RULES AND REGULATIONS

FOR THE

### MEDICAL DEPARTMENT,

WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### THE PRINCIPAL MEDICAL OFFICER.

- 1. This officer has the control and general superintendence of the Medical Department of Western Australia.
- 2. He will exercise a general supervision over all the Medical Establishments, and will bring to the notice of the Minister controlling the Department anything which he may consider requires attention or alteration in any of them.
- 3. For this purpose he will be at liberty to visit and inspect any of these establishments whenever he may think proper to do so.
- 4. He is the sole medium of communication between the Government and the officers of the Medical Department, and all returns and official documents connected therewith are to be addressed to him.

#### DISTRICT MEDICAL OFFICERS.

5. These officers are responsible for the proper performance of their medical duties within their districts, together with the general superintendence of the hospitals under their charge, and shall see that they are kept in proper order, that the Regulations for their management are strictly observed, and that the officers and persons connected with them do their duty in a satisfactory manner, and they will also consider themselves responsible for the charge of all Government Stores belonging to the department, and for their economical expenditure, and where no Secretary is appointed they will, with the assistance of the Matron, perform and carry out the duties of Secretary. (For books to be kept at each hospital, see Secretary's Rules and Appendix.)

6. The District Medical Officer shall be under bond as a guarantee for his accounting for all public moneys received by him; the amount of bond to be determined by the Principal Medical Officer. The bond shall be in a guarantee company, the premium of which will be paid by the Department.

## ATTENDANCE ON GOVERNMENT OFFICERS AND THEIR FAMILIES.

- 7. Officers who entered the Civil Service of the Colony prior to 8th July, 1886, and their families are entitled to free medical attendance and medicine, and such attendance will be given to them by the District Medical Officer in whose district they may be stationed.
- 8. The word "family" is to be understood to mean those persons who constitute an officer's ordinary household, and live under his roof and at his expense, having no means of their own. Able-bodied sons of over 18 years of age, and grown up persons who may live in the house for sake of convenience, or reside there as servants, etc., are not included in the word "family."
- 9. The members of the police force throughout the Colony are entitled to free attendance and medicine from the District Medical Officer, but not their wives and families, unless such officers entered the service prior to the 8th July, 1886.
- 10. Officers in the permanent employ of the Government, and stationed on the goldfields or in the tropical part of the Colony, are entitled (subject to rule 13) to medical attendance and medicine; but if admitted to a Government Hospital they must pay three-fourths of the ordinary rate per diem for maintenance.
- 11. Government officers travelling beyond their districts on duty are entitled to the gratuitous services of District Medical Officers who, however, will be entitled to charge the Government with the actual cost of medicines supplied, unless in lieu of drug allowance they receive their medicines from the Department.
- 12. Except when travelling on duty, Government officers will not be entitled to medical attendance or medicines when out of their districts.
- 13. No Government officer is entitled to medical attendance at public cost in a district where no Medical Officer is stationed.
- 14. Government officers, whose salaries are under £400 per annum, when requiring medical attendance for themselves or their families, may be required (when able to do so) to attend personally at the residence or hospital of the District Medical Officer of their respective districts, at such hours as may be notified for the purpose.

- 15. Government officers residing at a distance of more than one mile from the boundary of any town in which a Medical Officer may be employed, must, when requiring medical aid for themselves or their families, communicate with the District Medical Officer at his residence, and, in cases of emergency, the District Medical Officer will proceed to the patient's house, and will repeat the visit, if necessary; but such attendance is not to be prolonged at the expense of the Government.
- 16. Officers, voluntarily and for their own convenience, residing out of the district to which they are officially attached, will not be entitled as a matter of right to free medical attendance and medicines from the Medical Officer of the district in which they are so residing.
- 17. If at any time the post of Medical Officer should be vacant in any district, or if, from any other cause, the services of such Medical Officer are not available, the Medical Officer of an adjacent district will be required to give his services to that district when called upon by the Principal Medical Officer, Government Resident, or Resident Magistrate to do so.
- 18. District Medical Officers giving their attendance under Sections 15, 16, and 17 will provide their own means of transport, and be entitled to mileage at the rate of one shilling per mile one way.
- 19. District Medical Officers on the goldfields will be entitled to five shillings per mile one way; and all District Medical Officers will, in addition, be entitled to receive subsistence allowance at the rate of fifteen shillings per diem; one day to mean three meals and one night away from their proper place of residence. If they are able to return to their proper place of residence within nine hours, only two shillings and sixpence will be allowed. Officers on the Coolgardie, Yilgarn, Murchison, and Dundas Goldfields will be entitled to charge twenty-five per cent. additional to the above subsistence rates when called out of their districts. When called out of their districts under the provisions of Section 17, all District Medical Officers will, in addition to the usual subsistence rates, be entitled to charge one guinea for each day of their absence.
- 20. Mileage and expenses due in respect of visits to Government officers shall be defrayed by such officer if residing beyond a townsite, except by order of Government, who will then recoup the District Medical Officer.
- 21. Expenses so incurred will be paid from public funds on receipt of certificates from the District Medical Officer to the effect that the visits paid under Section 15 were absolutely urgent, or the duties performed under Section 17 were undertaken on the requisition of the Principal Medical Officer, Government Resident, or Resident Magistrate.
- 22. District Medical Officers are exempted from attendance at the accouchement of the wives of public servants, and on cases of venereal disease, and cases resulting from the abuse of alcohol.

#### ABSENCE FROM DISTRICT.

- 23. District Medical Officers desirous of absenting themselves from the townships in which they are stationed, before doing so, must obtain leave from the Principal Medical Officer, and their wish to do so must be forwarded in writing.
- 24. The above does not apply when at any time their professional services may be required in their own or a neighbouring district, in which case it will only be necessary for them to notify the Resident Magistrate or Warden of their district.

## HOSPITAL EXPENDITURE AND SUSPENSION OF OFFICERS.

25. District Medical Officers are not to incur any expenditure other than the purchasing of provisions, etc., for the up-keep of their hospital, except by permission of the Principal Medical Officer.

- 26. In cases of great emergency, they can telegraph for authority, but otherwise their application must be made in writing, and full particulars must be given.
- 27. The District Medical Officer must not grant leave to any member of his Hospital Staff for a longer period than 48 hours, without first obtaining the approval of the Principal Medical Officer.

No appointment shall be made without the authority of the Principal Medical Officer.

The District Medical Officer may suspend any officer whose conduct merits it, and report fully thereon in writing or by telegram to the Principal Medical Officer, who will take final action.

#### ADMISSION INTO HOSPITAL.

- 28. Admission into hospitals can only be obtained by the order of the Medical Officer in charge, or, in cases of emergency, by authority of the Government Resident or Resident Magistrate of the district in which the hospital is situated. The following cases are not to be admitted:—
  - Any pregnant female for the purpose of confinement.
  - II. Any person suffering from an incurable disease.
  - III. Any person who can be treated as an out-patient.
  - IV. Any person whose admission might endanger the other patients.
- 29. If it is desired to remove a patient from a district hospital to the General Hospital, Perth, the approval of the Secretary or the Resident Medical Officer, Perth hospital, must be first obtained.
- 30. Patients admitted into hospital are to be divided into two classes: (1) Those able to pay for their treatment; (2) Those unable to pay for it.
- 31. Patients are not to be admitted into hospital, except in cases of emergency, until it has been ascertained in which class they are to be placed. If in the first they will be required to sign an agreement (see Appendix) pledging themselves to pay the regular charge, viz.:—3s. per diem in country hospitals, and 6s. in goldfields hospitals, which will cover all expenses of living, attendance, and treatment; and the Medical Officer will, if he considers it necessary, require the patient to obtain, in addition, a guarantee for its payment from some responsible person known to him. In the case of children and servants, the guarantee should be signed by the parent or master, or some other responsible person.
- 32. Patients whose circumstances enable them to pay for medical attendance are not necessarily to be admitted into the hospital on the above terms; but in special cases, when it may appear to the Medical Officer that it would be advantageous to a patient, and he is desirous that his case should be treated in hospital, this officer will be at liberty to admit such patient, where he will be charged such sum per diem as may be determined beforehand for his living, attendance, and treatment, but exclusive of any operation, should such be required. Except for surgical operations, all fees received are to be paid to Revenue.
- 33. The Medical Officer of the hospital will, at the end of every month, forward to the Principal Medical Officer, and to the Government Resident, Resident or Police Magistrate (as the case may be) of the district a list of fees due to the Government; and he shall also forward to the Principal Medical Officer a list of fees received by him during the month.
- 34. Persons admitted as out-patients will receive advice and medicines gratuitously at the hospitals at 10 a.m. daily. As a rule, no persons other than paupers are to be treated as out-patients, and if the District Medical Officer is in doubt in regard to the financial position of any person so seeking treatment, he may, for the purpose, obtain the assistance of the police in procuring the information desired.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR HOSPITAL ADMINISTRATION.

- 35. The wards of the hospital are to be ventilated, according to the state of the weather, under the special direction of the Medical Officer.
- 36. The floors are to be dry-rubbed and cleansed every day; but to be washed only when ordered by the Medical Officer. The bedding, as far as circumstances will admit, is to be shaken and freely exposed to the air every day.
- 37. On first admission every patient, unless too ill to be subjected to the treatment, is to be made perfectly clean with soap and water, and his hair combed or cut, if necessary; he is then to be supplied with hospital clothing, and removed to his bed.
- 38. A ticket, with the name, age, status, religious denomination, disease, date of admission, and treatment, to be hung over the bed-head of each patient.
- 39. Patients with infectious or contagious diseases are to be kept separate from those suffering from other complaints; and the bedding of such must be thoroughly cleansed, disinfected, and aired before being used again, or put in store.
- 40. Patients will be required to wear the clothing and linen provided for them by the Government. The latter will be changed at least twice, and the sheets of the bed once, in each week, and oftener if necessary.
- 41. All patients who are convalescent will be required to rise at 6 a.m. in summer and 7:30 in winter, and all beds are to be neatly made by 8 a.m.
- 42. As quietness and rest are absolutely indispensable in hospitals, great care is to be taken that every duty be performed with the least possible noise. Every patient must be in bed by 7 o'clock p.m. in winter and 8 p.m. in summer; and no conversation is to be permitted after that hour, nor any fires or lights left burning, except such as the Medical Officer may have directed.

#### IN-PATIENTS.

- 43. In-patients must obey the directions of the professional staff.
- 44. Patients may receive visits from their friends on Wednesday and Sunday, between the hours of two and four o'clock in the afternoon, not exceeding two to each on any one day, and at other times and in other numbers by the special permission of the Medical Officer.
- 45. No in-patient shall leave his bed or ward without permission.
- 46. No in-patient shall absent himself from the hospital without permission of the Medical Officer.
- 47. No male patient shall go into the female wards, and female patient into the male wards, without leave of the Medical Officer.
- 48. No patient shall smoke in any of the wards or corridors of the hospital, or gamble or swear or use abusive language, or in any manner behave indecently on any part of the hospital premises. If any visitor be guilty of any of the offences aforesaid, or supply liquor or provisions to patients, the visitor so offending shall be prohibited from visiting the hospital again without the special leave of the Medical Officer.
- 49. In-patients who, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, are able to work, shall assist the nurses or servants in such employments as the Secretary or Matron may direct.
- 50. If any patient have any cause of complaint, such patient may, within one week after such cause has occurred, but not afterwards, complain in writing to the Medical Officer, the Secretary, or the Matron, who shall report it to the District Medical Officer or Principal Medical Officer.

- 51. Patients or their friends are prohibited from giving money, or any gratuity whatsoever, to any person employed in the hospital.
- 52. As the wants of the patients are fully provided for, the introduction of any articles of food or drink (without the sanction of the Medical Officer) is positively forbidden.
- 53. Any patient not conforming to these Rules may be expelled by the Resident Medical Officer, who shall report the same to the District Medical Officer, but such patient may be re-admitted by the authority of the District Medical Officer.
- 54. Patients obtaining passes for leave of absence must return to the hospital by 6 o'clock p.m. Passes are available for the day only on which they are issued.

#### GENERAL RULES.

- 55. A copy of the following Rules and Regulations, as far as they concern his or her office, shall be furnished to each officer at time of appointment, and a duplicate copy, signed by such officer, shall be duly filed for record and reference.
- 56. Printed copies of the Rules and Regulations affecting the patients, official duties, and the general management of the various departments of the hospital and dispensary shall be hung up in the departments concerned, for general information.
- 57. No officer, servant, or other person belonging to the institution shall take, on any pretence, directly or indirectly, a fee, reward, or gratuity from any patient whatever, nor from any tradesman or other person supplying or desirous of supplying the institution; and any person by any infringement of this rule shall be liable to removal from office or place without notice.
- 58. If the hours between which the various officers are expected to be on duty, as hereinafter defined, are found, in the smaller hospitals connected with the department, to be detrimental to the interests of the smooth working of the institution, the District Medical Officer may alter them accordingly. The daily leave of two hours to the nurses shall be decided upon by the Matron, as also the afternoon and Sunday leave. Night duty, as a rule, should not be continuous for a nurse or orderly for more than two months at a time.
- 59. Meals.—The hour for officers' breakfast shall be eight o'clock, and the table shall be cleared at nine o'clock; the dinner hour shall be half-past five o'clock, and the table shall be cleared at half-past six. The hour for tea shall be half-past seven, and the table shall be cleared at half-past seven, and the table shall be cleared at half-past eight. Luncheon shall be provided at half-past twelve o'clock, and remain one hour on the table; and no meals are to be provided at any other hour, unless unavoidable attendance on the medical duties of the hospital shall prevent an officer from joining the table at the regular time. The dinner hour on Sundays shall be one o'clock, and the table shall be cleared at three. These hours are to be adhered to as far as possible, but, if necessary, the matron may alter them.
- 60. The patients' breakfast hour shall be half-past seven o'clock or eight o'clock; dinner at one, and tea at six.
- 61. Half-past ten o'clock shall be the hour for the servants of the establishment to go to bed.
- 62. Any employé of the hospital suffering from fever or other illness contracted in the performance of duty in the institution will receive the privilege, as well as being treated free as an in-patient, of receiving full pay until sufficiently recovered to resume duty; such privilege as regards full pay not to exceed a period of three months.
- 63 The matrons and nurses employed in the goldfields' hospitals, also those employed in hospitals situated in the tropical part of the Colony, will be entitled to one month's holiday each year, and all other servants to a fortnight's holiday, on full pay. Matrons, nurses, and all other servants employed in the country hospitals will be entitled to a fortnight's annual leave on the above terms.

- 64. Any person engaged in Perth by the Principal Medical Officer, and who has to proceed to a country or goldfields' hospital, will have his or her railway or other fare paid by the Department, and shall sign an agreement to remain in the service of the Department for a period of six months. Should any persons so engaged leave the service before the expiration of the term signed for, they will render them selves liable to have the cost of their passage money deducted from any salary due to them. The actual expenses for meals when travelling to any centre, to which they may be sent by the Principal Medical Officer, will be refunded by the Department, on receipt of a duly certified voucher (Form N.), which must be signed by the Secretary or District Medical Officer.
- 65. The washing of the nursing staff and all other resident officers at the hospital will be done at the expense of the Department, but nurses and other female employés will not be entitled to send to the laundry articles of apparel which they wear when off duty, such as dresses, blouses, etc.
- 66. A leave of absence book shall be kept, in which every officer shall sign his or her name, stating the time going off duty and the time he or she returns to the Hospital.
- 67. All communications to the Principal Medical Officer must be sent through the District Medical Officer.

#### THE RESIDENT PHYSICIAN OR SURGEON.

- 68. Every Resident Physician or Surgeon shall, subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Department, be appointed for two years only, but may be eligible for reappointment.
- 69. No Resident Physician or Surgeon shall, during his term of office, engage in any private practice.
- 70. In the absence of the District Medical Officer he shall, if required, undertake the entire discharge of his duties at the hospital.
- 71. He shall have the charge of, and be responsible for the surgical instruments and apparatus, and may cause ordinary repairs to be effected thereto; and on taking office shall sign the inventory in proof of the correctness thereof. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no alteration or addition to any instruments or apparatus shall be made, except on the written direction of the District Medical Officer, subject to the approval of the Principal Medical Officer.
- 72. He shall be directly responsible to the District Medical Officer, and through him to the Principal Medical Officer, for the proper order and management under such instructions as he may receive for the general supervision of the hospital.
- 73. He may summon the police to take charge of any case of attempted suicide or violence, and, if necessary, engage a special attendant.
- 74. He shall not, unless required by these Regulations or by the District Medical Officer, undertake any routine, medical, or surgical work in the wards, but, by general supervision, see that the nurses and orderlies strictly carry out the instructions of the District Medical Officer, and also keep a thorough and complete record in the case book of all cases treated in the hospital. Where there is no Resident Medical Officer, the District Medical Officer must keep the record.
- 75. He shall have full power to admit, or refuse to admit, the friends of any patient as he may think fit, and may, in his discretion, prevent the admission of visitors to a ward at any time.
- 76. He shall, during the winter, deliver a course of lectures to the junior nurses and probationers, attendance at which shall be compulsory.

- 77. He shall sign all certificates awarded to the nurses who may have gone through a course of training in Tak hospital; such certificates must also be signed by the District Medical Officer and Matron, and will be issued from the office of the Principal Medical Officer.
- 78. It shall be his duty to make all necessary communications to the Press touching cases of accident or assault admitted to the hospital.
- 79. He shall be responsible for, and, with the assistance of the District Medical Officer and Secretary, shall prepare the Annual Report of his hospital, in so far as the medical portion is concerned.
- 80. In the absence of the Secretary, all matters which in the ordinary way would be referred to him shall be referred to the Resident Physician or Surgeon.
- 81. He shall, in the absence of the Dispenser, dispense or prepare any drugs or dressings which may be urgently required.
- 82. He shall not perform any operation without the consent of the District Medical Öfficer, unless in cases of special emergency.
- . 83. He shall administer anæsthetics, subject to the direction of the District Medical Officer; no anæsthetics shall be administered in any hospital except in the presence of a medical man.
  - 84. In respect to the operating theatre he shall see—
    - (a.) That the windows and ventilators, etc., are in proper working order.
    - (b.) That there is a good supply of various antiseptic lotions, dressings, bandages, etc.
    - (c.) That all instruments, bandages, dressings and other appliances, are neatly and carefully arranged in proper and suitable places.
    - (d.) That it is thoroughly, regularly, and completely cleaned.
    - (e.) That it is kept locked.
    - (f.) That previous to operations it is properly warmed.
    - (g.) That all instruments likely to be required are rendered aseptic, and laid out in readiness and proper working order.
    - (h.) That immediately after an operation all the instruments used, when permissible, are cleansed, rendered aseptic, and replaced in their proper place in the operating cases.
    - (i.) That immediately after any operation all slabs, basins, etc., are thoroughly scrubbed and cleaned.
- 85. The Resident Physician or Resident Surgeon shall be under the direction of the District Medical Officer, and shall attend him, if so required, during his visits routed the various wards.
- 86. The times of house duty to be observed by the Resident Physician or Surgeon shall be fixed by the District Medical Officer, and a notice showing the time of duty shall be placed in the mess-room.
- 87. No Resident Physician or Surgeon shall leave the hospital during his time of duty, as shown by the aforesaid notice, unless he has obtained leave from the District Medical Officer.
- 88. No Resident Physician or Surgeon shall be out of the house on any night later than 12 o'clock, unless he has obtained special leave from the District Medical Officer.
- 89. In the event of the Resident Physician or Surgeon being incapacitated for duty from any cause, he shall report the same to the Principal Medical Officer through the District Medical Officer, and shall also report in like manner if any unforeseen exigency shall necessitate his absence from the hospital during the time he is on duty.

- 90. The Resident Physician or Surgeon shall commence duty not later than 9 o'clock every morning, and shall also visit the wards every evening, commencing not later than 8 o'clock.
- 91. Every Resident Physician or Surgeon, or District Medical Officer shall enter in the "Certificate of Death Book" the necessary particulars of all deaths of patients under his care, and shall attach his signature to each entry, and his initials to the block.
- 92. No Medical Officer shall publish the report of any case without the written permission of the Principal Medical Officer.
- 93. Every Resident Physician or Surgeon shall, at once, report to the District Medical Officer, through the Matron, with a view to immediate inquiry being instituted, any neglect of duty or misconduct on the part of any of the nurses which may come to his knowledge.
- 94. Every Resident Physician or Surgeon shall be personally responsible for the prompt attendance on all cases of emergency, and for the proper application of all necessary splints, bandages, and dressings to patients suffering from accidents, or who may have been operated on.
- 95. In all infectious cases and in all other cases which a Resident Physician or Surgeon considers to be serious, he shall at once inform the District Medical Officer, and shall, in the absence of the District Medical Officer, take such action as he may deem necessary for the benefit of the patient.
- 96. The Resident Physician or Surgeon and District Medical Officers are prohibited from giving testimonials of conduct or qualification to the nursing staff or other employés of the hospital without the sanction of the Principal Medical Officer.
- 97. Misconduct on the part of the House Surgeon shall render him liable to suspension by the District Medical Officer, who must immediately make a report thereon, by wire, to the Principal Medical Officer.

#### THE HONORARY DENTIST.

- 98. An Honorary Dentist may be appointed, on the recommendation of the Principal Medical Officer, by the Minister controlling the Department, the tenure of office being two years, subject to the following conditions:—
  - He shall attend at the hospital from 9 till 10 a.m. on Tuesdays and Fridays, and give relief to such cases as may be referred to him by the Resident Physician or Surgeon or District Medical Officer.
  - In cases of emergency he shall attend, as soon as possible, at the request of any of the medical or resident staff.
  - He shall enter in a book kept for the purpose the names of all cases and the treatment adopted.

#### THE MATRON.

- 99. The Matron, who shall be the head of the nursing and training staff, subject to any agreement, shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor, and reside in the quarters provided for her, and shall devote the whole of her time and attention to the superintendence of the nursing, and the nursing staff of the hospital.
- 100. She shall also take the entire charge of the domestic affairs of the nurses and female employes, and have full control over the nursing staff attached to the institution; and in case of disobedience of orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any member of the nursing staff, servants, etc. (male or female), she shall have power to suspend any of them, immediately acquainting the Resident Physician or Surgeon or District Medical Officer of the fact, and reporting fully thereon, in writing, through the Secretary, to the Principal Medical Officer.
- 101. She shall report, in writing, all resignations, vacancies, leave of absence, promotions, and defects in the

- nursing staff to the Principal Medical Officer, through the District Medical Officer, and shall furnish monthly, to the Principal Medical Officer, a report as to the efficiency or otherwise of the nursing staff.
- 102. She shall be careful to see that all articles of bedding, clothing, etc., are kept in thorough repair, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and regularly aired, and that no bedding which has been in use be stored away without previous airing.
- 103. She shall inculcate strict conomy in the use of provisions, medical comforts, fuel and light, and see that order and cleanliness prevail throughout the establishment.
- 104. She shall visit each ward at least twice every day, and see that the wards and patients are in a proper state of order and cleanliness, carefully supervising all that appertains to the nursing and home departments, or that may contribute to the comfort and welfare of the patients and to the efficiency of the hospital generally.
- 105. She shall see to the daily delivery to the cook of the proper quantity of provisions for the day's consumption according to the diet roll.
- 106. She shall receive from the Secretary (from the general store) on requisition made in writing, all clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind for the use of the hospital, and for the care and custody of which she shall be responsible.
- 107. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the nurses' quarters, the quality, quantity, and preparation of the food, the state of their rooms, and the comfort generally of the nurses, and shall guard, as far as possible, against irregularities of conduct on the part of the nurses and servants, such as late hours, absence without leave, objectionable familiarities, etc., and by the maintenance of a wholesome discipline on her part among her subordinates, secure a high sense of the responsibilities devolving upon them.
- 108. She shall be responsible that no ward be left without the presence of a nurse or junior purse, and see that all nurses carry out the directions of the Medical Officers relative to the treatment of patients.
- 109. She shall give such practical and theoretical instruction as may be necessary for the training of the nurses; and, in addition to the ordinary instruction, shall see that all nurses be practically instructed in all branches of cooking for the sick, such as making beef tea, arrowroot, gruel, mutton broth, puddings, etc.
- 110. She shall take care that the nurses attend the lectures and other forms of instruction given by the Resident Physician or Surgeon.
- 111. She shall visit the laundry and give the necessary directions concerning the washing and getting up of the linen, blankets, and other articles, and see that the same are fit for use before being again issued.
- 112. She shall also give directions for making and mending the linen and clothing, and that all articles are properly marked with the name of the hospital and numbered.

#### THE SECRETARY.

- 113. The Secretary shall sign a written agreement and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor.
- 114. He shall be directly under the control of and responsible to the District Medical Officer, and shall not be engaged directly or indirectly in any business or profession, unless by special permission of the Principal Medical Officer in writing.
- 115. He shall be under bond, as a guarantee of his duly paying and accounting for all moneys received by him. The amount of the bond is to be determined by the

Principal Medical Officer. The bond shall be in a guarantee company, the premium of which will be paid by the department.

- 116. He shall conduct the correspondence, which shall all be signed by the District Medical Officer, and shall have charge of all documents relating to the hospital; and shall keep the books, forms, and accounts of the hospital, which shall be kept in such manner that they can be readily referred to: and shall submit his accounts to the District Medical Officer, or an officer from the Principal Medical Officer's office, when required to do so.
- 117. He shall keep in a press copy book copies of all letters written, and shall file all letters received on the business of the institution, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the District Medical Officer or the Principal Medical Officer.
- 118. He shall receive all moneys paid at the hospital, and enter the same in the cash-book, and pay the same to the Treasury Cashier or Sub-Collector of Revenue daily, obtaining from him a receipt in due form for the amounts so paid in; a copy of these accounts, initialled by the Treasury Cashier, shall be rendered monthly to the Principal Medical Officer
- 119. He shall keep the contributor's book, and shall enter therein and in the cash-book all subscriptions or donations received, and shall report the same to the Principal Medical Officer monthly.
- 120. He shall keep an admittance and discharge book, recording full particulars of each patient. (For headings, etc., see Appendix.)
- 121. He shall receive all property and moneys from patients on admission, and enter particulars thereof in a book to be kept for that purpose, giving the patient a receipt therefor, and on the discharge of the owner he shall return the same, taking a proper receipt.
- 122. He shall on a patient being admitted, or as soon afterwards as possible, ascertain if the patient is able to pay hospital fees or not.
- 123. In the former case he shall obtain a signed agreement to pay fees, and, if necessary, a guarantee to pay them, and in the latter case he shall obtain a declaration to the effect that the patient is unable to pay, recording both in his admittance book.
- 124. To those able to pay he shall furnish an account on Form A, and if it is not paid in a reasonable time he shall furnish him with Form B (reminder) and likewise Form C (final notice), and in the event of non-payment within three (3) days thereafter, he shall report the matter to the District Medical Officer and the Principal Medical Officer.
- 125. He shall, monthly, furnish to the Principal Medical Officer a list of outstanding fees.
- 126. He shall receive accounts from contractors and tradesmen, which must be furnished in duplicate, and shall instruct the contractors and tradesmen to furnish them so that they cover a calendar month.
- 127. He shall put the hospital stamp and date on the back of accounts to show the date of receipt from the contractor.
- 128. He shall carefully examine all the tradesmen's bills; and shall certify as to their correctness, in terms of Section 14 of the Audit Act, as follows:—
  - "We certify in terms of Section 14 of the Audit Act that the amount charged in this voucher as to computations, castings, and rates is correct, that the service has been faithfully performed, and that the expenditure is duly authorised;"

and he will be held responsible for the careful checking according to contract rates, etc.

- 129. He shall note all accounts in a book kept for that purpose (see Appendix for particulars), and shall forward the original accounts to the Principal Medical Officer as soon as possible after their receipt, himself retaining the duplicate.
- 130. He shall be accountable for the furniture, clothing, bedding, linen, glass, crockery, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, and shall keep an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose.
- 131. He shall, quarterly (in the first week of March. June, September, and December), requisition (in duplicate) to the Principal Medical Officer for such things as may be required in his hospital for the ensuing quarter.
- 132. He shall, under the direction of the Matron, order and receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and tradesmen, and see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and orders
- 133. He shall record them in a stock book to be kept for that purpose, and shall be responsible for the due issue of the same; should the goods, however, not be in accordance with the quality tendered for, he shall have power to return them.
- 134. He shall not procure any stores from any persons other than those under contract to supply, except by direction, in writing, of the Principal Medical Officer.
- 135. He shall make out a daily diet roll by which the number of patients on each diet may be known.
- 136. He shall not lend any official books or papers belonging to the hospital, or permit them to be removed or inspected without the express permission of the Principal Medical Officer, or the District Medical Officer.
- 137. He shall obtain authority from the Principal Medical Officer for any repairs that may be necessary, and shall supervise during the progress of any works; he shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in a proper state.
- 138. He shall be responsible to the District Medical Officer that all parts of the hospital grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order.
- 139. He shall, when practicable, instruct and drill the male employés in hose practice and the use of fire-extinguishing appliances, and in the event of fire he shall assume command.
- 140. He shall be responsible for the due observance of the Rules and Regulations, and shall keep an interleaved book containing them, and insert any new by-law issued, and shall communicate it to the person or persons to whom it may relate. He shall report to the Principal Medical Officer in writing through the District Medical Officer any gross misconduct or neglect of regulations on the part of any member of the staff.
  - 141. He shall keep the following books, etc.:--

Admission and Discharge Book.

Cash Book.

Fees and Donation Ledger.

Letter Book.

Letter File.

Patients' Property Book.

Stock Book,

Visitors' Book.

Inventory of all Furniture and effects.

Record of all Accounts passed to Principal Medical Officer for payment.

Record of all Salaries.

Stimulants Book.

142. He shall furnish the following Returns to the Principal Medical Officer:—

Weekly Return of Patients, every Saturday. Monthly Return of Patients, etc., every month. Monthly Return of Fees and Donations received every month.

Monthly Return of Fees outstanding every month.

Monthly Return of Salaries due to Staff on the 20th of each month.

Change of Staff immediately it occurs.

#### THE DISPENSER.

- 143. The Dispenser shall be in attendance at the hospital from 8·30 o'clock a.m. until 5 p.m., or at any time when his services may be required by the Resident Physician or Surgeon or District Medical Officer.
- 144. He shall have the entire charge of the dispensing utensils and medicines; shall examine all drugs and chemicals brought into the hospital, both as to quality and quantity, and shall report any defect in either respect to the Resident Physician or District Medical Officer; he shall be responsible for all medicines and other articles intrusted to his care, and shall make an inventory of the same in a book, called the "Drug Book," to be kept for that purpose.
- 145. He shall prepare yearly, in such month as may be directed by the Principal Medical Officer, a return showing the cost of all drugs and sundries used in his hospital during the past 12 months.
- 146. He shall, if required, be present and give such assistance as he may be able at any operation when called upon to do so by the Resident Physician or Surgeon or District Medical Officer.
- 147. He shall prepare quarterly (January, April, July, and December), in duplicate, a list of all drugs and sundries required for the ensuing three months in his hospital, which must be signed by himself and the District Medical Officer, and forwarded to the Principal Medical Officer.

#### CHARGE NURSES.

- 148. At the period of their appointment, Charge Nurses shall not be under 24 years of age. They will be recommended by the Matron to the Principal Medical Officer after consultation with the District Medical Officer, and will be held responsible to her for the efficient nursing of the patients and the good order and cleanliness of the wards.
- 149. They shall reside in the quarters allotted to them and when on duty shall wear such distinguishing dress as the Principal Medical Officer, on the recommendation of the Matron, may direct.
- 150. They shall devote their time and attention to the duties of their office, and shall not be absent from the hospital after 10 p.m., nor leave their wards during their hours of duty except by permission of the Matron.
- 151. They shall at no time leave their wards without placing a qualified nurse in charge.
- 152. They shall be careful before going off duty to give the nurse in charge all necessary instructions in writing concerning any patient requiring special care and attention.
- 153. They shall have the control, when on duty, of the nurses and servants in their respective wards, and shall report to the Matron if they do not perform their duties punctually and efficiently.
- 154. They shall be responsible to the Matron for the efficient training of probationers in all practical details of their work, both medical and surgical, and shall report to her thereon as she may require from time to time.
- 155. They shall see that patients, on admission, are properly bathed and cleaned, and that they are provided with clean linen.
- 156. They are strictly enjoined to preserve order, silence, and decorum among the patients, nurses, and servants, and to prohibit improper conduct and conversation.

- 157. They shall superintend all the ward meals, and allot the diets.
- 158. They shall see that such patients as may be able to do so take their meals at the public table of the ward, and that all patients retire to bed at such hours as may be appointed.
- 159. They are expected to have always in readiness in the surgical wards a proper assortment of bandages, as well as lint, strapping, and other ordinary dressings.
- 160. They shall have charge of all linen, bed-clothing, earthenware, and all appliances used in their respective wards, and will be held responsible to the Matron for correct keeping of the same. They shall be particularly attentive to the state of the bedding, and see that it is kept clean and in repair.
- 161. They shall personally assist in the nursing of all patients seriously ill, besides superintending the nursing of their respective wards, that they may be able to report to the attending physician or surgeon, whom they shall accompany when visiting the patients. They shall have the special care and custody of the medicines kept in stock in the wards, and shall see that they are not used without their knowledge and sanction. They shall superintend the administration of all drugs and external applications, noting accurately the prescribed doses and intervals of administration and application, and they shall on no account give any medicines to patients without the order of the Medical Officer. If any unusual symptoms occur in a patient, or if a Sister is at all in doubt as to her instructions concerning the medicines to be given, she shall apply at once to the Resident Physician or Resident Surgeon for direction. At the visits of the Medical Officers, she shall be accompanied by the probationers. In the surgical wards, all tray dressings must be ready by the hours of visit, and the nurse ready to give whatever assistance is required by the surgeons.
- 162. They shall, each afternoon before two o'clock, send to the Secretary's office all diet cards on which alterations have been made by the Medical Officers for the day following. They shall see that the wines and other liquors are punctually administered in the appointed quantities. They shall also be careful that such articles of food as may not be required shall be returned to the kitchen, and that wines and spirits not used, owing to the deaths or otherwise of the patients for whom they have been prescribed, are returned to the Secretary's office.
- 163. They shall see that the beds of the patients are made regularly every morning, and that all soiled bed linen, dressings, and dust are removed each day before 9 a.m., at 2·30 p.m., and 6·30 p.m., and they shall be careful that the cupboards, sculleries, and water-closets are kept clean and well aired, and that no dirt and articles not required are allowed to accumulate therein, and that all ward utensils are kept thoroughly clean.
- 164. They shall see that the patients wash themselves regularly before breakfast, in basins provided for that purpose, and that such as are unable to leave their beds are attended by the nurses. They shall see that the baths prescribed are regularly given, and in all respects they shall impress upon the patients the propriety and necessity of personal cleanliness.
- 165. They shall be at liberty to employ the patients to assist in the ward work, provided always such employment in the opinion of the Medical Officer be not inconsistent with their recovery. Sisters in the female wards shall take charge of the needlework sent from the linen store, and distribute it among such patients as are able to work, and they shall see that the work is well and efficiently done.
- 166. They shall, on the death of a patient, and within one hour of the occurrence, send the bed card to the Secretary's office, with the time of death noted thereon. They shall see that the body is washed and dressed in clean linen, and removed to the Mortuary without delay, with the name and age attached.

- 167. They shall see that all empty bottles, etc., are returned to the dispensary by 8:30 a.m., and that all medicines not required are also returned to that department.
- 168. They shall see that the lamps are kept low, and that lights are turned out at the appointed hours by the night
- 169. They shall take care that no fee or reward is accepted by a nurse from patients or their friends.
- 170. They shall see that trinkets and other property in the possession of patients on their admission are taken to the Secretary's office for safe keeping, and that the clothing, if not required, is sent to the store.
- 171. They shall see, in the event of a patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion, that notice is sent to the Secretary, in order that there may be no delay in complying with the request.
- 172. They shall be careful that no visitors are admitted to the wards, except on the appointed days and hours, without written permission from the Resident or District Medical Officer. But in case of sudden or serious illness, they shall send the names of the patients to the Secretary's office, in order that the visits of relatives or friends may be facilitated. They shall take care that visitors do not bring articles of food or drink to the patients, and that all bundles (belonging to patients) are inspected before being taken out of the ward.
- 173. In the evening before leaving the wards, they shall see that the Night Nurse in charge is duly informed of the condition of each patient requiring special attention, and everything in the ward must be left in perfect order.

#### THE NURSES.

- 174. Their hours of duty shall be such as may from time to time be arranged by the Matron. All nurses are required to keep their sleeping apartments neat and clean, and make their own beds. Nurses on day duty must be in bed by 10·30 p.m.; the lights must be turned out at that hour.
- 175. They shall make the beds with the assistance of the probationers in their respective wards every morning before eight o'clock. They must be ready to assist and shift all infirm or helpless patients, and they shall take care that those patients who are incapable of leaving their beds be either washed by them, or supplied with washing materials when able to assist themselves, and also that all linen removed from the beds is sent without delay to the laundry.
- 176. They must behave with great patience and kindness to the patients under their care, and pay attention to their state and symptoms, that they may be able to report to the Sister, and, in her absence, to the Medical Officers. If any threatening symptom should manifest itself in a patient, the nurse must give immediate notice to the Sister of the ward, that further aid may be obtained.
- 177. They shall attend under the Sister's directions, or at the request of the Medical Officers, to the application and administration of all remedies prescribed, and if they are doubtful as to their instructions, they must apply at once to the Sister for advice. They are strictly forbidden to give medicines to patients on their own responsibility.
- 178. They shall, in the absence of the Sister, accompany the Medical Officers in the course of their daily visits, and be ready to give information respecting the action of the medicines, and the previous condition and symptoms of the patients. In the surgical wards, the nurses must have their trays, dressing-pans, and other appliances in readiness at the hour of these visits, and give whatever assistance is required of them by the surgeons or the dressers, and any complaint as to the conduct of patients or assistants in the wards must be made at once to the Sister.
- 179. They shall have ready for collection all the empty medicine bottles, pots, boxes, powder, labels, etc., which require to be refilled or replaced by half-past eight in the morning, and shall also take care that there is sufficient of

- each preparation to last from Saturday till Monday. After the visit of the Medical Officer, they shall take to the Dizzapensary the treatment charts, as well as all medicines, lotions, etc., which are discontinued. On no account shall unused preparations be allowed to accumulate in the wards. If a medicine bottle is broken, or anything lost which may be ordered for the patients, they must report to the Dispenser without delay, and at the same time show him the treatment chart on which the prescription is written, in order that it may be at once replaced. Between the hours of two and three o'clock in the afternoon, articles not specially ordered for any particular patient, such as lint, tow, linseed meal, etc., must be obtained from the dispensary.
- 180. In the evening, before leaving the wards, they shall see that the night nurse in charge is duly informed of the condition of each patient requiring special attention, and everything in the ward must be left in perfect order.
- 181. They shall not visit other wards without the per mission of the Sister, nor shall they, when off duty, enter the wards or loiter about the corridors.

#### THE SUPERINTENDENT OF NIGHT NURSES.

- 182. She shall be responsible for the nursing of the patients during the night, according to the written or verbal instructions of the Medical Officers to the night nurses, and she shall visit the wards at frequent intervals, paying particular attention to urgent or severe cases.
- 183. She shall see that the nurses administer medicine, stimulants, and food at the proper times, as directed.
- 184. She shall communicate at once to the Resident Medical Officer on duty any change in a serious case.
- 185. She shall, on the death of a patient, see that all arrangements are carried out with promptitude.
- 186. She shall see that the night nurses carry out the rules relating to their position, and on her last visit to the wards shall sign the nurses' night chart.
- 187. She shall report, in writing, daily to the Matron on matters relating to the condition of the patients and conduct of nurses.
- 188. She is strictly forbidden to give medicines to patients on her own responsibility, but should immediately call the Resident Physician or Surgeon if any fresh symptom should develop in any patient.

#### NIGHT NURSES.

- 189. Their hours for duty shall be such as may from time to time be arranged by the Matron.
- 190. They shall preserve order and quiet in their wards during the night. They are not permitted to sleep, lie down, or leave their wards during the night, except for urgent reasons.
- 191. They shall, on entering on duty for the night, receive from the day nurse verbal and written instructions concerning the patients, and shall present the night chart to the Superintendent of Night Nurses for signature on her last visit to the ward. In case of emergency, they shall inform the Superintendent of Night Nurses or call in the assistance of the Medical Officer at once. The sub-division of duties assigned to nurses shall be arranged by the Matron.
- 192. They shall pay particular attention to the state and symptoms of the patients, visiting them frequently and administering their medicines and stimulants at regular intervals, and in the manner prescribed.
- 193. They shall see that the lights are kept low, and that they are turned off at daylight.
- 194. Before leaving their wards, they must report to the Sister or nurse as to the state of the patients, especially as regards cases of a serious nature, and everything in the ward must be left in perfect order.
- Note. —Nurses and wards-maids on duty in that part of the hospital set apart for infectious cases shall not by day or night (unless specially ordered to do so) have inter-

course or communication with any other part of the hampital, or the nurses' house, or any patient in any other part of the hospital.

#### NURSE PROBATIONERS.

- 195. They shall be engaged by the Principal Medical Officer, and discharged on the recommendation of the Matron. They shall not be under twenty years of age, and shall continue on trial for one month without pay, at the expiration of which, if found satisfactory, they shall be requested to sign an agreement to remain in the employment of the hospital for a period not less than three years, unless, in the matter of ability or conduct, they are found to be unsatisfactory, in which event, on the recommendation of the Matron, their agreement may be cancelled by the Principal Medical Officer.
- 196. They shall be respectful and obedient to all in authority, and, without hesitation or comment, carry out industry duty assigned to them by the Charge Nurse under whom they are placed.
- 197. They shall wear, when on duty, such distinguishing dress as the Principal Medical Officer, on the recommendation of the Matron, may direct.
- 198. They shall, when on duty, be under the more immediate control of the Sister in charge of the ward in which they are placed, and during their second year may be required to take night duty, or at any time, if in the opinion of the Matron or District Medical Officer they are competent to do so.
- 199. Their hours of duty shall be arranged from time to time by the Matron, and when on duty they are not to leave their wards except by permission of the Sister, or to engage in any private work whatever. No nurse or probationer shall be permitted to see friends when on duty.
- 200. They shall make the beds of the patients in their respective wards, and be ready to assist, wash, and feed infirm and helpless patients, and see that those able to assist themselves are supplied with washing materials before leaving the wards. They shall see that everything is in readiness for the night nurse, in accordance with the instructions of the Sister, and they must relieve each other punctually at the hour appointed.
- 201. They shall act under the Sister or nurses, and assist them, when required, in all departments of their work. They shall assist in keeping the wards and ward furniture clean and in its proper place, and, when necessary, assist in fetching the patients' food from the kitchen. They shall, during the afternoon, take messages and fetch articles from the dispensary. All other matters relating to details of their work shall be arranged by the Matron.
- 202. They shall be subject in all matters of discipline to the same regulations as the nurses. When off duty, they are not to enter the wards without permission, and they are not to loiter about the lobbies or corridors.
- 203. They are on no consideration to take presents or money from the patients or their friends.
- 204. They shall retire to their rooms at 10 o'clock, and the lights must be turned off at 10 30.
- 205. At the completion of their engagement they will receive a certificate according to their efficiency.
- 206. They will be required to attend a course of lectures during the first and second years.

TERMS UPON WHICH PROBATIONERS WILL BE ENGAGED.

- 207. The age considered desirable for probationers is from twenty to thirty, and they must be spinsters or widows. A certificate of age and other information will be required, according to the form printed herein.
- 208. The term of all probationers' training is three years. They will be received on the distinct understanding that they will remain for the required time. They may, however, be allowed to withdraw on approved grounds. They

will be subject to be suspended at any time by the Matron in case of misconduct, or should she consider them inefficient or negligent of their duties.

209. The probationers will be under the authority of the Matron, and will be subject to the rules of the Department.

#### PROBATIONERS.

- 210. The names of probationers will be entered in a Register, in which a record will be kept of their conduct and qualifications. At the end of their period of training those who have passed satisfactorily through their course of instruction will be entered in the Register of Nurses.
- 211. At the expiration of one month from the date of entry, every probationer will be required to write a letter to the following effect:—

" To the Principal Medical Officer, Perth.

"Sir,—Having now become practically acquainted with the duties required of a Hospital Nurse, I am satisfied that I shall be able and willing, on the completion of my period of training, to enter into service in a public hospital or as a private nurse, and I engage, in accordance with the regulations of the Medical Department, and in return for the advantages bestowed upon me, to continue in such service for the space of at least three years, in whatever situations may be thought suitable to my ability.

#### DUTIES OF PROBATIONERS.

You are required to be-

Obedient.
Sober,
Honest,
Truthful,
Trustworthy,
Punctual,
Quiet and orderly,
Cleanly and neat,
Patient, cheerful, and kindly.

- 212. You are expected to become skilful-
  - 1. In the dressing of blisters, burns, sores, wounds.
  - In applying fomentations, poultices, and minor dressings, and in the administration of subcutaneous injections.
  - 3. In the application of leeches, externally and internally.
  - 4. In the administration of enemas for men and women, and the use of the catheter for women.
  - 5. In the management of trusses and appliances in uterine complaints.
  - 6. In the best method of friction to the body and extremities.
  - 7. In the management of helpless patients, that is—moving, changing, personal cleanliness of, feeding, keeping warm or cool, preventing and dressing bedsores, managing position of.
  - 8. In bandaging, making bandages and rollers, linings of splints, etc.
  - 9. In making the beds of the patients, and removing of sheets while patient is in bed.

You are required—

- 10. To attend operations, to understand ventilation, or keeping the ward fresh by night as well as by day. You are to be careful that great cleanliness is observed in all the utensils in the ward.
- 11. To make strict observation of the sick in the following particulars:—The state of the secretions, expectoration, pulse, skin, appetite, intelligence (as delirium or stuper), breathing, sleep, state of wounds, eruption, formation of pus, effect of diet or of stimulants, and of medicines, and to "take" the temperature, pulse, and respiration.

And to learn the management of convalescents.

## ORDERLIES AND OTHER MALE EMPLOYEES WHOSE DUTIES ARE NOT OTHERWISE ENUMERATED HEREIN.

- 213. They shall carry out any instructions they may from time to time receive from the Medical Officer, Matron, Secretary, or nurse in charge.
- 214. They will be expected to immediately report any person they may observe loitering in the hospital grounds after the hours fixed for visitors.
- 215. The Orderly shall keep the operating room and adjacent rooms in a state of perfect cleanliness and order.
- 216. The Orderly shall have in readiness for immediate use articles of bedding, dressings, and such appliances as are required in the operating room by the Medical Officer.

# WARDSMAIDS, HOUSEMAIDS, COOKS, LAUNDRESSES, AND OTHER FEMALE EMPLOYEES WHOSE DUTIES ARE NOT OTHERWISE ENUMERATED HEREIN.

- 217. They shall be directly under the charge of the Matron, and shall carry out such orders as they may from time to time receive.
- 218. The wardsmaids are expected to carry out any orders they may receive from the nurse in charge of a ward.

#### CLERGYMEN AND RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTORS.

- 219. Every elergyman or religious instructor who visits at the hospital shall confine his visits to the sick patients who belong to his religious denomination, unless his services are specially requested by any patient of another denomination, and shall, except in cases of emergency, make such visits between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m.
- 220. Every such clergyman or religious instructor shall perform the duties of his office at the bedside of the patients in such way as to be as little overheard as possible by the surrounding patients.

- 221. No person shall read aloud, or conduct religious service in the sick wards of the hospital.
- 222. The board room, if any, of the hospital, shall so far as practicable, be available for public worship for the convalescent patients.
- 223. Clergymen and other visitors must retire from the bedside if requested to do so by a Medical Officer or Nurse.
