



SIR With reference to Mr. Chamberlain's Circular despatches of the 11th of August, and the 16th October, 1897, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Ministers, a copy of a note which the Bulgarian Minister for Foreign Affairs has addressed to His Majesty's Representative at Sofia, notifying the denouncement as from the end of 1893 by Bulgaria of the Commercial Agreement with Great Britain of the $\frac{12th}{24th}$ of July, 1897, and expressing

the desire of the Government of Bulgaria to enter into a fresh agreement and to conclude also Consular "Assistance Judiciaire," and Extradition Conventions with His Majesty's Government.

SIR,--I have the honour to inform you that the Gouvernesh, — I have the holder to inform you that the Gouvente-ment of the Principality consider it necessary to denounce the Commercial Agreement arranged on the 12-24th of July, 1897, between the Principality of Bulgaria and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

While notifying you of this denouncement according to the terms of Article 6 of the Agreement, which remains in force until the 18-31st December, 1903, I am to add that the

Gouvernement Princier proposes to enter into negotiations, as soon as possible, with the Government of His Britannic Majesty, with a view to concluding a Commercial Treaty. For this reason the Bulgarian Government is ready to negotiate and conclude with the British Government con-sular "Assistance Judiciaire" and Extradition Conventions similar to those arranged between the Principality and Austro-Hungary.

I express the hope that, thanks to your kind offices, His Britannic Majesty's Government will be willing to favourably entertain the propositions of the Gouvernement of the Principality in rendering Bulgaria able to expand on economic, social, and political grounds by means of the execution of a new Commercial Convention, completed by putting in force consular "Assistance Judiciaire" and Extradition Conventions.

REGULATION RESTRICTING CUTTING OF TIMBER ON STATE FORESTS.

Department of Lands and Surveys, $\frac{11320}{1901}$

Perth, 20th May, 1903.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898":-

No person shall, without the special permission, in writing, of the Minister for Lands or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forests), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing on the areas of Crown Land hereafter to be known and distinguished as Yerbillon, Dedari, Ghooli, Cunderdin, Merriden, and Gilgai State Forests, the boundaries of which are respectively described hereunder :-

YERBILLON.

All Crown Lands within a radius of five miles from the Yerbillon Pumping Station, No. 5.
