Alteration of Boundaries of East Fremantle Municipality.

PROCLAMATION

Western Australia,

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to alter the boundaries of any Municipality: Now, THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the Boundaries of the Municipality of East Fremantle, and declare them to be as follows:—

Bounded on the *Northward* by the left bank of the Swan River; on the *South* by the centre of Marmion Street; on the *East* by the East boundaries of Swan Locs. M. 336, 216, 297, 646, 72, and 650; and on the *Westward* by the centre of East Street and said left bank of Swan River.

The boundaries set forth in the Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd April, 1897, are hereby cancelled.

WHEREAS by Section 217 of the above Act the Governor may, by order, from time to time specify the articles on which a Drawback of Duty paid on importations into Western Australia may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of Drawback to be so allowed, and may also make Regulations for prescribing the conditions for carrying out the purposes of this part of the said Act: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby approve of the following additional Regulation.

Drawback Regulation.

Drawback will not be allowed on any goods which have been in the Colony for a longer period than one year from the date of importation.

WHEREAS by “The Stock Diseases Act, 1895,” the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea coast in Western Australia, being “ports” within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction or importation of Dogs into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand, except in conformity with and subject to the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No dog imported from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies will be allowed to land in the Colony of Western Australia at any place other than within the Ports of Albany and Fremantle; and all such dogs shall perform quarantine at such places as may be approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock; and every owner of such dog shall pay or cause to be paid to an Inspector of Stock the sum of £15, before landing, to meet the expenses liable to be incurred in the quarantine and treatment of such dog.

2. No dog will be allowed in the quarantine ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the quarantine ground may be destroyed or subjected to quarantine by an Inspector.

3. All dogs imported into the ports of Albany or Fremantle, or any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, which the master of any vessel shall certify in the notice required by the Regulations issued under “The Stock Diseases Act, 1895,” on August 28, 1897, as being only ship’s dogs, or dogs in transit to other colonies not requiring to be landed, such dogs, if healthy, shall be detained on board such vessel, and shall be securely chained whilst within any port in the Colony, except as may be otherwise authorised by an Inspector.

4. Any master, or owner, or consignee who shall refuse or neglect to have any dog securely chained as directed by an Inspector, or who shall neglect to carry out any order or direction given by an Inspector for the care or security of any dog, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £50.

5. Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stray on board a ship on which an imported dog is detained may be destroyed or detained in quarantine at the expense of the owner, and any person taking or allowing a dog to be on board a ship where an imported dog is detained shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20. Any master, mate, or member of the crew of a ship who shall permit or suffer a dog to go on board their ship during the time any dog shall be detained on such ship shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 for each breach of this regulation.

WHEREAS by “The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898,” the Governor, by Order in Council gazetted, may, from time to time, make such Regulations as he deems necessary for prescribing the manner in which diseased plants or fruit and infected packages shall be treated, cleansed, or destroyed, or otherwise disposed of; providing for the registration of all orchards, vineyards, nurseries, and prescribing the matter in respect whereof fees shall be payable under this Act; fixing the amount of such fees; the mode of the payment, and the recovery thereof: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that an additional Schedule should be made to Regulation 22 (published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd February, 1899) for the purposes of the said Act: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additional Schedule for the purposes aforesaid.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that a patch of foul ground has been found in King George Sound, one mile and seven cables to the Westward of Michaelmas Island.

From the shoalest rock, having on it twenty-one feet (21ft.) at low water, where the Chart shows eight fathoms (8fms.):

- Gull Rock (centre) bears N. by E., magnetic.
- Breaksea Lighthouse bears E.S.E. magnetic.
- Seal Island, highest part bears S.W. by S. Southerly, magnetic.
- King Point Lighthouse bears W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., magnetic.

An additional buoy, painted red, with staff and cage, has been placed a cable and a-half to the Westward of the rock above mentioned.

Vessels approaching Albany from the Eastward, and using the channel between Breaksea and Michaelmas Islands, are cautioned not to round the old buoy too closely, but are advised (while keeping Rock Dunder open South of Michaelmas Island) to bring Gull Rock to bear N.N.E. magnetic before hauling up for King Point.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," Clauses one and two, His Excellency the Governor in Council declares it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any Crayfish within the sea limit of half-a-mile from high-water mark on Rottneet Island; also that during the months of November, December, and January in each and every year no female Crayfish shall be taken in any portion of the sea; and, during said months, it shall be unlawful to offer for sale or have in possession any female Crayfish.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all Crayfish which shall have been taken.

The Regulation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th November, 1898, is hereby cancelled.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that the Honourable the Attorney General has approved of the Regulations hereunder respecting Licenses to practise as a Surveyor under "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893" (56 Vict., No. 14):—

REGULATIONS.

1. Application for licenses, enclosing certificates and testimonials, must be addressed to the Commissioner of Titles.

2. Before an applicant is eligible for a license under this Act he—

- (a.) Must obtain and hold a license under "The Licensed Surveyors' Act, 1895," and have held the same for a period of not less than twelve months;
- (b.) Shall produce satisfactory evidence that he has had at least six months' field experience in surveying in Western Australia;
- (c.) Shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Surveyor General that he is a person of good fame and character.

3. When the applicant has held for twelve months, and continues to hold a license in one of the other Australasian colonies under an Act similar to the Transfer of Land Act of Western Australia, he may apply for a license under this Act, after having held a license under "The Licensed Surveyors' Act, 1895," for six months, and had field experience in surveying in this Colony for not less than three months.

4. The applicant will be required to attend personally, at the office of the Surveyor General, to show that he is conversant with the Transfer of Land Act so far as it refers to surveys, with the Rules in force that have been made under that Act for the guidance of surveyors, and any other Acts that deal with surveys.

5. The Surveyor General shall have the right to subject an applicant to any examination, or to any other conditions he may consider necessary, and may refuse to grant a license to any applicant if he is of opinion that it would not be to the advantage of the Land Titles' Department to do so.

6. Any surveyor now or hereafter licensed to practise under this Act, who is absent from the Colony of Western Australia for a period exceeding twelve months, shall cease to be a licensed surveyor under this Act, and the Attorney General shall cause such absent surveyor's name to be removed from the list of surveyors licensed under this Act.

7. A person whose name has been removed from the list of licensed surveyors, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 6 of these Regulations, may, on returning to the Colony, apply for a license, and shall comply with all the foregoing conditions, except the one making field practice compulsory.

Amendment of Regulations.

Department of Mines,
Perth, 7th June, 1899.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Goldfields Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 40), has been pleased to amend the Regulation made there-under, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Regulation No. 20 is amended by striking out all the words after "Reward Claim," in the first paragraph thereof, and substituting the following in lieu thereof:—

	In localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn.	In localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn.
If distant less than one mile from the nearest boundary of any mining tenement producing gold	300ft. x 400ft. on or parallel to the base line	600ft. x 400ft. on or parallel to the base line
If one mile and under three miles as aforesaid	400ft. x 400ft. on or parallel to the base line	800ft. x 400ft. on or parallel to the base line
If distant three miles and upwards as aforesaid	600ft. x 400ft. on or parallel to the base line	1,200ft. x 400ft. on or parallel to the base line

Regulation No. 22 is amended by inserting after the words "a width of 400 feet" the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn; and may be, and shall not exceed, 150 feet long, or, at the option of the miner, parallel to the base line, by a width of 400 feet, in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn."

Regulation No. 23 is amended by inserting after the words "base line," in line four thereof, the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn, and one man for every 300 feet along the base line in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn"; and by adding at the end thereof the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn, and one man for each 150 feet along the base line in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn."

Regulation No. 47 is amended by omitting the words "One pound" in the sixteenth line and by inserting in lieu thereof "Five shillings."

Regulation No. 91 is amended by adding at the end thereof the words following:—"Provided that when any such abandoned, forfeited, or surrendered Lease has been previously surveyed, the applicant for a new Lease of the area thereof shall be entitled to a refund of any balance remaining on account of the fees deposited for survey, after the cost of re-survey, re-marking, or inspection has been ascertained."

Regulation No. 106 is amended by adding at the end thereof the words following:—"And any person who shall, by himself or by his agent, or by any method of collusion, mark out and post a further notice on the same land during the said period of 10 days, with a view to defeat the provisions of this clause, shall be deemed to have posted a false notice, as provided by Regulation 118."

Schedule No. 35 is amended by omitting £1 in the last line but one, and by inserting in lieu thereof "Five shillings."

7. In the case of such cements as pass the Government requirements, the casks tested will be branded and recorded if desired, and certificates up to the full number issued to the firm for whom the tests are made, guaranteeing such cement, without extra charge.

Alterations of Regulations.

*Education Department,
Perth, 20th June, 1899.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by Section 22 of "The Elementary Education Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1893," has been pleased to approve the appended Amendments to Regulations 5, 12, 13, 17, 18, 21, 38, 61, 64, 107, 117, 147, 156, 167, 170, 171, and Appendix I. (Examination for "A" Certificate):—

Regulation 5 to read:—"Wherever at least 20 children, between the ages of 6 and 14, are residing within an estimated radius of 10 miles from a central point, and can be collected in two groups, affording an aggregate average attendance of 16 children, an Itinerant Teacher may be appointed, and schools so established shall be designated Half-time Schools."

Regulation 12 to read:—"In a district where, in the Minister's opinion, the permanence of settlement is sufficiently assured for some time, a Provisional School may be established when not fewer than 10 and not more than 19 children, between the ages of 6 and 14, can regularly attend such School; provided that no Provisional School shall be established within four miles, by the nearest route practicable for children, of any existing State, Provisional, or Half-time School."

Regulation 13 to read:—"The Minister may, at his discretion, grant an annual sum not exceeding £12 as lodging allowance."

Regulation 17 to read:—"To ensure the continuance of a Provisional School, an average attendance of not fewer than 10 pupils must be maintained."

Regulation 18 to read:—"The necessary school buildings and furniture for Provisional Schools, as well as the requisite books and apparatus, will be provided at the cost of the Department."

Regulation 21 to read:—"The grant to teachers engaged in such Schools shall be at the rate of £4 10s. per annum, up to a maximum salary of £90 per annum, for each pupil in average daily attendance. In addition to such grant they may be allowed, where necessary, a sum of £10 per annum as forage allowance."

Regulation 38.—Amend the paragraph beginning "The principal teacher shall receive" to the following:—"The principal teacher shall receive salary at the rate of £3 per annum for each pupil in average attendance up to 20, and 10s. for each additional pupil beyond that number." Add, as a final paragraph, "Special arrangements may be made by the Minister in the metropolis, or in other large towns, where necessary."

Regulation 61 to read:—"Schools will be classified at the close of each calendar year, subject to the provisions of Regulation 58."

Regulation 64.—For paragraph "B. Schools below 15 at the rate of £5 per head." substitute "B. Schools below 15 males, £70 to £90; females, £60 to £80."

Regulation 107.—Omit the words "The Programme of Instruction" and insert "List of books used for Secular Instruction."

Regulation 117.—Add, as sub-section 5, the following:—"5. No child shall be allowed to remain in the infants' classes after having attained the age of eight years."

Regulation 147.—Add the following:—"The terms of the Act are as follows:—18. In every Government School a portion of each day, not exceeding half-an-hour, may be

set apart when the children of any one religious persuasion may be instructed by clergymen or other religious teachers of such persuasion, subject to the conditions following:—

- (1.) The children receiving such religious instruction shall be separated from the other children of the school.
- (2.) The time during which such religious instruction is given shall be fixed by the District Board of Education in consultation with the head teacher of such school, subject, however, to the approval of the Minister.
- (3.) Where two or more clergymen or other religious teachers of different persuasions desire to give religious instruction at any Government School, the children of each such different persuasion shall be so instructed on different days.
- (4.) The religious instruction to be so given shall in every case be the religious instruction authorised by the Church to which the clergyman or other religious teacher belongs.

19.—If the clergyman or religious teacher does not attend during any portion of the period agreed to be set apart for religious instruction in a Government School, such period shall be devoted to the ordinary secular instruction in such school."

Regulation 156.—Omit all words after "as boys."

Regulation 167.—Substitute the following:—"Children, as a rule, will be expected to advance at least one Standard per year."

Exceptions:—

- (1.) The following children may be presented in the same Standard at two consecutive examinations. The names of such children must be initialled by an Inspector:—
 - (a.) Children who fail to make two good passes in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic;
 - (b.) Children who, through sickness or physical or mental weakness, are unable to keep pace with the class to which they belong.
- (2.) Children who fail for two consecutive years in Arithmetic, but otherwise qualify for promotion, shall be promoted in all other subjects. In that subject they may be placed in the Standards in which they were last presented and failed.

Teachers will be required to present to the Inspector a list of children who, in their opinion, should come under Clause B. If the Inspector considers the reasons given are sufficient, he shall initial the names of such children on the Examination Schedule."

Regulation 170.—Omit all words after "the following subjects" and insert "Reading, Writing, Spelling, Arithmetic, and Drawing."

Regulation 171.—Omit all words after "Excellent, Good, etc.," and insert "Scripture, Geography, English History, Object Lessons, Drill, Music, and Manual Training. Under the Manual Training should be included Needlework for girls, Kindergarten for infants and younger children, Clay-modelling, and any other kindred subject previously approved of by the Department."

Appendix I.—Examination for an "A" Certificate.—Omit the whole of the Schedule and insert the following:—"This examination may be taken in two parts, at the option of the teacher."

PART I.

- 100. *Reading* Any standard author in Prose and Poetry.
- 100. { *Writing* Specimens of Copy Setting and Letter Writing.
- { *Spelling* Any exercise.
- 200. *Arithmetic* The whole Theory and Practice of Arithmetic. Mensuration.
- 200. *English* The same as for a "B" certificate, with increased skill.
- 100. *Geography* The World. Physical Geography.
- 200. *School Management* Gladman's "School Work" and Quick's "Essays on Educational Reformers." To take charge of a school in the presence of an Inspector.
- 100. *Drawing* Advanced Exercises in Freehand and Model. Blackboard Drawing.
- 100. *Euclid (Males)* Books I. to VI., with deductions from Books I. to III. inclusive.
- 100. *Needlework (Females)* E. Rosevear's Textbook of Needlework, etc.

PART II.

- 100. *Music* Singing-class Book by O. J. Stimpson, and Nelson's Music for Pupil Teachers, or Curwen's Standard Course to Step VI. inclusive.
- 100. *Physiography* Huxley's Physiography and Lockyer's Astronomy.
- 100. *History* Green's History of the English People. Australian History.
- 100. *English Literature* Morley's English Literature; Shakespeare's "Hamlet;" Bacon's Essays 1, 2, 4, 5, 9, 11, and 14 to 19; Milton's Lycidas; or other similar books as may from time to time be prescribed.
- 100. *Algebra and Trigonometry (Males)* Todhunter's Smaller Algebra and Trigonometry.
- 100. *Sanitation (Females)* Healthy Life and Healthy Dwellings.
