THE MARINE STORES ACT, 1902.

REGULATIONS.

Interpretation.

- In these regulations—
 - "Dealer" means a Licensed Marine Stores dealer.
 - "Collector" means a Licensed Marine Stores Collector.
 - "Cart" means a cart used for collecting marine stores.
 - "Truck" means a truck used for collecting marine stores.

Registration of Licenses.

2. (a.) Licenses, renewals of licenses, revocations of licenses, and all other matters by "The Marine Stores Act, 1902," or these Regulations requiring registration shall be registered in the Office of the Commissioner of Police at Perth, in a book to be kept for that purpose.

(b.) The register of dealers' licenses and collectors' licenses shall be kept separate.

(c.) The entry of any license in the register shall contain the following particulars, namely, the number of the license, the date of the license, the name and address of the licensee.

Advertising lists of licenses, etc.

3. Lists of licenses issued, and of revocations and forfeitures thereof, shall be published quarterly in the *Police Gazette*.

Badges.

4. (a.) Every collector shall wear on his left arm a metal badge bearing the words "Marine Stores Collector," and his registered number.

(b.) The badges will be issued by the Commissioner of Police on payment of the sum of Two shillings and sixpence each, and will remain the property of the Government.

(c.) A refund of Two shillings and sixpence each will be allowed on badges returned to the office of the Commissioner of Police.

Collectors to notify approach.

5. Collectors shall make known their approach by either ringing a bell or by calling out, and no collector shall enter any premises without the knowledge or permission of the owner or an occupier thereof; and in the event of no response being made to the call, knock, or other signal of any collector, he shall immediately leave the premises.

Name, etc., of dealer to be painted on carts.

6. (a.) The name and address of the dealer, followed by the words "Licensed Marine Stores Dealer," shall be painted in white letters of not less than two inches long and of a proportionate breadth, on a dark ground on the near side of each cart and truck.

(b.) The number of the owner's license shall be painted in figures of not less than six inches in length, and of a proportionate width, in a conspicuous place on the back of each cart and truck.

(c.) If a dealer owns more than one cart or truck, a distinguishing letter shall be painted on the back of each cart or truck, in addition to the number of the license, and so that no two carts or trucks of the same dealer shall bear the same distinguishing letter.

(d.) This Regulation shall apply to collectors and to their carts and trucks, except that the word "collector" shall be substituted for "dealer."

Maximum charge for carts or trucks.

7. The maximum amount which shall be taken by any dealer from a collector for the use or hire of any cart or truck shall be as follows:—For horse and cart, Six shillings per day; for cart or hand truck, One shilling per day.

Dealers' signs.

8. Every dealer shall exhibit in a prominent part of his business premises, in clear view of the public, a sign on which is painted, in letters of not less than six inches in length and of a proportionate width, his name and the words "licensed dealer in marine stores," followed by the number of his license.

Dealers' licenses—Hearing applications for.

9. The clerk of petty sessions, on receipt of notice of application under Section 10 of the Act, shall set the application down for hearing at the first sitting of the court, not less than 10 days after the receipt of such notice, and in case of application being opposed, shall give due notice to the applicant.

Lists of licenses to be forwarded.

10. Every clerk of petty sessions shall forward to the Commissioner of Police, monthly, a list of all licenses issued by him.

BY-LAW.

CITY OF PERTH.

IN PURSUANCE of the powers contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act 1900," and "The Municipal Institutions Act Amendment Act, 1902" (No. 3), the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Perth order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 3 of the By-laws passed by the Council of the City of Perth on the 21st day of January, 1901, for the regulation and licensing of public vehicles and drivers is hereby repealed, and the following is substituted therefor:—

3a. Any person desirous of obtaining such a license for any omnibus, cab, or dray, shall apply for the same to the Licensing Officer, and unless such vehicle shall be already licensed within the Municipality of Perth under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876," shall pay the fee set forth in Schedule H. Such licenses shall, if granted, be in such of the forms of Schedule A as shall be applicable.

RAINFALL FOR YEAR 1902.

(Completed as far as possible.)

THE accompanying table shows the rainfall for last year, at every station in the State from which returns have been received. At a few the records are still incomplete, and totals for 10 or 11 months are given, as stated in the footnote.

Compared with the averages for previous years, the fall was very light in the principal agricultural areas, i.e., from Geraldton to Bunbury, and for about a hundred miles inland. In the Perth district we received only 26 inches, as against an average of 31, and in the next square degree East, which includes Newcastle, Northam, and York, rather less than a mean of 15 inches was recorded, the average for previous years being 21. Along the South coast, between the Leeuwin and Esperance, the fall was about normal. Throughout the Goldfields and in the South-East it was considerably in excess of the average. The Kalgoorlie district, for example, had 13½ inches, as against 7 for previous years. From Geraldton and the Murchison Northwards it was mostly rather light on the coast, and fairly heavy inland. In the tropics it varied considerably, but was on the whole about normal.

The fall was distributed amongst the individual months as follows:—

- January.—Very heavy throughout the State, except in central West coastal districts, where only a few showers fell.
- February.—Very light in West and South-West districts. Heavy in interior and tropics.
- March.—Very light throughout.
- April.—Very light throughout.
- May.—Heavy throughout South-West districts; slightly above normal in West coastal districts. Patchy on Fields, but, on the whole, in excess of average for previous years. Light in the tropics.
- June.—Below average in West and South-West districts. Elsewhere about normal.
- July.—Very heavy in South-West districts, especially during first half of month. Elsewhere normal.
- August.—Very dry, except on the Goldfields and in the extreme South.
- September.—Universally heavy, generally, South of the tropics.
- October.—Generally about normal, but light in the neighbourhood of Perth. Heavy thunderstorm on Goldfields on the 19th.
- November.—Light throughout the State, except at a few places in tropics and on the Goldfields, where heavy scattered thunderstorms occurred.
- December.—Very light, except in the extreme North and extreme South-East.

VICTORIA PLAINS ROADS BOARD.

By-LAWS UNDER "THE ROADS ACT AMENDMENT, 1894," FOR MOORA TANK AND OTHER WATER SUPPLIES UNDER BOARD'S CONTROL.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws by virtue of Section 9 of "The Roads Act, 1888," Amendment, 58 Vict., No. 17:—

1. No person shall bathe in any tank, spring, or other water situate within any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply.

2. No person shall encamp upon any land specially set apart for purpose of water supply, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.

3. No person shall bring or deposit into or upon any reserve specially set apart for purpose of water supply any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse within any such reserve any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever.

4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water of any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit, or other filthy water, to find its way into any stream, catch-drain, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall for each such offence be liable to the penalty imposed by these Regulations.

5. The Board may at any time restrict the water in any of the dams, tanks, etc., for human consumption only, by affixing a notice to that effect in a conspicuous place at the dam or tank in question.

6. The following charge will be made for water at Moora tank:—

(a.) Horses and Cattle, 1d. per head per drink.

(b.) Sheep and Goats, 3d. per score per drink.

(c.) Other water supplied will be charged for at the rate of 1d. for five gallons, and *pro rata* up to 50 gallons; over that quantity a *pro rata* charge of 6d. for every additional 50 gallons supplied.

7. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
