Explanatory.

1. The eighteen Goldfields of the Colony are herein arranged according to their geographical position, commencing with Kimberley in the North, and terminating with Dundas in the South. Six Goldfields are sub-divided into seventeen districts, and in the case of these Goldfields the district in which the Warden has fixed his headquarters is placed first in the return. The Mining centres have, in all cases, been shown in alphabetical order under the heading of their respective districts, and, finally, the groups of mines which make up the mining centres have been set down in similar fashion.

* * * * *

2. These Returns represent all treatments reported to Mining Registrars as completed during the month; but, as Regulations 45 and 98 allow seven days in which to declare such results, the gold production of the Colony cannot be ascertained earlier than some ten days after the end of each month when the totals of each district will be announced, followed at a few days' interval by full details.

* * * * *

3. During the last week of each month the holders of leases and registered claims, as well as the managers of public crushing plants, will receive from the Mining Registrar of the district,—

(a.) Two copies of Schedule 11 or 22, according as they may be applicable to machinery areas, leases, or registered claims.

(b.) One addressed envelope, impressed with the Office and Frank Stamp of the local district in which the return is to be forwarded to the Mining Registrar.

From this, it will be gathered that all cost to the lessees and managers has been avoided, and the labour of completing the returns has been reduced to a minimum.

* * * * *

4. As one of the principal intentions of Regulation 45 is to credit each district with the amount of gold won therefrom, managers of gold-extracting plants, when taking delivery of ore presented for treatment, are particularly requested to insist upon the exact locality being declared from which such ore was derived. As it is imperatively necessary that the results from ore so treated should be in the hands of the Mining Registrar of the district from which it was obtained on the seventh day of each month, it behoves all managers to post the return as many days before that date as it will occupy in transit.

* * * * *

5. The difference between the statement headed "Return of Gold in ounces, as reported to the Mines Department," and the one compiled by H.M. Customs is to be accounted for by the fact that the exportation of gold started, practically, with the inception of the industry; whereas the mode of collecting returns adopted by the Mines Department is the elaboration of a system established some three years ago. Up to that date, therefore, no good basis for an exact comparison can be found. As to the discrepancy which exists at present, the assumption is that the whole of the gold won from the soil is not reported to the Department.

6. Notification will be gladly received by the Statist, Perth, of any omissions that may occur or corrections that may be necessary, the aim of the Department being to arrive at as accurate an account as possible of the gold production of Western Australia.

ROYAL MINT, PERTH BRANCH.

On 20th June, 1899, His Excellency the Governor declared the Perth Branch of the Royal Mint to be open for the receipt of gold for coinage.

Subject to the Regulations, any person may deposit gold at the Mint in his own name. Those who cannot attend personally for the purpose may send the gold by an agent, through the post, or under Police escort.

A pamphlet has been published giving all necessary information for intending depositors, conditions of the Escort Service, Coining Regulations, etc., etc. Copies of this pamphlet can be obtained from the Deputy Master of the Mint.

Parcels up to 43 ounces gross may be sent through the post. (*See page 18 of pamphlet.*)

An Escort Service is provided by the Police Department for parcels of all sizes. The consignor pays for the carriage by coach or train, but the escort charges are collected by the Mint. (*See page 19 of pamphlet.*)

Forms for use in connection with gold sent to the Mint by post or under Police escort can be obtained on application.

The charges for the conversion of gold into coin are as follows:—

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council, under the provisions of the Statute 63 Vict., No. 53, has been pleased to make the following By-laws, which are hereby published for general information.

By-Laws made under the Fremantle Water Supply Act, 1899 (63 Vict., No. 53).

Power to make By-laws.

WHEREAS by the combined effect of "The Fremantle Water Supply Act, 1899," and of "The Water-Works Act, 1889," the Director of Public Works is authorised and empowered, within the Municipalities of Fremantle, East Fremantle, and North Fremantle, from time to time to make, alter, and repeal By-laws:

- I. For regulating the conduct of the officers and servants appointed or employed under or for the purposes of the said Act.
- II. For fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and a minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is so supplied.
- III. For determining the times at which any charge for water supplied under agreement shall be payable, whether in advance or otherwise.
- IV. For regulating the number, form, material, dimensions, construction, and arrangement of pipes, fittings, and other works supplying water from the pipes of the Director of Public Works to adjacent premises; the time of executing, and the notices to be given for such works, the superintendence thereof, the making good and replacing ground which may be displaced in the course of such works, and for inspecting, at reasonable times, pipes and fittings, whether within any buildings or otherwise.
- V. For regulating the construction, disposition, and inspection of meters.
- VI. For regulating the quantity of water each consumer is entitled to use in respect of his rates in any given period.
- VII. For preventing the waste or misuse of water, whether supplied by meter or otherwise.
- VIII. For compelling persons using water supplied by the Director of Public Works to keep their pipes, fittings, and other appliances in proper repair; for preventing any alteration of, or interference with, such pipes or fittings without the consent of, or notice to, the Superintendent or Officer in Charge; for repairing such pipes, fittings, and appliances, so as to prevent waste of water, and for recovering the cost of such repairs.
- IX. For licensing competent plumbers, and for cancelling such licenses, and also for preventing any other than licensed plumbers from fixing, altering, or repairing any pipes, fittings, or meters

connected with the pipes or works of the Director of Public Works, and fining licensed plumbers for breach of any of the regulations.

And whereas by the said Acts it is enacted that the Director of Public Works may, by such by-laws, impose such reasonable penalties as he may think fit, not exceeding Twenty pounds, for any breach of such By-laws, and, in case of a continuing offence, a further penalty, not exceeding Five pounds, for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Director of Public Works to the offender.

Now, the Director of Public Works, under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Acts aforesaid, doth make the By-laws following:—

Cancellation of previous By-laws.

1. All By-laws heretofore made, regulating the supply of water to Fremantle, are hereby cancelled.

Interpretation clause.

2. In the construction of these By-laws, except where the subject matter or context shall require a different interpretation, the words "Director of Public Works" shall mean and include any person acting on behalf of the Director of Public Works; and the words "The Three Municipalities" shall mean and include the Municipalities of Fremantle, East Fremantle, and North Fremantle.

Officers and workmen not to accept gratuity.

3. The officers and workmen of the Director of Public Works, employed in connection with the Fremantle Water Supply, shall not accept any fee, gratuity, or reward whatsoever other than the salary, wages, or allowances granted them by the Director of Public Works.

Information supplied at Superintendent's Office, Fremantle.

4. Any person desirous of obtaining information relating to the Fremantle Water Supply is required to apply for the same to the Superintendent of Water Supply, at his office in Fremantle.

Fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure.

5. The prices to be charged for supplying water to shipping at Fremantle shall be as follows:—

- (a.) Supplies per meter to shipping and machinery connected with shipping (other than Government shipping and machinery), 4s. per thousand gallons.
- (b.) Supplies per meter to Government shipping and machinery on or near wharves and jetties, 1s. per thousand gallons.

6. The rate to be charged for water supplied by measure to consumers, other than Municipalities, Government Departments, or shipping, shall be 1s. per thousand gallons; provided that, if the consumer be subject to the water rate, the amount of such charge shall be not less than the amount of the water rate.

Minimum charges for water supplied by measure.

7. The minimum charges for water supplied by measure within the three Municipalities shall be as follows:—

- (a.) Minimum charge for water supplied by measure to private consumers shall be 5s., exclusive of rent of meter.
- (b.) Minimum charge for water supplied by measure to shipping and machinery connected with same (other than Government shipping and material) shall be 8s. 6d.

- (c.) Minimum charge for water supplied by measure to Government shipping, and machinery connected with same, shall be 1s.
- (d.) Minimum charge for water supplied by measure to Government Departments (except Government shipping) and Municipalities shall be 6d.

*Determining time of payment for supplies by measure—
Deposit may be required—Rent of meters.*

8. At any time after the meter registering the quantity supplied has been read by the officer of the Director of Public Works, the amount charged for water supplied by measure shall be payable by the consumer on his receiving a notice that such amount is due, such notice to be served as provided for in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895." The Director of Public Works may require a deposit to be lodged of such an amount as will, in his opinion, be sufficient security for the due payment of all charges in connection with water supplied, and such deposit shall be refunded after the agreement in respect of the supply of water shall have terminated, and after all charges in connection with such supply of water shall have been paid. The rent of meters shall be paid in advance.

Who to tap mains.

9. The water mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Director of Public Works.

Service pipe will only be laid to nearest street boundary.

10. Where the lands or premises for which a supply is required are in a street in which a main pipe is laid down, the Director of Public Works may be required to lay a surface pipe from the water main to the nearest street boundary of such lands or premises; but the said Director of Public Works shall not be required to lay a service pipe to any other lands or premises.

Service pipes on private property.

11. The Director of Public Works shall not be required to lay a service pipe on private property.

For supplying lands and premises situated more than 180ft. from a main.

12. A water supply to any lands or premises situated at a greater distance than one hundred and eighty feet from a water main will be given only under special agreement, and at the discretion of the Director of Public Works.

Separate service pipe to be laid to each tenement, etc.

13. Lands or premises for which a water supply is required shall not, if separately occupied, be connected except by a separate service pipe to each of such lands or premises.

Discontinuation of supply for purpose of tapping mains.

14. For the purpose of tapping the mains, the water supply shall be discontinued whenever it may be found necessary to do so, throughout the whole or part of the water areas hereinafter stated, on the days and between the hours hereunder specified:—

In North Fremantle Municipality, East Fremantle Municipality, and Skinner, Malcolm, and Tuckfield Streets, Fremantle Municipality, Mondays and Tuesdays, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

In East and South Wards of Fremantle Municipality, Wednesdays and Thursdays, from 9 a.m. till 12 noon.

In North and West Wards of Fremantle Municipality (except Skinner, Malcolm, and Tuckfield Streets), Fridays and Saturdays, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

Removal of Defective Fittings.

15. Any consumer's pipe, cock, cistern, or other fitting laid, fixed, or used otherwise than in accordance with these Regulations and with the provisions of the Act, or which shall, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works, be or become of bad or defective quality, or shall conduce to the waste, misuse, or contamination of the water, shall, upon the Director of Public Works giving notice in writing, be discontinued and disused; and the Director of Public Works may require the same to be removed, replaced, or repaired, and may, if he think fit, stop the supply of water to the said consumer until such pipe, cock, cistern, or other fitting shall have been removed, replaced, or repaired to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works by a plumber licensed by the Director of Public Works to execute water supply plumbing work within the three Municipalities.

Supplies to steam boilers, etc.

16. Private services shall not communicate directly with any steam boiler or other apparatus used for the generation of steam, but the feed water shall be supplied in such a manner that none of the water in the boiler or such other apparatus can return into the main or service pipe. Any boiler or other apparatus in which the feed water is supplied direct from the service pipe shall be disconnected by a licensed plumber, engaged by the owner, within twenty-four hours after the owner has received written notice to have such work done from the Director of Public Works, and such alterations in the arrangement of the supply shall be made at the owner's expense by the said licensed plumber as may be necessary to comply with this By-law; and if the required alterations be not made within twenty-four hours after the service of such written notice on the owner, or at the premises where the said boiler or apparatus is fixed, the owner shall be liable to the penalties provided by By-law No. 48, and the Director of Public Works shall be at liberty to discontinue the supply of water without giving any further notice, and the supply shall not be restored until the alterations are completed to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of the Water Supply, and until all penalties are paid, including the charges for cutting off and restoring the supply.

Diameters of service pipes.

17. The supply of water to each consumer shall be through a separate service pipe of one of the diameters stated hereunder, according to the annual value of the lands or premises as assessed by either of the three Municipalities for the purpose of the General Rate:—

For premises assessed at under £50 per annum, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe.

For premises assessed at more than £50 and not more than £150 per annum, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch pipe.

For premises assessed at more than £150 and not more than £300 per annum, 1 inch pipe.

For premises assessed at more than £300 and not more than £400 per annum, $1\frac{1}{4}$ inch pipe.

Other premises as per special agreement.

Expense of service connections on private property to be borne by owner or occupier.

18. The owner or occupier shall bear the expense of the laying down and maintenance on his premises of all pipes, service connections, and apparatus in connection with the water supply. All such pipes shall be of galvanised wrought iron.

Quality of fittings.

19. The whole of the iron pipes, tees, thimbles, bands, reducing couplings, plugs, etc., used in service connections shall be of galvanised iron of the best manufacture, and, where necessary and usual, true in section, straight, and of equal thickness, properly and truly cut with proper thread, and perfectly sound and new, and free from all defects. The tees, bends, tubes, etc., are to be capable of withstanding a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400ft. in height.

Joints.

20. All joints between tees, bends, thimbles, couplings, elbows, cocks, etc., shall be made with red lead and flax, and approved by the Director of Public Works before being allowed to form part of any service.

Depth of underground service pipes.

21. No underground service pipe on private property shall be laid at a less depth than 12in.

Location of service pipes, etc.

22. The location of all service pipes and fittings shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Public Works.

Pipes through drains, etc., to be properly protected.

23. No pipe or other apparatus shall be laid through any sewer, drain, ashpit, cistern, or manure tank or trough, in or into any place where, in the event of the pipe becoming unsound, the water conveyed through such pipe may be liable to be fouled or to escape without observation—unless such pipe or apparatus be laid through an exterior cast iron pipe or box of sufficient length and strength to afford due protection to same, and to bring any leakage or waste within easy detection.

Testing fittings.

24. All taps, stop-cocks, bib-cocks, ball-cocks, valves, closet-cisterns, service-boxes, waste-not regulators, bath taps or valves, or other fittings used in connection with a supply of water, shall be tested and approved by the duly authorised officer of the Director of Public Works before being fixed.

Cocks.

25. All stop and bib-cocks shall be loose valve, screw-down, high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun metal, and be in every respect of best quality and workmanship.

Cisterns.

26. Every cistern and tank used must be provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and the overflow pipe shall be laid and fixed in a suitable manner, so as to discharge in some conspicuous place, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the duly authorised officer of the Director of Public Works.

Service not to communicate with rain-water receptacles or underground tanks.

27. No service pipe shall communicate with any cistern, tank, or vessel intended or used for the reception of rain water, or made or used below the surface of the ground.

Water-closets.

28. Every water-closet fitting used shall be of such construction as shall be approved by the duly authorised officer in charge, and must be supplied from the service pertaining to the tenement through a proper closet cistern or service-box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe will be suffered, under any pretence whatever, to communicate directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water-closet.

Baths.

29. In every bath the outlet shall be distinct from and unconnected with the inlet or inlets; and the inlet or inlets must be placed above the highest water level of the bath. The outlet of every bath must be provided with a perfectly water-tight plug, valve, or cock. No bath shall have any overflow waste pipe, nor exceed in dimensions 6ft. 6in. long by 3ft. wide by 2ft. 6in. deep, unless the water is supplied through meter. The Director of Public Works will not supply any bath unless the same shall be so constructed as to prevent a waste of water.

Urinals.

30. Every urinal shall be supplied only through a cistern or service-box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No service pipe shall be suffered to communicate directly with urinal.

Construction, regulation, and disposition of meters furnished by the Director of Public Works.

31. The Director of Public Works may supply water by measure to any person requiring the same, on terms and conditions set out on Schedule "A." The expense of fixing and removing meters will be charged to the consumers having the use of same. The rent of meters, which is payable half-yearly in advance, and includes charges for fair wear and tear, will be 15s. per annum for $\frac{1}{2}$ in. and $\frac{3}{4}$ in. meters; 20s. for 1in. and $1\frac{1}{2}$ in. meters; 30s. for 2in., $2\frac{1}{2}$ in., and 3in. meters; and for larger sizes according to agreement. Meters will be provided by the Director of Public Works, provided that all persons to whom such meters shall be supplied shall have the option of purchasing their meter from the Director of Public Works, at a price to be fixed by the Director of Public Works; and in the event of such purchase, no rent shall be charged for the use thereof. Before being hired out or sold by the Director of Public Works all meters shall be tested in regard to accuracy of measurement, and no meter which registers inaccurately to the extent of more than 2 per cent. will be sold or hired out for measuring water from the mains within the three Municipalities

Meters registering incorrectly.

32. If from any circumstances any meter shall cease to indicate correctly the water passing through it, the Director of Public Works shall be entitled to charge for the supply according and equal to the corresponding period of the preceding year; or, in case where there is no corresponding period, the charge made will be based on the average consumption of water per head in the three Municipalities at the time, and on the number of people resident and working on the premises in question; or, at the request of the consumer or will of the Director of Public Works, if the said meter has not stopped working, it shall be tested in the manner provided by Clause 5 of the prescribed Agreement A for supply by meter, and the charge for water supplied regulated accordingly.

33. No meter shall be affixed or disconnected from the service pipes, or in any way interfered with, except by the workmen of the Director of Public Works.

Power to supply by measure.

34. The Director of Public Works may compel any person supplied with water to take the same by measure.

Water-troughs.

35. If necessary in the opinion of the Director of Public Works, water-troughs shall be supplied through meter.

Circumstances under which consumers may be required to have meters affixed.

36. When, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works, any consumer is using a quantity of water in excess of the prescribed quantity he is entitled to receive in consideration of the amount of water rate payable by the said consumer in accordance with By-law No. 48; or, when, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works, any consumer is using water for other than domestic purposes, a notice will be issued to such consumer by the Director of Public Works, calling on him to have a meter affixed to his service pipe within seven days; and should such consumer, within seven days from date of such notice, not take the necessary steps, in accordance with the By-laws, towards having a meter affixed to his service pipe so as to control the whole of his supply, then the supply of water to him shall be discontinued, and such discontinuance of supply shall not release him from payment of the water rate for any preceding or subsequent period.

Application for water.

37. Any person requiring a meter to be affixed to his service pipe shall make application therefor in the form as per Schedule D to these By-laws, and shall pay to the Director of Public Works all fees chargeable in accordance with these By-laws.

Prescribed quantity of water to be supplied in consideration of water rate.

38. The prescribed quantity of water which any consumer is entitled to receive in any given period in consideration of the amount of water rate payable by such consumer is that quantity the total cost of which, if paid for at the rate of one shilling per thousand gallons, would amount to a sum equal to the amount of water rate paid for such period, provided always that such period shall not exceed six calendar months.

Consumers may not allow water to be taken from their service pipes by persons not entitled to a supply.

39. Any person having a service pipe to a water main, who wilfully permits any other person not entitled to a supply of water from the Director of Public Works to take water from such service pipe, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Licensing of plumbers.

40. Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Director of Public Works, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Director of Public Works, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Director of Public Works, he shall obtain from the Director of Public Works a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid in connection with the supply of water to any lands or premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Such license shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Director of Public Works may see fit; and the Director of Public Works may at any time, at his discretion, cancel such license.

Deposit to be lodged.

Before any such license shall be granted by the Director of Public Works, the person applying for the same shall make application on the proper form, and shall satisfy the Director of Public Works that he is a competent plumber, and he shall, if the Director of Public Works think necessary, submit to a written and practical examination on the theory

and practice of plumbing work in a manner to be specified by the Director of Public Works. If the application be approved, the applicant shall, before the issue of the license, deposit a sum of Five pounds with the Superintendent, which shall be retained during the currency of the license as a security for the proper performance of all work done by the applicant in connection with the supply of water to lands and premises.

Bad work by plumbers may be made good work from deposit.

41. The Director of Public Works may deduct the amount of money required to make good any bad work done by the said licensed plumber or his employees from the Five pounds deposited by the said licensed plumber, who shall then be required to make good to the deposit the amount so deducted.

Inspection of work.

42. All work done on private lands or premises in connection with the water supply, whether such work consist in the laying and fixing of new services, or in the extension or alteration of existing services and fittings, may be inspected by the proper officer of the Director of Public Works. For this purpose the plumber executing such work is bound to give forty-eight hours' notice to the Superintendent, on the proper forms, of the plumber's intention to do such work, and shall describe on the forms the nature and extent of such work, and give full description thereof. In no case shall the water be turned on to any lands or premises where any such work shall have been executed until the said work shall have been inspected by the said officer, and certificated by him to be in strict accordance with these By-laws.

Plumbers may not interfere with any main of the water supply without permission.

43. Plumbers or their employees (who shall at all times be competent tradesmen) shall not, on any occasion, without the permission of the Director of Public Works or his Superintendent, interfere with any main nor with any stop-cock or fitting or any main connected with the Water Supply within the three Municipalities.

Expense incurred by reason of infraction of By-laws to be borne by person responsible for such infraction.

44. Whenever the Director of Public Works, by reason of an infraction of these By-laws, is put to any expense, he may recover the costs of all repairs, shutting off, disconnecting, re-connecting, or other work, from the consumer, who is, according to the Acts and By-laws regulating the water supply within the three Municipalities, primarily responsible for said infraction of the By-laws; and the said Director may, without prejudice to his right to levy and collect water rates for any period from the consumer, refuse to continue the supply to the premises occupied by the consumer, at the time the aforesaid expense may have been incurred, until the consumer has paid the said costs.

Officer or inspector may enter houses.

45. An officer, acting by authority of the Director of Public Works, may, at all reasonable hours, enter into any house or premises supplied with water by the Director of Public Works, in order to examine if there be any waste or misuse of water; and, if he be refused such admission, or prevented from making such examination, he may turn off from such house or premises the water supplied by the Director of Public Works, without any notice whatsoever, until permission shall have been given to enter.

Supply and use of water open to inspection.

46. The supply and use of water, whether by meter or otherwise, shall be open to inspection and admeasurement whenever required; and such information must, from time to time, be afforded as will be sufficient to enable the Director of Public Works to obtain satisfactory account of the quantity of water actually consumed, and of the pipes, taps, cisterns, and other apparatus and conveniences for receiving and delivering such water.

Director of Public Works may discontinue supply.

47. Any person who (1), not having from the Director of Public Works a supply of water for other than domestic purposes, uses for other than domestic purposes any water supplied to him by the Director of Public Works, or (2) having from the Director of Public Works a supply of water for any other than domestic purposes, uses for any purposes other than those for which he is entitled to use the same shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, without prejudice to the right of the Director of Public Works to recover from him the value of the water misused.

Penalty.

48. Any person committing a breach of any of these By-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds when the amount of such penalty is not hereinbefore specified; and, in case of a continuing offence, a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Director of Public Works to such offender, and one moiety of such penalty shall be paid to the informer and the other moiety to the Director of Public Works.

FREMANTLE WATER SUPPLY.

An Agreement made this _____ day of _____, 19____, between the Director of Public Works, of the one part, and _____ of _____ (hereinafter styled the consumer), of the other part. The said Director of Public Works agrees to supply water to the said consumer at his premises situated at _____ upon the terms hereinafter contained:—

1. All water supplied to the said consumer shall be supplied through a previously-tested and registered meter, which shall be provided by the Director of Public Works, and which the consumer shall have the right of purchasing at a price to be fixed by the Director of Public Works. The said consumer hereby agrees to pay all fees and charges as provided in the By-laws, and the said Director of Public Works hereby agrees to have the said meter read at least once in every six months, and as near the end of each year as is practicable, during the currency of this Agreement.

2. The said consumer hereby agrees with the Director of Public Works that he, the said consumer, will pay to the Director of Public Works the sum of _____ for each and every one thousand gallons of water, and so on in proportion for less than one thousand gallons, which, according to the said meter, shall be supplied to the said consumer, provided that the said consumer shall pay a minimum charge of 5s., exclusive of rent of meter. The consumer shall be entitled to have supplied to him every half-year, during the continuation of this agreement, the quantity of one thousand gallons of water for every _____ paid on account of the water rate levied by the Director of Public Works under Section 8 of "The Fremantle Water Supply Act, 1899," and so on in proportion for any less period than one half-year.

3. The said Director of Public Works and all officers, workmen, and servants employed by him shall have full right and liberty to enter upon the said premises from time to time at all reasonable hours for the purpose of fixing the said meter and keeping the same in repair and proper working order and of taking the register thereof, and the Director of Public Works shall also have the right of removing the same at the termination of this Agreement unless the meter shall have been previously purchased. In the event of the meter reader not being able to take the register of the meter in any month, or for a succession of months, in consequence of the ordinary means of ingress to the premises being fastened or otherwise, the consumption during such period shall be taken and deemed to have been equal to that of the corresponding period of the preceding year, or if there be no such corresponding period the charge made will be based on the average consumption of water per head within the three Municipalities at the time, and on the number of people resident and working on the premises of which the consumer is the occupier or owner.

4. The said consumer hereby agrees to keep the said meter properly protected from all accident or damage, and in the event of any repairs being required the said consumer will immediately give notice to the said Director of Public Works.

5. Except as hereinbefore provided, the quantity of water which shall be registered by the said meter as having been supplied shall be taken as the quantity actually supplied. If the said consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of the said meter, and shall be desirous to have the same tested, he shall give written notice to the officer in charge within seven days from receiving written notice of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested, by passing through it into a vessel of known capacity sufficient water to fill such vessel; and if, upon such testing, it shall appear that the said meter registered more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Director of Public Works will bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and will also allow to the said consumer a proportionate rebate upon the quantity of water which shall be objected to as registered to have passed through the said meter as aforesaid; but if the meter, upon such testing, shall not register more than the quantity that shall have actually passed through it, then the consumer shall pay to the said Director of Public Works, in addition to the sums hereinbefore agreed to be paid by him, all expenses of and incidental to such a testing; provided that the cost of each and every test shall be fixed by the said Director of Public Works, and shall in no case exceed the sum of twenty shillings; provided, also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the said right to test the said meter for any three months other than those next preceding his giving written notice to the said Director of Public Works of his dissatisfaction and desire to have the said meter tested as aforesaid.

6. The said Director of Public Works shall not be responsible for any stoppage of the water supply for any purpose whatever or for any accident, inconvenience, or damage which may be occasioned thereby, and no claim shall be made on the Director of Public Works on such account, nor shall this agreement in any respect be invalidated thereby.

7. The said Director of Public Works may, at his discretion, at any time terminate this agreement, signifying such termination by notice, in writing, to the consumer.

8. In addition to the liabilities of the said consumer under the preceding clauses, he shall continue to pay the said Director of Public Works at the rate aforesaid for water used upon the said premises after the said consumer shall have ceased to occupy the same, unless on his so ceasing to occupy he has given written notice to the Director of Public Works of a desire to be released from this agreement.

9. All the powers, rights, and remedies which are vested in the Director of Public Works by the Fremantle Water Supply Act shall remain in full force and virtue, unprejudiced and unaffected by this agreement, or any clause, matter, or thing herein contained.

Appendix No. 1 to By-laws made under the
Fremantle Water Supply Act, 1899.

Attention is drawn to the following Extracts from Acts of Parliament governing the Fremantle Water Supply. (Note: For "Council or Contractors" read "Director of Public Works.")

CLAUSE 20.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

What is domestic supply.

A supply of water for domestic purposes shall include a supply for one water closet and one bath, but shall not include a supply for cattle or for horses or for any steam engine or for washing carriages, where such horses or carriages are kept for hire or are the property of any dealer, or for any hotel, inn, trade manufacturer, or business whatever, or for watering gardens or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose.

CLAUSE 22.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

Power to supply by measure.

The Council or Contractors may supply any person with water for other than domestic purposes by measure at such prices and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the Council or Contractors and the person desirous of having the supply, and may compel any person supplied with water to take the same by measure at the same price and upon the same terms as water is then supplied by the Council or Contractors to other consumers.

CLAUSE 26.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

Laying of communication pipe.

Save in the cases provided for in the next preceding section, the Council or Contractors, on receiving from the owner or occupier of lands or premises in any street in which a main pipe has been laid down a written request for a constant supply of water for domestic purposes, shall provide and lay down to the edge of the same street nearest to such premises, and fix in readiness for use, and shall thereafter, at the like request, on receiving due notice in that behalf, keep in repair communication pipes and other fittings, and do such other acts and construct such works as the Council or Contractors shall deem necessary and proper for complying with and carrying out such request. The Council or Contractors may in like manner and under like circumstances provide, lay down, and fix pipes for supplying water by measure to any person entitled thereto under any agreement.

CLAUSE 33.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

No pipe or fitting to be connected or disconnected or altered without consent of Council or Contractors.

It shall not be lawful for the owner or occupier of any premises supplied with water, or any consumer of the water, or any other person to affix, or cause or permit to be affixed, any pipe, fitting, or apparatus, to a pipe belonging to or used by such owner or occupier, consumer, or any other person, or to make any addition to or alteration in any such communication or service pipe, fitting, or apparatus connected therewith, without the consent, in every such case, of the Council or Contractors: And if any person acts in any respect in contravention of the provisions of the present section, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without prejudice to the right of the Council or Contractors to recover damages from him in respect of any injury done to their property, and to the right to recover from him the value of any water wasted or misused.

CLAUSE 35.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

Power to enter and examine if water is wasted, etc., and if fittings in order.

Any officer of or person authorised by the Council or Contractors may, at all reasonable times, enter upon any lands and into any premises to which water is supplied by the Council or Contractors under agreement, or otherwise for the purpose of examining and ascertaining, and may examine and ascertain whether there has been or is any waste, misuse, fouling, or contamination of such water, and what quantity of water has been consumed there, and whether all baths, water-closets, soil-pans, receptacles, and fittings, and the materials and mode of arrangement thereof, used or intended to be used on or in such lands or premises for the purpose of conveying, delivering, or receiving water supplied or about to be supplied, are in every respect in accordance with the By-laws made under this Act and are in proper order and repair, and that they are used only for the purposes for which they may be lawfully used under this Act. If any bath, water-closet, soil-pan, receptacle, or fitting, shall on such examination be found to be out of

repair, or the mode or arrangement thereof not in accordance with such By-laws, the Council or Contractors may, without prejudice to any other power or remedy which they have under this Act, give notice to the occupier or owner of such land or premises to repair or alter the same; and if any such occupier or owner shall fail or neglect to comply with such notice, or if any officer of, or person authorised by the Council or Contractors, be at any reasonable time refused admission upon such lands or into such premises where such admission is claimed for any of the purposes mentioned in this section, or be obstructed in or hindered from doing all or any of the acts by this section authorised to be done, the Council or Contractors may cut off the water from such lands and premises, and shall not be bound to supply water thereto again, except at such times and upon such conditions (including payment of the expenses of cutting off and restoring such water) as the Council or Contractors shall think proper to prescribe; but the owner or occupier of such lands or premises shall nevertheless continue liable to pay water rates as before.

CLAUSE 40.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

Penalty for wasting water, not repairing fittings, etc.

If any person supplied with water by the Council or Contractors wastes any water or wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pan, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be so used or contrived that the water supplied to him by the Council or Contractors is or is likely to be wasted, misused, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noisome or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Council or Contractors, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

CLAUSE 42.—THE WATERWORKS ACT, 1889.

Penalty for unlawfully taking water.

If any person, not being supplied with water by the Council or Contractors, wrongfully takes or uses any water from any reservoir, watercourse, conduit, or pipe belonging to the Council or Contractors, or from any pipe leading to or from any such reservoir, watercourse, conduit, or pipe, or from any cistern or other like place containing water belonging to the Council or Contractors, or supplied by them for the use of any consumer, he shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

CLAUSE 227.—MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT, 1895.

Service of Notices.

Whenever under this Act any written, printed, or special form of notice is required to be served on or given to the owner or occupier of any building or land, such notice, addressed to the owner or occupier thereof as such as the case may require, may be served on the occupier of such building or land, by leaving the same with some inmate of his abode, or by posting such notice in a registered letter addressed to such owner or occupier, or, if there is no occupier then resident there, by affixing the notice on some conspicuous part of such building or land, and by posting the same by registered letter to the owner or occupier to the address as appears by the rate-book; and it shall not be necessary in any such notice to name the occupier or the owner of any such building or land; and when the owner of any such building or land and his residence are known, the council may, if such owner as aforesaid is residing within its jurisdiction, cause every notice required to be given to the owner to be served on such owner by leaving the same with some inmate of his abode; and, if such owner is not resident within its jurisdiction, the council shall send every such notice by post, addressed to the last known place of residence of such owner.

CLAUSE 9.—FREMANTLE WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1899.

Premises to be subject to water rate when main laid within 60 yards.

Water rates under this Act shall be paid in respect of all lands and premises within sixty yards from which a main pipe has been or shall be laid down; and when the Director of Public Works has published in the *Government Gazette* a notice that such main pipe has been laid down there, and that he is prepared to distribute a constant supply of water therefrom to the lands and premises situate within sixty yards thereof, such lands and premises shall be deemed to be supplied with water under this Act from and after the expiration of seven days from such publication. The water rate shall be payable in advance from the period which shall elapse between the first day of whatever month shall next follow the expiration of such seven days and the thirty-first day of December then following, and thereafter the rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and first day of July in every year, subject to the provisions of this Act and to any By-laws made thereunder.

CLAUSE 11.—FREMANTLE WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1899.

Ingoing occupier to pay rates in arrear and (if not the owner) receive the amount from owner.

Every person who enters into occupation of lands or premises, though not being the owner thereof, shall be liable to pay all water rates then due in respect thereof, and, if not the owner, shall, after such payment, be entitled to recover from the owner the sum so paid, or to deduct them from or set them off against any sum due or coming due from such occupier to the owner.

Appendix No. 2 to By-laws made under the Fremantle Water Supply Act, 1899.

NOTICES.

Administration and local management.

1. It is hereby notified that the Engineer for Metropolitan Sewerage and Water Supply is empowered to administer and regulate on my behalf the affairs of the Fremantle Water Supply, and that the Superintendent at Fremantle is in charge of the local management of the aforesaid affairs within the Municipalities of Fremantle, East Fremantle, and North Fremantle.

Recovery of rates.

2. It is hereby notified that, if the water rate remain unpaid for seven days after the serving, in accordance with Clause 227 of "Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," of a notice that such rate is payable, proceedings at law will then be taken to recover the amount; and if the ratable lands or premises are connected with a water main, the supply will be cut off until such rates are paid.

Printed forms of application supplied at Superintendent's office.—Fees to be prepaid.

3. Printed forms of application for work to be done in accordance with the By-laws or Acts of Parliament regulating the Fremantle Water Supply will be supplied at the office of the Superintendent, and any fees required in connection with such work are required to be lodged with the Superintendent at the time of making such application.

This month was a remarkably wet one in coastal districts between Geraldton and Eucla. Not only was the amount registered considerably in excess of the average, but the actual duration of rain was much greater than usual. In August the fall is as a rule confined principally to these districts, with only light showers on the Goldfields and farther North, but this month there was a succession of "lows" owing one upon the heels of another, leaving only very short intervals of fine weather between. At Perth there were only four days on which rain was not recorded, whilst in the extreme South-West it rained every day throughout the month except on the 31st. On the Goldfields and North of Geraldton the fall was as usual light, and in the tropics it was fine throughout.

The climate maps show that the isotherm of 40° for mean minimum night temperature has moved from its usual position between Kalbarrie and Southern Cross to the North Coolgardie Goldfields, and the terrestrial radiation thermometers have indicated several low readings, absolute minimum being 21.1 at Southern Cross, on the 8th.

At Perth the mean atmospheric pressure was considerably below the average for previous years. The mean temperature was about an average, but the diurnal range was considerably less than usual, the mean maximum being 2.8° below, and the mean minimum 2.7° above the corresponding quantities for previous years. The rainfall for August was 216 points above the average, and the total since the beginning of the year shows an excess of 369 points.

Every foreign company, or the attorney of every foreign company, carrying on business in this Colony shall, in the case of companies carrying on business therein at the time of the passing of this Act, within two calendar months from such time, and, as to all other companies so carrying on business at any time after the passing of this Act, within two calendar months from the deposit in the office of the Registrar of the power of attorney, in accordance with Section One hundred and ninety-eight of "The Companies Act, 1893," open, keep, and maintain, or cause to be opened, kept, and maintained, at the registered office of the said company in the Colony, a Register of Shareholders under this Act, to be called a Colonial Register, for the registration of all shareholders in such company who may apply in writing to such attorney to be registered therein.

Every such register shall be kept in the manner provided by Part III. of "The Companies Act, 1893," and transfers shall be effected on such register in the same manner and at the same charges as on the register kept at the head office of the company, and transfers lodged in the colonial office of the company shall be binding upon the company, and the Court shall be entitled to exercise the same jurisdiction of rectifying the same as is by Section Thirty-six of the said Act vested in such Court with respect to a register of a company incorporated in the Colony.
