WHEREAS it is provided by "The Sandalwood Act, 1881," that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council from time to time to proclaim and define one or more area or areas of Waste Lands of the Crown within which no live or growing sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up for the period to be named by the Governor in such proclamation: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and define the Waste Lands of the Crown contained and being within the following area to be an area within which no live or growing sandalwood tree shall be cut or grubbed up during a period of two years from the 1st day of November, 1901:—

AREA ABOVE REFERRED TO:

Bounded on the *Westward* by the Great Southern Railway Northward to Beverley by the Eastern Railway to Clackline Junction, the Newcastle Railway to Newcastle, and thence by road to Walebing, *via* New Norcia, to a point West of HK (conjoined) 107 (Waddouring Rock); thence West to the sea coast and along it Northerly; on the *North* by the Murchison River upwards to the 40-Mile Crossing; on the *East* by a Southerly line from the 40-Mile Crossing aforesaid to Pinddar, on the Cue Railway, and onwards through the highest peak of the Wongan Hills to a point West of HK (conjoined) 107 (Waddouring Rock) aforesaid; thence East to a point North of Mindabooka, HK (conjoined) 196; thence South to Mindabooka aforesaid, and South-South-Easterly to Cape Knob, and on the South by the sea coast.

The Proclamation dated 14th November, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 23rd November, 1900, to be superseded by this Proclamation on the 1st November, 1901.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any town or locality containing ratable property yielding, upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of three hundred pounds, to be a Municipality, and to declare the population of the locality so to be proclaimed: AND WHEREAS a Petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, praying that the District of North Perth might be proclaimed a Municipality, signed by not fewer than fifty of the inhabitants of the said District of North Perth, who would, upon the incorporation thereof, be liable to be assessed for municipal taxes in respect of land or household residence within the said proposed Municipality: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th day of September, 1901: AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the District of North Perth (hereinafter described) contains ratable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir ARTHUR LAWLEY, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the said District of North Perth to be over one thousand: AND I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation declare and proclaim it to be a Municipality under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Councillors of North Perth," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Perthshire Location Aq and extending East and North-East, passing along portions of the Southern boundaries of Perthshire Location Au to the Western side of Wanneroo Road; thence South-Eastward along it and the South-West side of Walcott Street to a point 12ft. 6in. South-Eastward from its intersection with the Western side of Beaufort Street; thence South-Westward parallel to and at a distance of 12ft. from the said Western side of Beaufort Street to the centre of Vincent Street; thence West along said centre of Vincent Street to a point due South of the South-West corner of Perthshire Location 115; thence North, passing along its West boundary and those of Swan Locations 112 and 613; thence North-Westward to the East corner of Swan Location 661; thence West, passing along its South boundary and those of Swan Locations 669, 782, and 673; thence North-Westward, passing along the latter's South-West boundary to its South-West corner; thence North, passing the East boundary of said Location Aq, to the starting point. Excluding Δ 884 and approaches thereto.

And with the like advice and by virtue of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, I hereby divide the said Municipality into three Wards, to be

known as the East Ward, the Central Ward, and the West Ward respectively, and declare the boundaries of the said Wards to be as follows:—

EAST WARD.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre of Vincent Street with the centre of Norfolk Street, and extending North along the centre of Norfolk Street to the centre of Robinson Street; thence North-Westward along the centre of said Robinson Street to the centre of York Road, and along said centre of road to its intersection with the South-West side of Walcott Street; thence South-Eastward along said side of Walcott Street to a point situate 12ft. 6in. South-Eastward from its intersection with the Western side of Beaufort Street; thence South-Westward parallel to and at a distance of 12ft. from said Western side of Beaufort Street to the centre of Vincent Street; thence West along said centre of Vincent Street to the starting point.

CENTRAL WARD.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre of Vincent Street with the centre of Norfolk Street, and extending North along said centre of Norfolk Street to the centre of Robinson Street; thence North-Westward along the centre of Robinson Street to the centre of York Road; thence East along the centre of York Road to its intersection with the South-West side of Walcott Street; thence North-Westward along said side of Walcott Street to the centre of Charles Street, and South-Eastward along said centre of Charles Street to the centre of Farmer Street; thence East along said centre of Farmer Street to the centre of Daphne Street; thence South along said centre of Daphne Street and onwards to the centre of Albert Street; thence West along said centre of Albert Street to the centre of Olive Street; thence South along said centre of Olive Street to the centre of View Street; thence East along said centre of View Street to the centre of John Street; thence South along said centre of John Street to the centre of Vincent Street; thence East along said centre of Vincent Street to the starting point.

WEST WARD.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre of Vincent Street with the centre of John Street, and extending West along the centre of Vincent Street to the South-West corner of Perthshire Location 115; thence North, passing along its West boundary and those of Swan Locations 112 and 613; thence North-Westward to the East corner of Swan Location 661; thence West, passing along its South boundary and those of Swan Location 669, 782, and 673; thence North-Westward, passing along the latter's South-West boundary to its South-West corner; thence North, passing along the East boundary of Perthshire Location Aq to its North-East corner; thence East and North-East, passing along portions of the Southern boundaries of Perthshire Locations Au to the centre of Charles Street; thence South-Westward along said centre of Charles Street to the centre of Farmer Street; thence East along said centre of Farmer Street to the centre of Daphne Street; thence South along the said centre of Daphne Street and onwards to the centre of Albert Street; thence West along said centre of Albert Street to the centre of Olive Street; thence South along said centre of Olive Street to the centre of View Street; thence East along said centre of View Street to the centre of John Street; and thence South along said centre of John Street to the starting point.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor in Council to prohibit absolutely the introduction into Western Australia of any plant which, in his opinion, is likely to introduce any disease: AND WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the introduction into Western Australia of any rooted grape vines, or grape vines that have had their roots removed, is likely to introduce the disease of "*Phylloxera vastatrix*": NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor in Council, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of any rooted grape vines, or grape vines that have had their roots removed.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of "The Health Act, 1898," the Governor may appoint any number of persons, not exceeding seven, to be a Local Board of Health for any District not forming part of a Municipal District: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby appoint the under-mentioned persons to be a Local Board of Health for the District to be known as "Port Hedland," in the Pilbarra Magisterial District, and to include all that parcel of land contained within the following boundaries:—

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes: **AND** WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve A605 (Quindaning, "Common") should be placed under the control of R. E. Warburton, Jno. Malcolm Page, Daniel Henrickson, Harry Sherry, and Thomas Wilson as a Board of Management:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of R. E. Warburton, Jno. Local Board of Health By-Laws.2170

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-Laws made by the Mulwarrie Local Board of Health.

By-Laws under "The Health Act, 1898," for the Mulwarrie Local Board of Health.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), the Mulwarrie Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 1.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

1. No person shall erect within the district of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.

2. No closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 20 feet from any business place or dwelling, unless with the express permission of the Local Board; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

3. Authority under Section 173, Sub-section 3.—The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the following size, shape, style, and materials:—18in. deep, 15in. diameter, circular; constructed of galvanised iron, and fitted with two handles and tight-fitting lid.

BY-LAW No. 4.

There shall be provided by the occupier two receptacles for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be properly cleansed.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 7.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depôts or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depôts or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 8.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid, as prescribed in the foregoing clause, shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No. 10.

No person shall remove any nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Every nightman shall forfeit and pay to the Local Board the penalties hereinafter specified, in case he shall commit any breach of the conditions upon which his license is issued:—

- (a.) For neglecting to remove any pan at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose, 5s.
- (b.) For any and every repetition of such neglect within three months of a neglect in removing any pan, £1.
- (c.) For each neglect to substitute a clean pan for every pan removed, 10s.
- (d.) For each neglect to place a cleansed pan in its proper position for use, 10s.
- (e.) For each neglect to clean or keep deodorised any pan, nightcart, or other vehicle, 10s.
- (f.) For every neglect or failure to properly dispose of nightsoil as soon as it is deposited at the depôt, £1.
- (g.) For depositing any load or part of any load of nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Local Board, £5.
- (h.) For neglecting to close the door or gate of any yard, or the door of any closet which was closed when the nightman entered, 10s.

- (i.) For permitting any night-cart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during prohibited hours, £1.
- (j.) For neglecting to cleanse any public latrine in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing, 10s.
- (k.) For spilling the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises, 5s.
- (l.) For neglecting to comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Local Board, £1.
- (m.) For any failure to replace any pan when so ordered by the Local Board, £1.
- (n.) For any or every neglect to clean soiled pans, 10s.
- (o.) For allowing any refuse, rubbish, or slops for pigs to be removed in carts or receptacles, or by other than those specially set apart for that purpose, 5s.
- (p.) For any failure or neglect on the part of any nightman or any of his employees to keep books in accordance with the direction of the Local Board, 10s.
- (q.) For any charge collected from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified in Schedule "A," and satisfactorily proved to the Local Board, 10s.

BY-LAW No. 12.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 13.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 14.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 15.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof, or any offensive smell therefrom.

2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 16.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 17.

No person shall store or keep any bone-dust, or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 18.

1. Every occupier or owner of any premises wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, or swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the depot or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 19.

1. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.

No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 20.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 21.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25ft. from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock, or bedding, or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 22.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of "The Health Act, 1898," whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee as set forth in Schedule "D" hereto, of the amount of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be limewashed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 23.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 25.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the District of the Local Board.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 26.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacles to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 27.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for the purpose.

BY-LAW No. 29.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the municipality or townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 30.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 31.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles, fitted with close fitting covers or lids, for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds used in any laundry or dwelling, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed, as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 32.

No foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 33.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No 34

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence [besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws] to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

EXTRADITION TREATY—SERVIA.

Saint James's, 15th June, 1901.

AT THE COURT AT SAINT JAMES'S,

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it is, amongst other things, enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any

fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a treaty was concluded on the 6th day of December, one thousand nine hundred, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the King of Serbia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the King of Serbia, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within their respective territories, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up; the said High Contracting Parties have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a treaty for this purpose, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Sir George Francis Bonham, a Baronet of the United Kingdom, Her Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Serbia;

And His Majesty the King of Serbia, His Excellency Monsieur Alexa S. Jovanovic, His President of the Council of Ministers, Minister for Foreign Affairs, Member of the Council of State, Grand Officer of the Order of Milosh the Great, Grand Cross of the Order of Takovo, Officer of the Order of the White Eagle, Commander of the Order of St. Sava, Grand Cross of the Order of Osmanieh, etc., etc.;

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime or offence committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

ARTICLE II.

The crimes or offences for which the extradition is to be granted are the following:—

1. Murder, or attempt, or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
4. Counterfeiting or altering money, or uttering counterfeit or altered money.
5. Knowingly making any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for counterfeiting coin.
6. Forgery, counterfeiting, or altering or uttering what is forged, or counterfeited, or altered.
7. Embezzlement or larceny.
8. Malicious injury to property, by explosives or otherwise, if the offence be indictable.
9. Obtaining money, goods, or valuable securities by false pretences.
10. Receiving money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen, embezzled, or unlawfully obtained.
11. Crimes against bankruptcy law.
12. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, or director, or member, or public officer of any Company made criminal by any law for the time being in force.
13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
14. Rape.
15. Carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have carnal knowledge, of a girl under 14 years of age.
16. Indecent assault.
17. Procuring miscarriage, administering drugs, or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of a woman.
18. Abduction.
19. Child stealing.
20. Abandoning children, exposing or unlawfully detaining them.
21. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
22. Burglary or housebreaking.
23. Arson.
24. Robbery with violence.
25. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person in a railway train.
26. Threats by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort.
27. Piracy by law of nations.
28. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.
29. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas, with intent to destroy life, or do grievous bodily harm.
30. Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.
31. Dealing in slaves.

Extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both the Contracting Parties.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial, within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination, or is undergoing sentence under a conviction for any other crime within the territories of the two High Contracting Parties respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until after he has been discharged, whether by acquittal or on expiration of his sentence, or otherwise.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution, or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has in fact been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored or had an opportunity of returning to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of the accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

If the fugitive has been arrested in the British Dominions, he shall forthwith be brought before a competent Magistrate, who is to examine him and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the British Dominions.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the British Dominions shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in Serbia, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of, a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or Judicial Officer of Police of Serbia.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or Judicial Officer of Police of Serbia, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be the true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or Judicial Officer of Police of Serbia.

4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice or of Foreign Affairs of Serbia; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law in that part of the British Dominions where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XI.

On the part of the Servian Government the extradition shall take place as follows in Serbia:—

The Minister, or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in Serbia, shall send to the Minister for Foreign Affairs, in support of each demand for extradition, an authentic and duly legalised copy either of a certificate of condemnation or of a warrant of arrest against an incriminated or accused person, showing clearly the nature of the crime or offence on account of which proceedings are being taken against the fugitive. The judicial document so produced shall be accompanied by a description and other particulars serving to establish the identity of the person whose extradition is claimed.

In case the documents produced by the British Government to establish the identity, and the particulars gathered by the Servian police authorities for the same purpose, should be deemed to be insufficient, notice thereof shall forthwith be given to the Minister or other Diplomatic Agent of Her Britannic Majesty in Serbia, and the individual whose extradition is desired, if he has been arrested, shall remain in detention until the British Government has produced new elements of proof to establish his identity, or to clear up any other difficulties arising in the examination.

ARTICLE XII.

The extradition shall not take place unless the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to. In Her Britannic Majesty's dominions the fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered until the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his being committed to prison to await his surrender.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers, on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper Tribunal thereof shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered, at the time of his apprehension, shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery thereof, be given up when the extradition takes place, and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any such Colony or foreign possessions may be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by any person authorised to act in such Colony or possession as a Consular Officer of Serbia.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of criminals from Serbia who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties at any time on giving to the other six months' notice of its intention to do so.

The Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Belgrade as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in Duplicate at Belgrade, the ^{6 December}/_{23 November} 1900.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Serbia, and of the said Treaty with Serbia.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Regulations.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

R. CECIL CLIFTON,
Under Secretary for Lands.

1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.

2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley Quarantine Area for any other part of the State of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.

4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve ⁶³²⁰ Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.

5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve ⁶³²⁰ Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily proclaimed quarantine areas, and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve ⁶³²⁰ Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—

- (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
- (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained, and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the salting-floor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

7. All stock carried from any other port of Western Australia than the Port of Wyndham, in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the then next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area.

8. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the then next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle

shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

9. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500.

Interpretation Clauses.

"East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.

"Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.

"Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.

"Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.

"Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats.

"Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

By-Laws for the Management of Reserve 7628
(PROTECTION OF CAVES).

THE following By-laws are published in accordance with Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898":—

1. No person shall enter any cave unless accompanied by the Caretaker.

2. No person shall break, remove, or deface by writing or marking, nor in any way damage any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, nor remove any rock, stalactite or stalagmite from any cave, nor in any way injure the stairways, ladders, cave-gates, railings or vegetation on the Caves Reserve ⁷⁶²⁸.

3. Every visitor to the caves shall act in obedience to the instructions of the Caretaker whilst being shown through the Caves, and the Caretaker may exclude or remove from the Caves any person guilty of improper conduct.

4. No person shall use any artificial light in the Caves except candles or magnesium ribbon.

5. Any person guilty of infringing any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Clause 6.

(6.) The lessee or applicant for a lease, as the case may be, may summon the caveator or his agent to attend before the Supreme Court, or a Judge in Chambers, or the Registrar of the mining district in which the lease or application for lease is situate, to show cause why such caveat should not be removed; and such Court, Judge, or Registrar may, upon proof that the caveator has been summoned, make such order in the premises, either *ex parte* or otherwise, as to such Court, Judge, or Registrar shall appear fit.

Clause 9.

(9.)
