Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle.

BY-LAWS.

For regulating and licensing Public Vehicles and Owners and Drivers thereof.

Whereas by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict, No. 10), it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes enumerated in Section 99 of the said Act: And whereas, pursuant to the powers contained in the Municipal Institutions Act aforesaid, the Council of the Town of Fremantle did enact certain By-laws (Nos. 5 and 24) for the regulation of licensed public vehicles and drivers, and it is expedient to repeal the same, and make other provisions in lieu thereof: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Council of the Town of Fremantle, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers in that behalf, that the said By-laws (numbered 5 and 24) henceforth shall be and are hereby repealed; and the following By-laws shall be the By-laws of the said Town of Fremantle in lieu thereof, in respect of the matters hereinafter mentioned:—

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws, except where the context shall require a different construction, the following terms in inverted commas shall have the respective meanings hereunto affixed to them, that is to say:—
 - "Omnibus" shall mean any vehicle used for the conveyance of passengers at separate fares or plying for hire to and from fixed places within or without the Town of Fremantle.
 - "Cab" shall mean and include as well a hansom cab or other passenger vehicle other than an omnibus.
 - "Hackney Carriage" shall mean a brougham or other like carriage having four wheels and a door on either side.
 - "Passenger Vehicle" shall mean any description of vehicle used for the conveyance of passengers for hire.
 - "Cart" shall mean and include any van, dray, wagon, trolly, or other vehicle used for the removal, cartage, or conveyance of goods, merchandise, furniture, produce, or other wares for hire.
 - "Licensing Officer" shall mean and include any person appointed by the Council to issue licenses for passenger or other vehicles used for the purpose of plying for hire, or to owners, drivers, or conductors of such vehicles, or any Inspector or Assistant Inspector of Traffic, or any person appointed by the Council to examine vehicles.
 - "Owner" shall mean any person possessed of a beneficial interest in any passenger or other vehicle used for plying for hire, or a person employed in the capacity of manager for the owner.
 - "Driver" shall mean and include a person to whom a license or permit has been granted to drive a passenger or other vehicle used for the purpose of plying for hire.
 - "Conductor" shall mean and include every director or other person (except the driver) who shall attend upon the passengers in any passenger vehicle.
- 2. And whenever in these By-laws, with reference to any person, animal, matter or thing, any word or words is or are used importing the singular number or the masculine gender only, such word or words shall be understood to include several persons or animals, females as well as males,

bodies corporate or politic as well as individuals, and several matters or things as well as one matter or thing, unless it be otherwise specially provided, or there is something in the subject or context repugnant thereto.

- 3. The licensing officer shall not license any vehicle to ply for hire unless he shall be satisfied that it is fit for the purpose for which it is sought to be licensed.
- 4. The licensing officer shall issue licenses to such owners, drivers, and conductors of vehicles as, in his discretion, are fit to be entrusted therewith.
- 5. The licensing officer may refuse to license any person he shall think disqualified; and he shall refuse to issue a license to any person against whom several complaints may have been made to him as licensing officer, or to the Council, or informations laid before a Justice of the Peace, or to any person who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour.
- 6. No vehicle shall receive a license for the conveyance of passengers that does not measure, in the inside, from the floor to the roof thereof, four feet nine inches, one foot ten inches between the seats, and the seats to be one foot two inches broad: Provided that nothing in this section shall apply to vehicles heretofore licensed to ply for hire in the town of Fremantle.
- 7. Every driver's or conductor's license issued under the authority hereof shall be in the form of Schedule C to these By-laws, and shall be in force from the date of issue until the end of the quarter in which they are issued, unless sooner revoked, cancelled, or suspended; quarters shall be deemed to commence on the first days of January, April, July, and October in each year, and end on the last days of March, June, September, and December in each year; and for every such license a fee of two shillings and sixpence shall be paid by the applicant on the issue of such license: Provided always that the Council may, as it deems expedient, authorise the granting of a license for a whole year to any person as driver or conductor; and in such case the year shall end on the last day of December next after the issue of such annual license, and for such license a fee of Ten shillings shall be paid to the Licensing Officer.
- 8. The license of any owner, driver, or conductor may, for any misconduct, be revoked, cancelled, or suspended by the Licensing Officer as he shall deem right, after notice given to such owner, driver, or conductor to show cause why the same should not be revoked, cancelled, or suspended, and opportunity thereupon given to him to show such cause.
- 9. In the event of any license being refused, cancelled, or suspended, the person affected may appeal to the Mayor and Council in writing against the decision of the licensing officer, who shall inquire into the matter of such appeal, and, at their discretion, confirm the decision of the licensing officer, or direct the issue or continuance of a license; and their decision shall be final.
- 10. No omnibus the top of roof of which shall be more than eight feet six inches from the ground, or the bearing of which on the ground shall be less than four feet six inches from the centre of the track of the left or near wheel to the centre of the track of the right or off wheel, shall be allowed to carry, in any case, more than the number of passengers herein respectively mentioned; that is to say—

And not more than two additional passengers outside for every two passengers which such omnibus is licensed to carry inside; and if any greater number of outside passengers shall be carried than hereinbefore mentioned, the driver or conductor, or both, shall be liable.

- 11. All owners of vehicles licensed for the conveyance of passengers or goods for hire, or the drivers, or other persons attending any such vehicles, shall bring such vehicle for inspection when and where the same shall be ordered by the licensing officer, and every owner or driver shall comply with the orders or directions of the licensing officer as to repairs, alterations, or matters relative to these By-laws, or any Act of Parliament relating to vehicles licensed to ply for hire.
- 12. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall provide such vehicle with three good, sound, serviceable lamps, with plain, clear, bright glass fronts and sides, such lamps to be at all times in good order, and to be carried one on each side of the outside of the vehicle, and one on the front

panel inside the vehicle; each lamp to be kept lighted and exhibit a bright light between sunset and sunrise; and shall at all times keep painted, in black, on the side glass of such lamps, the number of the vehicle in which they are used, in legible figures of not less than one and a-half inches in length and of proportionate breadth and thickness, and satisfactory to the licensing officer.

- 13. No vehicle shall be allowed to ply for hire for the conveyance of passengers, goods, wares, or merchandise until the same has been duly licensed by the licensing officer.
- 14. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall provide for such vehicle a good and serviceable waterproof apron for outside passengers, such apron to be to the satisfaction of the licensing officer.
- 15. The owner of every vehicle plying for the conveyance of goods, wares, furniture, or merchandise, for hire, shall provide such vehicle with waterproof coverings and ropes sufficient to cover and secure against the weather any quantity of goods, wares, furniture, or merchandise which such vehicle may reasonably be expected to carry.
- 16. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall keep the same at all times, while plying for hire or under engagement, in good order and condition, clean and tidy, with the whole of its furniture, fittings, and upholstering in good order and repair, the horse or horses drawing the same, and the harness complete and in a good serviceable condition, the whole satisfactory to the licensing officer.
- 17. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall provide such furniture for every such vehicle as the licensing officer may direct, and shall keep the same so furnished during the whole time such vehicle shall be plying for hire or under engagement.
- 18. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall keep painted in some conspicuous place inside such vehicle, and to the satisfaction of the licensing officer, the number of the license of such vehicle, and the number of persons such vehicle is licensed to carry inside, in figures and letters of not less than two inches in length, and of proportionate breadth and thickness; such letters and figures to be of a colour opposite to and different from the ground on which they are painted, and shall be kept legible and distinct all the time such vehicle shall be plying for hire or under engagement.
- 19. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall keep painted on the off side of such vehicle, and satisfactory to the licensing officer, the name of the owner, the number of the license, and the total number of passengers such vehicle is licensed to carry, in letters and figures of not less than two inches in length, and of proportionate breadth and thickness; such letters and figures to be of a colour opposite to and different from the ground on which they are painted, and shall be kept legible and distinct all the time such vehicle shall be plying for hire or under engagement.
- 20. The owner of every passenger vehicle shall provide and keep harnessed to such vehicle, the whole of the time it is plying for hire or under engagement, the number of horses in proportion to the number of passengers it is licensed to carry, according to the following scale, that is to say:—
 - If licensed to carry 6 passengers—one horse.
 - If licensed to carry 15 passengers—two horses.
 - If licensed to carry 27 passengers—three horses.
 - If licensed to carry 39 passengers—four horses.
- 21. The owner of every cab licensed for the cenveyance of passengers for hire shall keep fixed on the front panel inside such cab, or in some conspicuous place satisfactory to the licensing officer, a card provided by the Council showing the table of fares for time or distance as approved of by the Fremantle Town Council, such table of fares to be at all times kept legible and distinct while such cab is plying for hire or under engagement.
- 22. The owner of every omnibus or vehicle plying as an omnibus to and from fixed places, or along any specified route, shall keep fixed on the front panel inside such vehicle, or in some conspicuous place satisfactory to the licensing officer, a card as provided by the Council showing the table of fares to be charged each passenger carried thereby; and shall also have painted on the front panel inside such vehicle, or in some conspicuous place, to the satisfaction of the licensing officer, the name of the place or places to and from which such vehicle is plying for hire; and such table of fares and the name of place or places shall be kept legible, distinct, and conspicuous the whole time such vehicle shall ply for hire or be under engagement.

- 23. The owner of every omnibus or other vehicle plying as an omnibus to and from fixed places, whether within or without the Town of Fremantle, shall have painted in letters at least three inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and in a colour different from and opposite to the colour of the ground on which such letters shall be painted, upon some conspicuous part of the outside of such vehicle, to the satisfaction of the licensing officer, and so that the same shall be at all times plainly and distinctly visible while such vehicle is plying for hire or under engagement, the name or names of the extreme place or places to and from which such vehicle is plying for hire, also the route it travels.
- 24. The owner or driver of an omnibus or vehicle plying for hire as an omnibus, or along any specified route, or to and from fixed places, shall not proceed elsewhere to ply for hire, or pick up or put down passengers except along such specified route.
- 25. The owner of every cab shall provide and fix to the near side of the front panel of such cab, in a place satisfactory to the licensing officer, and so as to be easy of access to passengers riding on the box seat, a leather satchel; and shall keep inside such satchel a clean ticket showing thereon the table of fares payable for the hire of such cab in accordance with the fares fixed by the Council.
- 26. The owner of every omnibus shall, if the licensing officer thinks necessary, provide a conductor for such omnibus, and shall also provide a standing place outside such omnibus for the conductor.
- 27. The owner of every omnibus shall provide such omnibus with proper means of ventilation without having to open the side windows.
- 28. No owner shall lend his license for his vehicle to any person; and any owner parting with his licensed vehicle shall see that the name of the person who shall become the owner is registered in the books of the licensing officer and on the license granted for such vehicle; and any owner who shall part with his vehicle without such registry shall still be deemed the owner thereof, and subject as such to all the provisions of these By-laws as fully as if no change of ownership had taken place; and the purchaser of such vehicle who shall allow the same to be used or ply for hire without such registry shall be subject to the same penalty as is imposed by these By-laws on a person plying without a license; and the person in whose name a license shall appear to have been issued shall be deemed the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the same shall have been taken out, until the transfer shall have been duly made.
- 29. The owner of a passenger or other vehicle plying for hire shall not allow, permit, or suffer any person but a licensed driver to ply for hire with such passenger or other vehicle, or to drive the same while under engagement; nor shall any owner or driver of such passenger or other vehicle allow, permit, or suffer any other person but a licensed driver or conductor to ply, tout, or solicit hire for sucu vehicle.
- 30. No driver or conductor shall leave his passenger or other vehicle while plying for hire or under engagement, or on any stand, and shall keep within such a distance as to have full control of the horse or horses drawing the same, and shall not loiter on the footways near such vehicle.
- 31. No driver or conductor of any passenger or other vehicle shall sleep in or on such vehicle while the same is on any stand, plying for hire, or under engagement, and shall not allow any person except the hirer to ride on such vehicle, or lounge or hang about the same.
- 32. No owner, driver, or conductor of a passenger vehicle shall allow, permit, or suffer any person but the conductor of such vehicle to ride on the steps or other place of such vehicle, except on a proper seat legally provided for passengers.
- 33. No person under the age of nineteen years shall be granted a driver's license, and no person under the age of fifteen years shall be granted a conductor's license.
- 34. No owner, driver, or conductor of a passenger vehicle shall allow, permit, or suffer any advertise nent, printed bill, or any name, letters, numbers, or cards (except those mentioned in these By-laws or in the Cart and Carriage Licensing Act of 1876) to appear upon the inside or outside of any such vehicle without first having obtained the sanction of the licensing officer.
- 35. No owner, driver, or conductor of any passenger or other vehicle plying for hire shall wilfully deceive any person in respect to the route or destination of such vehicle; or deceive any passenger or intending passenger, hirer or

intending hirer as to the distance or route to any particular place where such passenger or intending passenger, hirer or intending hirer may be desirous of going to, if within the limits of the town of Fremantle, or any distance not exceeding seven miles outside the corporate limits of the said town.

- 36. Every driver of a cab or other vehicle plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise standing or plying for hire at any public stand, street, road, or place within the town of Fremantle shall, unless previously engaged (the proof and bona fides of such engagement shall be on such driver), be bound to take immediately any fare not exceeding the number of passengers such cab is licensed to carry, or goods, wares, or merchandise such other vehicle may reasonably be expected to carry; and the driver of such cab shall not refuse to carry thereby a reasonable quantity of luggage for any person hiring or desiring to hire such cab, and riding in or on the same, nor shall refuse to drive such cab or other vehicle to any place within the limits of the Town of Fremantle, or any distance not exceeding seven miles outside the corporate limits thereof, nor for any time not exceeding six hours, if so required, nor shall fail to drive at a fair and reasonable speed, not less than six miles an hour for a cab or four miles an hour for such other vehicle, where the traffic will permit, or unless required by the hirer to drive at a slower pace.
- 37. The fares and rates to be charged by the owners, drivers, or conductors of passenger or other vehicles plying for hire within the Town of Fremantle, or within seven miles of the corporate limits thereof, shall be as set forth in the Schedule marked A to these By-laws, and shall be deemed to be the fares and rates which may be lawfully demanded, received, or taken by the owners, drivers, or conductors of passenger or other vehicles as aforesaid: Provided that such rates and fares shall include all luggage carried not exceeding twenty-eight pounds weight for each passenger carried; all luggage carried for a passenger in excess of twenty-eight pounds weight shall be paid for at the rate set forth in the Schedule marked A to these By-laws.
- 38. No owner shall alter any licensed passenger vehicle by which it may be made to carry more or less passengers than that which it has been licensed to carry, and shall keep such vehicle in a like condition to that which it was in when licensed.
- 39. If by any unavoidable accident any passenger vehicle shall become unfit for use, and also during such reasonable time as any such passenger vehicle may be undergoing repair, the owner of such passenger vehicle may, subject to the approval of the licensing officer, use another vehicle, but the same shall in all respects (except as to license) be subject to these By-laws in the same manner as if a license had been granted for the same; and the person using such vehicle, or the driver thereof, shall be liable in the same manner for any non-compliance of these By-laws in respect thereof. Before using such other vehicle the owner shall give notice thereof in writing to the licensing officer stating the cause of using such other vehicle, and the probable time it may be required; no such other vehicle shall be used until it has been inspected and approved of by the licensing officer, nor for a longer period than that stated in a certificate to be issued by the licensing officer; but any vehicle may be used for the purpose of finishing a journey which may have been interrupted by an accident.
- 40. The owner of every licensed passenger vehicle, or other vehicle plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, shall, at the request of the licensing officer or member of the police force, give to such officer or member of the police force the name of the driver or conductor of such passenger or other vehicle.
- 41. The owner of any passenger or other vehicle plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, and the driver or conductor of such vehicles changing his address shall forthwith notify such change of address to the licensing officer.
- 42. No driver or conductor of passenger or other vehicles plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise shall lend or part with his license.
- 43. Every licensed passenger vehicle (except those on depôt stands), and every vehicle standing on any public stands, shall be deemed to be plying for hire and subject to the provisions of these By-laws.
- 44. The driver of every passenger vehicle shall, on being requested by any officer of the Council, member of the police force, passenger or intending passenger, give to such officer, member of the police force, passenger or intending passenger, his name and number of vehicle, and shall further exhibit for perusal to any such person a card show-

- ing the table of fares, the name of the owner of such vehicle, and the number of the same; such card shall be returned to the driver unless it should be necessary to retain it for the purposes of a prosecution, and no card exhibited shall be considered genuine unless the stamp of the licensing officer shall be on it.
- 45. The owner, driver, or conductor of any passenger vehicle shall not allow, permit, or suffer a greater number of persons to ride in or upon any part of such vehicle than the number it is licensed to carry on or in any part of such vehicle.
- 46. No person shall ride in or on any part of any passenger vehicle if told by the owner, driver, or conductor that such vehicle has already its full complement of passengers in such part of such vehicle.
- 47. No child under the age of three years (if accompanied by parents or other person) shall be counted as a passenger; children over three years and under twelve years shall be charged half-fare only.
- 48. No agreement whatever made by the owner, driver, or conductor of any passenger vehicle, or other vehicle plying for hire for the payment of any more than the legal fare shall be binding or held to authorise any overcharge; and any such owner, driver, or conductor demanding or receiving (whether in pursuance of any agreement or not) any sum exceeding the proper fare, the person paying the same shall be entitled, on complaint made against such owner, driver, or conductor, before any two or more Justices of the Peace, to recover back the sum paid beyond the proper fare, and such owner, driver, or conductor shall, for such overcharge, be considered to have committed a breach of these By-laws.
- 49. Any person having hired, used, or agreed to pay the hire of a passenger vehicle, or vehicle used for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise for hire, and not paying the legal fare at the termination of the journey or engagement, or when demanded, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws and punishable accordingly, and, in addition to any fine or penalty imposed, the Justices hearing and determining such information may order such person to pay the legal fare for such hiring or using; provided the owner, driver, or conductor of the vehicle aforesaid shall have produced to such person a card showing the table of fares when demanding payment of such fare.
- 50. Any person who shall wilfully cut or tear the cushions, or break any window or otherwise damage any licensed passenger vehicle or its furniture, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws, and, in addition to any fine or penalty imposed, may be ordered by the Justices hearing the information to pay for the damage done to such vehicle or its furniture.
- 51. The distance for which any fare shall be charged for the use or hire of any cab or vehicle plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise shall be computed from the stand or place where such cab or vehicle was engaged.
- 52. The owner or driver of any passenger vehicle taking up or setting down a passenger at any place of public worship, or place of amusement, or at any public meeting within the Town of Fremantle, or who is waiting for such purpose, shall act under the direction of the corporation officers or members of the police force who may be on duty at such place or places, as to the taking up or setting down or waiting for any passengers, and as to the order or place in which any such vehicle shall stand; and such owner or driver shall perform his duty in a careful and quiet manner, and shall not push into or get out of the line or position fixed for such vehicle, so as to endeavour to arrive at his place of destination before any other vehicle the driver whereof, from its position, would have a prior right to take up or set down passengers.
- 53. Every owner or driver of a passenger vehicle, whilst engaged in taking up or setting down any passenger, shall, during such taking up or setting down, place his vehicle as near as conveniently may be to the kerb at that side of the street at which the taking up or setting down is required, and shall assist such passenger with any luggage in loading or unloading the same.
- 54. The places set forth and described in any advertisement appearing in one or more of the daily newspapers circulated in the town of Fremantle, or published in the Government Gazette, shall be the public stands for the purposes set forth in such advertisement where passenger vehicles and vehicles plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise shall stand to ply for hire, and such stands, or such other stands in such other places as the Council of the town of Fremantle may from time to time appoint, shall be and continue the public stands of the

- town of Fremantle, for the purposes set forth in such advertisement, during the pleasure of the said Council; and the said Council may from time to time abolish, cancel, or alter such stands by it appointed as may be deemed desirable, due notice of such abolition or alteration being given as required when appointing the same; and no owner or driver shall draw up or station his vehicle to ply for hire at any other place, nor ply for hire on any other stand than that set apart for the class of vehicle he is in charge of, except by permission of the licensing officer.
- 55. All owners and drivers in charge of passenger vehicles, and vehicles plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, shall take their turn on the stands in the order of their arrival, and shall also take their proper turn to go from one stand to another as opportunity occurs, and where one stand is fed from another stand; and when any vehicle shall be called or driven off a stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall draw up to the place vacated, and all other vehicles behind shall draw up in like order.
- 56. The Mayor for the time being of the town of Fremantle may appoint such and so many places as temporary stands as, from time to time, he may deem necessary, and the same rule of order shall be observed as at other stands; but such temporary stands shall be used only during the time and for such purposes as shall be set forth in an advertisement published in one or more of the newspapers circulated in the town of Fremantle.
- 57. The owner or driver in charge of any passenger or other vehicle plying for hire leaving one appointed stand for another appointed stand with his vehicle, whether within the town of Fremantle or not, must complete the journey, after starting, to the other stand in reasonable time, and without turning round or leaving the proper line of road.
- 58. No owner or driver shall, except while standing on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any part of the town of Fremantle for a longer period than may be absolutely necessary for loading or unloading, or for taking up or putting down passengers, nor shall cause any obstruction in any street or thoroughfare.
- 59. No owner or driver shall loiter with any passenger or other vehicle in any street or roadway or public place.
- 60. No owner or driver or conductor of any passenger vehicle or vehicle plying for hire shall stand with such vehicle alongside of any other vehicle, or obstruct or interfere with the driver of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, or goods, wares, or merchandise, nor wilfully or forcibly prevent, or endeavour to prevent, the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.
- 61. The owner or driver of any horse attached to any passenger or other vehicle plying for hire which shall be addicted to biting shall keep a muzzle over the mouth of such horse while plying for hire or under engagement.
- 62. No owner or driver shall feed any horse while on any stand or under engagement except with a proper nose-bag (such nose-bag to be hung on the horse's head during the time it is feeding), and shall not remove such horse's winkers or remove the bit from its mouth during such feeding.
- 63. No owner or driver of a passenger vehicle shall carry or knowingly permit or suffer to be carried in such passenger vehicle, except to some police station or watch-house, or direct to his own residence, any drunken or intoxicated person.
- 64. No owner or driver of a passenger vehicle shall carry or knowingly permit or suffer to be carried in such passenger vehicle any person so violently or noisily conducting himself, or otherwise so misbehaving as to occasion public annoyance, or annoyance to the passengers of such vehicle, or disturb the public peace.
- 65. No owner, driver, or conductor of a passenger vehicle shall smoke any tobacco or cigar while on such passenger vehicle with passengers; nor shall any passenger smoke any tobacco or cigar whilst riding in or on such vehicle unless he be the sole occupant thereof, or shall have hired such vehicle solely for his own use; and the driver of such vehicle shall, at the request of any passenger, corporation officer, or member of the police force, require any passenger to cease smoking. Any passenger who shall persist in smoking after being requested by the driver to desist shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws.
- 66. The driver of a passenger vehicle shall not pass any other passenger vehicle going in the same direction if it shall be proceeding on its journey at the rate of seven miles

- an hour; and no driver of a passenger vehicle shall immediately precede or follow another passenger vehicle, or nurse or shepherd the same.
- 67. No owner or driver shall drive any passenger vehicle or vehicle plying for hire past any place of public worship during the hours of Divine Service therein on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday at a faster pace than a walk.
- 68. No owner or driver of any passenger vehicle shall carry or permit to be carried in or on any such vehicle any coffin containing the corpse of any diseased person above the age of two years, or of any child under the age of two years who died of any infectious disease.
- 69. The owner or driver in charge of a passenger vehicle wherein any property may be left by any person having used such vehicle shall, within twelve hours after such property has been left, leave the same at the office of the licensing officer, and the licensing officer to whom such property shall be lodged shall give an acknowledgment to the person leaving the same, and keep a record of such property. If any property so delivered shall not be claimed by the rightful owner within three months, the same shall be sold either privately or by public auction, and the proceeds, after deducting any expenses (including ten per cent. to the person depositing such article as aforesaid), shall be paid to the general revenue of the Council.
- 70. Any person claiming any property left in any passenger vehicle, and which shall have been lodged with the licensing officer, shall give an acknowledgment for the receipt of the same to the licensing officer.
- 71. Every owner, driver, or conductor of passenger vehicles and vehicles used for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise for hire shall, at the time of his first obtaining a license, have delivered to him, without any charge, a printed copy of this By-law; and every such owner, driver, or conductor respectively shall at all times have such copy or some other copy of this By-law ready to produce, and shall, upon request, produce the same for perusal to any person using or hiring such vehicle, or to any inspector of the Corporation or member of the Police Force: Provided that it shall not be necessary to supply more than one copy of this By-law to any owner, driver, or conductor as aforesaid, and such owner, driver, or conductor receiving a copy of this By-law shall give a receipt for the same: Provided further that the non-receipt of a copy of this By-law shall not be deemed to excuse any person for a breach of such By-law.
- 72. No owner, driver, or conductor of any passenger or other vehicle used for the purpose of plying for hire shall obstruct or hinder any officer of the Corporation or member of the police force in carrying out the provisions of these By-laws, or use any abusive, or insulting words, or behaviour to any such officer of the Corporation or member of the police force.
- 73. The licensing officer may, at his option, grant temporary licenses to persons applying for drivers' or conductors' licenses, but such temporary licenses shall be issued for the purpose of testing the suitability of the applicant for the position of driver or conductor, and such temporary license shall not be for a longer period than ten days, and under such conditions as the licensing officer may deem expedient.
- 74. The licensing officer, in refusing to issue a license to any owner, driver, or conductor, or cancelling, revoking, or suspending any license, shall not be compelled to state publicly his reasons for so refusing to issue a license or cancelling, revoking, or suspending any license.
- 75. No person shall act as the driver or conductor of any passenger or other vehicle used for the purpose of plying for hire, until he has been approved of by the licensing officer and obtained a license for that purpose.
- 76. Every person desirous of obtaining a license as driver or conductor of any passenger or other vehicle used for the purpose of plying for hire shall make application in writing, and in the form prescribed in Schedule B to these By-laws, accompanied by the necessary certificate attached to such Schedule signed by two or more respectable householders and ratepayers of the town of Fremantle.
- 77. The owner or driver in charge of any passenger vehicle shall stop such vehicle upon demand by the licensing officer or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation or member of the police force requiring to count the number of passengers, or to ascertain the name of any person who may be offending against any of these By-laws, or to examine any horse, harness, or vehicle.

- 78. Any driver in charge of any passenger vehicle intending to stop his vehicle while proceeding along any street, roadway, or public place shall, before doing so, give notice of such intention by raising and waving either his whip or his hand in such a manner as to be observable by the driver of any vehicle following in close succession; and in turning his vehicle shall do so at a walking pace.
- 79. No owner of any passenger vehicle, or vehicle used in the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, shall hand over or entrust any such vehicle of which he is the licensee to any person, to let, use, drive, or ply for hire with the same, except in the capacity of servant to the said owner.
- 80. If, upon inspection at any time by the licensing officer, any passenger vehicle, or vehicle used for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, shall be found out of repair, dirty, or untidy, or any of the lamps or other furniture of such vehicle be dirty, broken, or untidy, or the horse or horses drawing such vehicle be insufficient or unfit to draw such vehicle, he may order the removal of such vehicle from the stand, or from being used or let for hire for the carriage of passengers, goods, wares, or merchandise, and shall give notice to the owner accordingly; and, after receipt of such notice to the owner, such vehicle shall not be used until it has been put in order, with the horse or horses drawing the same sufficient and fit, and approved of by the licensing officer.
- 81. No owner or driver of an omnibus or vehicle plying as an omnibus for the conveyance of passengers shall allow, permit, or suffer his vehicle to remain on any omnibus stand for a longer period than ten minutes, whether loaded or not, nor leave such stand at a less period than ten minutes from the time of arrival thereon, unless his vehicle shall have its full complement of passengers which it is licensed to carry, and not then at a less period than three minutes after the vehicle that has just preceded it, and on leaving such stand must proceed on its ordinary route and without loitering: Provided that nothing in this clause shall prevent an omnibus or vehicle plying as an omnibus from remaining on a depôt stand until its proper turn arrives to take up its position on a stand to ply for hire.
- 82. The Council of the town of Fremantle may, as it deems expedient, appoint places as depôt stands where passenger vehicles plying for hire as omnibuses may remain to awart their proper turn to get to a stand to ply for hire; but in no case shall owners, drivers, or conductors of such vehicles ply for hire for the same while on depôt stands; nor shall vehicles be taken off a depôt stand except to take their proper turn to ply for hire on a stand for which the depôt has been appointed; and the first vehicle on a depôt, when its proper turn comes, shall take its position on the stand set apart for that purpose.
- 83. No owner or driver of an omnibus or vehicle plying as an omnibus shall proceed with such omnibus or vehicle plying as an omnibus along any route for the purpose of plying for hire to pick up or put down passengers, except from an omnibus stand.
- 84. No owner or driver shall take any passenger vehicle or permit or suffer the same to be taken off a depôt stand for the purpose of evading the taking of its proper turn on a stand: Provided always, that nothing in these By-laws shall be deemed to exclude a vehicle having no passenger in it from leaving any stand for its stable, or for repairs: Provided, also, that any vehicle so taken off and returning to its route must take up the rear position on the stand the same as if it had from its ordinary journey.
- 85. The Council of the town of Fremantle, in advertising any stands they may deem expedient to appoint, alter, or amend, may state in such advertisement the class of vehicle, the number of vehicles, and the particular position any vehicle shall take while on such stand, and any infringement of such advertisement by any person shall be deemed a breach of these By-laws.
- 86. The Council of the town of Fremantle may, as they may deem expedient, appoint routes for omnibuses, or vehicles plying as omnibuses; such routes, as occasion may arise, to be advertised in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the town of Fremantle; and owners or drivers of omnibuses or vehicles plying as omnibuses shall ply for hire on such routes only.
- 87. The owner or driver in charge of an omnibus or vehicle plying as an omnibus, on taking up a route in the morning, or when it first commences to ply for hire during any day, shall not change to any other route with such omnibus or vehicle during the same day without the consent of the licensing officer.

- 88. No owner of a licensed passenger vehicle or vehicle used for the purpose of plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise shall allow, permit, or suffer more than one person to ply for hire with any such vehicle at the one time; and no owner or driver shall allow, permit, or suffer any person but the licensed driver for the time being in charge of such vehicle to tout or solicit hire for such vehicle.
- 89. No licensed owner or driver in charge of any vehicle plying for hire for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise shall take more than one engagement at the one time, and on being engaged upon any stand or place shall, on getting such engagement, fulfil the same at once, and shall not wait or loiter for any further engagement.
- 90. The owner or driver of every passenger vehicle plying for hire shall, upon an alarm of fire being given, and at the request of any member of the Fremantle Fire Brigade, convey with such vehicle to the scene of fire, or to any fire station in Fremantle, any number of firemen of the Fremantle Fire Brigade, or appliances for the suppression or extinguishment of fires or saving life as such passenger vehicle can conveniently accommodate: And the owner or driver of such vehicle shall be entitled to charge for such service double the ordinary rates as prescribed in Schedule A to these By-laws; provided that such charge shall not be less than five shillings for such engagement.
- 91. Any person guilty of an offence against these Bylaws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds, in addition to all costs and expenses to which such person is hereby liable.

Persons calling or sending for cab and not further employing the same, a charge of one shilling in addition to detention charges, or, at the option of the driver, the full fare from the place where the cab was engaged.

 $Detention\ Charges.$ —For every fifteen minutes or portion of fifteen minutes after the first five minutes, one shilling.

Additional charge of one-half above fares may be made between the hours of 10 p.m. and 1 a.m., and double fares between the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m.

Half fare allowed back if distance exceeds two miles. The driver must, before starting, agree with hirer whether hiring is to be by time or distance; if such is not done, hirer to choose.

No extra charge for luggage if under 28lbs., if over 28lbs. and under 56lbs. half fare may be charged; and half fare for every additional 56lbs. or portion of 56lbs.

In all cases for the purposes of a fare, the time shall commence at the time the driver starts to perform an engagement, and the distance shall be computed from the place the driver leaves to perform an engagement and along the nearest route.

BY-LAWS FOR COLLECTION OF RATES.

The Eoads Act, 1888.

BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH PERTH ROADS BOARD.

The North Perth Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1888," and the Amendment Acts, 1889 and 1894, the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the North Perth District, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette:—

INTERPRETATION.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "The Act."—The Roads Board Act of 1888, and amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter as far as the Act allows.
- "District."—The North Perth Roads Board District.
- "Board."—The North Perth Roads Board.
- "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."—A member of the Board.
- $\mbox{``Secretary.''}\mbox{--}$ The Secretary of the Board.
- "Road" or "Reserve."—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Street" shall mean and include every public street, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district, under the control of the Board, which the the public are permitted to use.
- "Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made, or kerbed, or otherwise.
- "Owner."—Any person in possession or receipt of the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any ratable property within the district during the period specified in the Act.
- "Cyclist."—A person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
- "Person" shall include the plural and also the body corporate.
- "Masculine" shall include feminine.
- "Permission of the Board."—The consent of the Board in writing.
- "Vehicle."—Any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, or other conveyance (not being a hand cart), with or without springs.

DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

To attend all Board meetings.

To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports.

To conduct all correspondence and to give the instructions as directed by the Minutes.

To answer all questions by the Chairman on the Board business.

To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheet prepared, and statistical abstract made yearly.

To prepare the rate books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections, also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections.

To summon the members of the Board to special meetings.

The Secretary shall keep the cash book, as well as any and all other books he may require to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be kept written up ready for the inspection of the Board.

He shall check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made.

He shall pay into the bank to the credit of the Board, within two (2) banking days, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him amounting to £10 on behalf of the Board, and no money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer or member of the Board except by or through the Secretary.

The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms.

At each meeting of the Board an approximate balancesheet shall be produced, showing, as nearly as possible, the financial position of the Board as regards payments already made.

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

Notices of Meetings.

Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of any special meeting at least two (2) days before such meeting.

The ordinary fortnightly meeting to be held at the Board room on the alternate Monday of every month, at 8 o'clock p.m.

The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the 9th section of the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board after notice, as before stated.

No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board—inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence—be present, and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called.

Such circumstances, together with the names of the members there present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

$Order\ of\ Business.$

The ordinary business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :—

- (a.) Reading and confirming of Minutes at last ordinary and special meetings, if any.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of Minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient as having regard thereto.
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (e.) Presentations of petitions or memorials, and reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (g.) Ordinary business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the Minutes, except as to their accuracy or for the ratification of any clerical error.

The election of all officers shall be conducted by ballot so as to obtain an absolute majority of the members present.

All motions or amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded before the next business is proceeded with.

Any member wishing to rescind any motion previously carried at any previous meeting shall give at least seven days' notice of his intention to do so.

No member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the motion before the Chairman, except strictly in explanation, or in contradiction of a misstatement, except the mover of the original motion who shall have the right to reply, and no further discussion shall take place after the mover of the motion has replied.

In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, it shall be for him to move the suspension of the standing orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all other.

In case of doubt or difficulty arising as to a question of practice and points of order that are not met by these standing orders, reference shall be made to parliamentary usage, and that rule followed.

Voting.

Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of an equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the 10th section of the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which all items of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there noted by the secretary, and subsequently entered by him, in the manner prescribed by the Act, in the minute book.

Petitions

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting or the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

Speaker must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by the consent of the Board.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise two members.

FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be so initialled by him and paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by Government) shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and countersigned by another member of the Board and by the Secretary.

All moneys shall, within two days after they have come into the hands of the Board or of any officers, servants, or clerks, for the use of the Board, be paid into such bank.

Money granted by Government shall be paid to Board's credit at the Treasury, and shall be operated upon to pay actual creditors for work executed on the specific object for which the money was granted.

URGENT WORK.

The Chairman with two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

UNAUTHORISED EXPENDITURE.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

OFFENCES, OMISSIONS OR NEGLECTS.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding $\pm 10:$ —

- (1.) Riding or driving horses, cattle or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage upon or along any footway.
- (2.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (3.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter in any footway, carriage road, or open or public place, or any private place, to the annoyance of the public.
- (4.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (5.) Allowing the dripping of the caves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (6.) Placing any advertisement board, placard, or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof, or if on property under the control of the Board, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (7). Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (8.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.
- (9.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, football, catapult, air gun or fire arm, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footway or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footway or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (10.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property.
- (11.) Having any awning, verandah, or blinds on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being of the full width of ten feet, and eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning, verandah or blinds, over the footway; or erecting any sign-board, sign-awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or other thing over or near any footway or road, without first having obtained the permission of the Board.
- (12.) Blasting any rock, stone or timber in or near any public place, without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (13.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (14.) Making a cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (15.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.

GENERAL REGULATION OF TRAFFIC.

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left, or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

No person between sunset and the following sunrise shall, in, upon, or along any of the public roads or streets within the District, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on the off side of the front of such vehicle.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road or street at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour.

The driver of every vehicle, or the rider of every horse or other animal, turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the District, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

No person having the care or control of any horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road or street of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road or street for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the same. Provided that where suitable bridle posts are available, a horse may be securely fastened thereto for any time not exceeding half-an-hour, and that immediately upon the request of any officer of the Board or police constable such horse shall be removed.

STALL LICENSES.

No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, catables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed by the Board.

Licenses for stalls shall be in the Form A in the Schedule.

No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.

The following fees shall be paid for licenses for stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if payment be not made when due, the license shall be void:—

For every stall, 20s. per month.

Every licensed stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the traffic inspector or other authorised officer of the Board.

No person to whom a stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself.

CYCLES.

Every cyclist within the District shall observe the rules of the road laid down for vehicular traffic.

No cyclist shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footway within the District.

No cyclist shall, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, ride a cycle within the District, unless there is attached to such cycle a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, which lamp shall at all times be kept lighted.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot, or on horseback, or any vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall leave any cycles in or on any road, street or footway, so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Board.

No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

When a cyclist meets or overtakes any horse or other animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount and shall remain dismounted as long as may be necessary to avoid accident.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads or streets in the District, or across the intersection of any road or street, at a pace exceeding three miles an hour.

To prevent Obstructions on the Footway of the Streets.

No person without having first obtained the permission of the Board shall allow any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street or footway (under the control of the Board) within the District after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing same.

No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footway, or public reserve within the District, without having first obtained permission of the Board.

Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any street,

road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or material shall remain and continue so deposited.

To prevent Damages to Footways and other Board Property.

No person, without having first obtained the permission of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footway, drain, gutter, culvert, road, public way, kerbing, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board, or under the control thereof.

PRESERVATION OF TREES, ETC.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant standing in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty of not more than £10.

THROWING DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES ON FOOTWAYS.

Any person who shall throw vegetable substances or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any foot-way within the District shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the said Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

PARK LANDS, RESERVES, AND RECREATION GROUNDS.

All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the District, for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Board.

All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit or merchandise in any park lands, recreation ground, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.

No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

QUARRIES AND TIMBER.

Any person who shall quarry or remove stone or other materials on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

BARRED WIRE FENCES.

No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public street within the District.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

CONSTRUCTION OF FOOTWAYS, CROSSING PLACES.

It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any street or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the or gutter, naving first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse shall ride, or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, or tricycle upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case, upon and by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing or channel, as the Justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

Lamps, Posts, etc.

No lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flagstaff, shall be crected by any person in any street without the written consent of the Board, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board; and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

PRESCRIBING THE REMOVAL OF VERANDAHS AND BALCONIES, ETC., AT EXPENSE OF OWNER OR OCCUPIER.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board; and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not exceeding £10.

ENCROACHMENTS OR OBSTRUCTIONS TO BE REMOVED.

On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within 14 days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall be not more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed herein.

PENALTIES.

Where any person or persons by the foregoing By-laws, or any of them, are required to do or perform any act or thing, and any such act or thing remains undone, the Board may cause the same to be performed, and charge the cost and expenses against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall, on conviction for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except when otherwise provided) the sum of £20.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Beard to perform the same and charge the costs and expenses are interested. expenses against such persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits, or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

PENALTIES TO BE PAID TO THE BOARD.

All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Distric', except so much as may be payable to any informer.

BY-LAWS DEALING WITH RECEPTION OF NIGHT-SOIL, URINE, OFFAL, OR ANY OTHER RUBBISH OR OFFENSIVE MATTER.

The Board may from time to time appoint any place or places for the reception of night soil, urine, offal, or any other rubbish or offensive matter, or it may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Board shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.

- No person or persons shall deposit any night-soil or rubbish, urine or any other offensive matter in any place whatsoever in the North Perth Roads Board District, other than the place or places set apart or provided by the said Board for such purpose, and no person or persons shall transport such night-soil or urine from any place within the District to the said place or places provided by the said Board unless he be a nightman or other person duly authorised.
- 3. Every privy or urinal shall, within 14 days after the publication of these By-laws, be supplied by the occupier of the house to which it belongs with a pan or receptacle for night-soil or urine.
- The occupier of any premises whereon any privy or urinal is erected shall keep the same and the pans and receptacles for night-soil and urine clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause such privy or urinal to be properly emptied and cleansed once, at least, in every week or oftener if required by the Board.
- The nightman shall be entitled to charge and receive from the occupier of any premises from which any night-soil or urine shall be removed such sum or sums of money as may be provided or authorised by the Board, and no night-man shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys so authorised.
- 6. Every nightman, prior to his carrying on his business, shall obtain from the Board a license so to do, and such license may be cancelled at any time provided his work is not done to the satisfaction of the Board.
- No privy, cesspool, or urinal, or other receptacle for night soil or urine shall be emptied, or any blood, offal, or other offensive refuse whatever, removed from any house or premises within the North Perth Roads Board District, except between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m., and no night-soil shall be transported in said district except as aforesaid.
- 8. In the event of the death from natural causes or accident of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or accident, necessitating the slaughter of such animals within the North Perth Roads Board District, the carcase of such animals shall be removed immediately to the place or places provided by the Board, and thoroughly burned and destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be.
- 9. Any person or persons who shall be guilty of a breach of any one of the aforesaid By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5.

House of Ill-fame or Brothel .- No persons or person shall own or occupy a house of ill-fame or brothel in the North Perth Roads Board District, and no person or persons shall let or lease any house or premises in the District aforesaid to any person or persons reputed to be of ill-fame, or for any immoral purposes—and the onus of proof that the person

or persons letting or leasing the house or premises did not know that the person or persons to whom he or they let or leased such house or premises shall be upon the person or persons so letting or leasing the same, under a penalty not to exceed £20 for the first offence, and £50 for the second offence

No skilled mechanic or labourer employed by this Board, or by any contractor to this Board, shall be required to work more than eight hours in any one day; provided always, that in the event of any work that may be required to be finished, the said skilled mechanic or labourer shall receive time and a quarter for any time beyond this that he may work.

The following shall be the minimum of wages paid to any skilled mechanic or labourer employed by the Board, or by any contractor to this Board:—

Carpenters, 10s. per day.
Bricklayers, 12s. per day.
Masons, 12s. per day.
Blacksmiths, 11s. per day.
Painters, 9s. per day.
Plumbers, 10s. per day.
Labourers, 8s. per day.
Drivers (horse), 7s. per day.
Other skilled labour, 1s. 3d. per hour.
Clerks, when required, 1s.3d. per hour.

The above schedule shall be subject to the following sliding scale:—

From 16 to 18 years, 15s. per week. From 18 to 21 years, 25s. per week. From 21 to 50 years, as per schedule. From 50 to 60 years, 25 per cent. reduction. From 60 to 70 years, 50 per cent. reduction on schedule.

In the event of any breach of the foregoing By-laws by any contractor to this Board, the said contractor shall be liable to a penalty of £10 for the first offence, and for any subsequent offence £20; or the said Board may cancel the said contract.

No Asiatics shall be employed by any contractor to this Board.

The Commissioner of Railways does hereby declare that the following Regulations, having been approved by the Governor in Executive Council, on Wednesday, the 29th November, 1899, are the Regulations for regulating the use of all Wharves and Jetties under his control or management, pursuant to "The Railways Act, 1878," and all other the Acts amending the said Act, the Act 42 Victoria, No. 18, and every other Act enabling him thereto.

Regulations for the Working of Fremantle Harbour Wharves and Jetties, and such of the Sea Jetties of the Colony as are under the control of the Commissioner of Railways

1. From and after the 30th November, 1899, all Jetty Regulations heretofore made for the management and use of the Fremantle Harbour Wharves and Jetties, and such of the Sea Jetties as are under the control of the Commissioner of Railways, shall be cancelled, and, in lieu thereof, the following Regulations shall come into force on the 1st of December, 1899:—

BERTHING DUES, ETC.

Berthing Dues at Fremantle Harbour Wharves and Jetties.

2. All vessels using any of the Harbour Wharves or Jetties lying to the Eastward of the Western extremity of either of the moles, at Fremantle, for loading or discharging cargo, shall pay Berthing Dues at the following rates, i.e.:—

All ocean-going Mail Steamers ... 2d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped.

and per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, £5; maximum, £20 per entry into the Colony.

All lighters...

2d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 2s. 6d.

All coasting vessels (not exceeding 200 tons register)

2d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 5s.

All other Vessels per one week, or any part of a week, Sundays included

2d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, £3; maximum, £20 per entry into the Colony.

After the first week, for a week or any part of a subsequent week...

2½d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped.

Note.—All Vessels discharging or shipping 100 tons of cargo or over, per day, will be exempt from the additional ½d. per ton.

Berthing Dues at the Sea Jetties.

3. All Vessels using any of the Sea Jetties of the Colony under the control of the Commissioner of Railways for loading or discharging cargo shall pay Berthing dues at the following rates, i.e.:—

For the first week or any part of two (2) weeks, Sundays included

... 1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 10s.; maximum, £12.

For any subsequent week or part of such week

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped.

All Lighters

1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 2s. 6d.

All Coasting Vessels (not exceeding 200 tons register) ...

1d. per ton on all cargo landed or shipped. Minimum, 2s. 6d.

Vessels discharging or shipping 50 tons of cargo or over per day will be exempt from the additional $\frac{1}{2}$ d per ton.

Coal Hulks, each, per annum

... £10, payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year; provided that Coal Hulks shall not be allowed to occupy berthage accommodation when vessels with cargo or passengers require the same.

Vessels transhipping cargo to pay Berthing Dues.

4. All vessels lying alongside the Wharves or Jetties, and transhipping cargo to or from lighters or other vessels, shall pay the like berthage dues in respect thereof as if the said cargo had been landed on or taken off the wharves or jetties, or either of them, in place of being taken from or placed in such lighters or vessels as aforesaid.

Time during which a Vessel may occupy Berth.

5. The time during which a vessel may occupy any berth at any wharf or jetty for the purpose of discharging or loading cargo shall not exceed the following, viz.:—

And so on at the rate of one (1) additional day for every additional fifty tons register. The time to be allowed to a vessel not having a full cargo on board shall be in proportion to the above. Sundays and holidays are excluded from the above computation of time.

To move when directed.

6. No vessel shall be allowed to keep a berth longer than the prescribed period named in Regulation 5, although a portion only of her cargo may have been loaded or discharged, but she must give place to the next in turn when the Harbour Master so directs.

Taking in Cargo.

7. Vessels, after having discharged or taken in their cargo, shall remove to any berth or anchorage pointed out by the Harbour Master.

WHARFAGE AND OTHER CHARGES.

8. Consignees and shippers shall pay a charge of two shillings per ton on all goods landed or shipped at the said Fremantle Harbour Wharves or Jetties (except as provided by Clause 9), or at any of the Sea Jetties of the Colony, such charge to include all labour in trucking on such wharves and jetties; the charges to be levied on ship's measurement, weight, or at undermentioned scale, at the option of the Pier Master or officer in charge:—

9. Consignees and shippers shall pay a charge of 1s. per ton on all goods discharged from or shipped into lighters to or from the said Fremantle Harbour Wharves or Jetties (excepting goods loaded into or discharged from railway trucks, which shall pay 2s. per ton): Provided that such consignees and shippers shall provide and pay for all labour required therefor.

10. Wharfage and other charges on all goods must be prepaid to the Pier Master or officer in charge, unless the consignee or consignor has a duly authorised ledger account with the Railway Department.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 11. Before commencing to discharge inward cargoes, ship masters or their agents shall hand to the Pier Master or officer in charge a freight list of the cargo, which shall include mark, number, shipper, consignee, weight or measurement.
- 12. Inward cargoes shall be delivered into railway trucks or trollies, and, as far as it is practicable, ship masters shall deliver cargoes according to the entries on bills of lading or manifests.
- 13. To insure prompt and correct deliveries to consignees, special efforts shall be made by ship masters to deliver goods of the same nature and brand together, *i.e.*, where bag stuffs are available they shall be delivered together, where cases are available they shall be delivered together, etc.
- 14. Outward cargoes to be delivered in the same order as inward cargoes. Goods for different ports to be kept separately.
- 15. No goods shall be landed or placed on the wharves or jetties without the written authority of the Pier Master or officer in charge.
- 16. If it shall appear that goods are being landed, and cannot, in the opinion of the Pier Master or officer in charge, be removed in time to prevent a "block," the Pier Master or officer in charge may give notice, in writing, to the masters or persons in charge of vessels or lighters from which goods are being discharged to stop discharging cargo, and, upon such notice being given, no further cargo shall be discharged until such time as the Pier Master or officer in charge may direct.
- 17. The official hours for trucking will be from the 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. between the 1st of October and 30th of April (1st October to 30th April), with an interval of one hour for dinner. On Saturdays the hours will be from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. From the 1st of May to the 30th of September the hours will be from 8 a.m. to 5 30 p.m., with an interval of one hour for dinner. Saturdays, 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- 18. On all goods trucked after hours, on holidays, or on Sundays, at the request of shipping agents or others, the Pier Master or officer in charge will levy, in addition to the ordinary rates, the amount of overtime charges incurred.
- 19. Cargoes which are partly free and partly for bond shall be taken to the receiving warehouses, where they will be tallied by officers representing respectively the Customs and Railway Departments.
- 20. If free goods are not removed from the receiving warehouses within 48 hours from the time they are placed therein, a storage charge of 1s. per ton or 2d. per package per day will be made.
- 21. Goods not cleared at the Customs House will be kept in the receiving warehouses for 24 consecutive hours after delivery ex ship to enable the consignees to clear same or enter them for bond. If at the end of 24 hours goods are uncleared they will be delivered to Customs, and a charge of 1s. per ton (minimum 3d.) per consignment will be made for haulage from the receiving warehouses to Customs.
- 22. Cargoes going direct into bond shall be tallied by railway and ship's officers. The railway officer shall, if requested, give receipts for all deliveries ex ship during official working hours.

23. The Railway Department will deliver bonded goods to Customs between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m, from October 1st to 30th April, and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. from May 1st to September 30th. On Saturday, work shall cease at 1 p.m.

24. Hire of Cranes.—10-ton steam cranes, 10s. per hour, minimum £2; 5-ton steam cranes, 5s. per hour, minimum £1; donkey engines, 4s. per hour, minimum, £1; hand cranes, 2s. 6d. per hour. The foregoing charges are for the use of cranes at hirer's risk only, but the Commissioner of Railways will take the risk on payment of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on value of goods to be lifted in addition to ordinary crane charges. Application for the use of cranes must be made on the prescribed forms.

25. No person shall fish on any wharf or jetty.

26. Stones, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel shall not be landed or placed on the floor of the wharves or jetties. Firewood for the use of passenger steamers and other vessels or boats shall be taken direct from the truck to the vessel. No goods shall be handed over the rails of the wharves or jetties.

27. No person shall make fast any tackle, purchase, or other gear, to any part of the crane, or place or use any private derrick, crane, or other lifting machine without special permission obtained from the Pier Master or officer in charge.

28. No bullock or horse teams, or any wheeled vehicle, other than a railway truck, drawn by any quadruped or quadrupeds, shall be driven on to, or permitted to go on, the jetties or wharves, and no riding on horseback will be permitted thereon.

29. No person shall land or place or cause to be landed or placed upon any wharf or jetty, or upon the approach to any wharf or jetty, any decayed or decaying vegetables or other thing whatsoever likely to become a nuisance.

30. All consignments of live stock must be landed at the Owen Anchorage Stock Jetty. Live stock in limited quantities may, however, be landed at the Harbour wharves by permission being obtained from the Commissioner of Railways, and under the terms and conditions imposed by such authority.

31. Any person violating any of the above Regulations is liable, on conviction, to a fine of £10.
