HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898":—

No person shall gather or injure any Boronia plant within the area of Albany Suburban Lot 356 (Reserve  $\Delta$  6862.)

Any person offending against this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, to be recovered in a Court of Summary Jurisdiction.

This was distinctly a hot and dry month in Perth. The mean maximum temperature at the Gardens (86-5°) was 3° in excess of the average for previous years, and was the highest recorded since 1882. The night temperature was 1-2° above the average. In the middle of the month the temperature exceeded 100° on five consecutive days, an unprecedented event in December, and the maximum for the month was the highest since 1888. The rainfall was only 12 points, making the total for the year 396, or about an inch below the mean for previous years.

Taking the Colony generally, an increase of 7° to 10° in the average daily maximum over last month is noticeable throughout the Southern half, or from Geraldton and the Murchison Southwards. The area of hottest weather has moved considerably Southwards, and no lies between the Ashburton and the Murchison Fields, or probably in the desert to the East of that position. The mean maximum has decreased 5° at Wyndham, and 8° at Hall's Creek, but the night temperatures are about the same, or slightly higher than for November. The effect of the geographical position in modifying the climate of Perth is, as usual, most marked, the difference in the mean maximum here and on the Coolgardie Goldfields being 12° in our favour. This is due, not only to the welcome sea breeze which is such a characteristic feature of summer afternoons, but also to the fact that barometric "lows" either form in the interior or pass away to the Southern Ocean, or else come down through the Goldfields from the North-West coast. The effect in either case is the same. With pressure relatively high on the West coast, and relatively low inland, we enjoy the cool weather which invariably accompanies the Westward side of a "low," whilst the Fields have to endure the heat and discomfort which just as invariably accompany the Eastward segment.

Rainfall has been very light throughout. We do not usually expect much at this time of the year, but it has been even less than usual, and many places record nil. It was, however, fairly heavy in the Kimberley District, the maximum quantity registered being 54 points at Fitzroy Crossing.
