Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours' notice being given as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superintendent.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. *Should the undertaker or his representative be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days; and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance.* In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.

11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April	} Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
1st May to 31st August	
	} Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

And no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

13. *Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.*

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

16. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees; and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

19. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

20. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

21. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

22. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

23. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

24. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

25. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

26. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

27. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the Principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

29. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

30. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

32. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the Trustees to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

35. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.

37. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

38. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of January.

39. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.
- (c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
- (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

40. In every case where the funeral train from Roe Street platform, Perth, is availed of, the coffin shall be placed in the Funeral Car provided for that purpose by the undertaker, and all railway charges shall be paid by him.

The train will be met at Karrakatta station by the Board's Coffin Car and employees, and the coffin will be borne to the assigned grave by them, at the expense of the Board.

41. The undertaker or any one of his assistants shall be allowed to accompany the Funeral Train, and enter the Cemetery with the funeral for the purpose of discharging the usual duties of an undertaker.

42. Save as otherwise provided in the last preceding regulation, no undertaker, nor any assistant or servant of any undertaker, shall be allowed in the said train, or to enter the said Cemetery, or in any other manner be connected with the funeral after the coffin has been deposited in the Funeral Car at the Roe Street platform as foresaid.

43. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of January following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

44. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves, or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose.

45. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

46. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

47. A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a Register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office on 13th day of April, 1904, and adopted.

REGULATION.

No State Battery Officer to hold Mining Interests.

No Officer in charge of, nor any Assayer employed on any State Battery shall hold, directly or indirectly, any share or interest in any claim, mining lease, or other mining adventure whatsoever in the Goldfield or Mineral field in which he is employed.

Any such Officer or Assayer shall, for a breach of this Regulation, be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds, and in default of payment to imprisonment with hard labour for any period not exceeding six months, and to dismissal from his office.

Such Regulations to come into force throughout the State on the first day of July, 1904.

REGULATIONS.

PROSPECTING AREAS.

Dimensions of Prospecting Areas for Gold.

3. The maximum area which any miner who desires to prospect for gold on Crown Land may mark off and hold for that purpose shall be as follows:—

- (a.) Outside the limits of a proclaimed Goldfield, forty-eight acres.
- (b.) Within the limits of a proclaimed Goldfield, eighteen acres.

And every such area shall be marked in the prescribed manner. Every such area shall be called a Prospecting Area.

The Warden may, in his discretion, refuse to register any Prospecting Area, or he may register any Prospecting Area of such less extent than forty-eight or eighteen acres, as the case may be, as to him shall seem fit.

Prospecting Areas to be marked.

4. Every Prospecting Area shall be, as nearly as possible, in the form of a rectangular parallelogram, the length of which shall, in no case, exceed twice the width, and shall be marked at each corner by a substantial post or a cairn of stones projecting above the surface of the ground not less than three feet, and set in the angle of an "L" trench, the arms of which shall not be less than four feet in length and six inches in depth, cut in the general direction of the boundary lines. When the nature of the ground will not permit of trenches being cut, rows of stones of similar dimensions shall be substituted. The boundary lines shall be cleared from post to post. On one of such posts shall be firmly affixed at the time of marking a notice, in writing, under the hand of the miner, setting forth the name of such miner, the number and date of his Miner's Right, and the date on which the area was marked off. Such marking off and notice shall be deemed a sufficient title to such Prospecting Area for ten days if the same is situated within twenty miles of the nearest Warden's Office, and for fourteen days in any other case, and at the expiration of either of such periods, as the case may be, every Prospecting Area shall be registered as provided in Regulation 5.

Registration of Prospecting Area.

5. Any miner desirous of registering any Prospecting Area shall, before the expiration of the period in any case provided, make application for registration thereof in duplicate, in the form of Schedule 9, by lodging the same at the Mining Registrar's Office, and at the same time shall deposit the fee for registration at the rate prescribed; and on receipt thereof the Mining Registrar shall deliver to the applicant a Certificate of Application, in duplicate, in the form of Schedule 10, one of which shall forthwith be posted by the applicant on the Notice Board at the Mining Registrar's Office; and the other shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be posted on one of the posts of the area. Provided that the Mining Registrar may, if no prior right or public interest is thereby affected, register such Prospecting Area upon receipt of the application therefor, and the fees for registration thereof, without issue of Schedule 10 or posting thereof. And provided, further, that the Mining Registrar may require the applicant to comply with the provisions hereof with regard to posting of such notice; and in such case such notice shall be posted as provided and kept legible and intact for a period of six clear days; and if, at the expiration of such period, no objection shall have been lodged, he may register such area, subject to the provisions of Regulation 3, or he may refer the application to the Warden, and in that case shall be guided by his decision. If any objection shall have been lodged, the Mining Registrar shall defer registration until such objection has been heard and determined by the Warden, and shall be guided by the decision thereon.

## SCHOOL OF MINES OF W.A.

## GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. The examinations will be held during November in each year, at times to be duly announced.
2. Applications from candidates, together with satisfactory proof of age and a fee of ten shillings, must reach the Secretary of the School of Mines, Kalgoorlie, not later than October 20th.
3. The scholarships will be awarded on the reports of the Examiners to those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate of marks and comply with the conditions.
4. No scholarship will be awarded any candidate unless he passes in each subject of the examination and obtains at least 60 per cent. of the aggregate marks.
5. No person will be allowed to hold two of these scholarships concurrently.
6. Successful candidates must produce certificates of good character and of *bona fide* residence for six months in Western Australia.
7. The Minister for Mines reserves the right of cancelling any scholarship should the holder be reported for irregular attendance, idleness, or bad conduct.
8. As a condition of holding a School of Mines scholarship, successful candidates must regularly attend the classes and pass the annual examinations in the subjects specified for each scholarship.
9. The interpretation of these and the following regulations, together with the decision of all matters not specifically provided for, shall rest with the Director of the School of Mines, who shall also have full control of the conduct of the examinations.
10. There will be offered annually the following scholarships:—

- (a.) One Junior and one Entrance Scholarship for youths residing within the Eastern Land Division.

These scholarships will be tenable at the School of Mines, Kalgoorlie.

- (b.) One Senior Scholarship open to all youths completing the first year's course for an Associateship of the School of Mines. Students of the Perth Technical School will be eligible to compete, and if successful may obtain permission from the Hon. the Minister for Mines to continue their studies in Perth.
- (c.) Two other Junior Scholarships for separate competition, one in the South and Eucla Divisions, and one in the Western, North-West, and Kimberley Divisions.
- (d.) A second Entrance Scholarship for competition outside the Eastern Division.

The last four scholarships, viz., the Senior, the two Juniors, and the Entrance, by permission to be granted in each case by the Minister for Mines, may be held at the Perth Technical School.

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

## Junior Scholarships.

1. Junior Scholarships will be offered annually for competition, open to youths who are at least 15 years of age on the 1st of March following the examination, and have been *bona fide* residents of Western Australia for six months immediately prior to the examination.
2. The scholarships will be offered for separate competition in the following land divisions, viz.:—One in the Eastern Division, one in the South-West and Eucla Divisions, and one in the Western, North-West, and Kimberley Divisions.

3. Each successful candidate must at once enter upon classes in Preparatory Mathematics, Chemistry, and Physics, as laid down in the School of Mines syllabus, and by the end of his second year must complete the first course for the Associateship.

4. The scholarships will have an annual value of £40 for three years, with remission of class fees, and will be tenable for a fourth year if the holder completes the second year's work of the Associateship course at the end of his third year.

5. The Junior Scholarship examinations will be held in the following subjects:—

- (a.) ENGLISH.—Grammar, dictation, and composition, as laid down for Standard VII. of the State Primary Schools.
- (b.) ARITHMETIC.—Notation, numeration, tables, weights and measures, the simple and compound rules, square root, fractions, proportion, practice, and the mensuration of simple surfaces and solids.
- (c.) ALGEBRA.—The elementary rules, including brackets and simple equations.
- (d.) GEOMETRY.—The definitions, axioms, and postulates of Euclid, Book I., and propositions 1 to 26.
- (e.) PHYSIOGRAPHY.—Elementary principles. The atmosphere and oceans, circulation and action of water, the composition and movements of the earth's crust.

## SCHOOL OF MINES ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. Entrance Scholarships will be offered annually for competition to youths who are at least 15 years of age, on the first of March following the examination, and have been *bona fide* residents of Western Australia for six months immediately prior to the examination.

2. Each successful candidate must at once enter upon an Associate course in mining or metallurgy, as laid down in the School of Mines syllabus, and must pass the examinations for the first and second years' Associateship course at the end of his first and second year respectively, as a condition of retaining the scholarship.

3. The scholarships will have an annual value of £60 for three years, with remission of class fees.

4. The Entrance Scholarship examinations will be held in the following subjects:—

- (a.) ARITHMETIC.—The whole subject, with mensuration of simple surfaces and solids.
- (b.) ALGEBRA.—The elements up to easy quadratics.
- (c.) GEOMETRY.—The first three books of Euclid.
- (d.) CHEMISTRY.—The elementary principles, including the simple chemistry of hydrogen, oxygen, nitrogen, and carbon, and simple calculations.
- (e.) PHYSICS.—The elementary principles of sound, light, heat, magnetism, and electricity.

5. All candidates who pass in the mathematics portion of this examination will be entitled, without further examination, to enrolment as Associateship students of the School of Mines of Western Australia.

## SCHOOL OF MINES SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP.

1. One Senior Scholarship will be offered annually for competition to students who are registered Associateship students and are completing the first year's work of an Associateship course in either Mining or Metallurgy.

2. The successful candidate must at once enter upon the second year's work of the Associateship course and pass the terminal examinations at the end of his first year as a condition of holding the scholarship.

3. The Senior Scholarship will have an annual value of £75 for two years with remission of class fees.

4. The Senior Scholarship Examination will be identical with the annual examinations for the first year of the School of Mines Associateship course held in the following subjects:—

- (a.) MATHEMATICS.—First course.
- (b.) CHEMISTRY.—First course.
- (c.) GEOLOGY.
- (d.) PHYSICS.—First course.
- (e.) ASSAYING.—First course.

(d.) The entries in column 7 should agree with the Bank Pass Book.

(e.) In column 18 must be entered all amounts granted to the Board by the Government as "Circulars of Advice" are received.

(f.) Care should be exercised to make the entries in the respective Ward columns additional to the ordinary entry, in order that the "Receipts" or "Expenditure" for each ward can be readily ascertained. More especially the periodical entries of Rates and Licenses from the "Rates Cash" and "License" Books.

(g.) If a cheque is made up of several items, each item should appear in column 19 (column 20 is for total amount of each cheque drawn from Bank, and these amounts should agree with the Bank Pass Book).

(h.) In column 21 all orders drawn upon the Treasury must be entered. These entries should agree with Treasury Pass Book.

(i.) Amounts re-allocated to be adjusted by transfer entries.

(j.) No erasures whatever shall be made in this book. When alterations are necessary the incorrect entry should be neatly ruled through and the amendments initialled.

ORDER 52A.

PROCEEDINGS UNDER "THE TRUSTEES ACT, 1900."

1. All applications under "The Trustees Act, 1900" (in this Order called "the Act"), may be made by petition, except as otherwise provided under Rule 4 of this Order.

2. (1.) Where a trustee desires to make a lodgment in Court, under Section 46 of the Act, he shall make and file an affidavit intituled in the matter of the trust (described so as to be distinguishable) and of the Act, and setting forth,—

- (a.) A short description of the trust and of the instrument creating it.
- (b.) The names of the persons interested in and entitled to the money or securities, and their places of residence, to the best of his knowledge and belief.
- (c.) His submission to answer all such inquiries relating to the application of the money or securities paid into Court, as the Court or Judge may make or direct.
- (d.) The place where he is to be served with any petition, summons, or order or notice of any proceedings relating to the money or securities. Provided that if the fund consists of money or securities being or being part of, or representing a legacy or residue to which an infant or person beyond seas is absolutely entitled, and on which the trustee has paid the legacy duty, or on which no duty is chargeable, the trustee may make the lodgment (without an affidavit) on production of the official receipt for such duty, or a certificate from the proper officer, of the payment thereof, or that no such duty is payable.

(2.) Where the lodgment in Court is made on affidavit—

- (a.) The person who has made the lodgment shall forthwith give notice thereof, by prepaid letter through the post, to the several persons whose names and places of residence are stated in his affidavit as interested in or entitled to the money or securities lodged in Court.

(b.) No petition or summons relating to the money or securities shall be answered or issued unless the petitioner or applicant has named therein a place where he may be served with any petition or summons, or notice of any proceeding or order relating to the money or securities, or the dividends thereof.

(c.) Service of any application in respect of the money or securities shall be made on such persons as the Court or Judge may direct.

3. Applications to deal with funds lodged in Court under the Act shall be intitled in the same manner as the affidavit or request on which the funds were lodged. All other applications under the Act not made in any pending cause shall be intitled in the matter of the trust (described so as to be distinguishable) and of the Act. Every petition or summons for a vesting order, or the appointment of a person to convey, shall state the section or sections of the Act under which it is proposed that the order shall be made.

4. Any of the following applications may be made by summons:—

(a.) An application for the appointment of a new trustee, with or without a vesting or other consequential order.

(b.) An application for a vesting order or other order consequential on the appointment of a new trustee, whether the appointment is made by the Court or a Judge or out of Court.

(c.) An application for a vesting or other consequential order in any case where a judgment or order has been given or made for the sale, conveyance, or transfer of any land or stock, or the suing for or recovering any chose in action.

(d.) An application relating to a fund paid into Court in any case coming within the provisions of Order 52, Rule 3.

5. The following Rules are hereby repealed:—

Order 49, Rules 18, 19, 20, 21.  
Order 52, Rule 3, (4), (6).

6. These Rules may be cited as the "Rules of the Supreme Court (Trustees Act, 1900)" and each Rule may be cited separately according to the heading thereof, with reference to the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1888.

They shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1904.
