By-laws for the Payment of Fees for comparing and stamping Weights, Scales, Balances, Steelyards, Beams, or other Weighing Machines.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of Section 25 of "The Weights and Measures Act, 1899," the Council of the Municipality of Coolgardie has authority, by by-law, to fix the fees which shall be paid for comparing with the authorised copies in the said section mentioned, and stamping (if found correct) all weights, scales, balances, steelyards, beams, or other weighing machines: Now the Council doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws under the provisions of the said Act.

The Fees specified in the schedule hereunder written shall be charged, received, and taken by the Inspector of Weights and Measures for and on behalf of the Council of the Municipality of Coolgardie, for comparing with such authorised copies as aforesaid, and stamping (if found

correct) weights, scales, beams, balances, steelyards, and other weighing machines. All such fees to be paid to the said Inspector before delivery of such weights, beams, scales, steelyards, or weighing machines to the owner.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under Sections 153 and 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the leasing of any Town or Suburban Lands which may be declared open for selection as Residential Leases; and also of the cancellation of the Regulations dated 29th March, 1899, and 6th February, 1901:—

1. An application for a lease of town or suburban land declared open for selection as a Residential Lease shall be made in the form of Schedule "A."

2. The applicant shall be a male person above the age of 18 years, not being an Asiatic or African alien; or a female, not being an Asiatic or African alien, who is above the age of 18 years and the sole head of a family.

3. Applications shall be made to the Minister for Lands, but shall be lodged at the office of the Land Agent of the District within which the land is situate, or in case the land is situate within a Goldfield, then at the office of the Warden of such Goldfield, and shall be transmitted to the Minister by the Land Agent or Warden with his recommendation thereon.

4. Applications shall take priority in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of "The Land Act, 1898," and Section 2 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1900."

5. Every application shall set forth the number, position, and area of the lot applied for, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form of Schedule "B."

6. A fee of 10s. shall be payable with every application, in addition to the rent, at the rate of 10s. per annum, as provided in Section 10 following.

7. The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.

8. On an application being approved by the Minister, a lease shall be granted in the form of Schedule "D."

9. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and of so much of the land below the natural surface to a depth of 40 feet if situate within a Goldfield or Mining District, and to a depth of 2,000ft. in respect to all other lands.

10. Every lease shall be granted for a term not to exceed 21 years, at the rent of 10s. per annum, payable in advance, as prescribed by Section 136 of "The Land Act, 1898," the first payment to be made with the application. At the expiration of the said term, the Lessee shall have a preferential right of renewal for a further period of 21 years, on the terms and conditions prescribed by any Act or Regulations in force for the time being, should the land demised not be required by the Government.

11. Every Town or Suburban Lot leased under these Regulations shall be taken possession of within one month of the approval of the application for the same, and shall be used as the habitual abode of the Lessee, or some member of his family, for at least nine

months in every year, and shall not be used for any business purpose, or for any purpose other than that of residence.

12. Any Town or Suburban Lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, or any portion thereof, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes, or for any public purpose, at three months' notice to the Lessee, published in the *Government Gazette*; and immediately after the expiration of such three months, all the estate and interest of the Lessee in the land demised, or the portion resumed, as the case may be, shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted: Provided that, on any such resumption, the Lessee shall be entitled to receive from the Minister the fair value of any improvements existing on the said land, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the Lessee and one by the Minister; any difference of opinion between the said Valuers to be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.

13. In case of the refusal by the Minister of any application, notice thereof shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to the address given in the application, and the fee paid on the application and the deposit of rent shall thereupon be returned to the applicant on demand.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations in connection with the "Land Surveyors' Licensing Board," appointed under the above Act, and of the cancellation of the Regulations dated 24th March, 1899.

CHAS. SOMMERS,

1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business on the first Thursday of every quarter, and shall have power to adjourn to any intermediate period; provided that, if the first Thursday be a public holiday, the Board shall meet on the following Thursday.

2. At the first meeting of the Board, which shall be held in the month of January in each year, the members present shall choose one of their number to be the Chairman for the ensuing year; but the omission to choose a Chairman at such meeting shall not invalidate any act done by the Board.

3. The Chairman shall have power to call a special meeting for the consideration of any business which he may wish to submit to the Board.

4. The Chairman, or, in his absence, the Secretary, shall convene a special meeting of the Board, upon the written requisition of three members setting forth the objects for which the meeting shall be called, within three days after the receipt of the requisition.

5. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing, at least, shall be given of any special meeting of the Board to every member of the same, and shall be sent by post to, or delivered at, the address of such member.

6. At every meeting of the Board the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and, in his absence, a Chairman shall be chosen by a majority of the members present.

7. Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of one guinea for attendance at any meeting convened in accordance with these Regulations.

8. Any member who shall not be present at any Board, within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same, shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance.

9. All questions which shall be proposed or considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present; each member to have one vote, and in case of an equal division of the votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.

10. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a journal to be kept for the purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.

11. All moneys received by the Board shall be placed to its credit at such bank as the members may from time to time direct, and all payments shall

be made by cheques on such account, signed by one member of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary for the time being.

12. The Secretary shall attend every meeting and enter minutes of all the proceedings of the Board, and keep all the books and accounts, conduct the correspondence under the direction of the Chairman, and transact any other business the Board may require. He shall keep a register in which he shall enter the names of all Licensed Surveyors, with the particulars of their certificates, and shall cause such register to be revised forthwith after the issue, cancellation, or suspension of any license. He shall be entitled to a salary such as the Board may from time to time determine.

Rules for the Conduct of Examinations and Issue of Certificates and Licenses under "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 14).

THE Land Surveyors Licensing Board (appointed under the Act 59 Vict., No. 14) has, with the approval of the Governor, made the following rules for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act; and cancelled the Rules dated 19th May, 1897:—

1. Examinations for Certificates of Competency shall be held in Perth by the Board during the month

of September in each year, on a date to be fixed by the Board, and at such other times as the Board may think fit. Not less than four (4) weeks' notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette* of the date upon which any such examination will be held.

2. An intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board (a) written notice of his intention to present himself for examination, together with his address; (b) documentary evidence of his having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder; and (c) a fee of £3 3s., all of which must reach the Secretary at least fourteen days before the date fixed for the examination.

3. The Secretary shall, at least seven days before the date fixed for the examination, send to each candidate, by registered letter, through the post, a notification of the approval or refusal of his application by the Board.

4. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

5. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of 20 years at the time of the examination.

6. Every candidate shall furnish the Board with satisfactory evidence as to character.

7. No person shall be eligible as a candidate unless he shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the Matriculation Examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field; or shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession; or shall have taken the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

8. Every candidate shall produce a certificate in the form hereafter, or in a like form, from a qualified surveyor or surveyors with whom he has served, that he is competent to conduct surveys.

CERTIFICATE OF FIELD SERVICE AND COMPETENCY FOR PRESENTATION TO THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

9. A qualified surveyor shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire or the United States of America where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

10. A candidate, when lodging an application for examination, shall forward his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than forty (40) acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other

natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

MATHEMATICS.

11. Plane and spherical trigonometry, geometry, and algebra, so far as they are applicable to land surveying.

COMPUTATION.

Reduction of traverses—Computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves—Adjustment of discrepancies in surveys—Computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

PRINCIPLES AND PRACTICE OF SURVEYING.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes—Topographical surveying—Setting out of areas—Redetermination of boundaries—Laying out roads—Setting out curves—Plotting from field notes—Stadia surveying—Barometric measurement of heights—Surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

LEVELLING, ETC.

Levelling—Measurement of earthwork.

PRINCIPLES OF CONSTRUCTION, ADJUSTMENT, AND USE OF THE FOLLOWING INSTRUMENTS, VIZ.:—

Steel band—Plane table—Prismatic compass—Sextant—Level—Clinometer—Telemeter—Theodolite—Barometer—Thermometer—Tacheometer.

FIELD ASTRONOMY, GEODESY, ETC.

Determination of time, latitude and azimuth—Reduction of star places—Elementary Geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians—Declination of the magnetic needle.

DRAWING.

Plan drawing—Compilation of Plans—Projection of Maps and Charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics and Geology (Elementary); Description Writing.

12. Candidates producing sufficient evidence of having passed a satisfactory examination in Elementary Geometry, Trigonometry, and Algebra may be exempted from working out papers in those subjects, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

13. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall, upon payment of the prescribed fees, receive from the Board a certificate of competency.

LICENSES, ETC.

14. The Board may, at its discretion, at any time examine any candidate for a license whose qualifications are such as, in the opinion of the Board, justify it in dispensing with the full examination referred to in Clause 1.

15. All examinations under these regulations shall be conducted by not less than two members of the Board.

16. The Board may, upon payment of the prescribed fees, issue a license to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating

Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, subsequent to September, 1895, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his certificate.

17. A license may be issued by the Board without examination to any applicant who has paid the prescribed fees, and who produces to the Board satisfactory evidence that he has complied with the following conditions:—

- (a.) Has passed an examination prescribed by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, or
- (b.) Has passed before any authority an examination equivalent to that required by the Board, and has had not less than 12 months' field experience in practical land surveying similar or equivalent to that required of candidates for examination by the Board. Provided always, that the Board may in any such case examine an applicant.

18. The Board may require candidates for licenses under Clauses 15 and 16 of these Rules to produce a written recommendation, dated not more than 12 months previously, from the Board which granted the qualification by virtue of which the license is applied for.

19. No license shall be issued to any person under the age of 21 years.

20. No license under Clause 16 shall be issued to any applicant who is not entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his qualifications.

21. The Board may refuse to grant a certificate of competency or a license to any applicant if it is not satisfied as to his character.

22. In the event of failure of any candidate to pass an examination, the Board may, at its discretion, remit one-half the fees at any subsequent examination of such candidate.

Western Australian Government Railways.**Carriage of Long and Bulky Articles.**

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the cancellation of the special rate for the Carriage of Timber, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th April, 1901; also of Clause 31, page 11, of Classification and Rate Book, being amended as follows:—

31. *Long and Bulky Articles.*—The Commissioner shall not be bound to accept for carriage by Railway any article which from its excessive bulk would be inconvenient to transport. At Stations where there are no appliances for loading or unloading such articles, the duty must be undertaken by the owner at his own risk, and in all cases truck loads must be strictly limited to gauge, viz., 12ft. 6in. in height from the rail level in the centre, and be gradually rounded to 10ft. in height at the sides, and not more than 8ft. 6in. across, and not to project more than 6in. over the truck at each end, and be in the opinion of the Commissioner or his servants perfectly safe for transit. Long articles, requiring more than one four-wheeled truck, will be charged according to classification, with a minimum charge of two tons for each wagon used, unless otherwise specified, whether each wagon carries part of the load or is used as a safety only.

When other goods are carried with them, the long articles must be charged at the actual weight, provided the minimum charge as for two tons per wagon is maintained (and the carriage on the whole is paid by one person or firm). Should there not be sufficient goods available for loading with such long articles, the sender may endorse the consignment note *To be forwarded at the convenience of the Commissioner*, when actual weight only will be charged; provided that should there not be sufficient goods tendered within seven days to load the wagons as above, the Commissioner may forward such articles and charge sufficient to maintain the minimum of two tons per wagon. For Western Australian hardwoods the minimum weight per wagon will be as set forth on page 28.
