WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Chief Justice of the said Colony, Governor's Deputy, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the Fourth Session of the Third Parliament of Western Australia, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1896," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Wednesday, the 21st day of June next, at the hour of three of the clock p.m.; the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, St. George's Terrace, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Hay Street, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### PERTH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the South by the Northern shores of Melville and Perth Waters and the Swan River; on the Westward, Northward, and Eastward by lines extending Northerly along the West and North-West boundaries of the City of Perth, the East boundary of Leederville to the North-East corner of Location Ac; thence North-North-Westerly parallel to the Wanneroo Road to the Southern boundary of Location Au; thence Westerly along said boundary, the Northern boundaries of Locations 968 and Ao, and a production West of the latter's North boundary to the sea coast; thence by the sea coast Northward to a point situate West from the North-West corner of Location 1352; thence East to a point situate North from the South-East corner of Location 104; thence South to said corner, and South-South-Easterly through the East corner of Location 1141 to the East corner of Location X on the Swan River aforesaid.

# Imported Dog Regulations.

"The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 31st day of May, 1899.

#### Present:

His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables The Colonial Treasurer.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction or importation of Dogs into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand, except in conformity with and subject to the following Regulations:

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. No dog imported from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies will be allowed to land in the Colony of Western Australia at any place other than within the Ports of Albany and Fremantle; and all such dogs shall perform quarantine at such places as may be approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock; and every owner of such dog shall pay or cause to be paid to an Inspector of Stock the sum of £15, before landing, to meet the expenses liable to be incurred in the quarantine and treatment of such dog.
- No dog will be allowed in the quarantine ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the quarantine ground may be destroyed or subjected to quarantine by an Inspector.
- 3. All dogs imported into the ports of Albany or Fremantle, or any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, which the master of any vessel shall certify in Australia, which the master of any vessel shall certify in the notice required by the Regulations issued under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," on August 28, 1897, as being only ship's dogs, or dogs in transit to other colonies not requiring to be landed, such dogs, if healthy, shall be detained on board such vessel, and shall be securely chained whilst within any port in the Colony, except as may be otherwise authorised by an Inspector.
- 4. Any master, or owner, or consignee who shall refuse or neglect to have any dog securely chained as directed by an Inspector, or who shall neglect to carry out any order or direction given by an Inspector for the care or security of any dog, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £50.
- 5. Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stray on board a ship on which an imported dog is detained may be destroyed or detained in quarantine at the expense of the owner, and any person taking or allowing a dog to be on board a ship where an imported dog is detained shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20. Any master, mate, or member of the crew of a ship who shall permit or suffer a dog to go on board their ship during the time any dog shall be detained on such ship shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 for each breach of this regulation.

The Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 19th March, 1897, are hereby cancelled.

# Municipality of Albany.

BY-LAW No. 13

(Sub-section 27 of Section 99 of 59 Victoria, No. 10).

To regulate the Riding, etc., of Bicycles, etc., within THE MUNICIPALITY.

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" shall mean and include a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, and the expression "cyclist" shall mean a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede. The expression "residents" shall mean every person who has resided in the Albany Municipality for three consecutive months, and who still resides in it.

- 2. No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footway within the Municipality.
- 3. No person shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle in or on any street or road within the Municipality unless there is attached thereto a lamp, which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and at all times be kept lighted.
- 4. Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot, or on horseback, or vehicle is being approached or passed.
- 5. No person shall leave any cycle in or on any street or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his or her cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Council.
- 6. No cyclist shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
- 7. When a cyclist meets any horse or animal, and such horse or animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted, until such horse or animal has been passed.
- 8. No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any streets or roads within the Municipality, or across the intersection of any of the said streets or roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.
- 9. All cycles owned by residents within the Municipality of Albany, and which are used on the streets within the Municipality, shall be registered and licensed by the Albany Town Council, and the owners thereof shall pay a fee of 2s. per amum for every such cycle.
- 10. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that a patch of foul ground has been found in King George Sound, one mile and seven cables to the Westward of Michaelmas Island.

From the shoalest rock, having on it twenty-one feet (21ft.) at low water, where the Chart shows eight fathoms (8fms.).

Gull Rock (centre) bears N. by E. magnetic.
Breaksea Lighthouse bears E.S.E. magnetic.
Seal Island, highest part bears S.W. by S. Southerly, magnetic.

King Point Lighthouse bears W. by N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N Magnetic.

An additional buoy, painted red, with staff and cage, has been placed a cable and a-half to the Westward of the rock above mentioned.

Vessels approaching Albany from the Eastward, and using the channel between Breaksea and Michaelmas Islands, are cautioned not to round the old buoy too closely, but are advised (while keeping Rock Dunder open South of Michaelmas Island) to bring Gull Rock to bear N.N.E. magnetic before hauling up for King Point.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under Section 14 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61 Vict., No. 23), for the management of the Fremantle Cemetery (Reserve 6066).

R. CECIL CLIFTON, Under Secretary for Lands.

By virtue of powers vested in them, the Board of Trustees make the following By-laws and Regulations:—

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given.
- 2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, private grave, vault, or tombstone, monument or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefor on the prescribed form. Upon such application being approved of, the Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the Act (see Schedule B).
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in time to allow of at least five (5) working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent or Caretaker at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application and order therefor be handed in at the office in time to allow of at least six (6) working hours' notice being given as above.
- 4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and any other particulars mentioned in Schedule D, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
- 5. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Superintendent, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining the written approval of the Trustees thereto, and on payment of the necessary fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special exemption be obtained from the Trustees in writing.
- 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon.
- 7. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.
- 8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of Right of Burial, as in Schedule B, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.
- 9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.
- 10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial. Such certificate or order shall at the atest be handed to the Superintendent or Caretaker upont the funeral entering the Cemetery.

- 11. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—
  Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
  Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- 12. No burial shall be allowed to take place at any other hours, except by written permission of the Trustees.
- 13. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery.
- 14. At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.
- 15. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Superintendent or Caretaker by the Trustees, from time to time, for the regulation of the traffic.
- 16. No headstone, footstone, kerbing, monument, or any other erection of any kind shall be permitted, nor shall any inscription be allowed, until the plans and particulars of the same have been approved by the Trustees.
- 17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees or their officers, such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 18. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor or person responsible for the erection.
- 19. All material, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person responsible therefor.
- 20. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in previous By-law not being so removed, the Trustees shall have power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the costs of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.
- 21. All materials required in the erection and completion of any stone or other work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance to the Cemetery, and conveyed along such roads or tracks as the Superintendent or Caretaker shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
- 22. That the Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other cemetery.
- 23. That before any such exceptional case—as referred to in the last By-law—be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application, setting forth the reason for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Colonial Secretary, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If in the opinion of the Trustees necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
- 24. No wooden fences, railings, crosses, etc., shall be allowed.
- 25. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Superintendent or Caretaker.
- 26. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure, except such as are approved by the Superintendent.
- 27. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision

of the Superintendent or Caretaker, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give; and any workman committing any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent or Caretaker, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

- 28. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following Rules:—
  - (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other materials removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other graves, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
  - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves, except with the permission of the Superintendent.
  - (c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
  - (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- 29. Children under the age of ten years shall not be admitted to the Cemetery unless in the charge of some responsible person.
- 30. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 31. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any Rule, Regulation, or By-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 32. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 33. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in discharge of his duty, nor shall be be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees, and any person so employed accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 34. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule E; such licenses to be renewed annually.
- 35. Subject to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent or Caretaker shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery.

#### Amendment of Regulations.

"IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Goldfields Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 40), has been pleased to amend the Regulations made thereunder, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

Regulation No. 20 is amended by striking out all the words after "Reward Claim," in the first paragraph thereof, and substituting the following in lieu thereof:—

Regulation No. 23 is amended by inserting after the words "base line," in line four thereof, the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn, and one man for every 300 feet along the base line in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn"; and by adding at the end thereof the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn, and one man for each 150 feet along the base line in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn."

Regulation No. 47 is amended by omitting the words "One pound" in the sixteenth line and by inserting in lieu thereof "Five shillings."

This month was colder and drier than usual. The atmospheric pressure was in excess of the average, and the maximum was the highest, with one exception, ever recorded in Perth during May. The mean maximum temperature at the Botanic Gardens was 2° and the mean minimum 1'3° below the corresponding temperatures for previous years. There was no frost in Perth, the lowest temperature on the surface of the ground being 31'9 on the 18th; but inland the ground temperature was below the freezing point on several occasions. The lowest temperatures for the month were:—

After a few showers on the 1st, beautiful fine weather prevailed throughout the Colony for three weeks, broken only by some light showers on the South coast. During all this time two well-marked anti-cyclones or mounds of high pressure travelled slowly across the Southern portion of Australia, the first passing Perth on the 2nd, and reaching the East coast on the 10th. The second passed Perth on the 17th, and on the 22nd was lying over South Australia, followed by a "low" off our South-West coast, which brought squally, showery weather, especially in coastal districts, which lasted, with occasional fine intervals, until the end of the month.

The total rainfall for the month was generally below the average for previous years, except at a few places on the coast, which recorded very heavy falls on the 24th. In the Perth district only 253 points were registered, against 476 for previous years; in the Coolgardie district, 71 against 81; and from Onslow Northward only a few light showers fell at isolated places.
