I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency the Governor-General is in receipt of a despatch from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, notifying that a telegram has been received through the Foreign Office, from His Majesty's Minister at Guatemala, to the effect that the Honduran Government accepts the adhesion of New South Wales and Western Australia to the Treaty.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between the United Kingdom and the Republic of Honduras, signed at Guatemala on 21st January, 1887, and ratified on 3rd February, 1900, together with an explanatory Protocol signed at Guatemala on the 3rd February, 1900.

The effect of this explanatory Protocol is to override the provisions of Article XIV. of the Treaty, and to give to Colonial Governments in all cases a period of one year, and one year only, from the date of the exchange of ratifications to come within the operation of the Treaty, while it also reserves to Her Majesty's Government the right to terminate the Treaty on behalf of any Colony by giving twelve months' notice.

I shall be glad to be informed as soon as possible whether your Government desires to adhere to the Treaty.

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE REPUBLIC OF HONDURAS.

Signed at Guatemala, January 21, 1887.

[Ratifications exchanged at Guatemala, February 3, 1900.]

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, being desirous of maintaining and strengthening friendly relations, and of promoting commercial intercourse between the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty and the territories of the Republic, have resolved to conclude a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation, and have named as their plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, James Haister Harriss-Gastrell, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident and Consul-General to the Republic of Honduras;

And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, His Excellency Dr. Don. Jeronimo Zelaya, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties agree that, in all matters relating to commerce and navigation, any privilege, favour, or immunity whatever which either Contracting Party has actually granted or may hereafter grant to the subjects or citizens of any other State shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the subjects or citizens of the other Contracting Party; it being their intention that the trade and navigation of each country shall be placed in all respects by the other on the footing of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE II.

The produce and manufacture of, as well as all goods coming from, the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, which are imported into Honduras, and the produce and manufactures of, as well as all goods coming from Honduras, which are imported into the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, whether intended for consumption, warehousing, re-exportation, or transit, shall be treated in the same manner as, and, in particular, shall be subjected to no higher or other duties, whether general, municipal, or local, than the produce, manufactures, and goods of any third country the most favoured in this respect. No other or higher duties shall be levied in Honduras on the exportation of any goods to the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, or in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty on the exportation of any goods to Honduras, than may be levied on the exportation of the like goods to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

Neither of the Contracting Parties shall establish a prohibition of importation, exportation, or transit against the other which shall not, under like circumstances, be applicable to any third country the most favoured in this respect.

In like manner, in all that relates to local dues, Customs formalities, brokerage, patterns or samples introduced by commercial travellers, and all other matters connected with trade, British subjects in Honduras, and Honduran citizens in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, shall enjoy most-favoured-nation treatment.

In the event of any changes being made in Honduran Laws, Customs, Tariff, or Regulations, sufficient notice shall be given in order to enable British subjects to make the necessary arrangements for meeting them.

ARTICLE III.

British ships and their cargoes shall, in Honduras, and Honduran vessels and their cargoes shall, in the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, from whatever place arriving and whatever may be the place of origin or destination of their cargoes, be treated in every respect as national ships and their cargoes.

The preceding stipulation applies to local treatment, dues, and charges in the ports, basins, docks, roadsteads, harbours, and rivers of the two countries, pilotage, and generally to all matters connected with navigation.

Every favour or exemption in these respects, or any other privilege in matters of navigation which either of the Contracting Parties shall grant to a third Power, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the other Party.

All vessels which, according to British law, are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which, according to the law of Honduras, are to be deemed Honduran vessels, shall, for the purpose of this Treaty, be respectively deemed British or Honduran vessels.

ARTICLE IV.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall be permitted to reside permanently or temporarily in the dominions or possessions of the other, and to occupy and hire houses and warehouses for purposes of commerce, whether wholesale or retail. They shall also be at full liberty to exercise civil rights, and therefore to acquire, possess, and dispose of every description of property movable and immovable. They may acquire and transmit the same to others, whether by purchase, sale, donation, exchange, marriage, testament, succession *ab intestato*, and in any other manner under the same conditions as natives of the country. Their heirs and legal representatives may succeed to and take possession of it, either in person or by procurators, in the same manner and in the same legal forms as natives of the country.

In none of these respects shall they pay upon the value of such property any other or higher impost, duty, or charge than is payable by natives of the country. In every case the subjects or citizens of the Contracting Parties shall be permitted to export their property, or the proceeds thereof if sold, freely and without being subjected on such exportation to pay any duty different from that to which natives of the country are liable under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE V.

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, and shops of the subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, and all premises appertaining thereto destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be respected. Except under the conditions and with the forms prescribed by the laws for natives of the country, such dwellings and premises shall be exempt from search or domiciliary visit, and books, papers, or accounts shall be exempt from examination or inspection.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall have free access to the Courts of Justice for the prosecution and defence of their rights, without other conditions, restrictions, or taxes beyond those imposed on natives of the country, and shall, like them, be at liberty to employ, in all causes, their advocates, attorneys, or agents from among the persons admitted to the exercise of those professions according to the laws of the country.

ARTICLE VI.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall be exempted from billeting and from all compulsory military service whatever, whether in the army, navy, or national guard or militia. They shall likewise be exempted from all contributions, whether pecuniary or in kind, imposed as a compensation for billeting and for personal service, and, finally, from forced loans and military exactions or requisitions of any kind.

ARTICLE VII.

The subjects or citizens of either of the two Contracting Parties residing in the dominions and possessions of the other shall enjoy, in regard to their houses, persons, and properties, the protection of the Government in as full and ample a manner as native subjects or citizens.

In like manner the subjects or citizens of each Contracting Party shall enjoy in the dominions and possessions of the other full liberty of conscience, and shall not be molested on account of their religious belief; and such of those subjects or citizens as may die in the territories of the other Party shall be buried in the public cemeteries, or in places appointed for the purpose, with suitable decorum and respect.

The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty residing within the territories of the Republic of Honduras shall be at liberty to exercise in private and in their own dwellings, or within the dwellings or offices of Her Britannic Majesty's Minister, Consul, or Vice-Consul, or in any public edifice set apart for the purpose, their religious rites, services, and worship, and to assemble therein for that purpose without hindrance or molestation. The same stipulations shall be observed in regard to the citizens of the Republic of Honduras within the territories of Her Britannic Majesty.

ARTICLE VIII.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as natives, or as subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation, in regard to patents for inventions, trade marks, and designs, and the protection of industrial property, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law.

ARTICLE IX.

Each of the Contracting Parties may appoint Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, Pro-Consuls, and Consular Agents to reside respectively in towns or ports in the dominions and possessions of the other Power. Such Consular officers, however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted in the usual form by the Government to which they are sent. They shall exercise whatever functions, and enjoy whatever privileges, exemptions, and immunities are, or may hereafter be, granted there to Consular officers of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE X.

In the event of any subject or citizen of either of the two Contracting Parties dying without will or testament, in the dominions and possessions of the other Contracting Party, the Consul-General, Consul, or Vice-Consul of the nation to which the deceased may belong, or, in his absence, the representative of such Consular officer may, so far as the laws of each country will permit, take charge of the property which the deceased shall have left, for the benefit of his legal representatives, until an executor or administrator be named.

ARTICLE XI.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of each of the Contracting Parties residing in the dominions and possessions of the other shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

ARTICLE XII.

Any ship of war or merchant-vessel of either of the Contracting Parties which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the other, shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary stores, and to continue their voyage, without paying any dues other than such as would be payable in a similar case by a national vessel. In case, however, the master of a merchant-vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandise in order to defray his expenses, he shall be bound to conform to the Regulations and Tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship of war or merchant-vessel of one of the Contracting Parties should run against or be wrecked within the territory of the other, such ship or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging thereunto, and all goods and merchandise saved therefrom, including any which may have been cast out of the ship, or the proceeds thereof if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the same shall be delivered to the British or Honduranian Consul-General, Consul, Vice-Consul, or Consular Agent in whose district the wreck or stranding may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country; and such Consuls, owners, or agents shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The goods and merchandise saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of Customs, unless cleared for consumption, in which case they shall pay the same rate of duty as if they had been imported in a national vessel.

In the case either of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, run aground, or wrecked, the respective Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents shall, if the owner or master or other agent of the owner is not present, or is present and requires it, be authorised to interpose in order to afford the necessary assistance to their fellow-countrymen.

ARTICLE XIII.

For the better security of commerce between the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty and the citizens of the Republic of Honduras, it is agreed that if at any time any interruption of friendly intercourse, or any rupture, should unfortunately take place between the two Contracting Parties, the subjects or citizens of either of the said Contracting Parties who may be residing in the dominions or territories of the other, or who may be established there, in the exercise of any trade or special employment, shall have the privilege of remaining, and continuing such trade or employment, without any manner of interruption, in full enjoyment of their liberty and property, so long as they behave peacefully and commit no offence against the laws; and their goods, property, and effects, of whatever description they may be, whether in their own custody or intrusted to individuals or to the State, shall not be liable to seizure or sequestration, or to any other charges or demands than those which may be made upon the like goods, property, and effects belonging to native subjects or citizens. Should they, however, prefer to leave the country, they shall be allowed to make arrangements for the safe keeping of their goods, property, and effects, or to dispose of them, and to liquidate their accounts; and a safe conduct shall be given them to embark at the ports which they shall themselves select.

ARTICLE XIV.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws permit, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.
The Dominion of Canada.
Newfoundland.
New South Wales.
Victoria.
South Australia.
Western Australia.
Queensland.
Tasmania.
New Zealand.
The Cape.
Natal.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Treaty shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative in the Republic of Honduras to the Honduranian Minister for Foreign Affairs within two years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Treaty.

The Treaty shall apply in the case of such Colonies or foreign possessions from the date when this notice is given to the Honduranian Minister for Foreign Affairs.

ARTICLE XV.

Any controversies which may arise respecting the interpretation or the execution of the present Treaty, or the consequences of any violation thereof, shall be submitted, when the means of settling them directly by amicable agreement are exhausted, to the decision of Commissions of Arbitration, and the result of such arbitration shall be binding upon both Governments.

The members of such Commissions shall be selected by the two Governments by common consent; failing which each of the Parties shall nominate an Arbitrator, or an equal number of Arbitrators, and the Arbitrators thus appointed shall select an Umpire.

The procedure of the arbitration shall in each case be determined by the Contracting Parties; failing which the Commission of Arbitration shall be itself entitled to determine it beforehand.

ARTICLE XVI.

The present Treaty shall continue in force during ten years, counted from the day of the exchange of the ratifications; and in case neither of the two Contracting Parties shall have given notice twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of their intention of terminating the present Treaty, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

ARTICLE XVII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified by Her Majesty the Queen of Great Britain and Ireland and by His Excellency the President of the Republic of Honduras, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Tegucigalpa or Guatemala as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.

Done at Guatemala, the twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Protocol.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries of the High Contracting Parties, in proceeding to the signature this day of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Honduras, do hereby declare that by the words "a port," in Article XII, (first paragraph), as regards vessels in distress, is intended "a port or roadstead of any kind, whether or not it be a port of entry." It is likewise understood between the undersigned Plenipotentiaries that British subjects, in like manner as Honduranian citizens, shall pay the same municipal taxes, such as the tax on places of business in Honduras.

Done in duplicate at Guatemala, this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Protocol.

The undersigned Plenipotentiaries of the High Contracting Parties to the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation signed between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Republic of Honduras on the twenty-first of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, being duly authorised thereto, have agreed as follows:—

1st. The stipulations of the said Treaty shall not be applicable to any of the Colonies or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty unless notice to that effect shall have been given on behalf of any such Colony or foreign possession by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative accredited to the Republic of Honduras to the Honduranian Minister for Foreign Affairs within one year from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the said Treaty.

2nd. Her Majesty's Government may in the same manner give notice of accession on behalf of any British Protectorate or sphere of influence, or on behalf of the Island of Cyprus in virtue of the Convention of the fourth of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, between Great Britain and Turkey.

3rd. Her Majesty's Government shall also have the right to separately terminate the Treaty at any time on giving twelve months' notice to that effect on behalf of any British Colony, foreign possession, or dependency which may have acceded thereto.

4th. It is understood that in all cases in which the provisions of the said Treaty accord the treatment of the most favoured nation, that term shall not be held to include the Central American Republics.

5th. The stipulations of the said Treaty will be applicable to India, including the territories of any native Prince or Chief in India under the suzerainty of the British Government, subject to the following reservations:—

1. The Government of India reserve the discretionary power to prevent any foreigner from residing or sojourning in, or travelling through, India, as above defined, without their consent.

2. In regard to the native States of India, the rights of citizens of the Republic of Honduras, under Articles I. and IV. of the said Treaty are subject to the same limitations as those which are, or may be, in force as regards the European British subjects.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under Sections 153 and 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the leasing of any Town or Suburban Lands which may be declared open for selection as Residential Leases; and also of the cancellation of the Regulations dated 29th March, 1899, and 6th February, 1901:—

1. An application for a lease of town or suburban land declared open for selection as a Residential Lease shall be made in the form of Schedule "A."
2. The applicant shall be a male person above the age of 18 years, not being an Asiatic or African alien; or a female, not being an Asiatic or African alien, who is above the age of 18 years and the sole head of a family.
3. Applications shall be made to the Minister for Lands, but shall be lodged at the office of the Land Agent of the District within which the land is situate, or in case the land is situate within a Goldfield, then at the office of the Warden of such Goldfield, and shall be transmitted to the Minister by the Land Agent or Warden with his recommendation thereon.
4. Applications shall take priority in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of "The Land Act, 1898," and Section 2 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1900."
5. Every application shall set forth the number, position, and area of the lot applied for, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form of Schedule "B."
6. A fee of 10s. shall be payable with every application, in addition to the rent, at the rate of 10s. per annum, as provided in Section 10 following.
7. The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.
8. On an application being approved by the Minister, a lease shall be granted in the form of Schedule "D."
9. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and of so much of the land below the natural surface to a depth of 40 feet if situate within a Goldfield or Mining District, and to a depth of 2,000ft. in respect to all other lands.
10. Every lease shall be granted for a term not to exceed 21 years, at the rent of 10s. per annum, payable in advance, as prescribed by Section 136 of "The Land Act, 1898," the first payment to be made with the application. At the expiration of the said term, the Lessee shall have a preferential right of renewal for a further period of 21 years, on the terms and conditions prescribed by any Act or Regulations in force for the time being, should the land demised not be required by the Government.
11. Every Town or Suburban Lot leased under these Regulations shall be taken possession of within one month of the approval of the application for the same, and shall be used as the habitual abode of the Lessee, or some member of his family, for at least nine

months in every year, and shall not be used for any business purpose, or for any purpose other than that of residence.

12. Any Town or Suburban Lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, or any portion thereof, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes, or for any public purpose, at three months' notice to the Lessee, published in the *Government Gazette*; and immediately after the expiration of such three months, all the estate and interest of the Lessee in the land demised, or the portion resumed, as the case may be, shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted: Provided that, on any such resumption, the Lessee shall be entitled to receive from the Minister the fair value of any improvements existing on the said land, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the Lessee and one by the Minister; any difference of opinion between the said Valuers to be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.

13. In case of the refusal by the Minister of any application, notice thereof shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to the address given in the application, and the fee paid on the application and the deposit of rent shall thereupon be returned to the applicant on demand.

14. No person shall hold any Residential Lease within the distance of two miles from any other Residence Area or Residential Lease or Town or Suburban Lot held by him.

15. No Lessee shall transfer or underlet the premises demised by any lease, except with the consent of the Minister in writing first obtained, after production by the Lessee of the lease, and a statutory declaration by the transferee in the form of Schedule "B," and on payment of a fee of 20s.

16. No transfer or sub-letting of a lease shall be allowed until after the expiration of three months from the date on which the same was granted.

17. No transfer or underlease of any portion of the demised premises shall be approved on any conditions whatsoever.

18. The Governor may, at any time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, exempt from the operation of these Regulations any portion of any Town or Suburban Lands which may have been declared open for selection.

Rules for the Conduct of Examinations and Issue of Certificates and Licenses under "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 14).

THE Land Surveyors Licensing Board (appointed under the Act 59 Vict., No. 14) has, with the approval of the Governor, made the following rules for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act; and cancelled the Rules dated 19th May, 1897:—

1. Examinations for Certificates of Competency shall be held in Perth by the Board during the month of September in each year, on a date to be fixed by the Board, and at such other times as the Board may think fit. Not less than four (4) weeks' notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette* of the date upon which any such examination will be held.

2. An intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board (a) written notice of his intention to present himself for examination, together with his address; (b) documentary evidence of his having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder; and (c) a fee of £3 3s., all of which must reach the Secretary at least fourteen days before the date fixed for the examination.

3. The Secretary shall, at least seven days before the date fixed for the examination, send to each candidate, by registered letter, through the post, a notification of the approval or refusal of his application by the Board.

4. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

5. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of 20 years at the time of the examination.

6. Every candidate shall furnish the Board with satisfactory evidence as to character.

7. No person shall be eligible as a candidate unless he shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the Matriculation Examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field; or shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession; or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

8. Every candidate shall produce a certificate in the form hereafter, or in a like form, from a qualified surveyor or surveyors with whom he has served, that he is competent to conduct surveys.

CERTIFICATE OF FIELD SERVICE AND COMPETENCY FOR PRESENTATION TO THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

I, A. B., a qualified surveyor of _____, hereby certify that C. D. has been employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, and that he is competent to conduct surveys.

9. A qualified surveyor shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire or the United States of America where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

10. A candidate, when lodging an application for examination, shall forward his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than forty (40) acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

MATHEMATICS.

11. Plane and spherical trigonometry, geometry, and algebra, so far as they are applicable to land surveying.

COMPUTATION.

Reduction of traverses—Computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves—Adjustment of discrepancies in surveys—Computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF SURVEYING.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes—Topographical surveying—Setting out of areas—Redetermination of boundaries—Laying out roads—Setting out curves—Plotting from field notes—Stadia surveying—Barometric measurement of heights—Surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

LEVELLING, ETC.

Levelling—Measurement of earthwork.

PRINCIPLES OF CONSTRUCTION, ADJUSTMENT, AND USE OF THE FOLLOWING INSTRUMENTS, VIZ.:—

Steel band—Plane table—Prismatic compass—Sextant—Level—Clinometer—Telemeter—Theodolite—Barometer—Thermometer—Tacheometer.

FIELD ASTRONOMY, GEODESY, ETC.

Determination of time, latitude and azimuth—Reduction of star places—Elementary Geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians—Declination of the magnetic needle.

DRAWING.

Plan drawing—Compilation of Plans—Projection of Maps and Charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics and Geology (Elementary); Description Writing.

12. Candidates producing sufficient evidence of having passed a satisfactory examination in Elementary Geometry, Trigonometry, and Algebra may be exempted from working out papers in those subjects, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

13. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall, upon payment of the prescribed fees, receive from the Board a certificate of competency.

LICENSES, Etc.

14. The Board may, at its discretion, at any time examine any candidate for a license whose qualifications are such as, in the opinion of the Board, justify it in dispensing with the full examination referred to in Clause 1.

15. All examinations under these regulations shall be conducted by not less than two members of the Board.

16. The Board may, upon payment of the prescribed fees, issue a license to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, subsequent to September, 1895, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his certificate.

17. A license may be issued by the Board without examination to any applicant who has paid the prescribed fees, and who produces to the Board satisfactory evidence that he has complied with the following conditions:—

- (a.) Has passed an examination prescribed by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, or
- (b.) Has passed before any authority an examination equivalent to that required by the Board, and has had not less than 12 months' field experience in practical land surveying similar or equivalent to that required of candidates for examination by the Board. Provided always, that the Board may in any such case examine an applicant.

18. The Board may require candidates for licenses under Clauses 15 and 16 of these Rules to produce a written recommendation, dated not more than 12 months previously, from the Board which granted the qualification by virtue of which the license is applied for.

19. No license shall be issued to any person under the age of 21 years.

20. No license under Clause 16 shall be issued to any applicant who is not entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his qualifications.

21. The Board may refuse to grant a certificate of competency or a license to any applicant if it is not satisfied as to his character.

22. In the event of failure of any candidate to pass an examination, the Board may, at its discretion, remit one-half the fees at any subsequent examination of such candidate.

1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business on the first Thursday of every quarter, and shall have power to adjourn to any intermediate period; provided that, if the first Thursday be a public holiday, the Board shall meet on the following Thursday.

2. At the first meeting of the Board, which shall be held in the month of January in each year, the members present shall choose one of their number to be the Chairman for the ensuing year; but the omission to choose a Chairman at such meeting shall not invalidate any act done by the Board.

3. The Chairman shall have power to call a special meeting for the consideration of any business which he may wish to submit to the Board.

4. The Chairman, or, in his absence, the Secretary, shall convene a special meeting of the Board, upon the written requisition of three members setting forth the objects for which the meeting shall be called, within three days after the receipt of the requisition.

5. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing, at least, shall be given of any special meeting of the Board to every member of the same, and shall be sent by post to, or delivered at, the address of such member.

6. At every meeting of the Board the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and, in his absence, a Chairman shall be chosen by a majority of the members present.

7. Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of one guinea for attendance at any meeting convened in accordance with these Regulations.

8. Any member who shall not be present at any Board, within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same, shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance.

9. All questions which shall be proposed or considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present; each member to have one vote, and in case of an equal division of the votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.

10. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a journal to be kept for the purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.

11. All moneys received by the Board shall be placed to its credit at such bank as the members may from time to time direct, and all payments shall be made by cheques on such account, signed by one member of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary for the time being.

12. The Secretary shall attend every meeting and enter minutes of all the proceedings of the Board, and keep all the books and accounts, conduct the correspondence under the direction of the Chairman, and transact any other business the Board may require. He shall keep a register in which he shall enter the names of all Licensed Surveyors, with the particulars of their certificates, and shall cause such register to be revised forthwith after the issue, cancellation, or suspension of any license. He shall be entitled to a salary such as the Board may from time to time determine.
