PORT HEDLAND MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT DECLARED,
AND THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PILBARRA
DISTRICT AMENDED.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK
TO WIT. } GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand
FRED. G. D. BEDFORD, } Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the
Governor. } Bath, Governor in and over the State of
[L.S.] } Western Australia and its Dependencies,
etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of
“The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886,” the Governor
is empowered to declare any portion of the State to be a
Magisterial District, and to name such District, and to
alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by
separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring
it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or
by adding to a Magisterial District other land, whether
theretofore included or not, within the limits of a Magisterial
District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the
advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that
portion of the State contained within the following
boundaries:—

Bounded on the North by 20° 30' parallel of South
latitude; on the East by the Eastern boundary of the
State; on the South by an Easterly line from the Yule
River, passing through Mt. Berchaus, Robinson's Well,
Trig. Station B24, and Mt. Cecilia, thence due East; on
the Westward by the left bank of the Yule River; and
on the North-West by the sea-coast, including the
islands adjacent,

shall be and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District,
to be known as “The Port Hedland Magisterial District.”

AND I do also, with the like advice, declare that the
boundaries of the Pilbarra Magisterial District shall be,
and are hereby altered, by excluding from the said District
such portion thereof as is included within the boundaries
of the Port Hedland Magisterial District, as hereby
proclaimed.

FEBRUARY, 1905.

The principal meteorological feature of the month was a willy willy, which visited the North-West coast on the 8th. It struck the coast rather lower than usual, viz., in the neighbourhood of Onslow, where the barometer fell to 29.17. Heavy rain fell, and a hurricane raged, doing some damage to shipping, and causing the loss of life. The storm then passed across the interior to the Bight, giving the goldfields a moderate and very welcome rainfall.

With the exception of the district between Geraldton and the North-West Cape, the rainfall for the month was light, and below the average for previous years throughout the State. Pressure was mostly above normal, especially in Western and Southern districts, and temperature below, especially on the Coolgardie fields. In fact, the mean temperature for the month was lower at Coolgardie than in Perth. The figures for the extreme South-Western and Southern portions of the State, as usual, indicate a very mild summer. At Cape Leeuwin the mean daily maximum was 72°, and the highest recorded throughout the month was only 77°. At Albany the mean maximum was 71°, and at Breaksea only 67°. For cool nights, honours are pretty evenly divided between Bridgetown, with a mean minimum of 47.9°, and Mt. Barker, with 47.4°.
