W HEREAS by the provisions of Section 3 of "The Steam Boilers Act, 1897," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to set out Districts, and from time to time to alter or add to such districts: Now THERE-FORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the existing boundaries of the South-Western District, and hereby proclaim the boundaries of the said District to be as follows :--

Starting from a cairn and pole at the mouth of the Murchison River; thence Easterly along the left bank of said river to a spot opposite Bompas Hill; thence South-South-Easterly about 60 miles through said Bompas Hill

to Tallering Peak, being the Western corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence South-Easterly 55<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles to Mugga Mugga Hill, and again South-Easterly 84<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> miles to Mt. Gibson, along the South-Western boundary of said Yalgoo goldfield; thence East 84<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles along the South boundary of said Yalgoo Goldfield to the North-Western corner of of said Yalgoo Goldneid to the North-Western corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield; thence South 203<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles along the Western boundary and to the South-Western corner of said Yilgarn Goldfield; thence East 82<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> miles along the Southern boundary and to the South-Eastern corner of said Yilgarn Goldfield, being a point on the Western boundary of the Dundas Goldfield; thence South 18 miles along part of the Dundas Goldfield; thence South 18 miles along part of the Western boundary to the South-Western corner of the said Dundas Goldfield; thence East 68 miles along the boundary between Dundas Goldfield and Phillips River Goldfield to the North-Eastern corner of said Phillips River Goldfield; thence South 33 miles to the South-Eastern corner of said Phillips River Goldfield; thence East about 166 miles to the Southern coast; thence by the said Southern coast line in a general Western direction to Cape Leeuwin, and by the Indian Ocean in a general Northerly direction to the starting point on the Murchison River, including all islands adjacent thereto. W HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor may from time to the store of the store W Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, exempt Council to be published in the Government Gazette, exempt from the operation of any particular provisions of this Act such stock as he may think fit, either by generic or particular description, or in reference to the State or country whence the same may be imported or introduced into Western Australia: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby exempt "Horses" and "Dogs" from the operations of the Regula-tions in force under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," dated the 20th day of January, 1897, prohibiting the importation of cattle, sheep, dogs, and horses from Queensland, and hides under certain conditions, and hereby permits "Horses" and "Dogs" shipped at the Port of Brisbane to be admitted into the State of Western Australia, at the Port of Fre-mantle, subject to the provisions of the Regulations governing the importation of stock dated the 24th day of September, 1902.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Health Act, 1898," and by Section 10 of "The Health Act Amendment Act, 1900," the area of any district defined for the purpose of a Local Board of Health may from time to time be extended, contracted, or abolished by the Governor in Council, and whereas it is desired to abolish the District of the Meekatharra Local Board of Health : Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, on the recommendation of the Central Board of Health, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby abolish the District of the Meekatharra Local Board of Health.

### STOCK REGULATIONS.

THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the following purposes :-

- (1.) For regulating the conditions upon which any stock may be introduced or imported into the Colony.
- (2.) For the inspection of imported stock; for the seizure and destruction of infected stock.
- (4.) For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease,

- (5). For providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the Colony, and for preventing the spread of such disease.
- (6.) For prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infested stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock, shall be cleaned and disinfected.
- (7.) For the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock while in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom.
- (8). For prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined.
- (9.) For regulating the charges to be made for con-veying stock to or from quarantine, and their care, maintenance, and inspection while in quarantine.
- (10.) Generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the intro-duction or spread of disease.

Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

### "THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895."

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No cattle shall leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.

2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley Quarantine Area for any other part of the State of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, and shall be landed within the Quarantine enclosure, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantine until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock; provided that vessels discharging such cattle may make fast within four feet, on the South side, of Robb's Jetty.

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly dis-infected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.

4. All stock carried from any other port of Western Australia than the Port of Wyndham, in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the then next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area.

All imported stock carried in vessels which at any 5. time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be liable to be treated under the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.'

Cattle may only be removed from Quarantine Area Owen's Anchorage, Reserve 6320, on written application being made for permission in the form of Schedule A, and a permit being duly issued in the form of Schedule B, and then only to the Central Goldfields Quarantine Area on the Eastern Goldfields, or to a slaughter yard situated within some other proclaimed Quarantine Area on the Eastern Goldfields registered and numbered as a place wherein the slaughtering of tick-infested cattle is permitted.

7. Cattle travelling on a permit in the form of Schedule B shall go direct by rail to a place within the Central Gold-fields Quarantine Area, or in the case of cattle travelling to some other quarantine area, to the point nearest their destination, and, if necessary, thence by road, following the most direct route to the place of slaughter, there to be confined till slaughtered; provided always that such cattle may, in any case of urgency, be released from a slaughter yard on the authority of the Minister or an officer duly appointed to issue Release Permits for tick-infested cattle, such cattle to be released and depastured on such area as may be specified in the Release Permit, which, in every instance, shall be a Quaran-tine Area set apart and proclaimed as a Quarantine Area for depasturing tick-infested cattle. Application for a Release Permit shall be made in the form of Schedule C, and a Release Permit shall be in the form of Schedule D,

8. Tick-infested cattle conveyed to the Eastern Goldfields for slaughter shall be slaughtered within thirty days from the date of their removal from Reserve 6320; provided that an extension of the term may be granted in special cases, on application.

(a.) If, in a consignment of tick-infested cattle arriv 9. (a.) If, in a consignment of tick-infested cattle arriv-ing at Reserve 6320, there should be a number of store cattle deemed unfit for slaughter because of poverty, such cattle may be dipped at the request and expense of the owner in the dip already constructed at Owen's Anchorage, and may, if the owner then desires, be trucked at his ex-pense by rail direct to the Hine's Hill Grazing Depôt set apart on the Eastern Railway, where such dipped cattle shall be held at the expense of the owner, and at his risk under the absolute control of the Minister or his officer for a period of at least twenty-one days, or such longer for a period of at least twenty-one days, or such longer fime as the Minister or his officer duly authorised may determine. The request to dip and remove the cattle from Reserve 6320 to the Hine's Hill Grazing Depôt shall be made in the form of Schedule I, and the permit shall be in the form of Schedule J.

(b.) If, at the expiry of the time mentioned, a Permit to remove cattle from Hine's Hill Grazing Depôt to the Eastern Goldfields for depasture is applied for in the form of Schedule E, the Minister or an authorised officer may, in the event of such cattle being declared clean after a crush inspection by a qualified veterinary surgeon of the Agri-cultural Department, issue a permit in the form of Sche-dule F, consenting to such cattle being forwarded direct by rail to the Goldfields Grazing Area, as proclaimed, there to depasture at the will of the owner, but at all times subject to the requirements of the Minister or his officer duly authorised, to watch the movements of tick-infested cattle or cattle depasturing on the Eastern Goldfields, provided always that such cattle shall not be permitted to depasture within fifteen miles of any quarantine area, or within five miles of any registered slaughter yard.

10. Trucks used for the conveyance of tick-infested cattle to Coolgardie, or any other town on the Eastern Gold-fields Railway, shall be disinfected as required by the Director of Agriculture, and shall not be returned West of the rabbit-proof fence until such trucks have been certified clean by an officer of the Stock Department.

Cattle leaving the Eastern Goldfields will not be permitted to travel beyond the limits of the Goldfields Grazing Area until a permit has been obtained certifying that such stock are clean: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to tick-infested or dipped cattle, which shall not be permitted to leave the area. Application shall be made in the form of Schedule G, and the permit shall be in the form of Schedule H: Provided also that horses shall not leave the Central Goldfields Quarantine or any other proclaimed Quarantine Area without being dressed with some specific known to be fatal to ticks, or unless certified as clean by a qualified veterinary surgeon.

The owners of stock permitted to depasture on the 12 a monthly return to the Director of Agriculture, showing the condition of the stock, mortality, how disposed of, and locality where such stock are grazing on the date the return is made.

13. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve

 $^{/\Lambda}_{6320}$  Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily proclaimed quarantine areas, and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

14. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered

within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows :

- (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.

- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
- (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained, and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the salting-floor until an Inspector of Stock has certified, in writing, that the above requirements have been complied with.

15. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500.

16. The Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 1st of November, 1901, and 7th August, 1903, are hereby revoked.

Interpretation.

- In these Regulations-"Cattle" shall mea shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the hide of any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf.
  - "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District Eastward of the Eastern shore of Brunswick Bay and St. George's Basin, of the right bank of the Prince Regent River, and of a line therefrom via Mt. Agnes and the Eastern side of the Caroline Ranges, in dimension of the Growing Hills to the 197th in direction of the Gemini Hills, to the 127th meridian of East longitude and East of such meridian.
  - "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
  - "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent of any such owner.
  - "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
  - "The Central Goldfields Quarantine Area" shall mean all lands within the following boundaries:-Bounded on the North by an Easterly line 1 as ing through the 22nd Mile Post on the Coolgardie-Balgarrie Road, Survey Mark E3 on the Western boundary of the Broad Arrow Goldfield, and the 30th Mile Post on the Broad Arrow Road (No. 865) to the North-West corner of Reserve 7466. On the Eastward by a South line therefrom to the 30th Mile Post on the Bulong Road, and along it Easterly to the 34th Mile Post; thence South to a point East of the North boundary of Reserve 3675. On the Southward by a West line passing along said boundary of 3675 to a point South of Mount Hunt; thence South to a point East of the North-East corner of East Location 59; thence West to said corner, and South to a point East of the South boundary of Reserve 5346, and along said boundary West. On the West by a North line passing through the 15th Mile Post on the Coolgardie-Jaurdie Hill Road.
- "The Goldfields Grazing Area" shall mean all the lands within the following boundaries :--- Bounded on the North by the 28th parallel of South Latitude, on the East by the Eastern boundary of the State, on the South by the 32 parallel of the South Latitude, and on the Westward by the surveyed line of the Rabbit-proof Fence.

Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, the Secretary shall issue to the person so applying an order for funeral in the form of Schedule C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the fixed for burial. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with a Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office to allow time of at least six working hours' notice as above.

4. All graves shall be dug by and at the expense of the relatives of the deceased person.

5. Before any interment shall be allowed the "order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Secretary.

6. Every coffin shall have the name of the deceased indelibly inscribed in legible characters on the did. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the natural surface of the surrounding ground.

In the case of an application for interment in any 8 private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter therein unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths, or a Coroner's order for burial, is handed to the Secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral arriving at the Cemetery; such Registrar's certificate of death will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. The hours for burial shall be from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. daily, and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour without the written permission of the Trustees.

The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at 11. which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

12. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

13. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespassing in or upon the Cemetery or any part thereof, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection growing or made in or upon the Cemetery or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not precedure Five pounds ( $f_{22}$ ) exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. Subject to the By-laws, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters per-taining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

15. Any person requiring a grant of exclusive right of burial and a grant of the right of placing any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery, shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave

or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any deceased person or persons, if any, whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

16. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may give permission for the work to proceed, and if no work is to be done may issue a grant in the Form E in the Schedule.

17. Upon the completion of the work mentioned in the preceding By-law to the satisfaction of the Trustees, they may issue a grant in the Form E in the Schedule.

18. Every such grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the order for burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be reopened unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

19. Every coffin placed in any such brick grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone.

20. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the Act.

21. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected and all refuse or other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall immediately be removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

22. No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed im-mediately the work is completed.

Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatsh 23 and only during regulation times.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held on Saturday, the 4th day of July, 1903, and adopted.

#### BATTERIES AFTER 1ST JULY, 1903.

H. GREGORY,

#### Minister for Mines.

1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.

2. The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.

3. The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.

4. A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton,

5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due.

6. Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be treated as abandoned tailings.

7. Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in his discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.

8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.

9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay, he shall within six weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged, provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains, and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be considered as final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most widely from the referee assay.

10. A clean-up will be made about every two months, when the Department will make a *pro rata* distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefrom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained. 11. All tailings assaying less than 3dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.

12. A charge of ten shillings per ton for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds per ounce.

13. All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.

14. The Department reserves the right to suspend operations from any cause whatsoever, and will accept no responsibility for delays in treatment.

15. At every battery there will be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel lodged for treatment, the name, locality and number of the lease or holding from which it was obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.

A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules, and agrees to be bound by them.

### FREE ASSAYS AT THE SCHOOL OF MINES,. Coolgardie.

W ITH the object of encouraging bonî fide prospectors free assays for gold, silver, copper, etc., and determinations of mineral samples and rocks will be made at the School of Mines, Coolgardie, under the following circumstances:---

- (a.) The sender must satisfy the Director that he is a bond fide prospector, or acting on behalf of such. and that the sample forwarded is one genuinely complying with the following conditions under which free assays will be made.
- (b.) The sample must have been obtained from land within the State not held under lease for mining purposes.
- (c.) The exact locality where the sample was found must be disclosed.
- (d.) The sample must be of sufficient promise to warrant an assay being made at the expense of the State.
- (e.) Free assays will not be made of samples showing free gold, or of tailings or other metallurgical products, or of umpire samples.
- (f.) Samples to be assayed for gold should weigh about 1 or 2lbs. Other samples should be as large as circumstances will permit, up to 2lbs.
- (g.) Each sample must be properly marked, and securely fastened in a separate bag, along with the name and address of the sender.
- (h.) The parcel must be forwarded, prepaid, to

and be accompanied by a letter containing instructions and stating the locality where the samples were obtained.

Duplicate samples should be kept by the sender.

The reduced charges will operate only from the date on which the indemnity is received by the Department.

Three days instead of twelve (12) working hours will be allowed free of storage for the removal of goods from stations on the Great Southern Line, York to Torbay Junction inclusive; South-Western Line, Bunbury excepted; Northern Lines, Geraldton and to Torbay Junction inclusive; South-Western Line, Bunbury excepted; Northern Lines, Geraldton and stations Eastward of Mullewa excepted; Newcastle Branch, Goomalling Branch, and Stations of the Eastern Goldfields Line, Seabrook to Parker's Road inclusive. When, however, the consignee resides more than five (5) miles from any of the stations men-tioned in this paragraph to which his goods are con-signed, one (1) week will be allowed free of storage.

Trucks containing goods to be handled by the con-signees, which are not unloaded within 12 working hours after arrival at destination, will be subject to demurrage or unloading charges, as shown in Clause 22 below.

#### THE NELSON ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS, by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any pur-poses in the said Act mentioned, the Nelson Road Board, being the Road Board for the District of Nelson, in pur-suance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws :-

#### Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say-

- "District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Nelson Road Board.
- "Board."-The Nelson Road Board.
- "Chairman."-The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."—A member of the Board.
- "The Act."—The Roads Act of 1902, and all amend-ments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.
- "Road" or "Reserve."—A road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Footpath" or "Footway shall include any part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made, or kerbed, or otherwise.
- "Person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.

Duties of Secretary

- The duties of the Secretary shall be :---
- (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend all committee meetings.
- (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
- (d.) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business,
- (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheets prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette and at least one newspaper circulating in the district, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
- (g.) Supervise the preparation of the rate books and the Board's electoral list; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution.
- (h.) Summon the members to board and committee meetings
- (i) Keep all books entered up to date in accordance with instructions issued by Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
- (j.) Check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector, or other of the Board's officers, and to see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.
- (k.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (l.) To pay into the bank within twenty-four hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board, with the exception of moneys granted by Gov-ernment which are paid into Treasury book.

- (m.) Have the Bank Pass-book made up in readiness for the meeting of the Board, and to produce it at each meeting thereof, and to any member of the Board desiring to see it at any time during office hours. No money shall be paid into bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board, except by or through the Secretary, who shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (n.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.

# Supervisor's Duties.

The duties of the Supervisor shall be-

- (a) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary.
- (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings, or premises under the control of the Board situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called.
- (c.) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways are properly carried out.
- (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience, insubordination, and found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
- (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
- (g.) To attend all Board and Committee meetings, if required.
- (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year.
- (i.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or oftener if required, to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

#### Appointment of Officers.

4. No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

#### Meetings and Proceedings.

5. Notice shall be given, in writing, by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary meetings at least three days before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days. The Chairman if present shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and, in his absence, or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

6. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

7. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Bridgetown, on the last Thursday in the month, at 2 o'clock p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.

8. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

9. Any three members may require the Board-room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

10. At all meetings of the Board where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

11. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view to their confirmation.

#### Voting.

12. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

#### Minutes of Meetings.

13. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

### Order of Business.

14. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and Committee reports and consideration thereof.
- (e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

# (f.) General business.

(g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

#### Petitions.

15. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

#### Tenders.

16. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

#### Orders of Debate.

SPFAKERS MUST NOT DIGRESS. 17. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

# Motions and Amendments.

18. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by consent of the Board.

19. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order on which they were moved.

20. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

21. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

22. When an amendment is carried the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

23. No member shall speak twice on the same subject except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last carried motion;

3.

- (m.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (n.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding through any street.
- (o.) Making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or road without the con-sent of the Board.

#### General regulation of traffic.

34. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side, or near side, of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

35. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any street of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such street, for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle, provided that where suit-able bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

36. Any person leading an entire or stallion shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of the stallion

To prevent trees falling across any road or track.

37. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precaution against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### "o prevent accidents from riding, etc., or bicycles, etc.

39. Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

- (a.) No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.
- (b.) No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.
- (c.) Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback, or vehicle, is being approached or passed.
- (d.) No person shall leave any cycle in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
- (e.) No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
- (f.) When a cyclist shall meet any horse or animal, and such horse or animal shall become restless, or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dis-mount, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or animal has been passed.
- (g.) No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the dis-trict, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

#### To prevent obstructions on the footpaths.

No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road, or on any part of a footpath, within the district, after sunset; nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

To prevent damage to footpaths and any other Board property. 41. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage,

destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board, or under the control thereof.

42. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

- 45. Any person who:
  - (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road: or
  - (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
  - (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed approach, or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d.) Draws upon a road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a upon a wheeled venicle to drag or trail upon a road; or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence

for every such offence.

#### Removal of Gravel.

44. No person shall dig for or remove any gravel from any Reserve under the control of the Board, without first obtaining permission from the Board, and paying any fee or license that may be decided upon.

#### Cattle to keep off the Roads.

45. The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road, within the townsite of Bridgetown between sunset and sunrise shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

46. The owner of any bull or stallion straying on any road within the townsite of Bridgetown shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### Heavy Traffic.

47. A yearly license fee of Two pounds per pair of wheels shall be paid for every jinker or whim used within the district.

48. No single or two-wheeled jinker or whim shall be allowed on any declared road, within the district.

49. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

#### Penalties.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, 50.is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done, or remains undone, or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

51. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or com-mits, or permits any breach, or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Road Board of the Nelson District subject to any By-law, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the said Nelson District from the date of publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

### Appointment of Committee.

24. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a committee shall comprise three members.

#### Finance Committee and Finance Accounts.

A Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such Committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted 26.to the Finance Committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque

27. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys re-ceived from whatever source shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary.

Places for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins; and any person who shall carry on without such consent as aforesaid any other noxious or offensive trades, business, or occupation, or who, without such consent, shall add to or assist or extend any building or premises used for the purpose of such trade, business, or occu-pation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not
- exceeding Twenty pounds. (c.) Prior to the granting of any consent mentioned in the last preceding clause, notice of intention to apply for the same shall be given by adver
  - tisement one month previously in two news-papers circulating in the district, and any person, whether a resident in the district of such Board or not, his objections being granted, may state to the Board his objections thereto.

- (f.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pigstye within one hundred feet of any house or running water without consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains from any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a musance to any person or injurious to the public health.
- (g.) I. Any person who shall deposit or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place, the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse, or offensive matter;
  - 2. Cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him, in or upon any road, footpath, or road, or injure or pollute any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any officer or member of the Board may from time to time visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter house, or yard, or other place, for the purpose of ascertain-ing if the same is kept cleansed, and the same must be kept thoroughly clean to the satisfaction of such officer or member of the Board.

32. No person shall poison, kill, or main any horse, camely cow, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against the By-laws, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.

- 33. (a.) The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done, or allowed to be done, and any person or persons guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
  - (b.) Riding or driving cattle or horses, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath.
  - (c.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
  - (d.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any footway, road, or open or public place.
  - (e.) Leaving any inflammable material or other matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
  - the permission of the Board.
    (f.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board, carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks running, thereby letting the water escape from such tanks and waste, bathing in any dam or well, or in any way polluting the water contained in such tanks, well, or dam as to render it unfit for human consumption.
  - (g.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing, on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp post, or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
  - h.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or road, without the per-mission of the Board having been first obtained.
  - (i.) Neglecting to clean any private yard, way, passage, or avenue, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
  - (j.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.
  - (k.) Throwing or discharging any stone, or other missle in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
  - (l.) Having any awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.
