WHEREAS under the provisions of the 49th Section of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and to be called a Warden's Court, and which shall be a Court of Record, and shall possess such jurisdiction as is conferred by Part IV. of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the Warden's Court at Mt. Margaret should be removed to and established at Laverton, Mt. Margaret Goldfield; NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby remove the Warden's Court, heretofore held at Mt.

Margaret, from that place, and do hereby establish the said Court at Laverton, in the Mt. Margaret Goldfield, such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the said goldfield, or in his absence, by the Acting Warden thereof; to take effect from the 7th of September, 1899.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," it is made lawful (in case it should appear to the Governor that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to cemeteries or other burial ground or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued or discontinued subject to any exception or qualification) for the Governor, by order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to direct that after a time mentioned in such order (not being less than three months from the date thereof) burials in such cemetery or burial place, ground, or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exception or qualification mentioned in the same or any subsequent order: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the said Governor that it is advisable that, except in vaults at present owned by private persons, all burials should be discontinued in the Public Cemeteries, East Perth: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that from and after the first day of November, 1899, burials within the limits of the Public Cemeteries, East Perth, shall be wholly discontinued, except in cases where the special permission of the said Governor be first obtained.

**Central Board of Health.****BY-LAWS.****PART I.**

WHEREAS by the Health Act, 1898 (62 Vict., No. 24), the Central Board of Health has power to make By-laws, now therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made and shall come into operation from the date of publication of the same in the *Government Gazette*.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

2. All dairy farms, milk stores, grazing grounds of dairy cattle, and cattle in dairies, shall be inspected regularly from time to time at least once every month, at any reasonable hour in the day time, or in the case of a cause of inquiry or complaint arising in respect thereof, then such inspection may be made at any time when such business is in progress or is usually carried on. Such inspection shall be made by an Inspector of the Local Board or may be made by an Inspector of the Central Board or a person or persons appointed by the Central Board to carry out the provisions of these By-laws, or by any member of the police force.

3. If upon such inspection it shall appear to the person making the inspection that the use of any grazing ground for dairy cattle is likely to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, then such person shall forthwith report, in writing, accordingly to the Local Board or Central Board, who may thereupon, prohibit the use of any such grazing ground.

4. If, upon such inspection as aforesaid, any cow or other animal shall be found to be diseased, the person making such inspection shall cause such cow or other animal to be isolated and removed from all possible contact with all other dairy cattle, and shall forthwith report to the Local Board of the district and to the Central Board the nature of the disease, description of the animal affected, and the measures taken for the isolation and treatment of such animal. No dairyman or cow-keeper shall neglect or refuse to remove or isolate such diseased cow or other animal, or permit or suffer the same to come in contact with other dairy cattle, after being ordered by the person aforesaid making such inspection to remove or isolate such cow or other animal.

5. Whenever it shall be so reported to any Local Board or to the Central Board that any cow or other animal is diseased, then such Local Board or the Central Board, after due inquiry, may order such cow or other animal to be destroyed or to be removed from any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard, and such diseased cow or other animal shall be destroyed or removed in accordance with such order.

6. For the purposes of By-laws 4 and 5, or for the purpose of protecting milk against infection or contamination, a Local Board may, and if required by the Central Board shall cause the Tuberculin Test to be applied to any cow or other animal when reasonably suspected to be suffering from tuberculosis. For the purposes aforesaid, the Central Board may cause such test to be made, whether there is a Local Board or not, and may issue instructions to be observed in applying the Tuberculin Test.

7. All houses, dairies, and cow sheds, in the occupation of persons following the trade of cow-keepers or dairymen—

- (a.) Shall have proper provision for lighting.
- (b.) Shall have good and sufficient ventilation.
- (c.) Shall be cleansed daily.

(d.) Shall be drained thoroughly and effectually and in such manner as may be ordered by the Local Board, or if there be no Local Board then by the Central Board.

(e.) Shall have a sufficient supply of pure water.

8. Every milk store and milk shop shall be thoroughly cleansed daily, and every milk yard and dairy shall be kept at all times in a cleanly state.

9. For the purpose of protecting milk against infection or contamination, the following precautions shall be observed and kept :—

(a.) The walls, floors, counters, tables, and shelves of all milk stores, milk shops, and dairies shall be kept at all times in a thoroughly cleanly condition.

(b.) All barrels, butts, cans, and other vessels used for containing milk or cream, and also all bungs, bung cloths, lids, and other parts thereof shall be thoroughly cleansed and scalded with boiling water or steam immediately after use, and afterwards dripped.

(c.) No boiler, tank, steanchest, or other vessel used for scalding such vessels shall be employed for washing or boiling bed or body clothing, or for any other purpose which might cause contamination or infection of milk.

(d.) No milk or cream, or vessel used for containing milk or cream, shall be stored or kept in any dwelling or sleeping apartment; and no such dwelling or sleeping apartment shall have direct communication with any milk store; nor shall any articles of clothing be washed, hung up to dry, or kept in any room or place used for storing or keeping milk.

(e.) No earth closet, privy, or urinal, and no manure, dung, urine, stagnant water, filth, or other refuse shall be in contact with or within thirty feet of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop.

(f.) No swine or other animals shall be kept or allowed to remain within one hundred feet of any room or place used for keeping or storing milk.

(g.) No milk from any diseased cow shall be mixed with other milk, or sold for human consumption; and such milk shall not be used as food for swine or other animals until it has been well boiled.

(h.) No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having been recently in contact with, or in attendance upon, any other person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk or cream, or take part in any way in the storage or distribution of milk or cream.

(i.) When ordered by a Local Board or the Central Board, any sick person shall be immediately removed from the premises of any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard, by the owner or occupier, in accordance with such order.

(j.) Whenever any infectious or contagious disease occurs in any house or building in the occupation of any person or persons following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, or on any premises used for the purpose of a milk shop or milk store, the occupier thereof shall forthwith report such occurrence to the Local Board and Central Board.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend Regulation 49 of the Port Regulations, as follows :—

“All vessels calling at any Port in Western Australia for Coal or Supplies (but not broaching or shipping cargo, or landing or embarking passengers) shall be charged a fixed sum of Five pounds (£5) only, such charge to cover all tonnage, light, and pilotage dues, both inwards and outwards. Such vessels desirous of embarking passengers will be permitted to do so on payment of One pound for each passenger, the minimum payment therefor being Five pounds. Steamers calling at Albany on their way to South African Ports will be allowed to ship cargo (not exceeding in amount one-fourth of registered tonnage of vessel) on the scale formerly in force, i.e., Thirty pounds (£30) to include all Port Dues.”

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Light for Cape Sorell.

With reference to the Preliminary Notice issued by this Board, dated 7th March, 1899, it is hereby notified that, on and after the 2nd day of October, 1899, a Light will be exhibited from a Lighthouse erected on Cape Sorell at the entrance to Macquarie Harbour, the position and characteristics of such Light being as follows:—

The Lighthouse is situated on the outer end of Cape Sorell in latitude 42° 11' S. and longitude 145° 10' 30" E., approximately.

It is a Second Order Dioptric Light showing white and red flashes with eclipses. White flash visible 3 seconds, and eclipse 19½ seconds. Red flash visible 3 seconds, and eclipse 19½ seconds. The apparatus shows 4 white and 4 red flashes, and 8 eclipses in a complete revolution of three minutes.

The Light is fixed in a circular brick tower, painted white, the height of which to base of lantern is 100 feet. Height of focal plane of Light above sea level 186 feet; and allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye of mariner above sea level, the Light will be visible as follows:—White, 20 miles; red, 12 miles in clear weather, and at a lesser distance according to the state of the atmosphere.

Arc of visibility, all round, as far as the land will allow.

**I**T is hereby notified, for general information, that the following Regulations for the Competition for the Government Exhibitions have been approved by the Honourable the Minister of Education.

**REGULATIONS.**

The Exhibitions will be divided into Senior and Junior classes.

Five Senior Exhibitions of the value of £25 each, tenable for one year, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 16 and 18 years, and five Junior Exhibitions of the value of £15 each, tenable for a similar period, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 14 and 16 years.

The course of examination for seniors and juniors will be, respectively, that laid down for Senior and Junior Adelaide University Examinations.

Candidates must not be less than 14 or more than 18 years of age on the 1st day of November in the year in which the examination is held.

The examination will be held in Perth, and will commence on the 20th day of November.

A preliminary examination will be held by the Department on the 16th and the 17th of October, in the following subjects:—

English.  
English Composition.  
Arithmetic.  
Dictation.

No candidate will be allowed to proceed to the final examination unless successful in the preliminary examination.

The Department will pay the fees for the first ten junior candidates and for the first six senior candidates who pass the preliminary examination.

Candidates who qualify will be required to produce baptismal certificate, or satisfactory proof of age, before the Exhibition or Certificate is issued.

Applications for admission to the examinations must be made on the prescribed forms, which may now be obtained from the Education Department. Applications will not be received after 13th October.

#### SYLLABUS OF JUNIOR EXAMINATIONS.

Every candidate shall be required to satisfy the Examiners in three of the following subjects, but no candidate shall be examined in more than five:—

##### 1. English:—

- (a.) Outlines of the History of England.
- (b.) English Literature—Coleridge's *Ancient Mariner* edited by Dent (Blackie and Son).
- (c.) Outlines of Geography, especially the Geography of Australasia.

The Elements of Physical Geography:—

- The Earth.—Its form, motions, measurements, and mapping of its surface.
- The Sea.—Divisions, depth, saltiness, form, and nature of the ocean floor, waves, currents, and tides.
- The Land.—Continents and islands, coast lines, mountains, plains, and valleys.
- Distribution of rain, river systems, lakes, and inland seas.

Text Book—Geikie's *Elementary Lessons in Physical Geography*.

Candidates who satisfy the Examiners in two of the above will pass in English; but to obtain a *credit* they must satisfy the Examiners in all three.

- 2. *Latin*.
- 3. *Greek*.
- 4. *French*.
- 5. *German*.

- (a.) Grammar.
- (b.) Easy prose composition. Simple sentences to test knowledge of Grammar and the more common constructions of Syntax.
- (c.) Translation of simple unseen passages.

NOTE.—Use of Dictionaries will no longer be allowed.

Only such candidates as satisfy the Examiners in grammar and in easy composition can obtain a credit in any of the above four languages. In French and German it will also be necessary to satisfy the Examiners in the translation into English of easy passages from some books not specified.

##### 6. Mathematics:

- Arithmetic.—Questions on the elementary processes of arithmetic, including fractions, decimals, practice, rectangular areas and volumes, square root, percentages, simple interest, profit and loss, exchange, compound interest, and stocks and shares.
- Geometry.—The substance of Euclid Books I. and II., with Exercises.
- Algebra.—To Simple Equations (inclusive.)

\* Questions will also be set in the substance of Euclid Books III. and IV., with Exercises, and in Algebra to Quadratic Equations and Surds (both inclusive).

\* Candidates for a pass only need not attempt these.

The standard for a Pass will be—Arithmetic, the substance of Euclid, Books I. and II., with Exercises, and Algebra to Simple Equations.

##### 7. Physical and Natural Science:—

###### (a.) Elementary Physics:—

The Elementary laws of mechanics, hydrostatics, light, heat, sound, electricity, and magnetism.

Text Book recommended—Wright's *Text Book of Physics*; the very elementary portions only.

NOTE.—Candidates should work a few simple experiments, such as may be found in Worthington's *First Course of Laboratory Practice*, or Gregory's *Elementary Practical Physics* (Macmillan).

###### (b.) Elementary Chemistry:—

The elementary chemistry of the acid-forming elements, based upon Remsen's *Elements of Chemistry* (a text book for beginners), 2nd Edition, page 1-165.

###### (c.) Elementary Botany and Physiology:—

Candidates will be required to show a practical acquaintance with the position, appearance, and general structure of the principal organs of the body.

Candidates must satisfy the Examiners in one of these divisions, and no candidate shall be examined in more than two.

Every candidate shall be required to satisfy the Examiners in at least three of the following subjects, of which one must be No. 1 of Division A, and of the remaining two one must be selected from the other subjects of Division A, and one from the subjects of Division B:—

N.B.—An intelligent knowledge of Chemicals will be required as far as they are explained in the above-named Text Book.

10. *Experimental Physics*.—Elements of Light, Heat, Sound, Electricity, and Magnetism.

Text Book recommended.—Wright's Physics (Longmans).

NOTE.—Candidates should make experiments, such as may be found in Worthington's First Course of Laboratory Practice, or Gregory's Elementary Practical Physics (Macmillan).

11. *Botany and Physiology* :—

Botany.—The more conspicuous morphological variations of the sexual organs in each of the following orders, with particular reference to the more commonly occurring genera of the local flora :—Ranunculaceæ, Leguminosæ, Myrtaceæ, Proteaceæ, Goodenoviæ, Compositæ, Schrophulariaceæ, Epacrideæ, Orchideæ, and Liliaceæ.

Questions may be set with reference to the type plants enumerated in the Syllabus for the Junior Examination of the previous year.

Candidates will be required to classify specimens (with or without the aid of the "Flora") illustrative of any of the above-mentioned orders. They should also provide themselves with forceps and magnifying glass.

## Text Books—

Oliver—Lessons in Elementary Botany.

Tate—Flora of South Australia; or

Dendy and Lucas—Introduction to Botany.

Questions relating to obscure characters, or those not readily determined without the aid of a microscope, will not be set.

## Physiology—

Text Books recommended—Elementary Physiology (Foster and Shore).

Candidates will be required to show a practical acquaintance with the position, appearance, and structure of the most important tissues and organs, and may be called upon to perform some easy exercise in dissection.

12. *Physical Geography and the Principles of Geology* :—

## Physical Geography—

The following synopsis includes the various branches of the subject required :—

- (a.) Relation of continents and islands. Grouping of islands. Influence of the form of a coast line. Characteristic features of the various great masses of land.
- (b.) Details of the great mountain systems of the world. Nature and position of high plains. Low plains, their relations to geological structure. Their position, distribution, and characteristics. Different kinds of valleys.
- (c.) Ocean—Divisions, depth, density, temperature, and colour. Form and nature of the ocean floor. Movements of the ocean. Waves and currents.
- (d.) Distribution of rain. Subterranean circulation of water. Springs, their origin, temperature, and mineral contents.
- (e.) River systems of the world. Deltas. Extent and peculiarities of lakes.
- (f.) Snow line. Glaciers. Icebergs.
- (g.) Distribution of winds in both hemispheres. Special local winds and their causes.
- (h.) Phenomena and causes that produce or modify climate.
- (i.) Volcanic and earthquake phenomena.
- (j.) The simple facts of the vertical and horizontal distribution of plants and animals on the land and in the sea; the influence of physical and climatic circumstances on the distribution of terrestrial life.

Text Book recommended.—Geikie's Elementary Lessons in Physical Geography.

## Geology—

Questions will be confined to the undermentioned topics in the Elements of Physical Geology :—

Proofs of the origin of stratified rocks resulting from the degradation of the land produced by the action of rain, rivers, frosts, glaciers, icebergs, accumulations of organic *debris*, etc.

The transport of matter by rivers, the formation of the deltas, etc., and the general accumulations of great deposits of marine and fresh water strata.

The theory of the origin of salt lakes.

Proofs that large areas of the earth's surface are now being slowly elevated above or depressed beneath the sea. The relations of coral reefs and of earthquake and volcanic phenomena to this branch of the subject.

Explanations of common geological terms, as clay, sand, gravel, horizontal and inclined strata, anticlines and synclines, unconformability, dip, joint, fault.

The candidates will also be required to make sketches, and name unlabelled specimens of the commoner rocks of this country. They should provide themselves with scales and compasses.

Text Book recommended—Tate's Students' Class Book of Physical Geology.
