CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

FOR THE

SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF STORES

FOR THE

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT.

1. "Treasurer" means the Colonial Treasurer for Western Australia for the time being, and includes any Minister of the Crown, being a member of the Executive Council, who may be acting for or on behalf of the said Colonial Treasurer.

"Permanent Head" means—

Under Treasurer,
Under Secretary for Lands,
Under Secretary for Works,
Secretary, Law Department,
Under Secretary for Mines,
Under Secretary, Colonial Secretary's Department, or
Commissioner of Railways,

according to the Department which may be in question.

"Officer ordering stores" means the Permanent Head of a Department, or the person authorised by him in that behalf.

"Receiving Officer" means the person authorised by the officer ordering stores to inspect, examine, test, receive, accept, or reject stores offered on delivery by the Contractor.

"Tender Board" means the Tender Board appointed by the Governor in Council.

"Contractor" means Contractors when two or more persons tender or contract jointly for the supply of stores, and includes any incorporated joint stock or other company or association and their legal agents in Western Australia who may so tender or Contract.

"Stores" means any or all goods or chattels named in the several schedules attached to these conditions and to be supplied under this contract.

"Schedule" means the schedule list of stores and supplies attached hereto.

"Notice" means a written notice given or posted to the Contractor.

"Approved maker" means a maker approved by the Tender Board.

2. The prices set against the items in the Schedules of Prices shall include all wharfage dues and duties of Customs, all packages, wrappings, drums, tins, barrels, casks, kegs, jars, bags, cases, etc., covering the stores (unless otherwise provided), and all weighing, delivery materials, carriage, and freight implements, and every expense attending supply and delivery, and every contingent expense whatsoever.

3. The Contractor shall supply and deliver the stores in such quantities and at such times as may be ordered, in writing, by the officer ordering supply. The stores supplied shall be of the very best quality, strictly in accordance with Specifications and Schedules of Prices, and, where samples are provided, in accordance with such samples. A delivery note containing a reference to the number and date of the order concerned shall be handed to the Receiving Officer. Such delivery note shall contain a correct statement of the stores delivered. The Receiving Officer shall sign a receipt produced by the Contractor for the stores accepted. The delivery note, with corrections as to rejected supplies, shall be recorded by the Receiving Officer on behalf of the Department concerned.

4. The Contractor shall make correct claims for payment, and, if so desired by the Permanent Head of the Department concerned, shall produce the order for the supply and the receipt for delivery of the stores in question. Accounts shall be rendered according to the reasonable requirements of Departments, but shall in all cases contain the number or quantity and description of the stores, with contract and schedule numbers and rates and values.

5. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Receiving Officer, or such other officer as shall be named in the Conditions or Specifications. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be rejected. The Contractor shall, within 48 hours of notice, in writing, that such stores have been rejected, remove the same, and replace such rejected stores at his sole cost with other stores of approved quality.

6. Should the Contractor fail to replace such rejected stores within 48 hours, or within such time as the Permanent Head of the Department shall fix as fair and reasonable, the Permanent Head may purchase suitable stores at the Contractor's expense; and should it not be possible to procure stores or materials of the kind or quality ordered, he shall be entitled to purchase, at Contractor's risk and expense, such substitute therefor as may, in the opinion of the Permanent Head, be most suitable, even should such substitute be of a higher cost. Should the Contractor fail to remove rejected supplies within seven days after due notice in writing has been given, such supplies shall become the property of the Government, and the Contractor shall not be entitled to any payment or compensation on account of any articles which may thus be rejected or forfeited. All action taken by the Permanent Head shall be reported to the Tender Board without delay.

7. Whenever under these conditions any notice is to be given to the Contractor, in writing, signed by or on behalf of the authority giving the same, such said notice may be delivered, either personally to the Contractor or at his usual or last known place of abode or business in or near the place where such notice is given, or by posting the same by registered letter to his usual or last known place of abode or business in Western Australia.

8. If any difference or controversy arise between the Receiving Officer and the Contractor, the matter shall be referred to the Permanent Head of the Department concerned, whose decision shall be binding upon the Receiving Officer. The

Contractor, if aggrieved by any decision, ruling, action, or omission of a Permanent Head of any Department, may appeal to the Tender Board within seven (7) days of the receipt of such decision or the date of such ruling, action, or omission. The decision of the Tender Board shall be final and binding, unless the Treasurer be satisfied that the importance of the difference or controversy warrants the granting of a Board of Arbitration. While any difference or controversy remains unsettled, the Government shall not in any case pay any sum involved in such difference or controversy until a ruling or award has been given by the person or persons authorised to furnish such ruling or award.

9. A Board of Arbitration shall consist of—

- (1.) A member appointed by the Treasurer,
- (2.) A member appointed by the Contractor,

who shall immediately nominate, in writing, a Referee. The decision of the two members, or, in case of a difference, of the Referee, shall be final and binding. The cost of the arbitration and award shall be allocated in the discretion of the Board of Arbitration. Should the Board of Arbitration, by reason of any act or default of the Contractor or his representative, fail to come into existence within a period considered reasonable by the Treasurer, the previous ruling, recommendation, or conclusion of the Tender Board made the subject of arbitration by the Treasurer shall immediately come into effect, and be binding upon all parties.

10. When the Schedule contains more than one size or number of any article, the standard or accepted article shall apply to the quality of all, unless otherwise specified.

11. Stores for country stations, for which no local contract may have been accepted, may be ordered under a Perth or Fremantle contract.

12. In the event of any alteration in the Customs Tariff on any items included in this Contract subsequent to the date of tendering, and during the currency of this Contract, the Schedule shall be subject to an increase or decrease corresponding in rate and amount with the amount of such increase or decrease of duty, where the duty is specific; but in the case of *ad valorem* duty, 90 per cent. only of the schedule rate for each item shall be subject to such increase or decrease, except as provided in Clause 13. The increase or decrease shall take effect on the expiration of two months from the date of such alteration becoming law.

13. Goods manufactured in this State shall not be subject to increase or decrease in price consequent on alteration of duty, as provided for in Clause 12; but any increase or decrease of duty on material actually forming portion of such goods, when manufactured, shall be added to or deducted from the Contract price; the amount of such increase or decrease, however, to be assessed by the Tender Board.

14. It is expressly agreed that the automatic reduction of the Special Tariff, provided by Section 95 of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, shall not affect the Schedule rates of this Contract, which shall continue in force as if such Special Tariff continued the same as at the time of tendering; and it is hereby declared and agreed that no legislative provision for the cancellation or modification of contracts affected by the operation of the automatic reduction of the said Special Tariff shall have any application to this Contract.

15. In the event of any deficiency in the quantity or inferiority in the quality of the stores, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or should the Contractor fail, in the opinion of the Tender Board, in any way to carry out this

Contract, the Tender Board may recommend the forfeiture of the security or any part thereof, and that the Contractor be subjected to the payment of any sum not exceeding £100, as liquidated and ascertained damages, and the Tender Board may forthwith determine the Contract.

16. The Permanent Head shall have power to deduct any or all penalties becoming due under this Contract from the moneys due or becoming due to the Contractor, and retain the same as liquidated and ascertained damages for breach of contract; or the Tender Board may sue at law for the recovery of the sum of such penalties, and for damages for breach of contract.

17. The enforcement of a penalty shall not prejudice the right of the Tender Board to terminate a contract.

18. If the Contractor shall be adjudged bankrupt, or, being a company, any winding-up proceedings shall be taken against it under any law of the State of Western Australia or elsewhere, or if the Contractor have his estate liquidated by arrangement, or shall make any composition with his creditors in the State of Western Australia or elsewhere, or in the event of his death, it shall be lawful for the Tender Board, without previous notice, to terminate the Contract, and retain the security held for the due performance of the Contract, to be appropriated to the payment or satisfaction of any outstanding liability on the part of the said Contractor to the Government.

19. It is expressly stipulated that the quantity set out in this tender shall be regarded as approximate only, and in no way binding upon the Government, and that the Government shall have the right to take such greater or less quantities in each or all cases as its consumption may be found to require from time to time during the period contracted for.

20. The security deposited by the Contractor will be held by the Treasurer until the Chairman of the Tender Board certifies that this Contract has been carried out satisfactorily.

21. All Departments of the State of Western Australia may purchase stores included in Schedules marked or distinguished by the words "For all Departments."

22. It shall be optional with all Departments of the Imperial and Commonwealth Governments to purchase, under this Contract, all goods specified in the Schedules marked or distinguished by the words "For all Departments," subject only to such conditions of this Contract which, in the opinion of the Tender Board, reasonably apply.

23. While it is understood that the Contract shall be binding upon all Government Departments, it is expressly stipulated and agreed that,—

- (1.) The manufacture or importation of any stores by the Government or any Department;
- (2.) The purchase of stores under contracts already in existence, or other contracts; or
- (3.) Any purchases of stores which, in the opinion of the Tender Board, are necessary in the public interest;

shall not be an infringement of, break, or in any way vitiate the Contract.

24. Should any such purchase, manufacture, or importation be made by the Government or any Department, the matter shall, upon complaint by the Contractor, be considered by the Tender Board, and its recommendation made to the Treasurer, but no such purchase shall be held to infringe, break, or vitiate this Contract.

25. In the consideration of questions relating to the construction of this Contract or otherwise arising thereunder, the Tender Board shall exercise its judgment irrespective of any custom, precedent, or practice which may have previously obtained in any Department, or which may obtain or be the rule or practice in any trade or calling.

26. No Contract or any portion thereof shall be transferred, assigned, or sub-let without the written consent of the Tender Board.

27. After a Contract has been let, none of the clauses or provisions of these Conditions or Specifications shall be varied, waived, discharged, or released, either in law or in equity, unless by the express consent, in writing, of the Treasurer, on the recommendation of the Tender Board.

28. These Conditions shall for all purposes be deemed to include the tender and any price list or lists referred to, and also any other document attached to and intended to form part of the Contract.
