WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor may, by Proclamation, annex any land forming, with the municipal district of some municipality, one continuous area to such municipality: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia

praying for the annexation to the Municipality of Midland Junction of a portion of land severed from the Darling Range Roads Board District, signed by a majority of the persons on the Ratepayers' Roll of the said Roads Board, in respect of rateable land in such portion: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th day of August, 1903, as required by law: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby annex to the Municipality of Midland Junction the area contained within the following boundaries:—

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the Southern side of the York Road with the Eastern side of Robinson Road, and extending Easterly along said side of York Road to the Eastern side of Olive Street in subdivision of Swan Location 16; thence Southerly along said side of Olive Street and part of the West boundary of Reserve 2101A to the prolongation Eastward of the Southern side of Wilkins Street; thence Westerly along said side of Wilkins Street to the South-Eastern side of Irwin Street, and along it and a right-of-way South-South-Westerly and South-Westerly to the South corner of Lot 83 in said subdivision; thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of Lot 129, and Northerly along the Eastern side of the Upper Darling Range Railway Reserve to the Southern side of the Eastern Railway; thence crossing said railway to its Northern side, and along it South-Easterly to the Eastern side of Robinson Road aforesaid, and along said side of road Northerly to the starting point.

The entire boundaries of the Midland Junction Municipality being as follow:—

Bounded by lines starting from the North-West corner of Swan Location 7, on one of the Southern boundaries of Swan Location 15, and extending West 4 chains 49 links along said boundary; thence South-West 26 chains 66 links; thence South-East 2 chains 89 $\frac{3}{10}$ links; thence Southerly, crossing the main road from Guildford to York, to the Southern side of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence Westerly along said side of Reserve to the Eastern side of a subdivisional street called High Street; thence South-Easterly 6 chains 43 links; thence South-Westerly 73 links; thence South-Easterly about 2 chains 23 links to the right bank of the Helena River; thence upwards along said bank of river to the Western boundary of Reserve 2299; thence Northerly along said boundary to the South-West corner of Swan Location 7; thence Northerly along part of the West boundary to the Southern side of main

road from Guildford to York aforesaid; thence Easterly along Southern side of said road to the West side of Helena Street; thence South along said side of Helena Street to the Northern side of the Eastern Railway Reserve; thence South-Easterly along said side of Reserve to the Western side of Loton Avenue; thence South, crossing the Eastern Railway, to the Eastern side of the Upper Darling Range Railway Reserve, and along it Southerly to the South boundary of Lot 129 in subdivision of Swan Location 16, and along it Easterly to the South corner of Lot 83; thence North-Easterly and North-North-Easterly along the South-Eastern side of a right-of-way and Irwin Street in said subdivision, respectively, to the South side of Wilkins Street, and along it Easterly to the West boundary of Reserve 2101A; thence along said boundary North to the South side of the main York Road aforesaid; thence West-North-Westerly along said side of main York Road to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of Location 7 produced South; thence Northerly along said boundary to the North-Eastern corner of said Location 7; thence Westerly along one of the North boundaries of said Location to the Western side of the Midland Railway Reserve; thence Northerly along said side of Reserve to the Southern boundary of Swan Location 14A; thence Westerly along said boundary about 57 chains 50 links to the Western side of Elvire Street; thence South-Westerly along said side of street to the North boundary of said Swan Location 7; thence West to the starting point.

SANTOPILLI LIGHT—CHARACTER ALTERED.

BY-LAWS, BARDOC RECREATION RESERVE.

Reserve to be open.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to 10 p.m. throughout the year.

Injuring or destroying trees.

2. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserve.

Injuring the soil, or surface, or fence, etc.

3. No person shall cut up, or damage, or disfigure, or interfere with the soil or turf, or surface of any part of the said Reserve, or with any part of the fences, buildings, seats around or upon the same, or interfere with or destroy any birds or animals therein, in any manner whatsoever

Persons misconducting themselves.

4. No person shall misconduct himself in any way by indulging in any riotous or indecent conduct or make use of any indecent or improper language or commit any nuisance on the said Reserve.

Lodging in the Reserve.

5. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry over night or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight on the said Reserve, or shall sleep during the day in the said Reserve.

Shooting, etc., on the Reserve.

6. No person or persons shall shoot or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missiles, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set off any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire, on any portion of the Reserve, unless the consent of the Board in writing has been previously obtained.

Selling goods on the Reserve.

7. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said Reserve, unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Races, etc., forbidden.

8. No racing match with horses, dogs, or otherwise, nor any game of polo, nor any game which may be considered dangerous by the Board, or may be calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public, or likely to injure the suaface of the ground, shall be allowed on the said Reserve, except such portions (if any) as may be specially set apart for such purpose, and shown thereon by boundary posts, such boundary to be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board may deem necessary.

Waste litter of picnics to be removed.

9. When any person, party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game or picnic on the Reserve he or they (as the case may be) shall immediately prior to leaving the ground collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

Cricket and other games.

10. No person or organised club shall play cricket, football, baseball, racket, or any game of a like nature on any portion of the Reserve, except on such portion as shall have been, or hereafter may be, set apart for their peculiar purposes by the Board; neither shall any such games as aforesaid be played on those portions of the Reserve as are or may be set apart for those peculiar purposes, unless and until the person or club shall have first obtained from the Board a permit in writing to do so.

11. The Board may, if it thinks fit, fix the day or days upon which, and the bounds or limits within which, any games or gymnastics may be permitted to take place upon the Reserve, or they may prohibit any games or gymnastics from taking place upon the said Reserve.

Cattle not to be depastured.

12. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dogs, goats, camel, donkey, mule, or pigs to stray or to depasture upon the Reserve lands, without the special approval of the Board in writing.

Penalty.

13. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding Twenty pounds.

REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE BARDOC RECREATION RESERVE BOARD, APPOINTED UNDER "THE PARKS AND RESERVES ACT, 1895."

1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business not less than once a month, on a date and hour to be decided by the President, 24 hours' notice of which, in writing, shall be given by the Secretary to each member.

2. The President shall have power to call a special meeting for the consideration of any business he may wish to submit to the Board.

3. The President, or in his absence the Secretary, shall convene a special meeting of the Board, upon the written requisition of two members, setting forth the objects for which the meeting shall be called, within three days after the receipt of the requisition.

4. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing, at least, shall be given of any special meeting of the Board to every member of same, and shall be sent by post to or delivered at the address of such member.

5. All questions which shall be proposed or considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present, each member to have one vote, and in the event of an equal division of the votes the President shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.

6. At all meetings of the Board three members shall form a quorum.

7. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a journal to be kept for the purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the President, or in his absence the Chairman for the time being, shall sign the same as confirmed or amended.

8. All moneys received by the Board shall be placed to its credit at such bank as the members may from time to time direct, and all payments shall be made by cheques on such account, signed by two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary for the time being.

9. The Secretary shall attend every meeting and enter minutes of all the proceedings of the Board, and keep all the books and accounts, conduct the correspondence under the direction of the President, and transact any other business the Board may require.

BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH COOLGARDIE ROAD BOARD, FOR THE REGISTRATION OF CAMELS, CAMEL-DRIVERS, Etc.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the provision of "The Roads Act, 1902," Edwardi VII., No. 48, the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned: It is therefore ordered by the North Coolgardie Road Board that from and after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*, the following by-laws shall be in force within the North Coolgardie Road Board District, for the registration of camels, camel-drivers, etc.

Registration of camels.

1. All camel-owners shall register with the Road Board the brand with which all camels owned shall be branded and registered. Any owner, by self or agent, neglecting to register, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each offence.

Licensing of camels.

2. An annual license fee of Five shillings shall be paid to the Board for every camel above the age of two years kept or used within the district. Any unlicensed camel above the age of two years found within the district shall be liable to be seized for sale or destruction by the Board.

Licensing of drivers.

3. One driver or attendant shall drive or attend any number of camels not exceeding eight, and shall pay a license fee of Five shillings annually for license to drive or attend. Any driver or attendant found driving or attending without such license shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Information.

4. Any owner, driver, or attendant of camels objecting or refusing to give to any member or officer of the Road Board such information respecting ownership or use of camels as may be required by the Board shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Camels exempted by "The Roads Act, 1902," are not included in these By-laws.

Applications for registration, and certificates of registration shall be in the forms of Schedules hereunder.
