By His Excellency Admiral Sir FREDERICK GEORGE DENHAM BEDFORD, Knight Grand Gross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, etc., etc., etc.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Govern-ment Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart Temporary Stations: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers Council, do hereby set apart, as Temporary Quarantine Stations, the undermentioned premises, viz .:-

- (1.) The premises owned or occupied by Mr. Sinclair, situated in the Northam District, and used for the purpose of slaughtering stock.
- (2.) The premises ownel or occupied by Mr. McGuckin, situated in the Albany District, and used for the purpose of slaughtering stock.

W HEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Roads Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: AND

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve $\bigwedge_{9625}^{\Lambda}$ for Common, at Jarrahdale, should be placed under the control of the Jarrahdale Road Board as a Board of Management: Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Jarrahdale Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W HEREAS by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, published in the Government Gazette from time to time, prohibit or permit the introduction or importation into the State, either by land or sea, of any stock from any country or place : Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby order as follows :---

Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," to the contrary, the importation of any stock from any country or place beyond the States of the Commonwealth or New Zealand is prohibited, with the exception of stock from the United Kingdom, which may be imported in accordance with the Regulations applicable to such stock made on the 24th day of September, 1902, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of September, 1902, and the Regulations made on the 30th day of March, 1904, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of April, 1904, provided that the vessel conveying such stock shall not have, for a period of six weeks preceding the embarkation of such stock, carried any stock otherwise than from the United Kingdom.

W HEREAS by Section 96 of "The Roads Act, 1902," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of "The Permanent Reserves Act, 1899," the Governor may place any Public Reserve under the control and management of a Road Board, and that, for the purpose of controlling or managing such Reserve, the Board shall have all the power of a Board of Parks and Reserves appointed under "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," together with the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1902": AND WHEREAS it is

expedient that Reserve $\frac{\Lambda}{9800}$ (Ninghan, near Pinyalling) should be placed under the control and management of the Yalgoo Road Board : Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Roads Act, 1902," doth hereby place the said Reserve under the control and management of the Yalgoo Road Board.

LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH BY-LAWS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 20th July, 1905.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws made by the Kalgoorlie Local Board of Health.

THE KALGOORLIE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), and "Health Act Amendment Act, 1900" (64 Vict., No. 25), the Kalgoorlie Board of Health has power to make By-laws : Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purpose of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act, and, in addition thereto:—

- "Local Board" shall mean the Kalgoorlie Local Board of Health.
- "District" shall mean the district for which the Local Board is appointed, and any extensions thereof.
- "Outside District" shall mean all that portion of the district in which it may be agreed from time to time between the Board and the contractor that the open pan system may be used.
- "Contractor" shall mean any person with whom the Local Board has a subsisting contract for the removal of nightsoil and other refuse.
- "Nightman" shall mean any person employed to remove nightsoil.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

1. No person shall erect within the district any earthcloset, privy, or urinal, the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.

2. No closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 20 feet from any business place or dwelling, unless with the express permission of the Local Board; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

3. The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightscil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Closets supplied with receptacles for excrementitious matter-size, shape, materials of construction-interchangeable.

Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of sealed pans for excrementitious matter, which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and shall be of the size, shape, style, and materials directed by the Local Board; provided always, that in the outside districts open pans, approved by the Board, may be used.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Mode of Removal, etc.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle, and at once cover the same with a suitable tightfitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan, of the pattern approved by the Local Board, in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

Provided that in the outside district where open pans are allowed, the contents of such pans shall be removed by the nightman in a nightcart approved by the Local Board, and such pans shall then be cleansed with disinfectant to the satisfaction of the officers of the Board.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least, or so much more frequently as the Local Board shall from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Fixing the charges, etc.

The contractor shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade or house refuse shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and the contractor shall not demand or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said schedule.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Licenses to remove nightsoil. No person, other than the nightmen employed by the contractor, shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.

No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.

The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and amendments thereof, and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 7.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautious, etc., to be observed — meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 8.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board within one month from the date of the publication of these by-laws in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter on or before the first day of July in each succeeding year, and shall pay a registration fee of One pound for each such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 9.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by one of the Board's officers.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any officers of the Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 10.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on

the removal of pigwash, etc. 1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or other filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom. 2. Every tank or barrel, and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

3. All pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from all places or premises between the hours of 6 o'clock in the evening and 8 o'clock in the morning, and at no other time except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 11.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place, any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit which, in the opinion of any officer of the Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome, shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 12.

For the restriction of the storage of bone dust, etc. No person shall store or keep any bone dust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 13.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

1. Every occupier or owner of any premises wherein or whereon any horse, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, at least once a week, remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey, or cause to be conveyed, such dung or offensive matter to the depôt or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 14.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district.

BY-LAW No. 15.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit, on any premises owned or occupied by him, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the officer of the Board, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding $\pounds 5$ for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance and injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition, and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock, or bedding, or furniture manufactories shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the regulation of noxious or offensive trades.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of "The Health Act, 1898," whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee (as per Schedule D hereto) of the amount, of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be lime-washed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 18.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc. No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by an officer of the Board shall be determined by the Local Board, according to the nature of the case.

BY-LAW No. 20.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises. 1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughterhouse, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or stable to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the officers of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 21,

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from an officer of the Board, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by an officer of the Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as an officer of the Board may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier then the owner of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used, shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as an officer of the Board may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from an officer of the Board and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that such officer may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition. All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 23.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with line or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour, or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for the purpose.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Regulating the disposal of the carcases of dead animals,

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Townsite of Kalgoorlie, or to such place as the Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed, or buried, to the satisfaction of an officer of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter. No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or paring of leather, or any offensive matter, so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its officers shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitted with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds used in any laundry or dwelling, house refuse, waste or other matter or substance which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacle shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed, as may be directed by an officer of the Board, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition, and removed at least once a week, and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water, or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise dis-charged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district, other than the place set apart by the Logal Board for the truncate Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Restricting contracts. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil, or any other refuse, or offensive matter whatever, except with the Contractor, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water,

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 30.

To regulate the registration and management of private hospitals.

1. Every person in keeping, or intending to keep, or open any private hospital, within the district, shall register the same at the office of the Board; and each applicant for registration shall state the number of patients to be admitted, the number of number of satisfies to be maintained, and the class or classes of disease or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital; and the Local Board reserves the right, provided the following regulations are not adhered to, to revoke or cancel any such registration. All such private hospitals must be registered within one month from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the *Government Gazetle*, and thereafter on or before the first day of July in each succeeding year.

2. The officers of the Board shall at all reasonable times have access to the building or buildings for the purpose of inspections as to drainage, good management, and sanitary regulations; and no such building shall be registered unless it be passed by the Board's officers as a fit and proper place for hospital purposes.

3. Every person in charge of a private hospital shall keep a register of all cases admitted into and treated in any such hospital, and such register shall be produced for inspection at the request of any officer of the Board.

4. Any person in charge of any such hospital shall, at the request of an officer of the Board, provide for the isolation or removal of any patient suffering from scarlet fever, diphtheria, variola, varicella, puerperal fever, erysipelas, measles, or any other infectious or contagious disease.

5. In every such hospital there shall be at least one nurse to every 15 patients, and at least one qualified nurse, whose qualification shall be approved of by the Board, to every 10 patients.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Penalties.

Penalties. Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898," or any amendment thereof (Section 35 and 242), or these by-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be con-tinued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s. imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.

BUCKLAND HILL ROAD BOARD BY-LAWS.

ROADS ACT, 1902, AND AMENDMENTS THEREOF. THE Buckland Hill Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the

following By-laws:-WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1902," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned :

It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Buckland Hill District, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette :--

INTERPRETATION.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say :-

- "District."—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Buckland Hill Road Board.
- "Board,"-The Buckland Hill Road Board.
- "Chairman."-The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."-A member of the Board.
- "Secretary."—The Secretary of the Board.
- "The Act."-The Roads Act of 1902 and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter.
- "Road or Reserve."-A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

The word "Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

- "Owner."—Any person in possession or entitled to the receipt either of the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any rateable property within the district during the period specified in the Act.
- "Permission of the Board."-The consent of the Board in writing.

"Jetty."--Any jetty under the control of the Board.

"Vehicle."—Any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, motor car, or other conveyance (not being a hand cart) with or without springs.

APPOINTMENTS.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

To attend all Board meetings.

To attend all Committees.

To take notes of all minutes, and prepare reports of Committees.

To conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.

To answer all questions on the Board's business.

The S-cretary shall have charge of the Common Seal of the Board, and shall be responsible for the custody and safe use of the same.

The Secretary shall see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and printed yearly.

To supervise the preparation of the rate books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.

To summon the members to ordinary or special meetings of the Board by notice to each member not less than three clear days before such meeting, and by the like notice to summon the members to every meeting that shall be adjourned for a time exceeding seven days. Committee meetings shall be summoned, if required, by notice sent to each member three days at least before such meeting.

The Secretary shall keep the cash-book as well as any and all other books which may be issued by the Minister for Works or which may be required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be kept written up, and balanced with bank pass-books every month, ready for the inspection of the Board, or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.

He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding Five pounds in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers, and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

He shall pay into the bank, within forty-eight hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.

He shall have the Bank and Treasury pass-books made up in readiness for the first meeting in each month of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof; or should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours, the secretary shall produce same for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the secretary. The secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified. At each ordinary meeting in each month of the Board, an approximate balance-sheet shall be produced showing. at nearly as possible, the financial position of the Board as regards payment already made, its present assets and liabilities, which latter term shall specify and include all moneys voted for special purposes which have not yet been undertaken or contracted for

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

Meetings.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the chairman and any two members of the Board to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so, providing the business before the Board warrants such action being taken.

No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, exclusive of the chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present, and no business shall be transacted other than for which the special meeting is called (2 Edw. 7, Sec. 82).

The Board shall commence business as soon after the time appointed as there are sufficient members present to fo m a quorum.

At all times for meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present within 30 minutes after notified time of such meeting, or when the Board is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present. Such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

As the first business at all meetings of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by the 9th section of the Act; but the chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper.

Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the 90th section of the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act, in the minute book. But, during such meeting, he may be called on to read any portion of the rough minutes for the satisfaction of any member of the Board.

Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary subsequent meeting.

Order of Business.

The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

Questions.

(c) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.

Consideration of Notices of Motion.

- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and com-
- mittee's reports and consideration thereof. (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of con-
- (7.) Consideration of tenders and ratingation of contracts.
- (g.) Ordinary or other business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy or for the ratification of any clerical error.

Pe'itions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

Speaker must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Amendments.

Whenever an amendment is moved upon an original proposition no second amendment shall be taken into consideration until the first amendment has been disposed of. If the first amendment is carried, it shall displace the original question and become itself the question, whereupon only one further amendment may be moved. If the first amendment be negatived, then a second amendment shall be submitted to the Board for discussion at one time.

On an amendment being moved, no member of the Council who has spoken to the original question shall speak again (except in explanation, or as the mover of the original question in reply) until the amendment has been put, and has become the amended proposition before the Board.

Any member moving or seconding a motion or amendment in the terms "I move," etc., or "I second," etc., as the case may be, shall be held to have spoken on that question.

Appointment of Committee.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee of three shall comprise two members.

Finance Account.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee for recommendation to the Board, and, if passed by the Board shall be initialled by the chairman and paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may direct, and all moneys received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted ...y the Government) shall be paid into such Bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one member of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary.

All moneys granted by Government shall be paid to B ard's credit at Treasury, and shall only be operated upon to pay actual creditors for work ex cuted on the specific object for which money was granted.

Urgent Work.

The Chairman, or any two members in the absence of the Chairman may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceed ng £5, but shall, in every case, report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS, AND STANDING ORDERS.

Rules of Debate.

It shall be competent for any member to rise to order, on which the member speaking must at once resume his seat and remain silent until the point of order has been succinctly stated by the member who has risen.

The Chairman must thereupon decide the point of order or practice, and, if required, cite the rule applicable to the case, without argument or comment,

It is then competent for any member, not being the member interrupted by the member who rose to order, to demand that the sense of the Board be taken on the point, when the decision of the majority shall prevail, and be final and binding on every member.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

In case of urgent necessity, any Standing Order or Orders of the Board may be suspended on motion, duly made and seconded, without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least three members of the Board.

Suspension of Standing Orders carried by majority.

When a motion for the suspension of any Standing Order or Orders appears on the notice papers, such motion may be carried by a majority of the members of the Board.

Duration of Standing Orders.

The whole of the Standing Orders shall continue in force until altered, amended, or repealed.

In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and practice of the West Australian Houses of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as they can be applied to the proceedings of the Board.

No person, except a member of the committee, shall be admitted at any meeting of such committee without the consent of the members present.

Nuisances and traffic.

From time to time the Board may appoint an Inspector of Nuisances, whose duties shall be to see that the following By-laws are duly carried out within the district of the Board :---

The Inspector shall, from time to time, visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard, or other place, for the purpose of ascertaining that the same is not a nuisance, and the same must at all times be kept thoroughly clean to the satisfaction of such officer.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £10:---

- (a.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals, motor cart, cycle, or other vehicle, or wheeling barrow, or driving any carriage, whether with or without horses or other animals, upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter in any footway, or road, or open or public place.
- (d.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (e.) Allowing the dripping of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway or road.
- (f.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (g.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.
- (h.) Obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon, or otherwise.
- (i.) Throwing or discharging any stones or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property on a road.
- (j.) Having any awning on any footpath in any public street or thoroughfare not being eight feet clear above the footway or road, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (k.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (*l*.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving along any road.
- (m.) Making cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.
- (n.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.

No person shall erect any signboard, sign, awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or any other thing on or over any footway or road without the permission of the Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence. Any person who injures or pollutes any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5). Any owner, occupier, manager or other person in charge of any land or premises

manager or other person in charge of any land or premises who shall allow water from any shaft to flow into, upon, or across any road, foot way, or gutter without the permission of the Board first had or obtained, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and to the cost of repairing any such road, footway, or gutter damaged by reason of allowing water to flow as aforesaid.

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise shall in, upon, or along any of the public roads with in the district drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and visibly lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

The driver of every vehicle, or the rider of every horse or other animal, turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

Stall Licenses.

No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in any road for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise.

Cycles.

Every cyclist or person in charge of cycle or motor cars within the district shall observe the rules of the road for vehicle traffic.

No cyclist shall, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached to such cycle a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, which lamp shall at all times be kept lighted.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on hors, back, or any vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall leave any cycles in or on any road, street, or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Board.

No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

When a cyclist meets or overtakes any horse or other animal, and such horse or animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted as long as may be necessary to avoid accident.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads cr streets in the district, or across the intersection of any road or street at a pace exceeding three miles an hour.

To prevent damage to Footpaths and other Board Property.

No person, without first having obtained the period. mission of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plants, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board or under the control thereof.

Any person who draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road, or who shall damage or destroy, by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Preservation of Trees, etc.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant standing in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty of not more than £10.

To prevent Trees falling across Roads.

No person shall leave a burning camp fire by the roadside, and proper precaution against such fire spreading not being taken, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

No person shall wilfully set fire to standing trees on roads, ways, reserve, or otherwise. Any offender shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Penalties.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act. matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
