WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare "That any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof": And whereas it is deemed desirable that "Kangaroos" shall be strictly preserved within the South-West Division of the Colony, more particularly described in the Schedule

hereto attached: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare "Kangaroos" within the limits described as aforesaid to be strictly preserved, and their destruction in any way is wholly forbidden except for purposes of human food.
