WHEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53rd Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to prescribe limits within which it shall not be lawful to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, and to determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that it shall not be lawful to fish by means of any net or fixed engine within that portion of Champion Bay hereinafter described: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in—

That portion of the ocean waters extending from a point 200 yards to the East of the Geraldton Railway Jetty, to a point 200 yards to the West of the Geraldton Esplanade Jetty, and half a mile seaward.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds sterling (£20), and shall forfeit the instruments used and all fish that shall have been taken.

MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS.

MUNICIPALITY OF BUNBURY.

BY-LAW No. 74.

FIRE BRIGADE RULES.

Rule 1.—Name.

The Brigade shall be styled "The Bunbury Municipal Fire Brigade."

Rule 2.—Object.

The object of this Brigade shall be the prevention and extinction of fires, and the saving of life and property when endangered thereby.

Rule 3.—Constitution.

The Brigade shall consist of Superintendent, Foreman, Engineer, Sub-Engineer, Drill Instructor, Secretary, and twelve firemen, or such of those officers and men as may be required. Only persons of undoubted character shall be eligible to enter the Brigade, and, subject to the rules next following, shall be elected by a majority of members of the Brigade present at a General Meeting.

Rule 4.—Appointment of Officers.

The Superintendent, Foreman, and Engineer shall be appointed by, and hold their respective appointments during the pleasure of the Bunbury Municipal Council.

Rule 5.—Conduct of Business.

The business of the Brigade shall be conducted by the officers and members of the Brigade. Meetings shall be held monthly, when all business relative to social matters may be dealt with. All recommendations affecting appliances or the effectiveness of the Brigade shall be submitted, in writing, to the Fire Brigade Committee of the Council, to be considered by them and finally dealt with by the Council.

Rule 6.—Order of Business.

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes.
- (b.) Correspondence.
- (c.) Committee's and Officer's reports.
- (d.) Nomination and election of candidates.
- (e.) General business, and notices of motion.

All correspondence shall be considered as received, unless a motion to the contrary is carried.

Rule 7.—Notices of Motion.

Every notice of motion must be handed to the Secretary in writing, at least three clear days before the meeting at which it is proposed to discuss the same.

Rule 8.—Rules of Debate.

At all meetings the order of debate shall be as follows:—

- (a.) No motion shall be discussed until it has been seconded and stated to the meeting by the Chairman.
- (b.) When a motion is under discussion, no matter foreign to the question shall be admitted until a decision of the meeting is announced from the Chairman thereon.
- (c.) A motion to adjourn either a debate or a meeting shall always be in order.
- (d.) Every member speaking to a motion shall rise and address the Chair.
- (e.) No member shall speak more than once to any motion, except in reply or in explanation, without the express permission of the Chair.
- (f.) In the event of two members rising at the same time to speak, the Chairman shall decide who is in possession of the meeting. Any member may call for a division or ballot on any motion before the meeting. All members must either vote or leave the room. Any member acting contrary to these Rules shall be fined 2s. 6d., and on further persisting, he shall be fined 5s. and called upon to withdraw from that meeting.

Rule 9.—Membership.

Each member on joining the Brigade shall subscribe his name to the Rules and Regulations in a book to be kept for that purpose by the Secretary, in proof of his willingness to submit to all such Rules and Regulations, and also to all such alterations as may from time to time be made and approved by the Municipal Council. A copy of all such Rules and Regulations shall be furnished to each member.

Rule 10.—Address of Members.

Each member, on joining the Brigade, shall give to the Secretary his address, to be entered in a book kept for the purpose, and upon any change of his address he shall notify the same at once to the officer.

Rule 11.—Duties of Superintendent.

It shall be the duty of the Superintendent to take charge at all fires, to preside at all meetings, certify all accounts, be responsible for the proper condition of the Brigade and all appliances, and to furnish a quarterly report to the Council.

Rule 12.—Duties of Foreman.

It shall be the duty of the Foreman to act with and under the direction of the Superintendent, and in his absence, to perform his duties. To have direct charge of the engine and gear, and to be responsible for the proper condition of the same. He shall report to the Superintendent any defect or disarrangement, and attend all parades. His particular duty on an alarm of fire is to get the engine to the spot as quickly as possible. He will be responsible that every thing required, such as hose-reels, hand-pumps, ladders, and the like, are to hand, he will also arrange for necessary assistance, and see that the engine is placed in the best possible position with regard to the supply of water and the locality of the fire.

Rule 13.—Duties of Secretary.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to summon and attend all meetings of the Brigade, to take minutes, and record the names of members attending such meetings; to keep the books, papers, and accounts of the Brigade; to carry on all necessary correspondence, to receive all moneys due to the Brigade and pay the same into the Bank; to countersign all accounts presented for payment, to countersign cheques, and make payments as may be directed.

Rule 14.—Duties of Engineer.

It shall be the duty of the Engineer to see that all the engines and reels are at all times kept in perfect working order, and at once to report to the Foreman any defect in the same; in order to do this, he shall overhaul and examine all the appliances at least once a week, and immediately after any alarm. His special duty at a fire shall be to attend on the engines and see that they are working properly.

Rule 15.—Duties of Sub-Engineer.

It shall be the duty of the Sub-Engineer to assist the Engineer in carrying out his duties, and in his absence, to perform those duties himself.

Rule 16.—General Duties of Firemen.

1. It shall be the duty of firemen to attend all meetings and drills of the Brigade; and immediately on any alarm of fire, to proceed with all speed to the station and assist in getting out the engines and appliances ready to start; firemen shall, if possible, appear in uniform. On arriving at the fire they shall take their places as told off by the officer in charge, and on no account allow their attention to be diverted from their duties by the direction of any persons other than their own officers.

2. To pay strict and prompt obedience to the commands of officers.

3. After all practices, drills, or fires, to return forthwith to the station and assist with appliances, and not to leave the premises without the permission of the officer in charge.

Rule 17.—Uniforms.

1. The uniform of the Brigade shall be determined by the Committee.

2. Uniforms shall be provided by, and remain the property of the Brigade.

3. No member shall wear his uniform in public except on duty, or by the express permission of the Superintendent.

4. Every member shall appear in uniform at all practices, and so far as possible, at fires.

5. All members shall see that their uniforms are at all times kept in proper condition. Any member carelessly or wilfully damaging, or making away with any part of his uniform, shall be liable to make good the same, and shall be dealt with under the Rule next following.

Rule 18.—Misconduct of Members.

1. Any member using improper language when on parade, at a fire, or practice, or appearing at a parade in a state of intoxication, or refusing or neglecting to obey any order of an officer in charge, or who shall at any time be guilty of conduct unbecoming a member, or calculated to bring discredit on, or lower the status of the Brigade, shall be suspended, and shall be dealt with as provided in the following Rule.

2. Any charge brought against a member shall be investigated by the Committee at a Special Meeting to be called within seven clear days from time of suspension. A written statement of the charge shall be forwarded to the accused three clear days prior to such meeting, and should the charge be proved, the member shall be subject to such penalty as the Committee may determine.

3. Any member who has been expelled by a decision of the Committee shall deliver up all articles belonging to the Brigade in his possession, and shall not be eligible for re-election.

4. No member shall be allowed to write or answer any letter in any of the public journals without the sanction of the Brigade.

Rule 19.—Retirement of Members.

1. Any member wishing to leave the Brigade shall give seven clear days' notice, in writing, to the Secretary of his intention, and shall deliver up all articles belonging to the Brigade at once.

2. Any member wishing to absent himself from the district for any term exceeding one month shall notify the same to the Secretary and obtain leave of absence.

Rule 20.—Office becoming Vacant.

In the event of any office becoming vacant, nominations for same shall be posted on the board at least three clear days before the monthly meeting. The election shall take place at the first monthly meeting, or at a special meeting called for that purpose, should necessity arise.

Rule 21.—Reserve List.

Any member retiring from active service may, if he wish, be placed on the reserve list of the Brigade; preference being given to his services at fires.

Rule 22.—Elections.

All elections shall be by ballot.

Rule 23.—Misconduct of Officers.

Should the Brigade be dissatisfied with the conduct of any officer, a Special Meeting of the Brigade shall be called, and the charge investigated. Should the charge or charges in the opinion of a two-thirds majority of the members be substantiated, the officer shall be called on to resign with the Council's approval, with the exception of the Superintendent, who shall be under the control of the Municipal Council.

Rule 24.—Power to add to Rules.

The Fire Brigade Committee of the Council have power to add to these Rules and Regulations any additional Rules that may be necessary, if acceptable to the Brigade.

Rule 25.—Refreshments.

If considered necessary by the Superintendent, or officer in charge at any fire, the Secretary shall provide such refreshments for the members as may be directed by the officer in charge.

Rule 26.—Signal Whistles.

The following whistles shall be used by the officers in command at fires:—

- One whistle to fall in at the Station.
- One whistle at fire, to turn on water.
- Two whistles, to turn off water.
- Three whistles, to return gear to appliances.
- Continuous whistle, danger.

Rule 27.—Tolls.

The watchman, in giving the alarm of fire, shall use the following tolls to indicate the direction:—

- North, peal and one toll.
- South, peal and two tolls.
- East, peal and three tolls.
- In centre of city, continuous ringing.

Rule 28.—Reserve Members.

1. Firemen on reserve list shall attend fires and practices of the Brigade, and be subject to the Rules and Regulations thereof. They shall attend all meetings of the Brigade, and have no voice or vote in the proceedings.

2. Any candidate for the Reserve List being rejected shall not be eligible for re-nomination till the expiration of six months.

Rule 29.—Attendance of Members.

All members must attend not less than half of all calls to fires, to keep themselves effective. Roll book to be made up every three months, when all non-effective members shall be struck off, unless excused, or on leave of absence.

Rule 30.—Donations.

All donations to the fund of the Brigade to be handed to the Municipal Council, unless where specially stipulated by the donor as being for the personal benefit of the members.

BY-LAW No. 75.

AUTHORITY OF SUPERINTENDENT.

The Superintendent of the Fire Brigade shall, for the time being, at any fire, have the command of the Brigade engaged, and also of all appliances employed in extinguishing such fire. The Superintendent or officer in charge of the Brigade shall be empowered to enter upon or through any premises while in the execution of his duties, and to direct the action of the Brigade through or upon such premises. The Superintendent shall be further empowered to take water from tanks, reservoirs, or wells nearest or most convenient to the fire, and otherwise to do any matter of thing which he shall deem expedient for the purpose of extinguishing such fire.

BY-LAW No. 76.

RECOVERY OF EXPENSES.

The Superintendent, or officer in charge, or the Mayor, shall be authorised to employ, in extinguishing fires, such persons as either of them shall deem necessary, and the said Superintendent or officer, or Mayor, shall recover the amount of expenses actually incurred by the Brigade at any fire, from the owner or occupier of such premises, provided that such expenses shall not exceed those set forth in the following Schedule, and all such charges shall be recoverable in the Local Court:—

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24) the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws. Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

1. No person shall erect within the district of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal, the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.

2. All closets, privies, or urinals shall be erected in such position and in such manner as shall be approved of by the Local Board; and all such closets, privies, and urinals shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

3. Authority under Section 173, Subsection 3.—The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter—Size, shape, materials of construction—Interchangeable.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the size, shape, style and materials approved by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 4.

There shall be provided two receptacles for every closet on each premises.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be cleansed thoroughly.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 7.

That failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor be compelled to obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved dépôt for nightsoil for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

BY-LAW No. 8.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such dépôts or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such dépôts or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Mode of removal, etc.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Fixing the charge, etc.

The Local Board shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the owner or occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

1. No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

2. No nightman shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

3. The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions.

The following shall be the conditions upon which licenses to remove nightsoil shall be issued:—

The penalties for breach of any of the foregoing conditions shall be not more than the respective amounts set forth at the conclusion of each such condition.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed—
Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 14.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee of £1 for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 15.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.

2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bonedust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the depot or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 20.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

1. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.

2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 21.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 22.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry-yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 23.

For the regulation of noxious or offensive trades.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of the Act, whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee, as set forth in Schedule "D" hereto, of the amount of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be limewashed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 24.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 26.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Regulating the disposal of the carcasses of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcass of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or Townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper watertight vehicles or receptacles fitting with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance used in any laundry which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water, or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing, shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 34.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 36.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

REGULATIONS.

1. Whenever land is proclaimed open to selection under Section 11 of "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," applications may be made for any allotment thereof at such place and between such dates as may be fixed by the proclamation.

2. Every application shall be in the Form A in the Schedule, and shall be deemed to have been received on the last day of the period during which applications may be made.

3. Every applicant shall make a statutory declaration in the Form B in the Schedule, with such alterations as the Minister may approve. Such declaration shall be made before a Justice of the Peace, the Under Secretary for Lands, or an agent duly appointed by the Minister for Lands.

4. The application and declaration must be enclosed in a sealed envelope, endorsed "Application for land in the Estate," and delivered or sent by post to the officer appointed to receive the same.

5. A deposit at the rate of £7 12s. 10d. for each One hundred pounds of the selling price of the allotment, as fixed by the Governor, shall be made with the application.

6. Applications will be opened and considered on the day next following the last day appointed for the receipt thereof, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

7. The Minister may reject the application of any person who, in the opinion of the Minister, is not qualified to be an applicant, or is disqualified, or is not a *bona fide* intending settler on the allotment applied for.

8. Should there be only one application for any allotment, the Minister may in his discretion approve or reject the application, and notice thereof shall be posted to the applicant.

9. Should any such application be refused, the allotment applied for shall be again proclaimed open to selection, or submitted to auction, as the Minister may direct.

10. If there are two or more applications for the same allotment, the Minister may direct the allotment to be submitted to auction for competition between the applicants only, or to public auction, at such time and place as he may determine.

11. At any such auction the reserve shall be the selling price of the allotment fixed by the Governor, and the highest bidder at a price equal to or exceeding the reserve shall, if qualified to be an applicant, be deemed the successful applicant.

12. The highest bidder at any such auction shall immediately pay to the person acting as auctioneer a deposit at the rate of £7 12s. 10d. for each One hundred pounds of the amount of his bid, but credit will be given to an applicant for the amount paid with his application (if any).

13. If the highest bidder at a public auction was not an applicant for the allotment, he shall forthwith sign the prescribed form of application, and make the prescribed declaration, and his application shall thereupon be approved.

14. The deposit paid by every applicant whose application is not approved will be returned to him.

15. On the approval of an application, a lease shall, as soon as practicable, be granted to the applicant in the Form C in the Schedule, or to the effect thereof, for the term of twenty years, commencing on the first day of the quarter next preceding the date of the approval of the application.

16. The price of the allotment as fixed by the Governor, or, in the case of a submission to auction, as ascertained by the highest bid, shall be payable as an annual rent extending over the term of the lease, and as prescribed by the Agricultural Lands Purchase Acts, and section 136 of "The Land Act, 1898."

17. The deposit paid with the application, or to the auctioneer, as the case may be, shall be applied in payment of the rent payable for the first year of the term granted by the lease.

18. At the expiration of the said term of Twenty years, and upon payment of all rent reserved by the lease, and upon the Minister for Lands being satisfied that all the conditions thereof on the lessee's part to be observed and performed have been duly complied with, and upon payment of the prescribed fees for a Crown Grant and the registration thereof, the lessee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, shall be entitled to a Crown Grant for rural land in fee simple, in the form prescribed in the Land Act in force for the time being, of the said land or so much thereof as may for the time being be comprised in the lease.

During the last month the atmospheric pressure was lower throughout the State than the average, especially in the South-West and South, while the temperatures were again below those for previous years. South of the Tropics the mean was about 2° below normal, and at Perth the mean day temperature 5° below, while the night temperature was about normal.

From the Interstate Table it will be noticed that the mean Perth temperature was higher than Melbourne and lower than Sydney.

During the nights frosts were experienced inland, as may be seen from the appended table giving the mean and lowest temperatures recorded on the surface of the ground.

The heaviest rainfall recorded for April was experienced in the Kimberley District, about an average in the North-West and Murchison, and rather above the average in the South-West and South, including the Coolgardie Goldfields, but throughout the State it was very "patchy." About one and a half miles North-East of Northam a very heavy downpour occurred on the 14th, while only 20 points were recorded at the Local Post Office, and in the North-West at Wogoola Station nearly five inches fell from the 12th to 14th, but only three points at Winning Pool, about 40 miles to the West.

The disturbance which gave heavy rain in the tropics between Derby and Nullagine from the 16th to 18th passed in a South-East direction across the continent, and heavy rains commenced to fall on the 19th at Alice Springs, and spread throughout South Australia and the Eastern States.

WESTERN  AUSTRALIA.

CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Regulations made by the Central Board of Health for the prevention of Overcrowding and Obstruction in Gangways, Passages, and Aisles in any Public Building, and for the prevention of Fires in such Public Buildings, and generally for securing the public safety and convenience in the same under Section 154 of "The Health Act, 1898."

1. The owner or occupier of any public building, or the manager or trustee of any public building, or the company or corporation using or occupying any public building, or the person or persons by whose authority or sanction any public building is used, shall comply with the following Conditions and Regulations:—

- (a.) A sufficient number of gangways of sufficient width (not less than two feet six inches) shall be reserved to the satisfaction of the Central Board, in convenient lines to facilitate the passage of persons to and from their seats.
- (b.) Such passages or gangways shall at all times be kept entirely free from chairs, flap seats, or other obstructions, whether permanent or temporary. Such passages or gangways shall at all times be kept entirely free from obstruction by persons standing or sitting therein.
- (c.) All doors shall be constructed to open outwards, and the words "Way out" or "Escape door" written upon and over the doors in conspicuous characters.
- (d.) All seats shall be securely fixed together, and under no circumstances shall chairs or movable seats be placed in the gangways or elsewhere.
- (e.) Strong handrails of approved construction shall be securely fixed on each side of every stairway.
- (f.) All carpets and other floor or stair coverings shall be kept in such condition as to prevent possibility of accident.
- (g.) All gas and other lights throughout the building and its precincts shall be efficiently protected by approved guards.
- (h.) The lighting shall be under the control of a properly qualified person, and gasfittings and other lighting apparatus periodically examined. Separate stop-cocks shall be provided for the various divisions of the buildings, and also stop-cocks in the mains on the outside of the buildings, to admit of the gas being entirely shut off when necessary.
- (i.) A sufficient number of lamps, burning animal or vegetable oil, shall be provided, if so directed by the Central Board, within the building and precincts, to prevent panic which might arise from darkness consequent on the sudden extinction of the gas or other lights by accident or otherwise.
- (j.) A sufficient number of buckets, as ordered by the Central Board, painted red, and labelled "Fire," shall be always kept full of water, and in such positions as shall be approved of, and maintained solely for such purpose.
- (k.) For fire purposes only, a sufficient number of fire hydrants with hose and nozzles shall be provided and kept in an efficient state ready for instant use. Skilled persons shall be employed and in attendance, sufficient in number for the proper using of such appliances, whose sole duty it shall be to attend to the same. Such skilled persons shall be subject to the approval of the Central Board, if other than firemen in uniform.

(l.) Every public building shall be, when so ordered by the Central Board, in direct connection with the Fire Brigade Station by telephone.

(m.) A copy of these Regulations shall be kept posted, and maintained in good order, in such conspicuous place or places as shall be directed by the Central Board, so that all persons connected with such public buildings may be acquainted with such Regulations.

2. The Regulations made by the Central Board of Health on 28th August, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette*, 7th September, 1900, are hereby rescinded.

3. The penalty for breach of any of these Regulations shall be the same as provided by Section 242, "The Health Act, 1898."
