WHEREAS by the 17th Section of "The Health Act, 1898," the area of any district defined for the purposes of a Local Board of Health may from time to time be extended or contracted by the Governor by Order in Council: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to contract the boundaries of the district of the South Perth Local Board of Health as defined by Order in Council of the 9th day of June, 1897: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the

Leonora Municipality.

BY-LAW No. 77.

FOR SUPPRESSION OF DISORDERLY HOUSES.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Leonora, made under Section 167 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 77.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Leonora Municipality order as follows:—

1. A declaration made by five ratepayers of the Leonora Municipality that any house in Tower Street, Leonora, is of a disorderly character, and a nuisance to the public, shall be deemed sufficient evidence for proceedings to be taken at the Local Court by the Municipal Council or police officers.

2. Any person being either owner, landlord, agent, tenant, proprietor, or occupier, who lets or occupies the premises declared to be of a disorderly character, or a public nuisance, or any part thereof, with the knowledge that any person occupying such premises or part thereof is the keeper of a disorderly house, or is wilfully a party to the continued use of such building or part thereof as a disorderly house, or a public nuisance, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and a further penalty not exceeding £5 for each and every day during which such persons shall, after forty-eight hours' notice to desist from the inspector appointed by the council or police officer, continue to act, let, control, occupy, or manage any such premises or part thereof as aforesaid.

3. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent any number of persons being proceeded against simultaneously, or either together or separately, as owners, landlords, agents, tenants, proprietors, managers, or occupiers of such premises or part thereof, for any breach of any provisions of this By-law.

Municipality of Malcolm.

BY-LAW No. 73.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Malcolm, made under Section 170 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and numbered 73, for regulating the prevention of animals straying on streets, etc.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Malcolm order as follows:—

a. *Cattle at large on Unenclosed Land.*—If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other

dividing such first-mentioned land from any street, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle; and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any Justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons, stating his name, had been effected, or if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the Justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the Justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded, then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are to be recovered.

(b.) *Cattle at large in Streets.*—If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit, for every head of such cattle, a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as, after the sale of the cattle, may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices are by law to be recovered; and if, in the case of any information under this section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating Justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

(c.) *Goats sold for trespass to be released or killed.*—If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions for trespass in the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this By-law, relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not, after the expiration of twenty-four hours, be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any Justice may by warrant under his hand, directed to any constable, authorise the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

Permits to Land in South Africa.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that persons desirous of proceeding to South Africa must first obtain a "Permit to Land" in South Africa at this Office, in accordance with the following telegraphic instructions received by His Excellency the Governor-General from the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Minute for the Right Honourable the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia.

The Governor-General has to submit for the earnest consideration of the Right Honourable the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia the subjoined copy of a telegraphic despatch, which has this day been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, viz. :—

In consequence of the establishment of Martial Law at all British South African Ports, it has been decided, with the concurrence of the Governments of the Cape Colony and Natal, that after 1st January next persons desiring to land in those Colonies must provide themselves with a Permit. Permits are to be issued in this Country by a special Permit Officer on the production of a *Certificate* signed by a Member of Parliament, Justice of the Peace, Clergyman or Minister, or Officer of His Majesty's Forces, to the effect that the applicant is in possession of at least £100, or is in a position to maintain himself in South Africa; that the object of his journey (object to be stated) is *bonâ fide*, and that he has not been deported or sent out of South Africa as indigent. Applicant, after producing satisfactory Certificate, is required to sign a *declaration* to the same effect, with the additional statement that he will not directly assist, in any way whatsoever, His Majesty's enemies in South Africa, and that he is aware of the penalty for so doing under Martial Law. Members of one family to be shown on *permit issued* to the head, provided that a Separate Permit will be required for each son or daughter over sixteen. Notice published stating that passengers from Colonial Ports must supply themselves with Permits from the Colonial Secretary or some Officer appointed by the Colonial Government, who will satisfy himself, as far as possible, that applicants fulfil the above conditions. Specimen copies of permit and of notice, summarised above, are being sent to you by mail. Permits are available only to enable passengers to land in South Africa, and are no guarantee that they will be allowed to proceed inland. Two copies of each permit issued will be retained, one for record in the office of issue,

and the second to be despatched by earliest opportunity to officer at port to which the passenger is proceeding, namely, The Embarkation Officer, Capetown; The Commandant, Port Elizabeth; The Commandant, East London; and The Embarkation Officer, Durban.

His Majesty's Government feel sure that they may confidently rely on the special assistance of your Government in this matter, as all the authorities in South Africa are agreed that this measure is necessary to prevent undesirable persons from entering South Africa at the present time.

Persons proceeding from Foreign ports are being notified that they should obtain permits through the British Consular Officers.

DIVISION VIII.—REGULATION 128.

Attorney or Agent to be appointed.

(a.) The registered proprietor of any lease, claim, or authorised holding, not being resident within the Goldfield or Goldfield District on which such lease, claim, or authorised holding is situate, shall, within thirty days of his being so registered, appoint an attorney or agent resident within such Goldfield or Goldfield District, upon whom any summons or other legal process may be served; and shall register the name and address of such attorney or agent (in the form of Schedule 32) at the office of the Warden for the Goldfield or Goldfield District in which the lease, claim, or authorised holding is situate.

(b.) The registered proprietor of any lease, claim, or authorised holding, or of any share therein, resident within the Goldfield or Goldfield District, intending to absent himself from his usual place of abode or business on the Goldfield or Goldfield District in which his lease, claim, or authorised holding is situate, for a longer period than thirty days, shall, prior to his so doing, appoint an attorney or agent resident within such Goldfield or Goldfield District, upon whom any summons or other legal process may be served, and shall register the name and address of such attorney or agent, in the form of Schedule 32, at the office of the Warden for the Goldfield or Goldfield District in which the lease, claim, or other authorised holding is situate.

(c.) In the event of such appointment and registration not being so made, any summons or other legal process required by these Regulations to be personally served shall be deemed to have been sufficiently served upon such person, provided a copy thereof shall have been posted at the Warden's Office (and on some conspicuous part of such lease, claim, or authorised holding to which the same refers) at least ten clear days before the return day thereof.

(d.) This Regulation shall not apply to any Company registered under the provisions of "The Companies Act, 1893."

DIVISION XII.—JUDICIAL REGULATION No. 4.

Service of Summonses.

(a.) Service of Summonses, except in the cases hereinafter specially provided for, shall be personal on the defendant or his registered attorney or agent. If such service be found impossible then it shall be deemed sufficient service if a copy thereof be posted outside the Warden's Office, and (if the cause of action relates to any lease, claim, or authorised holding) also on a conspicuous part of such lease, claim, or authorised holding.

(b.) When the defendant or his registered attorney or agent is working in any mine or other works underground, it shall be sufficient service to deliver the summonses at the mine or works to the engineman, bracedman, or other person apparently in charge of the mine or works.

(d.) When the defendant is a company or corporation registered under the provisions of "The Companies Act, 1893," service of summonses on such company or corporation may be effected by delivering the same or sending it through the post in a prepaid registered letter, addressed to the Company at its Registered Office.

(e.) When from any cause it has been found impossible to serve a summons within the time allowed, the Bailiff or other person shall give notice of the same to the Mining Registrar, who may extend the day of hearing of the plaint, and issue a fresh summons accordingly, and shall give notice of such extension of time to the plaintiff.

(f.) When the defendant resides not more than 50 miles from the Court a summons shall be served not less than four clear days, and in all other cases not less than 10 clear days before the return day thereof.
