WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient that a Commission shall forthwith issue to inquire and report as to the Condition of Ventilation and Sanitation of the Mines of the State of Western Australia, the effects of the said conditions on the health of the persons employed in the said mines, and the measures which should be taken, where necessary, to bring about improvement thereof: Now KNOW YE that I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, integrity, knowledge, and ability, have constituted and appointed, and by these presents do constitute and appoint you the said Alexander Montgomery, R. L. Jack, Ernest Black, Thomas Hewitson, E. A. Mann, Fergie Reid, and John Carr to be Commissioners for the purpose aforesaid: AND for the better effecting the purposes of this Commission I do, by these presents, give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, in case you shall think fit so to do, full power and authority to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information on the subject of this Commission: AND I do by these presents will and ordain that this Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you the said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter or thing therein contained, although your proceedings may not be continued from time to time by adjournment: AND my further will and pleasure is that you do, within five months, report to me under your hands and seals your proceedings and the results of your inquiries, and also your recommendations by virtue of this Commission on the matter herein submitted for your consideration: AND I APPOINT you, the

said Alexander Montgomery, Chairman of this my Commission, with authority to appoint a Secretary, and with authority to give a second or casting vote at any meeting at which the votes (including that of the Chairman) on any question pertaining thereto shall be equal, and I declare this Commission to be a Commission for all the purposes of "The Royal Commissioners Powers Act, 1902: IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I have caused this Commission to be issued and the seal of our State of Western Australia to be hereunto affixed.

INQUIRY INTO THE PROPOSED EXTENSION OF BOUNDARIES.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has received from W. Re increasing area of Upper Chapman Road Board District by alienating parts of the Geraldton and Northampton Road Board Districts.

To His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

May it please Your Excellency,—

- In pursuance of your instructions I held inquiries, under Section 6, Subsection (c) of "The Roads Act, 1902," in the Police Court, Geraldton, on the 1st instant, and in the Road Board Office, Northampton, on the 3rd and 4th instant, into the proposed alterations of the boundaries and increase of the present gazetted area of the Upper Chapman Road Board District by alienating from the Northern portion of the Geraldton Road Board District a strip of land (edged pink on plan) about four miles wide, and containing approximately 80,000 acres, and adding same to the Southern part of the Upper Chapman Road Board District; as well as that portion between the railway and the coast (hatched red and edged in blue), together also with part of the Southern portion of the Northampton Road Board District, as shown in pink on attached plan.
- Three ratepayers attended at Geraldton in support of the petition, and four against, in regard to the Southern addition to the petitioning Board. While four ratepayers appeared in support of the annexation of the Southern portion of the Northampton Road Board District, and seven against.
- I have the honour to report as follows, regarding the boundaries of the district:—
- From the evidence, copy of which I attach, you will observe that the Geraldton Road Board strenuously opposed the Upper Chapman Road Board absorbing the whole of the portion edged pink on the plan, but that they were agreeable to the portion bordered by blue dotted line and hatched in red, and containing about 31,606 acres, or 49.4 sq. miles, being added to the Upper Chapman Road Board District, which at the present time contains 333,680 acres, or 521 sq. miles.
- After hearing the evidence, and from a personal inspection of the ground, I recommend that the portion bordered by blue dotted lines and hatched in red, marked "Extension recommended," be alienated from the Geraldton Road Board District and added to the Upper Chapman District.
- Regarding the proposal to add a part of the Southern portion of the Northampton Road Board District to the North-West corner of the Upper Chapman Road Board District, there is a superabundance of evidence in favour of the Northampton Board retaining this part of their district.
- From an inspection I made of the road lettered "I.J." I am inclined to agree with the evidence adduced by the Northampton Road Board, namely, that the road is in fair order. I cannot, therefore, recommend the alienation of this portion of the Northampton Road Board District, and suggest that this Board retains its territory intact as at present.

8. I could not get any definite expression of opinion from either the Geraldton or the Northampton Boards as to the division of their districts into wards; but the majority of the members of both those Boards, I believe, are in favour of the ward system. I cannot, however, through lack of this information, make any recommendation at this stage as to their subdivision into wards.

9. The chairman of the Upper Chapman Road Board suggests his district being divided into three wards with two members for each, or six in all; and in this he is supported by Mr. Eastough, a member of that Board. But Mr. Jupp, a ratepayer and very old settler, recommends four wards with two members for each, or eight in all. They all, however, agree that the district should be split up into wards as nearly equal in area as possible. It is impossible to do this with three wards, so I recommend four wards, with two members for each, making eight in all, with boundaries as shown on plan. The following table gives their areas:—

10. The settlement at present East of this district is sparse, most of it being along the Chapman River, and in the Southern part; but those proposed divisions equalise it as much as possible, and also tend to reconcile conflicting interests and rival factions. At first sight it appears that No. 4, or East Ward, carries a small population; but the Government has lately thrown open for selection Mt. Erin Estate, so that shortly, it is anticipated, the population will materially increase.
