W HEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institu-tions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thence-forth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

W HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the Government acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart temporary Stations: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as temporary. Quarantine Stations for the purpose of the said Act, for a period not to exceed six months from this date, those portions of the State as described hereunder portions of the State as described hereunder :

- (1.) Bounded on the North by an Easterly line from the Sea Coast to the 44 Mile post on the Eastern Railway Reserve; on the East by a South-Easterly line therefrom to the North-East corner of Avon Location 3444; thence Southerly along its Eastern boundary to its South-East corner; thence South-South Wate last its forth its for the South-East Corner. South-Westerly to a point situate 6 miles East from the North Dandalup Railway Station; on the South by a Westerly line therefrom to the Sea Coast; and on the West by the Sea Coast aforesaid.
- (2.) Eastward of a line running due North and South through Bullabulling.
- (3.) Mahomet's Flat, near to Geraldton.
- (4.) The piggery of Mr. Arthur Blechynden, situate at Bridgetown.

THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber at Perth, this 10th day of December, 1903.

Present;

His Excellency the Governor.

The Honourables-l, The Minister for Lands. The Attorney General,

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to make, vary, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed expedient-inter alia (1) For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or

remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; (2) For providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spread of such disease; (3) For the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom; (4) For prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined; and (5) generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease : AND WHEREAS it is expedient that regulations should be made to eradicate and prevent the spread of disease among swine: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

1. The movement of pigs within the quarantine area is prohibited, and all pigs for slaughter must be killed on the premises subject to the certificate of an Inspector.

Fat pigs from clean parts of the State will be permitted within the quarantine area for immediate slaughter only; such pigs may be sold in trucks at the Perth Railway Yard and afterwards removed direct to their destination on receipt of a certificate from an Inspector of Stock.

The weather in the South-West has been on the whole very pleasant, though a few warm days were experienced. The rainfall in this district was about an average, but very little fell in the neighbourhood of Perth until the evening of the 29th, when a thunderstorm, accompanied by heavy rain, passed over Rottnest, Perth, and Guildford, extending, however, only a few miles North or South.

The atmospheric pressure over the whole State was considerably below normal, and the temperature inland over the goldfields and all North of Geraldton was rather below the average for previous years. During the month the maximum did not reach 100 deg, at any station South of Laverton. The tropical rains have commenced in the East Kimberley District, but over the rest of the tropics and Gascoyne none fell, and on the Goldfields the fall was below the average.

No. 111.

Coal.—Coal required purely for bunkering purposes and coal the product of Western Australia will be free of wharfage dues.

No. 112.

Products of Western Australia.—All goods (except coal) the product of or manufactured within the State of Western Australia, landed from other ports within the said State, shall pay wharfage dues of one shilling (1s.) per ton.

No. 113.

Outwards Wharfage—where free.—All goods, except where otherwise specially provided, shipped to ports within the State shall be free of wharfage dues. No outwards wharfage charge will be made in respect of goods which have already paid an inward wharfage rate at Fremantle. In order to obtain this concession, consignors must, prior to shipment, make a declaration that the goods in respect of which such concession is sought have paid an inward wharfage at Fremantle.
