PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA,

By His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of 1 and 2 Edward VII., No. 24, the Governor may, by Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operation of "The Early Closing Act, 1902," in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: NOW THEREFORE I, Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, do hereby suspend the operation of the said Act in so far as it applies to the closing time of Hairdressers' Shops in the Municipality of Perth during Thursday, the 9th instant, from 6.30 o'clock, p.m., until 10 o'clock, p.m.
