IT is hereby notified that the Hon. the Minister of Education has approved the following Regulations for the Competition for High School Scholarships.

CYRIL JACKSON,  
Inspector General of Schools.

236. Two Scholarships of the value of £75 each per annum, tenable for three years, are annually offered for boys and girls attending Government or other efficient primary schools.

237. Candidates for these Scholarships must—

- Be over eleven and not more than thirteen years of age on the 1st October of the year in which the examination for the Scholarships is held.
- Have attended one or more of the Government or other efficient primary schools of the Colony continuously for at least two years immediately preceding the above-named 1st October, and have made not less than three hundred half-day attendances (unless prevented by illness) in such school or schools during their last school year.
- Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the head teacher of the last school attended.

238. The Scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department.

239. No candidate is eligible for a Scholarship who fails to obtain a minimum of two-thirds of the maximum number of marks.

240. Application for admission to the Scholarship examination must be made on the prescribed form to the Education Department on or before the 1st October of each year.

241. The conditions upon which the Scholarships are tenable are:—

- That the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the Scholarship, become a pupil at a school in which higher education, as approved by the Minister, is given. The Minister may require that the school be inspected before his approval is given;
- That he shall continue to attend such school, and must, at the end of each term, obtain from the authorities of the school, and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct and attendance have been satisfactory. If an unfavourable report is received, or if at any time his conduct be disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and the advantages connected therewith shall, with the consent of the Governor, thereupon cease and determine.

242. The schools of higher education at which these Scholarships are tenable cannot themselves send any candidates for the Scholarships, which are, as stated in Regulation 236, offered for scholars attending primary schools.

243. The subjects of examination will be:—Arithmetic (200 marks); English (100 marks); History (100 marks); Geography (100 marks); Dictation and Writing (100 marks); and Reading (50 marks).

The examination will be on the course as laid down for Standard V. in the Regulations for the curriculum of the Government Schools.

244. Under special circumstances arrangements might be made for examining candidates locally, but the examination will, as a rule, be held in Perth, and candidates will be expected to attend there.

This month was a dry one throughout the Colony. North of Sharks Bay, as usual, no rain fell, and South of there the quantity recorded for the month was in every case below the average for previous years, except between the Coolgardie District and the South-East, where it was in excess in some cases. The deficit throughout the country, from Geraldton to Albany, averaged about an inch. At 180 points were recorded, making the total since the beginning of the year 2,694, or 251 points below the average for previous years. Temperature at Perth was about normal, but the barometer was unusually high.

The climatological map shows the advent of the summer. The region of high barometers has moved considerably Southwards since last, and now lies along or, perhaps, South of the coast line.

The region of maximum heat during the daytime has also advanced Southwards, and now lies inland over the Kimberley District, and temperatures over 100 degrees have already been recorded in the Tropics. The coldest nights are still experienced between Katanning, Port, and Southern Cross, and the temperature on the surface of the ground has been down to 22.5 degrees at Katanning in the early part of month.

Only two of the usual winter storms were experienced during the month, viz., on the 11th and 20th. Neither was very severe, and the weather has otherwise been mostly fine, with a prevalence of Easterly winds.

A very unusual rainfall occurred in the Eastern Districts on the 4th. At 8 a.m. on this day there was a vast anticyclonic system moving from the South-West corner of the Colony, with barometer readings ranging up to 30.55, and even at Coolgardie it was 30.45. A steady North-East wind (generally considered a dry wind) was blowing from the South coast right across the continent to the North-West Cape. The anticyclone moved Eastwards during the day, and on the morning of the 5th covered the ocean between Albany and Adelaide, the wind then veering slightly to the Eastward. On the early morning of the 4th steady rain set in throughout the Goldfields, being heaviest at Coolgardie, where 195 points were recorded at 9 a.m. on the 5th. It then ceased, and the barometers commenced to fall rapidly throughout the Colony, but more so over the Goldfields than elsewhere. At 8 a.m. on the 6th the weather map showed a decrease of pressure at every point in Australia, except on the East coast—a rather remarkable event. In our own neighbourhood the barometer fell rapidly, with a wind from East and South-East (a most unusual proceeding), but the principal fall occurred over the Goldfields, where a “low” appeared on the 6th, with slightly rising gradients East and West. This “low” appears to have travelled very slowly in an East or South-East direction, and, although apparently insignificant, probably contributed its share in producing the grand and very welcome rains which visited Western Australia on the 10th.
