By His Excellency Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by the provisions of Section 5 of "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, from time to time divide the State into Districts, with such boundaries as he may think convenient, and may assign to any District a name by which it shall be known, for the purposes of the said Act, and may, in like manner, from time to time alter the boundaries of any District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me on that behalf, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the several Districts named in the Schedule hereto, with the boundaries therein stated, as Districts within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act.

#### THE SCHEDULE.

South-Western.

Starting from a cairn and pole at the mouth of the Murchison River; thence Easterly along the left bank of said river to a spot opposite Bompas Hill; thence South-South-Easterly about 60 miles through said Bompas Hill to South-Easterly about 60 miles through said Bompas Hill to Tallering Peak, being the Western corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence South-Easterly 55\(^1\_4\) miles to Mugga Mugga Hill, and again South-Easterly 84\(^1\_2\) miles to Mt. Gibson along the South-Western boundary of said Yalgoo Goldfield; thence East 84\(^3\_4\) miles along the South boundary of said Yalgoo Goldfield to the North-Western corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield; thence South 203\(^3\_4\) miles along the Western boundary and to the South Western corner of the South boundary and to the South Western corner of said Western boundary and to the South-Western corner of said Yilgarn Goldfield; thence East 823 miles along the Southern boundary and to the South-Eastern corner of said Yilgarn Goldfield, being a point on the Western boundary of the Dundas Goldfield; thence South 18 miles along part of the Western boundary to the South-Western corner of the said Dundas Geldfield; thence East 68 miles along the boundary between Dundas Goldfield and Phillips River Goldfield to the North-Eastern corner of said Phillips River Goldfield; thence South 33 miles to the South-Eastern corner of said Phillips River Goldfield; thence East about 166 miles to the Southern coast; thence by the said Southern coast line in a general Western direction to Cape Leeuwin, and by the Indian Ocean in a general Northerly direction to the starting point on the Murchison River, including all islands adjacent thereto.

#### Yilgarn.

Bounded by lines starting from a point 90 miles South of a cairn H26 on Koorarawalye Granite Rock, and extending West to a point due South of a point 10 miles West of a cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence North to the South-East corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield; thence East-South-East to a point about 50 miles due West from a cairn marked NB 1, near Wangine Soak; thence South through the before-mentioned cairn H26 to the starting point.

#### COOLGARDIE.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield (which is a point about 50 miles West from a cairn marked NB 1, near Wangine Soak), and extending South about 118 miles through a cairn H 26 on Koorarawalye Granite Rock; thence East about 133 miles through the summit of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak, on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Roads; thence North about 48 miles to a point 35 miles East of the South-East corner of Hampton Plains Location 48; thence West 35 miles to the South-East corner of the above-mentioned Location; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of Location 48. Westerly 443 chains 91 links, Northerly 564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of that Location Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains. Westerly 119 chains 87 links to the South-West corner of Location 51; thence Northerly 400 chains along the Western boundary of Location 51 and the Eastern boundary of Location 53 to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along a surveyed line 325° de' 36 miles 14 chains 81 links; thence North 30 miles 47 chains 46 links along a surveyed line to a tree R3 near the Cane Grass Swamp on the 90-Mile Road; thence Westerly to a cairn marked NB 1 near Wangine Soak; thence Westerly about 50 miles to the starting point.

Commencing at the South-East corner of the Coolgardie Goldfield, thence East about 42½ miles, thence South about 66 miles; thence West about 173 miles, passing through the 75-mile post on the Dundas-Esperance Road; thence North about 66 miles to the South-West corner of the said Coolgardie Goldfield; thence East about 132<sup>1</sup><sub>2</sub> miles along its Southern boundary to the starting point. Containing about 11,500 square miles.

#### EAST COOLGARDIE.

Bounded by lines starting from a mile post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield, 40 miles Southerly from Survey Station R3, and extending 1444 46' 26 miles 62 chains 37 links along a surveyed line to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of Location 53 and the Western boundary of Location 51 to the South-West corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries of that location Easterly 119 chains 87 links, Northerly 60 chains, Easterly 160 chains to a point on the Western boundary of Location 18, there along the supported boundary of Location 18, there along the supported boundary of Location 48; thence along the surveyed boundaries of Location 48 Southerly 564 chains 87 links; Easterly 443 chains 91 links to the South-East corner of that location; thence Easterly about 7 miles 65 chains to a point South of the South-East corner of Location 45; thence North to the said corner; thence North along the Eastern boundary of Location 45, 4 miles to its North-East corner; thence about 342° 10′ about 1 mile 64 chains to the South-East corner of Location 44; thence along the Eastern boundary of Location 44 to its North-East corner; thence about 321° 35′ about 30 miles 53 chains to a point bearing about 54° 50′ from the 40-Mile post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence about 234° 50′ about 14½ miles to the starting point.

#### NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE.

Starting from a point situate about 17 miles 30 chains East of Survey Station R3; thence South about 29 miles 70 chains to the most Northerly corner of the East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence about 141° 35′ about 30 miles 53 chains to the North-East corner of Location 54; thence along the Eastern boundary of that Location to its South-Eastern corner; thence about 162° 10' about 1 mile 64 chains to the North-East corner of Location 45; thence along the Eastern boundary of that Location to its South-Eastern corner; thence South to a point 7 miles 65 chains East from the South-East corner of Location 48; thence East about 27 miles 15 chains; thence South about 48 miles to the South-Eastern corner of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence East to the 125th meridian of East longitude; thence North along that meridian to a point East of Survey Station R3 aforesaid; thence West to the starting point.

### Broad Arrow.

Starting from Survey Station R3, thence East about 17 miles 30 chains to a point North of the most Northerly corner of the East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence South about 29 miles 70 chains to that corner; thence about 234° 50' 14\(\frac{1}{2}\) miles to the 40-mile post on part of the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence about 234° 46' 9 miles 32 chains 44 links; thence North 30 miles 47 chains 56 links to the starting point.

#### NORTH COOLGARDIE.

Bounded by lines starting from the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield, being the S.W. corner of the East Murchison Goldfield, and situate about 12 miles East and 5 miles South from Trig. Station K75 on Wyemandoo Hill, and extending South to the South-East corner of the Yalgoo Goldfield, which is a point due East from Mt. Gibson, near Lake Moore, and due North of a spot 10 miles West of a cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence E.S.E. to a point about 50 miles due West from a cairn marked NBI, near Wangine Soak; thence East to Survey Station NBI; thence about 87° 20 miles 22 chains to Survey Station R3; thence East to the 125th meridian East longitude; thence North along that meridian to a point East of tree marked BS2 at Brickey's Soak; thence West through the said tree to a spot about 764 miles West from it, and 13 miles North and 15 miles East from the summit of Mt. Ida; thence North about 31 miles to the South boundary of the East Murchison Goldfields and West to the starting point.

#### MT. MARGARET.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of East Murchison G.F.; thence East about 200 miles to the 125th meridian of East Longitude; thence South about 210 miles; thence West along part of the North boundary of the North Coolgardie G.F., passing through tree marked B82 at Brickey's Soak about 262½ miles; thence North about 31 miles along the boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield to the boundary of the East Murchison Goldfield; thence East about 6 miles; thence North passing through the 24 mile post on the Lawlers to Leonora telegraph line about 24½ miles; thence East about 62 miles passing through Survey mark AN62; thence North about 154 miles and passing through a point about 9 miles West of Trig. Station J.H.R. 58 on the summit of Mt. Waite to the starting point.

#### EAST MURCHISON.

Bounded by lines starting from the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield situate about 4½ miles East and about 4 miles South from Trig. Station K75 on Wyemandoo Hill, and extending North-Easterly along the East boundary of the Murchison Goldfield about 162 miles to the summit of Mt. Russell; thence North about 33 miles along the East boundary of the Peak Hill Goldfield; thence East about 124 miles; thence South along the West boundary of the Mt. Margaret Goldfield (and passing through a point about 9 miles West of Trig. Station JHR58 on the summit of Mt. Waite) about 154 miles; thence West about 62 miles (passing through survey mark AN62); thence South about 24½ miles (passing through the 24-mile post on the Lawlers-Leonora Telegraph line); thence West passing along part of the Northern boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield about 130 miles to the starting point.

#### Murchison.

Starting from the summit of Mt. Murchison and extending North-Eastward to the summit of Mt. Hale; thence East-South-Eastward to the summit of Mt. Russell; thence South-South-Westward to the North-West corner of the North Coolgardie Goldfield; thence West-North-Westward to the summit of Wyemandoo Hill, and onwards to Trig. Station K6, on Goonahmondey Peak; thence North-Westward to the summit of Mt. Farmer, and onwards to the summit of Mt. Luke, and onwards to the summit of Mt. Murchison.

#### Yalgoo.

Starting from the summit of Mt. Murchison and extending West-South-Westerly to the summit of Tallering Peak; thence South-Easterly to the summit of Mugga Mugga Hill, and onwards to the summit of Mt. Gibson, which lies about 12 miles South-West from Ningham Creek; thence Eastward to Trig. Station K83, on the Western shore of Lake Moore; thence due East to the North-West corner of Yilgarn Goldfield; thence North along the Western boundary of the North Coolgardie Goldfield to its North-West corner; thence West-North-Westward to the summit of Wyemandoo Hill, and onwards to Trig. Station K6 on Goonahmondey Peak; thence North-Westward to the summit of Mt. Farmer, and onwards to the summit of Mt. Luke, and onwards to the summit of Mt. Murchison.

#### PEAK HILL.

Starting from an angle in the Northern boundary of the Murchison Goldfield, at the summit of Mt. Hale, and extending along the said boundary in an East-South-Easterly direction to another angle at the summit of Mt. Russell; thence due North to the North-Westerly corner of the East Murchison Goldfield, latitude being on the 26th parallel of South latitude; thence in a Northerly direction to Trig. Station L15 on Wonyulgunna Hill; thence in a North-Westerly direction to the summit of Mt. Bresnahan, between the Angelo River and the Upper Ashburton; thence in a South-Westerly direction to Trig. Station K20 on a peak near the source of the Lyons River; thence still South-Westerly to the summit of Mt. Gascoyne; thence South-South-Easterly to the starting point on the summit of Mt. Hale.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the following purposes:—For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spreading of such disease; for prescribing the manner in which persons coming into contact with infected stock, and land, premises, or conveyances travelled over or used by infected stock, shall be cleaned and disinfected; for the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and disposal of stock whilst in quarantine, or in transit thereto or therefrom; for prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined, and generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. It is the duty of the owner of poultry infected with tick, within twenty-four hours of the time when he shall have discovered or suspected such poultry to be infected, to give written notice thereof to the nearest Inspector, and thenceforth to keep such poultry from coming into contact with other poultry until otherwise ordered by the Inspector (see 59 Vict., No. 34, Section 11).
- 2. If an Inspector shall discover on any premises poultry infected, or suspected of being infected with tick, he may serve upon the owner of such poultry a notice in the form or to the effect of the schedule hereto.
- 3. It shall be a sufficient ground to suspect that poultry are infected with tick if tick is found in or about the fowl-houses used by such poultry, or the appurtenances used in connection with such fowl-houses.
- 4. During the fourteen days next following the service of such notice it shall be unlawful for any person to remove any poultry from the premises referred to in such notice.
- 5. Within the fourteen days next following the service of such notice the following steps shall be taken by the owner of such poultry for cleansing and disinfecting the premises and preventing the spreading of such disease, that is to say:—
  - (a.) All fowl-houses and the appurtenances used in connection therewith shall be dismantled or treated in such manner as directed by the Inspector, and all visible ticks destroyed.
  - (b.) All material with which such fowl-houses and appurtenances were constructed shall then (if not destroyed by fire) be saturated with boiling water, and in order that all ticks and their germs hidden in crevices may be destroyed, thoroughly saturated with a three per cent. solution of carbolic acid and water, tar, or other effective destroyer.

- (c.) Should the fowl-houses be in close proximity to or attached to fencing, such fencing must be treated in a similar manner.
- (d.) The whole of the ground area of infected houses, etc., must be strewn to a thickness of half-inch with fresh quick-lime, and then slacked with water, also the ground within three feet of each side of infected fencing must be treated in a given water. similar manner.
- 6. If the owner of any poultry shall make default in taking such steps as aforesaid, pursuant to such notice, all work that the Inspector shall deem necessary to be done to comply therewith may be undertaken by or under the direction of the Inspector, and the expenses incurred shall be recoverable in a summary way at the suit of such In-spector before any Justice of the Peace.
- 7. All fowl-houses and the appurtenances in connection therewith which shall be dismantled in accordance with Clause (a.) hereof shall not be re-erected unless the same shall be constructed in such manner as to prevent the harbouring of tick, and shall be provided with tick-proof perches to the satisfaction of the Inspector.
- 8. Any person committing any breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall, for every offence, be liable, in addition to any expense incurred under Regulation 6, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The Board of Management of the Bridgetown Common The Board of Management of the Bridgetown Common (Reserve No. 305, Nelson), by virtue of the powers conferred by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of December, 1899, and made pursuant to Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," hereby repeals the By-laws numbered 2, 4, 5, and 10, made on the 26th day of December, 1899, and approved on the 15th day of March, 1900; and in lieu thereof the following By-laws are hereby made for the control and management of the gold common resemble. ment of the said common reserve:

- No person shall depasture stock on the common without a license under these Regulations
- 2. No license, except for working bullocks, shall be granted to a y person who does not reside upon or own or occupy land within the outer boundaries of the common.
- 3. Licenses shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board of Management, and shall be issued by the Collector
- The fee for every license shall be-For every working bullock, 2s. per head per annum; for every other head of stock, except as provided by By-law 7, 5s. per head per
- 5. No license shall be issued for cattle other than milking cows and working bullocks, and no person shall be licensed or allowed to depasture more than five (5) head of milking cows or one team of working bullocks at one time. Each (ow shall have attached to it a disc bearing the number of license, and shall be yarded from sunset to sunrise.
- 6. No person shall be licensed to keep more than three horses on the common at a time.
- 7. Sheep for killing for use in the Town of Bridgetown depastured on the common, shall be kept on the south side of the Blackwood River, and no person shall be licensed to depasture more than one hundred sheep at one time. The fee for depasturing sheep under this Regulation shall be threepence (3d.) per head.
- 8. All fees shall be paid in advance on the issue of the license, and shall be expended by the Board of Management in improvements to the Town of Bridgetown.

- 9. These Regulations shall not apply to travelling sheep, but no travelling sheep shall be allowed on the common for more than one night without the sanction, in writing, of the
- 10. No animal shall be depastured, or allowed to remain upon the common, which shall be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease; any animal found to be so sufficient shall be sufficiently in the state of the sufficient of the sufficie suffering shall be forthwith removed by the owner, and on his default the Board shall have power to remove or destroy such animal, and to burn or dispose of its carcase, and to recover, in addition to any penalty, the cost and expense of so doing from the owner thereof. If any animal shall die upon the common, its carcase shall forthwith be removed by the owner, and on his default the Board shall have power to remove, burn, or dispose of such carcase, and to recover the cost and expense of so doing from the owner thereof.

Any person acting contrary to these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 (five pounds), or £2 (two pounds) a day for a continuing breach, but not exceeding in the aggregate £20 (twenty pounds).

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), and "The Cemeteries Act, 1899" (63rd Vict., No. 38), for the management of the Moora Public Cemetery (Reserve  $\frac{\Lambda}{6603}$ ).

#### PUBLIC CEMETERY, MOORA, W.A. By-Laws.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Moora, W.A., the said Trustees make the following By-laws:

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least six working hours as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.
- 6. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet 6 inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

- 8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.
  - 9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:-
    - 1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.
    - 1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- 11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.
- 12. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- 13. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery nor any fireworks discharged therein.
  - 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- 16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever; and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 20. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 21. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the
- 22. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 23. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced,

- 24. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."
- 25. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 26. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- 27. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 28. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two preceding By laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 29. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in, broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
  - 30. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 31. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, shall be removed from the Cemetery.
- 32. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—  $\,$ 
  - (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
  - (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
  - (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
  - (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

#### BY-LAWS OF THE CANNING ROAD BOARD.

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Canning Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

#### Interpretation.

- 1. In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say—
  - "Board"—The Canning Road Board.
  - "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
  - "Cycle "-A bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
  - "Cyclist"—Any person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any
  - "District"—The District under the jurisdiction of the Canning Road Board.
  - "Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or other-
  - "Member"—A member of the Board, and includes the Chairman.
  - "Motor"—Any vehicle, not including traction engines or steam road rollers, moved or propelled by other than animal power.
  - "Occupier"—The inhabitant occupier of any land within the District, and if there be no occupier the person entitled to the possession thereof.
  - "Owner" includes the person, other than the King, for the time being entitled to receive the rent of the land, whether on his own account or as trustee, attorney, or agent for any other person, or who would be entitled to receive the rent if the land were let at a rent.
  - "Person" includes a Corporation, sole or aggregate.
  - "Road"—Any land under the control of the Board, and notified in the Government Gazette as a road; also any public highway, bridge, culvert, ferry, ford, gate, building, or other thing appertaining thereto.
  - "Reserve"—Any land under the control of the Board, and notified in the Government Gazette as a reserve.
  - "Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.
  - "The Act"—"The Roads Act, 1902," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.
  - "Vehicle"—Any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, or other conveyance whatsoever (not being a hand cart), with or without springs.

#### DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

- 2. The duties of Secretary shall be-
  - (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
  - (b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
  - (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees.
  - (d.) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
  - (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business
  - (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the Government Gazette and at least in one newspaper circulating in the district, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
  - (g.) Prepare and place before the Board the quarterly financial statement at the end of each quarter of the financial year, and enter the same on the minutes, as required by the Act.

- (h.) Supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's Electoral lists; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution.
- (i.) Summon the members to Board and Committee meet-
- (i.) Keep all books entered up to date in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
- (k.) Check all accounts sent into the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board's officers, and to see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.
- (l.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (m.) Have the bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meeting of the Board, and to produce it and also a banker's certificate and an approximate balance sheet, showing as nearly as possible the financial position of the Board as regard payments already made at each meeting thereof, and to any member of the Board desiring to see the same or any of them at any time during office hours. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, as directed by the Board, and the Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (o.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.

# Supervisor's Duties.

- 3. The duties of the Supervisor shall be-
  - (a.) To promptly attend to all instructions received through the Secretary, in respect of the following matters:—
  - (b.) To prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads, bridges, culverts. buildings, or premises under the control of the Board situate within the District; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed, lay out such work as to height, lines, levels, and dimensions, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called the Board before tenders are called.
  - (c.) To see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out.
  - (d.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience or insubordination, or found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
  - (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
  - (f.) To see that all officers under his control carry out their duties efficiently, and to report any departure therefrom.
  - (g.) To attend all Board and Committee meetings if required.
  - (h.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year, or as required by the Board.
  - (i.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control: to supply monthly, or oftener if required, to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks

# APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS.

- 4. No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. In the event of there being more than one applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by ballot so as to obtain an absolute majority of the members present.
- 5. The election of all other officers shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded, in which case the procedure in the foregoing By-law shall be followed.

#### MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

- 6. Notice shall be given in writing or posted on the Board's notice board, by the Chairman or Secretary, of ordinary meetings at least three days before such meetings, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present as the case way, he shall precide members present, as the case may be, shall preside.
- 7. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting, for which seven days' notice shall be given—vide Clause 81 of the Roads Act. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called
- 8. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Cannington, fortnightly, at 7:30 o'clock, p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.
- A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.
- 10. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.
- 11. At all meetings of the Board where there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute-book.
- 12. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view to their confirmation.

#### VOTING.

13. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

# MINUTES AND MEETINGS.

14. The minute-book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

# Order of Business.

- 15. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :—  $\,$ 
  - (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).
  - (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
  - (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out) and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
  - (d.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and Committee reports and consideration thereof.
  - (e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
  - (f.) General business.
  - (q.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- 16. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders and, it agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all ather.
- Any member wishing to rescind any motion carried at any previous meeting shall give to the Secretary at least seven days notice of his intention to move such reseission, particulars which shall be posted on the notice board.

#### PETITIONS.

18. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereot, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same. presenting the same.

#### TENDERS.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for the purpose

#### ORDERS OF DEBATE.

Speakers must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

#### MOTIONS AND AMENDMENTS.

- $-21. \ \ \,$  A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be with drawn unless by consent of the Board.
- 22. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.
- A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
- 24. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- 25. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.
- No member shall speak twice on the same subject except 20. No member shall speak twice on the same subject except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last carried motion; nevertheless any member who may have been misunderstood or misrepresented shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

#### APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE.

The Board may at any time appoint three or more 27. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of a Committee shall comprise two members.

# FINANCE COMMITTEE AND FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

- 28. A Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such Committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day.
- 29. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.
- after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.

  30. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of money granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more men-bers of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or to any other responsible officer if directed by the Board.

# URGENT WORKS.

31. The Chairman with one member, or in the absence of the Chairman any two members, may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £10. Any one member is empowered to authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding Two pounds ten shillings in cases of very urgent necessity upon "declared roads," but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

#### UNAUTHORISED EXPENDITURE.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any Committee, or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

# PREVENTION OF NUISANCES.

- Any person who--
  - Any person who—
    (1.) Shall keep or cause to be kept any abattoir, slaughter-house, pigstye, manure works, works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fellmongery, tannery, wool-scouring establishment, glue factory, soap or candle works, fish-curing establishments, place for stering, drying or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, dairy, or other work or establishment.

- (2.) Shall keep or cause to be kept any house, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cowshed, earth or other closet or cesspool;
- (3.) Shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or occupied by him:
- (4.) Shall deposit or cast or allow to remain upon any road or public place the carcase of a dead animal or any refuse or offensive matter;
- (5.) Shall cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in and upon any road or footpath, so as to be or likely to become a nuisance or injurious to public health shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 34. If any person shall permit or suffer any of the nuisances contained in the foregoing By-law No. 33, to continue after notice from the Board requiring such person to remedy or abate the same, he shall be liable to a penalty of five shillings for every day during which such nuisance shall remain unremedied or unabated to the satisfaction of the Board

# Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

- 35. Any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds :-
  - (a.) Riding or driving cattle or horses, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath;
  - (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained;
  - (c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place;
  - (d.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board;
  - (c.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public read, or on any wall, fence, gate, or lamp post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;
  - (f.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained;
  - (g.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath;
  - (n.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person;
  - (i.) Having any awning upon or over any footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Poard;
  - (!) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board;
  - (k.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding along any
  - (l.) Making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board:
  - (m.) Plying for hire without a license in the form set forth in Schedule "C" hereto;
  - (n.) Fishing off any bridge;
  - (n.) Fishing off any bridge;
    (o.) Using or having in possession or control any unlicensed vehicle or machine engaged or to be engaged in heavy traffic without having a license in the form set forth in Schedule "B" hereto;
    (p.) Using or having in possession or control any unlicensed cycle or motor without having a license in the form set forth in Schedule "B" hereto.

#### General Regulation of Traffic.

- 36. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.
- 37. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.
- 38. No person shall drive any vehicle between sunset and the following sunrise along any road without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed on the off side of the front of such vehicle
- 39. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road, for a longer period than necessary for loading and unloading the vehicle; provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

Any person leading an entire or stallion shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of the stallion.

#### TO PREVENT TREES FALLING ACROSS ANY ROAD OR TRACK.

- 41. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 42. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS FROM RIDING, ETC., ON BICYCLES, ETC.

- 43. (a.) No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle or motor within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp or lamps which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, at all times to be kept lighted.
  - (b.) Every cycle or motor shall carry a bell, or other instrument suitable for giving warning of approach, which shall be used as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.
  - (c.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.
  - (d.) No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.
  - (e.) When a cyclist or motorist shall meet any horse or or appear likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist or motorist shall stop his cycle or motor, and shall not proceed until such horse or animal has passed.
  - (f.) No person shall ride any cycle or motor round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

#### To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths.

- 44. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road, or on any part of a footpath, within the district, after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.
- 45. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footway, or public reserve within the district, without having first obtained permission of the Board.
- 46. Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited. deposited.

#### TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO FOOTPATHS AND ANY OTHER BOARD PROPERTY.

47. No person, without first having obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the Board, or under the control thereof.

# PRESERVATION OF TREES, ETC.

48. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty not more than £10.

# THROWING DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES ON FOOTWAYS.

Any person who shall throw vegetable substances, or 49. Any person who shall throw vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footway within the district shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing, or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby. PARK LANDS, RESERVES, AND RECREATION GROUNDS.

- PARK LANDS, RESERVES, AND RECREATION GROUNDS.

  50. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons: and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.
- 51. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Board.
- 52. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.
- 53. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
- 54. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation ground, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to exceed
- 55. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

#### SAND AND TIMBER.

- 56. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands belonging to or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in form set forth in Schedule "E" hereto, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.
- Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on any lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in the form set forth in Schedule "E" hereto, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

# BARBED WIRE FENCES.

58. No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public road within the district.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

# CONSTRUCTION OF FOOTWAYS, CROSSING PLACES.

- It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or 59. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any road or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding \$5.
- 60. Every person who wilfully, and without lawful excuse, shall ride or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, tricycle, or motor upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case, upon or by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing, or channel, as the Justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

# Lamps, Posts, etc.

61. No lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person in any street without the written consent of the Board, and upon any consent being obtained shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Board; and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

PRESCRIBING THE REMOVAL OF VERANDAHS AND BALCONIES, ETC., AT EXPENSE OF OWNER OR OCCUPIER.

62. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed

when ordered within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on convicting shall pay a sum not expedient \$10.00. conviction, shall pay a sum not exceeding £10.

# Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

63. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal, within 14 days, of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall be not more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

#### Damaging Roads.

- 64. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse, team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty set exceeding. not exceeding £20.
  - 65. Any person who-
    - (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
    - (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
    - (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the water-side of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle;
    - (d.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other materia otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

# CATTLE TO KEEP OFF THE ROADS.

- 66. The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other anima straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pm 2$ .
- 67. The owner of any bull or stallion straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

# HEAVY TRAFFIC.

- The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.
- 69. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### POUND.

- 70. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound fence, gate, lock, shed, trough, or premises shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 71. Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle Trespass Fencing and Impounding Act, 1882." shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 72. Any person who shall release or attempt to release any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from any such pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

No.

#### WATER SUPPLY.

- 73. The scale of charges for supplying and distributing water to the ratepayers shall be per schedule of charges which may hereafter be gazetted, and any person refusing or neglecting to pay any such charge shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and, on conviction thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 74. Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 75. Any person who shall waste, or allow to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

#### LICENSES.

- LICENSES.

  76. The several licenses contained in the schedules hereto may be granted by the Board for such periods not exceeding twelve months, or for such purposes irrespective of any period of duration, and upon payment of such fees as shall be prescribed. And if any person holding any such license shall make default in any of the conditions contained in such license the license shall thereupon become absolutely null and void, and the fees paid therefor shall be forfeited to the Board, and such person shall, in the event of any breach of the said license beguilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
- 77. The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor shall have their license number affixed on some conspicious part of such vehicle, cycle, or motor, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

#### Penalties.

- 78. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done, or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily. summarily.
- 79. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits, or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
- 80. All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

#### WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT, 1902.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS UNDER "THE WORKERS' Compensation Act, 1902."

#### (1 & 2 Edwd. VII., No. 5.)

In pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1902," and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following amending and additional Regulations, that is to say :--

#### Section 7 (2) of the Act.

46. The claim for compensation under the Act may be in Form CX in the Schedule annexed hereto. The claimant must be either the person injured, his agent, legal representative, or a dependant. Where the claimant makes the claim in his own person, his signature at foot of the form must be witnessed by a Justice of the Peace, or a Resident Magistrate, or a schoolmaster, or a clergyman, and the witness must complete and sign an endorsement in the form set forth in the form subjoined to Form CX in the schedule annexed hereto.

# SETTLEMENT OF CLAIM BY AGREEMENT Section 8 (1) of the Act.

- 47. When a question as to liability to pay compensation under the Act, or as to the amount or duration of such compensation, is settled by agreement, the procedure to be followed shall be :-
  - (a.) The Memorandum of Agreement (hereinafter termed the memorandum) shall be in Form CY in the schedule annexed hereto.
  - (b.) A duplicate original of the memorandum shall be filed at the office of the clerk in the district wherein the worker was injured, within six months after the date of the injury.
  - (c.) If the memorandum purports to be signed by or on behalf of all the parties thereto the clerk shall register it without further proof and without fee, upon being satisfied of its genuineness.
  - Upon registration the memorandum shall be enforceable as a Local Court judgment, provided that the Magistrate may at any time rectify such registration.
  - (e.) If the memorandum purports to be signed by or on behalf of one or some only of the parties thereto, or not, in his opinion, to be genuine, the clerk shall, before registering it, send a copy thereof to the other party or parties affected, and request him or them to inform him whether the memorandum is genuine. For CV in the the memorandum is genuine. Form CZ, in the schedule annexed hereto, is provided for the purpose.
  - (f.) If all the parties admit the genuineness of the memorandum, or do not dispute it within 14 days, the clerk shall register it without further proof and without fee.
  - (g.) If any party disputes the genuineness of the memorandum, in Form CZA in the schedule annexed hereto, the clerk shall inform the party by whom it was left with or sent to him of such dispute, in Form CZB, and that the document will not be registered except with the consent, in writing, of the party disputing the same, or by order of the Magistrate.
  - (h.) If the consent mentioned in the last preceding clause (g.) cannot be obtained, the party by whom the memorandum was left or sent may apply to the Magistrate to order the same to be registered.
- 48. An application for an order to register a memorandum or to rectify the register in the matter shall be made in the manner following:—
  - (a.) The application shall be made in Court, on notice, in writing, in Form CZC in the schedule annexed hereto, stating the relief or order which the applicant claims.

- (b.) Such notice shall be filed with the clerk, and copies thereof shall be served-
  - (i.) In the case of an application for an order that a memorandum be registered, on the party disputing such memorandum;
  - (ii.) In the case of an application to rectify the register, on every party who would be affected by such rectification, or on the solicitor or agent of such party, ten clear days at least before the hearing of the application unless the Magistrate or clerk shall give leave for shorter notice.
- (c.) On the hearing of the application witnesses may be orally examined in the same manner as on the hearing of an action.
- (d.) On the hearing of the application the Magistrate may make such order or give such directions as may be just.
- (e.) The provisions of the Act and these Regulations as to the cost of a hearing before a Magistrate and two Assessors shall apply to any such application.

Regulation 32 is hereby repealed and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

The costs of and incident to any proceedings under the Act shall be in the discretion of the Court, or, in the absence of an Assessor, of the Magistrate; and shall be taxed by the Magistrate or clerk, and shall be allowed in accordance with the scale of costs in force for the time being in Local Courts.
