Closure of the East Perth Public Cemeteries.

(The Cemeteries Act, 1897.)

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," it is made lawful (in case it should appear to the Governor that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to cemeteries or other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued or discontinued subject to any exception or qualification) for the Governor, by order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to direct that after a time mentioned in such order (not being less than three months from the date thereof) burials in such cemetery or burial place, ground, or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exception or qualification mentioned in the same or any subsequent order: **AND** WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the said Governor that it is advisable that, except in vaults at present owned by private persons, all burials should be discontinued in the Public Cemeteries, East Perth: **NOW, THEREFORE**, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that from and after the first day of November, 1899, burials within the limits of the Public Cemeteries, East Perth, shall be wholly discontinued, except in cases where the special permission of the said Governor be first obtained.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle.

IN pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in, under, and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the Town of Fremantle do hereby make and ordain the following additional clauses to By-law No. 32, which was passed by the Fremantle Municipal Council on the 7th day of July, 1896, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council on the 26th day of November, 1896:—

BY-LAW No. 32.*Additional Clauses, viz:—*

22. No person shall interfere with any property in and belonging to any park lands, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter of any kind.

23. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences of any park lands, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

24. Any person found in a state of intoxication in any park lands, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein may be forthwith removed from such park lands by the Caretaker, or by any officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the police force, and shall be, moreover, liable to prosecution for an offence against these By-laws.

25. No person, except those in the employ of, or authorised by, the Council, shall bring into any of the park lands any horse or other animal, or any vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

26. No person shall light any fire within any of the park lands without first having obtained the consent of the Council.

27. No person, except the Mayor or Councillors, or the officers or servants of the Council, acting in the discharge of their duty, shall be allowed to enter any of the park lands on such days as may be set apart for sports, except through the proper entrance for that purpose, and on payment of the fee chargeable for admission at the time.

28. No person shall smoke any pipe, tobacco, cigar, or cigarette on any of the pavilion galleries or steps in any of the park lands.

29. No person shall bet, gamble, or call the odds, or offer to bet or gamble within the pavilion enclosure of any park lands, or within fifty feet of the outside of any such enclosure; and any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds, or offering to bet or gamble within such portions as aforesaid of any park lands, may be forthwith removed from such portions of the park lands by the Caretaker, or by any officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the police force, and shall also be liable to be prosecuted for a breach of these By-laws.

30. No person shall sit or stand on the stairway leading to the galleries of any pavilion on any of the park lands.

31. No person shall enter any of the dressing or training rooms on any of the park lands, or use any of the lockers or bathrooms without first having obtained a ticket for that purpose from the Council, which ticket must be produced if demanded by any Councillor of the Fremantle Corporation, or by the Caretaker, or by any officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the police force, and failing to produce such ticket shall be sufficient grounds for excluding such person from the dressing, training, or bath rooms.

32. No person shall preach or address an audience or public meeting on any of the park lands without first having obtained permission so to do from the Council.

Local Board of Health—By-Laws.*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 25th July, 1899.*

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve the following By-laws made by the Local Board of Health of Bayswater.

By-Laws of the Bayswater Local Board of Health.

MADE in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Health Act, 1898."

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, words having a meaning assigned to them by "The Health Act, 1898," shall have the like meaning with the following additions thereto:—

"Nightman" shall mean any person who for reward shall remove or shall assist to remove any night soil, offal, blood or other refuse matter, and also any person driving any night-cart.

"Night-cart" shall mean any dray, cart, barrow, or other carriage whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter.

"Board" shall mean the Local Board of Health appointed by the Government by Order in Council, and the persons hereafter from time to time duly appointed as Members of the Board of the district.

"Inspector" shall mean the Inspector for the time being or any person lawfully acting in his place and stead.

"Refuse" shall mean and include dust, ashes, straw, tins, boxes, broken glass, house and trade refuse, waste paper and all rubbish of whatsoever kind.

The Board may at any time appoint any place or places within the district for the reception of night-soil, manure, offal, or any other refuse or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector shall have free access and admission to such place or places.

The Board shall meet for general business in the board-room, Ratepayers' Hall, Bayswater, on the second Tuesday in each month at 7.30 p.m., and special meetings may be called at any time by the Chairman or any two members of the Board; five, inclusive of Chairman, to form a quorum.

Any member absenting himself from (3) three ordinary consecutive meetings of the Board, without the consent of the Board, shall have his seat declared vacant.

All moneys shall be placed in the Western Australian Bank, Perth, to the credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one Member and countersigned by the Secretary.

The duties of the Secretary shall be to attend each meeting of the Board and also any committee meeting, to keep minutes of all such meetings of the Board and to prepare and read the reports of all Committees, to conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers of the Board instructions as directed by the minutes, to keep all books, journals, or other documents belonging to the Board and to perform all other clerical work incidental to the conduct of the Board's business.

The duties of the Treasurer shall be to receive all moneys due to the Board and pay same to the credit of the Board at whatever bank may be appointed to receive same.

The duties of the Health Officer shall be:—

1. To superintend the application of all sanitary measures ordered by the Board and to advise them generally in all such matters.

2. The Officer of Health shall make frequent examination of the District under his control and see that the duties of the Inspector are efficiently performed and report any neglect of that Officer, and, if necessary, suspend him until such report and neglect have been considered by the Board.

3. He is, pursuant to the powers contained in the Health Act, 1898, to inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition, and affecting health, and if found so, to give a certificate in accordance with Section 152 of the Act.

He is also required to examine premises where any process of manufacture causing effluvia is carried on, and, if necessary, furnish the Board with the required certificate in accordance with Section 149 of the Act.

He is also to inspect and furnish a certificate if necessary of any houses built for habitation, or of any over-crowding, in accordance with Sections 92 and 93 of the Act.

He is also to assist the Board with his presence, and advice, if necessary, in order to the carrying out of Section 54, referring to the sale of unwholesome food, and on all occasions to give them the benefit of his medical experience and skill.

4. The Officer of Health is to report to the Board with the least possible delay any undue prevalence of disease in his district, whether generally or locally, and in the latter case it will be his duty to attract the attention of the Board to the locality in order that remedial measures may be at once taken.

He is also to carefully note the appearance in his district of any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, or any indications thereof, or any occurrence or circumstances affecting or likely to involve public health; and he shall immediately make a full report thereof to the Board, whose duty it will be immediately to forward his report to the Central Board in accordance with Section 109 of the Act, and the Health Officer is expected energetically to assist in carrying out and enforcing the regulations of the Central Board for mitigating as far as possible and preventing and checking the spread of epidemic and other diseases as detailed in Section 111.

5. The Officer of Health is to furnish the Board of his district annually, as appointed, with a report of the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of his district for that period, making any remarks and observations he may think proper. A duplicate of said report to be forwarded to Central Board (see Section 108).

6. The Officer of Health shall from time to time issue to the Inspector such orders and instructions as the said Health Officer may deem necessary, and the Inspector being placed under the control of the Health Officer is required to report to him direct upon all matters or things appertaining to their respective duties and district.

Any special matter contained in any such reports necessary to be brought under the notice of the Board shall be forwarded by the Health Officer to the Board in the usual manner.

The Health Officer shall obey the orders of the Board.

The duties of the Inspector shall be:—

To make himself thoroughly acquainted with "The Health Act, 1898," and to carry out the provisions of the same.

To visit occasionally, not less than once a month, or oftener if directed by a competent authority, the various portions of his district, and give his advice and instructions to owners or occupiers of premises as to the prevention or abatement of any nuisance or removal of offensive matter.

To keep a record, in a book provided for the purpose, of all such advice or instructions to owners or occupiers to abate nuisances, etc.

To attend each regular meeting of the Board, and to deliver thereat a written report of all nuisances abated, all nuisances required to be abated, the general sanitary condition of the district, and of any matter whatsoever that may appertain to the healthfulness of the district.

To keep a list of all closets in use within the district, with the names of the persons occupying the premises to which such closets belong.

To give the contractor for removal of night-soil any instructions deemed necessary for the proper fulfilment of such contract.

NIGHT-SOIL AND SANITARY SERVICE.

1. No person shall deposit any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter in any place whatsoever other than the place provided by the Local Board, and no person shall transport or deposit such night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter from any place within the district to the said place so provided as aforesaid, unless he be a nightman duly licensed as hereinafter provided.

2. Every house or tenement within the district shall have a privy or earth closet, erected in such position as shall be approved by the inspector, and such privy or earth closet shall in all cases be not less than twenty (20) feet from such house or tenement.

3. Every such privy or earth closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the necessity for carrying the night-soil, or other refuse matter contained therein through any house. Every such privy or earth closet within the district shall consist of a suitable building, constructed with proper openings to provide ventilation as near to the top as practicable, and communicating directly with the external air. The floor of such privy or earth closet shall be at no point less than three (3) inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.

The seat of such privy or earth closet, the aperture in such seat and the space beneath such seat shall be so constructed as to admit of a movable receptacle for filth being placed and fitted beneath such seat in such manner and in such position as may effectually prevent the deposit upon the floor or sides of the space beneath such seat or elsewhere than in such receptacle of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat.

The seat of such privy or earth closet shall be so constructed that the whole of such seat, or a sufficient part thereof, may be readily removed or adjusted in such a manner as to afford adequate access to the space beneath such seat for the purpose of cleansing such space, or of removing therefrom or placing and fitting therein the appropriate receptacle for filth.

The orifice in the closet seat shall be at least three (3) inches behind the riser. The space under the seat may not allow of a larger interval than one and a half (1½) inches between the pan and the seat, and it must be so fitted with stops or bars that the pan may be easily introduced into its exactly proper position.

4. Every privy or earth closet shall within one (1) month after the publication of these By-laws be supplied by the owner or occupier of the house to which it belongs with a pan or receptacle for night-soil, which shall be constructed of iron and of a uniform size, to be approved of by the Local Board.

5. The occupier of any premises whereon any privy or earth closet is erected shall keep the same and the pans and receptacles for night-soil clean and free from offensive smell and shall cause such privy or earth closet to be cleaned once in every week at the least, and the said pans and receptacles to be emptied once in every week at the least, and oftener if the Inspector shall so require.

6. No privy or earth closet, cess-pit, pan or other receptacle shall be emptied nor shall any blood, offal, or other refuse matter whatsoever be pumped out of any house or premises within the district between the hours of five o'clock in the morning and eleven o'clock in the evening of any day, and no night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive refuse matter shall be transported or deposited in the district between the aforesaid hours.

7. Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises shall use or cause to be used a suitable disinfectant or deodorant, and shall cause to be kept in every privy or earth closet (pan closet) belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorising night-soil (not sand or gravel) and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorising material, sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorise the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

8. All existing cess-pools for the reception of night-soil shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within one (1) calendar month of notice to that effect being given by the Inspector to the owner or occupier of the premises whereon there is a cesspool for the reception of night-soil, and no cess-pool shall hereafter be opened or maintained within the district.

9. Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive refuse matter shall be removed, and from the owner of any land on which any cess-pool shall have been cleansed and filled up as aforesaid, such sum and sums of money as are mentioned in Schedule "B" hereto; and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

10. Every nightman prior to his carrying on his business shall obtain from the Secretary or Inspector a license so to do in the form in Schedule "A" hereto, such license shall be subject to the conditions contained in By-laws Nos. 14, 15, 16, 18, and 19, and shall be obtained upon an application in writing which shall contain the true name and address of the applicant, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from two or more householders in the district certifying to the fitness of the applicant to hold such license. The Secretary or Inspector shall keep a registrar of all licenses granted by him with the true name and address of the licensees.

The Secretary or Inspector shall not be bound to issue a license to any person, and shall not, without the consent of the Local Board, issue a license to any person who has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws.

11. Every such license shall remain in force only to the thirty-first day of December next ensuing thereof, subject, however, to the conditions that the Local Board may (whether the nightman has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws or not), upon being satisfied that a nightman has been guilty of any misconduct or impropriety whilst engaged in his business, or of any offence against these By-laws, at any time cancel such license or suspend the operation of the same for such period as the Local Board may think fit.

12. If a nightman shall change his abode during the currency of his license, he shall, within two (2) days after making such change, give to the Secretary or Inspector notice in writing of such change and specifying his new address, and shall, at the same time, produce his license to the Secretary or Inspector, who shall endorse a memorandum therein specifying the new address of the licensee.

13. Every nightman shall at all times when engaged in carrying on his business have his license with him, and shall be bound upon demand to produce the same to the Inspector or other person lawfully authorised to demand such production, and shall also at no time part with the custody or possession of his said license.

14. Every nightman shall, before using any night-cart, produce the same for examination by the Inspector, who shall, upon being satisfied of its fitness, register the same as a night-cart, with a number in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall hand to the nightman a memorandum of the number of such nightcart upon the register.

No cart, dray, barrow, or carriage shall be used as a nightcart until so registered.

15. Every nightman shall have painted, and at all times keep conspicuous upon the right hand side of any night-cart used by him, in white letters, not less than two (2) inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth, upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman," and together also with the registration number of the cart in figures of not less than four (4) inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth.

16. Every nightman shall keep any cart used by him watertight and free from leakage, and such cart shall be provided with a cover, so as effectually to prevent the splashing out or spilling of any of the contents thereof, or the escape of any offensive smells therefrom.

Every nightman shall, within twenty-four (24) hours after being requested so to do by the owner or occupier of any premises whereon are any receptacles for night-soil requiring emptying or cleansing, or any cesspool requiring emptying or filling up, by himself, or by any person appointed by the Local Board in that behalf, properly cleanse and fill up any cesspool, and cleanse any privy or earth closet, and remove the contents of any receptacle for night-soil, and the nightman shall be entitled to charge, in respect of such cleansing, filling up, and removal, such sum or sums of money as are mentioned in the Schedule "B."

17. Any nightman who shall be guilty of a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds sterling (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.), and his license may be forfeited or suspended by the Local Board.

HOUSE REFUSE—SCAVENGING.

No person shall deposit or discharge or permit, cause or suffer to be deposited or discharged, any refuse in any place or part of the district except in such places as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The owner of every house shall on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or bins of the material and of the dimensions as may be directed by the Inspector: provided that in no case shall the owner be required to provide more than one such receptacle for each part of such house which shall be occupied by a separate tenant.

The occupier for the time being of every house or part thereof, shall regularly collect all refuse on or from the premises occupied or used by him or her, and place the same in the said receptacle.

No occupier shall permit or suffer the receptacle attached or used with the premises of which he is the occupier, or of which he is one of the occupiers, to overflow or to become offensive.

Every occupier of a house or part of a house to or with which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied by the Local Board at least once every week; provided that in the case of buildings used for purposes other than private residences, the occupier shall cause the said receptacles to be emptied as often as the Inspector shall direct.

Every receptacle, as aforesaid, shall be kept in such positions as the Inspector may direct, so as to be convenient for the discharge and removal of the contents thereof.

The owner of every house shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle, any receptacle which the Inspector may deem to be worn out or unfit for use.

Notwithstanding any thing to the contrary herein contained, where any house is unoccupied or is occupied by numerous tenants, or where from any other cause the Local Board thinks it desirable, the said Local Board may give written notice to the owner, either personally or by leaving the same on the premises, requiring such owner to observe and carry out these By-laws in the same manner as if he were the occupier thereof, and in such case such owner shall be responsible in the same manner and to the same extent as if he were the occupier of such premises, and be liable to the same penalties.

If default or neglect be made in observing any of these By-laws by any owner or occupier, the Local Board may do all things and incur all expense necessary to observe the same, and all costs so incurred and things done shall be paid for by such owner or occupier, as the case may be, and may be sued for and recovered accordingly.

The occupier of any premises, who shall remove, or cause to be removed, for the purpose of sale or use as manure, any refuse, liquid, or solid rubbish, or manure produced upon his premises, shall not in the process of removal, deposit, or cause to be deposited, such refuse, rubbish, or manure upon any foot-way, pavement, or carriage or road-way.

For the purposes of such removal he shall in any case use, or cause to be used, a suitable vessel or receptacle cart, or carriage properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents thereof. If in the process of such removal any person shall slop or spill, or cause, or allow to fall upon any foot-ways, pavement, carriage or roadways any such refuse, rubbish or manure, he shall forthwith remove same, and shall immediately thereafter thoroughly sweep or otherwise thoroughly cleanse such place.

Every person who shall convey any refuse, rubbish, or manure, emitting a stench through and along any street, shall previous to, and during the whole time of such con-

veyance, cause such refuse, rubbish, or manure to be covered with lime or other precautions as respectively may be reasonably necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive effluvia from such refuse, rubbish or manure.

Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, or swine may be kept, shall provide in connection with such building or premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of such animals in such buildings or upon such premises.

He shall cause such receptacle to be constructed that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle. He shall also cause such receptacle to be constructed in such a manner and of such material and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any escape of the contents therefrom into the wall of any building.

He shall once at least in every week remove or cause to be removed from the receptacle provided, in accordance with this By-law, all dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter produced in or upon such building or premises and deposited in such receptacle.

The occupier of any premises shall not keep cattle or deposit the dung of any cattle in such a situation or in such a manner as to pollute any water supplied for use or used, or likely to be used, by man for domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or any water used, or likely to be used, in any dairy.

Except in cases where any sewage, soil, filth, dung, ashes, rubbish, or manure are produced on his own premises and are removed for sale or applied for his own use as manure, no person shall remove from off any premises any such matters unless previously authorised or licensed by the Local Board, or unless by special written leave of the Local Board.

No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, manure, or other offensive substance within the limits of the district or adjacent thereto, if such burning or destruction creates or is likely to create a nuisance, except as in such cases as in the opinion of the Inspector or the Local Board any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt when such Inspector or the Local Board may give permission for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.

In the event of the death from natural causes of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or accident necessitating the slaughter of such animals within the limits of the district, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the district and thoroughly burned and destroyed to the satisfaction of the Local Board or the Inspector by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be subject on conviction to a penalty of not less than five shillings (5s.) and not more than Ten pounds sterling (£10.)

Any person guilty of any breach of or neglect or failure to observe or perform any of the foregoing By-laws, or any notice or order given thereunder, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling (£10) or less than five shillings (5s.), or in case of a continued breach or neglect shall pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) or less than five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach or neglect continues.

BUTCHERIES (to include all buildings and store-rooms appertaining and used in connection therewith.)

Every butcher's shop shall be kept in a clean state and free from any effluvia arising from privy or any other nuisance:—

- (a.) All the internal walls of the rooms of every butcher's shop, and all ceilings and tops of such rooms, and all the passages of such butcher's shop shall be lime-washed once at least every six months.
- (b.) The troughs and all utensils in the butchers' shops shall be kept clean to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.
- (c.) No place on the same level as any butcher's shop and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping apartment unless it is sufficiently separated from the butcher's shop by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and such apartment shall be sufficiently ventilated.
- (d.) No person suffering, or who has recently suffered from any infectious disease shall be employed or allowed to reside on the premises.

- (e.) No live stock or poultry shall be kept within fifty feet of the butcher's shop.
- (f.) No person shall bring, or cause to be brought into the district, or carry or cause to be carried through the district, or carry or cause to be carried through the district on any cart or other vehicle, or in any way, any butcher's meat, or carcase of meat intended for human consumption, unless such cart or other vehicle or other means of conveyance be so constructed and provided with coverings to fully prevent the rays of the sun and of the rain and dust being allowed to fall or to be capable of reaching the butcher's meat or carcase of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof of any cart or vehicle used, and every person acting in contravention to the By-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

BY-LAWS.

BAKE HOUSES.

Every bakehouse shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from any offensive effluvia arising from privy, or any other nuisance:—

- (a.) All the internal walls of the rooms of every bakehouse, and all the ceilings and tops of such rooms, and all the passages of such bakehouse shall be lime-washed once at least every six months.
- (b.) The troughs and all utensils used in the bakehouse, shall be kept clean to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.
- (c.) No place on the same level as any bakehouse, and forming part of the same building, shall be used as a sleeping apartment unless it is sufficiently separated from the bakehouse by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and such apartment shall be sufficiently ventilated.
- (d.) No person suffering, or who has recently suffered from any infectious disease, shall be employed or allowed to reside on the premises.
- (e.) No live stock or poultry shall be kept within fifty feet of the bakehouse.
- (f.) No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the district, or carry or cause to be carried through the district thereof, on any cart or other vehicle, any bread or pastry intended for human consumption, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed that the rays of the sun and the rain, and dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such bread or pastry, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof, and every person acting in contra distinction to this By-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

BOARD OF HEALTH.

DISTRICT OF BAYSWATER.

THE Board of Health for the District of Bayswater, in the Colony of Western Australia, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Health Act, 1898," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Board, doth hereby make the following By-laws of the said Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. In the construction of these By-laws the word "person" shall include a Corporation. The "masculine" gender shall be deemed and taken to include "females," and the "singular" the "plural" and the "plural" the "singular." "Board" shall mean the "Local Board of Health for the District of Bayswater."
2. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall begin to occupy as a dairy or cowshed any building not previously so occupied, unless and until he first makes provision to the satisfaction of an officer of the Board for the lighting, ventilation, including air space and cleansing, drainage and water supply of the same, while occupied as a dairy or cowshed.
3. No person shall begin so to occupy any such building without first giving one month's notice, in writing, to the Board of his intention so to do.

4. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall occupy as a dairy or cowshed any building, whether so occupied previous to this By-law or not, if and as long as the lighting and ventilation, including air space and the cleansing, drainage, and water supply thereof, are not such as are necessary and proper:—

- (a.) For the health and good condition of the cattle therein.
- (b.) For the cleanliness of milk vessels used therein for containing milk for sale.
- (c.) And for the protection of the milk therein against infection or contamination.

5. No person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store, or milk shop, shall permit any water closet, earth closet, privy, cesspool, or urinal to be within, communicate directly with or ventilate into any dairy or any room used as a milk store or milk shop.

6. Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation or under his management or control and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale to be kept thoroughly clean. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily with washing soda and boiling water and then washed with clean water.

7. Every person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall keep in a proper state of repair all spouting, water pipes, and drains, and shall provide sufficient tanks to carry off all liquids which shall be emptied daily.

8. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, to use a milk shop or milk store in his occupation or permit or suffer the same to be used as a sleeping apartment, or for any purpose incompatible with the proper preservation of the cleanliness of a milk store or milk shop, and of the milk vessels and the milk thereon, or in any manner likely to cause contamination of the milk therein.

9. No cow keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep any swine in any cowshed or other building used by him for keeping cows, or in any milk store or other place used by him for keeping milk for sale.

10. All cattle in dairies shall be inspected by a veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board at least once in every six months, and any cows found to be diseased or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board as aforesaid.

11. All stables, cow-yards, and cattle sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, and all yards and enclosures connected therewith shall be constructed of suitable materials and paved or flagged with brick, stone, pitchers, or flagging, or be completely floored or covered with cement asphalt, or other impervious material, and shall have such impervious drains and receptacles so that no liquid, offal, dung, or other filth, refuse, or drainage shall stagnate or lodge therein, and in connection with every stable, cow-yard, cattle shed, or enclosure, there shall be provided a fit and sufficient box or bin for the reception of such dung or refuse arising in such stable, cow-yard, or cattle-shed as the Health Officer shall decide. Every such stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, and enclosure shall be swept and cleaned twice daily, and all manure, dung, or other refuse arising in or in connection therewith, if not removed immediately shall be placed in such box or bin as aforesaid and the said box shall be emptied and cleansed once at least in every week, and such box or bin as aforesaid shall be removed to a distance of at least ten yards from such stable or cattle-shed. Every such stable or cattle-shed shall within the time given by any order to such effect from the Health Officer or Health Inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

12. Every person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing, to the Secretary of the Board the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows or of any contagious or infectious disease, including consumption in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

13. No person following the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, nor any person under his direction or control whilst suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any

vessel used for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or occupier of a milk store or milk shop, as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk, until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk, or of contamination thereof, shall have ceased, and he shall have furnished a satisfactory medical certificate to the Health Officer that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a diseased cow with other milk.

14. Any person carrying on the business of a baker shall have all the inside walls or rooms of such bakehouse, and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms, whether such walls, ceilings or tops be plastered or not, and all the passages and outplaces of such bakehouse, either painted with oil or varnished, or washed with lime or some other wash material or liquid approved of by the Health Officer, or be partly painted or varnished and partly washed. Where painted with oil or varnished, there shall be three coats of paint or varnish, and the paint or varnish shall be renewed as required, and shall be washed with hot water and soap once at least in every six months. Any person keeping a bakehouse in contravention of this By-law shall be deemed to be committing an offence.

15. No place on the same level with any bakehouse and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is constructed as follows (that is to say) :—

Unless such sleeping place is effectively separated from the bakehouse by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling and unless there be an external glazed window of at least nine superficial feet in area, of which at least four and a half superficial feet are made to open for ventilation.

16. Every person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws shall, for every such breach or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

NOTE.—These By-laws shall, immediately they are published in the *Government Gazette*, come into operation and be in force in the district of Bayswater.

BY-LAWS OF THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE DISTRICT OF BAYSWATER MADE UNDER "THE HEALTH ACT, 1898" FOR THE ANNUAL REGISTRATION OF COW-KEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK, AND FOR PROHIBITING THE ADULTERATION OF MILK, AND FOR THE GRANTING OF LICENSES.

1. In the construction of these By-laws the word "person" shall include a "Corporation."

The "masculine" gender shall be deemed and taken to include "females" and the "singular" the "plural" and the "plural" the "singular."

2. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk in the district of Bayswater shall, on or before the first day of September in every year, make application to be registered in manner following, that is to say: by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health of the said district an application in the following form, or to the like effect. Every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of One pound sterling.

FORM OF APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION AS COW-KEEPER, DAIRYMAN, OR PURVEYOR OF MILK.

To the Secretary of the Local Board of Health, District of Bayswater.

3. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed. And on being satisfied that the applicant has made provision for the due observance of such By-law relative to dairies as may be in force for the time being under the Health Act, the Secretary shall issue a license in the Form "A," set out in the Schedule attached hereto, which shall remain in force until the 31st day of August next coming.

4. No person shall carry on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until such person shall have obtained from the Secretary a license for the purpose, which said license shall be renewed every year on or before the 1st day of September.

5. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall deteriorate the quality of milk by the addition of water or any foreign liquid or substance, or in any way adulterate the same.

6. These By-laws shall apply to the whole of the area under the control of the Local Board of Health of the District of Bayswater.

7. Every person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws shall for every such breach or neglect be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling (£20).

THE SCHEDULE.

2. The Explosives on the said Mine shall be stored in a "Main Magazine" and "Distributing Magazine" as herein after defined.

3. A "Main Magazine" shall consist of—

- (a.) A building situated on the surface of the ground and at a distance of 100 yards from any other building, works, or public road; provided that the magazine shall be surrounded by substantial mounds of earth, at least four feet thick, at a height level with the eaves of the building; or,
- (b.) An excavation in the ground; or so arranged that the roof of the magazine shall not be less than 15 feet below the surface of the ground; or,
- (c.) A drive or chamber in the upper level of the workings of the mine, connected with the surface by an independent air-pass; the passage connecting such magazine with the workings of the mine shall describe in its course at least one right angle, and the magazine shall be situated at a distance of 60 feet from any travelling road or underground thoroughfare, unless, in the opinion of the Inspector, owing to the nature of the country, this distance may be reduced, but in no case shall the distance be less than 30 feet. Of whichever of the above types the Main Magazine may consist, its construction, lining, and ventilation shall be such as approved by the Inspector, and shall be protected by doors so secured and constructed as to render it secure against unlawful entry.

4. A Distributing Magazine may be situated in any working level of the mine, and shall consist of a drive or chamber, situated at least 30 feet from any travelling road, and separated therefrom by a door so fitted and placed as to secure from unlawful entry.

5. The quantity of explosive to be stored in a Main Magazine of construction (a) shall not exceed 500lbs., or of construction (b) shall not exceed 2000lbs., and of construction (c) one week's supply, as required by the work of the mine, provided that—

The quantity required for one week's supply shall be certified to by the Inspector, who may in his certificate make reasonable allowance to provide for such possible increase (not exceeding 1000lbs.) as may be necessary to meet the exigencies of work in the mine.

6. The quantity of explosives allowed in any Distributing Magazine shall not exceed the supply required for one working day in the level in which the Distributing Magazine is situated.

7. No explosives shall be taken into any working face except in a securely covered case or canister, nor in any quantity exceeding what would be required for use during one shift in such face.

8. Detonators shall in all cases be stored apart from other explosives.

9. Every Main Magazine shall be in charge of a man specially appointed for the purpose, who shall have in his possession the keys of the magazine, and who shall be responsible for the safe storage of explosives contained therein; and the distribution of all explosives from any Distributing Magazine shall be under the supervision of an authorised person who may be one of the men at work in such level.

10. In the event of the closing of any mine, or part of a mine, the explosives stored therein shall be removed, and shall be disposed of as directed by the Inspector.

11. The storage of explosives generally in the mine shall be under the direction of the Inspector, who shall at any time have access to, and right of inspection of, any magazine or receptacle in connection with the mine.

12. No naked light shall be used in any magazine.

13. No charge shall be made up in any magazine.

Interpretation.

14. The "Inspector" shall mean any Inspector of Mines or other official who shall hereafter be appointed to carry out these Regulations; "Explosives" shall mean any explosives within the meaning of "The Explosives Act, 1895;" "Shift" shall mean eight working hours; "Working Day" shall mean 24 working hours, or three shifts.

Regulation No. 20 is amended by striking out all the words after "Reward Claim," in the first paragraph thereof, and substituting the following in lieu thereof:—

Drakesbrook Roads Board.

AT a Meeting of the above Board, held at Drakesbrook on the 6th day of May, it was resolved to take, for the purpose of opening a new line of communication, a strip of land, one chain wide, leaving the Perth-Bunbury Road at a point about 30 chains South from the North-West corner of Murray Location 10, and extending in a South-South-Easterly direction to join surveyed road in C.P. 48/2330 (O.P.
