#### THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

# BY-LAWS OF THE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE DISTRICT OF COOLGARDIE.

The Municipal Council of Coolgardie, being the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, and by virtue of "The Health Act, 1898," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby repeals all By-laws heretofore made by it, and hereby, in pursuance of such powers and authorities affected in the substantial of the substantial authorities aforesaid, makes and publishes the following By-laws in lieu thereof.

## INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

In the construction of the following By-laws—
"Act" shall mean "The Health Act, 1898," and any other Act amending the same.

"Municipality" shall mean within the limits of Coolgardie Municipality.

- "Occupier" shall mean every householder and the habitant occupier of any land, or if there is no habitant occupier, the person entitled to the possession thereof, and shall include leaseholder, and also the person who is for the time being entitled to receive the rents and profits of the land or premises in connection with which the word is used, and whether on his own account, or as the agent or trustee for any other person, or who would be entitled to receive the same if the land or premises were let at a rent.
- Board "shall mean the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie.
- "Land" shall include, besides land, all messuages, houses, buildings, and other structures erected thereon, and unless already hereinbefore defined, or the context requires, the terms herein used shall have the mean-ings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1898."
- "District" shall mean the area for the time being under the control of the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie.
- "Inspector" shall mean the person or persons appointed by the Board for the due carrying out of the provisions of the Act, and shall include any Acting or Assisting Inspector.
- "Health Officer" shall mean the person appointed as Officer of Health under the provisions of the Act, and any Acting or Assisting Health Officer.
- "Person" shall include a partnership Company or Corporation.
- Corporation.

  "House" shall mean and include tents and dwellings of any kind, and churches, schools, hotels, licensed victuallers' premises, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises, whether temporary or otherwise, and whether erected upon fee simple lands, reserves, Municipal lands, or on Crown lands.

#### BY-LAW No. 1.

- 1. No person shall erect within the District of the Local Board any earth closet, privy, or urinal the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick; and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.
- All closets, privies, or urinals shall be erected in such position and in such manner as shall be approved of by the Board; and all such closets, privies, and urinals shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 2,

The occupier of any premises whereon any closet is erected shall keep the same and the receptacles for night-soil clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause such closet to be cleaned once a week in the least, and the said receptacles to be emptied once a week in the least. The pan adopted by the Board for use within the District of Coolgardie shall be of iron, 144in. high, 134in. diameter, fitted with a tight-fitting lid 14in. diameter, known as "Munro's Patent."

#### BY-LAW No. 3.

Every occupier shall cause the closet or closets situated on the premises occupied by him to be provided with a sufficient number of receptacles for nightsoil of the pattern approved by the Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 4.

Every occupier shall provide a double pan service for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

#### BY-LAW No. 5.

Every occupier or any person having the management or Every occupier or any person having the management or control of any house or premises within the District of the Local Board of Health of Coolgardie shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a box containing dry earth, ashes, sawdust, or such materials as the Local Board may approve, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorant or disinfectant sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorise or disinfect the contents of such pan or receptacle.

#### BY-LAW No. 6.

No nightman or any of his employees shall parade or pass any nightcart or other offensive vehicle through or over the any nighteart or other offensive vehicle through or over the streets or roads or any of them of the District, or remove or suffer to be removed any nightsoil or urine before the hour of eleven o'clock at night, nor after the hour of five o'clock in the morning, and shall cause to be removed all carts belonging to him and used for any of the purposes aforesaid entirely outside the precincts of the town before the bounce of five o'clock in the new interest of the town before the hour of five o'clock in the morning.

## BY-LAW No. 7.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable lid to be provided and at once cover the same with a suitable lid to be provided by him, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Board in lieu of every pan so removed. Each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say:—Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart of a pattern to be approved by the Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Board. Until otherwise directed the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Board, and treated with disinfectant and covered with earth to such depth as the Board may from time to time direct.

#### BY-LAW No. 8.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil shall have been removed such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule B hereto; and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

## BY-LAW No. 9.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents as specified in By-law No. 7, to be cleansed by superheated steam.

## BY-LAW No. 10.

No person shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the boundaries of the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie unless he shall have first obtained from the Board a license authorising him to do so.

## BY-LAW No. 11.

No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Board, and no person shall be approved of to be granted a nightman's license unless he shall satisfy the Board that he is possessed, in his own name and as his absolute property, of plant in Coolgardie, to the approval of the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 12.

The license shall be in the form of Schedule A hereto and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of the Act and of these By-laws.

#### BY-LAW No. 13

Every nightman shall forfeit and pay to the Board the penalties hereinafter specified in case he shall commit any of the acts following:

- (a.) For neglecting to remove any pan at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose:
- Five shillings.

  (b.) For any and every repetition of such neglect within three months of a neglect in removing
- any pan: Ten shillings.

  (c.) For each neglect to substitute a clean pan for every pan removed: Five shillings.
- (d.) For each neglect to place a cleansed pan in its proper position for use: Five shillings.
  (e.) For each neglect to clean or keep decodorised any pan, night cart, or other vehicle: One pound.
  (f.) For every neglect or failure to properly dispose of
- nights il as soon as it is deposited at the depôt: Five pounds.
- (g.) For depositing any load or part of any load of nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Board: Ten pounds.
- (h.) For neglecting to close the door or gate of any yard, or the door of any closet which was closed when the contractor entered: Five shillings.
- (i.) For permitting any night cart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during prohibited hours: One pound.
- (j.) For neglecting to cleanse any public latrine in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing Two pounds.
- (k.) For spilling the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises: Ten shillings.
- (1.) For not reporting any failure to cleanse any pan on the night appointed for so doing: Five shil-
- (m.) For neglecting to comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Board: Five pounds.
- (n.) For any failure to replace a pan when so ordered by the Board: One pound per day.
- (o.) For any and every neglect to steam soiled pans: Five shillings per pan.
- (p.) For allowing any refuse, rubbish, or slops removed in carts other than those specially set apart for the purpose to be given to pigs: Ten pounds.
- (q.) For any failure or neglect on the part of any nightman or any of his employees to keep books in accordance with the direction of the Board: One pound per day
- (r.) For any charge collected from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified herein, and satisfactorily proved to the Board: Five pounds.
- (s.) For neglecting to remove any rubbish at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose: Five shillings.

## BY-LAW No. 14.

The Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depôts and places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depôts or places regularly, or at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

#### By-law No. 15.

- No person shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane within the district, in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcase for food, unless such meat shall be brought or carried in a properly covered eart or other vehicle and protected from the sun and dust.
- Every cart or other vehicle for carrying of, and every construction or covering for protecting meat therein, shall be kept in a clean and wholesome state and condition.

#### By-law No. 16.

## Regulating Dairies.

- 1. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the district shall, annually, in the month of January in each year, register his name and address with the Secretary of the Board.
- Every such person shall pay to the Board for each registration a fee of £1 per annum.
- 3. All dairy farms, milk stores, grazing grounds of dairy cattle, and cattle in dairies shall be inspected regularly from time to time at least once every month, at any reasonable hour in the day time; or, in the case of a cause of inquiry or complaint arising in respect thereof, then such inspection may be made at any time when such business is

- in progress or is usually carried on. Such inspection shall be made by an Inspector of the Board, or may be made by an Inspector of the Central Board, or a person or persons appointed by the Central Board to carry out the provisions of these By-laws, or by any member of the police force.
- If, upon such inspection, it shall appear to the person making the inspection that the use of any grazing ground for dairy cattle is likely to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, then such person shall forthwith report, in writing, accordingly to the Board or Central Board, as the case may require, who may thereupon prohibit the use of any such grazing ground.
- 5. If, upon inspection as aforesaid, any cow or other animal shall be found to be diseased, the person making such inspection shall cause such cow or other animal to be isolated and removed from all possible contact with all other dairy cattle, and shall forthwith report to the Board and to the Central Board the nature of the disease, description of the animal affected, and the measures taken for the isolation and treatment of such animal. No dairyman or cowk-eper shall neglect or refuse to remove or isolate such diseased cow or other animal, or permit or suffer the same to come in contact with any other dairy cattle after being ordered by the person aforesaid making such inspection to remove or isolate such cow or other animal.
- Whenever it shall be reported to the Board or to the Central Board that any cow or other animal is diseased, then such Board or the Central Board, after due inquiry, may order such cow or other animal to be destroyed or to be removed from any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard, and such diseased cow or other animal shall be destroyed or removed in accordance with such order.
- 7. For the purpose of sub-sections 5 and 6, or for the purpose of protecting milk against infection or coutamination, the Board may, and, if required by the Central Board, shall cause the tuberculin test to be applied to any cow or other animal when reasonably suspected to be suffering from tuberculosis. For the purpose aforesaid the Central Board may issue instructions to be observed in applying the tuberculin test.
- 8. All houses, dairies, and cow sheds in the occupation of persons following the trade of cowkeepers or dairymen-
  - (a.) Shall have proper provision for lighting;
  - (b.) Shall have good and sufficient ventilation;
    (c.) Shall be cleansed daily;

  - (d.) Shall be drained thoroughly and effectually, and in such manner as may be ordered by the Board;
  - (e.) Shall have a sufficient supply of pure water.
- Every milk store and milk shop shall be thoroughly cleansed daily, and every milk yard and dairy shall be kept at all times in a cleanly state.
- 10. For the purposes of protecting milk against infection or contamination, the following precautions shall be observed and kept :
  - (a.) The walls, floors, counterstables, and shelves of all milk stores, milk shops, and dairies shall be kept at all times in a thoroughly cleanly con-
  - (b.) All barrels, butts, cans, and other vessels used for containing milk or cream, and also all bungs, bung cloths, lids, and other parts thereof shall be thoroughly cleansed and scalded with boiling water or steam immediately after use, and afterwards dripped.
  - (c.) No boiler, tank, steam chest, or other vessel used for scalding such vessels shall be employed for washing or boiling bed or body clothing, or for any other purpose which might cause contamination or infection of milk.
  - (d.) No milk or cream, or vessel used for containing milk or cream, shall be stored or kept in any dwelling or sleeping apartment, and no such dwelling or sleeping apartment shall have direct communication with any milk store, nor shall any article of clothing be washed, hung up to dry, or kept in any room or place used for storing or keeping milk.
  - (e.) No earth closet, privy, or urinal, and no manure, dung, urine, stagnant water, filth, or other refuse shall be in contact with or within thirty feet of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop.
  - (f.) No swine or other animals shall be kept or allowed to remain within one hundred feet of any room or place used for keeping or storing milk.
  - (g.) No milk from any diseased cow shall be mixed with other milk or sold for human consumption; and such milk shall not be used as food for swine or other animals until it has been well boiled.

- (h.) No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having been recently in contact with or in attendance upon any other person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk or cream, or take part in any way in the storage or distribution of milk or cream.
- (i.) When ordered by the Board or the Central Board, any sick person shall be immediately removed from the premises of any dairy, milk store, milk shop, or milk yard by the owner or occupier, in accordance with such order.
- (j.) Whenever any infectious or contagious disease occurs in any house or building in the occupation of any person or persons following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, or on any premises used for the purpose of a milk shop or milk store, the occupier thereof shall forthwith report such cocurrence to the Board and Central Board,

#### BY-LAW No. 17.

- 1. Every person carrying on the business of a baker within the district shall keep his bakehouse or bakery at all times open to the inspection of the Inspector, and shall keep the same, with all troughs, tanks, and other appliances used in connection therewith, thoroughly clean and whole-
- 2. No such person shall sleep or permit or suffer any other person to sleep in his bakehouse or bakery, or use the same for any other purpose than his said trade.

#### BY-LAW No. 18.

- 1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter, unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof, or any offensive smell therefrom.
- 2. Every tank or barrel, and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Board.

## By-law No. 19.

No person shall remove or carry or cause to be removed or carried, for delivery to purchasers in, through, or partly in or through the said district, any article of food in any wehicle, box, thing, sack, covering, packing, or wrapping, unless such vehicle, box, thing, sack, covering, packing, or wrapping shall be in a clean and wholesome condition.

#### By-law No. 20.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop or other place, any fruit or fish which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome, shall be destroyed; and all cases or packing material which surrounds such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

## By-Law No. 21.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

#### BY-LAW No. 22.

- 1. Every occupier or owner of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such
- 2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such manner and of such material and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.
- 3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, as often as directed by the Board or its officers, remove, or cause to be removed, all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey, or cause to be conveyed, such dung or offensive matter to the depôt or place set apart for the transfer of the depôt or place set apart for that purpose by the Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 23.

Defining the area within which swine may be kept.

- It shall not be lawful for any person to keep or breed any kind of pigs or swine within the Municipality of Coolgardie.
- 2. No person shall keep pigs or swine in any place what-ever within the district under the control of the Board outside the Municipality of Coolgardie unless and until

- such premises have been licensed by the Board. The cost of such license shall be £2, payable annually in advance, in the month of January in each year.
- 3. All sties or piggeries shall be open to the inspection of the Inspector, and shall be constantly kept thoroughly clean.
- 4. No swine shall be permitted at any time to be at large.
- 5. Nothing in this By-law shall apply to any pigs or swine brought into the Municipality for sale and removed therefrom within twenty-four hours.

#### BY-LAW No. 24.

- 1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.
- 2. Any person who, after twenty-four hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offerce against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

#### By-law No. 25.

- 1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25ft. from any dwelling.
- 2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition, and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.
- No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock, or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

#### By-law No. 26,

- The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as s t forth in Section 146 of the Act, whe her established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Board an annual registration fee of Ten shillings, or such other fee not exceeding Five pounds as such Board may decide, of the amount of which fe the Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.
- 2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be limewashed as often as may be required by the Board or its officers.

#### BY-LAW No. 27.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any inspector or officer shall be determined by the Beard, according to the nature of the case.

- BY-LAW No. 28.

  1. It shall be not lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughter-house, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter, whether as the result of any business or trade or not, to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare or land within the district of the Board.
- 2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Board or its officers.

#### By-Law No. 29.

Every occupier shall place all rubbish from his house and yard in suitable receptacles, and shall cause such rubbish to be deodorised when necessary.

#### By-law No. 30.

Every occupier shall cause the contents of all receptacles for rubbish to be removed by a duly licensed scavenger at least twice weekly to such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Board.

#### BY-LAW No. 31.

Every occupier shall keep his receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

#### BY-LAW No. 32.

- 1. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.
- 2. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the limit in such notice, replace by a new and improved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

#### BY-LAW No. 33. Hours for removal of rubbish, etc.

No refuse or rubbish from any private house, business premises, hotel, shop, tenement, public or private place shall be removed by any unlicensed scavenger or any of his

employees or any private person or persons or company, at any other time or times between the hours of seven o'clock at night and nine in the morning.

#### By-law No. 34.

For regulating the deposit of rubbish.

- No person shall deposit any manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse matter at any place within the district of the Board other than the depot for such matter appointed and notified by the Board for such deposit.
- 2. All carts or other conveyances used for the carriage of manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse, shall be so constructed as to cause no nuisance during the transport, reception, utilisation, or deposit of such manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse matter as aforesaid; and every person carrying any manure, blood, offal, filth, or other refuse in any cart or conveyance not constructed as aforesaid shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

#### BY-LAW No. 35.

Regulating the disposal of the carcases of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or Townsite, or to such place as the Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed, or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

#### BY-LAW No. 36.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burn-

#### BY-LAW No. 37.

#### Regulating the removal of slops.

- Any person who shall be ordered by the Board or its Inspector shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles, fitting with close-fitting covers or lids, for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds used in any laundry or dwelling, house refuse, waste or other matter or substance which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure
- All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed, as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition, and removed at least once a week, and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

#### BY-LAW No. 38.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquids, etc.

No foul or offensive water or other offensive liquids, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Board for that purpose.

#### BY-LAW No. 39,

#### Restricting Contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever except with the person licensed by the Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

#### BY-LAW No. 40.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water. Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

#### By-law No. 41.

For regulating Common Lodging Houses within the area under the control of the Local Board of Health of Coolgardie.

control of the Local Board of Health of Coolgardie.

1. Every person keeping or about to keep a common lodging-house within the district shall give, at the office of the said Board, at least four days' notice, in writing, of his intention to apply for the annual registration of such house, specifying its situation and the number of lodgers accommodated on intended to be accommodated and shall them. modated or intended to be accommodated, and shall then and there deposit the sum of Ten shillings as a registration fee. Such notice shall be in the Form A in the Schedule hereto, and shall be accompanied by a certificate of character, in accordance with the Fourth Schedule of the Act, and such certificate shall be signed by six habitant

householders of the Municipality; and the Board may refuse to register any lodging-house, the occupier of which fails to produce such certificate. A keeper of a common lodging-house shall not at any one time receive, or cause or suffer to be received into such house or into any room therein, a greater number of lodgers than shall be fixed by to be received into such house or room, and shall be specified in a notice in writing, according to Form B in the Schedule hereto, which shall be served upon such keeper, and shall continue in force until, in pursuance of the By-law in that behalf, the number so fixed and specified shall be varied by the Board. A keeper of a common lodging-house (in any case where the Board may from time to time determine that it is expedient to vary the number fixed by them as the maximum number of lodgers authorised to be received into such house or any room therein, and may from time to time, for the purpose of such variation, cause to be duly served upon such keeper a notice in writing, according to Form C in the Schedule) shall not, at any time after any such notice shall have been served upon him, and after the date specified in such notice, and until, in pursuance of the provisions of this By-law, the number specified in such notice shall be further varied receive or cause or suffer to be received into such house, or into any room therein, a greater number of lodgers than shall be specified in such notice as the maximum number of lodgers authorised to be received into such house or into such room.

- The keeper of any common lodging-house shall cause to be cleansed all rooms, passages, stairs, floors, and offices of every kind daily, and shall cleanse all windows, doors, walls, ceilings, privies, and drains as often as may be necessary, and shall limewash the walls and ceilings thereof, or so much of them as shall be necessary, in the first week of each of the months of April and October in every year. keeper of a common lodging-house shall not, except in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause or suffer any person of the male sex above the age of ten years to use or occupy any room which may be used or occupied as a sleeping apartment by persons of the female sex. Such keeper shall not, except in such cases as are hereinafter specified, cause or suffer any person of the female sex to use or occupy any room which may be used or occupied as a sleeping apartment by persons of the male sex above the age of ten years. Provided that this By-law shall not be taken to prohibit the use and occupation by a husband and wife of any room which may not be used or occupied by any other persons of either sex above the age of ten years. The keeper of a common lodging-house shall cause every room in his house to be properly ventilated each day. He shall cause the to be properly ventilated each day. He shall cause the bedclothes of every bed in such house to be removed from such bed as soon as conveniently may be after such bed shall have been vacated by any lodger, and shall cause such bedclothes and the bed from which such bedclothes have been removed to be freely exposed to the air for one hour at least every day.
- The keeper of every lodging-house shall cause the yard, area, or other open space of the premises to be kept thoroughly clean and in good order, and free from all slopwater and rubbish, and the privy or privies to be kept clean and in sanitary condition, and constantly supplied with a suitable disinfectant. The privies shall be sufficient in number (no fewer than one for every eight lodgers permitted, in addition to one to be provided for the lodginghouse keeper and his family), and shall provide separate privies for the different sexes, and shall cause the pans to be emptied as often as may be necessary, and shall cause all sanitary appliances and the seats, floors, and walls of every privy belonging to such house to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary for the keeping such sanitary appliances, seats, floors, and walls in a clean and sanitary condition.

### BY-LAW No. 42.

## Regulating Private Hospitals.

- 1. No person shall keep or open a private hospital, unless the building in which it is proposed to be carried on has been previously approved by the Board. Every person keeping or intending to keep open any private hospital within the District shall register the same at the office of the Board; and each applicant shall make his application in writing, and therein state the number of patients to be admitted, and the number of nurses or assistants to be employed, and the class or classes of diseases or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital, and shall annually, in the month of January in each year, register the
- 2. Every such person shall permit the Inspector at all reasonable times to have access to his hospital for the purpose of inspection as to drainage, good management, and sanitary regulations.

- Every such person shall keep a register of all cases admitted into and treated in his hospital, and such register shall be produced for inspection at the request of any Officer, Inspector, or Sergeant of the Board or Central Board.
- 4. Every such person shall provide for the isolation in or removal from his hospital of any patient suffering from scarlet fever, diphtheria, varicella, variola, puerperal fever, erysipelas, measles, or any other infectious or contagious disease.
- 5. In every hospital as aforesaid there shall be one nurse, whose qualifications shall be approved of by the Board, and one assistant to every ten patients.

## BY-LAW No. 43.

As to the number of infants to be received for nursing or maintenance for hire or reward, in any house within the Municipality of Coolgardie.

The number of infants to be received into each house The number of infants to be received into each house registered under and for the purposes mentioned in Sections 99-107 of "The Health Act, 1898," shall be only such number as would, in the sleeping apartments provided for such infants for such house, be afforded five hundred cubic feet of air space for each such infant over and above the same amount of air space for each other person sleeping in the same apartment, and the number of such infants shall in no case exceed three (3).

#### BY-LAW No. 44.

Preventing any person expectorating on any footpath, etc.

No person shall expectorate on any made footpath in any street or public place, or on any building to which the public have access or any approach thereto, or on any railway carriage, tramcar, or other public conveyance.

Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment of a penalty of any less sum than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this By-law, but in no case to be less than Five shillings.

Rules for the Conduct of Examinations and Issue of Certificates and Licenses under "The Licensed Surveyors Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 14).

THE Land Surveyors' Licensing Board, appointed under the above Act, has, with the approval of His Excelency the Administrator, made the following Rules for the conduct of Examinations and issue of Certificates and Licenses under the said Act; and cancelled the Rules gazetted on 2nd August, 1901:—

- 1. Examination of candidates for certificates or licenses as surveyors will be held in Perth in the month of September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed a tvisable.
- 2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board:—
  - (a.) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the Government Gazette.
  - (b.) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

- 3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no license to practise as a surveyor will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.
- $4. \ \ \, \Lambda$  candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.
- 5. (a.) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- (b.) Or he shall have passed, at any University recognised by an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- (c.) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- 6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

# Form of certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I,  $\Lambda$ .B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land surveying, for the period of to (or has served under

to (or has served under articles, or other similar agreement, for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

Note.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a watercourse or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, and a further fee of £2 2s, paid for the issue of a certificate of competency and license, the candidate will be admitted to examination. Such fee will be returned if the candidate is unsuccessful in passing the examination.

#### SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

#### Mathematics

(a.) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

#### Computation.

(b.) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

#### Principles and practices of surveying.

(c.) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under the Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

#### Levelling, etc.

(d.) Levelling, grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

#### Use of instruments.

(e.) Principles of construction, adjustment, and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, planetable, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachcometer, and steel band.

#### Field astronomy, geodesy, etc.

(f.) Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth; reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle. (With practical tests.)

#### Drawing.

(g.) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

#### Miscellaneous.

- (h.) Physics and geology (elementary); names and descriptions of Australasian timbers of economic value (viva voce).
- 11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

## CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

- 12. Every candidate passing the foregoing examination to the satisfaction of the Board shall, upon payment of the prescribed fees, receive from the Board a certificate of competency.
- 13. Any surveyor licensed in Western Australia prior to September, 1895, or any surveyor licensed prior to September, 1895, in any other of the Australasian States or Colonies, who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the Certificate of Competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and, on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a Certificate of Competency. Such application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

#### LICENSES TO SURVEY.

- 14. The Board may, upon payment of the prescribed fees, issue a license to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia, subsequent to September, 1895, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the country where he obtained his certificate.
- 15. Any surveyor who is licensed to survey in any other of the Australasian States or Colonies applying to the Board for a license to practise in Western Australia may, on production of a letter of recommendation, dated within the preceding twelve months, from the Board of the State in which he is licensed, together with satisfactory evidence as to identity and to character, be entitled to a license to survey in Western Australia. Such application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.
- 16. In the event of failure of any candidate to pass the full examination, the Board may, at its discretion, remit one-half the fees at any subsequent examination of such candidate.
- 17. The Board may grant a letter of recommendation to any surveyor licensed in and desiring to be registered in another Colony, either without examination or on such viva voce examination as, in the opinion of the Board, may be necessary.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND WORKING OF TIMBER TRANWAYS UNDER "THE LAND ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1902."

1. Application for permission to construct and use tramways through and upon Crown Lands and Reserves shall be made in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall be lodged with or forwarded by registered post addressed to the Minister for Lands at his office in Perth, and accompanied by a deposit equal to the amount of rent or propor-

tion thereof due upon the next half-yearly period appointed for payment thereof, and calculated as in the Second Regulation set forth, which deposit shall be returned if the application is not approved, and shall also be accompanied by a plan showing the position of the proposed tramway, such plan to contain sufficient data to enable the position of the tramway to be accurately delineated on the plans of the Department of Lands and Surveys. On approval of the application, permission in the ferm of the Second Sci edule hereto, with such other conditions as the Governor may deem fit to impose, will be issued to the applicant.

Before the issue of any permission the applicant will be required to enter into a bond with two or more sureties approved by the Minister, to observe and abide by the conditions therein and in these Regulations contained, in all respects.

2. The rent payable in respect of such permission shall be such sum as may be fixed by the Governor, but shall not in any case be less than Two pounds (£2) per annum for each mile or fraction of a mile of the length of the proposed tramway.

Such rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of March and the first day of September in each year.

- 3. Upon receipt of the acknowledgment from the Minister of the receipt of an application, and before the granting of any permission to construct and use a firewood tramway will be made, the applicant shall cause the application to be advertised in at least two consecutive issues of some newspaper circulating in the district of the proposed tramway, and shall forward to the Minister a copy of the advertisement.
- 4. If the locality of the proposed tramway be within the limits of any proclaimed goldfield, the applicant shall at the same time cause a copy of the application to be posted at the principal office of the Warden of such goldfield, and shall forward a copy thereof to the Minister.
- 5. The applicant shall set forth in the application the nature of the motive power proposed to be used for haulage purposes on the tramline.
- 6. Any person shall have the right to object at any time within fourteen days of the last advertisement or posting of such notice, whichever shall last occur, to the granting of the permission applied for by notice, in writing, addressed to the Minister setting forth the reasons of such objection, and lodged at his office in Perth, or sent to him, addressed as above, by registered post; a copy of such notice will be sent to the applicant by the Minister.
- 7. The Minister may summon the applicant and the objector to appear before him and state more fully their reasons.
- 8. Any person to whom permission may be granted to construct a tramway shall, within one month of the completion of same, and before commencing the user, notify the Minister of the completion, and at the same time furnish at his own cost a plan showing the portion completed, such plan to be signed by a licensed surveyor, and the survey represented thereon must be carried out to the satisfaction of the Surveyor General, in accordance with the rules and regulations for the guidance of surveyors working for the Department of Land and Surveys. Failure to notify the Minister or supply the necessary plan shall render the permission liable to cancellation.
- 9. Should any person to whom permission to construct a tramway as aforesaid is given, fail to construct and properly equip one quarter of the tramway within six months, and the whole within twelve months from the date he is notified of approval, or should he fail to use such line for the purpose for which permission is granted for a period of one month, the permission will be cancelled; provided that the Minister may, by writing under his hand, grant exemption from using such tramway for any period not exceeding three months. The granting of such exemption shall not relieve the holder from the payment of the prescribed rent.
- 10. Any person to whom permission to construct and use a tramway is granted may, without any further permission, construct and use spur lines on both sides of the main line. But no spur line shall extend beyond a boundary parallel with the main line and distant two and a-half miles therefrom, measured at right angles, and the grantee shall lodge at the Department of Lands and Surveys, once at least in every three months, a plan showing all spur lines and deviations.

No such permission shall be transferred, assignee, mortgaged, sub-let, or otherwise disposed of, without the approval, in writing, of the Governor first had and obtained, and on payment of the prescribed fees.

11. No alteration or extension shall be made to the proposed line of the tramway without the previous consent, in writing, of the Governor first had and obtained.

# SECOND SCHEDULE. WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Permission to construct a Timber Tramway under "The Land Act, 1898," and "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1902."

- 1. The permission is granted subject to both Houses of Parliament not disallowing the conditions herein contained, and if Parliament does disallow them, the permission granted shall be void, and neither the Government nor the Minister shall be liable to make good any loss or damage which the grantee or any person claiming through him may suffer in consequence of such disallowance.
- 2. So far as the tramway shall be constructed over any Timber Reserve, neither the grantee nor any person claiming through him shall cut any timber or firewood outside of a limit of one chain on each side of the middle line of the tramway.

- 3. If any encroachment shall be made on any declared Timber Reserve by the person having the license to pass over them, the Minister shall cancel the license.
- 4. The grantee may construct and use spur lines on both sides of the main line. But no spur line shall extend beyond a boundary parallel with the main line and distant two and a half miles therefrom measured at right angles; and the grantee shall lodge at the Department of Lands and Surveys, once at least in every three months, a plan showing all spur lines and deviations.
- 5. The grantee shall, at his own expense, construct a weighbridge at such point as shall be indicated by the Commisioner of Railways, and maintain the same in a condition for accurate weighing, at his own cost.
- 6. The permission hereby granted may be revoked by the Minister of the will of the Governer, and no person shall be entitled to claim any compensation for any damage, that he may suffer by reason or in consequence of such revocation.
- 7. The grantee shall take all necessary precautions to prevent fire being caused to any land by any locomotive engine or other motive power used and employed upon the tramway.
