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WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any town or locality containing ratable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Three hundred pounds, and to declare and proclaim it to be a new Municipality: AND WHEREAS it is necessary, in order to determine the constitution of the Municipal Council, that the population of the locality to be proclaimed a Municipality shall be declared by the Governor: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the Town of Leonora (hereinafter described) contains ratable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Kt., Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the said town of Leonora to be under One thousand: AND I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation, declare and proclaim it to be a New Municipality, under the name, style, and title of "The Chairman and Councillors of Leonora," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate about 4 chains East, and about 35 chains 23 links North from the North-East corner of Goldmining Lease 250c, and extending

90° 4' about 8 chains; thence 0° 4' 10 chains, 90° 4' 12 chains, 180° 4' 10 chains, 90° 4' about 35 chains 25 links, 180° 4' about 124 chains, 270° 4' about 35 chains 25 links, 0° 4' about 47 chains, 270° 4' about 20 chains; thence 0° 4' 77 chains to the starting point. Excluding all lands at present legally held under "The Goldfields Act and Regulations," except those held under Business Licenses or as Residence Areas.

**W**HEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*—

1. To make regulations prescribing the length, width, and meshes of nets, whether generally or for certain places or times:

AND WHEREAS fishing by a set net in portions of the Swan River (except during the months of January, February, March, and April in each year) is allowed: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to regulate the length, width, and meshes of nets to be used in that portion of the Swan River extending from the Causeway Bridge to Upper Swan Bridge: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation prescribe that the length and meshes of nets to be used for the capture of fish within the portion of Swan River aforesaid shall be as follows:—The mesh must not be less than three inches from corner to corner, to be measured from point to point when stretched out; the length of the net must not exceed 50 yards; two or more nets must not be coupled together, and a net must not be set across a deep water channel which does not exceed the length of the net allowed; no dragging or splashing to be allowed.

BY-LAWS for the general regulation of Weights and Measures to be observed within the Town of Fremantle.

In pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in, under, and by virtue of "The Weights and Measures Act, 1899," the Council of the Town of Fremantle makes and ordains that the following By-laws for the general regulation of fees to be paid and received for testing and stamping weights, measures, beams, scales, steelyards, balances, and weighing machines within the Town of Fremantle shall be observed and enforced:—

1. The fees to be charged and taken by the Inspector of Weights and Measures for testing and stamping weights, measures, beams, scales, steelyards, balances, and weighing machines shall be according to Schedule A to these By-laws.

2. All such fees as mentioned in the said Schedule shall be paid to the Inspector upon the stamping of any weight, measure, beam, scale, steelyard, balance, or weighing machine.

The fees to be charged for any weights, measures, beams, scales, steelyards, balances, or weighing machines compared and stamped by the Inspector outside the Fremantle Municipality shall be one-half more than the ordinary fees as hereinbefore mentioned, exclusive of any charge incurred in conveying the weights and measures from the Inspector's office to the place required.

Persons having weights, measures, beams, scales, steelyards, balances, or weighing machines compared and stamped on their premises, or anywhere from the office of the Inspector, shall pay all expenses incurred in conveying the weights and measures from the Inspector's office to the place required.
