Amendment of the Boundaries of the Collie MUNICIPALITY.

PROCLAMATION $\frac{2442}{1900}$

(64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor may by Proclamation sever any portion of a Municipality therefrom, and annex the same to some Roads Board with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area: AND WHEREAS a Petition has been presented to His Excellency the Gover-nor of the State of Western Australia praying for a sever-

ance of a portion of the Municipality of Collie therefrom, and for the annexation of the said portion to the Collie Roads Board, signed by a majority of the persons on the Municipal Roll of the town of Collie in respect of ratable land in such portion proposed to be severed: AND WHEREAS the said Petition was publicly advertised in the Govern-ment Gazette of the 19th day of June, 1903, as required by law: Now THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby sever from the Municipality of Collie the area contained within the following boundaries :-

A REGULATION of the Municipality of Albany made under Section 56, Part VIII., of the Tenth Schedule to "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," in force in the Municipality by virtue of a By-law of the above-named Municipality, numbered twenty-six, for regulating the manner and position of affixing to each vehicle the table of fares and rates for licensed passenger vehicles plying for hire within the Municipality of Albany.

In pursuance of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Albany make the Regulation following :-

That the licensee of every licensed passenger vehicle plying for hire within the Municipality of Albany shall be caused to be painted on, or an approved printed card affixed to, the box-seat inside of each vehicle and facing passengers as they enter such vehicle, a table of fares and rates by time and distance including lug-gage, for licensed passenger vehicles, and the number of such licensed vehicle.

REGULATIONS.

1. The name of the School shall be the School of Mines of Western Australia.

2. The following persons are appointed to act as a Board to advise the Hon. Minister for Mines in the selection and removal of members of the staff of the School; in making and removal of memoers of the stati of the School; in making regulations as to fees to be paid, the conduct of students, and the conditions to be observed by them; in matters of finance; in drawing up and amendment of courses of in-struction; in the appointment of examiners and fixing the fees to be paid to them; in the issue of certificates and diplomas; in the establishment and closing of Branches, and generally in all matters connected with the management and working of the School, namely:

The State Mining Engineer.

The Government Geologist.

The Director of the School of Mines.

Edward Sydney Simpson, Esq., B.E., F.C.S.

The President of the Western Australian Chamber of Mines.

The President of the Amalgamated Miners' Association.

3. The Board shall be called the Advisory Board of the School of Mines of Western Australia.

4. The Chairman of the Board shall be appointed by the Minister for Mines. The Chairman shall record the pro-ceedings of the Board and forward their recommendations to the Minister. In the absence of the Chairman from any meetings, the Board shall have power to elect a substitute.

5. Meetings of the Board shall be held from time to time as required, and shall be convened by the Chairman by notice, in writing, sent to each member. In the event of the Chairman being unable to act, the Board may be convened by the Minister for Mines. Three members shall form a quorum at any meeting.

PEAK HILL ROAD BOARD DISTRICT.

BY-LAWS PROVIDING FOR THE REGISTRATION OF CAMELS AND LICENSING OF CAMEL DRIVERS.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," it is enacted that every Local Authority may make, alter, and repeal by-laws for the purposes set forth therein : Now, therefore, in pur-suance of the powers therein contained, be it ordered and directed by the Peak Hill Road Board, as follows :—

1. No person shall own, keep, or use within the Peak Hill Road District (hereinafter referred to as "the district") any unregistered camel.

2. Registration shall be effected annually under these By-laws, unless the camel is registered for the time being under the by-laws of another Road District.

3. Application for registration shall be made in the form A in the Schedule, addressed to the Secretary to the Board.

4. The fee payable on registration (except in respect of camels used by prospectors for prospecting purposes) shall be :-

For every cow or gelded camel or bull camel under the age of three years-

If used for packing, One pound. If used for draught, Ten shillings.

For every bull camel over the age of three years, Five pounds.

A certificate of registration will be granted in the form B in the Schedule.

6. Every registration shall expire on the 31st day of December next following the date thereof.

7. Every person in charge of any camel shall produce the certificate of registration of such camel whenever required so to do by any officer or other person acting with the authority of the Board.

8. Every unregistered camel found within the district may be seized and sold or destroyed by any person acting under the authority of the Board.

9. No person shall drive camels within the district unless he is the holder of a camel driver's license issued by the Board of the said District or of another Road District.

10. A camel driver's license may be in the form C in the Schedule.

11. Every camel driver's license shall expire on the 31st day of December next following the issue thereof.

12. The fee payable for a camel driver's license shall be Ten shillings.

13. The number of draught or pack camels driven by any one driver shall not exceed eleven.

14. A camel driver's license shall be transferable at the office of the Board, on payment of a fee of One shilling.

15. Every camel driver shall produce his license for inspection whenever required so to do by any officer or other person acting under the authority of the Board.

16. Any person committing a breach of any of the fore-going By-laws shall for every offence be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.
