ABOLITION OF PILOT STATION AT ROTTNEST ISLAND

ABOLITION OF PILOT STATION AT ROTTNEST ISLAND
(PORT OF FREMANTLE).

The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, with the concurrence of the Hon. The Colonial Secretary, hereby notify, for general information and guidance of persons using the Port of Fremantle, that on and after the First day of August next (1st August, 1903), the Pilot Establishment, hitherto existing at Rottnest Island, will be discontinued, and that the Pilot Service of the Port of Fremantle will thenceforward be worked from Fremantle.

The Pilot Station, at Fremantle, will be worked as a Shore Station, provided with a steam pilot boat, launch, and sailing lugger.

Rottnest Island is connected with Fremantle by telephone, and vessels bound for Fremantle will, on making Rottnest Island and requiring a Pilot, signal for same to the Signal Station situated at the main Lighthouse on the Island, and on this signal being made out it will be reported to the Pilot Station at Fremantle, whence Pilots will be despatched as required to board incoming vessels at the Pilot Boarding Ground (which is situated about five miles East of Bathurst Point, on Rottnest, as shown on new issues of Chart No. 1058).

Shipmasters are warned not to approach Rottnest nearer than three (3) miles, and to always pass in North of the Island and stand to the Eastward till Fremantle Time Ball Tower (Arthur Head) bears S.E. (Mag.), then steer S.E. towards Boarding Ground.

Sailing vessels working to the Southward with a head wind when East of Rottnest, not to stand closer than three miles to Rottnest Island or mainland.

When approaching Rottnest in the winter months, sailing vessels

When approaching Rottnest in the winter months, sailing vessels must guard against getting embayed South of the Island, as the winter gales generally commence at North with a falling barometer, and rapidly veer to the Westward.

Do not, under any circumstances whatever, heave to North, West, or South of Rottnest, but proceed to Pilot Boarding Ground.

At night, after picking up the Woodman's Point Leading Light stand East, through the Red and into the Bright Sector steer to the S.E. towards Boarding Ground, taking care to keep in Bright Ray.

The South Passage at Rottnest is on no account to be attempted except by vessels whose Masters hold Pilotage Exemption Certificates.

MELVILLE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH. BY-LAW No. 1.

DAIRIES.

WHEREAS by Section 38 of "The Health Act, 1898,"
power is conferred on Local Boards of Health for
the making of By-laws providing for the registration,
annually, of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk, and the payment by each such person to the Local Board of a reasonable fee, not exceeding One pound, for each such registration:

The Melville Local Board of Health hereby makes the

following By-law :-

No person or persons shall carry on the trade of a cow-No person or persons shall carry on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, within the Melville Local Board of Health District, unless such person or persons shall be registered with the Melville Local Board of Health. Such person or persons shall forthwith, for the current year and thereafter, before the second week in January in each year, make application for such registration, in writing, to the said Local Board, and shall pay an annual registration fee as set forth in Schedule hereto; such registration to be in force until the 31st December next ensuing.

BY-LAWS OF THE PERTH LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

 $\frac{922}{1908}$ IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Health Act, 1898," the Municipal Council of the City of Perth, being the Local Board of Health thereof, doth hereby make the following By-laws:-

All By-laws heretofore made under the Health Acts by the Municipal Council, or the Local Board of Health, of the City of Perth are hereby repealed.

In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Board," shall mean the Local Board of Health of the

"Board" shall mean the Local Board of City of Perth;

"Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Local Board of Health of the City of Perth;

"Inspector" shall mean and include any person appointed by the Board as an Inspector under "The Health Act, 1898," and any acting or assistant Inspector;
"Person" shall include a Partnership, Company, or

Corporation; "Refuse" shall mean and include dust, ashes, rags, straw, tins, boxes, broken glass, house and trade refuse, waste paper, and all rubbish of whatsoever

BY-LAW No. 1.

CLOSETS AND URINALS.

- No person shall hereafter erect any closet or urinal within a distance of 20 feet from any dwelling-house or place of business, unless with the express permission of the Board.
- 2. No person shall hereafter erect any urinal within a distance of 15 feet from any well from which any water is supplied for use, or is used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or otherwise in such a position as to

or the test of half, of other was in such a position as to endanger the pollution of any such water.

3. The owner of any house or premises having a closet or urinal attached thereto or used in connection therewith shall cause the entrance to such closet or urinal to be effectually screened from public view.

4. Every person who shall hereafter erect a urinal shall construct the floor thereof of impervious material with a fall to a properly trapped gully connected with a glazed earthenware pipe-drain jointed with cement, and the walls of stone or brickwork or concrete rendered in cement, and shall cause such walls to be covered to a height of four feet from the floor with some impervious material, and to be

supplied with a proper water flush.

- supplied with a proper water flush.

 5. Every person who shall hereafter erect any earth closet shall construct the walls thereof of stone or brickwork or concrete rendered in cement, and the floor space in front of the seat thereof of jarrah, flags, tiles, or other non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door thereof of at least half an inch to the foot and at a height of at least six inches above the level of the surface of the adjoining ground, and the whole of the floor space immediately beneath the seat of such closet of concrete or other impervious material at such a height that it shall be at least three inches above the level of the surface of the adjoining ground, and that the top of the pan shall be not more than one inch from the underside of the seat, and shall construct both sides of the space between the floor and the seat of such closet of flags, slate, asphalt, or brickwork at least 4½ inches thick and rendered in cement, and shall cause such closet—
 - (a.) To be provided with a properly fitted door, which shall at all times be kept in a thorough state of
 - (b.) To be supplied and kept supplied with a sufficient number of pans of the type and size provided by the Board. Such pans shall be purchased from the Board, who shall supply the same at the price of 12s. each.

(c.) To be provided with a trap-door of a size sufficient

to admit any such pans.

(d.) To be provided with a seat so constructed that the whole or a sufficient part thereof may be readily removed or adjusted in such a manner as to afford access to the space beneath such seat for

the purpose of cleansing such space.

(c.) To be provided with guide bars beneath such seat so arranged that the pan, when pushed against such bars, shall be immediately beneath the hole

in such seat.

(f.) To be constructed in such a manner and in such a position as to admit of the removal of the contents of any such pan from such closet and from the premises in connection with which such closet is used without being carried through any dwelling house or building.

(g.) To be provided with sufficient openings for ventila-(g.) To be provided with sufficient openings for ventilation, as near the top as practicable, and communicating directly with the external air, or with such other means of ventilation as may be approved by the Inspector.

6. The occupier of every house or premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a receptacle containing either school and containing either school are constant.

containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, or other disinfectant approved of by the Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in the pan used in connection with such closet to be immediately deodorised with a sufficient quantity of such disinfectant.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence continues.

BY-LAW No. 2.

CARRIAGE OF FOOD.

1. No person shall use any cart or other vehicle for the carriage of meat from or to any abattors, butcher's shop, or premises within the district of the Board, unless and until such cart or other vehicle shall have been inspected and approved of by the Inspector or other officer appointed by the Board.

- 2. No person shall carry or cause to be carried through any street or thoroughfare any meat, bread, fruit, or fish for sale or for delivery to purchasers, unless such meat, bread, fruit, or fish shall be protected from the sun, rain, or
- 3. No person shall use any cart or other vehicle for the carriage of any meat, fish, bread, fruit, or vegetables for sale or for delivery to purchasers, unless such vehicle shall be provided with proper seating accommodation for the driver thereof, and every such vehicle, and every basket, tray, or other article used for the conveyance of any such meat, fish, bread, fruit, or vegetables, and every covering used for protecting the contents thereof shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition, and no person shall sit upon any such meat, fish, bread, fruit, or vegetables in any such cart or other vehicle.
- No person shall at any time carry any manure or offensive matter or refuse in any cart or other vehicle which shall be used for the carriage of meat, bread, or fish for sale or for delivery to purchasers.

 5. No person shall carry or cause to be carried any fruit or vegetables intended for sale or delivery to purchasers in

any cart or vehicle containing manure or offensive matter.

6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence con-

BY-LAW No. 3.

DAIRIES.

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk under a subsisting license heretofore granted by the City Council, and every person who shall become registered under this By-law as hereinafter mentioned, shall, within 15 days from and after the 1st day of November in every year, register himself with the Local Board in manner hereinafter following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary an application in the form hereunder written; and every person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of £1, excepting that when a registration is made after the 1st day of May in any year a fee of 10s. only shall be paid. Provided that any unlicensed person who shall be carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk at the time of the coming into force of this By-law shall, within 15 days thereafter, and every person hereafter about to carry on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade, register himself under this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 4. BAKERIES.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

Every person carrying on a bakery shall cause all troughs, tanks, utensils, and appliances used on or in connection with such premises to be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

3. Every person carrying on the business of a baker shall cause all the inside walls or rooms of any bakehouse,

and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms, whether such walls, ceilings, or tops be plastered or not, and all the passages and outplaces of such bakehouse to be either

- painted with three coats of oil or varnish, or washed with lime or some other wash material or liquid approved of by the Inspector, or to be partly painted with three coats of oil or varnish and partly washed. Where lime-wash is used every such person shall cause the same to be renewed when required so to do by the Inspector, and where oil or varnish is used shall cause the same to be washed with hot water and soap once at least in every six months, and to be renewed as required.
- 4. No person shall use any place on the same level with any bakehouse, and forming part of the same building, as a sleeping place, unless such sleeping place is effectually steeping place, times such steeping place is electronly separated from the bakehouse by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and unless there be also an external glazed window of at least une superficial feet in area, of which at least 4½ superficial feet are made to open for ventilation.
- 5. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 10$, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence con-

BY-LAW No. 5.

REMOVAL OF PIG-WASH.

- 1. No person shall remove any pig-wash or other filthy matter unless the same be carried in a securely covered, water-tight vessel, barrel, cask, tank, or other suitable receptacle, so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any of its contents, or of any offensive, noxious, or injurious
- Every person who shall use any vessel, barrel, cask, tank or other receptacle as aforesaid for the reception and removal of any pig-wash or other filthy matter, and any conveyance or vehicle for the carriage thereof, shall keep same in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 3. No person shall remove any pig-wash or other filthy matter from any place or premises within the District of the Board or shall convey or carry the same through any street or thoroughfare within the said district between the hours of nine o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Board,
- 4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence continues.

BY-LAW No. 6.

REGULATING THE KEEPING OF CATTLE AND OTHER LIVE Ѕтоск.

- 1. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall-
 - (a.) Provide, in connection with such building or premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may, from time to time, be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises.
 - (b.) Cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle.
 - (c.) Cause such receptacle to be constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom into the wall of any
 - building.

 (d.) Cause such receptacle to be furnished with a suitable cover, and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.
 - (e.) Provide in connection with such building or premises a sufficient drain, constructed in such a manner and of such materials, and maintained at all times in such a condition as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.
 - (f.) Once at least in every week, or oftener if required by the Inspector, remove, or cause to be removed, from the receptacle provided in accordance with the requirements of this By-law, all dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter produced in or upon such building or premises and deposited in such receptacle.
- No occupier of any premises shall keep any cattle or deposit the dung of any cattle in such a situation or in such a manner as to pollute any water supplied for use, or used

or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or any water used or likely to be used in any dairy.

- 3. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the District under the control of the Board, unless and until such premises proposed to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved of by the Officer of Health.
- 4. No person shall keep a poultry yard in such a condition as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or, where space will allow, within 25 feet of any dwelling house.
- 5. Every person who shall keep a poultry yard shall cause the same to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and to be disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.
- 6. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and for a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence continues.

BY-LAW No. 7.

FOR THE COLLECTION AND REMOVAL OF REFUSE, ETC.

- 1. The occupier of every house or premises shall cause—
 - (a.) Such house or premises to be provided with as many receptacles for the temporary deposit of refuse as may be required by notice in writing from the Inspector. Such receptacles shall be constructed of 22-gauge plain galvanised iron 17½ inches in depth and 18 inches in diameter, with a handle on each side made of ¾ths round iron, and a conical cover made of 26-gauge plain galvanised iron with a handle on top. The bottoms of such receptacles shall be knocked up and the seams grooved and the bottoms and seams sweated with solder inside.
 - (b.) All refuse from such house or premises to be regularly collected and deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.
 - (c.) Such receptacle or receptacles to be kept in such a place and position convenient for the removal of the contents thereof, as the Inspector may direct.
 - (d.) Such receptacle or receptacles to be kept in such a condition as not to become offensive or to over-flow
 - (e.) Such receptacle or receptacles to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected with a suitable disinfectant whenever the same may be necessary, or whenever required by the Inspector or any other officer of the Board.
 - (f.) Such receptacle or receptacles to be replaced whenever the same shall, in the opinion of the Inspector, become worn out or unfit for use.
- 2. Every person who shall convey any refuse, rubbish, or manure, emitting a stench, through or along any street, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such refuse, rubbish, or manure to be covered with lime, or other suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be reasonably necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive effluvia from such refuse, rubbish, or manure. If, in the process of such conveyance, any person shall slop or spill, or cause or allow to fall upon any footway, pavement, or carriage-way any such refuse, rubbish, or manure, he shall forthwith remove same, and shall immediately thereafter thoroughly sweep or otherwise thoroughly cleanse such place.
- 3. Except in cases where any sewage, soil, filth, dung, ashes, dust, rubbish, or manure are produced on his own premises and are removed for sale or applied for his own use, as manure, no person shall remove from off any premises any such sewage, soil, filth, dung, ashes, dust, rubbish, or manure, unless previously licensed by, or by special written leave of, the Board, or shall deposit the same in any place within the District other than a place set apart by the Board for that purpose.
- 4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence continues.

BY-LAW No. 8.

PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

- 1. All private hospitals shall be registered annually at the office of the Board in manner hereinafter provided, on the 1st day of November in every year.
- 2. All private hospitals heretofore established shall be registered within one month after this By-law shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*, and all private

- hospitals which shall hereafter be established shall be registered before the same shall be opened, but no registration under this By-law shall remain in force after the 31st day of October following the date thereof.
- 3. Any person desiring to open, occupy, or conduct, or to keep open, occupied, or conducted any hospital within the jurisdiction of the Board, shall make written application to the Board, stating
 - (a.) The locality of the premises proposed to be registered.
 - (b.) Whether such hospital is intended for surgical purposes only or for the treatment of fevers and infectious and contagious diseases, or for both.
 - (c.) The maximum number of patients to be taken in, and the minimum number of nurses to be constantly employed.
 - (d.) The provisions made for sanitary arrangements, including the collection and disposal of all filth, house refuse, slops, etc.
 - (e.) The name and address of the applicant, and the qualifications possessed by him or her.
- 4. Such application shall be accompanied by a plan of the premises proposed to be registered, and also by a certificate, signed by the Health Officer, that such premises are in every way fit to be so registered, and that due and proper provision has been made for the observance of this By-law, and shall also be accompanied by a certificate, signed by the Inspector, that the sanitary arrangements are in every way satisfactory.
- 5. Within seven days after the application aforesaid is lodged with the Secretary, the applicant shall advertise notice in two daily papers published in Perth, in Form "A" in the Schedule to this By-law. Such advertisement shall be inserted in seven issues of each of the said papers, and copies of such issues shall be lodged with the Secretary.
- 6. No premises shall be registered unless the Health Officer shall certify, in writing, that the applicant in respect of such premises is in every manner qualified to be the keeper of a hospital.
- 7. No registration shall be granted in respect of any premises intended for use as a hospital for the treatment of fevers and infectious and contagious diseases when any part of the buildings on such premises are within 50 feet of any other building or erection, or, in respect of any premises intended for use as a hospital for surgical cases only, when any part of the buildings on such premises are within 12 feet of the boundary fence of such premises.
- 8. If an application is granted, the applicant shall receive from the Secretary of the Board a certificate of registration in Form "B" in the Schedule to this By-law, or to the like effect.
- 9. Any keeper of a hospital registered for surgical purposes only, who shall admit or permit the admission of any person suffering from any fever or infectious or contagious disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 10. The keeper of every private hospital shall provide each fever patient with at least 1,000, and each other patient with at least 500 cubic feet of space, and a minimum floor space of 160 feet, and 8 feet of lineal wall space shall be provided for each bed, and for the purpose of this calculation of cubic air space the limitation of height shall be 12 feet, and no keeper of any such hospital shall permit a greater number of patients or other persons to occupy or be in or upon the premises registered in that behalf than the number which will allow of such space being provided.
- 11. No keeper of a private hospital shall allow any patient to be or remain in any part of the premises not specified in the application to be for the use of patients, or to be or remain in any part of the premises which the Health Officer shall certify as unfit for patients.
- 12. The keeper of any private hospital shall cause every patient suffering from any contagious or infectious disease to be kept isolated from all other patients.
- 13. No keeper of a private hospital shall make any alteration to any registered premises, or any part thereof, unless with the approval of the Health Officer and the written consent of the Secretary.
- 14. No keeper of a private hospital shall allow persons of different sexes to occupy the same apartment, except in the case of children under the age of 10 years, or of married couples, in which latter case not more than one married couple shall be allowed to occupy the same apartment.

- 15. The keeper of every private hospital shall-
 - (a.) At all times give access to the premises registered in that behalf to the Health Officer, Inspector, and other persons authorised by the Board, and permit the Health Officer to see and examine all

(b.) Forthwith report to the Inspector, in writing, all cases of fever or other infectious or contagious cases

(c.) Cause all refuse to be burnt on the premises, in manner approved by the Health Officer.

(d.) Provide separate pans for the collection and removal of all excrementitious matter from fever, infectious, and contagious cases.

(e.) At all times keep all such material and appliances as the Health Officer may deem advisable for the use of patients or medical practitioners in

charge of patients.

(f.) Forthwith carry out all such orders and directions as the Health Officer may from time to time give relating to the sanitation, drainage, and good management of the premises and the care and comfort of the patients occupying the same.

- (g.) Forthwith carry out all such orders and directions as may be given from time to time by the Inspector relating to the sanitary arrangements, and the cellection and disposal of all nightsoil, house refuse, rags, slops, waste water, and other
- (h.) At all times keep a register showing the name and address of each patient admitted, the place from which he comes, and if the illness was contracted in Perth, the street where the person resided, the complaint from which he is suffering, and the medical practitioner under whose care the patient is, the date of admission and the date of leaving, and whether the patient is discharged cured or otherwise, and, in case of death, the cause of death. Such register shall be signed by the practitioner in charge of the case, and provision shall be made in such register to enable patients and practitioners to record (if they so desire) any complaints against the hospital, or desire) any complaints against the hospital, or his or her treatment therein. Every register as aforesaid shall be the absolute property of the Board, and shall be kept in such a place as to be at all times open to the inspection of the Health Officer, and also of any medical practitioner attending any case at the hospital, and, when filled in, shall be handed to the Secretary of the

(i.) At all times exercise a personal supervision over the premises and the persons employed therein, and see that all directions given by the medical practitioner in charge of any patient are faith-

fully and diligently carried out.

fully and diligently carried out.

(j.) At all times keep the said premises, and the yard attached thereto, and all outhouses and buildings, closets, and privies, and all household linen, beds, and bedding appliances and material thoroughly cleansed and disinfected, to the satisfaction of the Health Officer.

(k.) Provide at all times a number of certificated nurses sufficient in the opinion of the Health Officer, and also at all times keep employed on

Officer, and also at all times keep employed on the said premises the minimum number of certificated nurses or attendants inserted in the

certificate of registration.

16. No keeper of a private hospital shall—
(a.) At any time employ, engage, or permit or suffer to be on the premises any person to nurse, assist, or attend any patient, unless such person is a duly certificated nurse or attendant, as hereinafter mentioned, or unless such person is a relative of the patient.

(b.) Be absent from the registered premises for more than one week at a time, without the written consent of the Health Officer.

(c.) Transfer the said premises to be used as a private hospital, unless the transferce has first applied for and obtained a certificate of registration as keeper of the said premises.

17. The Board may forthwith cancel the registration of any premises if the keeper thereof or any persons employed or permitted to be on the premises by such keeper shall commit any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or of "The Health Act, 1898," or fail to observe any order

or direction given by the Health Officer, Inspector, or other competent Officer of the Board.

18. All applications for renewal of registration shall be lodged with the Board on or before the first day of September in each year, and the Board may, in its discretion,

refuse any such renewal.

- 19. Any person desiring to be qualified to become a nurse or attendant in any hospital shall apply for a certificate to the Health Officer, who may require the applicant to pass such examination as he thinks fit, and may direct the such examination as he thinks fit, and may direct the Secretary to grant or refuse such certificate. Any certificate so granted shall be in the Form "C" in the Schedule to this By-law, and may be cancelled at any time in the discretion of the Health Officer, but until so cancelled the person named therein shall be qualified to nurse or assist in any hospital registered under this By-law.
- 20. This By-law shall apply to the whole of the district of the Perth Board of Health, and to every private hospital, whether heretofore or hereafter established.
- 21. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence

BY-LAW No. 9.

Common Lodging-houses.

- The registration of common lodging-houses shall be annually renewed on the 1st day of November in each year, and the fee for every registration and renewal shall be the sum of 10s. Upon the registration of every common lodging-house, and upon every renewal, the Secretary shall issue to the keeper thereof a certificate of such registration in the form in the Schedule to this By-law, and such keeper shall, whenever required by any police constable or any officer or servant of the Board, produce such certificate for inspection.
- 2. No keeper of a common lodging-house shall permit a greater number of persons to occupy any sleeping apartment in such house at any one time than will admit of each such person having at least 500 cubic feet of space. For the purpose of this clause two children under ten years of age shall be counted as one person, and in the case of any apartment the walls of which do not reach from floor to ceiling, the amount of space in such apartment shall not be deemed greater than if such walls did reach from floor to

ceiling.
3. No house shall be registered as a common lodging-house unless each room intended for use as a sleeping apartment for lodgers shall bear a distinguishing number.

- 4. No room shall be registered as a sleeping apartment for lodgers if it be situated in a basement or below the level of the ground, or if it be used as a kitchen, scullery, dining, or general sitting room, nor unless such room have a window admitting light, and capable of being opened for the admission of fresh air.
- No keeper of a common lodging-house shall permit any room to be used as a sleeping apartment for lodgers other than a room registered for that purpose.

- 6. The Secretary shall issue to each keeper of a common lodging-house a notice signed by him in respect of each separate room, and such notice shall specify the maximum number of lodgers authorised to occupy each such room, respectively, as a sleeping apartment at any one time.
- 7. The keeper of every common lodging-house shall at all times keep the notice mentioned in the last preceding clause exhibited in a conspicuous place in the sleeping apartment in respect of which such notice shall have been
- 8. No keeper of a common lodging-house shall make any alteration to such house, except with the consent of the Board.
- 9. No keeper of a common lodging-house shall allow persons of different sexes to occupy the same sleeping apartment, except in the cases of children under the age of years, or of parents with their children under the age of 10 years, or of married couples, in which latter case not more than one married couple shall be allowed to occupy the same sleeping apartment.
 - 10. The keeper of every common lodging-house shall-

 - (a.) Cause the floor of every room or passage and every stair in such house to be kept thoroughly clean.
 (b.) Cause the yard and out-premises to be swept daily, and to be kept at all times clean and free from filth.
 - (c.) Cause the seats and floors of all closets or privies to be scrubbed and washed daily, and the walls to be limewashed once at least every month.

 (d.) Provide a sufficient number of appliances, water,
 - soap, and clean towels for washing, in the case of female lodgers or married couples, in their sleeping apartments, and in the case of male lodgers either in their sleeping apartments or in a convenient room set apart and fitted for the
 - purpose.

 (e.) Cause all beds, blankets, rugs, covers, sheets, towels, and house-linen to be kept clean, free
 - from vermin, and in a wholesome condition.

 (f.) Cause every sheet and all househo'd linen to be washed at least once in every seven days.
 - (g.) Furnish every sleeping apartment with a sufficient number of toilet utensils and bedsteads and sufficient bedding, so that each bed shall be provided with a mattress, two sheets, a rug and,
 - in winter time, not less than one additional rug.

 (h.) Cause the doors and windows of every sleeping apartment to be opened and kept fully open for at least three hours during each day, except when any bed in any such room shall be occupied by any lodger in consequence of sickness or of other sufficient cause.
 - (i.) Cause the bed-clothes of every bed to be removed therefrom as soon as conveniently may be after such bed shall have been vacated by any lodger, and such bed-clothes and bed to be freely exposed to the air during one hour at least of each day.
- 11. No keeper of a common lodging-house shall cause or allow any bed in any room which may be used as a sleeping apartment by persons of the male sex above the age of 10 years to be occupied at any one time by more than one such person.
- 12. No keeper of a common lodging-house shall cause or allow any lodger to occupy any bed in such house at any time within the period of eight hours after such bed shall have been vacated by the last preceding occupant thereof, unless such bed shall be provided with fresh bed-linen.
- 13. No keeper of a common lodging-house shall suffer or permit any immoral conduct on his registered premises.
- 14. In the absence of the registered keeper from the premises, the person apparently in charge thereof shall be deemed for all purposes the agent of the keeper, and such person and the keeper, or either of them, may be held responsible and proceeded against for any breach of or neglect to perform or observe any of the provisions of this By-law or of the "Health Act 1898."
- 15. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence continues.

BY-LAW No. 10. MISCELLANEOUS.

- 1. No person other than an employee of the Board shall remove or contract for the removal of nightsoil from any premises.
- 2. No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.
- 3. Every person who shall keep a matine store, flock-bedding, or furniture manufactory shall, from time to time and when required by the Inspector, disinfect all rags or other materials used or stored therein so that the same shall not cause a nuisance or be injurious to health.
- 4. No person shall manufacture flock from rags unless all such rags be boiled in water, or in water containing soap and soda, for at least half-an-hour immediately prior to such rags being subjected to the process of manufacture.
- 5. No person shall pump, empty, throw, or otherwise discharge into or upon any street, lane, or thoroughfare any foul or offensive water or other liquid.
- 6. The occupier of any building or premises registered under Section 147 of "The Health Act, 1898," as a "noxious trade establishment" shall keep the same in a clean and sanitary state.
- 7. No occupier of any factory or other establishment shall cause or allow any steam whistle used in connection therewith to be so used as to be or become a nuisance.
- 8. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of a slaughter-house, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shop, manufactory, brewery, or laundry shall cause all blood, offal, bones, manure, and other offensive liquid or matter produced or accumulated thereon to be placed in a suitable water-tight receptacle and to be removed from the said premises at least once in 48 hours, or oftener if so directed by any officer of the Board, and in the meant me to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to escape or flow into or upon any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place.

 9. The owner or person in charge of any horse, ox, ass, sheep, or other animal which shall have
- been killed by or in consequence of any accident shall forthwith cause the carcase of such animal to be removed beyond the boundaries of the Municipality and to be destroyed by fire or to be buried, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 10. No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any other matter or thing so as to cause a nuisance or to be offensive to any person resident in the district.
- 11. No person shall expectorate on any made footpath in any street or public place, or on any building to which the public have access, or on any approach thereto, or on any
- railway carriage, tramcar, or other public conveyance.

 12. No person shall keep any animal so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.
- The owner of every building shall cause the same to be provided with spouting, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.
- 14. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day during which the offence con-

REGULATIONS AND BY-LAWS WITH RESPECT TO TRANCARS.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Tramways Act, 1885," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Perth do hereby repeal By-laws No. 1 to 29, passed by the Council of the City of Perth on the 5th day of February, 1900, for the licensing of tramcars, drivers, and conductors, and do make and order the following Regulations and By-laws in lieu thereof:—

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws the words "Traffic Inspector" shall mean the person for the time being carrying out the duties of Traffic Inspector for the City of Perth.
- 2. No tramcar shall be kept for the purpose of plying for hire unless and until a license shall have been first had and obtained for the same and except during the currency of such license, and if any unlicensed tramcar shall be so kept for the purpose of plying for hire the owner thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

3. Every license in respect of any tramcar shall expire on the thirty-first day of October next after the same shall

be granted.

- 4. Before any license for a tramcar is granted by the Council, the owner thereof shall make application for the same on a form to be approved of by the Traffic Inspector.

 5. The Council shall, upon any such application as aforesaid being made, cause an inspection to be made of the tramcar to which the same shall relate, and shall not grant the license unless such tramcar shall be found to be in a fit and proper condition for public use.
- 6. In every such license for a transcar shall be specified the number of such license (but so that no two licenses granted hereunder by the Council shall bear the same number), and also the number of persons licensed to be carried in and by such transcar: Provided that no child under the age of three years sitting on the lap shall be deemed a person within the meaning of this By-law.
- 7. The owner of every licensed tramcar shall cause to be painted or marked thereon, in such manner and in such conspicuous position as the Traffic Inspector shall direct, and shall keep so painted or marked, the number of such tramcar corresponding with the number of the license, and the number of passengers licensed to be carried by such tramcar.
- The Traffic Inspector may, as often as he may deem it necessary, make an inspection of all tramears licensed by the Council; and if any such tramcars shall be found to be in a condition unfit for public use, he shall give notice to that effect to the owner thereof, which notice shall be served on such owner by delivering the same at the usual place of residence or business of such owner; and if, after notice as aforesaid, the owner shall use any such tramcar whilst in such condition, such owner shall be liable, upon conviction,

to a penalty not exceeding £2 for every day during which such tramcar shall be so used.

9. No person shall act as a driver or conductor of any tramcar without having a valid and subsisting license so to act from the Council, which license such Council is authorised to grant on being satisfied that the person applying for the same is a person of good character, and proper skill and fitness, and competent to perform the duties of a driver or conductor thereof, as the case may be. Every such license shall be registered by the Traffic Inspector.

10. Before any license is granted by the Council to any person to act as driver or conductor of any tramcar, the owner of such tramcar shall make an application for the same on a form to be approved of by the Traffic Inspector.

- 11. Every license so to be granted to any driver or conductor shall expire on the 31st day of October next after the same shall be granted.
- 12. When any driver or conductor leaves the service of any owner of a tramcar or tramcars, such owner shall, upon production of the license of such driver or conductor, be entitled to have the name of some other person, to be approved by the Traffic Inspector, substituted in such license as driver or conductor, as the case may be, and thereupon the person whose name shall be so substituted shall be deemed duly licensed for the balance of the term for which the original license was granted, and shall be the only person entitled to act as driver or conductor in pursuance of such license.
- 13. Neither the driver nor the conductor of any tramcar shall allow more than the number of persons for which such tramear shall be licensed to be carried in or by such tramear, and no person shall enter into or upon such tramear after he shall have been informed by the driver or conductor that the same has already the full number of passengers.
- 14. The driver of every tramcar shall stop such car immediately before crossing the intersection of any streets.
- 15. No driver of any tramear shall stop such car upon the intersection of any streets.
- 16. Every licensed driver in charge of any tramcar shall at all times, whilst such tramear shall be standing in any street, act under the direction of the Traffic Inspector, or other Officer of the Council, or any Police Constable on duty, and shall take up such position upon the tram line with such tramear as shall be pointed out to him by such Traffic Inspector, Officer, or Police Constable.
- 17. No driver of any tramcar shall cause or allow the same to travel in any portion of the Municipality at a greater rate of speed than 10 miles per hour.
- 18. No driver of any tramear shall, without the consent of the Traffic Inspector first had and obtained, cause or allow the same to follow any other tramcar at a less distance than 50 clear yards.
- 19. The driver of every tramcar shall sound the gong or bell attached thereto, and give sufficient warning as the said tramcar overtakes any vehicle or approaches the intersection of any streets, and also before setting the car in motion after any stoppage, and before passing another car, whether stationary or in motion.
- 20. The driver of any tramcar shall stop the same upon demand by the Traffic Inspector, or other Officer of the Council, or any Police Constable, to enable such Traffic Inspector, Officer of the Council, or Police Constable to count the number of passengers, or to ascertain the name of any person on the said tramcar who may be offending against any of the By-laws or Regulations, or any By-law or Regulations lawfully made in pursuance of "The Tramways Act, 1885."
- 21. Every driver and conductor of any tramcar shall, on being requested by any Traffic Inspector or other Officer of the Council, or any Police Constable, or Passenger, give to such Inspector, Officer, Police Constable, or Passenger, his name and the licensed number of the tramcar he is driving for attendant on, and shall, upon request, produce his license for inspection by any such Inspector, Officer, or Police
- 22. No licensed driver or conductor of any tramcar shall suffer any unlicensed person to act as driver or conductor, as the case may be, of such tramcar: Provided that this clause shall not be deemed to prevent any person in the employ of the owner of any tramcar acting as driver of such tramcar in the presence and under the supervision of the licensed driver thereof.
- 23. No person shall drive along Hay Street, between Pier and Milligan Streets, any vehicle containing any timber, iron, stones, bricks, or other building or road-making material between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 11 o'clock at night, unless such timber, iron, stones, bricks, or other material is or are to be used in connection with, or stored in, or is or are being removed from some building abutting upon such portion of Hay Street.

24. Where anything is by any of the foregoing Regulations or By-laws directed to be done or forbidden to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act so forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person or company making default as to such direction or prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and for every such offence, not otherwise hereinbefore specially provided for, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.
