Rule 53 and amendments to Rules 40 and 54 of 17th January, 1901, and additions to amendments of 4th December, 1902, are hereby cancelled, and the following amendment substituted in lieu thereof.

"The Honorary Medical Staff shall be appointed by the Governor on the recommendation of the Board of Management, and shall consist of the following officers:—

One Consulting Physician.
One Consulting Surgeon.
Three Physicians.
Two Physicians to out-patients.
Three Surgeons.
Two Surgeons to out-patients.
One Gynæcologist.
One Gynæcologist to out-patients (with two beds).
One Ophthalmic Surgeon.
One Ophthalmic Surgeon (with two beds).
One Ear and Throat Surgeon.
One Surgeon and Physician for Diseases of Children.
One Pathologist and Bacteriologist.
Two Dentists.
One Radiographer and Electrician.

These officers shall hold office for a term of two years, dating in the first instance from 1st April, 1903. They shall continue in office till their successors are appointed.

The members of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be eligible for re-appointment, but shall be subject to removal at any time by the Governor on the recommendation of the Board of Management.

Vacancies, whether by creation or any cause whatever, occurring during the currency of the respective periods, shall be filled for the unexpired term of the office.

The hours and days of attendance and duties, etc., of these Honorary Medical Officers shall be controlled by rules made from time to time by the Board of Management.

THE attention of the public is called to Sections 5, 6, and 7 of "The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act Amendment Act, 1902" (2 Ed. VII., No. 44), as printed below.

Amendment of 44 Vict., No. 9, sec. 56.

5. In section fifty-six of the principal Act the words "Western Australia" are omitted, and the word "Australia" is inserted in place thereof.

Amendment of 44 Vict., No. 9, sec. 57.

6. Section fifty-seven of the principal Act shall not extend to prevent the lawful employment, by any person holding a publican's general license, of an aboriginal native on the licensed premises of such person, with the consent in writing of the Chief Protector of Aborigines first obtained.

Who is to be deemed an aboriginal native. See 50 Vict., No. 25, sec. 45.

7. Every aboriginal native of Australia, and every aboriginal half-caste or child of a half-caste (such half-caste or child habitually associating and living with aboriginal natives), shall be deemed to be an aboriginal native within the meaning of the principal Act, and the Justices adjudicating upon any complaint may, in the absence of other sufficient evidence, decide on their own view and judgment whether any person, with reference to whom any proceedings are taken under the Act, is or is not an aboriginal native.

The barometer was above the average throughout the State. The temperature was fairly normal on the whole. In the neighbourhood of Perth it was slightly below, and on the Coolgardie Goldfields it was above the average for previous years. The rainfall was about the same as for previous years throughout the Goldfields and in North-West districts, but elsewhere it was lighter than usual, although some places in the Tropics received a very heavy downpour. In the South-West division scarcely a drop fell. The only interesting meteorological feature of the month was the passage of a tropical disturbance which put in an appearance off the North-West coast near Condon on the 18th, and worked down to the neighbourhood of Onslow on the 20th, giving stormy weather all along the coast. The rain travelled across to the Goldfields, as it usually does; but, owing to the development of high pressure on the South coast, the track of the "low" was not very well marked. Rain, however, was fairly general throughout the Murchison on the 20th, and on the Coolgardie Goldfields from the 22nd to the 25th, leaving cool weather there for the remainder of the month.

Through the courtesy of the Government Astronomers in South Australia, Victoria, and New South Wales, we are now enabled to compare our weather in Perth with that in Adelaide, Melbourne, and Sydney, and this will doubtless be of interest to those who have been accustomed to the climates of the Eastern States.
