By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Com-mander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare "That any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof": AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable that "Kangaroos" shall be strictly preserved within the South-West Division of the Colony, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto attached: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare "Kangaroos" within the limits described as aforesaid to be strictly preserved, and their destruction in any way is wholly forbidden except for purposes of human food.

### SCHEDULE.

Bounded on the West and South by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the North by the Murchison River, from its mouth at Gantheaume Bay upwards to Bompas Hill, at the Great Northern bend of the said river; on the East by a South-Easterly line from Bompas Hill through Tallering Peak, the highest peak in

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated 11th September, 1895, the close season for all species of Wild Duck (including Musk Duck or Steamer) and Teal was declared to be from 1st July to the 31st December, both days inclusive: And WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to alter the date of termination of the said close season for all species of Wild Duck (including Musk Duck or Steamer) and Teal to the 25th of December: Now Therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that from and after this date the close season for the said birds shall be from 1st July to the 25th December, both days inclusive, within the limits as described in the Proclamation of 7th June, 1892, published in the Government Gazette of the 9th June, 1892.

### The Land Act, 1898.

E.C. 3512 Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 25th day of October, 1899.

#### Present:

His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables-The Commissioner of Railways. The Minister of Mines. The Attorney General. The Colonial Secretary.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes; And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve  $\stackrel{\bigwedge}{676}$ Commonage) (Northampton should be placed under the control of the Chairman and Members of the Northampton Roads Board, as a Board of Management, the Honourable the Minister for Lands retaining the right to grant Conditional Purchases within the Commonage without reference to the Board: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Chairman and Members of the Northampton Roads Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or after by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

The former Board is hereby superseded.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At Government House, Brisbane, this fourth day of October, 1899.

Present:

His Excellency the Adminstrator of the Government in Council.

Whereas it is enacted by "The British Probates Act, 1898," that when the Governor in Council is satisfied that the Legislature of any part of Her Majesty's Dominions has made adequate provision for the recognition in that part of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court of Queensland, he may direct, by Order in Council, that the said Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in such Order, apply to that part of Her Majesty's Dominions, and thereupon while such Order is in force the said Act shall apply accordingly: And whereas His Excellency the Adminstrator of the Government in Council is satisfied that adequate provision has been made by the Legislature of that part of Her Majesty's Dominions known as Western Australia for the recognition therein of probates and letters of adminstration granted by the Supreme Court of Queensland; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Adminstrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the authority vested in him by the said Act, doth hereby order that the said Act shall apply to that part of Her Majesty's Dominions which is known as Western Australia.

And the Honourable the Chief Secretary is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

62 Vict. No. 10, "The British Probates Act, 1898,"

An Act to provide for the recognition of Probates and Letters of Administration granted in other parts of Her Majesty's Dominions.

[Assented to 9th December, 1898.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Short Title.

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The British Probates Act, 1898."
- 2. In this Act-

#### Definitions.

- The expression "Court of Probate" means any Court or authority, by whatever name designated, having jurisdiction in matters of probate;
- The expression "the Supreme Court" means the Supreme Court of Queensland or a Judge thereof.
- The expressions "Probate" and "Letters of Administration" include confirmation in Scotland, and any instrument having in any part of Her Majesty's Dominions the same effect which under the law of Queensland is given to probate and letters of administration respectively;
- The expression "Probate Duty" includes any duty payable on the value of the estate and effects for which probate or letters of administration is or are granted;
- The expression "British Court in a Foreign Country" means any British Court having jurisdiction out of Her Majesty's Dominions in pursuance of an Order in Council, whether made under any Act or otherwise.

Application of Act by Order in Council.

3. When the Governor in Council is satisfied that the Legislature of any part of Her Majesty's Dominions have made adequate provision for the recognition in that part of probates and letters of administration granted by the Supreme Court, he may direct by Order in Council that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Order, apply to that part of Her Majesty's Dominions, and thereupon while the Order is in force this Act shall apply accordingly.

Sealing in Queensland of British probates and letters of administration,

- 4. (1.) When a Court of Probate in a part of Her Majesty's Dominions to which this Actapplies has granted probate or letters of administration in respect of the estate of a deceased person, the probate or letters so granted may, on being produced to, and a copy thereof deposited with, the Supreme Court, be scaled with the scal of that Court, and thereupon shall be of the like force and effect and have the same operation in Queensland as if granted by that Court.
- (2.) Provided that no probate or letters of administration shall be sealed under this section until there has been filed in the Supreme Court a certificate under the hand of the commissioners of stamps to the effect that adequate security has been given for payment of all probate and succession duty in respect of so much (if any) of the estate as is liable to duty in Queensland.
- (3.) The Supreme Court may, if it thinks fit, upon the application of any creditor, require, before scaling, that adequate security be given for the payment of debts due from the estate to creditors residing in Queensland, and also, if it thinks fit, upon the application of any beneficiary or next of kin, require that adequate security be given for the protection of the interests of such beneficiary or next of kin.
- (4.) For the purposes of this section a duplicate of any probate or letters of administration scaled with the scal of the Court granting the same, or a copy thereof certified as correct by or under the authority of the Court granting the same, shall have the same effect as the original.
- (5.) Rules of Court may be made for regulating the procedure and practice, including fees and costs in the Supreme Court, on and incidental to an application for scaling a probate or letters of administration granted in a part of Her Majesty's Dominions to which this Act applies. Such rules shall, so far as they relate to probate and succession duty, be made with the consent of the Governor in Council; and, subject to any exceptions and modifications made by such rules, the enactments for the time being in force in relation to probate and succession duty (including the penal provisions thereof) shall apply as if the person who applies for scaling under this section were a person applying for probate or letters of administration,

Application of Act to British Courts in foreign countries.

5. This Act shall extend to authorise the sealing in Queensland of any probate or letters of administration granted by a British Court in a foreign country, in like manner as it authorises the sealing of a probate or letters of administration granted in a part of Her Majesty's Dominions to which this Act applies, and the provisions of this Act shall apply accordingly with the necessary modifications.

#### Orders in Council.

- (1.) Every Order in Council made under this Act shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as may be after it is made, and shall be published in the Gazette.
- (2.) The Governor in Council may revoke or alter any Order in Council previously made under this act,

Application of Act to probates, &c., already granted,
7. This Act, when applied by an Order in Council to a part of Her Majesty's Dominions, shall, subject to the provisions of the Order, apply to probates and letters of administration granted in that part either before or after the passing of this Act.

### Local Board of Health By-Laws.

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Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 2nd November, 1899.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Local Board of Health at Coolgardie.

By-Laws of the Local Board of Health of the District of Coolgardie.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

The Municipal Council of Coolgardie, being the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, and by virtue of "The Health Act, 1898," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes and publishes the following By-laws, viz. :-

### BY-LAW No. 17.

### REGULATING DAIRIES, ETC.

- 1. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the district shall annually, in the month of January in each year, register his name and address with the Secretary of the Board.
- 2. Every such person shall pay to the Board for each registration a fee of £1 per annum.
- 3. All dairy farms, milk stores, grazing grounds of dairy cattle, and cattle in dairies shall be inspected regularly from time to time, at least once every month, at any reasonable hour in the day time; or in the case of a cause of inquiry or complaint arising in respect thereof, then such inspection may be made at any time when such business is in progress or is usually carried on. Such inspection shall be made by an Inspector of the Board, or may be made by an Inspector of the Central Board, or a person or persons appointed by the Central Board to carry out the provisions of these By-laws, or by any member of the police force.
- 4. If, upon such inspection, it shall a pear to the person making the inspection that the use of any grazing ground for dairy cattle is likely to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, then such person shall forthwith report, in writing, accordingly to the Board or Central Board as the case may require, who may thereupon prohibit the use of any such grazing ground.
- 5. If, upon inspection as aforesaid, any cow or other animal shall be found to be diseased, the person making such inspection shall cause such cow or other animal to be isolated and removed from all possible contact with all other dairy cattle, and shall forthwith report to the Board and to the Central Board the nature of the disease, descripand to the central Board the nature of the disease, description of the animal affected, and the measures taken for the isolation and treatment of such animal. No dairyman or cowkeeper shall neglect or refuse to remove or isolate such diseased cow or other animal, or permit or suffer the same to come in contact with other dairy cattle, after being ordered by the person aforesaid making such inspection to remove or isolate such cow or other animal.

- 6. Whenever it shall be so reported to the Board or to the Central Board that any cow or other animal is diseased, then such Board or the Central Board, after due inquiry, may order such cow or other animal to be destroyed, or to be removed from any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard, and such diseased cow or other animal shall be destroyed or removed, in accordance with such order.
- For the purposes of Sub-sections 5 and 6, or for the purpose of protecting milk against infection or contamination, the Board may, and, if required by the Central Board, shall cause the tuberculin test to be applied to any cow or other animal, when reasonably suspected to be suffering from tuberculosis. For the purposes aforesaid, the Central Board may issue instructions to be observed in applying the transfer of the transfer of the contract of the contrac the tuberculin test.
- 8. All houses, dairies, and cow sheds in the occupation of persons following the trade of cowkeepers or dairymen:
  - a. Shall have proper provision for lighting.
  - b. Shall have good and sufficient ventilation.
  - c. Shall be cleansed daily.
  - d. Shall be drained thoroughly and effectually and in such manner as may be ordered by the Board.
  - e. Shall have a sufficient supply of pure water.
- 9. Every milk store and milk shop shall be thoroughly cleansed daily, and every milk yard and dairy shall be kept at all times in a cleanly state.
- 10. For the purposes of protecting milk against infection or contamination, the following precautions shall be observed
  - a. The walls, floors, counters, tables, and shelves of all milk stores, milk shops, and dairies shall be kept at all times in a thoroughly cleanly con-
  - b. All barrels, butts, cans, and other vessels used for containing milk or cream, and also all bungs, bung cloths, lids, and other parts thereof shall be thoroughly cleansed and scalded with boiling water or steam immediately after use, and afterwards dripped.
  - c. No boiler, tank, steam chest, or other vessel used for scalding such vessels shall be employed for washing or boiling bed or body clothing, or for any other purpose which might cause contamina-tion or infection of milk.
  - d. No milk or cream, or vessel used for containing milk or cream, shall be stored or kept in any dwelling or sleeping apartment; and no such dwelling or sleeping apartment, and no such dwelling or sleeping apartment shall have direct communication with any milk store; nor shall any articles of clothing be washed, hung up to dry, or kept in any room or place used for storing or keeping milk.
  - e. No earth closet, privy, or urinal, and no manure, dung, urine, stagmant water, filth, or other refuse shall be in contact with or within thirty feet of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop.
  - f. No swine or other animals shall be kept or allowed to remain within one hundred feet of any room or place used for keeping or storing milk.
  - g. No milk from any diseased cow shall be mixed with other milk, or sold for human consumption; and such milk shall not be used as food for swine or other animals until it has been well boiled.
  - h. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having been recently in contact, with or in attendance upon any other person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk or cream, or take part in any way in the storage or distribution of milk or cream.
  - i. When ordered by the Board or the Central Board, any sick person shall be immediately removed from the premises of any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard, by the owner or occupier in accordance with such order,

j. Whenever any infectious or contagious disease occurs in any house or building in the occupation of any person or persons following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, or on any premises used for the purpose of a milk shop or milk store, the occupier thereof shall forthwith report such occurrence to the Board and Central Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 18.

DEFINING THE AREA WITHIN WHICH SWINE MAY NOT BE KEPT.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to keep or breed any kind of pigs or swine within the Municipality of Coolgardie.
- 2. No person shall keep pigs or swine in any place whatever within the district under the control of the Board outside the Municipality of Coolgardie unless and until such premises have been licensed by the Board. The cost of such license shall be £2, payable annually, in advance, in the month of January in each year.
- 3. All sties or piggeries shall be open to the inspection of the Inspector, and shall be constantly kept thoroughly clean.
- 4. No swine shall be permitted at any time to be at large.
- 5. Nothing in this By-law shall apply to any pigs or swine brought into the Municipality for sale, and removed therefrom within twenty-four hours.

#### BY-LAW No. 19.

#### REGULATING THE CARRIAGE OF MEAT.

- 1. No person shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane within the district, in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcase for food, unless such meat shall be brought or carried in a properly covered cart or other vehicle, and protected from the sun and dust.
- 2. Every cart or other vehicle for the carrying of, and every construction or covering for protecting meat therein shall be kept in a clean and wholesome state and condition.

### BY-LAW No. 20.

FOR REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF RUBBISH.

- 1. No person shall deposit any manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse matter at any place within the district of the Board other than the depot for such matter appointed and notified by the Board for such deposit.
- 2. All carts or other conveyances used for the carriage of manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse shall be so constructed as to cause no nuisance during the transport, reception, utilisation, or deposit of such manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse matter as aforesaid; and every person carrying any manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse in any cart or conveyance not constructed as aforesaid shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

### BY-LAW No. 21.

### REGULATING BAKERIES.

- 1. Every person carrying on the business of a baker within the district shall keep his bakehouse or bakery at all times open to the inspection of the Inspector, and shall keep the same, with all troughs, tanks, and other appliances used in connection therewith, thoroughly clean and wholesome.
- 2. No such person shall sleep or permit or suffer any other person to sleep in his bakehouse or bakery, or use the same for any other purpose than his said trade.

### BY-LAW No. 22.

FOR REGULATING COMMON LODGING HOUSES WITHIN THE AREA UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH OF COOLGARDIE.

1. Every person keeping or about to keep a common lodging house within the district shall give, at the office of the said Board, at least four days' notice, in writing, of his intention to apply for the annual registration of such house, specifying its situation and the number of lodgers accommodated or intended to be accommodated; and shall then

- and there deposit the sum of ten shillings as a registration fee. Such notice shall be in the Form "A" in the schedule hereto, and shall be accompanied by a certificate of character, in accordance with the fourth schedule of the Act, and such certificate shall be signed by six inhabitant householders of the Municipality; and the Board may refuse to register any lodging house the occupier of which fails to produce such certificate. A keeper of a common lodging house shall not at any one time receive or cause or suffer to be received into such house, or into any room therein, a greater number of lodgers than shall be fixed by the Board as the maximum number of lodgers authorised to be received into such house or room, and shall be specified in a notice, in writing, according to the Form "B" in the schedule hereto, which shall be served upon such keeper, and shall continue in force until, in pursuance of the By-law in that behalf, the number so fixed and specified shall be varied by the Board. A keeper of a common lodging-house (in any case where the Board may from time to time determine that it is expedient to vary the number fixed by them as the maximum number of lodgers authorised to be received into such house or any room therein, and may from time to time, for the purpose of such variation, cause to be duly served upon such keeper a notice in writing, according to Form C in the schedule) shall not, at any time after any such notice shall have been served upon him, and after the date specified in such notice, and until in pursuance of the provisions of this By-law the number specified in such notice shall be further varied, receive or cause or suffer to be received into such house, or into any room therein, a greater number of lodgers than shall be specified in such notice as the maximum number of lodgers authorised to be received into such house or into such room.
- 2. The keeper of any common lodging-house shall cause to be cleansed all the rooms, passages, stairs, floors, and offices of every kind daily; and shall cleanse all windows, doors, walls, ceilings, privies, and drains as often as may be necessary, and shall limewash the walls and ceilings thereof, or so much of them as shall be necessary, in the first week of each of the months of April and October in every year. A keeper of a common lodging-house shall not, except in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause or suffer any person of the male sex above the age of ten years to use or occupy any room which may be used or occupied as a sleeping apartment by persons of the female sex. Such keeper shall not, except in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause or suffer any person of the female sex to use or occupy any room which may be used or occupied as a sleeping apartment by persons of the male sex above the age of ten years: Provided that this By-law shall not be taken to prohibit the use and occupation by a husband and wife of any room which may not be used or occupied by any other person of either sex above the age of ten years. The keeper of a common lodging-house shall cause every room in his house to be properly ventilated each day. He shall cause the bed clothes of every bed in such house to be removed from such bed as soon as conveniently may be after such bed shall have been vacated by any lodger, and shall cause all such bed clothes, and the bed from which such bed clothes have been removed, to be freely exposed to the air for one hour at least every day.
- 3. The keeper of every lodging-house shall cause the yard, area, or other open space of the premises to be kept thoroughly clean and in good order, and free from all slop water and rubbish, and the privy or privies to be kept clean and in sanitary condition, and constantly supplied with a suitable disinfectant. The privies shall be sufficient in number (no fewer than one for every eight lodgers permitted, in addition to one to be provided for the lodging-house keeper and his family) and shall provide separate privies for the different sexes, and shall cause the pans to be emptied as often as may be necessary, and shall cause all sanitary appliances, and the seats, floors, and walls of every privy belonging to such house to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for keeping such sanitary appliances, seat, floor, and walls in a clean and sanitary condition.

### BY-LAW No. 23.

#### REGULATING PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

1. No person shall keep or open a private hospital unless the building in which it is proposed to be carried on has been previously approved by the Board. Every person keeping or intending to keep or open any private hospital within the District shall register the same at the office of the Board; and each applicant shall make his application in writing, and therein state the number of patients to be admitted, and the number of nurses or assistants to be

employed, and the class or classes of diseases or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital, and shall annually, in the month of January in each year, register the same.

- Every such person shall permit the Inspector, at all reasonable times, to have access to his hospital for the purpose of inspection as to drainage, good management, and sanitary regulations.
- 3. Every such person shall keep a register of all cases admitted into and treated in his hospital, and such register shall be produced for inspection at the request of any officer, inspector, or servant of the Board or Central Board.
- 4. Every such person shall provide for the isolation in or removal from his hospital of any patient suffering from scarlet fever, diphtheria, variola, varicella, puerperal fever, erysipelas, measles, or any other infectious or contagious
- 5. In every hospital as aforesaid there shall be one nurse, whose qualifications shall be approved of by the Board, and one assistant to every ten patients.

#### BY-LAW No. 24.

FOR PREVENTING OFFENSIVE MATTER RUNNING OUT OF PREMISES.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughter-house, butcher's shop, fishmonger's shop, or laundry to allow any waste matter, as the result of any business or trade, to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, and thoroughfare, or land within the said district.
- 2. All such waste matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

#### BY-LAW No. 25.

HOURS FOR THE REMOVAL OF RUBBISH, ETC.

No refuse, rubbish from any private house, business premises, hotel, shop, tenement, public or private place, shall be removed by any licensed scavenger or any of his employees, or any private person or persons or company, at any other time or times than between the hours of seven o'clock at night and nine in the morning.

PENALTIES FOR BREACHES OF BY-LAWS.

Any person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £10: Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment of a penalty of any less sum than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this By-law, but in no case to be less than five shillings.

The first half of October was unusually wet in Perth and all South-West districts, but after the 14th the weather clear during the remainder of the month only a few occasional showers fell. The mean pressure at Perth was unusually low—in fact, it h lower on only two previous occasions, one of these being October, 1898. The mean maximum day temperature was about the same previous years, but the nights were remarkably mild; the mean minimum at the Botanic Gardens being the highest during the last years. There was an average difference of nearly seven degrees in the night temperatures of Perth Gardens and York.

The climate map shows that the summer is making itself felt in the Kimberley district, where the mean maximum day temp was the highest. Temperatures of over 100 degrees in the shade have been experienced several times in the tropics, the highest bein degrees at Onslow; but the century has not yet been reached farther South than Onslow. Between 90 degrees and 100 degrees h recorded down as far as Geraldton, and thence through the Murchison and Coolgardie Goldfields, and also at Eyre on one day.

The rainfall was very light in the Kimberley district, and none at all fell throughout the North-West country; but, from Sha Southwards, it was everywhere in excess of the average for previous years. The South-West districts received most of their rain first half of the month, and the Goldfields received theirs as an accompaniment to a succession of very heavy thunderstorms during week of the month.

The total rainfall at Perth, from 1st January to 31st October, has been 3,126 points, or 16 points below the average for the p 23 years.

# WIDTH OF TIRES ACT, 1895.

By-law for Regulating Width of Tires of  $V_{\rm EHICLES}$ .

HEREAS by "The Width of Tires Act, 1895," it is enacted that every local authority may make and prescribe, amend, repeal, or add to such by-laws as it thinks fit for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers therein contained, be it ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Northam as follows:—

1. It shall not be lawful for any person engaged in building, constructing, selling, or making vehicles to build, construct, or make, sell or hire, or offer for sale or hire, any vehicle unless the width of the tires of such vehicle shall be in the following proportion to the diameter of the axlearm of such vehicle, viz.:—

- 2. No person shall import into the Municipality of Northam any vehicle the tires of the wheels of which vehicle are not of the width presented or specified by the preceding section of this by-law, and if any such vehicle be imported no person shall use or employ it upon any public road or street within the Municipality.
- 3. No person shall use or employ any vehicle upon any public road or street of the Municipality unless the tires of the wheels of such vehicle are of the proportion specified in Section No. 1 of this by-law.
- 4. Every vehicle in use on any public road or street in the Municipality shall have the diameter of the axle-arms painted on some conspictuous part on the off-side thereof; and any owner of any vehicle who neglects to have such measurements painted as aforesaid, or who has the same so painted incorrectly, shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.
- 5. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 6. Vehicle means and includes any wagon, cart, or lorry or dray, but does not include any vehicle intended solely for the conveyance of passengers.

- 1.
