BY virtue of the authority vested in the Governor in Council by "The Explosives Act, 1895," His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and declare that all other Regulations under "The Explosives Act, 1895," in force at this date shall be and are hereby repealed.

EXPLOSIVES REGULATIONS.

1. No vessel having more than twenty pounds of explosives on board, arriving in or off, or being or remaining in any of the undermentioned ports or harbours of Western Australia, shall be permitted to anchor within the limits hereinafter specified, viz. :—

Port of Fremantle
Port of Albany
Port of Geraldton
Port of Esperance
Port of Carnarvon
Port of Cossack
Port of Wyndham

} Within a quarter of a
mile of any ship,
or within one mile
of any public wharf
or landing place.

2. The master or person in charge of every ship having explosives on board shall keep conspicuously exhibited at the foremast head, from sunrise to sunset, the Red burgee, being letter "B" of the Universal Code, and from sunset to sunrise, in addition to the lights ordinarily required, a red light in such a position as to be above such ordinary lights, and to show a clear, uniform, and unbroken light all round the horizon, visible on a clear night at a distance of half a mile from such light; and every person in charge of a vessel shall observe due caution when approaching any vessel or craft having the gunpowder flag or lamp hoisted, and shall not approach any such vessel or craft nearer than 200 yards, unless duly authorised.

3. All explosives retained on board any vessel as stores shall, during the time such vessel is in port, be securely kept in a suitable magazine to be approved by the Inspector of Explosives.

4. No explosives shall be shipped on board any vessel as cargo within any port in Western Australia (unless such vessel shall be lying within the anchorage provided for incoming vessels having more than twenty pounds of explosives on board), and no explosives shall be shipped on any vessel as stores within the limits of any port of Western Australia, except in the quantities and according to the manner approved of or prescribed by the Inspector of Explosives, and all explosives shipped as stores shall be placed in properly constructed magazines, to be approved of by the Inspector of Explosives.

5. All boats conveying explosives either to or from ships, wharves, or other places, shall be duly licensed as floating magazines, and shall be subject to all the Regulations, as far as the same may be applicable, in force for the time being for the management of magazines, as regards the wearing inflammable clothing by those on board, and the precautions to be observed to prevent accident by fire or explosion.

6. No boat having explosives on board shall be towed by a high-pressure open-decked steambot whose furnaces are exposed, nor shall any such boat be towed by any other steamer with less towline between her and the steamer than 60ft.

7. All boats used in the conveyance of explosives in or upon any public river, harbour, or public place, and containing more than 100lbs. of gunpowder, or more than 100lbs. of fireworks, or more than 25lbs. of explosives, other than gunpowder and fireworks, shall be of good and substantial construction, roofed with wood or other material approved of by the Inspector of Explosives, and capable of being closed by means of doors and locks, and shall have the word "Explosive" painted in plain and conspicuous characters on both sides thereof, and no explosives shall be conveyed in or upon any public river, harbour, or any public place after sunset or before sunrise.

8. Explosives shall not be conveyed in a boat, or ship whilst carrying or plying for passengers, unless the quantity be less than 5lbs., and the same be securely covered, and all due precaution be taken for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion; but in no case shall there be conveyed in any boat, whilst carrying or plying for passengers, any explosive of the 5th (Fulminate) Class, or any explosive of the 3rd division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, or any explosive of the 1st division of the 7th (Firework) Class.

9. No explosive of the 5th (Fulminate) Class, and no explosive of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, which contains its own means of ignition, and no explosive of the 7th (Firework) Class, shall be conveyed in the same boat with any explosive not of the class and division to which it belongs, unless it be sufficiently

separated therefrom to prevent any fire or explosion which may take place in one such explosive being communicated to another.

10. If the explosive is not effectually protected from accident by fire from without, by being conveyed in the hold of a boat having a close deck securely closed, then the explosive shall be completely covered with a painted cloth, tarpaulin, wadmilt-tilts or other suitable material so as to effectually protect it against communication of fire.

11. There shall not be any iron or steel in the interior of the portion of the boat where the explosive is deposited, unless the same be covered, either permanently or temporarily, with leather, wool, cloth, or wadmilt-tilts, or other suitable material.

12. In any boat containing explosives, no matches, other than safety matches, shall be carried for the use of such boat, and such safety matches shall be kept in a safe place apart from the explosive.

13. In the stowing of explosives in any boat, due precaution shall be taken, by means of a partition or otherwise, and by careful stowing, to secure such explosive from being brought into contact with, or endangered by, any other article or substance conveyed in such a boat which is liable to cause fire or explosion.

14. No person whilst on, in, or attending any boat containing any explosive shall smoke.

15. No person in charge of any boat containing explosives shall conduct the same in a dangerous or reckless manner; and no person who is intoxicated shall be permitted to be or continue in charge of any boat, nor shall any such person last-mentioned be permitted to be in, on, or attending the same.

16. While the loading, unloading, or conveyance of explosives is going on, all persons engaged in such loading, unloading, or conveyance shall observe all due precautions for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion, and from preventing unauthorised persons having access to the explosive so being loaded, unloaded, or conveyed, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the loading, unloading, or conveyance of such explosive, or of any other article carried therewith, and for preventing any other person from committing any such act.

17. After the loading or unloading of explosives in or out of any boat is begun, no longer time shall be suffered to pass than the use of all due diligence, or reasonably necessary for the purpose of such loading or unloading.

18. No explosive shall be loaded or unloaded from any boat in or upon any public highway, street, road, thoroughfare, or public place, or at any public wharf or landing place, except with the consent of and under conditions approved of by the Inspector of Explosives.

19. Explosives shall not be conveyed in a boat which is carrying as merchandise any article liable to cause fire or explosion, or to communicate fire, such as charcoal, lucifer matches, articles for striking a light, or petroleum.

20. No person in charge of any boat conveying explosive shall delay for a longer time than may be necessary, nor stop unnecessarily at any place where such stopping would be attended with special public danger.

21. In the case of a boat conveying explosive due provision shall be made for preventing the introduction into such boat of fire, lucifer matches, or any substance or article likely to cause explosion or fire,

or the introduction of any iron, steel, or grit so as to come in contact with such explosive; and if the explosive carried in any such boat is liable to be dangerously affected by water, due precautions shall be taken to exclude water from coming into contact with such explosive.

This clause shall not be construed to prevent the introduction of an artificial light of such construction, position, or character, or of safety matches of such character as not to cause any danger of fire or explosion.

22. The owner of every boat on, from, or in which explosive exceeding 100lbs. is loaded, unloaded, or conveyed who employs others in such loading, unloading, or conveyance shall, by furnishing copies of the Regulations and orders relating to conveyance, or by affixing copies of the same in some place where they can be conveniently read, or otherwise take such measures as may be necessary in order that the persons so employed may be acquainted with the provisions of the Regulations and orders relating to conveyance.

23. Each boat conveying explosives shall be in the exclusive charge of, and constantly attended by, some competent person; and such person shall not have charge of more than one boat.

24. The quantity of explosives to be conveyed in any one boat shall not exceed 2,000lbs., unless the boat have a close deck so closed as effectually to protect the explosives against accident by fire from without, in which case the amount of explosives conveyed in any such carriage or boat shall not exceed such quantity as may be allowed by the Inspector of Explosives.

25. When two or more boats are conveying explosives, or are travelling together, a space of at least 50 yards shall be kept between each boat, and every boat, unless circumstances render it impracticable.

26. Nothing in Clauses 1 to 25 hereof, inclusive, shall apply to any explosive of the first division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, provided all due precautions are taken for the prevention of accidents, and any explosive of the 1st division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, shall be a prescribed explosive under Section 33, Sub-section 9, of "The Explosives Act, 1895."

27. In the case of every vessel loading or discharging explosives within any port in Western Australia:—

- (a.) An officer of the vessel shall be constantly and exclusively in charge of the shipment, stowage, or discharge of such explosives.
- (b.) All fires and lights shall be completely put out (except engine-room fires, which must be carefully banked with damp ashes). No smoking shall be allowed on board. This rule will apply to every vessel alongside of or attached to any ship or boat loading or discharging any kind of explosive.
- (c.) Men selected to work in the magazine of the ship or boat must not have any matches, fuses, or knives about their persons, nor wear boots or shoes with any iron or steel on them.
- (d.) All exposed iron or steel in or near the place where any explosive is being passed or handled must be covered over with tarpaulins or other suitable covering.
- (e.) All explosives must be passed from man to man, or rolled, and on no account shall any explosives be pitched, thrown, slung, or slid.
- (f.) No person shall be allowed to work aloft, or in those parts of the rigging which may be near to the magazine.

(g.) Special care must be exercised in selecting the men to work the explosives to see that they are perfectly sober.

(h.) In the event of any necessity arising for the stoppage of the loading or discharging of any kind of explosive for any purpose or from any cause whatever, it will devolve upon the officer in charge to take precautions that the hatches of the vessel, as well as those of the licensed boat delivering or receiving, are put on and covered with tarpaulins, and that no person is allowed to remain below in the magazines or hold during such stoppage.

(i.) Paraffin, naphtha, petroleum, or other volatile oil must not be used for any purpose or upon any pretence whatever on board a vessel after such vessel has on board more than 1,000lbs. of any explosives other than of ammunition whilst the ship is within the limits of any port in Western Australia.

28. Every case containing explosives imported into Western Australia shall be marked in legible and indelible characters showing the date of its manufacture, the name of the explosive, and the word "Explosive."

29. No explosive shall be landed in any port in Western Australia unless such explosive shall have been previously inspected by the Inspector of Explosives, or unless permission shall have been given by the Inspector.

30. Explosives in course of transit by a boat may, by permission of the Inspector of Explosives, be stored temporarily only upon a hulk approved by him, and all such explosives shall be removed from any such hulk, with all due diligence, to some duly licensed magazine or other place where the same may be legally kept.

31. The provisions of these Regulations shall be observed by persons in the employment of the Government in the same manner as by persons not so employed, and the officers of the Customs Department or harbour authority shall endeavour, as far as practicable, to see that these Regulations are observed on board the ship or boat of which they may be in charge, and no explosives shall be discharged from any vessel unless such officer shall be present.

32. No explosives shall be put on board of or discharged from any boat, or ship, or placed in or removed from any magazine, except between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

33. In the case of stores licensed for keeping and selling gunpowder or other explosives, in lieu of the maximum amount of gunpowder limited by Section 18 of "The Explosives Act, 1895," there shall be substituted the following amounts of other explosives, viz.:—

If stored in mode (a)—In lieu of each pound of gunpowder, 1lb. of fireworks, or $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of any explosive other than gunpowder or fireworks.
If stored in mode (b)—In lieu of each pound of gunpowder, 1lb. of fireworks, or $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of any explosive other than gunpowder or fireworks.

34. The following fees shall be payable for licenses granted by the Minister under the Explosives Act:—

35. Any person who shall commit or attempt to commit any breach of any of the foregoing Regulations, shall for every such Act or default be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence and £10 for each day during which the offence continues, and the forfeiture of all or any part of the explosive in respect of which, or found in the ship, boat, or carriage in respect of which, the breach of the Regulation has taken place.

tained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895."

BY-LAW No. 51.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

1. The Council shall meet at the Council Chambers on the first and third Thursday in every month, at the hour of eight p.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, but it shall be competent for the Council to sit with closed doors and deal with any question if, in their opinion, they deem it necessary; and the Mayor may, or any two Councillors present may request the Mayor to, order the Council Chambers to be cleared of any unruly visitor or visitors.

2. The Council shall commence business so soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiration of fifteen minutes from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting.

3. Should the Mayor not be present, the meeting shall elect a Chairman from the councillors present, who shall preside during the absence of the Mayor.

4. At all meetings of the Council when there is not a quorum present, or when the Council is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than one-third of the members of the Council present, exclusive of the Mayor or Councillor chosen to preside in his absence) such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

5. At all meetings of the Council the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

6. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Mayor may make any communication to the Council which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at that time. Provided always that, if a member requires an answer to his question on the night of the meeting, he shall have given at least four (4) clear days' notice in writing to the Town Clerk.

7. The ordinary business shall then be proceeded with.

8. Members may explain matters of a personal nature, but no debate to take place on such matters.

9. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented by a member of the Council only, who shall affix his name at the beginning thereof with the number of signatures, and any member presenting same shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council. The nature and prayer of any petition or memorial shall be stated to the Council by the member presenting the same. Any deputation intending to wait upon the Council must give four (4) days' notice in writing to the Town Clerk, and must be introduced by a member of the Council.

10. The order of business shall be set forth in the business sheet, namely:—

Reading and confirmation of minutes.
Outward correspondence when ordered by the Council.
Inward correspondence.
Reports.
Accounts.
Orders of the Day.
Ordinary business.
New Notices of Motion.

BY-LAW No. 52.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

1. An order of the day shall be taken to mean a notice of motion, or any matter which the Council may have postponed or directed to be considered at the next or any subsequent meeting of the Council.

2. The orders of the day shall be numbered, brought on, and disposed of in the order which they appear on the paper.

3. All notices of motion must be given in writing at an ordinary or special meeting, or given in writing to the Town Clerk at least four days before the next meeting, and shall be discussed at the next ordinary meeting or a special meeting called for that purpose not less than four days after the notice has been given.

4. No resolution or motion affecting the expenditure of any portion of the Municipal funds, exceeding in amount the sum of Ten pounds, shall be considered by the Council unless notice of the same shall have been given as in the manner prescribed by the next preceding clause.

5. If any notice of motion contains any unbecoming expressions, the Council may order it to be expunged from the business sheet.

6. No order of the day shall be proceeded with when called on, unless the member who gave the notice, or some other member authorised by him to proceed thereon, be present, but it, as well as any notice of motion on the business sheet not moved when called on, shall lapse.

7. Any adjourned debate on a motion before the Council, or any motion of which the Council may postpone consideration, and direct to be considered at the next or any subsequent meeting of the Council, shall be set down on the business sheet before, and have precedence over any other notices of motion on the same.

BY-LAW No. 53.

SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

1. In cases of urgent necessity any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least four members of the Council.

2. Every member of the Council who shall commit a breach of any section of this "part" of these By-laws, or who shall move or attempt to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter as to which the Council has no legal jurisdiction, or who shall in any other way raise or attempt to raise any question, or shall address or attempt to address the Council on any subject which the said Council has no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who shall use any other language which according to the common usage of gentlemen would be held disorderly, or who shall say or do anything calculated to bring the Council into contempt, shall be deemed to be out of order.

3. The Mayor or Chairman may, without the interposition of any other member of the Council, call any Councillor to order whenever, in the opinion of such Mayor or Chairman, there shall be a necessity for so doing.

4. Every member of the Council shall have the right of calling the attention of the Mayor or Chairman to any motion, amendment, statement, argument, or observation moved, raised, or made by any other member which such first-named member may consider out of order.

5. A Councillor called to order shall withdraw while the question of order is being discussed and decided on, unless specially permitted to offer an explanation, retraction, or apology; but on obtaining such special permission such Councillor may explain, retract, or apologise for the matter or remark alleged to have been out of order. And if such explanation, retraction, or apology be deemed satisfactory, no further discussion on the question or order shall be permitted.

6. If any Councillor, on being called to order, shall ask such permission to explain, retract, or apologise as aforesaid, the Mayor or Chairman may, of his own authority, grant or refuse such permission as he may think fit, unless any Councillor shall require the sense of the Council to be taken on this question. In such case it shall be the duty of the Mayor or Chairman to take the sense of the Council at once, without discussion, as to whether such permission shall be granted. And when any such explanation, retraction, or apology shall have been made or offered by permission of the Mayor or Chairman, the latter shall in like manner decide, or, if required so to do, shall take the sense of the Council as to whether such explanation, retraction, or apology is considered sufficient. If such permission be refused, or if such explanation, retraction, or apology be considered insufficient, the question of order shall be considered and decided before any further business is proceeded with. Provided that if such Mayor or Chairman shall have decided the question of order before any Councillor shall have required the sense of the Council to be taken in reference thereto, such question of order shall not be re-opened. And provided further that nothing herein contained shall be held to affect the right of such Mayor or Chairman to decide finally, as hereinbefore provided, upon any such point of order after the same shall have been discussed.

7. The Mayor or Chairman, when called upon to decide points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he shall deem applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting upon the same.

8. Whenever it shall have been decided as aforesaid that any motion, amendment, or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected; and whenever anything said or done in Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor or Chairman to make such explanation, retraction, or apology, as the case may require.

9. Any Councillor who shall have been called to order, and who, after having been twice directed to withdraw as aforesaid, shall refuse to do so, or who shall persist in any line of conduct or argument, or of observations, which shall have been decided as aforesaid to be disorderly, or who shall refuse to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as aforesaid when required so to do, or who shall be guilty of any other act of disorder, as defined in Section 5 of this part of these By-laws, shall refuse to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as a majority of the Councillors then present shall consider satisfactory, shall be liable, on

Conviction before two Justices of the Peace, for the first offence to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds; and on second conviction for the like offence he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Three pounds nor more than Ten pounds; and on a third conviction, and for every further conviction for the like offence, he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds nor more than Twenty pounds.

10. Whenever any Councillor shall have committed an offence under this By-law, the Mayor, or, in case of his absence, the Chairman presiding at the meeting when such offence was committed, shall forthwith lay, or cause to be laid, an information before a Justice of the Peace, for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

BY-LAW No. 54.

HAWKERS' LICENSES.

1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables within the limits of this Municipality without first obtaining a license from this Council (and such license may be on the form as contained in Schedules E for Europeans, F for Asiatic aliens), shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace in Petty Sessions, be liable for a first offence to a penalty not exceeding £10, and for any subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding £20, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding six calendar months with hard labour.

“All vessels calling at any Port in Western Australia for Coal or Supplies (but not broaching or shipping cargo, or landing or embarking passengers) shall be charged a fixed sum of Five pounds (£5) only, such charge to cover all tonnage, light, and pilotage dues, both inwards and outwards. Such vessels desirous of embarking passengers will be permitted to do so on payment of One pound for each passenger, the minimum payment therefor being Five pounds. Steamers calling at Albany on their way to South African Ports will be allowed to ship cargo (not exceeding in amount one-fourth of registered tonnage of vessel) on the scale formerly in force, i.e., Thirty pounds (£30) to include all Port Dues.”

The climate of Perth was fairly normal. The mean temperature was very nearly the same as the average for previous years. The rainfall was slightly below, and the atmospheric pressure higher than usual. This was principally characterised by the passage across the Southern portions of the Colony of two vast anticyclonic or high pressure regions. The former of these made a rapid approach from the Westward on the 2nd, and on the morning of the 3rd was well established near Perth. It slowly worked down to the South coast, and remained almost stationary for a few days, but made a definite move Eastwards on the 8th, when barometers began to fall, with winds veering from East towards the North. By the evening of the 10th rain set in at the Leeuwin, and on the 11th extended throughout the Colony South of Sharks Bay, being, as usual, heaviest in the South-West. During the prevalence of this anticyclonic weather frosts were experienced, especially at inland stations. The following were the lowest readings of a thermometer on the surface of the ground at a few places:—

The second anticyclone put in an appearance off the coast, near Perth, on the 17th. It also kept well to the South, and on the 21st covered the coastal portions of the Southern Ocean throughout the entire width of Australia, the barometer reading 30.60 at Adelaide, and 30.54 at Hobart. The whole vast system moved Eastwards, and on the evening of the 23rd heavy rain set in at the Leeuwin, extending later on throughout the Southern portions of the Colony. Between these two anticyclones a very small but rather interesting disturbance travelled overland from the North-West coast towards Adelaide. It was difficult to trace from the isobars at first owing to the paucity of observing stations in the interior of Western Australia, but moderate to heavy rain was reported in the North-West coastal districts on the morning of the 14th, isolated showers between Peak Hill and Nannine on the 16th, light to moderate rain all East of a line joining Peak Hill and Coolgardie on the 17th, and on the 18th heavy rain at Israelite Bay and Balladonia in the South-East. On this day it was gloomy to overcast in the Northern portions of South Australia, and unsettled on their Western coast; and, on the morning of the 19th, Alice Springs, in the centre of the Continent, reported 28 points, Yardea 14, and Streaky Bay 18 points of rain. After this the depression seemed to have been filled in by the vast anticyclone already described. The rainfall for the month was, as usual, small from Geraldton Northwards. Between Geraldton and Perth it was much below the normal, but elsewhere it nearly reached, and in a few instances exceeded, the average for previous years.
