WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Municipal Institu-
tions Act, 1900," the Governor may, by proclamation,
divide any Municipality into Wards and define the
boundaries thereof: AND WHEREAS a Petition has been
presented to His Excellency the Governor praying that the
Municipality of Victoria Park be divided into three wards,
signed by not fewer than one-third of the persons on the
Municipal Roll of the said Municipality: AND WHEREAS
the said Petition was publicly advertised in the *Government
Gazette* on the 21st day of October, 1904: NOW THEREFORE
I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent
of the Executive Council, and by virtue of the powers so
vested in me by the said Act, hereby divide the said Mu-
nicipality into three wards, to be known as the East Ward,
the Central Ward, and the West Ward respectively, and
declare the boundaries of the said Wards to be as follow :—

EAST WARD.

Bounded by lines starting from the left bank of the Swan
River, at the North-West corner of Swan Location 34, and
extending in a South-Easterly direction, passing along the
North-East boundary of Swan Location 35 to the North-
West side of Brookman Road, Canning Location 2; thence
South-Westerly along the said North-West side to the
centre of the Perth-Bunbury Railway; thence North-
Westerly along the centre of the said railway to its inter-
section with the centre of the Guildford Road; thence
along the centre of the said road to its intersection with
the centre of the Perth-Albany Road; thence along the
centre of the said road to the left bank of the Swan River;
thence North-Easterly along the said left bank to the
commencing point.

CENTRAL WARD.

Bounded by lines commencing at the centre of the Perth-
Albany Road, at its intersection with the centre of the
Guildford Road; thence along the centre of the said Guild-
ford Road to its intersection with the centre of the Perth-
Bunbury Railway; thence South-Easterly along the centre
of the said railway to its intersection with the North-West
side of Brookman Road, and along it South-Westward to
the North side of Welshpool Road; thence Westerly along
the said North side and in a line with it to the centre of
the Perth-Albany Road; thence North-Westerly along the
centre of the said road to the commencing point.

WEST WARD.

Bounded by lines commencing at the left bank of the
Swan River, at its intersection with the centre of the Perth-
Albany Road; thence South-Easterly along the centre of
the said road to its intersection with the line of North side
of Welshpool Road; thence Westerly to the West side of
the said Perth-Albany Road and along it South-South-
Easterly to the North-West boundary of Subdivision E of
Canning Location 2, and along it and that of Subdivision L
South-Westerly to the North corner of Canning Location
328; thence South-Westerly along its North-West boundary
and that of Location 65 to the lower Canning Bridge Road,
and Westerly along its North side to the East boundary of
Canning Location 37; thence North to the South-West
boundary of Reserve 3694, and along it North-Westerly to

the South-East boundary of Swan Location 39; thence
North-East, passing along the South-East boundaries of
Swan Locations 39, 38A, and 38B to the South-West bound-
ary of Swan Location 37; thence South-Eastward and
North-Eastward, passing along part of the South-West and
South-East boundaries of said Location 37 to the South-

WHEREAS by Section 159 of "The Local Courts Act, 1904," it is provided that there shall be payable, in respect of every proceeding in a Local Court, such Court fees and Bailiffs' fees as the Governor may from time to time prescribe: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct that, on and after the coming into operation of the said Act, the Court fees prescribed by Section 1 of 51 Victoria, No. 10, and by Order in Council made under Section 119 of the Small Debts Ordinance, 1863, and dated the 16th day of June, 1897, and the Bailiffs' fees prescribed by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of October, 1897, and the 23rd day of August, 1899, respectively, shall be charged and payable as the Court fees and Bailiffs' fees payable under the Local Courts Act, 1904, in all actions and other proceedings in the Local Courts until further order.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time prohibit the importation into the State of any stock, or may permit the importation, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he may see fit: AND WHEREAS an Order in Council and Regulations permitting the importation of stud boars were made on the 25th day of May, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd day of June, 1904, and continue in force: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to revoke the said Order in Council and Regulations: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in any Order in Council or Regulations made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," to the contrary, the importation of all swine from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, and the Colony of New Zealand, into the State of Western Australia, is prohibited until further notice.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve ¹⁰³³⁹₉₅₇₆, for "Temporary Common" at Williams, should be placed under the control of the Williams Road Board as a Board of Management: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Williams Road Board as a Board of Management, subject to the right on the part of the Crown to dispose of lots comprised in the Reserve without notice or compensation; and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

The Regulations of the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, dated the 24th day of July, 1903, and which came into force on the 1st day of September, 1903, are hereby amended as follows:—

By repealing Regulation No. 97 and enacting the following new Regulation in lieu thereof:—

No. 97 (Amended).

Vessels calling in distress, for orders, supplies, etc.—No harbour dues payable to the Trust under these Regulations, with the exception of a special payment of half the ruling pilotage rates, up to a maximum of £10 per entry into the Port, shall be paid by vessels arriving—

- (a.) In distress, for the purpose of being docked or refitted or repaired, or filling up coal bunkers only; or
- (b.) Merely calling for orders or provisions without discharging or taking on board any cargo or passengers; or
- (c.) Employed solely in mission work in connection with some religious body; or
- (d.) Employed solely as a pleasure yacht, and not engaged in trading or plying for hire.

By repealing Regulation No. 141 and enacting the following new Regulation in lieu thereof:—

No. 141 (amended).

Regulations to be enforced.—The following Regulations shall be enforced:—

- (a.) No vessel shall be fastened to any part of such wharves or jetties except to such bollards or other fastening as are or may be provided for the purpose; and no vessel shall lie alongside such wharves or jetties unless properly moored. All vessels so fastened shall also be anchored or moored in such a manner as to relieve such wharves or jetties as much as possible from the weight of such craft.
- (b.) No vessel shall be moored or so fastened as aforesaid except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period during the authorised hours than shall be reasonably required for such purpose
- (c.) Passenger boats may lie alongside the steps at any such wharves or jetties for such time as may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers.
- (d.) All vessels lying alongside any such wharves or jetties shall, on the approach thereto of a passenger steamer, be hauled off, if required, to a sufficient distance to enable such passenger steamer to disembark or embark passengers.

- (e.) Any steam vessel plying on the coast of this State shall be permitted to lie alongside any wharf or jetty for the purpose of discharging and taking in cargo at all hours of the day and night consistent with these Regulations.
- (f.) In no case shall more than one tier of vessels lie alongside or be moored or fastened to any wharf or jetty or to any other vessel lying alongside moored or fastened to any wharf or jetty, without the special permission of the Harbour Master, except in the case of steam tugs, hulks, and lighters engaged or about to engage in towing or the loading or unloading of cargo, and in respect of which a general or special permission so to do shall have been obtained from the Trust.
- (g.) The Trust may, from time to time, give such general or special permission aforesaid and revoke the same.
- (h.) All vessels lying alongside any of the wharves or jetties shall provide and use suitable fenders, and shall likewise take such precaution as may be necessary to prevent injury to the structure.
- (i.) All foreign-going vessels shall be moored alongside the wharves and jetties in such position as may be indicated by the Harbour Master, who may, if necessary, direct the removal of other craft for that purpose.
- (j.) Such portions of the wharves as may from time to time be decided upon by the Harbour Master shall be allotted respectively to all vessels. A list shall be kept by the Harbour Master, and applications to be placed in turn on such lists, according to date of the arrival of the vessel in port, must be made at his office. If such application be not made, the next vessel on the list shall have precedence, but the vessel forfeiting her turn may be placed next in succession.
- (k.) In the event of any vessel or vessels being moored alongside any of the wharves or jetties in such a way as to exclude any other vessel or vessels whose owners or masters wish also to moor her to them alongside, consistently with these Regulations, the Harbour Master may order the removal of such vessel or vessels to another berth or berths, and such vessel or vessels shall forthwith be removed accordingly.
- (l.) When the Harbour Master may deem it unsafe, through stress of weather, for a vessel to remain alongside any wharf or jetty, he shall direct the immediate removal of such vessel, and the master or other person in charge of such vessel shall remove such vessel accordingly.
- (m.) The Harbour Master shall have full power at any time to reserve any berth he may consider most suitable at the wharves for any man-of-war, or for any British or foreign mail steamer trading between Europe or America and the Australasian States.

BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE
ROADS BOARD.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned:

The North-East Coolgardie Roads Board, being the Roads Board for the District of North-East Coolgardie, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Acts and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

INTERPRETATION.

1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

"District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the North-East Coolgardie Roads Board.

"Board."—The North-East Coolgardie Roads Board.

"Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Member."—A member of the Board.

"Secretary."—The Secretary of the Board.

"The Act."—The Roads Act of 1902, and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.

"Road or Reserve."—A road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

The word "street" shall mean and include every public street, road, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district, which the public are permitted to use.

"Footpath or footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

The word "person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.

2. Duties of Secretary.

- (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend all committees.
- (c.) To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of committees.
- (d.) To conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) To answer all questions on the Board's business.
- (f.) To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheets prepared and published yearly in the *Government Gazette*, and at least one newspaper circulating in the district.
- (g.) To supervise the preparation of the rate-books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.
- (h.) To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
- (i.) The Secretary shall keep the cash-book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be written up every month ready for inspection of the Board, or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.
- (j.) He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding £5 in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that with all returns made the heels of the receipt-book accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the corporation; he shall report to the Board, at their next meeting, any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (k.) He shall pay into the bank, within 48 hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him (amounting in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or upwards) on behalf of the Board.

- (l.) He shall have the bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce it at each meeting thereof, or should any member desire to see it at any time during office hours the Secretary shall produce it for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board, except by or through the Secretary. The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board, and not herein specified.

- (m.) The office hours of the Board shall be from 9 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m., on week days, and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturdays, during which time the office shall be kept open.

Supervisor's Duties.

3. The duties of the Supervisor shall be—

- (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary.
- (b.) To have proper plans and specifications prepared for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts, buildings or premises under the control of the Board situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed; lay out such work as to height, line, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all plans and specifications to the Board before tenders are called.
- (c.) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways are properly carried out.
- (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience, insubordination, and found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
- (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
- (g.) To attend all Board and Committee meetings if required.
- (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year.
- (i.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or oftener if required, to the Board returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Appointment of Officers.

4. No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS.

Notice of Meetings.

5. Notice shall be given by the Secretary or Chairman of ordinary or special meetings at least 24 hours before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside.

6. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—ordinary and special. Ordinary meetings are those appointed by the Board from time to time and those called by the Chairman as often as seems proper for the transaction of the Board's business. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No other business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

7. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the 81st section of the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting of the Board unless at least three of the members, inclusive of the Chairman, are present, or a member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence.

8. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

9. At all meetings of the Board when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there is less than a quorum present), such circumstance, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute-book.

10. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

11. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at any time.

Voting.

12. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Meeting.

13. In addition to the minute-book prescribed to be kept by the 90th Section of the Act, a rough minute-book shall be kept in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary subsequent meeting.

Order of Business.

14. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence out and in, and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (e.) Presentations of petitions or memorials and committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

Petitions.

15. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

16. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for that purpose.

Speaker must not digress.

17. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

18. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn, unless by the consent of the Board.

19. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

20. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

21. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

22. When an amendment is carried the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Appointment of Committee.

23. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or by a resolution of the Board. No business shall be transacted unless three members at least are present. (See Section 88 of "Roads Act.")

Finance Accounts.

24. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque, except in cases of day labour, wages for which may be paid fortnightly on the certificate of the Supervisor of Works and Secretary, indorsed by the Chairman, and which must be confirmed at next ordinary meeting.

25. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may direct, and all moneys received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by the Government) shall be paid into such Bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, together with the signature of the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within two days after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary.

26. Moneys granted by the Government shall be paid to the Board's credit at Treasury, and shall only be operated upon to pay actual creditors for work executed in accordance with Government regulations.

Urgent Work.

27. The Chairman, with one member, may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

28. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

For the prevention and abatement of Nuisances.

29. Abattoirs or slaughter-houses shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called abattoirs or slaughter-houses, and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.

30. No owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within the district shall allow any impure water or any foul liquid matter of any description to flow from such land or premises into or upon the street, footway, or gutter, so as to become or likely to become a nuisance, and no person shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any foul liquid matter of any description, so as to become or likely to become a nuisance, and any person so doing shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

31. No owner, occupier, manager, or other person in charge of any land or premises shall allow water from any shaft to flow into, upon, or across any road, footway, or gutter without the permission of the Board first had and obtained, and any person so doing shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and to the cost of repairing any such road, footway, or gutter damaged by reason of allowing water to flow as aforesaid.

32. Any officer or member of the Board may from time to time visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard, or other place for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed, and the same must be kept thoroughly clean, to the satisfaction of such officer or member of the Board.

33. The occupier of any house outside the limit of the jurisdiction and control of the Local Board of Health shall have upon the premises a pit for the purpose of containing deposits of night-soil, urine, and household refuse matter; such pit to be of not less than eight feet deep, and of not less than two feet by three feet sections, and such pits shall be filled in before the accumulations of deposits reach within two feet of the surface.

34. No person shall leave the carcass of any dead animal so so as to become or likely to become a nuisance in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcass, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty of not more than £10, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial of such animal.

35. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done or allowed to be done, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20:—

- (a.) Riding or driving cattle, horses, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow or driving any carriage upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.
- (d.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (e.) Causing a nuisance by allowing any nightsoil or any other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
- (f.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (g.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building or any wall, fence, lamp-post or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (h.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (i.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smells or otherwise is caused.
- (j.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking-in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or obstructing any footpath or carriage-road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.

- (k.) Having any awning on any footpath in any public street or thoroughfare, not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (l.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any public place, without the permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (m.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (n.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any entire horse for show, hire, or sale.
- (o.) Making cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (p.) The plying for hire by any carts or vehicles without a license.

General regulation of traffic.

36. (a.) No person shall, within the district of the Roads Board for the North-East Coolgardie District, have control of or attend to more than one dray, wagon, van, cart, or other carriage whatsoever drawn by more than one horse or other animal whilst on, or proceeding, or being drawn along any road or track within the said District.

(b.) No person shall, within the said District, have control of or attend to more than two drays, wagons, vans, carts, or other carriages whatsoever, each one being drawn by not more than one horse or other animal whilst on or proceeding, or being drawn along any road or track within the said District.

(c.) No driver of a dray, wagon, van, cart, or other carriage whatsoever shall, within the said district, ride therein without having some person on foot to guide the same (such as are drawn by horses, and properly driven with reins only excepted). No driver of any dray, wagon, van, cart, or other carriage whatsoever shall be at such a distance, or in such a situation whilst it shall be passing upon any road or track in the said district that he cannot have the direction or government of the horses or other animals drawing the same.

(d.) Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

37. Every person having the care or conduct of any cart, carriage, or other vehicle shall keep the same on the left side or near side of the road, except in cases of actual necessity or sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person, cart, or carriage passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

38. Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise, shall, in or upon any road within the district, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

39. The driver of every vehicle, or the rider of every horse or other animal, turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

40. Any driver of a camel or camels on any street neglecting to draw off on the approach of a vehicle shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Registration of Camels, and licensing of Drivers.

41. (a.) No person shall use, own, or keep, within the North-East Coolgardie Roads Board District, hereinafter referred to as the "District," any unregistered camel.

(b.) Registration shall be effected annually under these By-laws, unless the camel is registered under the By-laws of another road district.

(c.) Application for registration shall be in the Form A in the Schedule, addressed to the Secretary of the Board.

(d.) The fees payable on registration shall be, for cow or gelded camel, 10s., bull camel, 20s.

(e.) A certificate of registration will be granted in the Form B in the Schedule.

(f.) Every registration shall expire on the 31st day of December next following the date of registration.

(g.) Every person in charge of any camel shall produce the certificate of registration of each camel whenever required so to do by any person acting with the authority of the Board.

(h.) Every unregistered camel found within the district may be seized and sold, or destroyed, by any person acting under the authority of the Board.

(i.) Every camel-driver shall be licensed.

(j.) A camel-driver's license shall be in the Form C in the Schedule.

(k.) Every camel-driver's license shall expire on the 31st of December next following the issue thereof.

(l.) The fee payable for a camel-driver's license shall be five shillings.

(m.) The number of draught or pack camels driven by any one driver shall not exceed eleven (11).

(n.) Every camel-driver shall produce his license for inspection whenever required so to do by any officer or other person acting with the authority of the Board.

To provide for the licensing of bicycles, tricycles, and motor cars.

42. (a.) No person shall ride any bicycle, tricycle, or motor car within the district of the North-East Coolgardie Roads Board without first having obtained a license.

(b.) Licensing fee for bicycles and tricycles. 5s. per annum.

(c.) Licensing fees for motor cars, five shillings per annum.

(d.) Bicycles, tricycles, and motor cars licensed after 30th June in any year will be only charged half fees.

(e.) All licenses expire on 31st December next following the issue thereof.

Requiring all licensed vehicles to have Number of license and name of Board affixed to vehicle.

43. Every owner of a licensed vehicle shall have the number of the license and the name of Board granting same legibly painted on the off side of such vehicle.

44. Every rider of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor car shall have his license number affixed on some conspicuous part of his bicycle, tricycle, or motor car.

To prevent accidents from riding, etc., of bicycles, tricycles, motor cars, etc.

45. Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, other velocipede or motor car, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, or motor car.

46. No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.

47. No person shall, within the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.

48. Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

49. No person shall leave any cycle in or on any street or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested so to do by any constable or officer or member of the Board.

50. No person shall pass, at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour, any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

51. When a cyclist meets any horse or animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and remain dismounted until such horse or animal has been passed.

52. No person shall ride a cycle round the corners formed by the intersection of any streets in the district at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

To prevent and prohibit any animals suffering from infectious or contagious diseases from polluting water.

53. Any owner of an animal suffering from any infectious or contagious disease and allowing such animal to pollute the water at any public watering place shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To prevent trees from falling across any road or track.

54. No persons shall make or leave a fire by the road or track side without taking proper precaution against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

55. No person shall set fire to standing trees on the road or track side, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

To prevent damages to footpaths, bicycle paths, and other property of the Board.

56. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, or destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board.

57. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

58. No person shall damage, injure, or obstruct any bicycle path in the Board's district by travelling on same with any horse, dray, wagon, or any other animals drawing vehicles, or by placing firewood or boughs on same, or by any other means; and any person upon conviction of having infringed this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

59. No person shall dig for or remove any gravel within the district without first obtaining permission from the Board, and also paying any fee or license that may be decided upon,

Penalties.

60. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

61. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty or fine not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Roads Board of the North-East Coolgardie District, subject to and by and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the said North-East Coolgardie Roads Board District from the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
