Amendment of Magisterial Boundaries of the NORTHAM AND SWAN MAGISTERIAL DISTRICTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Edward Albert Stone, Knight, Administrator of the Government in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc. WEST RN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT. E. A. STONE, Administrator.

W HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land, whether theretofore included or not, within the limits of a Magisterial District. Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and amend the boundaries of the Northam and Swan Magisterial Districts, and declare them to be as follows, as from the twenty-third inst.:—

### NORTHAM MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the continuation East of a due East line passing through the summit of Mt. Lesueur. On the Westward by a line extending South to the North-East corner of Avon Location 1956; thence West to its North-West corner; thence South-Westward along the North-West corner; thence South-Westward along the North-West boundary of Avon Location 1833, to the North-East corner of Avon Location 1957; thence West to its North-West corner; thence South to the Newcastle-New Norcia Road, and North-Westerly along said road to the South boundary of Melbourne Location 935, and along said boundary West to the Midland Railway; thence South-South-Easterly to the 60th mile post on the Perth-New Norcia Road, and onwards to the South-West corner of Swan Location 95 at Bailup: thence by a South-Easterly line to a point on the Eastern Railway due North from the North-East corner of Helena Location22; thence South five miles. On the Southward by an East-North-Easterly line from the point five miles South of Railway aforesaid to the West corner of Avon Location f; thence North-Easterly along the North-West boundaries of Avon Locations f and J to the latter's North corner; and thence due East. On the East by a North line passing through a point situate 10 miles West of the Trigonometrical Station on Yorkrakine Granite Rock.

### SWAN MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the Sea Coast, and extending due East, passing through the summit of Mt. Lesueur to a point situate North of the North-East corner

of Avon Location 1956; thence South to said corner; thence West to its North-West corner; thence South-Westward along the North-West boundary of Avon Location 1833 to the North-East corner of Avon Location 1957; and thence West to its North-West corner; thence South to the New-castle-New Norcia Road, and North-Westerly along said castle-New Norca Road, and North-Westerly along said road to the South boundary of Melbourne Location 935, and along said boundary West to the Midland Railway; thence South-South-Easterly to the 60th mile post on the Perth-New Norcia Road, and onwards to the South-West corner of Swan Location 95 at Bailup; thence by a South-Easterly line to a point on the Eastern Railway due North from the North-East corner of Helena Location 22; thence South to its South-East corner; thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mt. Dale; thence West-N rth-Westerly to the Easternmost corner of Swan Location 34, and North-Westerly along its North-East boundary to the South corner of Swan Location X; thence North-North-Westerly to the South-East corner of Perthshire Location 104; and thence North to a point East of the North-East corner of Perthshire Location 111 at Nowergup; thence West to the Sea Coast aforesaid, and along it Northerly to the starting point, including the Islands adjacent: AND I do also, with the like advise declare that the boundaries of the Victoria like advice, declare that the boundaries of the Victoria and Yilgarn Magisterial Districts, respectively, shall be altered in so far as they are affected by the boundaries of the Northam and Swan Magisterial Districts.

I have the honour to inform you that, in consequence of representations which have been received from Lord Milner, it has been decided that in future no permits to proceed to the Transvaal or Orange River Colony shall be issued elsewhere than at the South African ports. A copy of a notice on the subject which is being communicated to the Press is enclosed herewith.

I have to request that you will give instructions accordingly to the officers who are charged with the issue of permits, and whose services in this capacity will now no longer be required.

Copies of a notice on the subject which has been issued by the Transvaal and Orange River Colony Governments and of the form which applicants should fill up are also enclosed.

#### NOTICE.

To Persons intending to visit the Transvaal or Orange River COLONY.

It is notified, for information, that permits onter the Transvaal or Orange River Colony are still required, except by persons exempted in the terms of the Ordinance quoted below. Such permits are issued at all coast ports in British South Africa, at Bulawayo, and at Lourenco

Persons about to visit the new colonies are advised, in order to save themselves delay and disappointment, to forward their application for permits at least one week before their departure, in order that the permits may be ready for them when they land.

Applications should, in the case of British subjects, be addressed to the Permit Secretary at the intended port of disembarkation.

Foreigners should make application through their Consular represen-

Persons proceeding via Delagoa Bay should address their applications to H.B.M. Consul General, Lourenco Marques.

Application forms are obtainable at the Colonial Office, London, at the principal South African Shipping Offices in London and Southampton, at the Bank of Africa and Standard Bank of South Africa in London, and on board the principal South African bound steamers.

The following extract from the Peace Preservation Ordinance, Transvaal, is published for information. The terms of the Peace Preservation Ordinance, Orange River Colony, Sections 19 to 23, are mutatis mutandis identical:—

"19.—After the date of this Ordinance no person shall enter this colony without a permit granted under the terms of this Ordinance,

- (a.) He was resident and within this Colony or the Orange River Colony on the 31st May, 1902, and has not since that date been expelled from or ordered to leave this Colony or the Orange River Colony.
- (b.) He has since the 31st May, 1902, and before the date of this Ordinance, receive da permit or other formal authorization to enter this Colony from some duly constituted authority.
- (c.) He is a person coming within the provisions of Article 2 of the Terms of Surrender signed at Pretoria on the 31st May, 1902, and published in the Gazette Extraordinary, dated 3rd June, 1902.
- (d.) He is a person employed in His Majesty's Navy or Military Service, or in the Civil Service, or in any Police Force of this colony or the Orange River Colony.

"20.—Permits to enter the colony under this Ordinance shall be granted by such persons as may be authorised to do so by the Governor, and shall be in such form as the Governor may direct.

No such permit shall be granted to any person who, having been a Burgher of the South Afr can Republic or the Orange Free State, has not taken the Oath of Allegiance to His Majesty or made some declaration of equivalent import in form approved by the Governor. In all other cases it shall be in the discretion of the Governor to grant or refuse any permit.

"21.—It shall be lawful for the Colonial Secretary, if he has reason to believe that any person is residing or sojourning in this colony having entered it without proper authority, to give notice thereof to any Resident Magistrate, and such Magistrate shall thereupon summons such person to appear before him, and if such person fails to satisfy the Magistrate that he has obtained a permit under this Ordinance or is exempt under the provisions of Section 19 from obtaining such permit, the Magistrate shall make a written order directing such person to leave the Colony within seven days, unless before the expiration of that time he has received permission in writing from the Colonial Secretary to remain in the colony; such permission shall have the same effect as a permit granted under this Ordinance.

"22.—(1) If any person in whose case such order has been made is found within the colony after the expiration of seven days after service of such order without having obtained permission from the Colonial Secretary as aforesaid, he may be arrested and brought before a Magistrate, and shall, upon conviction, be imprisoned for a period not less than one month and not more than six months and with or without a fine not exceeding £500, and in default of payment to a further term of imprisonment not exceeding six months.

(2) If any person imprisoned under the terms of the preceding Sub-section shall remain in the colony for a period of more than seven days after the expiration of his term of imprisonment or any subsequent term of imprisonment inflicted under this section, without obtaining permission in writing from the Colonial Secretary to remain in the colony, he may be arrested and brought before a Magistrate, and shall, on conviction, be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, for a period of not less than six months and not more than twelve months, and with or without a fine not exceeding £500, and in default of payment to a further term of imprisonment not exceeding six months.

"23.—Any person entering this colony on a permit not issued to him by proper authority or obtained by him by any fraudulent means shall be liable to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a period not exceeding two years, or to a fine not exceeding £500, or to both such imprisonment and fine."

After the 1st December no permits to proceed to the Transvaal or Orange River Colony will be issued in the United Kingdom, or by His Majesty's Consular Officers abroad, or elsewhere than at the South Africau ports.

Persons wishing to proceed to the Transvaal or Orange River Colony should therefore apply for the necessary permits to enable them to do so to the Transvaal and Orange River Colony Permit Office at the port at which they propose to land.

They are warned that such permits are liable to be refused by the Government of the Transvaal and Orange River Colony, and it is suggested that, in order to avoid disappointment and delay, they should ascertain before sailing for South Africa from the Permit Office at the port where they propose to land whether permits will be granted to them.

Under the Peace Preservation Ordinances now in force in the Transvaal and Orange River Colony, persons who enter those colonies without permits may be ordered to leave, and if such order is not obeyed within a given time, they will be liable to fine and imprisonment.

SIR With reference to Viscount Knutsford's Circular despatch of 20th August, 1889, I have the honour to state that I have been informed by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury that where any officer who has been transferred from the Imperial Civil Service to the Civil Service of a Colony is removed from the latter service on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office under the provisions of any Colonial Law similar to Sect. 2 (1) of the Superannuation Act, 1887, his claim to pension for his Imperial service may be admitted under the Pensions (Colonial service) Act, and the Superannuation Act, 1887, taken together, notwithstanding that the retirement takes place under 60 years of age. It is to be noted, however, that in the Imperial Civil Service cases dealt with under section 2 of the Superannuation Act, 1887, the officer does not as a rule receive the full amount of pension for which he would be qualified by his length of service.

- 2. I have to add that an officer transferred from the Imperial service to the service of any Colony or Protectorate to which the provisions of the Superannuation Act of 1892 have been applied, can receive a pension for his Imperial service if he retires at any age at which the Regulations of the Colony permit him to retire without a medical certificate. The following is a list of the Colonies and Protectorates the Funds of which have now been determined by the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury to be Public Funds within the meaning of Section 4 of the last rubic Funds within the meaning of Section 4 of the last mentioned Act, viz.:—The Windward Islands, the Leeward Islands, all the West African Colonies and Protectorates, Ceylon, Straits Settlements, Federated Malay States. Hong Kong, Wei-hai-Wei, Gibraltar, St. Helena, Falklands, Seychelles, British East Africa, and British Central Africa. Also the fund out of which are paid the salaries of the Sergeant Majors and Sergeants of the Jamaica Constabulary Force appointed under Jamaica Law 18 of 1895 (the Constabulary Law, 1867, Amendment Law, 1895), has been determined to be a Public Fund within the meaning of the Superannuation Act, 1892
- 3. I have to explain that, in the case of the Colonies and Protectorates mentioned in the last paragraph, the amount of the pension grantable in respect of the Colonial portion of the Officer's service will not be affected by the applica-tion of the Superannuation Act, 1892, to such Colony or Protectorate, but such pension will still be governed by the special pension rules of each Colony or Pro ectorate.

#### PHILLIPS RIVER ROAD BOARD BY-LAWS.

The Road Board for the District of Phillips River, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the Roads Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following

#### INTERPRETATION.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say
  - "District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Phillips River Road Board. "Board."—The Phillips River Road Board.

"Chairman."—Includes the member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Member."—A member of the Board.
"The Act."—"The Roads Act of 1902."

- "Road or Reserve."—A road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- under the control of the Board.

  "Street" shall mean and include every public street, road, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district which the public are permitted to use.

  "Footpath or footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

  The word "person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.

body corporate.

Chairman to preside.

- 2. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and, in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall
  - Board to sit with open doors.
- 3. The business of the Board shall be conducted with open  $With drawal\ of\ strangers.$

4. Any three members may require the Board-room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

Meetings.

- Meetings.

  5. Notice shall be given, in writing, by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least twenty-four bours before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days.

  6. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—ordinary and special. Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting.
- 7. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper.
- 8. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

When a quorum not present.

- 9. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.
- 10. At all meetings of the Board where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

Minutes of meetings.

- 11. In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book.
- 12. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary subsequent meeting, and no business shall be transacted at ordinary meetings until the minutes of previous meetings requiring confirmation have been confirmed.
- Voting. 13. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of an equality of votes, give a casting vote, and any reason stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members

# ORDER OF BUSINESS.

Confirmation of minutes.

14. The minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business at all ordinary meetings of the Board and then confirmed, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

Chairman may make communications.

15. Immediately after confirmation of the minutes, the Chairman may make any communications to the Board he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary.

Questions may be asked.

16. It shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the questions simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at this time.

Order of Business.

17. The business at all ordinary meetings shall be taken in the following order, that is to say:—

Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

Reading of correspondence (in and out) and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.

Presentations of petitions or memorials and committee reports, and consideration thereof.

Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

General business

Passing of accounts for payment.

#### Petitions

Petitions.

18. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

#### Tenders.

19. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

#### Orders of Debate.

Speakers must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Speaking twice.

No member shall speak twice on the same question, ex-21. No member shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried; nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

Motions and amendments—how proposed.

Motions and amendments—how proposed.

22. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise in his place uncovered, and address the Chairman or other presiding Chairman; and no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case he shall sit down, and the member calling to order shall in the first place name the grounds on the strength of which he rises, and, if found to be correct by the Chairman or other presiding Chairman, shall be heard in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

Motions or amendments to be in writing.

23. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment shall state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the Board thereon, and, for the purposes of record shall, if requested, put it in writing, and sign and deliver to the Secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall read the same to the Board before being discussed.

#### Withdrawal of motions.

24. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

#### Amendments.

- 25. Whenever an amendment is moved on an original proposition, no second amendment shall be taken into consideration until the first amendment has been disposed of; if the first amendment is carried, it shall displace the original question and become itself the question, whereupon only one further amendment may be moved. If the first amendment be negatived, then a second amendment shall be submitted to the Board for discussion at the continuous control of the control
- 26. On an amendment being moved, no member of the Board who has spoken to the original question shall speak again except in explanation or as the mover of the original question in reply) until the amendment has been put, and has become the amended proposition before the Board.
- 27. Any member moving or seconding a motion or amendment in the terms "I move," etc., or "I second," etc., as the case may be, shall be held to have spoken on that question.

Division of complicated questions.

- The Board may order a complicated question to be divided.
- 29. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- 30. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chair-

#### Committees' reports.

31. Members signing reports of committees, as proposer or seconder, may address the Board on such reports. Any member who may have signed the proposition paper, either as proposer or seconder, to enable the proposition paper, either as proposer or seconder, to enable the reports of the committees of the Board to be put to the vote for adoption or otherwise by the Board, shall not be held to have spoken thereon by such act, but may address the Board on matters contained in such reports.

#### $Interruption\ not\ allowed.$

- 32. When a question is being put to the vote, or when the Chairman is speaking, or any member addressing the chair, no member shall walk out of or across the chamber, so as to interrupt him, nor shall any member interrupt another whilst speak-
  - 1. To request that his words be taken down;
  - 2. To call attention to a point of order; or
  - 3. To call attention to the want of a quorum.

#### Speaking to order.

33. Any member may rise to speak "to order" upon a matter suddenly arising.

#### Precedence to question of order.

34. All questions of order at any time arising shall, until decided, suspend the consideration and decision of every other

Decision on point of order.

The Chairman or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

#### Appointment of committee.

36. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a committee to enquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a committee of three shall comprise two members

#### Committees.

37. The Chairman shall be a member of and Chairman of any committee appointed by the Board.

## Attendance at committees.

38. No person, except a member of the committee, shall be admitted at any meeting of such committee without the consent of the members present.

### Record of attendance.

39. The secretary shall keep a record of the attendance of all members at any meeting of the Board and at each committee meeting, and such record shall be presented to the last meeting of the Board held in the months of May and November of each

## DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

Duties of Secretary.

- 40. The duties of the Secretary shall be-
  - (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
  - (b.) To attend all committees.
  - (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
  - (d.) To conduct all correspondence.
  - (e.) To give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes
  - (f.) To answer all questions on the Board's business
  - (g.) To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette and at least one newspaper circulating in the district.
  - To supervise the preparation of the rate book and Board's electoral lists, to examine proofs of the latter, and to arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections.
  - (i.) To attend all courts of revision or appeal, to make the necessary arrangements for elections, and to prepare papers, etc., for the clerks.
  - (i.) To summon the members to Board and committee
  - (k.) To keep the cash book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be written up every fortnight, ready for inspection by the Board, or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.
  - (1) To check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts sent in to the hoard, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding £5 in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers. and to see that with all returns made the heels of the receipt book accompany the returns.

- (m.) To supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Bofficers and payable to the credit of the Board.
- (n.) To report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (o.) To pay into the Bank, within 48 hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him (amounting in the aggregate to Two pounds or upwards) on behalf of the Board.
- (p.) To have the Bank pass book made up once a month, or as the Board shall direct, or, should any member of the Board desire to see it at any time during office hours, the Secretary shall produce it for his inspection.
- (q.) To give all receipts on printed forms.
- 41. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein

#### Duties of Engineer.

- The duties of the Engineer shall be-
  - (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through
  - the Secretary.

    (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards streets, roads, bridges, buildings, or premises under control of the Board situate within the bounds of the Board sidistrict; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such works as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation lest such height, lines, etc., should be altered; measure all metal before being used on any works, and measure, and make returns to the Board works, and measure, and make returns to the Board through the Secretary for payment for all works and materials: submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
  - (c.) To see that the work for cleansing and repairing all public streets, roads, and footways is properly carried out.
  - (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately dis-charge any labourer guilty of disobedience, insub-ordination, or if found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
  - (e.) To see that the time of the men is returned by the gangers, and, if satisfied with the correctness thereof, have the pay sheet made out accordingly.
  - (f.) To give the necessary lines and levels to persons building next to public ways, and see that there is no encroachment on public property.
  - (g.) To see that all sewers, drains, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
  - (h.) To see that the laws with regard to buildings within the Board's district are not infringed, and take action in the case of "dangerous buildings."
  - (i.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
  - (j.) To attend all meetings of the Board.
  - (k.) To render the Secretary when required reports and accounts of all matters coming under his control; to supply fortnightly, or oftener if required, to the Board returns of work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.
  - (l.) To define from time to time duties of gangers, and see that they are communicated to them in writing.

## Election to Offices.

#### Election of officers.

43. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Board shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the candidates polling the largest number of votes be again put to the ballot, until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of votes of the members present: every member present being required to record his vote.

#### Notice of election.

44. When an office is at the disposal of the Board, at least eight clear days' notice shall be given by affixing a notice at the Board's office, or by an advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers of the intention of the Board to fill such vacancy. and the same notice shall invite applications for the office to be sent into the meeting of the Board appointed for the purpose of receiving same

#### Fixing Salary.

45. The salary or allowance attached to the office under the consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the election, unless otherwise decided by resolution of the Board; and the salary of any officer, when fixed, shall not at any time be considered with a view to its reduction, unless specially sanctioned by and at the meeting of the Board at which two-thirds at least of the members are present.

#### Security.

No member of the Board nor any auditor or any officer of the Board shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Board or for any work to be done for the Board; and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the Board. Finance Accounts.

47. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meeting, and, after being certified as correct and passed, shall be paid by cheque.

- An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board 48. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board; and no account shall be paid except by cheque, signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, together with the signature of the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within two days after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary.
- 49. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary.

Urgent Work.

50. The Chairman and one member, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Five pounds; but shall, in every case, report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

#### Unauthorised Expenditure.

51. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

General instructions to officers.

52. At all times officers of the Board, in passing through the District, are required to be watchful, vigilant, and report immediately to the Secretary any dereliction of duty on the part of the contractors, or any infringements of the Roads Acts or

Notice to remove dangerous buildings.

- Where any building of any kind shall, in the opinion o the Board, be out of repair or dangerous, the Secretary shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall forthwith comply with such order, under a penalty of not more than \$20 for non-compliance.
- 54. No person shall damage, by means of horse, team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ .
  - Any person who-
    - (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road:
    - (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon: or
    - (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the water-side of a road except over a properly constructed pipe, approach, or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle.
    - (d.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

#### Removal of gravel, etc.

- No person shall dig for or remove any gravel, stone, or earth from any reserve without first obtaining permission from the Board, and also paying any fee or license that may be decided
- 57. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20:—
  - (a.) Riding or driving cattle, horses, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage upon or along any footpath.
  - (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board first obtained.
  - (c.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter in any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.
  - (d.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
  - (e) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, ience, or gate under the control of the Board; carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks running, thereby letting the water escape from such tanks and waste; bathing in any dam or well, or in any way polluting the water contained in such tanks or well as to render it unfit for human consumption.
  - (f.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
  - (g.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the per-mission of the Board having been first obtained.

- (h.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
- (i.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any toning any cast, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- i.) Throwing or discharging any stones or other missiles to the damage or danger of any person.
- (k.) Having any awning on any footpath in any public street or thoroughfare not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
  (l.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without the permission of the Board, and not attending to any direction in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (m.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding through any public place.
- (n.) Making cellar doors or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (o.) The plying for hire by any carts or vehicles without a license.
- Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any nightsoil or other offensive matter outside the limits of the control exercised by the Local Board of Health without permission or a license from, and without having given such security as is required by the Board.
- (q.) Allowing any nightsoil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
- (r.) Cutting or removing any growing timber on any Crown lands or reserves within the boundaries of the district.

- For the prevention and abatement of nuisances.
  58. "Abattoirs" or "slaughter-house" shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called abattoirs or slaughter-houses, and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.
- 59. No person shall establish or carry on within the district of the Board, without its consent in writing, any of the undermentioned trades, businesses or occupations, viz.:—

Abattoirs or slaughter-houses.

Vanure works.

Works for boiling down meat, bones, or offal:

Bone mills and bone manure depots,

Fellmongeries, tanneries and wool scouring,

Fellmongeries, tanneries, and wool scouring establish-

Glue factories,

Piggeries,

Soap or candle works or factories,

Fish-curing establishments,

and anyone so doing shall be guilty of an offence under these

- 60. No owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within the district shall allow any impure water or any foul liquid matter of any description to flow from such land or premises into or upon the street, footway or gutter; and no person shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any foul liquid matter of any description, and any person so doing shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 61. No owner, occupier, manager, or other person in charge of any land or premises shall allow water from any shaft to flow into, upon, or across any road, footway or gutter without the permission of the Board first had and has been obtained, and any person so doing shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and to the cost of repairing any such road, lootway, or gutter damaged by reason of allowing water to flow as aforesaid.
- 62. Any officer or member of the Board may from time to time visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed, and the same must be kept thoroughly clean to the satisfaction of such officer or member of the Board.
- to the satisfaction of such officer or member of the Board.

  63. The occupier of any house outside the limit of the jurisdiction and control of the Local Board of Health shall have upon the premises a pit for the purpose of containing deposits of nightsoil, urine, and household refuse matter; such pit to be of not less than eight feet deep and of not less than two feet by three feet section, and he shall not permit such pit to overflow or become offensive; and shall, when necessary or directed by the Board's officer, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith, and such pits shall be filled in before the accumulations of deposits reach within two feet of the surface.
- 64. No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, camel, cow, bullock, dog, or other animal and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty of not more than £10.

#### Signboards, etc.

65. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, signs, awnings, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or on any footway or roadway, without obtaining the consent of the Board, in writing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

#### General regulation of traffic.

- 66. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.
- 67. Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise, shall, in, upon, or along any road within the district, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.
- 68. The driver of every vehicle, or rider of every horse or other animal, turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.
- 69. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any street of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such street for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle. Provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided, the horses may be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding thirty minutes: but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board, or police constable, such horse, or horse and vehicle, shall be removed.
- 70. Any driver of a camel or camels on any street neglecting to draw off on the approach of a vehicle shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To prevent trees from falling across any road or track.

- 71. No person shall make or leave a fire by the road or track side without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 72. No person shall set fire to standing trees on the road or track side, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### To prevent accidents from riding, etc., or bicycles, etc.

- 73. Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
  - (a.) No person shall ride or impel a bicycle upon any footpath within the district.
  - (b.) No person shall, within the hours of sunset and sunno person shall, within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.
  - (c.) Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.
  - (d.) No person shall leave any cycle in or on any street or No person suan teave any cycle in or on any street or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
  - (e.) No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.
  - (f.) When a cyclist meets any horse or animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or animal has been passed.
  - (g.) No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any streets in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said streets, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

#### To prevent obstruction on the footpaths of the streets.

74. No person shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a street, or on any part of a footpath, within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

# To prevent damage to footpaths and other Board property.

75. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board, or under control thereof.

#### Stall licenses.

- 76. No person shall keep, manage, or conduct at any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables. or articles of merchandise unless such person be licensed.
- Licenses for stalls shall be in the form "A" of the
- 78. No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours the Board may decide from time to time.
- 79. A fee of twenty shillings per month shall be paid for licenses for stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if any payment be not made when due the license shall be void.
- 80. Every licensed stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the Secretary or other authorised officer of the Board, or member of the police force.
- 81. No person to whom a stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license granted, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself, unless by written consent of the Secretary.

#### THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1895.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS AND Issue of Certificates and Licenses under "THE LICENSED SURVEYORS ACT, 1895" (59 VICT., No. 14).

THE Land Surveyors' Licensing Board, appointed under I the above Act, has, with the approval of His Excellency the Administrator, made the following Rules for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act; and cancelled the Rules gazetted on 2nd August, 1901:

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates or licenses as surveyors will be held in Perth in the month of September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board :-
  - (a.) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
  - (b.) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no license to practise as a surveyor will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- 4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.
- 5. (a.) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evi-dence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- (b.) Or he shall have passed, at any University recognised by an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c.) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

#### Form of certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land , viz., from surveying, for the period of

to (or has served under articles, or other similar agreement, for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, and a further fee of £2 2s, paid for the issue of a certificate of competency and license, the candidate will be admitted to examination. Such fee will be returned if the candidate is unsuccessful in passing the examination.

#### SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:-

#### Mathematics.

(a.) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

#### Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

#### Principles and practices of surveying.

(c.) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, sub-divisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under the Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

> (Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

#### Levelling, etc.

(d.) Levelling, grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

#### Use of instruments.

(e.) Principles of construction, adjustment, and use of the following instruments:-Theodolite, planetable, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tacheometer, and steel band.

### Field astronomy, geodesy, etc.

(f.) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth; reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

#### Drawing.

(g.) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

#### Miscellaneous.

- (h.) Physics and geology (elementary); names and descriptions of Australasian timbers of economic value (viva voce).
- 11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

#### CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

- 12. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall, upon payment of the prescribed fees, receive from the Board a certificate of competency.
- 13. Any surveyor licensed in Western Australia prior to September, 1895, or any surveyor licensed prior to September, 1895, in any other of the Australasian States or Colonies, who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the Certificate of Competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and, on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a Certificate of Competency. Such application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

#### LICENSES TO SURVEY.

- 14. The Board may, upon payment of the prescribed fees, issue a license to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, subsequent to September, 1895, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his certificate.
- 15. Any surveyor who is licensed to survey in any other of the Australasian States or Colonies applying to the Board for a license to practise in Western Australia may, on production of a letter of recommendation, dated within the preceding twelve months, from the Board of the State in which he is licensed, together with satisfactory evidence as to identity and to character, be entitled to a license to survey in Western Australia. Such application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.
- 16. In the event of failure of any candidate to pass the full examination, the Board may, at its discretion, remit one-half the fees at any subsequent examination of such candidate.
- 17. The Board may grant a letter of recommendation to any surveyor licensed in and desiring to be registered in another Colony, either without examination or on such viva voce examination as, in the opinion of the Board, may be necessary.

Its Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, under the provisions of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902," to approve of the Regulations as hereunder, for the construction and working of Timber Tramways through and upon Crown Lands and Reserves, in lieu of those published in the Government Gazette of 25th April, 1902, which are hereby cancelled.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND WORKING OF TIMBER TRAMWAYS UNDER "THE LAND ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1902."

1. Application for permission to construct and use tramways through and upon Crown Lands and Reserves shall be made in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall be lodged with or forwarded by registered post addressed to the Minister for Lands at his office in Perth, and accompanied by a deposit equal to the amount of rent or propor-

tion thereof due upon the next half-yearly period appointed for payment thereof, and calculated as in the Secon Regulation set forth, which deposit shall be returned if the application is not approved, and shall also be accompanied by a plan showing the position of the proposed transway, such plan to contain sufficient data to enable the position of the transway to be accurately delineated on the plans of the Department of Lands and Surveys. On approval of the application, permission in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, with such other conditions as the Governor may deem fit to impose, will be issued to the applicant.

Before the issue of any permission the applicant will be required to enter into a bond with two or more sureties approved by the Minister, to observe and abide by the conditions therein and in these Regulations contained, in all respects.

2. The rent payable in respect of such permission shall be such sum as may be fixed by the Governor, but shall not in any case be less than Two pounds (£2) per annum for each mile or fraction of a mile of the length of the proposed tramway.

Such rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of March and the first day of September in each year.

- 3. Upon receipt of the acknowledgment from the Minister of the receipt of an application, and before the granting of any permission to construct and use a firewood tramway will be made, the applicant shall cause the application to be advertised in at least two consecutive issues of some newspaper circulating in the district of the proposed tramway, and shall forward to the Minister a copy of the advertisement.
- 4. If the locality of the proposed tramway be within the limits of any proclaimed goldfield, the applicant shall at the same time cause a copy of the application to be posted at the principal office of the Warden of such goldfield, and shall forward a copy thereof to the Minister.
- 5. The applicant shall set forth in the application the nature of the motive power proposed to be used for haulage purposes on the tramline.
- 6. Any person shall have the right to object at any time within fourteen days of the last advertisement or posting of such notice, whichever shall last occur, to the granting of the permission applied for by notice, in writing, addressed to the Minister setting forth the reasons of such objection, and lodged at his office in Perth, or sent to him, addressed as above, by registered post; a copy of such notice will be sent to the applicant by the Minister.
- 7. The Minister may summon the applicant and the objector to appear before him and state more fully their reasons
- 8. Any person to whom permission may be granted to construct a tramway shall, within one month of the completion of same, and before commencing the user, notify the Minister of the completion, and at the same time furnish at his own cost a plan showing the portion completed, such plan to be signed by a licensed surveyor, and the survey represented thereon must be carried out to the satisfaction of the Surveyor General, in accordance with the rules and regulations for the guidance of surveyors working for the Department of Land and Surveys. Failure to notify the Minister or supply the necessary plan shall render the permission liable to cancellation.
- 9. Should any person to whom permission to construct a tramway as aforesaid is given, fail to construct and properly equip one quarter of the tramway within six months, and the whole within twelve months from the date he is notified of approval, or should he fail to use such line for the purpose for which permission is granted for a period of one month, the permission will be cancelled; provided that the Minister may, by writing under his hand, grant exemption from using such tramway for any period not exceeding three months. The granting of such exemption shall not relieve the holder from the payment of the prescribed rent.
- 10. Any person to whom permission to construct and use a tramway is granted may, without any further permission, construct and use spur lines on both sides of the main line. But no spur line shall extend beyond a boundary parallel with the main line and distant two and a-half miles therefrom, measured at right angles, and the grantee shall lodge at the Department of Lands and Surveys, once at least in every three months, a plan showing all spur lines and deviations.

No such permission shall be transferred, assignee, mortgaged, sub-let, or otherwise disposed of, without the approval, in writing, of the Governor first had and obtained, and on payment of the prescribed fees.

11. No alteration or extension shall be made to the proposed line of the tramway without the previous consent, in writing, of the Governor first had and obtained.

- 5. The grantee shall, at his own expense, construct a weighbridge at such point as shall be indicated by the Commisioner of Railways, and maintain the same in a condition for accurate weighing, at his own cost.
- 6. The permission hereby granted may be revoked by the Minister of the will of the Governer, and no person shall be entitled to claim any compensation for any damage that he may suffer by reason or in consequence of such revocation.
- 7. The grantee shall take all necessary precautions to prevent fire being caused to any land by any locomotive engine or other motive power used and employed upon the tramway.
- 8. The person to whom this permission is granted shall be responsible for all acts of trespass or damage caused by any person or persons in his employ, and whether such persons are employed as sub-contractors, or on wages, or in any manner otherwise howsoever.
- 9. The applicant shall at all times, after commencing the use of the tramway, carry firewood for the public at such rates as shall be approved by the Governor.
