WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, prohibit or permit the introduction or importation into the State, either by land or sea, of any Stock from any country or place: AND WHEREAS Regulations prohibiting the introduction of Stock from Asiatic Ports were duly made and published under the said Act, the 12th day of February, 1897: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the said Regulations as hereinafter appearing: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby order as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th February, 1897, the importation of horses from Asiatic Ports into this State is permitted, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) That each consignment is accompanied by a Government certificate of health, signed by a duly qualified Veterinary Surgeon, in addition to a declaration by the owner or breeder of the Stock, or Manager of the Farm or Station from which they come, to the effect that such Stock were, at the time of departure from the Farm or Station, and had been for three months immediately preceding, to the best of his belief, free from disease, and had not for such period been in contact with diseased animals.

(b) That should such Stock arrive at a Port of landing in Western Australia without the aforesaid certificate, and the Inspector be satisfied that such Stock are free from disease, he may permit the landing of the Stock on the declaration being sworn at the time of landing, and on payment of a fee of ten shillings, in addition to a fee for inspection of ten shillings from one to five head, and of one shilling for every additional head: Provided that such Stock, not found on arrival to be infected, shall be removed to the Quarantine Station, where they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen days, and if, at the expiration of that period, such Stock shall be found to be clean, the Inspector shall give the owner thereof a certificate permitting the removal.

THE following special rules issued by His Majesty's Government, enjoining neutrality on all British subjects in the present war between Russia and Japan, are published for general information:—

- "Rule A.—No ship of war of either belligerent may use British waters as places for resort for warlike purposes or equipment, or may leave British waters until 24 hours after any ship of the other belligerent, whether a ship of war or merchant vessel.
- "Rule B.—Every such ship of war shall be required to put to sea within 24 hours after entrance, unless in event of stress of weather or necessity for repairs or provisions, in which case must leave as soon as possible, and certainly within 24 hours after completion of repairs. Rule B is subject to Rule A, and time may be extended accordingly.
- "Rule C.—During the continuation of hostilities no coal should be supplied to warships of either belligerent power, except on the written authority of the competent port authorities specifying the amount of coal which may be supplied.
- "Rule D.—Before issuing any authorisation for the supplies of coal to any belligerent warship, the port authorities shall obtain written declaration duly signed by officer commanding such warship of the destination to which it is proceeding and the amount of coal already on board.

His Excellency the Governor-General has also issued, by proclamation, the following instructions, which are to be observed by all officers (civil, military, and naval), and by all other His Majesty's subjects in the Commonwealth:—

- "No supplies to be allowed to any such ship as is included in above rules, beyond provisions and subsistence for crew necessary for immediate use.
- "No coal, beyond that to take her to nearest port of own country, or nearer-named neutral destination.
- "No coal to the same ship in any British ports twice within three months.
- "No prizes to be brought to British waters.
- "If any ship of either belligerent takes any coal under the rules, report by telegram immediately, in order that other ports may be notified.
- "If any exceptional or doubtful case arises under the rules, apply for instructions by telegraph."

THE DONNYBROOK LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.
BY-LAW No. 37.

WHEREAS by Section 191 of "The Health Act, 1898," a Local Board may make By-laws for the purpose of preventing the pollution of any river or watercourse, the water of which is used for drinking purposes: AND WHEREAS the water of the Preston River within the District of Donnybrook Local Board of Health is used for drinking purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the recited section or otherwise conferred by the said Act, the Local Board of Health for the District of Donnybrook hereby makes the following By-law:—

"No person shall swim or bathe in, or permit dogs, ducks, or pigs to have access to, or in any other way pollute the water of the Preston River within the District of the Board."
