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HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to alter the boundaries of any Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the boundaries of the Municipality of Esperance, and declare them to be as

Bounded on the North by part of the South boundary of East Location 21 and its prolongation East; on the East and South by the sea coast; on the West by the East boundaries of Esperance Locations 27, 26, 25, 24, 23, 42, 22, 21, 41, 39, 18, 17, 16, 15, and by the North side of a surveyed road passing along the North and West boundaries of Esperance Location 11.

507.4 WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," it is made lawful (in case it should appear to the Governor that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to cemeteries or other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued or discontinued subject to any exception or qualification) for the Governor, by order to be published in the Government Gazette, to direct that after a time mentioned in such order (not being less than three months from the date thereof) burials in such cemetery or burial place, ground, or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exception or qualification mentioned in the same or any subsequent order: And whereas it has been made to appear to the said Governor that it is advisable that, except in vaults at present owned by private persons, all burials should be discontinued in the Public Cemeteries, East Perth: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that from and after the first day of November, 1899, burials within the limits of the Public Cemeteries, East Perth, shall be wholly discontinued, except in cases where the special permission of the said Governor be first obtained.

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HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the importation or introduction into the Colony, either by sea or land, of stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea-coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby prohibit the introduction of Imported Stock into this colony, except in conformity with, and subject to the regulations made under the sixth section of the above Act, hereto appended.*

IIIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-Laws made by the Council of the Municipality of North Fremantle.

Municipality of North Fremantle.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Acts 59 Vict., No. 10, 48 Vict., No. 15, 40 Vict., No. 5, 46 Vict., No. 7, and 59 Vict., No. 39, the Council of the Municipality of North Fremantle doth hereby make the By-laws following; that is to say:—

BY-LAW No. 8.

TO REPEAL CERTAIN BY-LAWS.

The by-law regulating the construction of buildings made on the 9th January, 1896, and published in the Government Gazette of the 27th March, 1896, and the by-law regulating the construction of fences made on the 10th December, 1896, and published in the Government Gazette of the 1st January, 1897, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

BY-LAW No. 9.

- FOR REGULATING HACKNEY CARRIAGES AND VEHICLES LICENSED TO CARRY PASSENGERS AND PLYING FOR HIRE, AND THE OWNERS AND DRIVERS THEREOF, WITHIN THE TOWN OF NORTH FREMANTLE.
- 1. The licensing officer shall issue licenses to such owners, conductors and drivers of hackney carriages and vehicles as in his discretion are fit to be entrusted therewith.
- 2. The licensing officer shall not license any person as driver of any licensed vehicle unless and until he is satisfied the person so offering himself as a driver is fit and competent for the duties of a licensed driver; but he may at his option grant to such applicant a temporary license for a term not exceeding ten days by way of testing his competency for the position of licensed driver.
- 3. Every driver or conductor's licenses issued under the authority hereof shall be in force from the 10th day of January in the year of issue, or any subsequent date of the the year of issue, until the 10th day of January in the following year, unless in the meantime any such license shall be revoked or cancelled, as next hereafter provided; and the licensing officer shall take and receive the sum of two shillings and sixpence for every such license issued.
- 4. The license of any owner, driver or conductor may for any misconduct be revoked, cancelled or suspended by the licensing officer as he shall deem right after notice given to such owner, driver or conductor, to show cause why the same should not be revoked, cancelled or suspended, and opportunity thereupon given to him to show such cause.
- 5. The licensing officer may refuse to issue a license to any person he shall think disqualified; and he shall refuse to issue a license to any person against whom several complaints have been made to him as licensing officer, or to the Council of the Town of North Fremantle, or informations laid before a Justice.
- 6. In the event of any license being refused, revoked, cancelled, or suspended, the person affected may appeal to the Mayor and Council against the decision of the licensing officer, who shall inquire into the matter of such appeal, and at their discretion confirm the decision of the licensing officer or direct the issue or continuance of a license, and their decision shall be final.
- 7. The licensing officer shall not license any carriage or vehicle to ply for hire unless he shall be satisfied that it is a vehicle fit for the purpose for which it is sought to be licensed.
- 8. No vehicle shall receive a license to ply for hire that does not measure in the inside from the floor to the roof thereof four feet nine inches, and a clear space of two feet at least between the inside seats of every such vehicle, which shall be thirteen and a half inches, at least, broad: Provided that nothing in this section shall apply to vehicles heretofore licensed to ply for hire in the Town of North Fremantle.

9. No omnibus, the top or roof of which shall be more than eight feet nine inches from the ground, or the bearing of which on the ground shall be less than four feet six inches from the centre of the track of the left or near wheel to the centre of the track of the right or off wheel, shall be allowed to carry in any case more than the number of outside passengers herein respectively mentioned; that is to say—

And not more than two additional passengers outside for every two passengers which such omnibus may be constructed to carry according to the said regulations in the whole; and if any greater number of outside passengers shall be carried than hereinbefore mentioned, the driver and conductor of the omnibus at the time when such offence shall have been committed shall be liable for the same.

- 10. All owners of vehicles and omnibuses, or drivers, or other persons attending any such vehicles or omnibuses, shall bring his or their vehicles or omnibuses for inspection when and where the same shall be ordered by a licensing officer, and every owner, driver, and conductor shall comply with the orders and directions of such licensing officer as to matters in relation to these by-laws or any Act of Parliament relating to licensed vehicles.
- 11. If by any unavoidable accident any vehicle or omnibus shall become unfit for use, and also during such reasonable time as any such vehicle or omnibus may be undergoing repair, it shall be lawful for the owner, subject to the approval of the licensing officer, to use a spare vehicle or omnibus, but the same shall in all respects, except as to license, be subject to these by-laws in the same manner as if a license had been granted for the same; and the person using such spare vehicle or omnibus shall be liable in the same manner for any non-compliance with these by-laws in respect thereof as if the same had been licensed. Before using such spare vehicle or omnibus, the owner shall give notice thereof in writing at the office of the licensing officer stating the true cause of the vehicle or omnibus being disused, and the period during which such spare vehicle or omnibus will be required, and no such spare vehicle or omnibus will be used until it had been inspected and approved of by the inspector, nor for a longer period than that stated in a certificate to be signed by the licensing officer and delivered to the owner; but any vehicle or omnibus may be used for the purpose of finishing a journey which may have been interrupted by an accident.
- 12. Outside every omnibus a standing place, satisfactory to the inspector, shall be provided for the conductor, and suitable aprons for the reasonable convenience of outside passengers.
- 13. Every omnibus shall be provided with proper means of ventilation without opening the side windows.
- 14. No licensed vehicle shall ply for hire or carry passengers unless at the time of such plying or carrying such vehicle be drawn by at least the number of horses proportionate to the number of passengers which such vehicle or omnibus shall have been licensed to carry, exclusive of the driver, as follows, that is to say—
 - If licensed to carry six or any less number of persons—one horse.
 - If licensed to carry more than six and not more than fifteen persons—two horses.
 - If licensed to carry more than fifteen and not more than twenty-seven persons—three horses.
 - If licensed to carry more than twenty-seven and not more than thirty-nine persons—four horses.
 - And so on in the same proportion for any greater number of persons.
- 15. The name of the owner, the number of the license, and the number of persons to be carried, shall be painted on the right or off side of every vehicle in letters and figures of not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth in such position as the licensing officer shall direct, and such letters and numbers shall be kept legible and undefaced during all the time the vehicle shall ply or be used for hire.
- 16. The name of the owner and the number of the license of every licensed vehicle, on a plate eight inches by four inches, painted in clear legible figures, together with the number of passengers which such vehicle is licensed to carry inside and outside, whether the vehicle is

licensed to ply for hire within or beyond the bounds of the town of North Fremantle; also, for vehicles plying for hire within town, a printed card to be provided by the Town Council, showing the table of fares fixed by the Town Council for the time or distance, shall be fixed at the upper part of the front panel, or in such place as the inspector may direct, inside such vehicle; and such plate and such card respectively shall be so fixed, conspicuous, legible, and undefaced, during all the time the vehicles shall ply or be used for hire.

- 17. Every licensed vehicle plying to and from fixed places without the town of North Fremantle shall have painted in letters at least four inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and in a colour different from and opposite to the colour of the ground on which such letters shall be painted, upon some conspicuous part of such vehicle, so that the same shall be at all times plainly and distinctly visible and legible, the name or names of the extreme place or places to and from which such licensed vehicle shall be licensed to travel and go.
- 18. The owner of every omnibus plying for hire within the town of North Fremantle and within a distance of seven miles from the corporate limits of the said town shall paint or cause to be painted and exhibited inside such omnibus as shall be directed by the Inspector, a table of fares, and also the name of the place or places to and from which such omnibus shall ply, and the amount of fare charged for each passenger carried thereby, the same to be kept conspicuous and legible during the whole time that such omnibus shall ply for hire.
- 19. No proprietor shall be at liberty to lend his license to any person and any proprietor parting with his licensed vehicle shall see that the name of the purchaser is registered in the books of the licensed officer and on the license granted for such vehicle; and any proprietor who shall part with his vehicle without such registry shall still be deemed the proprietor thereof and subject as such to all the previsions of this by-law as fully as if no change of ownership had taken place; and the purchaser of such vehicle who shall allow the same to be used or to ply for hire without such registry shall be subject to the same penalty as is imposed by this by-law on a person for applying without license; and the person or persons in whose name or names a license shall appear to have been obtained, shall be deemed the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the same shall have been taken out until the transfer shall have been duly made.
- 20. The owner of any licensed vehicle shall, upon request made by any person or by the inspector, or by any police constable, declare to the person, inspector, or constable requiring the same, the name and place of abcde of the conductor or driver thereof.
- 21. Whenever any person named as the proprietor or one of the proprietors of a licensed vehicle shall change his place of abode, he shall within seven days next after any such change, give notice thereof in writing to the licensing officer specifying his place of abode, and the same shall be duly endorsed upon the license granted to such proprietor.
- 22. No person whatever, except the licensed and registered driver or conductor of any licensed vehicle, shall be permitted to ply for hire with the same. No driver or conductor shall leave his licensed vehicle while plying for hire, and no person shall tout or solicit passengers for him, and at all times shall be within such distance as to have full control of the horse or horses.
- 23 No person shall act as driver of any licensed vehicle who shall not be the full age of 17 years, neither shall any person act as conductor of any licensed vehicle who is not of the full age of 13 years.
- 24. Every proprietor of a licensed omnibus shall, whenever ordered by the licensing officer, provide a conductor for such omnibus, and shall be held responsible for the conduct of the conductor or conductors employed by him, and shall be liable for all the penalties which such conductor or conductors may incur under these by-laws.
- 25. No driver or conductor of a licensed vehicle shall lend or part with his license, nor shall the proprietor of any such vehicle employ any unlicensed person as the driver or conductor thereof; nor shall the driver cause or permit (except by order of the owner and consent of the licensing officer) any unregistered person to drive the licensed vehicle he has the charge or care of.
- 26. The owner, driver or conductor of any licensed vehicle shall not suffer any notice, advertisment or printed bill or any names or letters or numbers to appear upon the outside or inside of any such vehicle, if the inspector shall object thereto.

- 27. No driver or conductor of any licensed vehicle shall wilfully deceive any person in respect to the route or destination thereof, or for the purpose of taking up or setting down a passenger (except in case of accident or other unavoidable necessity), stop such vehicle upon any place, where foot passengers usually cross the caariage way.
- 28. No owner or driver of any licensed vehicle shall, when plying for hire, refuse or delay to admit and carry in and by his carriage the number of persons painted and marked thereon and specified in the license granted in respect thereof.
- 29. No owner or driver of any licensed vehicle having agreed or engaged to take any fare at any time or from any place shall delay, neglect or refuse to fulfil such engagement.
- 30. Every owner or driver of a licensed vehicle standing or plying for hire at any appointed public stand shall, on engaging to take a fare either by time or by distance, perform such engagement whether the distance to be travelled be within or without the bounds of the town of North Fremantle.
- 31. Every owner or driver of a licensed vehicle standing or plying for hire at any public stand, street, road or public place within the town of North Fremantle (except passenger vehicles licensed to ply along any specified route) shall, unless previously engaged (the proof of which engagement shall be on such owner or driver), be bound to take immediately (or provide some other licensed vehicle as a substitute) any fare not exceeding the number of persons which his vehicle is licensed to carry; and no owner or driver of any licensed vehicle shall refuse to carry thereby a reasonable quantity of luggage for any person hiring or desiring to hire any such vehicle nor shall refuse to drive the same to any place within the limits mentioned in this by-law, nor for any time not exceeding six hours if so required by any person hiring or intending to hire any such vehicle, nor shall fail to drive the same at a reasonable speed, not less than six miles an hour, unless unavoidably delayed or required by the hirer to drive at any slower pace, reasonable time being allowed for food or bait for horses.
- 32. The fares and rates to be charged by the owners and drivers of all licensed public passenger vehicles plying for hire within the town of North Fremantle and within nine miles from the corporate limits of the said town shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto marked A and shall be deemed to be the fares and rates which may be lawfully demanded, received or taken by the owner or driver of any licensed vehicle as aforesaid, provided that such fares and rates shall be inclusive of all charges for luggage not exceeding 28 pounds weight for each passenger.
- 33. The driver of any licensed vehicle shall, on being requested by any officer of the Corporation, police constable, passenger or intending passenger give such officer, police constable, passenger or intending passenger, his name and number of licensed vehicle; and when such vehicle (hansom cabs and hackney carriages excepted) is plying for hire within and for the town of North Fremantle shall also give, on request, to each passenger, on being taken up, a ticket showing the radius within which the vehicles ply at sixpenny fares, the name of the owner of the vehicle and its licensed number, which ticket shall be returned by the passenger on leaving the vehicle, except the passenger has some cause of complaint against the driver or owner or other person connected therewith, when he may retain the ticket and produce the same in evidence on the hearing of any charge arising out of any complaint.
- 34. The driver and conductor of every licensed vehicle shall not allow more than the number of persons for which such vehicle shall be licensed to be carried in or on such vehicle, nor shall any person but the conductor be allowed to ride on the steps or stairs of such vehicle. No person shall ride in or on such vehicle if informed by the driver or conductor that the same has the full number of passengers
- 35. Licensed vehicles known as hansom cabs when plying for hire within the town of North Fremantle shall not be allowed to carry more than two passengers at one time, exclusive of the driver.
- 36. No child under three years of age shall be counted as a passenger. Children over three years and under twelve to be considered half fares and charged only half price.
- 37. No driver of any licensed vehicle, when engaged as a whole vehicle, shall allow any person to ride on the box or in or upon any part of such vehicle without the permission of the person hiring the same.

- 38. No agreement whatever made with the owner or driver of any licensed vehicle for the payment of any more than his proper fare, as fixed or limited by law, shall be binding or held to authorise any overcharge whatever, where such vehicle is engaged and used when plying for hire in any public street, and any owner or driver demanding or receiving, whether in pursuance of any agreement or not, any sum exceeding the proper fare, the person paying the same shall be entitled, on complaint made against such owner or driver before any Justice of the Peace, to recover back the sum paid beyond the proper fare; and such owner or driver shall further, for such exaction, be liable for an offence against the provisions hereof.
- 39. Any person having hired or used or agreed to pay the hire of a licensed vehicle and not paying the legal fare at the termination of the journey or engagement or when demanded, shall, on conviction, before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay the fare together with a sum not exceeding ten pounds.
- 40. Any person having hired or engaged a licensed vehicle and refusing to pay the legal fare, after the scale of fares or copy of this by-law shall have been produced by the driver of the said vehicle, shall, upon being requested by the driver or police constable, give his proper name and residence, and any person refusing to do so shall be liable to a penalty for an offence against the provisions hereof.
- 41. Any person who shall wilfully cut or tear the cushions or break any window, or otherwise damage any licensed vehicle, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, in addition to the payment of the damage done to such vehicle.
- 42. The distance for which any charge shall be made shall be computed from the stand or place where the vehicle was bired, but in case the vehicle be taken from any place of public amusement the distance shall be computed from such last mentioned place, and not from the stand where the vehicle shall usually ply.
- 43. The driver of every licensed vehicle taking up or setting down a passenger at any place of public worship or public amusement, or at any public meeting, within the town of North Fremantle, or who is waiting for such purpose, shall act under the direction of the corporation officers or police constables who may be on duty at such place or places, as to the taking up or setting down or waiting for any passengers, and as to the order or place in which any vehicle shall stand, and shall perform his duty in a careful and quiet manner, and shall not push into or get out of the line or position fixed for the vehicle so as to endeavour to arrive at his place of destination before any other vehicle, the driver whereof, from its position, would have a prior right to take up or set down passengers.
- 44. Every driver whilst engaged in taking up or setting down any passenger shall, during such taking up or setting down, place his vehicle as near as conveniently may be to the curb at that side of the street at which the taking up or setting down is required, and shall assist such passenger with his luggage in loading and unloading the same.
- 45. The places set forth and described in any advertisement in one or more of the daily newspapers or in the Government Gazette shall be public stands where all licensed vehicles shall ply for hire and such stands or such other stands in such other places as the Council of North Fremantle may from time to time appoint (due notice of which shall be given by public advertisement in the Government Gazette or in one or more of the daily newspapers), shall be and continue the public stands of the town of North Fremantle for the purpose aforesaid during the pleasure of the said Council; and the said Council may from time to time abolish, cancel, or alter such stands, by it appointed, as may be deemed desirable, due notice of such abolition or alteration being given as required when fixing the same; and no person shall draw up or station his vehicle at any other place to ply for hire, nor shall any owner or driver ply for hire on any other stand than that for which his vehicle has been licensed to ply on, except by permission of the licensing officer; and all vehicles shall be considered plying for hire if upon any appointed stand.
- 46. Licensed vehicles shall take their station on the stand in the order of their arrival, the first on the front of the stand, and when any vehicle shall be called or shall be driven off any stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall draw up to the place vacated, and all other vehicles behind shall draw up in the like order.
- 47. The Mayor for the time being of the said town may appoint such and so many places in the town as from time to time he may deem necessary as temporary stands where licensed vehicles may ply for hire in addition to the usual

- and published stands; but such additional places shall be public stands only for such time as shall be set forth in an advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the said town of North Fremantle.
- 48. At every fourth vehicle on every stand there shall be left a space of eight feet at least for foot passengers to pass through, except the stands where the number of vehicles to ply thereon is fixed at a less number than seven, or where the space to be observed and kept between the vehicles defined in this by-law.
- 49. Each licensed vehicle plying from one appointed stand to another appointed stand, whether within the town of North Fremantle or not, must complete its journey, after starting, to the other stand in reasonable time and without turning round or leaving the proper line of road.
- 50. No owner or driver shall, except while standing on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any part of the town of North Fremantle, longer than may be absolutely necessary for loading or unloading, or for taking up or putting down passengers, nor shall cause any obstruction in any street or thoroughfare.
- 51. Any driver loitering in any street or roadway, or public place with his vehicle shall forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
- 52. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall suffer the same to stand for hire across any street, or alongside of any other licensed vehicle, nor obstruct the driver of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.
- 53. No driver or conductor shall at any time whilst loading, unloading or attending any licensed vehicle wilfully or negligently do, or cause or suffer to be done, any damage to the person or property of anyone or be guilty of any breach of the peace, misconduct or behaviour whereby a breach of the peace may be occasioned in any respect in such employment.
- 54. Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.
- 55. The driver of every licensed vehicle shall be constantly attendant on the same when standing on any stand or plying for hire or whilst under engagement, and shall remain with it, and shall not stand on the footways near the stand, and shall not place any vehicle or stand with any vehicle or ply for hire in any part of the streets or roadways within the town of North Fremantle other than on one of the stands; and if any licensed driver shall make any default herein he shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five pounds.
- 56. Any driver found asleep on his vehicle while such vehicle is on the stand or under engagement shall be deemed not to be in attendance thereon.
- 57. No owner or driver shall, while having the care of or being attendant upon any licensed vehicle, drive the same furiously, wantonly or carelessly; and shall not be drunk whilst driving or plying for hire; and shall not use any indecent, threatening, abusive or insulting language to any other driver or to any person hiring or applying to hire any vehicle, or conveyed in the same.
- 58. The driver of every licensed vehicle shall place a muzzle on the head of any horse addicted to biting employed by him and harnessed to such vehicle and keep the same thereon whilst on the stand or waiting for hire.
- 59. Every driver who shall feed any horse whilst on the stand waiting for hire shall use a nose-bag to contain the forage and shall not remove such horse's winkers during the time of feeding.
- 60. No driver shall carry, or knowingly permit to be carried, in any licensed vehicle, except to some police office or watch-house or direct to his own residence, any drunken or intoxicated person.
- 61. No driver shall carry, or knowingly permit to be carried in any licensed vehicle, any person so violently or noisily conducting himself, or otherwise so misbehaving as to occasion public annoyance, or annoyance to the passengers of such vehicle, or disturb the public peace.
- 62. No driver shall smoke any pipe or eigar whilst driving any licensed vehicle with passengers, nor shall any passenger smoke inside any licensed vehicle or whilst a passenger therein, unless he be the sole occupant thereof or shall have hired such licensed vehicle solely for his own use; nor shall any passenger smoke if he is an outside

passenger of any vehicle should any passenger by such vehicle object to such smoking; and the driver of any such vehicle shall, at the request of any passenger, require any other passenger to cease smoking, and in case of refusal of the driver's request, it shall be lawful for the driver of such vehicle there and then to remove the offending passenger from the vehicle and refuse to carry him further; and such passenger shall thereupon pay the driver the full fare as though he terminated his journey.

- 63. No licensed vehicle shall pass any other licensed vehicle proceeding in the same direction to or from the stand if the latter be proceeding on its journey at the rate of eight miles an hour; and no licensed vehicle shall immediately precede or follow another licensed vehicle or nurse or shepherd the same to the danger or annoyance of the passengers of either vehicle.
- 64. The driver of every licensed vehicle driving the same by any place of public worship during the hours of Divine service therein, on any Sunday, Christmas day, or Good Friday, shall drive such vehicle whilst passing such place of public worship at a walking pace.
- 65. No owner or driver of any licensed vehicle shall carry or permit to be carried in or upon any such vehicle any coffin containing the corpse of any deceased person above the age of two years or any child who died of any infectious disease, or any person labouring under any inside any licensed vehicle any loaded firearms, or any parcel or luggage having an obnoxious smell. And no dog or other animal shall be suffered to accompany any passenger in or upon any passenger vehicle, if objected to by any passenger thereby.
- 66. Every licensed vehicle plying for hire, or engaged after sunset and before sunrise, shall be provided with two proper carriage lamps, one being placed on each side of such vehicle, and the driver shall keep the same lighted whilst so plying or engaged for hire.
- 67. The owner or driver of every licensed vehicle plying for hire in carrying passengers shall have painted, so as to be distinct and legible, on the front glass of each of the lamps of the same, the licensed number of such vehicle in figures one inch at least in length, and shall keep the same so painted during the whole time that such vehicle shall ply for hire or be used for the conveyance of passengers, and such lamps shall be used only for and with the vehicle the licensed number of which shall be so painted upon them.
- 68. Every covered passenger vehicle plying for hire or engaged after sunset or before sunrise, shall be provided with a lamp or lamps inside such vehicle, so placed as to give a convenient and sufficient light inside, and the driver shall keep the same lighted whilst so plying or engaged for hire.
- 69. The driver of any licensed vehicle plying for hire within the town of North Fremantle, shall produce a copy of the fares on demand, and have a copy of the same fixed conspicuously inside his vehicle on the front panel thereof, or in such other part thereof as the inspector of vehicles may direct.
- 70. The owner or driver of any licensed vehicle wherein any property shall be left by any person hiring or using such vehicle shall, within eighteen hours next after the same shall have been so left, restore such property in the state which the same shall have been found to the owner thereof; or, if the owner cannot be traced, shall deposit such property in the office of the licensing officer, and if any owner or driver shall make any default herein, he shall forfeit such sum not exceeding ten pounds sterling, as the Justice or Justices before whom such complaint shall be made, shall award for an offence against the provisions of this by-law; and when any such property shall be deposited as aforesaid, the officer receiving the same shall give an acknowledgment to the depositer and make an entry and record thereof, and the property so deposited shall be returned to the person who shall prove ownership to the satisfaction of the said licensing officer. And if any property so found and deposited shall not be claimed by the owner thereof within six months after the date of the deposit—the property having been advertised in such manner as the Council may direct—such property may be sold by public auction and the proceeds thereof paid into the corporation funds. And the Town Clerk shall pay the person who found any such articles sold such sum as he is entitled to for depositing the same in the office of the licensing officer.
- 71. The owner of every licensed vehicle shall at all times, when plying or employing such carriage for hire, have the same in good order with the harness sufficient,

- perfect and in good condition, and the whole ready and sufficient for duty, with the driver and horse or horses fit and competent to perform any drive or distance that may be presumably required.
- 72. Every owner and every driver or conductor licensed under the provisions here of shall, at the time of his first obtaining a license, have delivered to him without any charge, a printed copy of this by-law; and every such driver, owner, or conductor respectively shall at all times have such copy or some other copy of this by-law ready to produce, and shall, on request, produce the same for perusal to any person using or hiring such vehicle.
- 73. It shall not be necessary, except upon request at the first licensing of any vehicle, to deliver to the owners or drivers of licensed vehicles, a printed copy of the by-law regulating licensed hackney carriages and vehicles.
- 74. No owner or driver of any vehicle or any other person shall obstruct or hinder any officer of the corporation or police constable in the execution of his duty.
- 75. For every offence against any provision of this By-law, except numbers 40, 52, 56 and 72, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to, and shall pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling, to be recovered in a summary way before any Justice of the Peace. Provided that, where by this by-law, any penalties imposed upon the owner and driver of any licensed vehicle for one and the same offence, only one prosecution shall be had or maintained for the recovery of such penalty against such owner or driver, at the option of the person prosecuting the same.
- 76. The words "Licensing Officer" or "Inspector of Vehicles" shall be understood to mean the licensing officer, or inspector of vehicles, for the town of North Fremantle. The word "wagonette" shall not be considered or deemed to mean an "omnibus." The word "owner" shall signify every person possessed of a beneficial interest in any licensed vehicle; the words "hackney carriage" shall mean a brougham or other like carriage, having a door on either side, with four wheels and two or more horses; and the words "licensed vehicle," when used in this By-law, shall signify and mean every description of public vehicle plying for hire within the town of North Fremantle, and licensed to carry passengers; "conductor" shall mean and include every director or other person, except the driver, who shall attend upon the passengers in any omnibus; "luggage" shall mean any goods (except explosives or dangerous or noxious substances) which do not exceed in weight twenty-eight pounds, or in bulk a cube of two feet. Whenever in this By-law the words "bounded by a straight line running northwards" or "southwards," the same shall be taken to mean, and shall mean, any portion of the said street through which the said line is said to run. And whenever in this by-law, with reference to any person, animal, matter or thing, any word or words is or are used importing the singular number or the masculine gender only, such word or words shall be understood to include several persons or animals as well as one person or animal, females as well as males, bodies corporate or politic as well as individuals, and several matters or things as well as one matter or thing, unless it be otherwise specially provided or there is something in the subject or context repugnant thereto.
- 77. No vehicle of any description shall ply or be used for hire for the conveyance of passengers within the town of North Fremantle without first having obtained a license for that purpose from the licensing officer appointed to issue licenses by the North Fremantle Municipal Council.
- 78. Any driver intending to stop his vehicle shall, before so doing, give notice of such intention by raising and waving either his whip or his hand in such a manner as to be observable by the driver of any vehicle following in close succession; and in turning his vehicle he shall do so at a walking pace.
- 79. Whenever the owner of any licensed passenger vehicle shall employ or permit any licensed person to act as driver or conductor thereof, such owner shall require to be delivered to him the original part of the license of such driver or conductor and shall keep in his possession such original license during the time such driver or conductor is employed by him as driver or conductor. In all cases of complaint affecting such licensed driver or conductor, the owner may be summoned to attend before a Justice of the Peace, and shall be required to produce the driver or conductor so complained against, and thereupon shall produce the original part of the license of such driver or conductor; and if the driver or conductor so complained against shall be adjudged guilty of the offence alleged against him, the

Justice may make or cause to be made, an indorsement upon such original part of the license, or duplicate license, or both, of such driver or conductor of the nature of the offence, and the amount of penalty inflicted, and cause intimation of such indorsement to be conveyed to the Town Clerk

- 80. The owner of any licensed passenger vehicle shall not employ or allow any person to act as driver or conductor of a licensed passenger vehicle unless such person shall produce his original and duplicate license. Any person falsely representing himself to be a licensed driver or conductor shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws, and numishable accordingly. and punishable accordingly.
- 81. Whenever any licensed driver or conductor shall leave the service of the owner by whom he has been employed for any misconduct in such service punishable under this by-law, such owner shall forthwith deliver to the Traffic Inspector the original part of the license of such driver or conductor, together with an intimation of the nature of such misconduct; but if such driver or conductor shall leave such service for any other cause than that aforesaid, then the owner shall forthwith return to such driver or conductor such original part of the license.
- 82. Before a license shall be granted to any person as a driver or conductor of a licensed passenger vehicle, a requisition written and signed by the applicant, must be handed in to the Traffic Inspector, giving name in full and place of residence, and shall further produce satisfactory certificates of good conduct, and, if a driver, of ability to
- 83. Licenses of drivers and conductors of licensed passenger vehicles shall be in the form of Schedule B to this by-law or to the like effect, and for every such license a fee of two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Inspector.
- 84. No owner shall entrust or hand over any licensed passenger vehicle of which he shall be the licensee to any passenger venture of which he shall be the hease to any person to let, use, drive, or ply for hire with the same, except in the capacity of servant to the said owner.
- 85. If upon inspection at any time by the Traffic Inspector, any licensed passenger vehicle, or the harness, or the horse, or horses used in drawing the same shall be found insufficient or unfit for public use, the Inspector may order the removal of such vehicle, harness, horse or horses from any stand, or from being used, or let for hire, and give notice to the owner or driver of such vehicle accordingly; and after receipt of such order or notice to the owner or driver, such vehicle, or harness, or horse or horses, shall not be used or let for hire until the same has been put in good order or repaired.
- 86. It shall not be lawful for any omnibus or other passenger vehicle licensed to ply for hire along any specified route to be taken off such specified route, to ply for hire or put down or take up passengers, and the driver or owner offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling.
- 87. Every licensed passenger vehicle shall be provided with proper aprons for outside passengers.
- Licensed drivers and conductors of passenger vehicles shall, whilst attending on their vehicles be clean and respectably dressed.

Persons calling or sending for cab and not further employing same, a charge of One shilling in addition to detention charges, or, at the option of the driver, the full fare from the place where the cab was engaged.

Detention Charges .- For every 15 minutes after the first five minutes, one shilling.

Additional charge of one-half above fares to be made between the hours of 10 p.m. and 1 a.m., and double fares between the hours of 1 and 5 a.m.

Half-fare allowed back, if distance exceeds two miles. The driver must before starting agree with hirer whether hiring is to be by time or distance; if such is not done, hirer to choose.

No extra charges for luggage if under 28 pounds; if over 28 pounds and under 56 pounds, half fare to be charged; and half fare for every additional 56 pounds.

In all cases for the purpose of a fare, the boundary shall mean either side of the named streets.

BY-LAW No. 10.

TO REGULATE THE LICENSING OF WAGONS, DRAYS, CARTS, OR OTHER VEHICLES FOR THE CARRYING OF GOODS AND MERCHANDISE, PLYING, KEPT, OR LET FOR HIRE, WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY.

Vehicles to be licensed.

- 1. From and after the passing of this by-law, no vehicle of any description whatever shall be permitted to ply for hire within the limits of the town of North Fremantle for the conveyance of goods or merchandise until the same shall have been duly licensed by the Licensing Officer of the said town by a license in the form in Schedule A hereto; and every owner of any vehicle who shall cause, allow, or permit the same to ply for hire in carrying goods or merchandise without first having obtained such license shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding two pounds: Provided that licensed cabs carrying travellers' luggage, shall be bound to produce such license.
- 2. No license as driver or conductor shall be granted to any person under the age of seventeen years.

Drivers to be approved by Licensing Officer.

3. No person shall ply for hire within the limits of the town of North Fremantle with any licensed vehicle for the conveyance of goods or merchandise until he shall have been approved of by the Licensing Officer of the said town as a fit and proper person to be a licensed driver or conductor, and shall have registered his christian and surname and also his place of abode in the office of the Licensing Officer, and shall have received from such Licensing Officer a certificate of approval in the form of the Schedule hereto marked B

Drivers not to be changed without approval of the Licensing Officer.

4. In the event of the owner of any vehicle licensed to convey goods or merchandise within the town of North Fremantle being desirous of changing the driver of such licensed vehicle, the owner thereof shall give notice to the Licensing Officer of such proposed or intended change, and previous to any change being made shall produce to the Licensing Officer the license for such vehicle, in order that the said Licensing Officer may (upon approval) insert thereon the christian and surname, and also the place of abode of the person intended to be registered for the time being as the driver of such vehicle.

Public stands for licensed vehicles only.

5. The places set forth and described in any advertisement published by the authority of the Town Council as public stands for vehicles that are licensed to carry goods and merchandise only shall be and are public stands where all such licensed vehicles shall ply for hire, and such public stands or such other stands in such other places as the Council of the town of North Fremantle may from time to time appoint, due notice of which shall be given by public advertisement in the Government Gazette or in one or more of the newspapers published in the town of North Fremantle, shall be and continue to be the public stands for vehicles only that are licensed to carry goods or merchandise until abolished by the Council of the said town; and every owner, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle licensed as aforesaid, who shall after such notice draw up or station such vehicle at any other stand, in order to ply for hire, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law, and upon conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding five pounds sterling, together with such costs and expenses as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard shall, in his or their discretion, deem proper to award.

Rates and fares.

6. The fares and rates for the conveyance of goods or merchandise by any licensed vehicle plying for hire within the said town, shall be those which are described in the Schedules hereto and no other.

Licensed vehicles and horses, etc., etc., to be in proper working order.

7. The owner of every vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise within the said town shall, at all times when plying for hire, have and keep the same in good and serviceable order, and the harness in sufficient and proper condition, the driver competent, and the horse or horses attached or harnessed to such licensed vehicle, fit and capable of performing any engagement that may be reasonably required.

$Driver\ of\ licensed\ vehicles\ to\ perform\ engagement.$

8. Every owner or driver of any vehicle licensed to convey goods or merchandise and plying for hire at or on any of the public stands within the said town, shall, on engaging to convey goods or merchandise, either by time

or by distance, perform such engagement, whether the distance to be travelled shall be within or beyond the limits of the town of North Fremantle; and every owner or driver of any vehicle licensed to convey goods or merchandise and plying for hire shall take immediately any employment tendered to him for the hire of his vehicle within the limits of the Municipality of North Fremantle, unless previously engaged (the proof of such previous engagement shall be on such owner or driver), or unless the employment tendered to him is manifestly unsuited to his vehicle, or unless he immediately find a substitute; but wilfully failing or refusing to take the employment tendered to him for the hire of his licensed vehicle within the limits of the town of North Fremantle shall be deemed a breach of this by-law, and the owner or driver of such vehicle shall, upon conviction thereof forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding forty shillings for such offence, together with such a sum for costs and expenses as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard shall, in his or their discretion deem proper to award.

Agreement for more than legal fare not binding.

9. No agreement whatever made with the owner or driver of any vehicle licensed for the conveyance of goods or merchandise for the payment of any sum over and above the rates and fares as described in the Schedule hereto shall be binding or held to authorise any overcharge whatever; and any owner or driver of any vehicle licensed for the conveyance of goods or merchandise demanding or receiving payment over and above the rates as fixed and described in the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law, and upon conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, together with such costs and charges as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard shall, in his or their discretion deem proper to award.

Overcharges may be recovered.

10. In case any person hiring any vehicle licensed to convey goods or merchandise being required by the owner or driver thereof to pay, or may or shall have paid, to such owner or driver thereof, whether in pursuance of any agreement or not, any sum exceeding the charges allowed and described in the schedule hereto, or any sum exceeding the legal charge, the person paying the same shall be entitled, on complaint being made against the owner or driver of such vehicle licensed to convey goods and merchandise before any Justice or Justices, to recover back the sum paid in excess of the proper and legal charges, together with such costs, damages, and claims for loss of time and expenses incurred as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard, may in his or their discretion deem proper to award.

Rates or fares chargeable.

11. The following rates or fares shall be chargeable:-

By time for drays and carts, wagons or vans, drawn by one horse, by the hour.

12. Removing furniture to be always paid by time, the carter being bound to use all reasonable expedition.

Time or distance to be at the option of the employer, except in case of removing furniture, the same to be calculated from the stand or place where such vehicle was hired, and an allowance of one shilling for each and every mile the vehicle is away from such stand or place when discharged or engagement terminated.

The carter shall in all cases assist in loading and unloading.

In case the carter is detained for more than ten minutes, a fare of Sixpence for a dray, or cart drawn by one horse, or Ninepence for a van or wagon drawn by two horses, for every 15 minutes, may be charged to the person hiring his vehicle.

Refusing to pay legal fare.

13. Any person who shall have hired a vehicle licensed for the conveyance of goods or merchandise from off any of of the public stands of the town of North Fremantle, and who, at the termination of the hiring or of the journey, shall refuse or omit to pay to the owner or the driver thereof the legal charges for such hiring or conveyance, as are described in the Schedules hereto, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law, and on conviction thereof shall forfeit and pay for such offence a sum not exceeding forty shillings, and in addition thereto shall pay to the owner or driver of the licensed vehicle the legal charges for the conveyance of the goods or merchandise, together with such costs, damages, and claims for loss of time and expenses incurred as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard may in his or their discretion deem proper to award.

Name of owner and licensed number to be painted on vehicle.

14. Every vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise and plying for hire within the town of North Fremantle, shall have legibly painted in Roman letters of not less than one inch in length on the right side or off side of such vehicle the name of the owner thereof, the number of the license thereof, and the correct weight of such vehicle, and shall keep the same at all times legible and conspicuous, and failing to do so shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, together with such costs and expenses as the Justice or Justices, before whom the case is heard, may in his or their discretion deem fit to order.

Order on stands.

15. Licensed vehicles shall take their station on the stands in the order of their arrival; and when any vehicle shall be called or driven off the stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall draw up in the place vacated, and all other vehicles behind shall draw up in like order.

Space of eight feet to be left at every fourth vehicle.

16. At every fourth vehicle on every stand, there shall be left a space of eight feet at least for foot passengers to pass through, and at every eighth vehicle, a space of 16 feet for vehicles to pass through.

Drivers to be in attendance on vehicle.

17. The driver of every vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall be, when plying for hire or under engagement, in constant attendance on his vehicle, and whilst in charge of such vehicle shall be and remain sober and orderly, and shall not wilfully or negligently do or cause or suffer to be done any damage to the person or property of anyone, or be guilty of any breach of the peace, misconduct, or misbehaviour whatever; and in the event of any owner or driver in charge of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise using any insulting, threatening, or abusive language to any other driver or other person, or so conducting himself as to create any noise, disturbance, or obstruction, it shall be lawful for the licensing officer to deprive such owner or driver (as the case may be) of his license, who, upon complaint made before any Justice of the Peace, shall be found guilty thereof.

No person but driver to ply for hire.

18. No person whatever except the registered driver of any wagon, dray, cart, or other vehicle, shall ply for hire with the same; nor shall any driver leave his vehicle to ply for hire or tout, or solicit hire for any vehicle.

Vehicle not to stand across street.

19. The driver of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall not suffer the said vehicle to stand across the street, or alongside any other licensed vehicle, neither shall he obstruct the driver of any other licensed vehicle in taking up or setting down any goods or merchandise, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other licensed vehicle from taking any employment tendered to him.

Forage bag and winkers to be used.

20. Every driver who shall feed any horse while harnessed to any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall use a proper nose bag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horse's bridle during the time of feeding.

Vicious horses to be muzzled.

21. The driver of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall place a sufficient muzzle over the mouth of any vicious horse employed by him, and shall keep the same thereon at all times whilst such vicious horse is harnessed to such vehicle.

Name of driver to be given up on demand.

22. The owner of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall, upon request made by the Licensing Officer, or any Police Officer, or any authorised person requiring the same, declare the name and place of abode of the driver of such vehicle.

Not to stand in street longer than necessary.

23. No owner or driver shall, except whilst standing on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any part of the town of North Fremantle longer than may be absolutely necessary for the loading or unloading thereof, nor shall cause any obstruction of any part of the said town.

Licensed vehicles to carry ropes and tarpaulins.

24. Every vehicle licensed to carry goods and merchandise within the town of North Fremantle when plying for hire shall at all times have ready for immediate use a proper canvas covering for the protection of goods and merchandise from inclement weather, together with such ropes and other appliances as be necessary for the competent performance of any engagement that may be reasonably required.

Who shall be deemed owner,

25. The owner of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise within the town of North Fremantle, who shall hereafter dispose of such licensed vehicle, shall register in the office of the licensing officer of the town of North Fremantle, the christian and surname of the purchaser, and his place of abode, and shall transfer to such purchaser the license of such vehicle; and failing so to do shall still be deemed to be the owner of such licensed vehicle and subject as such to all the provisions of this by-law as fully as if no change of ownership had taken place, and the person or persons in whose name or names a license shall appear to have been obtained shall be deemed to be the owner or owners of the licensed vehicle in respect of which the said license shall have been issued and subject in all respects to the provisions of this by-law, until such time as the transfer shall have been duly and properly registered.

Penalties.

26. For every offence against any provision of this bylaw, except sections Nos. 9, 13 and 14, the offender shall upon conviction be liable to pay a penalty not exceeding two pounds, together with such costs and expenses as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard may in his or their discretion deem fit to order, to be recovered in a summary way before any Justice of the Peace: Provided that where by this by-law any penalty is imposed upon the owner and driver of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or nierchandise for one and the same offence, only one prosecution shall be had or maintained for the recovery of such penalty against such owner or driver at the option of the person prosecuting the same.

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BY-LAW No. 11.

To regulate the Licensing of Porters and Handcarts.

- 1. No person shall use any wheelbarrow or handcart to carry, transport, or convey baggage, goods, or other things from place to place within the town of North Fremantle for hire, wages, or pay for such conveyance, or be at any hotel, boarding-house, ferry, steamboat, pier, railroad station or depôt and solicit strangers, travellers, or other persons to accept the conveyance of baggage or other articles without being licensed therefor by the Council: Provided that this provision shall not be construed to prevent any person keeping or wholly employed in any hotel, or boarding-house from conveying any baggage or other article to or from such hotel or boarding-house, and using a handcart or wheelbarrow therefor: Provided the name of the hotel or boarding-house and the name of the keeper thereof be painted distinctly on both sides of such wheelbarrow or handcart and on a badge worn on the front of his hat or cap so as to be easily and distinctly seen.
- 2. All licenses to handcarts granted as aforesaid, shall run for one year from the first day of January in each year, and may be renewed by the Council.
- 3. Every person receiving a license for a handcart as aforesaid shall pay to the Town Clerk, for the use of the Corporation funds the sum of five shillings for such license.
- 4. Every such licensed person shall wear in a conspicuous place about his person, so as to be easily seen, a brass plate or badge, on which shall be engraved the words "Licensed Porter" and the number corresponding to the number of his license, and it shall be unlawful for any other person to wear or exhibit any plate or badge purporting to be, resembling or similar to, the plate or badge of a public porter; and no public porter shall permit any other person to wear his badge or use his name in any way whatever in the transportation or conveyance of anything.
- 5. Licensed porters shall be entitled to charge and receive for the carrying or conveyance of any article the fees and charges set forth in the Schedule next hereafter.
- 6. No licensed porter shall be entitled to recover or receive any pay or fare from any person for the transportation of any article or articles, unless the badge be visibly worn and the rates fixed agreeably to the provisions contained in the Schedule to this by-law.
- 7. Upon the trial of any cause commenced for the recovery of any of the aforesaid rates or fares, it shall be incumbent on the plaintiff in such action to prove that the badge was worn and the prices fixed agreeably to Section 5 of this by-law, at the time the services were rendered for which the suit was brought.
- 8. No licensed porter shall refuse or neglect to transport any article or articles when required so to do, unless he shall then be actually and otherwise employed, or unless the distance he shall be required to go shall exceed two miles, under a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every such offence.
- 9. No licensed porter shall suffer or permit any other person than himself to carry any article or articles in his wheelbarrow or handcart, or to wear his badge, under a penalty not exceeding one pound sterling for every such offence.
- 10. If any licensed porter shall ask or demand any greater rate of pay or compensation for the carrying or conveyance of any articles other than is herein provided, he shall not be entitled to any pay for the said service, and to ask, demand, or receive any such greater pay or compensation shall be deemed a violation of this provision.
- 11. Any person representing himself as, or wearing or exhibiting any badge, inscription, card or device purporting or implying that he is employed or authorised by the keeper, proprietor, agent, or officer of any hotel, boarding-house, vessel, steamboat or railroad company, to solicit, receive, or convey baggage or other things to or from any such hotel, boarding-house, vessel, steamboat or railroad company's station or depôt without being duly licensed so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten bounds.
- 12. Every person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for the use of the said corporation a sum not exceeding ten pounds, except where a penalty is prescribed in any section of this by-law.
- 13. No person under the age of seventeen years shall be licensed as a porter.

- 14. The following shall be the fees chargeable by porters:—
 - Any distance within a quarter of a mile, if carried by hand
 - Any distance within half a mile, if carried by
 - If carried on a wheelbarrow or on a handcart or other conveyance, whether drawn by a horse or otherwise, within a quarter of a mile ...

 If carried on a wheelbarrow or on a handcart or
 - If carried on a wheelbarrow or on a handcart or other conveyance, whether drawn by a horse or otherwise, exceeding a quarter of a mile
 - and within half a mile... If the distance exceeds half a mile and is within one mile, one-half the above rates in addition thereto, and in the same proportion for any greater distance.
 - In no case the maximum charge for luggage to exceed 2s. to any one person.

BY-LAW No 12.

TO REGULATE THE LICENSING OF HAWKERS.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person without being licensed as herein provided, to hawk for the purpose of trading, or carry about for sale, within the town of North Fremantle, any flesh meat, fish, fruit, vegetables or other provisions, or any beast of burden, or in any cart, dray, wagon, truck, or other vehicle drawn by horses, oxen or other animals, or drawn or pushed by hand, or in any pack or basket.
- 2. Licenses in the form in the Schedule hereto may, in the discretion of the Town Clerk, be issued to any person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend with a cart, dray or wagon on payment for the same of a fee of five shillings per quarter, and to any person applying to be licensed to hawk with a handcart, barrow, truck or other vehicle, or with a pack or basket, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence per quarter; and the Town Clerk shall keep a register of the names of such licensed hawkers and where the Town Clerk, in the exercise of the discretion hereby given to him, shall refuse a license to any person applying for the same under this by-law, it shall not be necessary to assign any reason for any such refusal.
- 3. Every person applying for a license to hawk under this by-law shall submit for the approval of the Town Clerk the cart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck or other vehicle proposed to be used for such hawking purposes, and obtain the approval in writing of the Town Clerk for the use thereof; and no licensed person shall without the like approval, use for hawking, any other vehicle, or any approved vehicle after making any addition thereto, or alteration thereof.
- 4. Every person licensed shall have exposed to public view while hawking, on his licensed vehicle, truck, pack or basket, his name and licensed number, and the words "Licensed Hawker" painted in legible and conspicuous Roman letters not less than one inch in length, and of corresponding width, and no person hawking shall be allowed to stand in any street or thoroughfare without first obtaining leave of the Council.
- 5. Every unlicensed person hawking goods who shall expose any name on any vehicle, pack or basket, purporting to be the name of the licensed person, and every licensed person who shall omit to show to any inspector or other officer of the Corporation or police constable, on demand, his license for hawking; or shall neglect to have painted on his licensed vehicle, pack, or basket the name, number and words aforesaid, or fail to keep them legible and conspicuous; or shall, without the approval in writing of the Town Clerk, use any other vehicle than that which has been approved by him, or use such approved vehicle after making any addition thereto, or alteration thereof, without first obtaining the like approval and generally every person offending against any provision of this by-law, shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding two pounds.
- 6. The Council may from time to time, as it shall deem expedient, forbid hawking in any street or streets or other places, within the town of North Fremantle and the corporate limits thereof.
- 7. The Town Clerk may in his discretion, refuse to grant a renewal of any hawker's license, and in so doing shall not be compelled to give any reason for such refusal.
- 8. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish or vegetables within any part of the town of North Fremantle without having first obtained a license from the Council.
- 9. Any person who travels and trades on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the limits aforesaid, any of the articles or things aforesaid, shall be deemed to hawk the same.

- 10. No person shall keep, manage, or conduct at any moveable or temporarily fixed stall, in or near any street, for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise unless such persons be licensed.
- 11. Licenses for stall-holders shall be in the form in the schedule.
- 12. No person to whom a hawker's or stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license to any person, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself.

BY-LAW No. 13.

FOR CARRYING INTO EFFECT THE WIDTH OF TIRES ACT, 1895.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person engaged in building, constructing, selling, or making vehicles to build, construct, or make, sell or hire, or offer for sale or hire, any vehicle unless the width of the tires of such vehicle shall be in the following proportion to the diameter of the axlearms of such vehicle, viz.:

When the diameter of the axle-arm is 2 inches the width of the tire shall be 3 inches

- 2. No person shall import into the Municipality of North Fremantle any vehicle the tyres of the wheels of which vehicle are not of the width presented or specified by the preceding by-laws, and if such vehicle be imported, no person shall use or employ it upon any public road within the colony.
- 3. Any person offending against the provisions of either of the two preceding clauses of this by-law shall be liable on conviction before any two Justices of the Peace to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
- 4. Vehicle means and includes any wagon, dray, cart, or lorry but does not include any vehicle intended solely to carry passengers.
- 5. Every vehicle in use on any public road shall have the diameter of the axle arms painted on some conspicuous part on the off side thereof; and the owner of any vehicle who neglects to have such measurements painted as aforesaid or who has the same so painted incorrectly, shall upon conviction, forfeit and pay for each and every such offence a sum not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 14.

TO REGULATE THE USE OF LICENSED WEIGHBRIDGES.

- 1. All hay, straw, coals, firewood and bark to be hereafter sold, bartered or exchanged within the Municipality shall be weighed at some weighbridge within the said Municipality, licensed for that purpose by the Council thereof; and any person selling or offering for sale within the Municipality any hay, straw, coal, firewood or bark by any weigh-note, except one obtained from some licensed weighbridge within the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding five pounds.
- 2. Every person selling within the Municipality any hay, straw, coal, firewood or bark shall, when requested by any Inspector of Weights and Measures or other officer of the Corporation, or any police constable or other persons authorised in that behalf, produce the weight-note of the load or part of the load of any such articles as aforesaid, for the satisfaction of such Inspector or other person; and any person refusing or omitting to do so when so requested shall for each offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding two pounds.

- 3. Any carter or other person refusing or omitting, on being required by the purchaser to take to the weighbridge in the Municipality nearest the place where such goods may have been sold or offered for sale, or to any other weighbridge in the Municipality, at the option of the purchaser, the dray, cart, or other vehicle, after the delivery of the load, for the purpose of such dray, cart, or other vehicle being re-weighed, and the tare weight thereof when empty ascertained, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding five pounds, and shall also forfeit and pay a like penalty if he shall refuse to produce to the purchaser the weight-note of any load or quantity purchased or of the dray, cart or other vehicle when empty.
- 4. Any carter or other person selling within the Municipality, any hay, straw, coal, firewood or bark, and neglecting or omitting on delivery thereof, to give to the purchaser the weight-note of any load or other quantity so sold, shall forfeit and pay for every such neglect or omission a sum not exceeding five pounds.
- 5. Every person selling withing the Municipality any hay, straw, coal, firewood or bark, shall, upon being requested by the Inspector of Weights and Measures or other authorised officer appointed by the Council, forthwith re-weigh such hay, straw, coal, firewood or bark, as the case may be, at the weighbridge in the Municipality nearest to the place where such request shall be made or at any other weighbridge in the Municipality at the option of the said Inspector of Weights and Measures, or other officer, and in his presence if he shall so require, the said Inspector of Weights and Measures, or other officer, paying the expense of such re-weighing, unless on such re-weighing the former weighing be found incorrect, when the person selling shall pay the expense of such re-weighing; and any person so selling and refusing or omitting so to re-weigh, shall, for each refusal or omission, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five pounds.
- 6. Any person within the said Municipality selling or delivering, or causing or permitting to be sold or delivered, any goods, wares or merchandise of any kind whatever, under the weight or measure at or for which such goods, wares or merchandise shall have been sold, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the sum of forty shillings.
- 7. The owner, proprietor or keeper of any weighbridge within the Municipality giving a false or incorrect weight of any dray, cart or other vehicle, or of any load or part of a load of goods thereon, shall, upon proof thereof, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 15.

To REGULATE THE SALE OF BREAD.

- 1. A notice shall be conspicuously placed in every shop or other premises where bread is offered or exposed for sale, containing the words "bread weighed on delivery"; and all bread shall be sold by avoirdupois weight only, and, except as to fancy bread and as next mentioned, shall be weighed in the presence of the party purchasing the same if required by the purchaser.
- 2. No person shall deliver or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread under the weight at or for which it shall have been sold.
- 3. Every person who shall carry out bread for sale, or deliver in a cart or other vehicle, shall constantly carry therewith correct beam and scales, with true weights of the standard; and all bread, except fancy bread, so sold or delivered, as in the clause contained, shall be of full weight, and shall be weighed in the presence of the party purchasing same, if demanded, or of the inspector or officer next mentioned, if present.
- 4. It shall be lawful for any inspector of weights and measures, or other officer of the Corporation of the said town, to enter into and upon any premises where bread shall be sold or exposed for sale, to weigh or ascertain the weight of any bread, and if the bread so exposed for sale, or carried about for sale or delivery, shall be deficient in weight according to the weight per loaf at which bread is professed to be sold, then the person who shall expose, offer for sale, or carry for delivery any such bread under weight as aforesaid, or the person in whose service such last mentioned person may be, shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay the penalty hereinafter mentioned.
- 5. Any person offending against any or either of the provisions of this by-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding five pounds: Provided always that any prosecution under this by-law, in respect to the delivery of bread under weight, shall be commenced within twenty-four hours next after such delivery.

BY-LAW No. 16.

To regulate the Driving of Camels and Horned Cattle.

- 1. No camel shall be driven, ridden, or led along, or across any street, except by special permission first had and obtained from the Town Clerk, which shall embody the conditions as to the route to be observed by the owner, driver, or other person or persons who may have the charge of such camel.
- 2. No horned cattle, whether intended for sale or for slaughter, and no camels or unbroken horses, whether roped or not, shall between the hours of eight of the clock in the forenoon and twelve of the clock at night, during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, or between the hours of six of the clock in the forenoon, and twelve of the clock at night, during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April, be driven, conducted, or led along, across, into, or through any terrace, square, street, lane, court, or alley, within the limits of the said town, and any person who shall drive, conduct or lead, or cause to be driven, conducted or led, by tethering ropes, halters or appliances other than good or sufficient reins or yokes, any cattle, horses, or camels, contrary to the provisions of this by-law, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to any milch cow going to or returning from depasturing or watering.

BY-LAW No. 17.

- To RESTRICT THE BREAKING-IN OF HORSES IN THE STREETS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES RELATING TO HORSES.
- 1. No person shall break in any horse, mare, gelding pony, mule, ass, or camel in any street or thoroughfare of the town of Fremantle, either by leading, riding, or driving, the same
- 2. No person shall lead or exhibit, or cause or suffer to be led or exhibited, any entire horse through or in any street or public place within the Municipality, between the hours of eight of the clock in the forenoon and six of the clock in the afternoon.
- 3. No person or persons, either as owners or otherwise, in charge of any entire horse, or ass, shall cause, allow, permit or suffer any such entire horse or ass to cover any mare within the Municipality, or to cause or permit, or allow or suffer any such entire horse or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other place with any mare for the purpose of allowing such mare to be covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from the public view; and any person offending against any portion of this by-law, shall forfeit and pay for such offence, on conviction, a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 18.

- TO REGULATE THE CONDUCT OF PERSONS HAVING THE CONTROL OF ANIMALS OR VEHICLES ON THE STREETS OF THE TOWN.
- 1. No person shall at any one and the same time act as driver, or have the sole charge of more than one cart, dray, or other vehicle drawn by animal power on any public road or street of the Municipality, and no person under the age of 17 years shall act as the driver of any vehicle within the Municipality. No person shall drive any vehicle drawn by animal power within the Municipality between sunset and sunrise, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on each side of the front of such vehicle. Any person infringing this clause shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
- 2. Every person who shall drive any horse or other animal drawing any waggon, dray, cart, or other such carriage without springs, at a faster rate than a common walk, through, over or along any street, road or thoroughfare in the town of North Fremantle, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
- 3. Every person who shall ride or drive any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, at more than a walking pace round the corners formed by the junction of any public or private street, in the town of North Fremantle, with any other street in the said town, or across the intersections of any of the streets of the town, shall, for every offence, forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding two pounds: Provided always, that this clause shall be taken to be in force only as regards those street corners or intersections where the Council shall have caused to be placed in some conspicuous place at or near such corner, a notice requiring the public to ride or drive round such corner at a walking pace.

4. No person shall leave or allow to stray, any horse, ass, mule, ox, cow, goat or camel, or any vehicle to which may be attached and harnessed any animal, or unattended in any street, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, and any Corporation officer or police constable may seize and remove any such animal or vehicle to the nearest public pound, police office, or corporation yard or premises; and the person so leaving such animal or vehicle shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding two pounds in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

BY-LAW No. 19.

To regulate Processions and, at certain times, General Traffic.

- 1. No procession of persons with or without vehicles (except for funeral, military, or public purposes), shall parade or pass through any street unless and until the previous consent, in writing, of the Mayor, or, in his absence, the Town Clerk, shall be first had and obtained, and then only by the route or at the place or places specified in such consent, nor until the recipient of such consent shall, if required, have paid the cost of giving public notice, by advertisement, setting forth the particulars of such route.
- 2. Every person who shall wilfully disregard or not conform himself to the regulations or directions made in that behalf by the Council for regulating the route of horses, carts, carriages, or persons, during the time of public interest, amusement, or excitement in the town of North Fremantle, and for preventing obstructions during such times, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.
- 3. The driver of any private carriage taking up or setting down passengers at any place of public worship or public amusement, or at any public meeting or gathering within the town of North Fremantle, or who is waiting for such purpose shall act under the direction of the officers of the Corporation or police constable, who may be on duty at such place or places, as to the taking up or setting down or waiting for any passengers, and as to the order and place in which any carriage shall stand, and shall perform his duty in a careful and quiet manner; and any person refusing, failing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this by-law, or who shall wilfully disregard and not conform thereto, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.
- 4. Any person congregating with others in any street or footway within the said town of North Fremantle, so as to obstruct the free passage and traffic through, along, or upon the same, who shall refuse or neglect to move on so as to cease from and discontinue such obstruction upon being requested so to do by any police constable or officer or by any inspector or other officer of the Corporation, such person so offending shall ferfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 20.

To Regulate the Use of Bicycles or other Velocipedes, and Perambulators.

- 1. Throughout this by-law the expression "bicycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede; the expression "bicyclist" means a person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede in any street, roadway, or footway, within the town of North Fremantle.
- 2. Every bicyclist within the town of North Fremantle shall observe the rules of the road as laid down respecting vehicular traffic. A bicyclist shall not ride nor impel his bicycle upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made or set apart for the use or accommodation of foot passengers.
- 3. Every bicyclist who rides a bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry, attached to his bicycle, a lamp, which shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of such bicycle.
- 4. Every bicyclist when riding or propelling a bicycle shall carry or have a bell large enough to be heard at a distance of 50 yards, and such bell shall be kept continually ringing.
- 5. No person using a bicycle or having charge thereof, shall leave the same at any one time in or on any street or footway within the said town or for a greater length of item than 30 minutes.

- 6. Not more than two bicyclists shall ride abreast, and only one bicyclist shall pass a carriage or person at the same time
- 7. No bicyclist shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving, nor pass round corners at a greater speed than three miles an hour.
- 8. In every case where a bicyclist meets or overtakes any wagon, cart, carriage or vehicle, or any horse, mule, or other beast of burden, and where by reason of such meeting or overtaking, any animal drawing such wagon, cart, carriage, or vehicle or such horse, mule, or other beast of burden, may become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such wagon, cart, carriage or other vehicle, or of such horse, mule, or other beast of burden, such bicyclist shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary to avoid accident.
- 9. Every person propelling or using any perambulator, or other form of vehicle in which children are usually conveyed, in or along any footpath, shall keep to his or her right hand side and no such perambulator or vehicle shall be propelled or allowed to remain abreast or alongside any other such perambulator or vehicle. No person shall leave any perambulator on any footpath, but shall place the same on the roadway next to the kerb. Any person offending against this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 21.

- TO REGULATE THE USE OF ADVERTISING VANS, THE THROWING OF HANDBILLS AND BILL POSTING.
- 1. No person shall, without the written consent of the Town Clerk, drive or cause to be driven through or along any street any cart, carriage, van, or other vehicle with advertisements posted thereon, used or intended solely for advertising purposes.
- 2. No person shall throw or discharge any handbills or other printed matter in or upon any street, or in or upon any premises adjoining any street.
- 3. Every person who is desirous of posting handbills or other form of advertisement on the walls or other parts of the town, where the same is allowed, must make application to the North Fremantle Municipality for a license for so doing, and the same, if the party is approved of by the Town Council, shall pay a monthly fee of five shillings for such permission; but in no event shall it be lawful for any bill poster to post any bills or other form of advertisement on any public fence or the walls of any public building in the said town, nor upon the walls of any private houses, unless he shall first obtain the consent of the owner or occupier of such house or other premises.

BY-LAW No. 22.

TO REGULATE THE STORAGE OF PETROLEUM AND OTHER VOLATILE FLUIDS.

- 1. No greater quantity than one hundred and fifty gallons in the whole of petroleum, naphtha, turpentine, or other similar volatile fluid or fluids, shall be placed or retained at one and the same time in any one building, and the yards, offices, and appurtenances thereof, unless in any building which shall be situated at a distance of not less than one hundred feet from any other building, and which shall be of the description following, that is to say, either a shed, divided into compartments of moderate dimensions, well ventilated at the top, and have the floor thereof sunk to any depth that may be preferred, not being less than three feet, and being surrounded by an area of two feet wide, and of a depth and capacity sufficient to contain the surplus fluid contents of such shed over and above the quantity thereof which would be contained by the space between the sunken floor and the ground level; or a ground floor shed, properly ventilated at the top, surrounded by a trench three feet deep by two feet wide, at a distance equal to the height of the walls of such shed, having guiding drains into the said trench, down which, in case of fire, the burning liquid may flow into the said trench, and surrounded beyond such trench by a brick wall, without break or opening, and of not less than half the height of the walls of such shed.
- 2. Any person, who, being the occupier, or having the use and control of any building or tenement, of whatsoever description within the town of North Fremantle (not being a building situated and constructed in manner described in the first section of this by-law) who shall place, or cause or permit to be placed, or allow to remain, within such building or in yards or in offices at any one and the same time a quantity of any one or more of the volatile fluids specified

in this by-law greater in aggregate measure than one hundred and fifty gallons shall, upon conviction of every such offence before any one or more of the Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than ten pounds. Provided that no second or after prosecution for the placing or retaining of any one and the same quantity of such fluids, contrary to the provisions hereof, shall be commenced on the same day as the preceding complaint shall have been made.

3. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic spirits.

BY-LAW No. 23.

- TO REGULATE THE STORAGE OF HAY, STRAW, FIREWOOD, EMPTY CASES, SHAVINGS, AND OTHER INFLAMMABLE MATERIAL.
- 1. No person shall stack in quantity within the Municipality any hay, straw, thatch, reeds, coal, or firewood without having properly constructed buildings and premises, and in such places as shall be approved by the Council.
- 2. No person shall stack or store empty cases, paper shavings, crates packed with straw, or any dangerous or inflammable substances in the open air or in sheds, without having first obtained the consent of the Council. Any person infringing this by-law, on conviction, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 24.

FOR THE PREVENTION OF FIRES.

- 1. The occupier of any premises within the Municipality whereof any chimney flues shall take fire from having been suffered to become foul, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding two pounds.
- 2. Any person who shall burn rubbish of any kind without having three hours previously left with the Secretary of the North Fremantle Fire Brigade a written notice of his intention so to do, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 25.

FOR REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION OF BUILDINGS.

1. The several words mentioned in the second section of "The Building Act, 1884," shall, where used in these bylaws, have the same construction as is provided for by such section, except that the words "Council," "Mayor," "Town Clerk," and "Surveyor" shall mean the Council, Mayor, Town Clerk or Surveyor, respectively, of the Municipality of North Fremantle.

Notice of intention to build.

2. Every person intending to commence to build, take down, alter, add to, or repair any building, or to do any act whereby any public street may be obstructed or rendered dangerous or inconvenient to persons passing over or near thereto, shall give three clear days' notice in writing to the Surveyor of his intention so to do, and shall deposit drawings and specifications of the proposed works. Such notice shall be delivered at the Surveyor's office, and shall contain particulars of the site and nature of such intended building, work, or other act. The Surveyor is authorised thereupon to grant a license in the form prescribed in Section 7 of this by-law, and to give such directions as he shall think fit for the erection of hoardings or fences, and a platform and handrail for the protection of passengers, and such directions shall be complied with to the satisfaction of the Surveyor before the commencement of such building, work, or act, but such license shall not be issued until all fees and deposits have been paid. Every breach of this clause shall subject the person guilty of such breach to a penalty of five pounds, and a further penalty of one pound for each day the same continues, recoverable in a summary manner before Justices.

Deposit of materials on public street.

3. Every person wishing to deposit any stones, bricks, lime, rubbish, timber, iron, or other material upon any public street, or to make any excavation on any land abutting on or adjoining or contiguous to any public street, shall first make application for and obtain from the Surveyor a license so to do. Such license shall be given in the form prescribed in Section 7 of this by-law, after all fees and such deposits as the Town Surveyor may require shall have been made. Any infringement of this clause shall subject the person guilty of such infringement to a fine of five pounds for every day such infringement continues, to be recovered in a summary manner before Justices.

Hoardings to be kept in repair.

Every person who shall be required to erect any hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail under the two last preceding by-laws shall keep the same in good and sufficient repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor so long as it shall, in his opinion, be necessary for the public safety; and every such person shall, immediately upon receipt of notice from the Surveyor that such hoarding, fence, platform or handrail is out of repair, and requiring him to repair same, forthwith repair the same to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall be liable to a penalty of one pound for every day the same shall continue in disrepair after the receipt by him of such notice.

Hoardings, etc., to be lighted.

5. Every person erecting such hoarding, fence, platform or handrail, or obstruction of any kind in the public street, or any excavation as aforesaid, shall cause the same to be well and sufficiently lighted at night, and shall be liable to a peralty of One pound for every night on which the same is not so lighted.

Party walls.

6. All partitions between separate houses or other buildings erected or altered in future, whether such houses or other buildings shall belong to one or more owners, shall be of not less than 12-inch stone or 9-inch brickwork, and shall entirely separate the woodwork of the two roofs. said party wall shall be carried up at least 9 inches above an iron roof and 15 inches above a shingle roof. Any person neglecting to comply with these provisions shall incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Form of license.

7. Licenses under Sections 2 and 3 shall be in the following form :-

NORTH FREMANTLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Hoarding License and Building Permit.

CONDITIONS.

Fee.—Shall be Five shillings per month, payable in advance.

Area.—Shall be restricted to a frontage of......lineal feet, a maximum width of......feet, height......feet.

Hourding and Gangwey.—Shall be strongly and securely constructed of materials, and to a design, to be approved by the Surveyor, and maintained in good condition throughout the currency of this license, and at any time the Surveyor may, if he think fit, order an alteration or addition to be made to the hoarding for the better protection and convenience of the public.

Lighting.—A sufficient light shall be displayed and maintained at the exterior angles of the hoarding each night from sunset to sunrise.

Advertising.—No advertisement, sign, placard, or device shall be posted on the hoarding without the written consent of the Surveyor.

Obstructions.—The gangway and water channel shall at all times be kept clear throughout.

Sanitary.—Before commencing to build, a privy shall be erected for the use of workmen, and all the requirements of the sanitary authorities strictly complied with.

Reinstatement.—At the expiration of the period for which this license is granted, or sconer if possible, the hoarding shall be cleared away, and the footpath, kerbing, channelling, and roadway made good to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

Deposit.—As additional security for the satisfactory performance of the last-named condition the licensee has deposited the sum of with the Town Clerk.

Walls, etc.

8. Every wall constructed of brick or of stone or other similar substance shall be properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar or cement, and no part of such wall, except coping, shall overhang any part underneath it, and all return walls shall be properly bonded together.

Hoarding license and building fees.

- 9. There shall be paid to the Municipality in respect of the services of the Surveyor, the following sums:— $\,$
 - For every building containing 300 square feet or less of floor space—five shillings.
 - For every building containing over 300 square feet of floor space—a sum calculated at the rate of two shillings and sixpence for every 100 square feet of floor space
 - For every addition or alteration to be made in any building after the roof has been covered in—one-half of the above fees.
 - For inspecting dangerous structures by direction of
 - the Mayor—twenty shillings.
 For each permit given to erect hoardings enclosing portion of footway or roadway—five shillings for a period of one month, or for any shorter period.

Roofs projecting over footway.

10. Any owner or occupier of any house, shop, door, or other building, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall construct or have any cornice, crane, hoist or any other fixture or projection, overhanging or upon any footway or thoroughfare, save and except any awning, projection, or erection, whether fixed or not, in the nature of an awning, approved of in writing by the Mayor, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, any sum not exceeding five shillings and a like sum for every day during which such offence shall continue.

Erection of aasometers.

11. It shall not be lawful for any gasometer or any apparatus for the generation or storage of gas to be within 30 feet of any other building, and any person by whose act default or sufferance any gasometer or apparatus mentioned, and any other building shall be erected nearer to one another than 30 feet, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every day during which such offence continues.

Power to Surveyor to enforce preceding By-laws.

It shall be lawful for the Surveyor, without reference to the Council, to take immediate steps to enforce any of the preceding by-laws, and he may cause any such hoarding or other obstruction that has been erected without his license, or which has been erected or continued in breach of the conditions of any such license, to be removed, or any such excavation to be filled in, or injuries to the public street repaired at the cost and expense of the person erecting or making the same, and such costs and expenses shall be recoverable from the person so making the same as well as the penalties hereinbefore imposed.

BY-LAW No. 26.

TO REGULATE THE ERECTION OF VERANDAHS AND SIGN BOARDS.

- Any person desiring to make or erect any verandah, awning, or other projection overhanging the footway of any street in front of his shop, house or premises, shall apply for permission so to do in writing, to the Council, and shall, at the same time, furnish a plan and specification of the proposed work.
- 2. No person shall place, hang, or suspend in any street within the town of North Fremantle, being not less than 66 feet wide from building line to building line, any signboard or other sign, showbill or showboard which shall project a greater distance than three feet; and in all other streets of less width than 66 feet, two feet from the wall of any house, shop, store or other building, except as herein-after permitted. The Council shall have power to withhold permit or license without giving any reason whatever for so doing.
- 3. Any person may place, hang, or suspend across the footway in any street in the said town, where such footway is sheltered by a verandah, a sign, showbill or showboard extending from the wall of any house, shop, store or other building to which such verhandah is built, to the inside of the exterior edge of such verandah, after having first obtained a permit from the Council for that purpose
- 4. Any person may place or fix a sign on the exterior or outer edge of any verandah erected over the footway of any street after having first obtained a permit from the Council for that purpose.
- 5. Any person erecting or using a sign shall be solely responsible in the event of any accident occurring through the falling or otherwise of such sign.
- Any signboard erected before the coming into force of this by-law shall not be allowed to remain unless the requirements of this by-law be complied with.
- 7. No signboard or other sign, showbill or showboard, erected under the second section of this by-law shall exceed in width or depth two feet six inches; and under the third section of this by-law the width or depth of one foot three inches; and under the fourth section of this by-law the height of two feet six inches; and no signboard or other sign, showbill or showboard, erected under the second and third sections of this by-law, shall be placed, hung, or suspended at a lesser height than eight feet in the clear from the surface of the footway to the under side of the sign, showbill, or showboard.
- Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions to the footways or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered within such time as shall be notified

by the Council, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Council or otherwise, or any person, whatsoever, interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Council in effecting any such removal, or offending otherwise against any of the provisions of this by-law, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 27.

To compel the Filling up of Cellarways and Openings under Footways.

- 1. No trap-door, or cellar-flap, or covering over any stair, vault, or cellar-way or opening shall be made or fixed so that the covering to such stair, vault, or cellar-way, or opening, except fixed gratings, for which permission has been granted by the Council, shall project on or over any portion of the footway of any street within the town of North Fremantle.
- 2. All openings, ways, cellar-flaps and trap-doors projecting on or being in or under any footway in the said town shall be removed, and all cellars and openings in or under any footway shall be filled up and made level with the footway to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, except fixed gratings for which permission has been granted by the Council.
- 3. Any person offending against either of the provisions of this by-law shall for every offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 28.

TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO FOOTPATHS AND OTHER COUNCIL PROPERTY.

No person without first having obtained the written sanction of the Council, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, injure or deface any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implement, materials, buildings, or other property of the Council or under the control thereof, and any person who shall offend against the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 29.

FOR THE PUNISHMENT OF PERSONS DEPOSITING RUBBISH ON ROADWAYS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

- 1. Any person who shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street or roadway or public reserve within the town of North Fremantle, without having first obtained from the Council a permit so to do, shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 2. Where any building materials, rubbish or other things shall be laid, or any hole or excavation shall be made, in any of the streets within the said town of North Fremantle, the person depositing or causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or the said hole or excavation to be made, shall, at his own expense, cause a sufficient light to be fixed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise during the time such materials, hole or excavation shal remain; and such person shall, at his own expense, cause such materials, rubbish or other things, hole or excavation, to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such materials and other things shall be removed and the hole or excavation filled up or otherwise made secure; and in case such person shall refuse or neglect so to light, fence or enclose such materials or other things, or such hole or excavation, he shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.
- 3. Any person by whose Act, default or sufferance any stone, sand, gravel or other material shall fall from any vehicle on to the surface of any roadway, footpath or any other public place, or who shall otherwise allow any such material to be laid, cast or thrown on to any roadway, footpath or other public place, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 30.

To prevent Foot-paths being obstructed by Goods, Merchandise, or other Articles.

1. Every person who shall permit any goods, wares, merchandise, boxes, cases, coal, firewood or other articles to remain or be on any foot-way, or on any street in the town of North Fremantle for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

2. No person shall place, hang up, or otherwise expose any goods, wares, merchandise, matter or thing whatsoever so that the same shall be or project upon, into or over, any footway beyond or outside the doorway, window, stall-board or show-board, in front of or adjoining any house, shop, building or erection at which the same shall be so exposed; and any person so offending shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 31.

TO PREVENT THE THROWING OF DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES AND THE BEATING OF CARPETS ON STREETS.

- 1. Any person who shall cast or throw orange peel or any other vegetable or dangerous substances or sweeping of paper and other matter, or any offensive or noxious substance, upon any footpath or street within the town of North Fremantle, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.
- 2. Any person who shall beat or shake any carpet, rug, or mat, or shall sweep or throw anything whatsoever in any street after the hour of eight o'clock in the morning, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

BY-LAW No. 32.

For the Removal of Branches of Trees overhanging Footways.

Any branch or branches of trees growing on private property overhanging or overlapping any footway, public crossing or land, which is in any way dangerous or inconvenient to the public, shall, if ordered by the Council, be removed by the owner or occupier of such property, and if not so removed, the person offending shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and for every day such branch or branches remain unremoved after the expiration of time given for removal the person or persons so offending shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five shillings.

BY-LAW No. 33.

TO PREVENT CATTLE STRAYING ON STREETS.

- 1. No person shall suffer or permit any kind of swine or any horse, ass, camel, mule, bull, steer, cow, sheep, goat or other cattle belonging to him or under his charge to be at large in any street or public place within the town of North Fremantle.
- 2. Every person who shall offend against this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 34.

FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF GOATS TRESPASSING ON STREETS AND OTHER PLACES.

- 1. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public street, or within any public enclosure, may be forthwith, by any officer of the Corporation, seized and destroyed.
- 2. The carcase of every goat destroyed as aforesaid shall be forthwith removed and buried in such place as shall be by the Council set apart for that purpose.
- 3. The owner of any goat which shall have been seized and destroyed as aforesaid, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding two pounds in addition to the costs and expenses incurred in the removal and burial of the carcase.

BY-LAW No. 37.

To prescribe the Manner in which certain Walls or Fences shall be erected.

- 1. Whenever the Council shall require the erection of a fence or wall abutting on any street or public place, the same, if a wall, shall not be less than 12-inch stone or 9-inch brickwork, and four feet six inches in height, and if a fence, shall be a 2-rail picket fence and not less than four feet six inches high, and the same shall be either a close picket fence or an open picket fence, as the Council may determine.
- 2. Any such wall or fence shall be erected in a thoroughly workmanlike manner, and to the entire satisfaction of the Surveyor.
- 3. Any person offending against this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 38.

FOR REGULATING BATHING AT CERTAIN PLACES.

- 1. The Council shall have power to authorise the erection of bathing houses, sheds and machines, and all rules and regulations appertaining to same shall be submitted to the Council for their approval or otherwise before such authority is given.
- 2. No male person shall bathe at any portion of the sea beach or of the fore shore of the Swan River forming the boundary of the Municipality of North Fremantle, except at such places as the Council may, from time to time, by resolution, set apart for the purpose, and no female person shall so bathe, except at places so set apart for females. Such resolution shall distinctly describe the places so set apart, and posts defining such places shall be set up and notices written, painted or printed, shall be displayed at such places, setting forth such regulations or directions as the Council may think proper.
- 3. All bathers shall have the body clothed from the waist to the thighs with bathing trunks.
- 4. Any person wilfully exposing himself when undressing for the purpose of bathing, or before dressing after having bathed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
- 5. Any person damaging, defacing, altering, removing, throwing down or in any way interfering with any notice board erected by the authority of the Council, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, and shall also be liable to make good any damage done.
- 6. No person shall commit a nuisance at any bathing house or shed. $\,$

7. Any person or persons contravening any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding five pounds, and it shall be lawful for any constable or Municipal officer, without warrant, to arrest any person so offending, and to carry him before any Justice of the Peace to be dealt with according to law.

BY-LAW No. 39.

TO REGULATE THE LICENSING OF DANCING ROOMS.

- 1. No person or persons shall use any premises as a dancing saloon unless the same be licensed for that purpose by the Council.
- 2. The term for which each registration shall be made shall be twelve months, dating from the first day of January in each year.
- 3. The payment to be made to the Town Clerk for each such registration, and for every renewal thereof, shall be five pounds, but if any such registration shall, for the first time, be made in the second, third, or fourth quarter of the year, the sum payable for such first registration shall be correspondingly reduced to three-quarters, one-half or one-fourth of the sum of five pounds.
- 4. Any person offending against the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
- 5. The conditions of registration, and of every renewal thereof, are as follows:—
 - (1.) The external or party walls of the building must be of stone or brick.
 - (2.) There must be upon the premises, privies in equal number for males and females with proper partition, those for the one sex from those of the other, and in the proportion, at the least, of one privy for every twenty persons, in the extent of the number of persons which the dancing room or saloon shall be calculated to accommodate. In the privy apartment for males, urinal accommodation must also be provided, and such privies and urinals must be kept at all times clean and inodorous, and the floors and seats must be scrubbed clean in the forenoon of each day after which there shall be, or shall have been any person dancing in the dancing room or saloon.
 - (3.) There must be hat and cloak rooms and a separate lavatory for persons of each sex, and such lavatories must be provided with a constant supply of water and with all necessary utensils and appliances for washing hands and faces.
 - (4.) Every room to be registered as a dancing room or saloon must contain at the least 10,000 cubic feet of air; must have its ceiling at least 14 feet high from the floor; must have fixed in its walls, and with free access to the outer air, open ventilators in the proportion of at least 12 square inches of outlet and 12 square inches of inlet ventilation (exclusive of doors, windows, and fireplaces) for every 500 cubic feet of the internal space of such room. Such ventilators must be kept at all times open and unobstructed, and the premises throughout, with all their conveniences, appliances and utensils, must be kept at all times in good repair, order, efficiency and cleanliness.
 - (5.) The premises throughout must at all times be open to inspection by anyone or more of the officers of the Council or of the local Board of Health, who may, by the said Council or Board, be authorised to inspect dancing rooms or saloons.
 - (6.) The number of persons which any such dancing room or saloon shall be registered as capable of accommodating, shall be in the proportion of eight persons for each space of ten feet by twelve feet of floor space.
 - (7.) The hour for closing dancing rooms or saloons shall be not later than eleven o'clock p.m., and no such room or saloon shall be re-opened before the hour of eight o'clock in the morning of the next succeeding week day, nor shall any such room or saloon be opened on a Sunday.

BY-LAW No. 40.

To restrain the Keeping of Houses of Ill-Fame, Dog-fights, Prize-fights, etc.

1. Any person acting as the proprietor, and any person having a chief control or management or being the occupier of any brothel within the town of North Fremantle shall forfeit and pay the sum of five pounds, and

- a further sum not exceeding one pound for every day during which such person shall, after notice from any Inspector appointed by the Council to desist, continue to act, control, occupy, or manage any brothel as aforesaid.
- 2. Any person letting any house knowing that such 2. Any person letting any house knowing that such house is about to be used by the tenant thereof as a brothel, and any person who shall knowingly and wilfully continue as a tenant of any house, any person who shall keep such a house as a bawdy house, brothel, or house of ill-fame, shall forfeit and pay a sum of five pounds, and a further sum of one pound for every day during which such person is continued as a tenant after notice to eject from any Inspector appointed by the Council.
- 3. Any person engaged in or assisting, instigating, aiding or abetting at any prize-fight, dog-fight or cockfight within the town of North Fremantle shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.
- 4. The owner, lessee, tenant, occupier, or any person or persons using any gaming table, or who shall engage or assist in any description of gambling within the said town shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.
- 5. The owner or occupier of any premises who shall permit or allow any prize-fight, dog-fight, cock-fight, gaming or gambling of any description to take place or be carried on upon such premises within the said town shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 41.

FOR THE PUNISHMENT OF PERSONS FALSELY REPRESENTING THEMSELVES TO BE OFFICERS OF THE CORPORATION.

Any person falsely representing himself to be an officer of the Corporation of the town of North Fremantle shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 42.

FOR FIXING PENALTIES FOR BREACH OF BY-LAWS.

Any person guilty of an offence against any by-law of the Council for which no penalty is specially provided shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within 100ft. of any inhabited dwelling house, public street, or roadway within the Municipality, and shall not in any case keep such swine so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to public health, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.
- Every goat found straying at large in any street, road, or public place, or within any public enclosure, may be forthwith, by any officer of the Corporation, seized and destroyed.
- 3. The carcas of every goat destroyed as aforesaid shall be forthwith removed and buried in such place as shall be by the Council set apart for that purpose.

The owner of any goat which shall have been seized and destroyed as aforesaid shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £2, in addition to the costs and expenses incurred in the removal and burial of the carcass.

On confirmation of the above amended By-law the previously existing By-law is hereby repealed.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

R. CECIL CLIFTON,

Under Secretary for Lands.

1. All stock imported into Western Australia from the Australian Colonies and New Zealand shall be exempt from Section 13 of "The Stock Diseases Act of 1895," and shall be admitted to the Colony on the certificate of a Government Inspector, in addition to a declaration by the owner or breeder of he stock, or manager of the farm or station from which they come, to the effect that such stock were, at the time of departure from their farm or station, and had been for three months immediately preceding, to the best of his belief, free from disease, and had not, for such period, been in contact with diseased animals.

If coming from beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand, stock shall perform the following periods of quarantine:—

Sheep				14 days
Horses				14 ,,
Cattle				30 ,,
Camels				40 ,,
Pigs				30 ,,
Dogs				6 months
Goats,	Deer,	Llama,	and

And if, during the period of quarantine, any signs of disease is exhibited, then, if not ordered to be destroyed, such stock shall be kept in quarantine for such period as the inspector shall direct, and treated as he shall deem necessary.

- 2. All sheep and cattle intended for immediate slaughter may be landed on the permit of an inspector, and removed to such place as he may direct, and shall not be again removed alive without his written permission.
- 3. No stock which may lawfully be imported shall be landed at any port other than Fremantle, Albany, Champion Bay, Cossack, Eucla, Esperance, and Bunbury, unless they shall have been first inspected and passed by an inspector of stock at any one of the aforesaid ports.
- 4. All stock found on arrival by an inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be forthwith destroyed or kept and treated in quarantine, as such inspector shall direct.
- 5. No person shall enter or leave a quarantine ground without the permission of an inspector, in writing, and every person who shall enter shall, if the inspector so directs, disinfect himself and his clothes in such a manner as the inspector shall order.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the quarantine ground, including the Perth Zoological Gardens.

6. All expenses of landing, removing to, maintaining, and keeping in quarantine; and of disinfecting or otherwise treating any stock, and all expenses in connection therewith, shall be paid by the owner or consignee of such stock to the inspector upon demand, and before such stock shall be removed from quarantine.

- 7. All expenses of destroying any stock, or of disinfecting or destroying any fodder or fittings, shall be paid by the owner or consignee thereof to an inspector upon demand.
- The owner or consignee of any stock, fodder, or fittings shall deposit with the inspector, upon demand, such sum of money as shall be deemed by such inspector sufficient to defray all the expenses of inspection, maintenance, disinfection, medicine, attendance, transhipment, or conveyance to or from the quarantine ground of such stock, fodder, or fittings respectively; of disinfecting the vessel or conveyance in which such stock, fodder, or fittings shall have been conveyed to the Colony, or to or from a quarantine ground; veterinary surgeon's fees for inspection, and all costs, charges, and expenses of every description in connection with or attendant upon the introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings. If such sums be not forthwith paid on demand as aforesaid, such stock, fodder, or fittings may be sold by an inspector for the purpose of defraying such expenses, fees, costs, and charges.
- 9. Any stock found at any time to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or suspected by the inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or affected with tick, or lice, or any parasite, may be seized by an inspector and placed in quarantine, and there treated as the inspector may direct, at the owner's expense, until clean; or if the disease should be of such a nature that, in the opinion of the inspector, such stock should be destroyed, the inspector shall report the case to the Minister, who may order the destruction of such stock at the owner's expense.
- 10. An inspector, on finding stock infected with disease, may, as he shall think fit, declare such portions of the land on which such stock may be found at the time of the discovery of the disease a quarantine area, within the boundaries of which such stock shall be kept in quarantine, or, at the discretion of the inspector, be transferred to some proclaimed quarantine area until declared clean by an inspector.

Provided that the whole amount of fees for inspection of any one shipment by the same owner shall not exceed £5.

12. The Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission in writing to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first mentioned land, for stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land

within the Colony for the purpose of depasturing or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one, time; provided that such stock shall not, by reason of such permission, become "introduced" stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission.

- 13. Any owner intending to introduce any cattle by land into Western Australia shall give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector of Stock in the district into which they are to be introduced, in the form of Schedule A hereto, such notice to be delivered not less than seven days before the introduction of such cattle, and shall produce a certificate of a duly qualified Government inspector that such cattle have been successfully inoculated against pleuropneumonia immediately prior to their departure for Western Australia.
- 14. The crossing place for stock in the Kimberley District, via South Australia, shall be at the Ord Station; and the crossing place for stock in the Eucla District, via South Australia, shall be where the present road from South Australia crosses, about eight miles North-East from Eucla.
- 15. No stock adjudged by an inspector to be diseased shall cross the border into Western Australia, and any person so introducing such diseased stock shall be subject to a penalty of Five pounds per head.
- 16. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two hundred pounds, or imprisonment not exceeding six months where not otherwise provided.
- 17. Whenever any expenses, fees, costs, or charges have been incurred by an inspector under these Regulations, he may sell the stock, fodder, or fittings in respect of which the same were incurred, for the purpose of defraying all or any such expenses, fees, and charges.
- 18. An inspector, on suspecting any animal to be affected with tubercolosis, may subject such animal to the tuberculine test, and the owner, if required by the inspector, shall render all necessary assistance to facilitate the operation.
- 19. Any person who, without the written authority of the Chief Inspector of Stock, carries, collects, keeps, or sends through the Post Office or otherwise, or is in any way knowingly concerned in the carriage, collection, keeping, or sending of any ticks or eggs of ticks shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds on conviction.
- 20. Any inspector may at any time enter upon any run and inspect and examine any stock wherever in the Colony they may be, and exercise and discharge all the powers and duties conferred upon him by the Act in any and every part of the Colony, and, in the exercise and discharge of such powers and duties, shall have free ingress, egress, and regress through, over, and upon any run; and the owner of any stock shall, when required by an inspector, forthwith muster his stock in some convenient place, or places, as the inspector may direct, for his examination. The inspector, if he is not satisfied that the whole of the stock on the run have been so mustered, may employ any person or persons to assist him in the thorough examination of the run, and the expenses of and incident to such an examination of the run shall be paid by the owner of the

THE SCHEDULE.

2. The Explosives on the said Mine shall be stored in a "Main Magazine" and "Distributing Magazine" as hereinafter defined.

3. A "Main Magazine" shall consist of-

- (a.) A building situated on the surface of the ground and at a distance of 100 yards from any other building, works, or public road; provided that the magazine shall be surrounded by substantial mounds of earth, at least four feet thick, at a height level with the eaves of the building; or,
- (b.) An excavation in the ground; or so arranged that the roof of the magazine shall not be less than 15 feet below the surface of the ground; or,
- (c.) A drive or chamber in the upper level of the workings of the mine, connected with the surface by an independent air-pass; the passage connecting such magazine with the workings of the mine shall describe in its course at least one right angle, and the magazine shall be situated at a distance of 60 feet from any travelling road or underground thoroughfare, unless, in the opinion of the Inspector, owing to the nature of the country, this distance may be reduced, but in no case shall the distance be less than 30 feet. Of whichever of the above types the Main Magaon whenever of the above types the Main Magazine may consist, its construction, lining, and ventilation shall be such as approved by the Inspector, and shall be protected by doors so secured and constructed as to render it secure against unlawful entry.
- 4. A Distributing Magazine may be situated in any working level of the mine, and shall consist of a drive or chamber, situated at least 30 feet from any travelling road, and separated therefrom by a door so fitted and placed as to secure from unlawful entry.
- 5. The quantity of explosive to be stored in a Main Magazine of construction (a) shall not exceed 500lbs., or of construction (b) shall not exceed 2000lbs., and of construction (c) one week's supply, as required by the work of the mine, provided that-
 - The quantity required for one week's supply shall be certified to by the Inspector, who may in his certificate make reasonable allowance to provide for such possible increase (not exceeding 1000lbs.) as may be necessary to meet the exigencies of work in the mine.
- 6. The quantity of explosives allowed in any Distributing Magazine shall not exceed the supply required for one working day in the level in which the Distributing Magazine is situated.
- 7. No explosives shall be taken into any working face except in a securely covered case or canister, nor in any quantity exceeding what would be required for use during one shift in such face.
- 8. Detonators shall in all cases be stored apart from other explosives.
- Every Main Magazine shall be in charge of a man 9. Every Main Magazine shall be in charge of a man specially appointed for the purpose, who shall have in his possession the keys of the magazine, and who shall be responsible for the safe storage of explosives contained therein; and the distribution of all explosives from any Distributing Magazine shall be under the supervision of an authorised person who may be one of the men at work in such level.
- 10. In the event of the closing of any mine, or part of a mine, the explosives stored therein shall be removed, and shall be disposed of as directed by the Inspector.
- 11. The storage of explosives generally in the mine shall be under the direction of the Inspector, who shall at any time have access to, and right of inspection of, any magazine or receptacle in connection with the mine.
 - 12. No naked light shall be used in any magazine.
 - 13. No charge shall be made up in any magazine.

Interpretation.

14. The "Inspector" shall mean any Inspector of Mines or other official who shall hereafter be appointed to carrs out these Regulations; "Explosives" shall mean any explosives within the meaning of "The Explosives Act, 1895;" "Shift" shall mean eight working hours; "Working Day" shall mean 24 working hours, or three shifts.

Special Rules under an Act to provide for the Regulation and the Inspection of Mines and Collieries.

> Department of Mines, Perth, 9th August, 1899.

THE undermentioned Special Rules to be observed at "The Collie Coalfield Proprietary Company's Colliery," in the Collie River Coal Mining District, Western Australia, are now published in conformity with the provisions of Section 43 of "The Mines Regulation Act of 1895."

Special Rules for the conduct and guidance of the persons acting in the management of "The Collie Coalfield Proprietary Company's Colliery," in the Collie River Coal Mining District, Western Australia, and of all persons engaged in, at, or about the said Colliery, whether employed by the Manager or by Contractors under his supervision.

- 1. An employee, on obtaining work at the Colliery, shall be supplied with a copy of the Special Rules, for which he shall give a receipt.
- 2. All persons employed in, at, or about the mine will not only be bound to comply and observe these rules, but are also bound to enforce their observance upon others; failing which they will subject themselves to the penalties imposed by the Mines Regulation Act in force at the time.

COLLIERY MANAGER.

3. The colliery manager shall have full charge and control over all persons employed, and of all operations in, at, or about the mine, and shall regulate the work thereof. He shall comply with the requirements of the Mines Regulation Act, and shall, to the best of his ability, employ only efficient officers for positions of responsibility, and competent workmen for carrying on the work of the mine. He shall periodically ascertain the amount of the ventilation in the mine, and cause the same to be recorded in a book kept at the Colliery Office for the purpose, and signed by the person making the record. He shall, when necessary, order locked safety lamps to be used throughout any district or by any individuals, and shall appoint a competent person to examine the lamps.

OVERMAN.

4. In the absence of the manager, the overman, who shall have daily supervision, shall have full control and charge of the mine and of all persons employed in, at, or about the colliery; he shall personally, or by his assistants, give all necessary instructions to the men and boys in the mine respecting their work, and shall be responsible for the due observance of the rules and regulations of the colliery. He shall see that the air crossings, courses, and stoppings are in good repair, and that an adequate amount of ventilation is constantly supplied to the men, and should it be ascertained that any dangerous discharge or accumulation of inflammable gas has taken place in any part of the mine, he or his subordinate officers shall see that the miners be withdrawn from such parts, and he shall adopt such measures as may seem to him most advisable for the immediate removal of the gas. He shall also cause to be put up, on all entrances to such part or parts of the mine, a danger signal, back from the said danger, beyond which all persons are prohibited from passing, except with the distinct sanction of the manager, overman, or fireman, and then only with a locked safety lamp. The overman shall, as soon as possible, report all occurrences to the manager.

- 5. If at any time fire-damp exists in any part of the mine in sufficient quantity to show a blue cap on the flame, or if by reason of the presence of carbonic acid gas (or choke-damp) being found in any part of the mine, all miners must instantly leave that part of the mine, and at once inform the overman or manager.
- 6. He shall see that the air furnaces and ventilating appliances are kept in good repair and carefully attended to. He shall examine daily, or as often as practicable, the state of the roof in the main roads and working places, and in the event of such roof being found insecure, he shall cause the same to be repaired at once. He shall also see that an adequate supply of timber is sent to the appointed stations within the mine, and that such places are properly and securely timbered. If from any cause the condition of the roof in any place is found dangerous, unless the same can be immediately remedied, the men shall be withdrawn, and he shall cause a danger signal to be placed across the road, beyond which no ordinary workman must pass without permission from the manager, overman, deputy, or fireman.
- 7. If at any time it is found necessary to work any bord, stall, or heading in the mine with locked safety lamps, no shot-firing shall be allowed before the place shall be examined by the overman, deputy, or fireman, or any other person specially appointed by the manager to act in such capacity, and he or they alone shall be the person or persons duly authorised to fire the shots; and if the place contains fire-damp in such quantities as to show a blue cap on the safety lamp, no shot shall be fired while the ordinary miners are within the mine, and then only if the gas has been removed. In any place worked with safety lamps the shot shall be prepared and fired in the manner directed by the manager or overman only.

The overman shall immediately report to the manager any breach of the provisions of the Mines Regulation Acts, or of these special rules, by employees, or any accident, danger, or defect in the working places or appliances, and shall record the result of his daily inspection in a book provided for this purpose.

8. The night overman shall receive his instructions nightly from the manager or overman, and he shall, so far as practicable, observe the same rules and regulations as the overman, and he shall have, during his shift or during the absence of the overman, full control over all persons employed and working in the mine

DEPUTY.

9. The deputy, where employed, shall at all times be subject to the manager or overman, from whom he shall receive his instructions. He shall see that the men are provided with timber, and that the wheelers, trappers, and others strictly obey his lawful instructions, and, in the overman's absence, he shall have full control over all persons employed in his particular district, and see that the provisions of the Act and Special Rules are complied with. He shall also report to the manager or overman any danger that may from time to time arise either from inflammable gas or insecurity of roof, and in their absence he shall take such steps as he may think most desirable for the security of the workmen and of the mine. He shall also, without fail, report any disobedience or violation of rules, and shall, subject to the instructions of the overman, have full and sole control over the men and the amount of labour to be performed by each person employed. Any deputy failing to perform these duties will be considered to have committed an offence, and shall be liable to dismissal.

FIREMAN.

- 10. The fireman shall, once in every shift, and before the men enter the mine, after having once found the presence of fire-damp, carefully examine with a safety lamp the whole of the working faces and travelling roads. He shall cause to be written with chalk the day of the month in every working face so examined, and if, in his opinion, any danger is apparent, either from inflammable gas, insecurity of roof, or other cause, he shall cause a danger signal to be put up, and no person shall be admitted to work in such place until the said danger is reported to the overman or manager, and removed.
- 11. He shall also make a true report of, and enter and sign daily in a book kept at the colliery office for the purpose, the state of the mine, roads, doors, stoppings, and ventilating appliances. shall instantly suspend any workman who passes the appointed station without his permission, and if he discovers any place or district to be dangerous or unsafe from the presence of inflammable or noxious gases, or other causes, he shall suspend all operations, remove all persons to a place of safety, and report the danger to his superior officers, and shall take such precautions as he may deem necessary to prevent workmen from entering or re-entering the place or district found dangerous, except for the purpose of removing the danger, until such place or district has been restored to a safe condition. He shall, during working hours, watch the ventilation and condition of roads, stoppings, airways, brattice, doors, and working places in his district, so as to reasonably insure the safety of all persons therein. He shall immediately report to his superior officer any breach of these rules and of any regulations that may be issued by the manager, in respect of shot-firing. Where safety lamps are in use, he alone, and in the manner prescribed by the manager, shall fire shots in his district; before doing so he shall examine the place where the shot is to be fired, and satisfy himself that the place is free from accumulation of gas, and that the shot might be fired with safety. He must on no account fire a shot if he considers from any cause that it would be unsafe.
- 12. He shall once in every week examine, so far as is practicable, the state of the waste workings and main airways, and make and sign a true report of the state thereof in a book kept at the office for the purpose.
- 13. In the deputy's absence he is empowered to act on his behalf, and shall report any important occurrence, disobedience, or violations of rules on the part of any employee, to the manager or overman.

COLLIERS AND WORKMEN.

- 14. No workman shall pass the station appointed for his district, unless authorised by the fireman, and any person failing to observe this rule will be dismissed.
- 15. No collier shall enter his working place, or any other part of the mine, if the same be barred with cross timbers or a danger signal. On first entering his working place he shall satisfy himself that it has been examined and found safe. If he does not observe the fireman's mark on the face, he will on no account commence his work, but shall at once return to the station and report the circumstance to the fireman, overman, or manager, and await instructions before returning to his working place. In addition to the examination by the fireman or other officials, miners and others are required to satisfy themselves as to the condition of the working places,

- and if they consider there is any danger, or if they discover any defect, they shall at once discontinue work. No workman shall on any pretext ride on the skips.
- 16. Every collier or other person employed in, at, or about the mine shall, in all matters relating to the working of the mine or safety of the workmen, strictly obey the orders of the manager, overman, deputy, or fireman, or any other person for the time being in charge of the mine or part of the mine. Every collier shall, when leaving his place of work, take care that no candle, lamp, or matches be left in his own place or any other workings that he may pass through or by, unless it be under the care of some person, nor shall he leave any gunpowder loose or unsecured, or under any pretext enter any part of the mine other than the working place where he is immediately employed, without having first obtained distinct permission to do so from the manager or the overman.
- 17. Every collier shall securely uphold the coal whilst holing, and shall prop up and secure the roof and sides of the bord, stall, or heading in which he may be employed, for a distance not exceeding twelve feet back from his working face, and if he should not be provided with sufficient quantity of timber, he shall cease working and report the deficiency to the manager, overman, or person in charge. It shall be the duty of every workman employed in any part of the mine to inform the person in charge of the workings of the existence of any choke-damp or firedamp, or any insecurity of roof, shaft, or any other part of the mine, or of any air-door being damaged or left open, immediately on its being observed by him. No miner must incur any risk or danger, but shall instantly withdraw until the defect be remedied.
- 18. No workman shall injure any air-course, crossing, brattice, or stopping, or leave open wholly or partly any door, whereby the ventilation of the mine may be effected, or do any other act whereby the lives of the men or the property of the owners may be endangered. Should a miner tap old workings or waste, he shall at once close the opening, and inform the manager or overman.
- 19. The seam of coal or other mineral shall at all times be worked strictly in accordance with the directions issued by the manager or his overman, and any workman disregarding this provision will be liable to dismissal.
- 20. In all cases involving the use of safety lamps, every person using the same shall satisfy himself that they are securely locked, and are otherwise in good order and repair. No unauthorised person shall open any lamp, and any person having in his possession, when using any safety lamp, any matches, tobacco, pipes, or any contrivance whatever by which he could open his safety lamp, shall be instantly dismissed, and his offence shall be reported to the Crown authorities for punishment. The smoking of tobacco in any form is not permissible when safety lamps are in use. At any time when the safety lamps require to be relighted, they shall be brought to the nearest lamp station provided, where a person, duly appointed by the manager, shall be in attendance to re-examine, light, and relock the lamp. If at any time through accident, or otherwise, a lamp is found to be defective, he shall extinguish it by withdrawing the wick, and return it to the lamp station, where alone the defect shall be remedied, or another be obtained in its place. Safety lamps must not be placed within two feet of the swing of the pick, and the greatest care must be taken to prevent these lamps from being injured.

- 21. All workmen using safety lamps will be responsible for their condition, and shall be required to give to the lampman a satisfactory explanation as to the cause of any defect that may be found, and, in default, he shall be deemed guilty of negligence, and will be liable to dismissal, and will be reported to the Government Inspector of Collieries.
- Where safety lamps are used, no person shall fire a shot except those specially appointed by the manager for the purpose, and the person appointed shall first satisfy himself that the operation can be conducted with safety; and all miners shall strictly obey the instructions of the manager, overman, deputy, or the shot-firer as to the method of dressing the coal before the shot shall be fired, and every precaution must be taken in order to avoid and lessen the risks of accidents caused by blown-out shots, that the same shall be assisted by holding well under the seam, and also uicking, shearing, or cutting where necessary. No shots shall be tamped with dry coal dust, but with some other moist and non-inflammable material. No person shall on any account ignite gas.
- 23. No shot that has missed fire shall on any account be untamped, and no person shall approach any working place where a shot has missed fire until a period of at least one hour has elapsed from the time it was lighted.
- 24. In other parts of the mine where shot-firing shall be allowed to be carried on by the miners, it shall be subject to the regulations as to tools and preparing the coal (as above), and to any further regulations that may from time to time be issued by the manager.
- 25. No person shall go beyond a danger signal, except those having special instructions from the management.
- 26. No person shall on any account be permitted to take the tools of another, and every one shall refrain from quarrelling, fighting, using obscene or profane language, inciting men or boys to disobedience, impeding work, or using any words whereby a breach of the peace may be occasioned. No person shall enter the mine intoxicated, or bringing intoxicating drinks to the works, or interfere with, or disobey the orders issued by the manager or overman.
- 27. Except the manager, no person or persons shall be permitted to place restrictions upon the amount of wages, or the amount of labour to be performed by the different workmen at the mine; and any person violating this rule, or, as aforesaid, interfering in any way with the orders issued by the manager, overman, or any other person for the time being duly in charge of the mine, shall be liable to dismissal without notice.
- 28. No person shall carry a greater quantity than eight pounds of gunpowder into the mine at one time, which shall be kept or carried in a secure tin or can. No steel or iron rammer shall be used. No person shall carry a naked light attached to his cap on his head whilst handling explosives, or in charging his holes for blasting.
- 29. Except those in charge of a train, no person shall ride in or out of the mine on a full or empty skip, or train of skips.
- 30. Any person employed in or about the mine, who shall violate or infringe any of the foregoing rules, shall be liable to dismissal without notice.

WHEELERS.

31. The wheelers shall diligently attend to the requirements of the colliers, and carefully attend to their horses, and shall also see that the harness is kept in a good state of repair, and will be answerable for any damage they may cause thereto. They shall also prohibit trappers from leaving their doors or riding upon the skips, and shall immediately report any insecurity of roof or road, or any damage that may have been accidentally caused, or that they may observe, to any air-crossing, door, or brattice, to the overman or person in charge. They shall at once report any appearance of gas in the roadways or working places.

TRAPPERS.

32. The trappers shall constantly remain at their respective doors, and see that they are carefully opened and closed as occasion requires. They shall also on no account ride upon the skips, leave their post, or follow the wheelers, and shall report immediately any defects in the doors to the overman or person in charge.

SET RIDER.

33. The set rider shall carefully attach the ropes to the set, and inspect the connections, etc., etc.; and if any defect is discovered, he shall at once report the same to the overman or person in charge. He shall permit no person to ride on the full or empty sets, and upon any person refusing to comply with his orders in this respect, or in any other way violating this rule, he shall immediately report the circumstance to the manager or overman.

FURNACE MAN.

34. Any person in charge of the furnace shall see that the fires are always kept in vigorous operation during the working hours, and that the bars are clean between shifts. He shall not allow any hot ashes to accumulate in the mine, and if any stoppage should occur in the ventilation he shall at once report the circumstance to the manager or overman.

MECHANICAL ENGINEER.

- 35. The mechanical engineer, or the person appointed for the purpose, shall at least once in every twenty-four hours carefully examine all the machinery, hauling ropes, drums, pulleys, boilers, etc., etc., and shall make a true report, stating the conditions thereof daily in a book, which must be signed by him and kept in the office of the mine for that purpose.
- 36. He shall, if any disarrangement is discovered in any part of the machinery, ropes etc., cause the same to be immediately remedied, and shall see that the boilers are regularly blown off, cleaned, and inspected, that all connections, pumps, safety valves, and gauges, etc., etc., are kept in good working order. He shall have control (subject to the manager) of all men in his department, who must strictly obey his instructions.

ENGINE MAN.

37. The engine-driver (subject to the mechanical engineer) shall have the sole control of the engine entrusted to his care. He shall have control of the stokers, and shall see that the steam is constantly kept up. He shall also inspect daily the engines, boilers, drums, ropes, etc., under his care, and shall immediately report any defect to the manager or

mechanical engineer. He shall be in constant attendance to his engine during his shift, and on no account shall he permit any person to enter the engine-house or touch any part of the machinery, except such persons as may be appointed to do so by those in authority over him. He shall at all times pay strict attention to the various signals from the mine, and to the oiling of his engine and pulley wheels. Should he perceive anything wrong with the working of the machinery, he shall instantly stop the engine, and not proceed until the defect is put right.

SCREEN OVERSEER.

- 38. The screen overseer shall have charge of the platform, screens, etc. He shall report any defect that he may observe in the working thereof to the engineer or manager.
- 39. He shall see that the timber and rails necessary for each day's consumption are brought over to the mine, and sent down when required by the overman

ONSETTER.

40. He shall not allow any person to interfere with the roper, and shall see that the couplings are secure before the sets are allowed to be put in motion.

RULES FOR ALL PERSONS.

- 41. No person acting in a place of trust shall depute any one to do his work without the sanction of the manager or the overman, and no person in a place of trust shall absent himself without having previously obtained the permission of the manager or overman to do so.
- 42. Employees are prohibited from entering any part of the mine, other than that in which they are immediately employed, without the distinct order of the manager or overman.
- 43. Every person employed at the mine shall make himself thoroughly acquainted with the provisions of the Mines Regulation Act and these Special Rules, so far as they relate to his employment and duty, and shall strictly observe the same.
- 44. Every person employed in connection with the mine shall give and receive, as the case may be (except for violation of Special or General Rules), fourteen days' notice before leaving the colliery.
- 45. No person shall injure or interfere with any air-course or crossing, brattice, stopping, or door, nor leave any door open which he found shut, or do anything to check the ventilation of the mine.
- 46. Every person shall go in and out of the mine by the main travelling road (unless otherwise specially directed by the overman or other superior officer).
- 47. No person shall open any door which should be kept shut, unless it is necessary for him to pass through it, or, by any wilful act or neglect, injure any door, brattice, air-course, or crossing, stopping, danger signal, or caution mark, nor shall he cut or fill any coal from any pillar, nor remove any timbers which are left for the support of the roof and sides; or put coals, rubbish, or any other obstruction in any other roadway, air-course, man-hole, or place of refuge; or break, injure, or put out of repair, order, or gear, any machinery or structure, nor do any other act whereby loss or inconvenience may be caused to his employers, or the work of the mine impeded, or whereby the lives or safety of the persons at the mine may be imperilled, or the mine be rendered unsafe, or any machinery or structure be made dangerous, defective, or out of order.

- 48. Any person who shall discover any disarrangement or defect in the ventilation, or injury to any machinery or structure, or any appearance of fire-damp, choke-damp, or water, or any fall or indication of danger in the roof, sides of headings or roads, or any broken timber, or any defect in any air-way in the mine, shall immediately give notice thereof to the overman or fireman.
- 49. Every person passing through a door must close it carefully after him.
- 50. No person shall on any account try for fire damp with a naked light.
- 51. No person shall leave a light in any part of the mine when quitting his work.

Extracts from Mines Regulation Act, Sections 5 and 26.

Penalties for Offences against this Act.

5. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this Act, for which no specific penalty is herein provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding, if he is the owner, mining manager, or person in charge of, or giving orders or directions relating to the carrying on of any mining operations in a mine, Fifty pounds, and if he is any other person, Ten pounds for each offence, to be recovered in a summary manner before two or more Justices. The whole or any part of such penalty may be awarded by such Justices to any person injured, or to the personal representative of any person killed in consequence of any such offence, and such award shall be in addition to the right of action such person or personal representative has under this Act or otherwise.

Employees to satisfy themselves of Safety of Appliances. Failure to report Danger.

26. Every person employed in or about a mine shall, before commencing, and whilst at work, use crdinary and reasonable precaution to ascertain that the tubs, chains, tackle, windlass, ropes, or other appliances he uses are not unsafe; he shall not use anything unsafe, or apparently unsafe; and every such person who witnesses in or about the mine anything likely to produce danger of any kind shall forthwith report same to the mining manager, and on leaving work he shall report to the man relieving him the state of that part of the works where he has been employed, or otherwise he shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

SCHEDULE.

Regulation No. 20 is amended by striking out all the words after "Reward Claim," in the first paragraph thereof, and substituting the following in lieu thereof:—

Regulation No. 22 is amended by inserting after the words "a width of 400 feet" the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn; and may be, and shall not exceed, 150 feet long, or, at the option of the miner, parallel to the base line, by a width of 400 feet, in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn."

Regulation No. 23 is amended by inserting after the words "base line," in line four thereof, the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn, and one man for every 300 feet along the base line in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn"; and by adding at the end thereof the words "in localities South of the Tropic of Capricorn, and one man for each 150 feet along the base line in localities North of the Tropic of Capricorn."

Regulation No. 47 is amended by omitting the words "One pound" in the sixteenth line and by inserting in lieu thereof "Five shillings."

Regulation No. 91 is amended by adding at the end thereof the words following:—"Provided that when any such abandoned, forfeited, or surrendered Lease has been previously surveyed, the applicant for a new Lease of the area thereof shall be entitled to a refund of any balance remaining on account of the fees deposited for survey, after the cost of re-survey, re-marking, or inspection has been ascertained."

Regulation No. 106 is amended by adding at the end thereof the words following:—"And any person who shall, by himself or by his agent, or by any method of collusion, mark out and post a further notice on the same land during the said period of 10 days, with a view to defeat the provisions of this clause, shall be deemed to have posted a false notice, as provided by Regulation 118."

Schedule No. 35 is amended by omitting £1 in the last line but one, and by inserting in lieu thereof "Five shillings."
