WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: AND WHEREAS the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued to Tuesday, the 23rd day of May now next ensuing: NOW I, Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, G.C.B., Governor of the said State, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly to Thursday, the 6th day of July now next ensuing; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the SECOND SESSION OF THE FIFTH PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall be holden for the despatch of business on the aforesaid Thursday, the 6th day of July next, at the hour of three o'clock p.m.; the Session of the said Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly in the Houses of Parliament, in the City of Perth, in the said State; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 219 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: AND WHEREAS the Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, hereunder named and described, which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of Perth, be declared public highways: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force:—

THE GOLDFIELDS WATER SUPPLY ACT, 1902.
(2 Edw. VII., No. 33.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 31st day of May, 1905.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor.

The Honourables—

The Minister for Mines,
The Minister for Lands,

The Minister for Labour.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area, for the purposes of the said Act, and may divide the area into districts, and define the boundaries of the districts. Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the powers of the said Act, doth hereby revoke and cancel the Order in Council dated 25th May, 1904, and in lieu thereof doth order that, as and from this date, the said area shall be divided into the districts specified in the schedule hereto with the several boundaries therein respectively defined:—

THE SCHEDULE.

THE KANOWNA WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area bounded by a circle having as its centre the Railway Station at Kanowna, and the radius of which shall be five miles in length.

THE BOULDER WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of Water Area bounded by a line starting at a point on the boundary of Water Area due South of Lakeside Railway Station, and passing thence due North to Lakeside Railway Station; thence North-Westerly along railway to the intersection of railway with the boundary of Boulder townsite, between Gold Mining Leases 16E and 31E; thence following the said boundary Northerly, North-Westerly, and by irregular line South-Westerly to most Westerly point of Boulder townsite; thence by straight line to most Southerly point of Sommerville Suburban Area; thence due South to boundary of Water Area; thence along last-mentioned boundary to the starting point, but excluding therefrom those portions of the Water Area comprised within all gold mining leases that are or may be supplied with water from the Kalgoorlie and Boulder Mines Water Trust.

THE KALGOORLIE WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area East of a line drawn at right angles to the pipe line at Mungari Railway Station, and extending to the boundaries of the area on both sides of the pipe line, but excluding therefrom that portion of the Water Area comprised within the Boulder Water District, and also excluding therefrom that portion of the Water Area comprised within the Kanowna Water District.

THE COOLGARDIE WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area situated outside of and to the Eastward of the Southern Cross Water District and West of a line drawn at right angles to the pipe line at Mungari Railway Station, and extended to the boundaries of the Water Area on both sides of the pipe line.

THE SOUTHERN CROSS WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area comprised within a circle, the centre of which shall be at the Southern Cross Railway Station, and the radius of which shall be two miles in length.

THE CENTRAL WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area between the Eastern boundary of the Mundaring Water District and the Western boundary of the Coolgardie Water District, but excluding therefrom that portion of the Water Area comprised within the Northam Water District and the Southern Cross Water District.

THE NORTHAM WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area bounded by a circle having as its centre the Northam Town Hall, and the radius of which shall be two miles.

THE MUNDARING WATER DISTRICT.

All that portion of the Water Area West of a line drawn at right angles to the pipe line at a point two miles West of Northam Town Hall, such line being extended to the boundaries of the Water Area on both sides of the pipe line.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," the Governor may, by order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purposes of the said Act, and may from time to time alter the boundaries of the Water Area: AND WHEREAS by Order in Council dated 11th day of February, 1903, the boundaries of a Water Area were duly constituted and defined: AND WHEREAS the boundaries of the said Water Area were altered by Order in Council dated 1st June, 1904: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to further alter the boundaries of the Water Area as defined by the aforesaid Order in Council: NOW THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council under the powers of the said Act, doth order that as and from this date the boundaries of the Water Area shall be altered by the inclusion in the Water Area of all land situated within the Reserve for Goldfields Water Supply and numbered 8059 on Plan IC/40 in the Lands Department; all land situated within a circle having as its centre the site of the Greenmount Reservoir on Reserve 2101 and the radius of which shall be 1½ miles, the location of the site of the said reservoir being defined on Plan G.W.S.A. numbered 931; all land situated within a circle having as its centre Midland Junction Post Office and the radius of which shall be 2 miles; all land situated within a circle having as its centre Guildford Post Office and the radius of which shall be 1½ miles.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserves 8228, 8229, 8230, 8231, and 8232 (Avon and Jilbadji Districts) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works, as Administrator of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," in trust for Pumping Stations Nos. 4 to 8 inclusive: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Works, with power to the said Minister for Works to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

THE BUILDING ACT, 1884, SECTION 40.

MUNICIPALITY OF LEEDERVILLE.
Amendment of Building By-law No. 7.

WHEREAS by "The Building Act, 1884," Section 40, it is enacted that every Council of a Municipality shall have the power at all times to make, repeal, alter, or amend By-laws for the purposes enumerated in the said Act: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Act, it has been ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Leederville to amend By-law No. 7 of its Building By-laws as follows:—

By-law No. 7 is hereby cancelled, and the following By-law substituted in lieu thereof, viz.:—

By-law No. 41.—With regard to the component materials of any external walls of buildings in Newcastle Street, Oxford Street, Sanders Street, Railway Parade from Kimberley Street to Monger Street, Monger Street from Railway Parade to Cambridge Street, Cambridge Street from Monger Street to Kimberley Street, Kimberley Street from Cambridge Street to Railway Parade and Short Street, every such wall must be built of either brick or stone, or artificial stone together laid in, and with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work.

No weatherboard buildings will be allowed to be erected within (50) fifty feet of the street alignment in Railway Parade, Cambridge Street, and St. Leonard's Avenue from Railway Parade to Woolwich Street, save and excepted as provided for brick or stone buildings in the foregoing clause, unless of a design to be approved by the Town Clerk or Engineer.

And it is further directed that all material used within, and beyond the above-mentioned areas within the Municipality shall be subject to the approval of the Town Clerk or Engineer.

Each infringement of this By-law will subject the person guilty of same to a penalty not exceeding £20, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices.

His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations relating to Residential Leases of lands now open for selection, or which may hereafter be declared open for selection, as Residential Lots.

REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL LEASES.

Repeal.

1. The Regulations of the 27th day of May, 1903, and all other regulations heretofore made relating to Residential Leases, are hereby repealed.

Applications.

2. Any person above the age of eighteen years, resident in Western Australia, and intending to actually reside on the lot applied for, may be an applicant for land set apart for Residential Leases.

But no lease of any lot shall be applied for, granted to, or held by—

(a.) Any Asiatic or African alien, except as provided in Regulation 38; or

(b.) Any person having any interest in any other Residential Lot within two miles of the lot applied for, except such other lot has been approved by the Minister for a Business Permit, and is used for business purposes only.

3. Every application—

(1.) Shall be in the form of Schedule A, with the declaration therein contained; and

(2.) Shall be lodged with the Land Agent for the District; or, in case there is no Land Agent for the District, with the Warden or Resident Magistrate.

4. With every application the applicant shall pay a fee of Ten shillings, and the amount of rent payable in advance, in accordance with the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," or any amendment thereof, and of the Regulations thereunder.

5. All applications shall be subject to the approval of the Minister; and the Land Agent, Warden, or Resident Magistrate shall forthwith forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, and the fee and rent, to the Under Secretary for Lands. The applicant may be granted by the Land Agent, Warden, or Resident Magistrate, respectively, permission to occupy temporarily the land applied for in the form of Schedule B.

6. The granting or refusal of the application shall be in the discretion of the Minister, but priority will, where practicable, be given to married applicants where husband and wife intend to reside on the area applied for.

7. If an application is refused, the rent paid with the application shall be returned to the applicant.

8. (1.) If an application is approved, a lease shall be granted to the applicant in the form or to the effect of Schedule C, as from the first day of the quarter next preceding the date of approval of the application, upon payment by the applicant of a fee of Ten shillings for the cost of the lease.

(2.) On approval of an application, notice shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to his address.

(3.) If the fee of Ten shillings is not paid within thirty days after the posting to the applicant of notice of approval, such approval shall be void and the application shall be deemed to have been refused.

9. The granting of any lease shall not be a waiver of the restrictions mentioned in Regulation 2.

Conditions of Lease.

10. No lease or interest in a lease shall, except as provided in Regulation 38, be held by any Asiatic or African alien, nor by any person under the age of eighteen years, nor by any person who is interested in any other Residential Lease within a distance of two miles, except as provided in Regulation 2.

11. Every lease shall be granted and held subject to the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898," and any amendment thereof, or any Act passed in substitution for the same, (hereinafter referred to as the Act), and the Regulations thereunder in force for the time being relating to Residential Leases (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations).

12. Every lease shall be limited to the natural surface of the land demised, and the land below the natural surface to a depth not exceeding 40 feet if situated within a gold-field or mineral district, and if not so situated, not exceeding 200 feet.

13. The term granted by any lease shall be for 999 years from the first day of January preceding the date of the application.

14. (1.) The yearly rent for each Residential Lot shall be Four pounds per centum on the capital unimproved value of the land, the minimum rent being Ten shillings per annum.

(2.) The capital unimproved value of each Residential Lot shall be fixed by the Minister, and such value fixed on or before the granting of the lease shall be the basis of the yearly rent for the first ten years, and shall continue to be the rent until revaluation of the land is made, or caused to be made, by the Minister.

(3.) The Minister may, for each subsequent period of ten years, make, or cause to be made, a valuation of each Residential Lot within the twelve calendar months next pending the expiration of the then current ten years, and the value so fixed shall be the basis of the yearly rent for the subsequent period of ten years. The capital unimproved value of each lot shall be the price at which the land in fee simple, unencumbered by any mortgage or charge thereon, might be expected to sell at the time when valued.

(4.) The rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

(5.) If the lessee of any Residential Lease granted before the publication of these Regulations wishes to bring the lease under these Regulations, he may do so by the payment of a fee of Ten shillings, when the lease shall be cancelled, and a new lease issued subject to these Regulations.

(6.) All rates, taxes, etc., chargeable on the land must be paid by the lessee.

15. Possession of the Residential Lot shall be taken by the applicant within two calendar months of the approval of the application.

16. The lessee shall not, except as hereinafter provided, use the land or permit it to be used for any business, trade, or occupation, or for any purpose whatever other than *bona-fide* residence.

17. If a lessee, or the husband or wife of a lessee, has or acquires any interest in any other Residential Lot within two miles of the lot, except as hereinbefore provided in Regulation 2, the lease may be forfeited.

But this Regulation shall not apply where the husband or wife of a lessee is permanently living separate and apart from the lessee.

Transfers.

18. (1.) No transfer shall be allowed without the consent in writing of the Minister in that behalf first obtained, on application in the form of Schedule D. No such consent shall be given within twelve months of the granting of the lease, except in very special cases.

(2.) On every such application the lease shall be produced, with a statutory declaration by the intended transferee in the form of Schedule E, and the fee of Twenty shillings shall be paid.

(3.) No transfer shall be made to any person not entitled to be an applicant for or to hold the lease, and the consent of the Minister to the transfer shall not avoid a forfeiture of the lease, if it shall appear that the transferee was disqualified.

19. No portion of any Residential Lot shall be transferred or sub-let under any circumstances whatever.

Forfeiture.

20. (1.) A lease may be forfeited by the Minister—

(a.) If the rent is not fully paid at the times and in manner provided by the Act.

(b.) In case of breach, non-performance, or non-observance of any of the conditions thereof or of the provisions of the Act or Regulations relating thereto.

(2.) No acceptance of rent, or other act subsequent to any breach, non-performance, or non-observance as aforesaid shall be deemed to be, or operate, or be pleaded as a waiver of the forfeiture, and no forfeiture shall be waived otherwise than by an express waiver under the hand of the Minister.

21. A lease may be determined at the option of the lessee, at the expiration of any year of the tenancy, by notice in writing, given by the lessee to the Minister three months before the expiration of such year.

22. At any time during the continuance of or within one month after the determination of any lease, the lessee may remove any buildings or fixtures on the lot.

23. If, in the opinion of the Minister, a lease has been or has become liable to be forfeited, he shall give notice thereof to the lessee by letter sent by post addressed to the lessee at the lot in question, or by notice in the *Government Gazette*; and unless, within the time limited by such notice, the Minister is satisfied to the contrary, the lease may, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, be absolutely forfeited.

Mortgages.

24. A lessee may not mortgage his lease without the consent of the Minister. On such consent being given, a lease may be mortgaged in accordance with the provisions of the Act and Regulations, but such mortgage shall only be effected for the purpose of *bonâ fide* improving the lot. This Regulation shall not apply to mortgages effected prior to the coming into force of these Regulations.

Business Permits.

25. (1.) If, in the opinion of the Minister, it is desirable so to do, he may, in his discretion, grant to any lessee permission to carry on, upon his residential lot, any specified business or businesses.

(2.) Such permission shall be granted at such additional rent as the Minister may in each case determine, and the additional rent, if any, shall be payable half-yearly in advance, as from the next preceding quarter-day.

(3.) Such permission shall not be granted in respect of any Residential Lease granted before the publication of these Regulations, but such lease may be cancelled, and a new lease granted in lieu thereof, subject to these Regulations.

26. Application for a business permit shall be made in the form of Schedule F, and a deposit of £2 shall be paid with every application.

27. The application shall be lodged and dealt with as hereinbefore provided in the case of an application for a lease.

28. Before granting permission, the Minister shall satisfy himself, by any such personal or other inquiry as he may deem fit, of the *bona fides* of the application, and that the permission applied for is necessary in the general interest of the neighbourhood.

29. If the Minister refuses to grant the permission applied for, the deposit, after deducting the expenses of the inquiry (if any), to be fixed by the Minister, shall be returned to the applicant.

30. If the Minister is prepared to approve of the grant of a permit, he shall give notice, by letter sent by post to the applicant, of the amount of additional rent fixed; and the applicant shall, within twenty-eight days after the posting of such letter, forward to the Minister the additional rent for the current half-year. If such rent is not received by the Minister within such time, the application shall be forthwith cancelled and the deposit forfeited. If such rent is so received the application shall be deemed granted, and the expense of any inquiry shall be deducted from the deposit, and the balance credited to the lessee on account of future rent.

31. Such permission may be granted in the form of Schedule G.

32. The additional rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance, at the times and in manner prescribed for payment of the rent reserved by the lease, and, in case of default in payment in accordance therewith, the permission may be cancelled by order of the Minister.

33. The permission may be cancelled by order of the Minister in his absolute discretion at any time if, in the opinion of the Minister, any business other than the business expressly authorised is carried on upon the residential lot.

34. The permission shall follow every approved transfer or sub-lease of the residential lot.

35. (1.) No lessee shall sell or allow or permit the sale of any liquor on his residential lot by virtue of any license under "The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act, 1880," or any amendment thereof, or any Act passed in substitution for the same, for consumption either on or off the premises, without the special permission, in writing, of the Governor.

(2.) No such permission shall be granted for a longer period than one year without the special consent of the Governor, but every such permission may be renewed, and shall be revocable at any time at the discretion of the Governor.

Resumption.

36. The whole or any part of a residential lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes, or for any public purpose whatever, at three months' notice to the lessee, published in the *Government Gazette*; and, immediately after the expiration of such three months, all the estate and interest of the lessee therein shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted. But on any such resumption the lessee shall be entitled to receive from the Minister the fair value of any improvements existing on the land resumed, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the lessee and one by the Minister, and any difference of opinion between the said valuers shall be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.

Transmissions.

37. On the death or bankruptcy of a lessee his legal personal representative or the Official Receiver or trustee of his estate may be registered as the lessee, but a transfer to a person entitled to be an applicant for and to hold a lease shall be made by such representative, Official Receiver, or trustee, and registered within three calendar months thereafter, otherwise the lease shall be forfeited.

Special areas for Asiatic and African aliens.

38. Notwithstanding the exceptions contained in regulations 2 and 10, residential leases and business permits may be applied for, granted to, and held by Asiatic or African aliens under and subject to these regulations in respect of any land situated northward of the 25th degree of south latitude, and declared open for selection by Asiatic or African aliens.

Interpretation.

39. In these regulations the term "lessee" includes any authorised transferee or sub-lessee.

40. "Improvements" include all buildings, structures, fencing, clearing, and other work done, or material used thereon, by the expenditure of capital or labour by the lessee of the land, but in so far only as the effect thereof is to increase the value of the land, and the benefit thereof is unexhausted at the time of valuation.

1. Every person who desires to register, under Section 4 of "The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1904," the brand of a fertiliser and the minimum percentages of nitrogen, nitrogen as nitrates, potash in readily soluble

form, water soluble phosphate, citrate soluble phosphate, acid soluble phosphate, and moisture contained in such fertiliser, shall make application, in writing, to the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto, stating the particulars therein indicated.

2. Every person who desires to amend the registered minimum percentages of nitrogen, nitrogen as nitrates, potash in readily soluble form, water soluble phosphate, citrate soluble phosphate, acid soluble phosphate, and moisture contained in any brand of fertiliser registered by him, shall make application, in writing, to the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, in the form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, stating the particulars therein indicated.

3. The Invoice Certificate, under Section 8, to be given by every person who sells any fertiliser in any quantity not less than half a hundredweight to the purchaser at the time of sale or delivery of the fertiliser, or any part thereof, shall be in the Form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto, signed by the seller or his agent.

4. (1.) The minimum percentages of tricalcium phosphate derived from bones contained in bonedust or bonemeal shall be 40 per cent.

(2.) The minimum percentage of water soluble phosphate contained in superphosphate or super shall be 20 per cent.; and the minimum total percentage of water soluble phosphate and citrate soluble phosphate contained in superphosphate or super shall be 30 per cent.

(3.) The minimum percentage of tricalcium phosphate contained in 'Thomas' phosphate composed of basic slag shall be 30 per cent.; and the fertiliser shall be so prepared that not less than 80 per cent. thereof is capable of passing through a sieve having a 10,000 mesh to the square inch, or not less than 5 per cent. is capable of passing through a sieve having a 3,600 mesh to the square inch.

BY-LAW 15.

No person shall keep, or allow to be or to stray, within one hundred yards of high water-mark of the Helena River Reservoir (that is to say, the level which the water attains when it begins to flow over the retaining wall at Mundaring), or within one hundred yards of any stream or watercourse within the catchment area, nor shall any person have or maintain any sty in which pigs are kept on any portion of the catchment area within two hundred yards of the Helena River Reservoir or of any stream or watercourse within the catchment area.

BY-LAW 56A.

Within the Northam Water District the Water Rate shall be at the rate of sixpence in the pound (being at the rate of tenpence and two-sevenths of a penny in the pound per annum), to be made and levied for the unexpired portion of the current year, namely, from 1st June, 1905, to 31st December, 1905, upon all rateable land; and every ratepaying consumer therein will be entitled to a supply of water at the rate of three shillings and ninepence per thousand gallons in return for the amount of rate paid by him. Any consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged three shillings per thousand gallons for the excess used for the purposes of trade, business, or manufacture, and two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons for the excess used for purposes other than trade, business, or manufacture. In the event of any dispute arising as to whether or not water is being used for the purposes of trade, business, or manufacture, the decision of the Minister for Works shall be final in every case. The minimum sum payable as rate on every separately assessed property on which a building or structure of any description is erected shall be one pound per annum, and the minimum sum payable as rate on every separately assessed vacant property shall be ten shillings per annum, and in this respect this By-law shall over-ride By-law No. 57, gazetted on 13th January, 1905.
