PROCLAMATION

Western Australia,  
to wit.

GERARD SMITH,  
(L.S.)

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions contained in "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I did, by Proclamation dated the 23rd ultimo, declare Wednesday, the 4th October, from 12 o'clock, noon, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the City of Perth: AND WHEREAS the Banks in the said City now desire that the whole of the 4th instant shall be declared a holiday: NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation appoint

*Wednesday, the 4th October instant,*

to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the City of Perth.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Perth, this 2nd day of October, 1899.
