WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: AND WHEREAS the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued to Tuesday, the 23rd day of May now next ensuing: Now I, Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, G.C.B., Governor of the said State, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly to Thursday, the 6th day of July now next ensuing; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the SECOND SESSION OF THE FIFTH PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall be holden for the despatch of business on the aforesaid Thursday, the 6th day of July next, at the hour of three o'clock p.m.; the Session of the said Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly in the Houses of Parliament, in the City of Perth, in the said State; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 8), the Governor may, by proclamation, annex any land forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipality: AND WHEREAS a petition has been presented to His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, praying for the annexation to the Municipality of Kalgoorlie of a portion of land severed from the Kalgoorlie Road Board District, signed by a majority of the persons on the ratepayers' roll of the said Road Board in respect of rateable land in such portion: AND WHEREAS the said petition was publicly advertised in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of December, 1904, as required by law: NOW THEREFORE I, Admiral Sir Frederick George Denham Bedford, G.C.B., Governor as aforesaid, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby annex to the Municipality of Kalgoorlie the area contained within the following boundaries:—

Starting from a point in the centre of the Kalgoorlie-Menzies Railway line, situate in prolongation North-Eastward of the centre of the right-of-way between Killarney Street and Eureka Street, such right-of-way passing along the South-Eastern boundaries of Hannans Sub. Area Lots F25 to F32, inclusive, and F9 to F16, inclusive; thence South-Westward along said line and the centre of said right-of-way to the centre of Thurmott Street; thence along the centre of said street South-Eastward to the Kalgoorlie Townsite boundary; thence South-Westward alongside said Townsite boundary to a point in prolongation North-Westerly of the centre of Russell Street; thence South-Eastward by the said line and the centre of Russell Street to a line in prolongation South-Westerly of the North-Western side of Campbell Street; thence North-Eastward along said North-Western side of Campbell Street to its intersection with the Western side of Keenan Street; thence North-Westerly along said side of Keenan Street to its intersection with the centre of Ward Street; thence North-Eastward along said centre of Ward Street to its intersection with the centre of the Kalgoorlie-Menzies Railway line; and thence North-Westerly along said centre to the starting point.

The entire boundaries of the Kalgoorlie Municipality being as follow:—

Starting from a point in the centre of the Kalgoorlie-Menzies Railway line, situate in prolongation North-Eastward of the centre of the right-of-way between Killarney Street and Eureka Street, such right-of-way passing along the South-Eastern boundaries of Hannans Sub. Area Lots F25 to F32, inclusive, and F9 to F16, inclusive; thence South-Westward along said line and the centre of said right-of-way to the centre of Thurmott Street; thence along the centre of said street South-Eastward to the Kalgoorlie Townsite boundary; thence South-Westward along said Townsite boundary to a point in prolongation North-Westerly of the centre of Russell Street; thence South-Eastward by the said line and the centre of Russell Street to a line in prolongation South-Westerly of the North-Western side of Campbell Street; thence South-Westerly along said side of street to the South-West side of Russell Street; thence 133° 28' 20 chains 70 links along the South-West side of Russell Street; thence 223° 28' 71 chains 50 links along the North-West side of Bourke Street;

thence by a line bearing 133° 28' about 62 chains along the South-West boundaries of Kalgoorlie Town Lots 399 and 398, and along the South-West side of Throssell Street to the South-East side of Egan Street; thence 43° 28' 23 chains 50 links along part of the South-East side of Egan Street; thence 109° 28' about 26 chains 70 links; thence 43° 28' about 46 chains 60 links; thence 39° 48' about 29 chains 55 links parallel to, and at a distance of 75 links South-Eastward from, the South-Eastern boundaries of Kalgoorlie Town Lots R713 to R719, inclusive, to the centre of the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Railway line; and thence North-Westward along the said centre and the centre of the aforesaid Kalgoorlie-Menzies Railway line to a point on the Kalgoorlie-Menzies Railway line in prolongation of a line being the centre of Elizabeth Street; thence North-Eastward along the centre of such street to the intersection of the centre of Rydal Street; thence North-Westerly along the centre of the last-mentioned street to the intersection with the centre of Gordon Street; thence South-Westerly along the centre of the latter street, and by the prolongation of such centre line thereof to the Kalgoorlie-Menzies Railway line, and along it Northward to the starting point.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that on and after the 15th July, 1905, a Dioptric Fixed Light of the 4th order will be exhibited from an open braced steel Tripod, erected on Gantheaume Point in lat. 17° 59' South, long. 122° 11' East, the height of the focal plane above high water being 56 feet.

UNDER the powers conferred by Royal Proclamation dated 13th October, 1897, Section 5, Subsection D, the following amended Regulations under which Gold may be received and coined at the Branch of His Majesty's Mint at Perth, Western Australia, have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

These regulations will come into force from the 1st July proximo.

REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH GOLD MAY BE RECEIVED AND COINED AT THE BRANCH OF HIS MAJESTY'S MINT AT PERTH, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

1. Gold in deposits of not less than one ounce will be received at the Mint daily (Saturdays and holidays excepted) between the hours of 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.

2. Each parcel requiring a separate assay will be treated as a separate deposit.

3. The value of each deposit will be determined upon the report of the Assay Department, which report shall be final.

4. The value of each deposit will be calculated as follows:—Standard gold at £3 17s. 10½d. per ounce troy, and a proportion of the silver at a rate per ounce to be fixed by the Deputy Master from time to time. The proportion of silver paid for will be as follows:—

In deposits under 1,000 ozs. gross: all silver in excess of 8 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

5. Charges.—For assaying, refining, and coinage: the charges shown in the Schedule attached to these Regulations.

Provided that of these charges, 1½d. per ounce standard where the amount brought at one time does not exceed five hundred ounces, and a penny in any other case, shall be considered to be the coinage charges fixed by the Royal Proclamation of the 13th October, 1897.

6. Additional charges, to be fixed by the Deputy Master, will also be made when—

- A deposit contains base metal in excess of two per cent. of its weight after melting.
- It is necessary to subject the metal to any special treatment.

7. The value of the deposit, less the Mint charges, will be paid to the Depositor—

- By cheque, in the case of deposits of less than 1,000 ozs. gross weight.
- In all other cases, in coin for the even thousands of pounds, and by cheque for the balance; or wholly by cheque if desired.

Payments will be made on Tuesdays and Fridays next after the expiration of three weeks from the date of the deposit.

Cheques will be transmitted by post when required.

NOTE.—These arrangements for the payment of depositors will be adhered to as far as possible, but the Deputy Master cannot be held responsible for any delay arising from accidents to machinery, great pressure of work, or other unavoidable cause.

8. All deposits will be dealt with strictly in the order in which they are received.

9. The Deputy Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable, and it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

THE ROADS ACT, 1902.

BY-LAWS OF THE ASHBURTON ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Ashburton Road Board, being the Road Board for the district of Ashburton, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and every other authority enabling it on that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws :—

INTERPRETATIONS.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them respectively, that is to say :—

"District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Ashburton Road Board.

"Board"—The Ashburton Road Board.

"Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

"Member"—A member of the Board.

"The Act"—The Roads Act of 1902 and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter, as far as the Act allows.

"Reserve"—A reserve under the control of the Board.

"Road."—The word "road" will include all public roads and thoroughfares within the Ashburton area.

"Person."—The word "person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

1. To attend all Board meetings.
2. To attend all Committees, if required, and take notes of minutes, and prepare reports of Committees where practicable.
3. To conduct all correspondence, and to give other officers instructions, as directed by the minutes.
4. To answer all questions on Board's business.
5. To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheet prepared and published yearly in the *Government Gazette* and at least one newspaper circulating in the district.
6. To prepare the Rate Book and Board's Electoral List, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or Appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing all papers, etc., for clerk.

7. To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.

8. The secretary shall keep the cash book as well as any other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board and in accordance with directions issued from time to time by the Minister. The said books shall be kept written up and balanced with pass-book at least once every month, ready for inspection by the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time desire to see them.

9. He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding £10 in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check returns made by collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that with all returns made the heels of the receipt book accompany the returns.

10. He shall remit to the Bank upon every mail day, to be placed to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.

11. He shall, at regular intervals, forward the pass-book to the Bank and also to the Treasury, being careful to have the pass-book in hand on the 30th June in each year for the annual audit. No money shall be paid into the Bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except the secretary. The secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

12. The Board, in the absence of the secretary, may appoint one of their members to act for any meeting.

13. The secretary shall not be entitled to tender for any contracts to be let by the Board.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

14. (a.) The reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings (if any).

(b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

(c.) Reading of correspondence received and despatched, and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient with regard thereto.

(d.) Presentation of reports of Committee and consideration thereof.

(e.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

(f.) General business.

(g.) Passing of accounts for payment.

FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

15. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meeting, and, after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.

16. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be remitted to the Bank, by registered letter, at least once in each and every month.

PUBLICATION OF NOTICES AND COLLECTION OF RATES.

Rates, enforcing payment.

17. In event of any ratepayer not having forwarded the amount due to the Board upon the day stated in the notice, a second notice shall be served by post, under registered cover, and such ratepayer shall be warned that in six weeks from the date of such posted notice legal proceedings will be taken for the recovery of such rates.

OFFENCES.

18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding £20 sterling for every offence.

The foregoing By-laws were duly passed at a meeting of the Board held on the 4th day of October, 1904.
