W HEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), the Governor is em-1899 " powered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette-

1. To make regulations prescribing the length, width, and meshes of nets, whether generally or for certain places or times :

AND WHEREAS fishing by a set net in portions of the Swan River (except during the months of January, February, March, and April in each year) is allowed : AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to regulate the length, width, and meshes of nets to be used in that portion of the Swan River extending from the Causeway Bridge to Upper Swan Bridge: Now THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation prescribe that the length and meshes of nets to be used in the capture of fish within the portion of Swan River aforesaid shall be as follows: - The mesh must not be less than three inches from corner to corner; to be measured from point to point when stretched out; the length of the net must not exceed 50 yards; two or more nets must not be coupled together, and a net must not be set across a deep water channel which does not exceed the length of the net allowed; no dragging or splashing to be allowed.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than $\pounds 20$, and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

B^Y virtue of the provisions of Section 110 of "The Health Act, 1898," His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby orders that the provisions contained in Section 111 of "The Health Act, 1898," for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, be put in force in Western Australia, and does hereby also make the following orders :-

That notice shall be given immediately by the 1. occupier of any house, premises, or place wherein there is any infectious or contagious disease, to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health for the District, and if there be no Local Board, then to the Secretary of the Central Board.

That entry may be made at all times to houses, buildings, and premises by Medical or other officers of local boards, or the Central Board, for the purpose of carrying out any regulations made by the Central Board, or of inquiring into and ascertaining the presence of such disease.

That infected bedding, clothing, and other 3. infected things shall be destroyed or disinfected.

4. That houses, schools, churches, places of assembly or entertainment, and other buildings and premises, shall be cleansed, purified, ventilated, and disinfected by the owners or occupiers thereof, or by medical or other officers of, or persons authorised thereto by the Local Board or the Central Board, at the expense of the owners or occupiers, or where necessary at the public expense.

5. That persons suffering from infectious or contagious diseases shall be removed to a hospital or other place which shall be deemed suitable or convenient by the Central Board, and shall be kept in such place until they are free from infection or contagion.

6. That all persons shall be forbidden and prevented from quitting or entering any house, premises, place, town, or district, which may be declared infected by the Governor in Council or other person or persons authorised by him, in accordance with Section 110 of "The Health Act, 1898," by notice published in accordance with that Section.

7. That the times, methods, and conditions of the burial of the dead shall be such as may be prescribed under any regulation made by the Central Board for this purpose under Section 111 of "The Health Act, 1898," and by virtue of this order.

8. That, in order to prevent the introduction and spreading of such diseases as aforesaid, by means of rats—

- (a.) In case of ships coming from any place or country where bubonic plague is known or suspected to exist, all rats on such ships shall be immediately destroyed.
- (b.) All rats in all stores, warehouses, and other buildings under the control of the Railway, Customs, and Harbours Departments, at the ports of the Colony, shall be destroyed.
- (c.) The Local Boards of Health at all the ports and towns of the Colony shall take the necessary steps to have the rats in such ports and towns destroyed.
- (d.) Complete precautions shall be taken to prevent rats coming ashore from all ships in any port of the Colony.
- (e.) The bodies of all rats taken, alive or dead, shall be destroyed by fire.
- (f.) An efficient staff shall be appointed to carry out the destruction of rats as aforesaid.
- (g.) A reward shall be offered for the bodies of rats captured at such ports as shall be named in the Regulations framed under this Order.

9. That all cargo from ships or vessels having touched at any port where bubonic plague is known or suspected to exist shall be disposed of and dealt with in such manner as the Medical Officer at such port may deem necessary; and all cargo consigned to Perth shall be dealt with at Fremantle in the same manner as cargo consigned to that port.

10. That as a further precaution as aforesaid, the landing of any articles or goods deemed by the Central Board to be liable to be infected may be prohibited or restricted by any regulation made by the Central Board, under Section 111 of "The Health Act, 1898," and by virtue of this order.

11. That these orders, made under Section 110 of "The Health Act, 1898," shall continue in force for one month from the date hereof, unless and until such orders may be revoked, altered, or varied in the meantime.

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W HEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in, and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve $\stackrel{A}{6618}$ Gingin (Recreation) should vest in and be held by the Council and Burgesses of the Town of Gingin: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Council and Burgesses of the Town of Gingin, with power to the said Council and Burgesses of the Town of Gingin to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

Beer Duty Act, 1898.

Regulations.

His Excellency the Administrator. The Honourables— The Colonial Treasurer, The Minister for Lands, The Minister of Mines, The Attorney General, The Colonial Secretary, The Commissioner of Railways.

W HEREAS by "The Beer Duty Act, 1898," it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for all or any of the purposes of the said Act, or for making allowances for drawback, or for spoiled stamps, or for beer which has become wasted, spoiled, or unfit for use, or for the disposal of damaged beer, or for altering the form of the Second and Third Schedules to the said Act, and that any such Regulations may prescribe penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach thereof: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Administrator of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

Regulations under Beer Duty Act.

1. The duty of carrying out the provisions of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall, subject to the instructions of the Minister, devolve upon the Collector of Customs.

2. The bond to be entered into by every brewer, in accordance with the seventh section of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall be in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule to these regulations.

3. On all beer contained in vessels not specified or enumerated in section four of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, duty shall be paid on the actual number of gallons capable of being held in such vessel, but no brewer shall sell or remove from his brewery any beer in vessels other than those specified or enumerated in the said section, or in any vessels other than those approved of by the Minister under section eight of the said Act.

4. One of the books required to be kept under the ninth and tenth sections of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall be in the form or to the effect in the Second Schedule in these regulations.

5. The statements to be rendered monthly, in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh section of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall be in the form or to the effect in the Third Schedule to these regulations; and such statements shall be accompanied by a declaration in the form or to the effect in the Third Schedule to these regulations, and shall be signed by the brewer, or in the case of a company by the manager, managing director, secretary, or principal officer thereof.

6. Permits granted under the twentieth section of the Act, will be supplied by the Collector of Customs, Fremantle, on the written application of the brewer, and shall be in the form and to the effect in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.

7. Every permit granted as aforesaid shall be securely fixed upon the head of every vessel containing the beer proposed to be removed under such permit, and shall not be cancelled or destroyed until such beer is removed from the depôt, warehouse, or other building to which the same has been removed.

8. A duplicate permit shall be issued to the brewer, and on the removal of the vessel he shall write across such duplicate permit the words "removed accordingly." Such duplicate permit shall be returned to the Collector of Customs in such manner as may be directed by him. Any brewer not returning to the Collector of Customs, or not producing any duplicate permit when required by the Collector, shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.

9. Every brewer shall, before any beer is sold or removed from his brewery, mark or cause to be marked upon every vessel containing such beer the name or initials of the brewer by or for whom such beer was brewed, or, in the case of a company, the name of the company by whom such beer was brewed. And every brewer shall, before any beer is sold or removed from his brewery, mark or cause to be marked upon every vessel a distinguishing number. Any brewer who shall mark or cause to be marked any two or more vessels with the same number shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.

10. When beer is being delivered or forwarded from any brewery, it must be accompanied by a cart note, and a duplicate cart note, upon each of which the words "duly stamped" shall be written or printed in red ink, and signed by the person to whom the beer is delivered. The cart note shall be handed to the person to whom the beer is delivered, and the duplicate shall be retained by the brewer.

11. No beer shall be removed from any brewery except between the hours of five o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening of the same day between the months of October and April, both inclusive, and between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of the same day between the months of May and September, both inclusive.

12. The written notice required to be given to the Collector of Customs, or other officer, under the twenty-eighth section of the said Act, shall be given twenty-four hours before the beer intended to be purchased as therein mentioned shall be removed; and no brewer shall remove beer purchased as aforesaid without giving such notice, or before the expiration of the time herein limited.

13. Whenever any malt or tun liquor in the first stages of fermentation, known as fermenting worts, of whatever kind shall be sold, as mentioned in the twenty-ninth section of the said Act, such unfermented worts shall not be removed except between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of the same day, nor until twenty-

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four hours' notice in writing has been given to the Collector of Customs, or other duly appointed officer, of the intention to remove the same, stating therein the brewery from which and to which such worts are to be removed.

14. In addition to the books required to be kept by brewers under the Beer Duty Act 1898, there shall be also kept at each brewery a book in the form or to the effect in the Fifth Schedule to these regulations, in which shall be entered the date of delivery, number, and contents of each vessel, also the name and address of the person to whom sent or delivered; and such book shall be open at all reasonable hours in the day time to the inspection of the Collector or other duly appointed officer, who may take extracts therefrom or transcripts thereof.

15. The duplicate statement mentioned in the eleventh section of the said Act shall be forwarded to the Collector of Customs, Fremantle.

Every person who shall commit a breach of 16^{-1} these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £2 and not exceeding £50.

High School Scholarships.

Education Department,

Perth, 12th September, 1900. T is hereby notified, for general information, that an examination for High School Scholarships will be held on November 1 and 2. The Regulations governing these examinations are appended hereunder.

> CYRIL JACKSON, Inspector General of Schools.

REGULATIONS.

1. Three Scholarships of the value of £50 each per annum, tenable for three years, are annually offered for boys and girls attending Government or other efficient primary schools.

2. Candidates for these Scholarships must-

- (a.) Be over eleven and not more than thirteen years of age on the 1st October of the year in which the examination for the Scholarships is held.
- (b.) Have attended one or more of the Government or other efficient primary schools of the Colony continuously for at least two years immediately preceding the above-named 1st October, and have made not less than three hundred half-day attendances (unless prevented by illness) in such school or schools during their last school year.

(c.) Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the head teacher of the last school attended.

3. The Scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department,

No candidate is eligible for a Scholarship who fails 4. to obtain a minimum of two-thirds of the maximum number of marks.

5. Application for admission to the Scholarship examina-tion must be made on the prescribed form to the Education Department on or before the 1st October of each year.

6. The conditions upon which the Scholarships are tenable are :-

- (a.) That the successful scholar shall, at the commence-ment of the first term following the award of the Scholarship, become a pupil at a school in which higher education, as approved by the Minister, is given. The Minister may require that the school be inspected before his approval is given.
- (b.) That he shall continue to attend such school, and must, at the end of each term, obtain from the authorities of the school, and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct and attendance have been satisfactory. If an unfavourable report is received, or if at any time his conduct be disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and the advantages connected therewith shall, with the consent of the Governor, thereupon cease and determine.

The schools of higher education at which these Scholarships are tenable cannot themselves send any candidates for the Scholarships, which are, as stated above, offered for scholars attending primary schools.

8. The subjects of examination will be:—Arithmetic (200 marks); English (100 marks); History (100 marks); Geography (100 marks); Dictation and Writing (100 marks); Reading (50 marks); and Drawing (100 marks).

The examination will be on the course as laid down for Standard V. in the Regulations for the curriculum of the Government Schools.

Under special circumstances arrangements might be made for examining candidates locally, but the examination will, as a rule, be held in Perth, and candidates will be expected to attend there.

The Exhibitions will be divided into Senior and Junior Classes.

Five Senior Exhibitions of the value of £25 each, tenable for one year, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 16 and 18 years, and five Junior Exhibitions of the value of £15 each, tenable for a similar period, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 14 and 16 years.

The course of examination for seniors and juniors will be, respectively, that laid down for Senior and Junior Adelaide University Examinations.

Candidates must not be less than 14 or more than 18 years of age on the 1st day of November in the year in which the examination is held.

The examination will be held in Perth, and will commence on the 19th November.

A preliminary examination will be held by the Department on the 16th and 17th of October, in the following subjects :-

English English Composition Arithmetic Dictation.

The Department will pay the fees for the first ten junior candidates and for the first six senior candidates who pass the preliminary examination.

Candidates who qualify will be required to produce baptismal certificate, or satisfactory proof of age, before the Exhibition or Certificate is issued.

Applications for admission to the examinations must be made on the prescribed forms, which may now be obtained from the Education Department. Applications will not be received after 13th October.

The weather was fairly seasonable on the whole. In the extreme South-West and South it was unusually wet, but elsewhere the rainfall was about the same as the mean for previous years. There were no continuous periods of wet weather, but the usual alternations of sun and showers, the latter being mostly confined to the coastal districts. About the 20th an anti-cyclone commenced to form over the Southern portions of the Colony, giving some very cold, frosty weather. The maximum pressure occurred on the 22nd and 23rd, after which the temperature rose steadily as the anti-cyclone receded Eastwards, reaching the unusual height of 87.6 in the Perth Gardens on the 28th, a reading that has only once been exceeded in September since records commenced in 1876. Some rather low temperatures were recorded on the surface of the ground, the minima being :--
