On behalf of His Excellency the Honourable Sir ARTHUR LAWLEY, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia, and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any town or locality containing ratable property yielding, upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of three hundred pounds, to be a Municipality, and to declare the population of the locality so to be proclaimed: AND WHEREAS a Petition has been presented to His Excellency Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Administrator of the Government of the State of Western Australia, praying that the town of Collie might be proclaimed a Municipality, signed by not fewer than fifty of the inhabitants of the said Town of Collie, who would, upon the incorporation thereof, be liable to be assessed for municipal taxes in respect of land or household residence within the said proposed Municipality: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of April, 1901: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the Town of Collie (hereinafter described) contains ratable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: Now THEREFORE I, Edward Albert Stone, Governor's Deputy, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the said Town of Collie to be over one thousand: AND I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation declare and proclaim it to be a Municipality under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Coun-

cillors of Collie," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the East corner of M.L. 87 and extending 287° 31' 75 chains to its North corner; thence 197° 27' 30" 85 chains 35 links along the Western boundaries of said M.L. 87 and M.L. 90 to the East corner of M.L. 94; thence 287° 30' 75 chains to its North corner; thence 197° 29' 82 chains 64 links, passing along the Western boundary of said M.L. 94 and part of M.L. 97 to the right bank of the South branch of the Collie River, and along it and the right bank of the Collie River downwards to the latter's intersection with the East boundary of M.L. 111; thence North 139 chains 7 links, passing along part of the said East boundary of M.L. 111 and the East boundary of M.L.'s 112 and 113 to the latter's North-East corner; thence 285° 53' 31 chains 23 links and 273° 10' 70 chains 7 $\frac{1}{10}$ links along the Northern boundaries of M.L.'s 113 and 114 to the latter's North-West corner; thence North 11 chains 36 $\frac{1}{10}$ links; thence 67° 22' 30" 238 chains 45 $\frac{1}{10}$ links to the right bank of the Collie River aforesaid, and along it downwards to a point situate West of survey mark T28; thence East through said Survey mark T28 about 132 chains; and thence 197° 31' 105 chains 31 links to the starting point.

Excluding, however, the area within the following boundaries:—

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the Northern side of Christie Street with the Eastern side of Wilson Street, and extending 197° 29' 22 chains 21 $\frac{1}{10}$ links; thence 287° 29' 19 chains along the Southern side of Coombes Street; thence 197° 28' 11 chains 75 links along the Eastern side of Paul Street; thence 287° 29' about 64 chains to the right bank of the Collie River, and along said side of river upwards to a point in prolongation North-Westerly of the Northern side of Christie Street aforesaid, and thence 107° 31' along the said side of street to the starting point.

The Proclamations dated the 16th day of January, and the 8th day of May, 1901, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th January and 10th May, respectively, are hereby rescinded.

The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Director of Public Works, under Section 6 of "The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898."

By-Laws under "The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898."

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898," the Director of Public Works has the power and authority of a Local Board of Health for the purpose of making and enforcing By-laws for preventing pollution of the waters within the

catchment area of the Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply: NOW THEREFORE, by virtue and in exercise of such powers, I, the Hon. Barrington Clarke Wood, Director of Public Works, do hereby make the following By-laws, to come into operation within the said area from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms "Cesspool," "Drain," "Earth-closet," "House," "Land," "Owner," "Person," "Piggery," and "Slaughter-house" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1898."

"Catchment Area" shall mean and include the area of land defined in Section 3 of "The Coolgardie Goldfields Water Supply Construction Act, 1898."

"High Water Mark" shall mean the highest point on either bank of any watercourse to which the water of such watercourse has risen, or may, owing to the construction of the Helena Weir or other works incidental thereto, at any time rise.

"Inspector" shall mean an Inspector appointed by the Director of Public Works for the purposes of "The Health Act, 1898," and amendments thereof, and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 1.

All existing cesspools within the catchment area shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within one calendar month after notice, in writing, to that effect shall have been given on behalf of the Director of Public Works to the occupier or owner of the premises concerned.

BY-LAW No. 2.

The owner or occupier of every house shall, within one calendar month after the publication of these By-laws in the *Government Gazette*, provide for the use of the occupants of such house an earth closet with a sufficient number of pans approved by the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Every closet (which shall be of stone, iron, wood, brick, or combination of two or more of such materials) shall be so constructed as to effectively screen from observation all persons using the same. Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter, which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the size, shape, style, and materials approved by the Director of Public Works, and every pan shall be emptied and cleansed once every week, or as often as may be required by the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 4.

No closet or urinal shall be constructed within fifty feet of any house, or within one hundred and fifty yards of high water mark, and any closet or urinal which is situated within these respective distances shall, within one calendar month after notice to remove the same has been given, in writing, on behalf of the Director of Public Works, to the owner or occupier of the premises concerned, be taken down or removed by and at the cost of such owner or occupier; and the floor and seat of every closet shall be so constructed that the top of the receptacle shall not be more than one inch below the lower surface of the seat.

BY-LAW No. 5.

No owner or occupier shall permit the contents of any pan used in any closet or urinal to overflow from any cause whatever.

BY-LAW No. 6.

No owner or occupier of any house shall permit any closet or urinal, or pan appertaining thereto or used by the occupants of such house, to become offensive or a nuisance, and every such owner or occupier whenever directed, either verbally or in writing, by the Inspector shall properly and effectively empty and cleanse such closet, urinal, or pan to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 7.

No person shall place or deposit or spread, or permit to be placed, deposited or spread, in or upon any land or garden within the catchment area, any nightsoil or any human urine, whether mixed with any other substances or not, or

any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and unless the written consent of the Director of Public Works, subject to any regulations the Central Board may make, has been obtained.

BY-LAW No. 8.

No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited any faecal matter, refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter in or near any watercourse, or within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any watercourse.

BY-LAW No. 9.

No stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house shall be erected or constructed within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in such a position that storm waters may wash any manure or refuse therefrom into any watercourse. Every such structure situated elsewhere within the catchment area shall have attached thereto, for liquid and solid manure, a water-tight receptacle approved by the Inspector. Land sloping to a watercourse on which any such structure stands shall be excavated to a depth of at least twelve inches, and the soil so obtained shall be used as an embankment around the area so excavated. Such work shall be done by and at the expense of the owner or occupier of such premises.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Every stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, fowl-house and piggery situated within three hundred yards of high water mark, or in such position that storm waters may wash any manure or other refuse therefrom into any watercourse shall, within one calendar month after the publication of these By-laws in the *Government Gazette*, be cleansed by the owner or occupier to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and shall be no longer used for housing animals, and shall be taken down and removed by and at the expense of such owner or occupier if and when the Director of Public Works so directs.

BY-LAW No. 11.

The owner or occupier of any stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house shall not allow any dung, manure or other refuse to accumulate in or near such premises, but shall periodically remove or dispose of the same in such manner that it cannot pollute any water flowing, or which may flow, into any watercourse, and generally to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 12.

The Inspector may, by written notice to the owner or occupier of any stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house, order the removal and disposal of any dung, manure, or other refuse from such premises and fix the periods within which such dung, manure, or other refuse shall be removed and disposed of; and any person omitting to comply with such notice to the satisfaction of the Inspector, within three days after such notice shall have been issued, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and liable to penalties imposed for breach thereof.

BY-LAW No. 13.

No animal shall be stabled, housed, or yarded within 300 yards of high water mark.

BY-LAW No. 14.

No person shall allow any horse, cattle, sheep, goat, duck, goose, fowl, or other species of live stock to stray over any land reserved or set apart for the purposes of the Coolgardie Water Scheme, without the written permission of the Director of Public Works or of some person acting with his authority.

BY-LAW No. 15.

No person shall keep any swine in any part of the catchment area.

BY-LAW No. 16.

No person shall establish or carry on, without the consent in writing of the Director of Public Works, any abattoir or slaughter-house in any part of the catchment area.

BY-LAW No. 17.

In the event of the death, or of any accident necessitating the slaughter, of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcass of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance from high water mark, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and disposed of to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 18.

No person shall deposit, or cause or permit to be deposited, any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, soap suds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter, in any part of the catchment area whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm water into any watercourse.

BY-LAW No. 19.

No person shall allow any filth, rubbish, blood, offal, manure, or any slops, soap suds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter, to flow or escape from any house or premises owned or occupied by him.

BY-LAW No. 20.

No person shall bathe or wash clothes or other articles in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks within the catchment area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal; or throw, or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein, any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing.

BY-LAW No. 21.

It shall be lawful for the Inspector (or other authorised officer), at his discretion, at any reasonable hour, with or without notice, to enter any house or premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether any act or thing is being done or permitted within such house or premises in breach of these By-laws; and to remove, or cause to be removed, anything therein or thereon in breach of these By-laws, or to take such steps as he may deem necessary for carrying out these provisions; the cost of such removal, or such other necessary act, shall be borne by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which such breach shall occur.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Director of Public Works, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such persons, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898," Sections 35 and 242, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recoverable as provided in "The Health Act, 1898;" provided always that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

WHEREAS by Sections 34 and 38 of "The Health Act, 1898," every Local Board of Health is empowered to make By-laws for the purpose of (*inter alia*) prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pig-wash and other filthy matter: And whereas by Section 35 of the said Act such Local Board of Health is authorised by any such By-laws to impose penalties as therein mentioned for every breach thereof: Now the Council of the

Municipality of Subiaco, acting as the Local Board of Health for the said Municipality, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

1. No person shall remove any pig-wash or other filthy matter, unless such pig-wash or other filthy matter be carried in a securely covered water-tight vessel, barrel, cask, tank, or other suitable receptacle, so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any of its contents, or of any offensive, noxious, or injurious effluvia.

2. Every vessel, barrel, cask, tank, or other receptacle as aforesaid used for the reception and removal of any pig-wash or other filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage thereof, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. No pig-wash or other filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and six o'clock in the afternoon, except by permission of the Local Board of Health.

4. Any person guilty of any offence against these By-laws shall be liable for every offence to a penalty of not less than Five shillings and not exceeding Ten pounds.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under Sections 153 and 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the leasing of any Town or Suburban Lands which may be declared open for selection as Residential Leases:—

1. An application for a lease of town or suburban land declared open for selection as a Residential Lease shall be made in the form of Schedule "A."

2. The applicant shall be a male person above the age of 18 years, not being an Asiatic or African alien; or a female, not being an Asiatic or African alien, who is above the age of 18 years and the sole head of a family.

3. Applications shall be made to the Minister for Lands, but shall be lodged at the office of the Land Agent of the District within which the land is situate, or in case the land is situate within a Goldfield, then at the office of the Warden of such Goldfield, and shall be transmitted to the Minister by the Land Agent or Warden with his recommendation thereon.

4. Applications shall take priority in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of "The Land Act, 1898," and Section 2 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1900."

5. Every application shall set forth the number, position, and area of the lot applied for, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form of Schedule "B."

6. A fee of 10s. shall be payable with every application, in addition to the rent, at the rate of 10s. per annum, as provided in Section 10 following.

7. The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.

8. On an application being approved by the Minister, a lease shall be granted in the form of Schedule "D."

9. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and of so much of the land below the natural surface to a depth of 40 feet, if situate within a Goldfield or Mining District, and to a depth of 2,000ft. in respect to all other lands.

10. Every lease shall be granted for a term not to exceed 21 years, at the rent of 10s. per annum, payable in advance, as prescribed by Section 136 of "The Land Act, 1898," the first payment to be made with the application. At the expiration of the said term, the Lessee shall have a preferential right of renewal for a further period of 21 years, on the terms and conditions prescribed by any Act or Regulations in force for the time being, should the land demised not be required by the Government.

11. Every Town or Suburban Lot leased under these Regulations shall be taken possession of within one month of the approval of the application for the same, and shall be used as the habitual abode of the Lessee, or some member of his family, for at least nine months in every year, and shall not be used for any business purpose, or for any purpose other than that of residence.

12. Any Town or Suburban Lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, or any portion thereof, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes, or for any public purpose, at three months' notice to the Lessee, published in the *Government Gazette*; and immediately after the expiration of such three months, all the estate and interest of the Lessee in the land demised, or the portion resumed, as the case may be, shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted: Provided that, on any such resumption, the Lessee shall be entitled to receive from the Minister the fair value of any improvements existing on the said land, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the Lessee and one by the Minister; any difference of opinion between the said Valuers to be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.

13. In case of the refusal by the Minister of any application, notice thereof shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to the address given in the application, and the fee paid on the application and the deposit of rent shall thereupon be returned to the applicant on demand.

14. No person shall hold any Residential Lease within the distance of two miles from any other Residence Area or Residential Lease or Town or Suburban Lot held by him.

15. No Lessee shall transfer or underlet the premises demised by any lease, except with the consent of the Minister in writing first obtained, after production by the Lessee of the lease, and a statutory declaration by the transferee in the form of Schedule "B," and on payment of a fee of 5s.

16. No transfer or sub-letting of a lease shall be allowed until after the expiration of three months from the date on which the same was granted.

17. No transfer or underlease of any portion of the demised premises shall be approved on any conditions whatsoever.

18. The Governor may, at any time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, exempt from the operation of these Regulations any portion of any Town or Suburban Lands which may have been declared open for selection.

Alteration of Regulations re Reserved and Exempted Lands.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 99 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," has been pleased to repeal Regulations 166 to 178 inclusive, and to substitute the following Regulations in lieu thereof; to take effect from 1st May, 1901.

DIVISION X.—RESERVED AND EXEMPTED LANDS.

Application for Authority.

166. Application for authority to occupy reserved or exempted lands under the provisions of Section 23 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," shall be made in writing in the form of Schedule A, and forwarded through the Warden to the Minister; and such application shall be accompanied by a fee of Ten pounds, as prescribed by the Act, and by a plan showing (a) the locality, (b) the position in relation to the nearest sold or surveyed land, or in relation to some well-defined and fixed object, (c) the extent of the land applied for, and (d) the portion of the surface of the reserved land which the applicant will require to use.

Priority of application—how determined.

167. In the event of two or more applications being made for the same land, they shall be dealt with in the order of their receipt, and if any such applications shall be received on the same day the order of priority shall be determined in such manner as the Minister shall in each case direct.

Notices—how given.

168. As soon as possible after the receipt of any application as aforesaid, the Minister shall cause notice thereof to be posted at the Warden's Office and to be published in three consecutive issues of some newspaper circulating in the district wherein the land referred to is situate, and such notices shall name the date up to which objections to the applications may be lodged.

Inspection and Report.

169. As soon as possible after notice shall have been last published as aforesaid, the Minister shall cause instructions to be issued to some competent person to inspect the land applied for, and report to him whether the same may be occupied for mining without injury to, or obstruction to the enjoyment of reserved or exempted lands, the subject of the application, and whether the occupation of such land for mining purposes will, or will be likely to, injure any adjoining property, and may require such person to make an estimate of the cost of repairing any injury which may be done to any such reserved or exempted lands, or adjoining property.

Objections.

170. Any objection to the granting of the authority applied for may be lodged in the form of Schedule 28 by any person interested in opposing the same, at the Warden's Office, within thirty days of the receipt by the Minister of the application, and a copy of such objection shall be served on the applicant. Any such objection shall be dealt with in the manner provided by Regulation 89.

Applications may be refused.

171. If it shall appear from the report provided for in Regulation 169 that injury would or would probably be done to adjoining property by such mining operations, the Minister shall refuse to entertain such application unless and until the applicant shall have obtained the sanction or consent of the owner or owners of such property to the occupation for the purpose aforesaid, or until he has deposited a sum of money to cover the cost of repairing such injury, as provided by the next following regulation.

Deposit to cover cost of repairs.

172. In case it shall appear by the report aforesaid that injury would or would likely be done to any reserved or exempted land or adjoining property by such occupation for mining purposes, it shall be lawful for the Minister to require the applicant to deposit such sum of money as shall by the report appear necessary to cover the costs of repairing the injury which may be done to such reserved or exempted land or adjoining property by such occupation for mining purposes. And if, after making such repairs, or if no such repairs shall be necessary, the deposit or the balance of the sum so deposited shall be returned to the applicant.

Authority to be subject to Conditions.

173. Every order granting authority to occupy reserved or exempted lands for mining purposes shall be made subject to and shall contain such conditions, restrictions, and stipulations as the Governor shall in each case impose. The applicant may be required to enter into a bond, to be approved by the Minister, for the due observance and performance of such conditions, restrictions, and stipulations.

Penalty for Breach of Conditions.

174. If any miner to whom authority as aforesaid shall have been granted shall fail to observe or perform any of the conditions, restrictions, or stipulations, subject to which the authority shall have been granted, such miner shall be deemed to be mining on reserved or exempted lands, without authority, and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and to be summarily removed therefrom.

Authority may be cancelled.

175. The Governor may at any time cancel any order or withdraw any authority granted under these Regulations, if the miner to whom such authority shall have been granted shall at any time fail to observe and perform the conditions, restrictions, and stipulations aforesaid, or shall fail to hold a valid Miner's Right, or if it shall be found that such reserved or exempted land cannot be occupied for mining purposes without injury or obstruction to the enjoyment by the public of the same.

Mining without Authority.

176. Any person who shall, without authority first obtained, occupy reserved or exempted land, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and to be summarily removed therefrom.

VENTILATION OF MINES.

25. The air for ventilating a mine, as required by Section 10 of 63 Victoria, No. 49, and in the respective quantities named therein, shall be made to sweep along the airways, and shall be forced as far as the face of and into each and every working place where man, boy, or horse is engaged or is passing—main return airways only excepted. The intake air shall travel free from all stagnant water, stables, fires, and old workings.
