ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 2nd day of August, 1905.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Roads Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Reserve ⁶⁶²³₁₉₀₅ ⁷³⁴⁵ for Recreation, at Balbarrup, should be placed under the control of Alfred C. Reeve, James W. Muir, Jun., Arthur A. Scott, Herbert J. Giblett, C. Isaac Doust, and Andrew Muir as a Board of Management: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of Alfred C. Reeve, James W. Muir, Jun., Arthur A. Scott, Herbert J. Giblett, C. Isaac Doust, and Andrew Muir as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

ROYAL NAVY CADETSHIPS.

COLONIAL NOMINATIONS.

UNDER the new Naval Agreement Act there will be available yearly, commencing with the year 1906, eight nominations for Australians for commissions in the Royal Navy. The regulations governing the entrance of cadets will come into operation in their entirety in November next. Applicants for nominations must not be less than twelve years and four months or more than thirteen years of age at the time of examination. Applications will be receivable by the Governor-General or the Governor of the State in which an applicant resides, and must be made upon the prescribed forms, copies of which are obtainable on written request from the Governor-General or the Governors of States. All applications must be lodged with the Governor-General before 1st November of the year preceding that for which a nomination is desired. Therefore, applications for nominations for next year made through the Governors of States should be lodged in sufficient time to reach the Governor-General by the last day of October next.

Rule 26 is hereby repealed and the following is substituted, viz. :—

CERTIFICATES, DIPLOMAS, OR DEGREES.

26. The certificates, diplomas, or degrees recognised by the Board under Section 10, paragraph (d.), of the principal Act, as amended by Section 2 of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899," shall include the following, namely :—

Licentiate of dental surgery of any university of the Commonwealth of Australia.

A certificate, under the hand of the Registrar, that the applicant has previously been a registered dentist in Western Australia, and has withdrawn his name from the register under the provisions of Section 6 of "The Dentists Act Amendment Act, 1899."

BROOME MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

BUILDING BY-LAWS.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Building Act, 1884," and the Acts amending the same, and in the "Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Broome do make and order the following By-laws:—

BY-LAWS TO REGULATE BUILDINGS, ALTERATIONS, ETC., WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BROOME.

Interpretation clause.

1. The several words mentioned in Section 2 of "The Building Act, 1884," shall, where used in these By-laws, have the same construction as is provided for by such section.

Notice of intention to build.

2. Every person intending to commence to build, take down, alter, add to, or repair any building, whether partially destroyed by fire or otherwise, or to do any act whereby any public street may be obstructed or rendered dangerous or inconvenient to persons passing over or near thereto, shall give three clear days' notice, in writing, to the Surveyor or Town Clerk of his intention so to do, and shall deposit with such notice complete drawings and specifications of the proposed work, and also a plan of the locality, showing the position of such buildings and their relative positions to each other.

Such notice shall be delivered at the Surveyor's or Town Clerk's Office, and shall contain particulars of the site and nature of the intended building, work, or other act.

The Surveyor or Town Clerk, provided the licence fee and the deposit, as hereafter provided, have been paid to him, shall forthwith grant a licence in the Form "A" of the Schedule hereto, and also give such directions as he shall think fit for the erection of hoarding or fences, and platforms and handrail for the protection of passengers; and such directions shall be complied with to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk before the commencement of such building, work, or act. In the event of the plans being incomplete or incorrect, they must be resubmitted for approval after the alterations have been properly effected, or if, from any cause, the Surveyor or Town Clerk cannot then approve of them, they must then be submitted to the Works Committee of the Council.

Every breach of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such breach to a fine or penalty of not exceeding £5, and a further penalty of not exceeding £1 for each day the same continues, recoverable in a summary manner before justices.

Schedule of fees payable to the Council before a licence to build can be granted.

Notice of intention to use area in public street, etc., for the deposit of materials.

3. Every person wishing to deposit any stone, bricks, lime, rubbish, timber, iron, or other materials, on any public street, or to make any excavation on any land abutting on, or adjoining, or contiguous to any public street, shall first make application for and obtain from the Surveyor or Town Clerk license so to do.

Such license shall be given in the Form "A," in the Schedule hereto, specifying the time for which the same, when so erected and set up, may be continued, also the conditions to be observed by license, giving such other directions as the Surveyor or Town Clerk may think necessary.

Any infringement of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such infringement to a fine of £5 for every day such infringement continues, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices.

Hoardings to be kept in repair.

4. Every person who shall be required to erect any hoarding, fence, platform, or hand-rail, under the last two preceding clauses, shall keep the same in good and sufficient repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, so long as it shall, in his opinion, be necessary for the public safety; and every such person shall, immediately upon the receipt of notice from the Surveyor or Town Clerk that such hoarding, fence, platform, or hand-rail is out of repair, and requiring him to repair the same, forthwith repair the same to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every day the same shall continue in disrepair after the receipt by him of such notice.

Hoardings, etc., to be lighted.

5. Every person erecting such hoarding, fence, platform, or hand-rail, or obstruction of any kind in any public street, or on any excavation as aforesaid, shall cause the same to be well and sufficiently lighted at night, with lamps glazed with coloured glass, all in accordance with the directions and to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every night or part of a night on which the same is not lighted.

Power of Surveyor or Town Clerk to enforce preceding By-laws.

6. It shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Town Clerk, by order of the Council, to take immediate steps to enforce any of the preceding regulations, and he may cause any such hoarding or other obstruction that has been erected without his license, or which has been erected or continued in breach of the conditions of any such license, to be removed, or any such excavations to be filled in, or injuries to the public street repaired, at the cost and expense of the person erecting or making the same, and such costs and expenses shall be recoverable from the person so making the same, as well as the penalties hereinbefore imposed, before Justices.

Roofs to Buildings.

7. With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building and any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes, as to prevent the water therefrom dripping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

All iron pipes shall lead, if so required, from the front of the building under the footpath into the street side-channel: Provided always that the pipe laid across the footway shall be at least 6 inches below the surface and be of jarrah, cast or wrought iron piping of 4 inches diameter, or in glazed earthenware, securely bedded in concrete, all as directed by the Surveyor or Town Clerk.

Covering Footpaths, Scaffolding, etc.

8. In the case of any building being erected abutting on the footpath of a public street, or of any plastering operations being intended to be performed above the first storey of any building, the builder or other persons having charge of such buildings, or the plasterer, shall, before proceeding to build further than the first storey of such buildings so being erected, or with any plastering as aforesaid, give notice thereof in writing to the Surveyor or Town Clerk, who shall thereupon give directions to such builder, person, or plasterer, for the covering of such footpath as he shall think fit; and any builder, person, or plasterer who shall fail to give such notice, or shall proceed with such building or plastering without having complied in all respects with the directions of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, or without keeping such scaffolding, covering, or other erection directed by him in an efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, shall incur a penalty of £5 for each day in which such default shall occur or continue.

If, in the opinion of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, any scaffolding is unsafe or insufficient, he may direct that the same shall be strengthened, altered, and made secure to his entire satisfaction.

Back Yards.

9. With regard to back yards or open spaces attached to dwelling houses, every house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space according to Section 5 of "The Building Act Amendment Act, 1887," exclusive of any building thereon, unless all the rooms of the house can be lighted and ventilated from the street.

Privies.

10. No closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 15 feet from any business place or dwelling, and not less than three feet from any boundary not abutting upon a right-of-way, unless with the express permission of the Council first obtained; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be maintained and ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk.

Rooms—with regard to height.

11. With regard to rooms in other parts of the buildings in reference to the height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used, for the purposes of habitation, must be at the least the height of nine feet from floor to ceiling, and no sleeping room shall have a cubical area of less than 300 feet to each person.

Notice to remove dangerous building.

12. When any building shall, in the opinion of the Surveyor or Town Clerk, be ruinous or dangerous, or unfit for human use or habitation through defects in its construction or surroundings, under the meaning of Clause 16 of "The Building Act, 1884," the Surveyor or Town Clerk shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall forthwith comply with such order, under a penalty of not more than £1 per day for non-compliance.

Temporary buildings.

13. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Council for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings, all the walls of which may be of wood, iron, or canvas.

Prohibiting for human habitation.

14. No building, or any part thereof not originally built as and for a dwelling-house within the limits of the Municipality, whether built before or after the adoption of this By-law, shall be converted into or used as a dwelling-house without the previous consent of the Council, who may grant such consent upon and subject to such conditions as they may see fit or in their discretion may refuse the same.

Disputes.

15. If any dispute shall arise between the Surveyor or Town Clerk and any person or persons respecting the meaning or operation of any of the conditions of these By-laws, the question shall be referred by the Surveyor or Town Clerk to the Council for their adjudication.

Fees, penalties, etc.

16. All fees, penalties, and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws, or any of them, shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Council, and shall become the property of and part of the ordinary income of the Municipality.

Power to Surveyor or Town Clerk to enter and remove.

17. And generally, where anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention to these regulations, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Town Clerk, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and, by the warrant or order of two justices of the peace, as provided in Sections 15 and 16 of "The Building Act, 1884," remove, or cause to be removed, any buildings or other things which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do, or cause to be done, any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the costs of so doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these regulations.

Bench marks, etc.

18. All survey levels, bench marks, or other marks denoting the same shall be carefully preserved, and any person removing, obliterating, or causing or permitting same to be removed or obliterated shall be liable to a penalty of £10, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing same.

SCHEDULE A.

BROOME MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

No. Hoarding License and Building Permit, granted to of Street, for months, commencing from and terminating on the day of permitting the enclosing of a specified area of Street, and the erection and [or] alteration of certain buildings, the Block Plan, Plans, and Specifications whereof have been duly submitted for inspection and approval, and the authorised building fees, amounting to £ paid, but subject to the following conditions, and to all the provisions and penalties of the Building Acts, 1884, 1887, and 1895, and the Health Acts and the Municipal Institutions Act now in force.

CONDITIONS.

Fec.—Shall be 6d. per superficial yard per month, payable in advance, and renewal required may be granted at the discretion of the Surveyor or Town Clerk at the rate of 3d. per superficial yard per week.

Area.—Shall be restricted to a frontage of lineal feet, a maximum width of feet, height feet.

Hoarding and Gangway.—Shall be strongly and securely constructed of materials and to a design to be approved of by the surveyor or Town Clerk, and maintained in good condition throughout the currency of this license; and at any time the surveyor or Town Clerk may, if he think fit, order any alteration or addition to be made to the hoarding for the better protection and convenience of the public.

Lighting.—A sufficient light shall be displayed and maintained at the exterior angles of the hoarding each night from sunset to sunrise.

Advertising.—No advertisement, sign, placard, or device shall be posted or written on any hoarding without the written consent of the Council.

Obstructions.—The gangway and water channel shall at all times be kept clear throughout.

Sanitary.—Before commencing to build a privy shall be erected for the use of the workmen, and all the requirements of the sanitary authorities strictly complied with.

Re-instatement.—At the expiration of the period for which this license is granted, or sooner if possible, the hoarding shall be cleared away, and the footpath, kerbing, channelling, and roadway made good to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Town Clerk.

SCHEDULE B.

And further take notice that, in default of your doing so, you will be liable to a penalty of £1 for each day during which such default continues, and to pay the cost of removal of such building by the Municipal Council.

BROOME MUNICIPAL COUNCIL BY-LAWS.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and Acts amending same, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Broome do make and order the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the several words mentioned in the sixth section of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," shall, where used, have the same meaning as is attached to such words by the said section.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Standing Orders.

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations, which shall be called the Standing Orders.

Chairman.

2. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word "Mayor" shall include the Councillor chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

Open doors.

3. The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council shall by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

Quorum.

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than three Councillors in addition to the Mayor. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

Adjournment in absence of quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the majority of the Councillors present, or any one Councillor, if only one be present, or the Town Clerk, if no Councillor be present, may adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.

Who shall preside.

6. The Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and in his absence, or if, after being present, he retires, one of the Councillors chosen by the Councillors present shall preside.

Count out.

7. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a councillor shall call the attention of the Mayor to the fact that a quorum is not present, the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future day.

Record of Councillors present.

8. At all meetings at which there are not present three councillors and the Mayor, or four councillors, as the case may be, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the councillors then present shall be recorded in the minute book.

Confirmation of minutes.

9. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the Mayor, as by Section 162 of the Act required.

Order of business.

10. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Announcements by the Mayor without discussion.
- (2.) Questions by Council without discussion.
- (3.) Correspondence.
- (4.) Petitions and memorials.
- (5.) Tenders.
- (6.) Reports of committees.
- (7.) Orders of the day, including considering and ordering upon reports previously presented, business left over from the preceding meeting, and any business the Mayor may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (8.) Motions of which previous notice have been given.
- (9.) Notices of motion for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order of business on Notice Paper.

11. The order of business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Notice of motion.

12. Any councillor may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given, in writing, to the Town Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days before such last-mentioned meeting.

Motion to lapse.

13. Every such motion shall lapse unless the councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other councillor authorised by him, in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

Councillors to address the Chair. Points of order.

14. Any councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon, and the question of order has been disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed.

Nature of motion to be stated.

15. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon, and, if so required by the Mayor, shall put the same in writing.

Withdrawal of motion.

16. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

Motions to be seconded. Enforcement of Standing Orders.

17. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

Use of titles.

18. At meetings of the Council, speakers, in referring to others present thereat, shall designate them by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be.

Priority of speakers.

19. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Councillor not to speak twice.

20. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. And no councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

Calling to order for speaking twice.

21. The Mayor shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

Mover or seconder to be held to have spoken.

22. A councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon.

Suspension of Standing Orders.

23. In cases of urgent necessity, any Standing Order or Orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of the majority of the councillors present, provided also that such majority be not less than five.

Object of suspension to be stated.

24. Any councillor moving the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

Production of documents.

25. Any councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

One amendment at a time.

26. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

Substantive motion.

27. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

Method of taking votes.

28. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Division.

29. The Council shall vote by a show of hands, but any councillor may call for a division upon any question; in which case the councillor voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats; all division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

Reflection on the vote of Council.

30. No councillor shall reflect upon any vote of the Council except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

Motion for adjournment.

31. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

Rescission of resolution.

32. No resolution of any meeting of the Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered except in manner provided in section 150 of the Act.

Reconsideration of motion for rescission.

33. No motion for revoking, rescinding, or altering any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained during the same municipal year, unless with the consent of at least seven members of the Council.

Adjournment of debate.

34. A debate may be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day by motion duly seconded, without previous notice. No discussion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjournment of a debate.

Pre-audience on resumption of adjourned debate.

35. The councillor upon whose motion any debate shall be adjourned by the Council shall be entitled to pre-audience on the resumption of the debate.

Resumption of debate after count out.

36. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion with notice.

All councillors to vote.—Casting vote.

37. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, all the councillors present shall vote. If there be an equal division of votes upon any question, the Mayor shall, in addition to his own vote, have a second or casting vote.

Committee of whole Council.

38. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered in committee of the whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

Matters to be considered by committee.

39. Such committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Council.

Conduct of committee.

40. In committee of the whole the Standing Orders of the Council shall apply, except that councillors may speak more than once on the same question.

Adoption of committee's resolutions.

41. The Mayor shall report the resolutions arrived at in committee of the whole to the Council at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Council, as the case may require, and such resolutions shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

Digression from subject—Personal reflection.

42. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives to any other councillor, and all personal reflections upon any councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

Records of words used by a councillor.

43. Any councillor may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

Mayor's Ruling.

44. The Mayor, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

Withdrawal of offensive expression.

45. Any councillor who shall use any expression which, in the opinion of the Mayor, reflects offensively on any member of the Council, shall, when required by the Mayor, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair, and if he decline or neglect to do so, the Mayor may refuse to hear such councillor further upon the matter then under discussion, and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the council, or may direct the offending councillor to withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the council.

Disturbance—Conversing aloud.

46. No councillor shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud whilst any other councillor is speaking, or whilst any matter is being read or opened.

Crossing Council Chamber.

47. When the Mayor is putting any question, no councillor shall walk out of or across the chamber, nor shall any councillor, whilst any other councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

Mayor may call to order.

48. The Mayor may, on his own motion, call any councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there shall be cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

49. Every councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other councillor.

Definition of order.

50. Any councillor who shall do anything, or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any section of this by-law, shall be deemed to be out of order.

Decision of Mayor on point of order—Councillor to apologise when called upon.

51. Whenever it shall have been decided by the Mayor that any motion, amendment, or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in Council by any Councillors shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.

Councillor to withdraw from Council Chamber.

52. Any Councillor who shall persist in any line of conduct which the Mayor shall have decided, or which by any section of this By-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction, or apology required by the Mayor as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the Mayor, withdraw from the Council Chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

Removal of Councillor from the Council.

53. In the event of any Councillor refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Council Chamber when requested, or directed by the Mayor so to do, the Mayor may order such Councillor to be removed from the said Chamber, and to be excluded therefrom during the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

COMMITTEES.

Standing Committees.

54. In addition to such special committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be three standing committees appointed from among the Councillors, namely, a Works Committee, a Finance Committee, and a General Purposes Committee, each of which shall consist of not less than three members. Such committees shall be appointed each year at the first meeting of the Council which shall be held after the annual election.

Election of Committees.

55. The members of the said committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot, and in the event of an equality of votes for two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

Works Committee.

56. The Works Committee shall have the general direction of all works ordered or sanctioned by the Council, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges, and other public places under the care and management of the Council; the management and general direction of street lighting, sweeping, and watering, and the general administration of the building by-laws. Such committee shall inquire into and report to the Council from time to time upon such improvements and repairs as they may think necessary, or which the Council may, by resolution, direct them to inquire into and report upon.

Finance Committee.

57. The Finance Committee shall examine and check all accounts, and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of the municipal revenue. Such committee shall inquire into and report to the council from time to time upon all matters which they may consider to affect, or be likely to affect, the finances of the municipality, or which the Council may, by resolution, direct them to inquire and report upon. Such committee shall also have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Council.

General Purposes Committee.

58. The General Purposes Committee shall prepare drafts of all such By-laws as may from time to time be required for the good government of the municipality. They shall also have the control of all parks, reserves, and tree-planting, and of the Town Hall and other municipal buildings, and the administration of all the municipal By-laws, except such as shall be specially placed under the control of any other committee.

Special committees.

59. Special committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any special committee. The appointment of a special committee shall be made by resolution, after due notice; such resolution shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such special committee, and may either state the number of councillors to be elected by ballot, or shall name the councillors whom it is proposed shall constitute such committee. In the event of a ballot being taken, and an equality of votes being recorded in favour of any two or more councillors, the mayor shall have a casting vote.

Convening Committee Meetings.

60. The Town Clerk shall call a meeting of any committee when requested so to do by the Mayor or any two members of such committee.

Officers and servants.

61. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same or before advertising inviting applications, and in such latter case the salary or allowance shall be specified in such advertisement.

Security.

62. No member of the Council, nor any auditor of the Municipality, nor any officer of the Corporation shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performances of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the Council.

[Exceptional cases.]

63. Nothing herein contained shall be held to prevent the employment, as may be from time to time found necessary, and as may be ordered by the Council, of any workman or labourers on the public works of the Municipality.

Election to office.

64. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Council, for which applications have been invited by advertisement, shall be by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the three, if not three, then the two candidates polling the largest number of votes be again put to the ballot until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

Penalty.

65. Any Councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, before a Court of summary jurisdiction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Enforcement of By-laws.

66. Whenever any Councillor shall have committed an offence under this By-law, the Mayor may forthwith lay, or cause to be laid, an information before a justice of the peace for the purpose of summoning the offending councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

BY-LAW No. 2.

For the preservation of trees in the Municipality.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant planted in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places, of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Council of the said Municipality, or shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against, or tie any horse or other animal to any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection, shall forfeit for any such offence a penalty of not more than £10

BY-LAW No. 3.

Obstruction of footpaths by placing carriages, etc., thereon.

No person shall drive, or ride, or place, or cause, permit, or suffer to be ridden, driven, or placed upon any footway in the said Municipality any wagon, cart, dray, sledge, bicycle, tricycle, or any other vehicle which may be driven, ridden, or drawn, or any wheel, wheelbarrow, handbarrow, truck, hogshead, cask, barrel, or other article or thing; nor shall lead, drive, or ride any animal or animals whatsoever upon any of the footways aforesaid. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 4.

To prevent obstruction on the footpaths and streets.

No person shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street, or on any of the said footpaths of the said Municipality after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same; and every person so offending shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 5.

To prevent animals or vehicles being left in the street, or obstructing any portion of the street.

No person shall leave unattended, or allow to stray in any street, any horse, ass, mule, ox, cow, goat, or camel, or any vehicle to which may be attached and harnessed any animal for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the same; provided that where suitable bridles are erected the horse or other animal may be securely fastened thereto for any time not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer of the Council or police constable such horse or other animal shall be removed; failing the carrying out of such request the horse or other animal, together with the vehicle, may be seized and removed to the nearest police station, municipal yard, or pound; and the person so leaving such animal or vehicle shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10, in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by such impounding.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Regulating signboards, awnings, overhanging lamps, etc.

No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane in the Municipality of Broome any signboard or other sign, show-bill, or show-boards, or awning, overhanging lamp, or other things which shall project more than 3ft. from the building line, or be at a less height than 8ft. in the clear from the ground; except by permission of the Council; and every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Carriages and other vehicles plying for hire.

1. All vehicles plying for the carriage of passengers, and all lorries and other vehicles engaged in carrying merchandise for the public, shall be registered and licensed by the Council, and the owners thereof shall pay a fee of £1 per annum for every such vehicle (in addition to any other license required by law), such license in the case of passenger vehicles to stipulate the number of passengers allowed to be carried in the vehicle licensed; and the Council shall have power to refuse to grant any such license, or to withdraw such license when granted, if they shall consider the vehicle unfit for the purpose.

2. The owner of any licensed passenger vehicle shall put up, and at all times keep distinctly painted or marked upon every such vehicle, as directed by the Council, his license number, his full christian and surname, a list of his charges as fixed by the Council, with the number of passengers allowed to be carried, and no charge shall be made in addition thereto.

3. No owner shall employ any person under the age of 17 years to act as driver of any carriage, lorry, or vehicle referred to in this By-law.

4. Any person plying, keeping, or letting for hire any vehicle within the Municipality shall at any time, if required by a police constable or officer of the Council, give his name and address, and produce the license licensing such vehicle.

5. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law, or violating the conditions of his license, shall on conviction forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5 for each offence.

BY-LAW No. 8.

To prevent the danger from the driving of vehicles at night without lights.

No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, in, upon, or along any streets within the Municipality, drive any vehicle or propel any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on the off-side of the front of such vehicle; and every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Restrictions as to furious driving.

No person shall ride or drive furiously or carelessly in any street, nor be drunk while driving or riding, and no person shall drive at more than walking pace at or round the intersection of any street.

BY-LAW No. 10.

To ensure control over vehicles and horses.

Any person who, having the care of any vehicle in the public streets, shall be at such distance from such vehicle as not to have the complete control over every horse or other animal drawing the same, and shall not have one wheel of such vehicle chained, or the horse securely tied, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Regulating street traffic on special occasions.

The Council may, at its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways in any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to such street.

BY-LAW No. 12.

To restrict the breaking-in, etc., of any horse in the streets of the Municipality.

No person shall break-in any horse, mule, ass, or any other animal in any street of the Municipality either by leading, riding, or driving same; and any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2.

BY-LAW No. 13.

To restrict the use of stud animals within public view.

No person in charge of any bull or entire horse shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any entire horse or bull to be turned loose in any street, yard, or other place with any animals for the purpose of covering, except in such yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely screened from public view. Any person who shall offend against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 14.

To prevent accidents from the riding or propelling of bicycles, tricycles, and other velocipedes.

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "Bicycle" means bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede; the expression "Bicyclist" means a person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, or electric motor in any street, roadway, or footway within the Municipality of Broome.

2. Every bicyclist within the Municipality of Broome shall observe rules of the road.

3. A bicyclist shall not ride or impel a bicycle upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made or set apart for the use or accommodation of foot passengers.

4. Every bicyclist who rides a bicycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry, attached to his or her bicycle, a lamp, which shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and shall be so lighted, and kept lighted, as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of such bicycle.

5. Every bicyclist, when riding or propelling a bicycle, shall carry a bell, to be used as a signal to warn foot-passengers, and generally used to avert accidents.

6. No person using a bicycle or having charge thereof shall leave the same at any time in or on any street or footway within the said Municipality so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his or her bicycle immediately upon being requested so to do by a constable or other authorised official.

7. No bicyclist shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving.

8. In every case where a bicyclist meets any horse, mule, or other beast of burden, and whereby by reason of meeting such horse, mule, or other beast of burden may become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse, mule, or other beast of burden, such bicyclist shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary to avoid accident.

9. Any person offending against any portion of this By-law shall be liable for any one offence to a fine not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 15.

Prohibiting fires in the open air.

1. Every person who shall place, stack, or store, or permit to be placed, stacked, or stored in the open air in any street, lane, yard, or place, whether public or private, any inflammable material of any kind, or shall light any fire or let off any fireworks within the Municipality in such manner as to endanger any contiguous building, shall be liable to a fine of not more than £5.

2. Any unprotected fire in the open air, made or permitted within ten years of any dwelling-house, store, or other building, or within five yards from any fence, shall, for the purposes of this By-law, be held to endanger such building or other structure. Any one contravening this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 16.

To prevent danger from firearms.

Any person who shall wantonly and without lawful excuse discharge any firearms within the Municipality shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 17.

Sand, rock, and gravel, etc.

No person or persons shall remove any sand, rock, or gravel from any street or road within the boundaries of the Municipality, or from any land under the control of the Council, without having first obtained a permit in writing from the Council therefor. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 18.

Damaging property, etc., of Municipality.

Any person who shall (without first having obtained the sanction in writing of the Council) break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove, or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, watercourse, culvert, building, dead bush in use for the purpose of arresting drift sand, sand, material, or other property belonging to or in charge of or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Brothels—Letting with knowledge.

1. No person shall let any premises, or any part thereof, with the knowledge that the same are, or is to be, used as a brothel, or for the purpose of habitual prostitution, or shall wilfully continue as a tenant of his premises any person who shall keep such premises as a brothel or for the purposes of habitual prostitution.

Keeping a brothel.

2. No person shall keep, manage, or assist in the management of a brothel, house of assignation, house of ill-fame, or place used for the purposes of habitual prostitution.

Permitting use as a brothel.

3. No person shall knowingly permit any premises, or any part thereof, to be used as a brothel, house of assignation, or for the purposes of habitual prostitution.

Penalty.

4. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

BEVERLEY LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH, REPEAL OF
BY-LAW No. 18.

WHEREAS by Section 38 of the Health Act, 1898, any Local Board of Health may from time to time make, repeal, alter, or amend any By-law: Now, THEREFORE, in pursuance thereof, the Local Board of Health for the district of Beverley hereby repeals By-law No. 18, and in lieu thereof makes the following By-law:—

By-law No. 18.—"No person shall keep any swine within the Municipal boundaries for a longer period than twenty-four hours."

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898" (62 Vict., No. 24), the Local Board of Health has power to make By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance thereof, the following By-laws have been made, and shall come into operation from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms herein used shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Cesspools to be cleansed and filled up.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 2.

Regulating the position and manner of construction of privies.

1. No person shall erect within the district of the Local Board any earth-closet, privy, or urinal, the walls of which are not of stone, wood, wood and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Local Board. The doors of every closet shall be properly fitted, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to readily admit the pan, and shall be placed in a position so that it may be easily approached by the night-carts.

2. All closets, privies, or urinals shall be erected in such position and in such manner as shall be approved of by the Local Board; and all such closets, privies, and urinals shall be erected as near the right-of-way as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

3. Authority under Section 173, Subsection 3.—The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either ashes, dry earth, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Local Board, and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closet or privy to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Every owner of a closet shall provide in connection with such closet one or more receptacles for excrementitious matter, as required by the Health Board. He shall cause such receptacles to be constructed out of not less than 22-gauge galvanised iron, and the dimensions of such receptacles shall be 14½ inches high, 13¼ inches diameter (inside measurement) when completed. The ring around the top to be made of 1-inch by ¼-inch iron, with four holes punched at equal distance apart, and riveted to the body so as to fit same neatly, and be level across the top; the seams of the body shall be folded and grooved and sweated with solder, two straps to be put across the bottom of the pan made of 20-gauge galvanised hoop iron 1½ inches wide, and swaged and riveted to the bottom. Handles made of ¾-inch round iron shall be properly secured to the external opposite sides of the body at five inches below the top of the body, and projecting not more than two inches from the side thereof.

BY-LAW No. 4.

1. There shall be provided by the occupier two receptacles for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

2. He shall not permit any closet on his premises to be used by more than ten persons.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Every nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents, to be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every contractor shall cause the nightsoil removed from any premises to be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator, or to be trenched or ploughed into the land.

BY-LAW No. 7.

The Local Board shall exercise stringent supervision over all such depots or places of deposit, and the Inspector shall inspect such depots or places regularly at such intervals as the Local Board may direct.

BY-LAW No. 8.

Mode of removal, etc.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable tight-fitting lid, and upon every such removal shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Local Board in lieu of every pan so removed, and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say—

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid as prescribed in the foregoing clause shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart or vehicle of a pattern to be approved by the Local Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Local Board.

Until otherwise directed, the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches, to be excavated at his own expense, in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Local Board, and treated with disinfectant, and covered with earth to such depth as the Local Board may from time to time direct.

The said receptacles shall be emptied once a week at the least.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Fixing the charge, etc.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, trade, or house refuse shall have been removed such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule "A" hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Licenses to remove nightsoil.

1. No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Local Board.
2. No nightman shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Local Board a license authorising him to do so.
3. The license shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," and of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Imposing penalties on licensee for breach of conditions.

The following shall be the conditions upon which licenses to remove nightsoil shall be issued:—

The penalties for breach of any of the foregoing conditions shall be not more than the respective amounts set forth at the conclusion of each such condition.

BY-LAW No. 12.

For the mode of carriage of, and precautions, etc., to be observed—Meat, bread, fruit, etc.

1. No person or persons shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street, or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.
2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state.

BY-LAW No. 13.

For the registration annually of all persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk.

All persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the district of the Local Board shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee for such registration, and shall receive a certificate thereof in the form of Schedule "C."

BY-LAW No. 14.

For securing the cleanliness of bakeries.

1. No person shall carry on any bakery or bread or confectionery store unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.
2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of the Local Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 15.

For prescribing the time of and the precautions to be taken on the removal of pigwash, etc.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks, securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.
2. Every tank or barrel and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter as above, shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 16.

For the prevention of the sale of diseased fruit, etc.

No person shall sell or expose for sale in any market, warehouse, or shop, or other place any fruit or fish which is diseased or unwholesome, and any fruit or fish which, in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board or Central Board, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed, and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit or fish shall also be destroyed as such officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 17.

For the restriction of the storage and keeping of bonedust, etc.

No person shall store or keep any bonedust or artificial or other manure so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 18.

Regulating and keeping of cattle or other animals.

1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine, or other animals may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any leakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall at least once a week remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey or cause to be conveyed such dung or offensive matter to the depot or place set apart for that purpose by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 19.

Defining an area within which swine may not be kept, etc.

1. No person shall keep any swine except in such place or places as approved of by the Local Board.

2. No person shall keep any swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 20.

For the prevention of danger to the public from manufactories or places for the storage of inflammable materials.

1. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty casks, or other inflammable material.

2. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW No. 21.

For the disinfection of and the prevention of nuisance or injury to health from poultry yards, rags, or other materials used or stored in marine stores.

1. No person shall keep any premises as a poultry yard at a less distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall be kept in a clean condition and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

3. No rags or other materials used or stored in marine stores, flock or bedding or furniture manufactories, shall be kept so as to cause a nuisance or to be injurious to health.

BY-LAW No. 22.

For the regulation of noxious or offensive trades.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of the Act, whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual registration fee, as set forth in Schedule "D" hereto, of the amount of which fee the Local Board shall give notice to such owner or occupier, and if such owner or occupier fails to comply he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2 per day for each day during which such provisions shall not be complied with.

2. All premises or places so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be limewashed as often as may be required by the Local Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 23.

For the prevention of the use of steam whistles at factories, etc.

No person or owner of any factory or other establishment shall use or cause to be used any steam whistle so as to be a nuisance to any person.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Specifying the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing.

- (a.) In the case of any notice given by an Inspector under Section 169 of "The Health Act," the time which shall elapse between the giving of a notice and compliance therewith shall, if the notice relates to the removal of stagnant water, be two working days, and when the notice requires the removal of manure, dung, soil, or other offensive or noxious matter, the time which shall elapse shall be one working day.
- (b.) Under By-law 17, diseased or unwholesome fruit or fish shall be destroyed within four hours; the cases and packing material within twenty-four hours.
- (c.) Under By-law 26, the time allowed shall be two hours.
- (d.) Under By-law 27, paragraph 1, the time allowed shall be two days.
- (e.) Under By-law 27, paragraph 2, the time allowed shall be one hour.
- (f.) Under By-law 27, paragraph 5, the time allowed shall be one day.

BY-LAW No. 25.

For preventing offensive matter running out of premises.

1. It shall not be lawful for the owner, proprietor, or any employee of or in any manufactory, brewery, slaughter-house, knacker's yard, butcher's or fishmonger's shops, laundry, or dinghill to allow any offensive matter to escape and flow upon any street, lane, way, or thoroughfare, or land within the district of the Local Board.

2. All such offensive matter shall be placed in a suitable receptacle, and emptied as often as necessary, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Regulating the deposit of rubbish, etc.

1. The occupier of every house or premises shall, on written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or boxes of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Local Board for the temporary deposit of house refuse.

2. The occupier of such house, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles; and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive, and shall, when necessary or directed by the Inspector or officer of the Local Board, thoroughly disinfect the same forthwith.

3. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such place or position as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the removal of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier, or if there be no occupier, then the owner, of every house or premises to which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 27.

Receptacles to be kept in an inoffensive condition.

All receptacles required by "The Health Act, 1898," or under these By-laws, shall be kept in an inoffensive condition by the householder or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 28.

Regulating the removal of offensive matter.

Every person who shall convey any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, yard, street, or place whatsoever, through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil collected to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive odour or effluvia therefrom; and the same shall not be deposited in any place within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 29.

Regulating the disposal of the carcasses of dead animals.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcass of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or Townsite, or to such place as the Local Board may direct, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed or buried, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 30.

Regulating the burning of offal and other offensive matter.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so as to be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 31.

Regulating the removal of slops.

1. Any person who shall be ordered by the Local Board or its Inspectors shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitting with close-fitting covers or lids for the purpose of carting or receiving any slops or suds, house refuse, waste, or other matter or substance used in any laundry which is likely to become a nuisance or offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary condition and removed at least once a week and cleansed and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 32.

Regulating the deposit of offensive liquid, etc.

No foul or offensive water, or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other offensive matter or thing, shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land, or other place, whether public or private, within the district other than the place set apart by the Local Board for that purpose.

BY-LAW No. 33.

Restricting contracts.

No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil or any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the person licensed by the Local Board, and in accordance with these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 34.

Regulating the carrying off of storm or rain water.

Every owner shall cause all buildings to be provided with spoutings, downpipes, and drains sufficient to carry off all storm or rain water.

BY-LAW No. 35.

Penalties.

Any person guilty of any offence against any of these By-laws, not otherwise specially provided for, shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898" (Sections 35 and 242), or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided in the said Act: Provided always, that no penalty imposed hereunder shall be less than 5s.
