WHEREAS by "The Fishery Act, 1889" (53 Vict., No. 4), and "The Fisheries Act, 1899" (63 Vict., No. 47), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any Western Australian waters to be close waters for all or any kind of fishing, and

for any time specified in such Proclamation: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Thompson's Bay, Rottneest Island, should be declared close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare Thompson's Bay, Rottneest Island, more particularly described in Schedule hereto attached, to be close waters for fishing by means of any net or fixed engine from and after the thirtieth day of September, 1903.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish that shall have been taken.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE FISHERY ACT, 1889."

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

1. To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine;
2. To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease;

and to impose such reasonable penalties not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does by these Regulations declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in any part of Warnbro' Sound (otherwise known as Safety Bay), more particularly described in Schedule attached hereto, during the season commencing on the fifteenth day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December, both days inclusive, in each and every year till further notice.

And also that it shall be unlawful for any person to fish with a line within the said Sound or Bay except between the times of five o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock a.m. (which will be notified by the flying of a flag from the Government launch at five o'clock and the lowering thereof at eight o'clock a.m.) for a period of six days per week, commencing as from and inclusive of Monday in each and every week during the season commencing on the fifteenth day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December, both days inclusive, in each and every year till further notice.

Every person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty on conviction of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the instruments used and all fish that shall have been taken.

"but whensoever in the opinion of the Inspector it is not reasonably practicable to apply such side catches to skips, cages, or man-trucks used in raising or lowering men in inclined or underlay shafts, such skips, cages, or man-trucks so used shall be of construction approved in writing by the Inspector, and all ropes, chains, bridles, skids, rails, guides, and other appliances whatsoever used in connection therewith shall be subjected to such periodical examination and testing as he may prescribe ; and no such skips, cages, man-trucks, ropes, chains, bridles, skids, rails, guides, or other appliances shall be used for the purpose of raising or lowering men unless and until the Inspector shall have first, in writing, approved the use of the same, and shall have prescribed the methods of periodical examination and testing to be carried out by the Manager of the mine or some person specially appointed to that duty by him. A written record, signed by the person making the tests and examination, shall be made in the book required to be kept

at the mine in accordance with General Rule 27 of Section 23 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1895," forthwith upon the completion of the same, and the said record shall state the true date upon which the said tests and examinations were made."

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH STONE WILL BE CRUSHED AND TAILINGS TREATED AT THE STATE BATTERIES AFTER 1ST JULY, 1903.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 29 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902," has been pleased to make the following Regulations under which Stone will be crushed and Tailings treated at the State Batteries after 1st July, 1903.

H. GREGORY,
Minister for Mines.

1. All stone accepted for treatment at the State batteries shall be estimated at 21 cubic feet per ton, except where weighing machines are provided, when stone must pass over same to ascertain weight.

2. The manager of the battery may refuse any stone considered too poor to pay crushing charges, unless a deposit is paid in advance.

3. The charge for crushing, as determined from time to time by the Hon. the Minister for Mines, shall be posted up at each battery and strictly adhered to while in force.

4. A minimum charge will be made for all parcels of less tonnage than will return £5 on the rate charged per ton.

5. Payment for crushing shall be made to the manager on completion of treatment, or sufficient gold will be retained to pay for the amount due.

6. Where no cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, any person desirous of claiming tailings, the proceeds of his crushing, shall remove them from the battery site immediately the crushing is completed, otherwise they will be treated as abandoned tailings.

7. Where a cyanide plant has been erected at a battery, tailings resulting from stone crushed at that battery will be treated, but the manager may, in his discretion, refuse to treat any tailings should he consider them unsuitable for treatment by cyanide.

8. The number of tons of tailings suitable for cyanide treatment by the ordinary leaching vat plant installed at the battery shall be determined by the manager, whose decision shall be final; provided that in no case shall such tonnage exceed eighty per cent. of the number of tons milled. Where a slimes plant is working in conjunction with the ordinary vat system, the combined tonnage of sand and slimes shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the tons milled.

9. The manager shall take samples of the tailings as they pass through the battery, or from the pit into which the tailings may be deposited. The tailings collected shall be thoroughly mixed and divided into three samples, one for assay by the manager, one for the owner, and one sealed and kept by the manager for reference. The assay of the manager's sample will be available on application within fourteen days from the completion of any crushing, and should the owner dispute such assay, he shall within six weeks of the completion of the crushing notify the manager to that effect, in writing, and shall at the same time forward a certificate from a competent assayer. On receipt of such certificate the results of the two assays will be averaged, provided that the difference between them does not exceed six grains; but should the difference in the assay exceed six grains, and should the owner still refuse to accept the manager's assay, the manager shall forward the sealed sample previously referred to, to the Government assayer, Perth, and the result of the assay as furnished by him shall be considered as final. The cost of such assay (fifteen shillings) shall be borne by the party whose assay differs most widely from the referee assay.

10. A clean-up will be made about every two months, when the Department will make a *pro rata* distribution, based upon the original assay value of the tailings, the estimated extraction therefrom, and the actual extraction. After the deduction of ten shillings per ton for cost of treatment, the owners of tailings treated will receive the amount due to them within 14 days after the value of the bullion has been ascertained.

11. All tailings assaying less than 3dwts. 3grs. per ton shall become the property of the Government.

12. A charge of ten shillings per ton for treatment shall be the first charge on all tailings treated, and the gold contents of tailings will be paid for at the rate of Four pounds per ounce.

13. All tailings collected for treatment by the owner will be treated at the rate of 27 cubic feet per ton.

14. The Department reserves the right to suspend operations from any cause whatsoever, and will accept no responsibility for delays in treatment.

15. At every battery there will be kept a book in which shall be recorded the number of tons in each parcel lodged for treatment, the name, locality and number of the lease or holding from which it was obtained, and the name of the person for whom the stone is to be crushed.

A copy of the foregoing rules shall be inserted in the said book, and every person sending stone for treatment shall sign opposite the entry relating to the stone lodged by him, and such signature shall be sufficient evidence that he is cognisant of the foregoing rules, and agrees to be bound by them.

FREE ASSAYS AT THE SCHOOL OF MINES,
COOLGARDIE.

WITH the object of encouraging *bonâ fide* prospectors, free assays for gold, silver, copper, etc., and determinations of mineral samples and rocks will be made at the School of Mines, Coolgardie, under the following circumstances:—

- The sender must satisfy the Director that he is a *bonâ fide* prospector, or acting on behalf of such, and that the sample forwarded is one genuinely complying with the following conditions under which free assays will be made.
- The sample must have been obtained from land within the State not held under lease for mining purposes.
- The exact locality where the sample was found must be disclosed.
- The sample must be of sufficient promise to warrant an assay being made at the expense of the State.
- Free assays will not be made of samples showing free gold, or of tailings or other metallurgical products, or of umpire samples.
- Samples to be assayed for gold should weigh about 1 or 2lbs. Other samples should be as large as circumstances will permit, up to 2lbs.
- Each sample must be properly marked, and securely fastened in a separate bag, along with the name and address of the sender.
- The parcel must be forwarded, prepaid, to

and be accompanied by a letter containing instructions and stating the locality where the samples were obtained.

Duplicate samples should be kept by the sender.

This month was again exceptionally wintry throughout the South-West division of the State, the rainfall being the heaviest on record for September. The atmospheric pressure was considerably below normal over the whole State, and the mean temperature from 1 to 4 degrees below the average, except in the Kimberley district. No rain fell in the tropics, about the average in the Gascoyne district and inland over the Goldfields, but fully twice as much as usual in coastal districts from Geraldton to Bunbury, and slightly over the average along the South coast. The most severe storm was experienced in the middle of the month. On Saturday, the 12th, it was beautifully fine, with a very light Easterly wind, and appearances indicated at least one or two days' pleasant conditions. Early on Sunday morning, however, the wind was from North-North-West, with threatening weather, and steady rain fell during the afternoon. After this, it cleared for a few hours, and there was a fine afternoon, with a warm feel in the atmosphere, the wind still keeping about North-West, and heavy showers fell in the evening. The peculiarity consisted in the fact that all this time the barometer showed no signs of the rapid fall that almost invariably accompanies this description of weather. It did fall slightly from Saturday noon till Sunday afternoon, but then commenced to rise slowly and steadily, with the wind still in the North-West quadrant, clouds also moving from the North-West, and the weather was warm and showery. This continued until Monday evening, when the wind veered gradually, reaching South-West at midnight, and South at 3 a.m., blowing a moderate gale. The barometer by this time was rising rapidly, and the atmosphere had become very cold and bleak. It was felt on Sunday that something unusual was happening, and even when all the reports had come to hand on Monday morning, the weather map gave indications only of an ordinary and a rather feeble "low," passing well South of the Leeuwin—the kind of map that leads one, this time of the year, to anticipate a few showers and fairly strong winds along the coast from Fremantle round towards Esperance. Instead of that, however, the wind veered to the South, and blew with hurricane violence, raising a tremendous sea. By Tuesday morning the weather map showed that the "low" had moved up from the Southern Ocean towards Eucla, where the barometer had fallen to 29.60, and the "Kyarra" reported that further South it fell to 28.94. It is thus evident that either this storm suddenly developed, or else that it was lying far South of the Leeuwin on Monday, and was deflected northwards by some unknown factor even still further South. At all events it was, by Tuesday morning, a storm of great energy, moving in a North-East or East-North-East direction, and by Wednesday had penetrated inland, the centre lying somewhere to the West of Port Augusta.

THE CLIMATE OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA DURING SEPTEMBER, 1903—continued.

On Thursday it had passed to the East of that locality, where the barometer fell to 29.38 (or probably even lower). The centre was then somewhere in the neighbourhood of Broken Hill, where the long drought has at last broken and a copious downpour been experienced. Stormy weather was also reported throughout South Australia and New South Wales. On Friday it had evidently moved farther East towards the New South Wales coast; but, unfortunately, no reports were received from that State in time for the weather map. Following the passage of the storm area past Western Australia came a high pressure, accompanied by a sudden cloudiness throughout the greater portion of the State, and very cold, bleak weather, which has been generally acknowledged to be somewhat abnormal. Altogether the storm has been a most interesting one, and indicates what vast fields of research are yet open to us in the domains of Australian meteorology.
