132A. In the Port of Bunbury, in lieu of Regulation 4, set forth in Schedule D, the following shall apply :—

The time during which vessels with full cargoes of timber on board may occupy any berth at any wharf or jetty, for the purpose of discharging or loading cargo, shall not exceed the following, viz. :—

and then at the rate of one additional day for every additional 200 tons register. The time to be allowed to vessels not having full timber cargoes on board shall be in the same proportion to the above number of days as such cargo bears to the register tonnage. At the expiration of these respective lay days, a rate of one farthing per register ton per day shall become leviable. Sundays and holidays are excluded from the above computation.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time prohibit the importation into the State of any stock, or may permit the importation, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he may see fit: AND WHEREAS an Order in Council and Regulations permitting the importation of stud boars was made on the 25th day of May, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd day of June, 1904, and continue in force: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke the said Order in Council and Regulations: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in any Order in Council or Regulations made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," to the contrary, the importation of all swine from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, and the Colony of New Zealand, into the State of Western Australia, is prohibited until further notice.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to confirm the following Rules of North Fremantle Fire Brigade made by the Council of the Municipality of North Fremantle.

RULES OF THE NORTH FREMANTLE FIRE BRIGADE.

(MADE UNDER SECTION 4, BY-LAW NO. 7, OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF NORTH FREMANTLE.)

Name.

1. That this Brigade be known and designated as "The North Fremantle Fire Brigade."

Objects.

2. That the objects of the Brigade shall be the extinction and prevention of the spread of fire, and the preservation and protection of life and property by means of all the apparatus available for that purpose, and by the exertions of the several members.

How constituted.

3. The Brigade shall consist of 12 able-bodied men (in addition to the Superintendent) of good reputation and not less than 18 years of age. Any person over 18 and under 45 years of age desirous of becoming a member, and residing within the Municipality of North Fremantle, may in the first instance apply to the Superintendent, who, if satisfied, will place the applicant's name on the probationary list for one month; during which time the applicant will be required to attend at least two practices, and if then considered satisfactory will be appointed on the permanent list by the Superintendent, subject to the approval of the Fire Brigade Board.

4. No person convicted of any serious violation of the law shall be capable of being or continuing a member of the Brigade.

5. The officers of the Brigade shall consist of a Superintendent, appointed by the Council (*see* Rule No. 15), Lieutenant, Hose Officer, and Secretary, who shall be elected as provided by Rules Nos. 30 and 31.

Meetings.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

6. The Brigade shall hold a general meeting for the transaction of business on the first Monday in each month, and the annual meeting on the second Monday in November in each year.

SPECIAL MEETINGS.

7. Special meetings shall be called by the Superintendent within three days on receiving a requisition signed by five (5) members of the Brigade specifying the objects of the special meeting, and in the event of such meeting not being called within the time specified, the Secretary shall call a meeting on being presented with a copy of such requisition. Special meetings may also be called whenever the Superintendent shall deem necessary. Such meetings shall be called by circular.

8. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as shall be specified in the circular.

9. No business shall be transacted except at the annual, monthly, or special general meetings. All meetings shall be held at the Fire Brigade Station.

10. At all general and special meetings, five members to form a quorum, and, in the event of there not being a quorum within 15 minutes of the time specified, the meeting shall be adjourned to a day to be named by a majority of those present.

11. The Superintendent shall preside at all meetings, or, in his absence, the Lieutenant. Should neither be present, the meeting shall elect a Chairman. The Chairman to have both a deliberative and a casting vote.

Order of Business.

12. At all meetings the order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1.) Reading and confirmation of minutes.
- (2.) Correspondence read and dealt with.
- (3.) Committees' and officers' reports.
- (4.) Motions, of which notice shall have been previously given.
- (5.) General business.

Any member may demand a division on any motion before the meeting. All correspondence shall be considered as received, unless a motion to the contrary is carried.

Rules of Debate.

12. At all meetings the order of debate shall be as follows:—

- (1.) No motion shall be discussed until it is seconded and stated to the meeting by the Chairman.
- (2.) When a motion is under discussion, no matter foreign to the question shall be admitted until a decision of the meeting is announced from the Chair thereon.
- (3.) A motion to adjourn either debate or meeting shall always be in order.
- (4.) Every member speaking to a question shall rise and in the first place address himself to the Chair.
- (5.) No member shall speak more than once, unless in explanation of or in reply to the question before the Chair, without the permission of the meeting.
- (6.) In the event of two members rising at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who is in possession of the meeting.

Notice of Motion.

14. Every notice of motion must be given in writing to the Secretary, who shall cause same to be posted in the Fire Brigade Station. Such notice of motion shall only be dealt with at a meeting held at least 21 days subsequently to its being given first order of debate.

Superintendent.

15. The appointment of the Superintendent shall rest solely with the Council. He shall have entire charge of the Brigade station, engines, and all appliances, and shall be held responsible by the Council for the proper maintenance of the same in good order, and for the satisfactory working of the Brigade. He will take command at all fires, practices, and parades.

Lieutenant.

16. It shall be the duty of the Lieutenant to act with and under the direction of the Superintendent, and, in his absence, perform his duties.

Hose Officer.

17. It shall be the duty of the Hose Officer to see that the engine and all apparatus of the Brigade are in proper working order, and at all times clean, to supervise all repairs, to keep an inventory of all the apparatus belonging to the Brigade, and immediately report any defects to the Superintendent.

Secretary.

18. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a correct copy of the proceedings of the Brigade in the books kept for that purpose, to conduct and attend to all correspondence, to hand all moneys received by him on behalf of the Brigade over to the Town Clerk, to have all accounts checked and vouchers signed by Chairman and two councillors and forwarded on to the Town Clerk for payment, and to forward to the Town Clerk a written copy of the Board's recommendations and decisions for the approval of the Council. He shall notify members of all special meetings, read the minutes of previous meetings, furnish a report and balance-sheet at the annual meetings, and call the roll at all meetings, practices, parades, and fires. He shall, when at fires, take note of the members present, and in case of any being absent, send a messenger to call them.

Alarm of Fire.

19. On the alarm of fire it shall be the duty of the members (Superintendent excepted) to at once hasten to the Fire Station and assist in getting out the necessary apparatus and proceed to the scene of the conflagration, and not leave their duty without the permission of the officer in command, or until the appliances have been returned to the Fire Station and the roll called.

Orders.

20. Members, when at fires and practices, shall take notice of no orders except those given by the Superintendent or officer in command.

Residence.

21. It shall be the duty of each member on being appointed to give his name and address to the secretary, and on changing his residence to notify the secretary of such change. A list of members and their addresses shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the Fire Station.

Discipline.

22. Any member who shall, by his non-attendance at fires, practices, and meetings, show his want of interest in the Brigade or its affairs shall be reported by the officers to the Superintendent, who will investigate the charge, and, if proven, inflict such punishment as he may think fit.

Misconduct of Members.

23. Any member using improper language at fires, practices, parades, or meetings, or being in a state of intoxication whilst attending same or when wearing the uniform of the Brigade, refusing to obey the orders of the Officer-in-Charge, or at any time guilty of conduct unbecoming a member or calculated to bring disrespect on, or lower the status of the brigade, shall be suspended and dealt with as per Rule 26.

24. Any member carelessly or wilfully damaging, making away with, lending, or wearing, except when on duty, any portion of the uniform shall be suspended and dealt with as provided by Rule 26.

25. No member shall be allowed to write or answer any letter in any public journal on Brigade matters without the sanction of the Board.

26. Any charge brought against a member shall be investigated by the Superintendent at the next general or at a special meeting. A written statement of the charge shall be furnished to the accused at least three days prior to such meeting, and should such charge be proved, the member shall be subject to such penalties as the Superintendent may determine.

Conduct of officers.

37. Should the Brigade at any time be dissatisfied with the Superintendent, the members may, after full discussion, in special meeting duly convened for the purpose of considering such dissatisfaction, forward copies of the resolution when carried to the Board, who will inquire into and deal with the matter.

28. Should the Brigade be dissatisfied with the conduct of any officer (other than the Superintendent—see preceding Rule) the members may call on him to resign or remove him from office as may determined upon by a special meeting of the Brigade called for that purpose, of which seven days' notice shall have been given to each member by circular setting forth the business for which the meeting is called.

Practices.

29. The Brigade shall meet for general practice every Thursday evening at 8 o'clock, and for special practice at such times as the Superintendent may determine.

Wet practices shall be held once in every three months, and the Secretary shall notify members of the Board when the same is to take place.

Nomination and Election of Officers.

30. The annual nomination of officers (with the exception of the Superintendent, who is appointed as per Rule No. 15) shall take place at the October monthly meeting. The election shall take place at the annual meeting, and in the event of there being more than one member nominated for any office, the election shall be by ballot, and all officers shall have an absolute majority of the votes of those present and entitled to vote.

Extraordinary Vacancies.

31. If any of the offices (that of the Superintendent excepted) become vacant prior to the annual meeting, nominations for the same shall be taken at the next general meeting, or at a special meeting called for that purpose. The election for same shall take place not less than seven days after nomination.

Uniform.

32. The uniform of the brigade shall be of such pattern and material as the Brigade may from time to time think fit.

Accoutrements of Members.

33. Each member of the Brigade shall, on being appointed, be supplied with a helmet, spanner, life-line, axe, working trousers, and cap, the property of the Council (see Rule No. 41) and to remain so, and such other uniform as may be from time to time decided upon by the Brigade, also a copy of these rules.

Auditors.

34. The books of the Brigade shall be audited by the Municipal Auditors prior to the annual meeting, who shall certify to their accuracy or otherwise.

Miscellaneous.

35. The command of the Brigade shall be taken in the following order :—Superintendent, Lieutenant, Hose Officer, Secretary.

36. Officers, when on duty, must be addressed by their official titles.

37. When at fires, the Officer-in-Charge may order what refreshments he may deem necessary.

38. None of the property shall be removed from the Fire Brigade Station without the authority of the Superintendent.

Watchman.

39. There shall be a Watchman on duty between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. at the Fire Brigade Station, conditionally on suitable quarters being provided. The watchman will be under the supervision of the Superintendent, who may call on any member of the brigade to relieve the watchman.

Alteration or Suspension of Rules.

40. None of these Rules shall be altered, revoked, suspended, or rescinded except by two-thirds of the members present at a general meeting of the Brigade.

Any member proposing to alter, rescind, revoke, or suspend any of these Rules shall do so by giving notice of motion (Rule No. 14).

This provision shall not apply to Rules Nos. 15 and 41, which shall not be altered or dealt with in any way except by the consent of the Council, such consent to be in writing.

Property.

41. The whole of the property at present held by the Brigade, or which may in future be acquired out of the funds, shall be considered the property of the North Fremantle Municipal Council as trustees for the ratepayers and residents of the town, and on no account shall any of this property be disposed of without the consent of the Council.

General Instructions.

42. To prevent confusion and misunderstanding, it is absolutely necessary that silence and obedience to the officers shall be observed, that no one but the Superintendent shall use the whistle, or, in his absence, the next in command, who shall surrender the same on the arrival of his superior officer, and that every member shall make himself acquainted with the Rules and Regulations, and endeavour to do his work promptly.

Whistles.

43. *One (1) Call.*—To go on if on the road, to commence work if at a fire.

Two (2) Calls.—To stop if on the road, to cease work if at a fire.

Three (3) Calls.—Coil up and place apparatus on the carriage.

Four (4) Calls.—Assemble for instructions.

THE Council of the Municipality of North Fremantle, under the powers conferred on it by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (Section 179), doth hereby order that Clause No. 2 of a By-law intituled "A By-law for regulating and controlling a Fire Brigade in the Municipality of North Fremantle," and advertised in the *Government Gazette* of the 12th August, 1898, be amended to read as follows :—

There shall be a managing committee, which shall have general supervision over the finances of the Brigade, and shall report thereon from time to time to the Council.

In December of each year the Council shall appoint three of its members, and the Brigade shall appoint two of its members, and the five persons so appointed, together with the Mayor and the Superintendent of the Brigade for the time being, shall form the managing committee.

All funds of the Brigade shall be paid to the North Fremantle Municipal Account at some bank, and all cheques drawn shall be signed by the Mayor, the Treasurer, and the Town Clerk of the Municipality.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, excepting such cesspools as are situated and are of such construction as shall be required by the Local Board, shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

1. No person shall erect within the District of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal, the walls of which are not of stone, wood, and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.

2. All closets, privies, or urinals shall be erected at a distance of not less than twenty feet from any dwelling house or place of business, and in such manner as shall be approved of by the Local Board; and all such closets, privies, and urinals shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

3. The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles for excrementitious matter, which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the following size, shape, style, and materials, to be constructed out of 22 gauge iron, 14½ inches high, 13½ inches diameter, inside measurement, when completed. The ring around the top to be made out of 1 in. x ½ in. bar iron, with four holes punched at equal distances apart, and riveted to the body so as to fit same neatly and be level across the top. The seams of the body are to be folded and grooved, and sweated with solder. Two straps to be put across the bottom of pan, to be made of 20 gauge galvanised hoop iron, 1½ in., and swaged and riveted to the bottom. The handles are to be made out of ½ in. round bar iron.

BY-LAW No. 4.

There shall be provided by the occupier two receptacles for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be thoroughly cleansed and tarred.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 7.

That failing the use of a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, the contractor be compelled to obtain a receipt from the occupier of the land whereon deposit is made, or from the manager of some approved depot for nightsoil, for the number of pans there emptied or delivered.

BY-LAW No. 8.

No person shall deposit any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, or bury any horse, cattle, or animal of large dimensions in any place whatsoever other than the sanitary depot provided by the Local Board of Health, and no person shall transport or deposit such nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter from any place within the district to the said depot unless he be a nightman duly licensed as hereunder provided.

BY-LAW No. 9.

All depots or places of deposit shall be subject to the stringent supervision of the Local Board, and the Inspector shall inspect such depots or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 10.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say:—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited at the depot provided by the Local Board for such purpose, and if no such depot is provided, then in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

1. No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

2. No nightman shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

3. The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 13.

Regulating removal of nightsoil from depot.

No nightsoil or any human urine, whether mixed with other substances or not, or any solution of nightsoil shall be removed from any place or depot duly authorised for the reception, utilisation, or deposit of nightsoil or human urine without having been first subjected to a heat of not less than 212 degrees Fahrenheit for not less than fifteen minutes.

BY-LAW No. 14.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions.

The following shall be the conditions upon which licenses to remove nightsoil shall be issued:—

Penalty for breach.

- (a.) Every nightman shall remove all pans at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose, 5s.
- (b.) Substitute a clean pan for every pan removed, 5s.
- (c.) Place cleansed and tarred pans in their proper position for use, 5s.
- (d.) Clean or keep deodorised all pans, nightcarts, or other vehicles, 5s.
- (e.) Properly dispose of nightsoil as soon as it is deposited at the depot, 5s.
- (f.) Not deposit any load or parts thereof of any nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Local Board, £2.
- (g.) Close the door or gate of any yard or other means of ingress or egress used by the nightman or his employees, or the door of any closet which was closed when the nightman entered, 5s.
- (h.) Not permit any nightcart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during hours prohibited by Section 108, Police Act, 1892. 10s.
- (i.) Cleanse all public latrines in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing, 5s.
- (j.) Not spill the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises, 5s.
- (k.) Comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Local Board, 5s.
- (l.) Replace any pan when so ordered by the Local Board, 5s.
- (m.) Clean soiled pans, 5s.
- (n.) Not allow any refuse, rubbish, or slops for pigs to be removed in carts or receptacles or by other than those specially set apart for that purpose, 10s.
- (o.) Keep or cause to be kept books in accordance with the direction of the Local Board, 5s.
- (p.) Not collect any charge from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified in Schedule "A," 10s.

The penalties for breach of any of the foregoing conditions shall not be more than the respective amounts set forth at the conclusion of each such condition.

BY-LAW No. 15.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed—Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun, dust, and rain.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee of £1 for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 17.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store, unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.

2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of ten o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 19.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome; and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 20.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bonedust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 21.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall regularly collect all dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, and place the same in the said receptacle, and he shall not permit or suffer any receptacle to overflow or become offensive.

4. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, at least once a week, remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the depot or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

1. No person shall keep any swine within 100 feet of any house.

2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 23.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 24.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 25.

For the regulation of noxious or offensive trades.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of the Act, whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee, as set forth in Schedule "D" hereto, of the amount of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be linedashed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 26.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use, or cause to be used, any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or officer shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 28.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dunghill, to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or, if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

2. The occupier of any premises who shall remove or cause to be removed any filth, dust, paper, or vegetable matter, ashes, rubbish, or any offensive matter produced upon his premises shall not in the process of such removal deposit such filth, dust, rubbish, ashes, or offensive matter upon any footway, pavement, or carriage way.

3. For the purpose of such removal any person shall in every case use or cause to be used a suitable vessel or receptacle, cart or a carriage properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents thereof.

4. If in the process of such removal, any person shall slop, spill, or cause or allow to fall upon any pavement, footway, or road, or carriage-way any such filth, dust, ashes, rubbish, or any offensive matters, he shall forthwith remove the same and immediately after such removal thoroughly sweep or otherwise thoroughly cleanse such place.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper watertight vehicles or receptacles, fitted with close-fitting covers or lids, for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance used in any laundry, which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition, and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 34.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water, or other offensive liquid, and on garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing, shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district, other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 36.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rainwater.

BY-LAW No. 37.

Hospitals.

1. Every private hospital within the district of the said Local Board shall be registered, and shall obtain a license.

2. Every license and registration so granted and obtained shall, subject to the powers of the said Local Board to revoke or cancel the same, be in force for 12 calendar months from the date thereof, and every application for registration and for a license shall state the name and address of the applicant and the qualifications held by him, the situation of the premises proposed to be licensed, the number of rooms contained therein, the maximum number of patients proposed to be treated therein at any one time, the sanitary arrangements in connection with the said premises, the minimum number of nurses to be constantly employed therein; and such application shall also be accompanied by a plan of the buildings and premises, and by a certificate signed by the Inspector of the said Local Board, stating that the sanitary arrangements and the drainage of such premises are satisfactory.

3. The said Local Board shall have the power at any time to cancel or revoke any such license and registration, if, in the opinion of the Local Board, such private hospital endangers health by reason of any drainage connected or adjacent thereto, or by reason of any default in the observance of any By-law or order for the time being in force in the said district, or hereafter to come into force, or if, in the opinion of the said Local Board, either the building or the conduct or management thereof is undesirable to the interest of the public health, or if any complaint is made against any such registered hospital.

4. Any building or premises licensed as by this By-law directed shall, at all times, be open to the inspection of the Inspector or other officer of the Board, who may make any order or direction for the destruction or removal of refuse, and as to the appliances to be used in connection therewith, and any other order or direction regarding the sanitation or the management of the premises, as he or they may think fit.

BY-LAW No. 38.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty

not exceeding the sum of £10. and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

GOVERNMENT ASSAYS.

ASSAYS, Analyses, and Determinations of any Western Australian Ore or Rock will be made by the Assayer to the Geological Survey, *when not unduly interfering with official work*, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Each sample must weigh at least 6oz., but not more than 2lbs.
2. Each sample must be enclosed in a separate canvas bag or strong paper wrapper, with a slip of paper bearing the name and address of the sender, together with a private mark by which it may be readily identified.
3. The parcel must be forwarded *prepaid* to:—
