Sir,-I have the honour to inform you that, in consequence of representations which have been received from Lord Milner, it has been decided that in future no permits to proceed to the Transval or Orange River Colony shall be issued elsewhere than at the South African ports. A copy of a notice on the subject which is being communicated to

the Press is enclosed herewith. I have to request that you will give instructions accord-ingly to the officers who are charged with the issue of permits, and whose services in this capacity will now no longer be required.

Copies of a notice on the subject which has been issued by the Transvaal and Orange River Colony Governments and of the form which applicants should fill up are also enclosed.

NOTICE.

To Persons intending to visit the Transvaal or Orange River Colony,

COLONY. It is notified, for information, that permits to enter the Transvaal or Orange River Colony are still required, except by persons exempted in the terms of the Ordinance quoted below. Such permits are issued at all coast ports in British South Africa, at Bulawayo, and at Lourenco Marques. Bargourge about to active the

Marques. Persons about to visit the new colonies are advised, in order to save themselves delay and disappointment, to forward their application for permits at least one week before their departure, in order that the permits may be ready for them when they land. Applications should, in the case of British subjects, be addressed to the Permit Secretary at the intended port of disembarkation. Foreigners should make application through their Consular represen-tatives

tatives.

tatives. Persons proceeding via Delagoa Bay should address their applications to H.B.M. Consul General, Lourenco Marques. Application forms are obtainable at the Colonial Office, London, at the principal South African Shipping Offices in London and Southamp-ton, at the Bank of Afr.ca and Standard Bank of South Africa in London, and on board the principal South African bound steamers. The following extract from the Peace Preservation Ordinance, Trans-vaal, is published for information. The terms of the Peace Preserva-tion Ordinance, Orange River Colony, Sections 19 to 23, are mutatis mutandis identical:— "19.—After the date of this Ordinance no person shall enter this colony withouta permit grauted under the terms of this Ordinance, unless—

- (a.) He was resident and within this Colony or the Orange River Colony on the 31st May, 1902, and has not since that date been expelled from or ordered to leave this Colony or the Orange River Colony.
- (b) He has since the 31st May, 1902, and before the date of this Ordinance, received a permit or other formal authorization to enter this Colony from some duly constituted authority.
- (c.) He is a person coming within the provisions of Article 2 of the Terms of Nurrender signed at Pretoria on the 31st May, 1902, and published in the Gazette Extraordinary, dated 3rd June, 1902

(d.) He is a person employed in His Majesty's Navy or Military Service, or in the Civil Service, or in any Police Force of this cclony or the Orange River Colony
"20.—Permits to enter the colony under this Ordinance shall be granted by such persons as may be authorised to do so by the Governor, and shall be in such form as the Governor may direct. No such permit shall be granted to any person who, having been a Burgher of the South Afr can Republic or the Orange Free State, has not taken the Oath of Allegiance to His Majesty or made some declara-tion of equivalent import in form approved by the Governor. In all other cases it shall be in the discretion of the Governor to grant or refuse any permit.

"21.—1t shall be lawful for the Colonial Secretary, if he has reason to believe that any person is residing or sojourning in this colon having entered it without proper authority, to give notice thereof to any Resident Magistrate that he has obtained a permit under this Ordinance or is exempt under the has obtained a permit under this Ordinance or is exempt under the provisions of Section 19 from obtaining such person to leave the Colony within seven days, unless before the expiration of that time he has received permission is writing from the Colonial Secretary to remain in the colony; such permission shall have the same effect as a permit granted under this Ordinance. "22.—(1) If any person in whose case such order has been made is found within the colony after the expiration of seven days after service of such order without having obtained permission from the Colonial Secretary as aforesaid, he may be arrested and brought before a Magistrate, and shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned for a period not less than one month and not more than six months and with or without a fine not exceeding £500, and in default of payment to a further term of imprisonment not exceeding six months.

(2) If any person imprisoned under the terms of the preceding Sub-section shall remain in the colony for a period of more than seven days after the expiration of his term of imprisonment or any subse-quent term of imprisonment inflicted under this section, without obtaining permission in writing from the Colonial Secretary to remain in the colony, he may be arrested and bronght before a Magistrate, and shall, on conviction, be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, for a period of not less than six months and not more than twelve months, and with or without a fine not exceeding £500, and in default of pay-ment to a further term of imprisonment not exceeding six months. Enclosure to Circular dated 2nd December, 1903. After the 1st December no permits to proceed to the Transvaal or Orange River Colony will be issued in the United Kingdom, or by His Majesty's Consular Officers abroad, or elsewhere than at the South African ports. Persons wishing to proceed to the Transvaal or Orange River Colony should therefore apply for the necessary permits to enable them to do so to the Transvaal and Orange River Colony Permit Office at the port at which they propose to land.

They are warned that such permits are liable to be refused by the Government of the Transvaal and Orange River Colony, and it is suggested that, in order to avoid disappointment and delay, they should ascertain before sailing for South Africa from the Permit Office at the port where they propose to land whether permits will be granted to them.

Under the Peace Preservation Ordinances now in force in the Trans-vanl'and Orange River Colony, persons who enter those colonies without permits may be ordered to leave, and if such order is not obeyed within a given time, they will be liable to fine and imprison-ment ment.

6. Any person ordering a grave in the above Cemetery shall be shown by the Secretary, or his substitute, a map of the blocks available, when such person will fill in a form after the manner of Schedule B, which form shall be handed to the Superintendent for his instruction and guidance

7. The hours of burial to be from 8 a.m. to sunset of the same day, except by special permission of the Trustees.

8. Name and age of deceased to appear in legible letters on plate or lid of coffin.

9. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground, unless permission be given by Board.

10. No grave shall be dug in the above-named Cemetery except by the Superintendent thereof, or by the special permission of the Trustees or their officers.

11. No conveyances of any description shall be allowed within the Cemetery gates except the hearse or vehicle containing the coffin.

12. No children under 10 years of age to be allowed in the Cemetery unless in charge of some person.

13. Any act of destruction of anything in the Cemetery to be followed by prosecution.

14. Four general meetings to be held at quarterly intervals during the year. The Chairman to have power to convene a m eting at any time. Two to form a quorum.

15. Any proposed alteration of these By-laws to be given in writing and to lie on the table one month before being dealt with.

16. Any person or persons violating any of the said By-laws will be prosecuted, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that under Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the management of U. B. Hisphere Council Act 27400 the Rockingham Commons A1485 and A7490.

BY - LAWS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Governor in Council, the Board of Management of the Rockingham Commonages make and ordain that the following By-laws for regulating the depasturing of horses, sheep, cattle, pigs, goats, camels, asses, and mules upon the Rockingham Commonages, and for regulating the felling and removal of any timber thereon and therefrom, be observed and enforced.

1. These By-laws shall be known and cited as the Rockingham Commonages By-laws.

2. No person shall depasture any horse, sheep, cattle, pigs, goat, camel, ass, or mule upon the Rockingham Commonages, or any part thereof, without having first obtained a license from the Board. The following fees shall be paid for licenses by any person or persons (except butchers) to depasture, issued under these By-laws, and shall be paid in advance on or before the 1st day of February in each year, and if any payments be not made when due the license shall be void :-

For cattle, horses, asses, and mules, the bond fide property of residents in the Rockingham district, threepence per head per annum.

The charge for property owners, not residents in the district, will be one shilling per head per annum.

Sheep, pigs, and goats will be strictly prohibited from the Commonages, except in the case of the local butchers and travelling stock.

In the case of the local butchers, the fee for a license to be issued under these By-laws shall be an annual sum of £1 in lieu of the above fees.

Provided, also, that travelling camels shall be allowed to depasture on the said Commonages; a fee of five shillings per head will be charged per week, or part of a week, pay-able in advance, in respect of such travelling camels.

And no fee shall be payable for any license to be issued under these By-laws in respect of any horses and cattle under the age of nine months. Provided that travelling small cattle and great cattle shall be allowed to depasture on the Rockingham Commonages for 24 hours without pay-ment of any fee; and that, after the expiration of such 24 hours, such travelling small cattle and great cattle shall be removed from the said Commonages unless a license be obtained from the Board.

For small cattle, 1d. per head per day; great cattle and horses, 3d. per head per day; and any owner or person in charge neglecting or refusing to remove them when called upon by the Board, or properly authorised person, to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Owners of great cattle not being bond fide settlers in the district may depasture same on the Commonages, on payment of fee as follows :- Great cattle 3d. per head per day.

Every applicant for a license under these By-laws shall give a correct list, in writing of the number of horses, cattle, asses, or mules that he or she shall intend to depasture on the said Commonages, and shall describe therein the brands thereon, and shall obtain a license, signed by the person duly authorised in that behalf, or the the Chairman, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Board to so depasture on the said Commonages.

4. No license shall be granted to any butcher to depasture on the said Commonages, at any one time, more than 50 sheep and 10 head of cattle for slaughtering purposes.

5. No licensee shall remove from the said Commonages any horses, sheep, cattle, asses, and mules in respect of which the fees payable under these By-laws shall not have been paid; nor shall depasture such animals on the said Commonages, except in accordance with the provisions of these By-laws.

6. No person shall depasture on the said Commonages any entire horse over nine months old, or any bull over six months of age (unless the approval of the Board has been obtained in writing), and such entire horse or bull found thereon shall be hable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by law.

The Board shall not be responsible for damage sustained from any cause whatever by any stock of any description depasturing on the said Commonages under the provisions of these By-laws.

8. The Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bonû fide traveller within the meaning of these By-laws.

9. No person shall cut, fell, or remove any timber on or from the said Commonages without having first obtained a license from the Board and paid therefor the sum of Five shillings per acre per month, except in the case of firewood for residents' own private use.

10. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or com-mits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding Five pounds and Two pounds a day for a continuing breach, not exceeding in the aggregate £20.

11. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise pro-vided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of the Board for the improvement and maintenance of the said Commonages.

COSSACK COMMON.

The Council of the Municipality of Cossack, as the Board of Management of the Cossack Common, do hereby, under the provisions of Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Cossack Common :---

1. All stock running on the common otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws to be treated as trespassing stock.

With the exception of stock owned by bond fide 2 travellers, travelling teamsters, and packers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the common free of charge; and the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Cossack Municipality only to have the right to run stock upon the common.

- Horses and Cattle shall be charged at the rate of 20s. per head per quarter or part of a quarter: Provided, however, that no person, firm, or company shall be allowed to run more than eight head of horses and cattle at any one time. All stock under twelve months old, the progeny of stock running on the common, being bond fide property of any ratepayer, shall not be charged for.
- Sheep.—Only sheep kept for killing by bona fide butchers, for supplying the public, shall be allowed butchers, for supplying the public, shall be allowed to run and depasture on the common, and such sheep shall be charged at the rate of 3d. per head per annum. 150 to be the largest number allowed on the common at one time, if only one butcher carrying on business in Cossack; should there be more than one butchering establishment, 100 sheep to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers.

Swine or Camels shall under no circumstances be permitted to run on the common.

 $\sim 3.$ That any person or persons running stock on the common may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid commonage fees.

That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making 4. use of the common, as heretofore provided, to furnish the Town Clerk or Ranger of the common with a list, giving conrect description of all stock placed by them upon the common, within 12 hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

5. Bond fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the common for the space of four clear days free of all charge; should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of 6d. per head per day or part of a day for all horses and cattle. In no case are such horses and cattle to remain on the common under this regulation longer than seven clear days at any one time. The Council shall, in all cases, be the sole judge of what constitutes a bond fide traveller, teamster, and packer.

6. No travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the Port of Cossack, shall be allowed to cross the common. The owner or drover in allowed to cross the common. The owner or drover in charge of such last-mentioned stock to give written notice with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act of 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

That all annual fees shall be due and payable on the 1st day of December in each year, and the Town Clerk shall at any time, with the approval of the Mayor or any two Councillors, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.

8. That no stock on which commonage fees are due shall be removed from the common, unless with the written sanction of the Town Clerk, until after all such fees have been paid in full.

9. That stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the common shall not be liable to pay commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.

10. That no entire horse, pig, or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the Council) shall be allowed on the common; and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).

11. The Ranger or Town Clerk for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the common.

12. For each and every breach of any one of these By-laws the owners of stock running on the common shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s., exclusive of costs, and in addition to the commonage fees, as provided in these Such penalty and fees may be recovered and By-laws. By-laws. Such penalty and rees may be recovered and enforced in a summary manner before any one or more Justices of the Peace, in manner prescribed by "The Justices Act, 1902," and shall in no way affect any fines and fees recoverable under By-laws of the Council regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of impounded stock.

LEONORA CEMETERY BY-LAWS.

All fees and charges payable to the Cemetery Trust shall be made at the time when applications are made or orders given, and all interments shall be paid for before burial takes place.

Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, 2 2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, private grave, vallt, tombstone, monument, or enclosure, or tor any other purpose, shall make application therefor at the office of the Cemetery Trust. Upon such application being approved of, the Cemetery Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form prescribed by the Act.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Cemetery Trustees at least six hours prior to the time fixed for burial.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and any other particulars shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

5. Any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be per-mitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Cemetery Trustees, after submitting a plan of same and obtain-ing the written approval of the Cemetery Trustees thereto. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

6. Every coffin shall have on the lid an improved metal plate, bearing the name and age of the deceased stamped in legible characters thereon.

£ s. d.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no inter-ment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the sur-rounding ground, after such interment.

8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, as in Schedule "A," or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.

10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the Deputy Registrar of Deaths or a Coroner. Such certificate shall be handed in to the office of the Cemetery Trustees before the funeral takes place.

11. All burials shall take place between the hours of sunrise and sunset.

At any funeral no vehicles shall under any consideration 12 be allowed to enter the Cemetery with the exception of the hearse and first mourning coach, and only the latter when driven by the undertaker or his employee.

13. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the officers of the Cemetery Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing same to be used, or by the contractor for the erections.

14. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

15. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work in the Cemetery, deposit with the Cemetery Trustees the sum of Ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if the previous By-law is not complied with to the satisfaction of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.

16. Subject to the approval of the Cemetery Trustees each proprietor shall enclose his land with tile, slate, or stone kerbing, and shall cause to be placed thereon the number of the grave or vault. No mounds shall be allowed. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the supervision and approval of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.

17. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure except such as shall be approved by the Cemetery Trustees.

18. All workmen, whether employed by the Cemetery Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees, and shall only obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and By-laws, or neglecting or refusing to comply with any directions of the said officer, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other adjoin-ing grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave except with the permission of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.
- (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the officer of the Cemetery Trustees.
- (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with all despatch and only during regulation hours.

No dogs shall be admitted to the Cemetery, and any found 20 there shall be liable to be destroyed.

21. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any rule, regulation, or By-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directed. directs.

22No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or other wise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

23. No person employed by or under the Cemetery Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in the discharge of his duties, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work, under a liability of summary dismissal.

24. The Mayor and Councillors of the Leonora Municipality shall be the Trustees of the Cemetery.

THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1895.

4th February, 1903.

Rules for the Conduct of Examinations and ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES UNDER "THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1895" (59 VICT., No. 14).

HE Land Surveyors' Licensing Board, appointed under the above Act, has, with the approval of His Excel-lency the Administrator, made the following Rules for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act; and cancelled the Rules gazetted on 2nd August, 1901 :-

1. Examination of candidates for certificates or licenses as surveyors will be held in Perth in the month of Sep-tember of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board :-

- (a.) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
- (b.) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no license to practise as a surveyor will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a.) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evi-dence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b.) Or he shall have passed, at any University recognised by an Australasian University, the matriculation examina-tion, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c.) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall 6. produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, and a further fee of 22 2s, paid for the issue of a certificate of competency and license, the candidate will be admitted to examination. Such fee will be returned if the candidate is unsuccessful in passing the examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects :-

Mathematics.

(a.) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as and algebra. far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b.) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries. Principles and practices of surveying.

(c.) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, sub-divisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under the Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Levelling, etc.

(d.) Levelling, grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e.) Principles of construction, adjustment, and use of the following instruments :- Theodolite, planetable, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tacheometer, and steel band.

 $Field\ astronomy,\ geodesy,\ etc.$

(f.) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth; reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g.) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h.) Physics and geology (elementary); names and descriptions of Australasian timbers of economic value (viva voce).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

12. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall, upon payment of the prescribed fees, receive from the Board a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor licensed in Western Australia prior to eptember, 1895, or any surveyor licensed prior to September, 1895, in any other of the Australasian States or

Colonies, who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the Certificate of Competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and, on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a Certificate of Competency. Such application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

LICENSES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may, upon payment of the prescribed fees, issue a license to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, subsequent to September, 1895, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his certificate.

15. Any surveyor who is licensed to survey in any other of the Australasian States or Colonies applying to the Board for a license to practise in Western Australia may, on production of a letter of recommendation, dated within the preceding twelve months, from the Board of the State in which he is licensed, together with satisfactory evidence as to identity out to abaptive he articled to a license s to identity and to character, be entitled to a license to survey in Western Australia. Such application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

16. In the event of failure of any candidate to pass the full examination, the Board may, at its discretion, remit one-half the fees at any subsequent examination of such candidate.

17. The Board may grant a letter of recommendation to any surveyor licensed in and desiring to be registered in another Colony, either without examination or on such viva voce examination as, in the opinion of the Board, may be necessary.

TIMBER TRAMWAYS.

H IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council-has been pleased, under the provisions of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902," to approve of the Regulations as hereunder, for the construction and working of Timber Tramways through and upon Crown Lands and Reserves, in lieu of those published in the Government Gazette of 25th April, 1902, which are hereby cancelled.

Regulations for the Construction and Working of Timber Tramways under "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902."

1. Application for permission to construct and use tramways through and upon Crown Lands and Reserves shall be made in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall be lodged with or forwarded by registered post addressed to the Minister for Lands at his office in Perth, and accompanied by a deposit equal to the amount of rent or proportion thereof due upon the next half-yearly period appointed for payment thereof, and calculated as in the Second Regulation set forth, which deposit shall be returned if the application is not approved, and shall also be accompanied by a plan showing the position of the proposed tramway, such plan to contain sufficient data to enable the position of the tramway to be accurately delineated on the plans of the Department of Lands and Surveys. On approval of the application, permission in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, with such other conditions as the Governor may deem fit to impose, will be issued to the applicant.

Before the issue of any permission the applicant will be required to enter into a bond with two or more sureties approved by the Minister, to observe and abide by the conditions therein and in these Regulations contained, in all respects.

2. The rent payable in respect of such permission shall be such sum as may be fixed by the Governor, but shall not in any case be less than Two pounds (\pounds 2) per annum for each mile or fraction of a mile of the length of the proposed tramway.

Such rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of March and the first day of September in each year.

3. Upon receipt of the acknowledgment from the Minister of the receipt of an application, and before the granting of any permission to construct and use a firewood tramway will be made, the applicant shall cause the application to be advertised in at least two consecutive issues of some newspaper circulating in the district of the proposed tramway, and shall forward to the Minister a copy of the advertisement.

4. If the locality of the proposed tramway be within the limits of any proclaimed goldfield, the applicant shall at the same time cause a copy of the application to be posted at the principal office of the Warden of such goldfield, and shall forward a copy thereof to the Minister.

5. The applicant shall set forth in the application the nature of the motive power proposed to be used for haulage purposes on the tramline.

6. Any person shall have the right to object at any time within fourteen days of the last advertisement or posting of such notice, whichever shall last occur, to the granting of the permission applied for by notice, in writing, addressed to the Minister setting forth the reasons of such objection, and lodged at his office in Perth, or sent to him, addressed as above, by registered post; a copy of such notice will be sent to the applicant by the Minister.

7. The Minister may summon the applicant and the objector to appear before him and state more fully their reasons.

8. Any person to whom permission may be granted to construct a tramway shall, within one month of the completion of same, and before commencing the user, notify the Minister of the completion, and at the same time furnish at his own cost a plan showing the portion completed, such plan to be signed by a licensed surveyor, and the survey represented thereon must be carried out to the satisfaction of the Surveyor General, in accordance with the rules and regulations for the guidance of surveyors working for the Department of Land and Surveys. Failure to notify the Minister or supply the necessary plan shall render the permission liable to cancellation.

9. Should any person to whom permission to construct a tramway as aforesaid is given, fail to construct and properly equip one quarter of the tramway within six months, and the whole within twelve months from the date he is notified of approval, or should he fail to use such line for the purpose for which permission is granted for a period of one month, the permission will be cancelled; provided that the Minister may, by writing under his hand, grant exemption from using such tramway for any period not exceeding three months. The granting of such exemption shall not relieve the holder from the payment of the prescribed rent.

10. Any person to whom permission to construct and use a tramway is granted may, without any further permission, construct and use spur lines on both sides of the main line. But no spur line shall extend beyond a boundary parallel with the main line and distant two and a-half miles therefrom, measured at right angles, and the grantee shall lodge at the Department of Lands and Surveys, once at least in every three months, a plan showing all spur lines and deviations. No such permission shall be transferred, assigned, mortgaged, sub-let, or otherwise disposed of, without the approval, in writing, of the Governor first had and obtained, and on payment of the prescribed fees.

11. No alteration or extension shall be made to the proposed line of the tramway without the previous consent, in writing, of the Governor first had and obtained.

Dogs, 6d. each do. 6d. Sheep, 1d. each do. 6d.

VEHICLES,

Carriages, 8s. each. Buggies and dog-carts, 6s. each. Two-wheeled vehicles, 6s. each. Drays (two-wheeled), 6s. each. Drays (four-wheeled), 8s. each.

Transhipment Cargo.

8. On all goods transhipped from vessels or lighters (secured to Jetties), to other vessels or lighters, a charge of 1s. per ton will be enforced.

Cargo received ex ships on to jetties or into trucks, for transhipment to other ships will be charged 2s. per ton, *plus* 9d. per ton for each handling by the Department.

Transhipment charges on coal ex ships fastened to jetties into coal hulks, for bunkering purposes only, will not be made.

9. Wharfage and other charges on all goods must be prepaid to the Pier Master or officer in charge, unless the consignee or consignor has a duly authorised ledger account with the Railway Department.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

10. Before commencing to discharge or tranship cargoes, ship masters or their agents shall hand to the Pier Master or officer in charge a freight list of the cargo, which shall include mark, number, shipper, consignee, weight, or measurement.

11. Inward cargoes shall be delivered into railway trucks or trollies, and, as far as it is practicable, ship masters shall deliver cargoes according to the entries on bills of lading or manifests.

12. To insure prompt and correct deliveries to consignees, special efforts shall be made by ship masters to deliver goods of the same nature and brand together, *i.e.*, where bag stuffs are available they shall be delivered together, where cases are available they shall be delivered together, etc.

13. Outward cargoes to be delivered in the same order as inward cargoes. Goods for different ports to be kept separately.

14. No goods shall be landed or placed on the jetties without the written authority of the Pier Master or officer in charge.

15. If it shall appear that goods are being landed, and cannot, in the opinion of the Pier Master or officer in charge, be removed in time to prevent a "block," the Pier Master or officer in charge may give notice, in writing, to the masters or persons in charge of vessels or lighters from which goods are being discharged to stop discharging cargo, and, upon such notice being given, no further cargo shall be discharged until such time as the Pier Master or officer in charge may direct.

16. The official hours for trucking will be from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. from the 1st of October to the 30th of April, with an interval of one hour for dinner. On Saturdays the hours will be from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. From the 1st of May to the 30th of September the hours will be from 8 a.m. to 5 30 p.m., with an interval of one hour for dinner. Saturdays, 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

17. On all goods trucked after hours, on holidays, or on Sundays, at the request of shipping agents or others, the Pier Master or officer in charge will levy, in addition to the ordinary rates, the amount of overtime charges incurred.

18. Cargoes which are partly free and partly for bond shall be taken to the receiving warehouses, where they will be tallied by officers representing respectively the Customs and Railway Departments.

19. If free goods are not removed from the receiving warehouses within 48 hours from the time they are placed therein, a storage charge of 1s. per ton or 2d. per package per day will be made.

20. Goods not cleared at the Customs House will be kept in the receiving warehouses for 24 consecutive hours after delivery *ex* ship, to enable the consignees to clear same or enter them for bond. If at the end of 24 hours goods are uncleared they will be delivered to Customs, and a charge of 1s. per ton (minimum 3d.) per consignment will be made for haulage from the receiving warehouses to Customs.

21. Cargoes going direct into bond shall be tallied by railway and ship's officers. The railway officer shall, if requested, give receipts for all deliveries ex ship during official working hours.

22. The Railway Department will deliver bonded goods to Customs between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. from October 1st to 30th April, and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. from May 1st to September 30th. On Saturday, work shall cease at 1 p.m.

23. HIRE OF CRANES.—10-ton steam cranes, 10s. per hour, minimum £2; 5-ton steam cranes, 5s. per hour, minimum £1; donkey engines, 4s. per hour, minimum £1; hand-cranes, 2s. 6d. per hour. The foregoing charges are for the use of cranes at hirer's risk only, but the Commissioner of Railways will take the risk on payment of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on value of goods to be lifted, in addition to ordinary crane charges. Application for the use of cranes must be made on the prescribed forms. (See page 145 of Railway Rates Book.)

24. No person shall fish on any jetty.

25. Stones, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel shall not be landed or placed on the floor of the jetties. Firewood for the use of passenger steamers and other vessels or boats shall be taken direct from the truck to the vessel. No goods shall be handed over the rails of the jetties.

26. No person shall make fast any tackle, purchase, or other gear, to any part of the crane, or place, or use any private derrick, crane, or other lifting machine without special permission obtained from the Pier Master or officer in charge.

27. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any jetty; provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any such jetty to or from any steamer, vessel, or boat moored thereto, for the purpose of being loaded or unloaded thereat.

The term "machine" shall include a bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, perambulator, or any motor car.

28. No bullock or horse teams, or any wheeled vehicle, other than a railway truck, drawn by any quadruped or quadrupeds, shall be driven on to, or permitted to go on, the jetties, and no riding on horseback will be permitted thereon.

29. No person shall land, or place, or cause to be landed or placed upon any jetty or upon the approach to any jetty, any decayed or decaying vegetables, or other thing whatsoever likely to become a nuisance.

Live stock in limited quantities may be landed on the jetties by permission being obtained from the Commissioner of Railways, and under the terms and conditions imposed by such authority.

Any person violating any of the above Regulations is liable, on conviction, to a fine 31. of £10.
