W HEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor, by Order in Council gazetted, may, from time to time, make such Regulations as he deems necessary for prescribing the manner in which diseased plants or fruit and infected packages shall be treated, cleansed, or destroyed, or otherwise disposed of; providing for the registration of all orchards, vineyards, nurseries, and prescribing the matter in respect whereof fees shall be payable under this Act; fixing the amount of such fees; the mode of the payment, and the recovery thereof: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that an additional Schedule should be made to Regulation 22 (published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd February, 1899) for the purposes of the said Act: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following additional Schedule for the purposes aforesaid.

purposes; AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 6217 (Wiluna—Commonage) should be placed under the control of James Morton Wotton, Anthony Nülsen, and James Saunders, as a Board of Management: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned Reserve under the control of James Morton Wotton, Anthony Nülson, and James Saunders, as a Board of Mangement, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter By-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Rules of Procedure under "The Adoption of Children Act, 1896."

Attorney General's Office, Perih, 23rd June, 1899.

I IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in pursuance and in exercise of the power and authority conferred by "The Adoption of Children Act, 1896," has been pleased to make and prescribe the following rules of procedure and fees of Court under the said Act:—

1. Every application under section 3 or 4 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as circumstances will permit, and shall be signed by the applicant or applicants in the presence of, and shall be attested by, a Government Resident, Police Magistrate, Resident Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace.

2. The Judge shall appoint some convenient place and time for the hearing, and shall indorse a memorandum thereof on the application.

3. The Judge's Associate shall give notice to the applicant of the time and place appointed for the hearing. Such notice may be sent through the post, addressed to the applicant at the place of residence stated in the application.

4. The applicant or applicants, and the child proposed to be adopted, shall attend personally before the Judge on the hearing of the application, but the Judge may, in his discretion, dispense with such personal attendance. 5. A summons for the attendance of a witness may be in the Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, and shall be served personally on the witness, and may, if necessary, contain a clause requiring the witness to produce any books, deeds, papers, and writings in his possession or under his control.

6. The consent in writing of the parents or parent or legal guardian of the child proposed to be adopted shall be in the Form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto, and shall be signed and attested in the same manner as an application is required by Rule 1 to be signed and attested.

7. The order of adoption shall be in the Form No. 4 in the Schedule hereto, or as near thereto as circumstances will permit.

8. The Registrar of the Supreme Court shall file the application and other documents relating thereto, and shall keep a register-book, properly indexed, and shall record therein a true copy of every order made under this Act. Such copy-order shall be verified under the hand of the Judge.

9. Any person desirous of obtaining the variation or discharge of any order made under the Act shall apply in writing to the Judge, and shall serve a copy of such application forthwith upon the person or persons in whose favour such order was made. Such application shall set forth the grounds upon which the reversal and discharge of the order are sought, and shall be signed and attested in the same manner as an application under Rule 1.

10. The Judge shall appoint a convenient place and time for the hearing, and shall endorse a memorandum thereof on the application.

The applicant shall serve a true copy of the 11. application, and of the memorandum of the time and place for hearing endorsed thereon, upon the person in whose favour the order was made, personally, a reasonable time before the hearing. The Judge may order substituted service to be effected in such manner as he may think fit.

In all cases where an order is varied or 12.discharged, a memorandum of such variation or discharge shall be written across the face of the registered copy of the order, and signed by the Judge.

Every person interested may, upon the hearing 13.of any application under the Act, appear personally or by a legal practitioner.

The following Schedule of Forms and Scale of 14.Fees shall form part of these Rules.

15. The Judge shall, by memorandum under his hand indorsed on the application, have power to remit the said fees or any of them, or to reduce the amount thereof, in any case where in his opinion there are reasonable grounds for remitting or reducing the same.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that a patch of foul ground has been found in King George Sound, one mile and seven cables to the Westward of Michaelmas Island.

From the shoalest rock, having on it twenty-one feet (21ft.) at low water, where the Chart shows eight fathoms (8fms.):

Gull Rock (centre) bears N. by E., magnetic.

Breaksea Lighthouse bears E.S.E. magnetic.

- Seal Island, highest part bears S.W. by S. Southerly, magnetic.
- King Point Lighthouse bears W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., magnetic.

An additional buoy, painted red, with staff and cage, has been placed a cable and a-half to the Westward of the rock above mentioned.

Vessels approaching Albany from the Eastward, and using the channel between Breaksea and Michaelmas Islands, are cautioned not to round the old buoy too closely, but are advised (while keeping Rock Dunder open South of Michaelmas Island) to bring Gull Rock to bear N.N.E. magnetic before hauling up for King Point.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that under Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," Clauses one and two, His Excellency the Governor in Council declares it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any Cravfish within the sea limit of half-a-mile from high-water mark on Rottnest Island; also that during the months of November, December, and January in each and every year no female Crayfish shall be taken in any portion of the sea; and, during said months, it shall be unlawful to offer for sale or have in possession any female Cravfish.

Every person committing a breach of these Reguations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all Crayfish which shall have been taken.

The Regulation published in the Government Gazette of the 18th November, 1898, is hereby cancelled.






