WHEREAS by Section five of the Early Closing Act, the Governor may, from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, define and declare the Boundaries of places or districts other than the Metropolitan, Geraldton, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, Kanowna, Bulong, Menzies, and Broad Arrow Districts, and declare such places or districts to be, or to cease to be, districts for the purposes of this Act, and shall, by the proclamation proclaiming a district, fix the time (such time being not earlier than six a.m. nor later than seven-thirty p.m.) for the opening and closing of shops within such district on every day of the week excepting on Sundays and public holidays, and (as to the hour of closing shops) excepting on days whereon a later hour than seven-thirty p.m. is provided by this Act for the closing of shops: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the area comprised within the boundaries for the time being of the Municipality of Northam to be a District within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Early Closing Act, 1898;"

And do fix 8 a.m. as the time for the opening and 6 p.m. as the time for the closing of shops within said district, except as in the said Act is provided.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any town or locality containing ratable property yielding upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Three hundred pounds, to be a Municipality, and to declare the population of the locality so to be proclaimed: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Administrator of the Government of the State of Western Australia, praying that the town of Paddington might be proclaimed a Municipality, signed by not fewer than fifty inhabitants of the said town of Paddington, who would, upon the incorporation thereof, be liable to be assessed for municipal taxes in respect of land or household residence within the said proposed Municipality: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the Government Gazette on the 10th day of May, 1901: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the town of Paddington (hereinafter described) contains ratable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: Now therefore I, the Honourable Sir Arthur LAWLEY, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the said town of Paddington to be under one thousand: And I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation, declare and proclaim it to be a Municipality under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Councillors of Paddington," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:-

Bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of Broad Arrow Gold Mining Lease 1488E, and extending 342° 56′ 14 chains 87 links, and 72° 56′ 8 chains 48 links, along its Western and Northern boundaries respectively; thence 349° 11′ 3 chains 29 links along part of the Western boundary of Lease 526E; thence 259° 24′ 6 chains 39 links boundary of Lease 526E; thence 259° 24′ 6 chains 39 links along one of the Southern boundaries of Lease 555E; thence 309° 26′ 17 chains along the South-West boundaries of Lease 5 5E aforesaid and Lease 559E; thence 320° 13′ 1 chain 36 links along part of the South-West boundary of Lease 561E; thence 252° 57′ 27 chains 82 links; thence 162° 57′ 34 chains 29 links; and thence 72° 57′ 35 chains 24 links, passing through the North-West boundary of Lease 899E, and along part of that of Lease 557E to the starting point. Also to include late Gold Mining Lease 971w.

Albany Local Board of Health.

HEALTH BY-LAWS.

127

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

All By-laws made by the Albany Local Board of Health and now in existence are hereby repealed, except so far as regards any act, matter, or thing duly done or suffered under such By-Laws, or any penalty, forfeiture, or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any such By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies,

- 1. No person shall erect within the District of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal that is not to the satisfaction of the Board, and every closet shall be equipped with the pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The internal dimensions of any privy shall be at least 5 feet by 4 feet, with walls at least 7 feet high from floor to eaves, provided with a hinged seat, or sliding riser, or a hinged door at the rear, for removing the pan. The material for construction must be either stone, brick, wood, or iron, or a combination thereof, and an approved floor of stone, brick, concrete, or wood must be provided.
- 2. No closet, privy. or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 20 feet from any business place or dwelling, unless with the express permission of the Local Board; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.
- 3. The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementations matter.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 5.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depôts or places of deposit, and the inspector shall inspect such depôts or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

Unless otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in his contract with the Local Board, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said contract.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

No person shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

The license shall be in the form of Schedule "A" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these Bylaws

BY-LAW No. 8.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions.

Every nightman shall forfeit and pay to the Local Board the penalties hereinafter specified in case he shall commit any breach of the conditions upon which his license is issued:—

- (a.) For neglecting to remove any pan at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose, 5s.
- (b.) For any and every repetition of such neglect within three months of a neglect in removing any pan, 5s.
- (c.) For each neglect to place a cleansed pan in its proper position for use, 5s.
- (d.) For each neglect to clean or keep deodorised any pan, nightcart, or other vehicle, 5s.
- (e.) For every neglect or failure to properly dispose of nightsoil as soon as it is deposited at the depôt, 20s.
- (f.) For depositing any load or part of any load of nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Local Board or its officers, 20s.
- (g.) For neglecting to close the door or gate of any yard, or the door of any closet which was closed when the nightman entered, 5s.
- (h.) For permitting any nightcart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during prohibited hours, 10s.
- (i.) For neglecting to cleanse any public latrine in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing, 5s.
- (j.) For spilling the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises, 5s.
- (k.) For neglecting to comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Local Board or its officers, 5s.
- (l.) For any failure to replace any pan when so ordered by the Local Board or its officers, 5s.
- (m.) For allowing any refuse, rubbish, or slops for pigs to be removed in carts or receptacles or by other than those specially set apart for that purpose, 5s.
- (n.) For any failure or neglect on the part of any nightman or any of his employees to keep books in accordance with the direction of the Local Board or its officers, 5s.

(o.) For any charge collected from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified in the contract, and satisfactorily proved to the Local Board or its officers, 5s.

BY-LAW No. 9.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed— Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

- 1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.
- 2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 10.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk, within the district of the Local Board, shall annually register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay an annual registration fee of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "B."

BY-LAW No. 11.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

- 1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.
- 2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 12.

For prescribing the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

- 1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.
- 2. Every tank or barrel, and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed by the owner, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed by the owner as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 14.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bone-dust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bone-dust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

- 1. Every occupier or owner of any premises wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.
- 2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle.

BY-LAW No. 16.

- 1. No person or persons shall keep any swine or pigsty within the Municipality of Albany within the areas defined by the following boundaries:—On the South, by Princess Royal Harbour, between Parade and Osnaburg Streets; on the West, by Parade Street and the Western boundary of Sub. Lot 37 to Perth Road, Ulster Road from the Monument to Spencer Road; on the North, by Perth Road from Cross Street to the Monument, and Middleton Road from the Monument to the Church of England Cemetery; Eastward, by a line drawn from the Church of England Cemetery to Short Street East by way of Rowley Street, thence to Osnaburg Street, on to Princess Royal Harbour; and not within 100 feet of either side of the several roads named.
- 2. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.
- 3. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

- 1. No person shall permit, on any premises owned or occupied by him, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.
- 2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

- 1. Every poultry house and yard shall be kept in a clean condition, and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.
- 2. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 19.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 21.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.
- 2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The owner or occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide a rubbish bin of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

- 2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the bin; and he shall not permit or suffer such bin to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.
- 3. Every bin as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.
- 4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier then the owner of every house or premises to which a bin as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.
- 5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved bin any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Regulating the disposal of the carcases of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or Townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any offensive matter, so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such

BY-LAW No. 27.

Regulating the removal of slops.

- 1. Any person keeping a laundry or carrying on the business of a laundryman who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitted with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds used in any laundry, or other matter or substance which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.
- All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed, as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition, and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district, other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil, or any other refuse, or offensive matter what-ever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all surplus storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 31.

No person shall keep any pigeons in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board of Health, unless they are kept in suitable aviaries, so that they cannot contaminate the rain water caught for drinking purposes off the house roofs.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the registration and management of Private Hospitals,

- 1. Every person keeping, or intending to keep, or open any private hospital within the Health District of Albany shall register the same at the Town Clerk's office; and each applicant for registration shall state the number of patients to be admitted, the number of nurses or assistants to be maintained, and the class or classes of disease or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital; and the Local Board of Health reserve the right, providing the following regulations are not adhered to, to revoke or cancel any such registration.
- 2. The officers of the Municipal Council and the Local Board of Health shall at all times have access to the building or buildings for the purpose of inspections as to drainage, good management, and sanitary regulations; and no such building shall be registered unless it be passed by the Board's officers as a fit and proper place for hospital purposes.
- 3. Every person in charge of a private hospital shall keep a register of all cases admitted into and treated in any such hospital, and such register shall be produced for inspection at the request of any officer, inspector, or servant of the Local Board of Health.
- 4. Any person in charge of any such hospital shall, at the request of the Officer of Health for the Local Board, provide for the isolation or removal of any patient suffering from scarlet fever, diphtheria, variola, varicella, puerperal fever, erysipelas, measles, or any other infectious or contagious disease.
- 5. In every such hospital there shall be at least one nurse to every 15 patients, and at least one qualified nurse, whose qualification shall be approved of by the Local Board of Health.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, or in the case of an offence which is of the nature of a continuing offence from day to day to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

SCHEDULE "A."

NIGHTMAN'S LICENSE.

This is to certify that the Local Board of Health of the District of Albany having approved of the application of for a License as a Nightman for the District aforesaid, hereby licenses the said as a Nightman for the District of Albany, subject to the By-laws of the Local Board of Health and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898."

Conditions upon which this license is granted:-

- (a.) Every pan shall be removed at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose.
 (b.) The cleansed pan shall be placed in its proper position for use immediately on the removal of any pan.
 (c) All pans, nightcarts, or other vehicles used in connection with the work shall be kept clean and deodorised.

- (d.) All nightsoil shall be deposited at the place or one of the places appointed.

- (e) All doors or gates of any yard or yards, and all doors of all closets which were closed when the nightman entered, shall be closed on leaving.
- (f.) All reasonable orders of the Local Board or its officers shall be complied with without delay.
- (g.) Any pan shall be replaced by another pan when so ordered by the Local Board or its officers.
- (h.) No refuse, rubbish, or slops for pigs shall be removed in carts or receptacles other than those specially set apart for that purpose.
- (i.) Such books as the Local Board or its officers may direct shall be kept and properly written up.
- (j.) No charge to be collected from any householder in excess of the rate specified.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

- 1. No person shall erect within the district of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be seen on structed as to readily the related shall be placed for inget the right of two admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.
- 2. No closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 20 feet from any business place or dwelling, unless with the express permission of the Local Board; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.
- Authority under Section 173, Sub-section 3.—The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter—Size, shape, materials of construction—Interchangeable.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the following size, shape, style, and materials:

Receptacles or pans to be circular, with flat bottoms, 13½ inches in diameter by 14 inches in depth, and provided with suitable handles on the sides thereof to facilitate removal. The whole to be constructed of plain galvanised iron of not less than 24 gauge.

BY-LAW No. 4.

There shall be provided by the occupier two receptacles for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be cleansed by superheated steam.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 7.

That failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor be compelled to obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved depôt for nightsoil for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

BY-LAW No. 8.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depôts or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depôts or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Mode of removal, etc

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause, shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the local Board.

Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at its own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct

BY-LAW No. 10.

Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule 'A' hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

No person shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Lett Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-Laws.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions,

Every nightman shall forfeit and pay to the Local Board the penalties hereinafter specified, in case he shall commit any breach of the conditions upon which his license is issued:—

- (a.) For neglecting to remove any pan at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose, 10s.
- (b.) For any and every repetition of such neglect within three months of a neglect in removing any pan, 20s.
- (c.) For each neglect to substitute a clean plan for every pan removed, 10s.
- (d.) For each neglect to place a cleansed pan in its proper position for use, 5s.
- (e.) For each neglect to clean or keep deodorised any pan, nightcart, or other vehicle, 10s.
- (f.) For every neglect or failure to properly dispose of nightsoil as soon as it is deposited at the depôt, 40s.

- (g.) For depositing any load or part of any load of nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Local Board, 100s.
- (h.) For neglecting to close the door or gate of any yard, or the door of any closet which was closed when the nightman entered, 5s.
- (i.) For permitting any night-cart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during prohibited hours, 20s.
- (j.) For neglecting to cleanse any public latrine in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing, 20s.
- (k.) For spilling the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises, 10s.
- (l.) For neglecting to comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Local Board, 20s.
- (m.) For any failure to replace any pan when so ordered by the Local Board, 10s.
- (n.) For any or every neglect to clean soiled pans, 10s.
- (o.) For allowing any refuse, rubbish, or slops for pigs to be removed in carts or receptacles, or by other than those specially set apart for that purpose, 20s.
- (p.) For any failure or neglect on the part of any nightman or any of his employees to keep books in accordance with the direction of the local Board, 20s.
- (q.) For any charge collected from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified in Schedule "A," and satisfactorily proved to the Local Board, 10s.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed—Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

- 1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.
- 2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 14.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 15.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

- 1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.
- 2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

- 1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof, or any offensive smell therefrom.
- 2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 3. All pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 6 o'clock in the evening and 8 o'clock in the morning.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bone-dust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bone-dust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

- 1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.
- 2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.
- 3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the depôt or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

- 1. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.
- 2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 21.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

- 1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.
- 2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 22.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

- 1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25ft. from any dwelling.
- 2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.
- 3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock, or bedding, or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 23.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistles so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 25.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the District of the Local Board.
- 2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

- 1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.
- 2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.
- 3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.
- 4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.
- 5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the househ lder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance cause such dust, mud, ashes rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the disposal of the carcases of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the municipality or townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the removal of slops.

- 1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper watertight vehicles or receptacles fitted with close fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds used in any laundry or dwelling, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.
- 2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed, as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 34.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55th Victoria, No. 9), notifies, for general information, that the Pearling Banks as hereunder described will be open for Dredging and Picking up of Pearl Shell for a period of six months from 1st April, 1901, subject to the Regulations in force and special condition hereunder:—

£500 if discovered upon Crown lands.

or exempted lands under the provisions of Section 23 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," shall be made in writing in the form of Schedule A, and forwarded through the Warden to the Minister; and such application shall be accompanied by a fee of Ten pounds, as prescribed by the Act, and by a plan showing (a) the locality, (b) the position in relation to the nearest sold or surveyed land, or in relation to some well-defined and fixed object, (c) the extent of the land applied for, and (d) the portion of the surface of the reserved land which the applicant will require to use.

Priority of application—how determined.

167. In the event of two or more applications being made for the same land, they shall be dealt with in the order of their receipt, and if any such applications shall be received on the same day the order of priority shall be determined in such manner as the Minister shall in each case direct.

Notices-how given.

168. As soon as possible after the receipt of any application as aforesaid, the Minister shall cause notice thereof to be posted at the Warden's Office and to be published in three consecutive issues of some newspaper circulating in the district wherein the land referred to is situate, and such notices shall name the date up to which objections to the applications may be lodged.

Inspection and Report.

169. As soon as possible after notice shall have been last published as aforesaid, the Minister shall cause instructions to be issued to some competent person to inspect the land applied for, and report to him whether the same may be occupied for mining without injury to, or obstruction to the enjoyment of reserved or exempted lands, the subject of the application, and whether the occupation of such land for mining purposes will, or will be likely to, injure any adjoining property, and may require such person to make an estimate of the cost of repairing any injury which may be done to any such reserved or exempted lands, or adjoining property.

Objections.

170. Any objection to the granting of the authority applied for may be lodged in the form of Schedule 28 by any person interested in opposing the same, at the Warden's Office, within thirty days of the receipt by the Minister of the application, and a copy of such objection shall be served on the applicant. Any such objection shall be dealt with in the manner provided by Regulation 89.

Applications may be refused.

171. If it shall appear from the report provided for in Regulation 169 that injury would or would probably be done to adjoining property by such mining operations, the Minister shall refuse to entertain such application unless and until the applicant shall have obtained the sanction or consent of the owner or owners of such property to the occupation for the purpose aforesaid, or until he has deposited a sum of money to cover the cost of repairing such injury, as provided by the next following regulation.

Deposit to cover cost of repairs.

172. In case it shall appear by the report aforesaid that injury would or would likely be done to any reserved or exempted land or adjoining property by such occupation for mining purposes, it shall be lawful for the Minister to require the applicant to deposit such sum of money as shall by the report appear necessary to cover the costs of repairing the injury which may be done to such reserved or exempted land or adjoining property by such occupation for mining purposes. And if, after making such repairs, or if no such repairs shall be necessary, the deposit or the balance of the sum so deposited shall be returned to the applicant.

Authority to be subject to Conditions.

173. Every order granting authority to occupy reserved or exempted lands for mining purposes shall be made subject to and shall contain such conditions, restrictions, and stipulations as the Governor shall in each case impose. The applicant may be required to enter into a bond, to be approved by the Minister, for the due observance and performance of such conditions, restrictions, and stipulations.

Penalty for Breach of Conditions.

174. If any miner to whom authority as aforesaid shall have been granted shall fail to observe or perform any of the conditions, restrictions, or stipulations, subject to which the authority shall have been granted, such miner shall be deemed to be mining on reserved or exempted lands, without authority, and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and to be summarily removed therefrom.

Authority may be cancelled.

175. The Governor may at any time cancel any order or withdraw any authority granted under these Regulations, if the miner to whom such authority shall have been granted shall at any time fail to observe and perform the conditions, restrictions, and stipulations aforesaid, or shall fail to hold a valid Miner's Right, or if it shall be found that such reserved or exempted land cannot be occupied for mining purposes without injury or obstruction to the enjoyment by the public of the same.

Mining without Authority.

176. Any person who shall, without authority first obtained, occupy reserved or exempted land, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and to be summarily removed therefrom.

Local register to be kept by foreign companies.

Every foreign company, or the attorney of every foreign company, carrying on business in this Colony shall, in the case of companies carrying on business therein at the time of the passing of this Act, within two calendar months from such time, and, as to all other companies so carrying on business at any time after the passing of this Act, within two calendar months from the deposit in the office of the Registrar of the power of attorney, in accordance with Section One hundred and ninety-eight of "The Companies Act, 1893," open, keep, and maintain, or cause to be opened, kept, and maintained, at the registered office of the said company in the Colony, a Register of Shareholders under this Act, to be called a Colonial Register, for the registration of all shareholders in such company who may apply in writing to such attorney to be registered therein.

Every such register shall be kept in the manner provided by Part III. of "The Companies Act, 1893," and transfers shall be effected on such register in the same manner and at the same charges as on the register kept at the head office of the company, and transfers lodged in the colonial office of the company shall be binding upon the company, and the Court shall be entitled to exercise the same jurisdiction of rectifying the same as is by Section Thirty-six of the said Act vested in such Court with respect to a register of a company incorporated in the Colony.

The liquidator or the company shall forward to the Registrar at the Supreme Court a statutory declaration made by the liquidator or by a director or officer of the

company authorised by the company in that behalf, stating how this section has been complied with; and until such declaration has been filed no conveyance, transfer, or dealing with any property of the company shall be registered in the Department of Mines or of Crown Lands or in the office of Land Titles, or in the office for the registration of deeds; and no person holding any property, real or personal, as servant, agent, or trustee on behalf of the company shall convey, deal with, or dispose of the same, nor shall any property of the company in this Colony pass to the purchaser thereof.

Before filing any declaration purporting to comply with this Act, the Registrar shall examine the same and satisfy himself of such compliance.
