#### The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

E.C. 3 8 1 2 Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 29th day of November, 1899.

> Present:His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables-The Colonial Treasurer, The Commissioner of Railways, The Minister of Mines, The Attorney General.

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HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the importation or introduction into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any such stock from any country or place, or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or such importation by sea at such

parts of the sea coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby permit the introduction by land of stock from the Northern Territory of South Australia into that portion of the Kimberley District of Western Australia situated East of the 127th meridian of longitude, at the places and subject to the conditions hereafter set out, viz.:-

- 1. That all stock introduced into Western Australia by land from the Northern Territory of South Australia shall be exempt from Sections 13 and 14 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."
- 2. That such stock shall be introduced from the Northern Territory of South Australia into Western Australia at Cockatoo Springs, Newry, or at the point on the border line of the two colonies where the Negri River crosses.
- 3. That every person, before introducing any cattle or horses from the Northern Territory of South Australia into that portion of Western Australia previously defined, shall give not less than seventy-two hours' notice, in writing to the Inspector of Stock for Western Australia, stationed at Rosewood, stating the time at which such stock will arrive be named in the notice), the number of cattle and horses intended to be introduced, with their brands and description, the owner's name, where brought from, and to whom consigned.
- That all stock so introduced be accompanied by a declaration of health, made by the owner or breeder, that such stock are healthy, and were so at the time of starting to travel; and such declaration shall be in the form hereunder, and shall be made before an Inspector of Stock of this Colony.

WHEREAS by "The Beer Duty Act, 1898," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for all or any of the purposes of the said Act: Now, THERE-FORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, in addition to the Regulations made on the 6th day of December, 1899, that is to say:

#### REGULATION UNDER BEER DUTY ACT.

No person shall carry on the business of bottling beer 1. No person shall carry on the business of bottling beer in any brewery, or upon any premises having communication with a brewery, unless in a place approved by a collector appointed under "The Beer Duty Act, 1898," or by an officer of Customs, nor unless the words "Authorised for Bottling," legibly painted or printed, be kept affixed over every entrance to the place so appointed: And the removal of beer from the brewery to such place shall be deemed a removal from the brewery within the meaning of Section 15 of the said Act Section 15 of the said Act.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Albany.

#### Albany Municipality.

#### BY-LAW No. 25.

For the Management of the Ulster Road Reserve, Albany.

- 1. No person shall interfere with any property in and belonging to the Ulster Road Reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter of any kind.
- 2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences of the Ulster Road Reserve, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.
- 3. Any person found in a state of intoxication in the Ulster Road Reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein, may be forthwith removed from such Reserve by the Caretaker, or by any officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the Management Committee, or by any member of the Police Force, and shall be, moreover, liable to prosecution for an offence against this By-law.
- 4. No person, except those in the employ of, or authorised by, the Albany Town Council, or by the Management Committee, or by payment of the stipulated fee, shall bring into the Reserve any horse or other animal, or any vehicle.
- 5. No person shall light any fire within the Reserve without first having obtained the consent of the Council or of the Management Committee.
- 6. No person, except the Mayor or Councillors, or the officers or servants of the Albany Town Council, or the members of the Management Committee, acting in the discharge of their duty, shall be allowed to enter the Reserve on such days as may be set apart for sports, except through the proper entrance for that purpose, and on payment of the fee chargeable for admission at the time.
- 7. No person shall be allowed to enter the Reserve for the purpose of training on the bicycle track, or for practising cricket or football, until he has first obtained a permit to do so
- 8. No person shall smoke any pipe, tobacco, cigar, or cigarette in any of the dressing rooms on the Reserve.
- 9. No person shall bet, gamble, or call the odds, or offer to bet or gamble, within the Reserve; and any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds, or offering to bet or gamble, within the Reserve, may be forthwith removed from the Reserve by the caretaker, or by an officer or servant of the Town Council, or by any member of the Management Committee, or by any member of the Police Force, and shall also be liable to be prosecuted for a breach of this By-law.
- 10. No person shall enter any of the dressing or training rooms on the Reserve, or use any of the lockers, without first having obtained a permit for that purpose from the Management Committee, which ticket must be produced if demanded by any member of the Management Committee, or by the Caretaker, and failing to produce such ticket shall be sufficient grounds for excluding such person from the dressing and training rooms.
- 11. No person shall preach or address an audience or public meeting on the Reserve without first having obtained permission so to do from the Management Committee.
- 12. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight, in the open air on the said Reserve, or under the shade or shelter of any tree or trees, or on any seat on the said Reserve, without the written consent of the Management Committee first obtained.

- 13. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, sent, cilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, hand-bill notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, or path on the said Reserve, without the written consent of the Management Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said Reserve unless the consent, in writing, of the said Management Committee shall be previously obtained.
- 15. The said Reserve to be open until 10 o'clock a.m. on Sundays. Any person found on the Reserve after that hour on the afore-mentioned day shall be liable to be prosecuted for a breach of this By-law.
- 16. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

This month was characterised in Perth by mild pleasant weather. The mean temperatures, both maximum and minimum, were very nearly the same as for the corresponding month last year, but were considerably below the general average for previous years. The highest temperature recorded during the month at the Perth Gardens was 86.4, and on only one occasion during the last 23 years has it been as low as that. The highest ever recorded in November was 105°.

Taking the Colony generally, we find that the usual summer conditions of atmospheric pressure have set in, the barometers being highest on the South-West and South coast, with falling gradients thence Northwards. The mean temperature has advanced nearly 10° throughout the Tropics. The heat has been most intense at Hall's Creek, in the Kimberley district, where the mean monthly maximum was 1054°, and the temperature has exceeded 100° some time during the month at all stations from Coolgardie Northwards, with the exception of Geraldton and Carnarvon. The highest reading was 112·8° at Condon on the 12th.

In Southern Districts, the increase of temperature as compared with last month has been only about 2° on an average, except well inland, where it has been greater. The effect of the sea breeze in modifying the heat during the daytime is very marked. Thus the mean daily maximum at

The coolest place in the Colony is Breaksea Island, where the mean daily maximum temperature is only 64.4°. The region of coldest nights is the neighbourhood of Katanning, where the mean minimum was 48.6°, and the absolute lowest temperature for the month 37.0°.

The rainfall from the latitude of Perth Southwards was, on the whole, slightly in excess of the average for previous years, but to the North it was poor, and throughout the North-West country no rain at all was recorded.

The total fall at the Perth Gardens from January 1st to November 30th has been 31.84 inches, or about half an inch less than the average amount.
